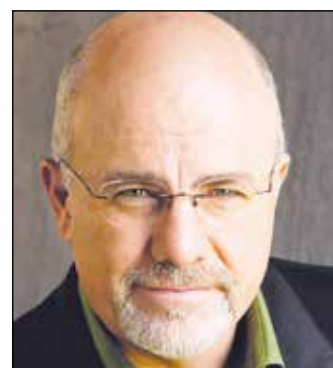

Celebrating in Style

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - More than two centuries of patriotism were celebrated on Fathers' Day by Carmichael's famous Bunfill brothers. Decorated WW II hero Curly just turned 103; baby brother Larry will next week reach 99.

Strutting pointed boots and Stetsons, the siblings are cowboys by heritage and heart. Two of 11 Bunfill brothers raised in a travelling Wild West show, they became fist-fighting extras in Hollywood movies and later, builders by trade. Other shared passions include horse racing and all-American automobiles. "Our dad bought our first Cadillac in 1941," Larry Bunfill recalls. "Ever since, we've all owned Cadillacs. We like the way they drive."

Including offspring, the

Bunfill ménage currently garages six of these iconic autos. Waxed and decorated, the fleet will haul VIPs in Carmichael's July 4 parade. A 1956 Seville built for Rita Hayworth (bequeathed to Curly in the movie star's will) will also grace the cortege.

In keeping with their circus childhood, Larry and Curly rode as soon as they walked. As teens, they haunted California's burgeoning movie industry as extras on cowboy films. "I was in "Skippy" (1931) with Jackie Cooper," Larry says. "Jackie said something smart to me. We were just kids and we started scrapping. The directors decided to use me for fight scenes..."

At their great ages, Curly and Larry now prefer the embrace of a large and close-knit family. Failing eyesight ended Larry's

driving days but on Curly's recent 103rd birthday, the old pro got his driver's license renewed. Both brothers will ride shotgun in their cars for the July 4 parade. After decades of auto shows and processions, the Carmichael Cadillac kings still love their hometown pageant.

"Next to been honored for my war service, being in the parade is my best honor as an

American," says centenarian Curly. "I love just riding along and seeing everybody so happy."

The Carmichael Elks' 58th annual parade graces Fair Oaks Boulevard from 10:30 am on Monday July 4. Grand Marshall Assemblyman Ken Cooley will ride in a Bunfill Cadillac. Fireworks will complete the day at the La Sierra Community Center. ★

Man Wanted for Four Sacramento Area Bank Robberies

FBI Special Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) seeks assistance from the public to identify an armed and dangerous individual who has robbed several Sacramento area banks. Thus far, the subject has been linked to four robberies in the Sacramento area:

- **April 25 2016:** West America Bank located at 1610 Arden Way in Sacramento
- **May 29, 2016:** US Bank located at 3320 Arden Way in Sacramento
- **June 11, 2016:** US Bank located at 4040 Manzanita Avenue in Carmichael
- **June 15, 2016:** Bank of the West located at 2581 Fair Oaks Boulevard in Sacramento

The robbery subject is described as an adult male who may be in his 20's or 30's. He stands approximately six feet tall with a very slender build. The man has worn a variety of clothing and has concealed his hair or lack thereof by wearing a shoulder-length, red-brown wig or white straw fedora hat that had a band with three alternating stripes. During the four robberies, the man either brandished a black handgun or threatened a gun before and demanding money from tellers. After receiving money, the subject stowed the funds in a bag. During the April 25, 2016 and May 29, 2016, robberies, the individual used a tan fabric tote with a stiff, round handle. During the June robberies, the man used a royal blue fabric bag.

In addition to the FBI, the bank robberies are being investigated by the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and Sacramento Police Department.

Individuals with information about this man may call their local FBI office or 1-800-CALL-FBI (800-885-5984). Tips may also be submitted online at tips.fbi.gov. If the subject is spotted in the community, the public is urged to call 911 and not approach the individual. Wanted fugitives, bank robberies, and other cases in need additional information from the public are posted for viewing on the FBI Sacramento Division's Most Wanted page. ★

Officer Involved Shooting in Carmichael

Special Sacramento County Release

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - At 11:00 p.m. on June 18, 2016, a Sheriff's deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically in the area of El Camino Avenue and Walnut Avenue in Carmichael. The deputy attempted to pull over the suspect vehicle when a pursuit ensued. The pursuit continued for approximately four to five minutes, with the suspect vehicle reaching speeds of up to 60 miles per hour in residential areas.

The suspect turned south on Horton Lane south of Sutter Avenue. The roadway turned into a dead end, where deputies exited their car and gave commands for the suspect to exit the vehicle. The suspect then put his car in reverse and began to accelerate. A deputy fearing for the safety of the officers behind

the suspect's vehicle discharged his firearm at the suspect. The suspect sustained gunshot wounds and was taken out of his vehicle. Deputies immediately began life saving measures. Sacramento Metro Fire

responded and pronounced the suspect deceased at the scene.

The identity of the suspect in this case will be made available by the Sacramento County Coroner's office, after notification has been made to his next of kin.

The investigation into the incident will be conducted by the Sheriff's Homicide Bureau and Professional Standards Division, which is standard practice for any officer-involved shooting that occurs in the Sheriff's Department's jurisdiction. The deputy involved in the shooting is a 12 year veterans of the Sheriff's Department. In accordance with the Sheriff's Department policies and procedures, the deputy involved in the shooting will be placed on paid administrative leave pending the investigation. The deputy is currently assigned to the field services division. ★

Summer is here, the weather is warm and the river is calling your name. Visiting Sacramento County's public waterways and rivers is a traditional way to cool off and enjoy the outdoors.

But before you take the plunge remember "Life Looks Good on You" and so does a life vest. Drowning Doesn't.

Putting a life vest on before going into the river is the smart and safe thing to do. And remember it's the law for children under 13 to wear a life vest because kids don't float. Wearing one could help save a life - including your own.

There are several life vest borrowing stations along the American River Parkway at Discovery Park (2 sites -- kids and adults), Ancil Hoffman Park (kids only), Howe Avenue river access (kids only), Watt Avenue river access (kids only), River Bend Park (kids only), and Sunrise river access (kids only).

Alcohol Ban Keeps Parkway Family Friendly

If you are planning to enjoy the American River Parkway over the Fourth of July Day holiday weekend, there will

be a complete ban on alcohol consumption and possession both on land and in the water between Hazel and Watt avenues (an exception exists for Ancil Hoffman Golf Course).

In past years summer holiday weekends had become major problems along the American River due to excessive alcohol consumption making the parkway less of a family friendly outing because of fights, public nudity, profanity and littering.

The problem was very apparent Fourth of July in 2006 when hundreds of rafters and partygoers consuming excessive amounts of alcohol created what one observer called a "chaotic scene" along a portion of the parkway.

Besides Memorial Day weekend, the restriction is applicable for the holiday weekends of Memorial Day as well as Labor Day. In addition, the Board of Supervisors delegated authority to the Director of Regional Parks the ability to prohibit alcohol in the Parkway on any additional days between Memorial Day and Labor Day when such a ban is needed to maintain order to address excessive alcohol consumption encouraged by social media.

After the Board restored decorum through the ban, families I have talked to have expressed appreciation for making the holiday weekend a time again for everyone to enjoy the Parkway.

- More than 500 local residents joined with 100 formerly homeless women to raise a recordbreaking \$200,000 at Women's Empowerment's 15th Anniversary Gala in May. Funds raised will benefit the local nonprofit job training and empowerment program for women who are homeless and their children. The event, which also honored the group's 1,322 graduates, included opportunities for community members to mingle with graduates who wore evening gowns donated by the community. Guests enjoyed a formal dinner, live and silent auctions, live music and stories from women who are no longer homeless.

"When we started this

organization 15 years ago, we never could have dreamed that we would raise \$200,000 at this beautiful event that doubles as a way to celebrate all of the amazing women in Sacramento who have broken the cycle of homelessness for their children," said Lisa Culp, founding executive director, Women's Empowerment. "The Sacramento community outdid themselves this year in showing their support for local women who are working so hard."

Celebrating its 15th anniversary this year, Women's Empowerment was recently featured on NBC's TODAY Show and CNN's Impact Your World for offering the most comprehensive job-readiness program

in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The 2014 Organization of the Year has graduated 1,322 homeless women and their 2,750 children. Last year, 93 percent of graduates found homes and 83 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. "Non-Violent Second-Striker" Early Prison Releases: MAY 2016 Update

The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office takes an active role in evaluating these cases and writes letters to the Board with an overview of the inmate's criminal history and current commitment offense, an opinion regarding the public safety risk posed by the inmate, and the appropriateness of an offender's early release.

As of May 31, 2016, 135 inmates sentenced from Sacramento County have been granted early prison releases. Given the number of violent offenders who continue to be granted early release, DA Anne Marie Schubert began monthly updates to provide the public with a sampling of the noteworthy criminals who appear to pose a risk to public safety, but are being granted early release into our community as 'non-violent second-strikers.'

In the month of May 2016, inmates granted early prison release include:

Curtis Marcellino – Marcellino has a prior 1982 strike conviction for residential burglary. In that case, a woman awoke in her home to find Marcellino climbing on top of her and naked from the waist down. Marcellino received a 1 year county jail sentence for that offense. In 1995, a woman reported Marcellino grabbed her, kissed and fondled her as she tried to push him away and told him to stop. Marcellino pled to misdemeanor battery in this case and was sentenced to 90 days Sheriff Work Project. In 2004, Marcellino was arrested for annoying /molesting a child under age 18 and battery. He received 3 years probation for battery in this case. In 2006, Marcellino went to his victim's house in violation of a restraining order. When she asked him to leave, he became angry and drove his vehicle towards her and her 18-year-old female friend, forcing them to jump out of the way to avoid being struck. For this offense, he was convicted of felony assault with a deadly weapon and sentenced to 270 days in county jail. In his current offense, Marcellino was 50 years old when he picked up a 15-year-old girl he met earlier the same day on Craigslist. The victim's mother saw Marcellino drive away with her daughter and took down his license plate number before calling law enforcement. Officers went to the address associated with the vehicle and found Marcellino and the victim both naked from the waist down. The victim said she told Marcellino she was 18 years old, but admitted she was only 15. According to the victim, the two were having sex. When she repeatedly told Marcellino he was hurting her, he didn't stop until the victim pushed him off of her. Observing officers found it clear the victim was under the age

of 18 based on her demeanor, attitude, mannerisms and the fact she was wearing a local high school PE shirt. Marcellino pled to unlawful sexual intercourse with a minor victim under the age of 16 years when he was over 21, admitted his prior strike offense and was sentenced to 4 years in state prison. In addition to these offenses, Marcellino has an array of other convictions and prison sentences for theft, drunk driving, welfare fraud and identity theft.

Christopher Moore – Moore has two prior 2007 strike convictions for robbery and assault with a deadly weapon, with the enhancement of personally inflicting great bodily injury. In that case, Moore robbed two victims at gunpoint. Moore hit one of the victims with the butt of a rifle, causing that victim to sustain a fractured jaw. Moore then chased down the other victim, who tried to run for safety, and punched and kicked that victim several times in the head and body. Moore was still beating the victim when officers responded to the scene. He tried to run from officers and then lied about his identity when he was apprehended. Moore was sentenced to 6 years in state prison for this ruthless conduct. In 2005, Moore drove through the family room of an occupied residence as he tried to evade officers attempting to stop him for driving a stolen car. Officers located a handgun in that stolen car. Moore was injured in the collision and transported to the hospital. Due to his conduct, he was placed in leg shackles while awaiting medical treatment. Moore pretended to need to use the restroom, at which point he tried to again run from officers. In that case, Moore was convicted of evading officers with wanton or willful disregard for the safety of others and escaping from lawful custody of an officer for pending felony charges and sentenced to 300 days in county jail. In his current committing offense, Moore was involved in a hit and run collision where he brandished a firearm in an attempt to intimidate the driver of the other car. Moore was located several hours later and denied being the driver involved in the collision. Since Moore was on parole at that time, officers searched his car and found a 9mm handgun with a shaved off serial number and 10 live rounds of ammunition for that gun. Moore was convicted of being a felon in possession of a firearm, having a prior strike conviction and sentenced to 32 months in state prison. In addition to these felony convictions, Moore sustained numerous parole violations and misdemeanor convictions, including resisting police officers and driving under the influence of alcohol. ★



Two Dogs and One Bird Perish in Arden-Area House Fire

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Around 9:30 this morning, Metro Fire crews were dispatched for a kitchen fire on the 2100 block of Red Robin Lane in the Arden area. Strong winds blowing through windows quickly spread the kitchen fire to the rest of this small house, and fire crews arrived to find a home well-involved with fire.

Four fire engines, two trucks, two medics, and two battalion chiefs worked quickly to search for victims, extinguish the fire,

and protect nearby homes. Their strategic fire attack successfully contained the fire to the house of origin, with minimal charring to the exterior of an adjacent home. Firefighters pulled two dogs and one bird out of the fire and attempted to resuscitate them, but they did not survive. The cause of the fire was determined to be unattended cooking, with total damage estimated at \$50,000.

Our thoughts go out to the resident who lost her pets and much of her home today.

Cooking remains the number one cause of home fires, causing more injuries than any other type of fire. Knowing what to do can make all the difference. Never leave unattended food cooking on the stove, even for a short time. If you encounter a small grease fire, leave the pan where it is, turn off the heat, and put a lid on it. If you can't get a lid on the pan, use a fire extinguisher or call 911. For more information, check out www.metrofire.ca.gov. ★

Legislative Democrats' Sunshine Law is Awfully Dim

Commentary from Assembly Republican Communications

Yesterday, (June 16th) the California Senate pushed forward with a thinly veiled attempt to kill a transparency initiative sponsored by Stanford physicist Charles Munger that is set for the November ballot. The Munger initiative is a good governance sunshine law that would, among other things, require all bills to be in print for 72 hours before being passed by the Senate or Assembly. The waiting period would provide legislators, the media and the general public with proper time to review legislation before it's passed, a courtesy they are not currently granted under state law.

have introduced similar legislation for several years, only to see it killed by the majority party each time.

Now, suddenly, legislative Democrats have seemingly had a change of heart and pushed SCA 14 their own "sunshine law" through the Senate. At first glance, the bill appears to require bills to be in print for 72 hours before being passed by either house, similar to what Munger and Republicans have asked. Unfortunately, the language in their version is simply a wolf in sheep's clothing; with so many loopholes it resembles Swiss cheese more than sunshine.

In fact, legislative Democrats have so little respect for the 72 hour waiting period they are claiming to promote that, on the same day the Senate Democrats passed SCA 14, the Assembly

Democrats pushed through two budget trailer bills (SB 839 and SB 840) THAT WERE IN PRINT FOR LESS THAN 24 HOURS!!!

The truth is that legislative Democrats are not actually interested in transparency. Dan Walters of the Sacramento Bee recently described their true intentions in creating a competing ballot measure:

"If both measures pass, the one with more votes would prevail. But if voters are confused by two measures on the same subject, both could be rejected and we'd be back where we started on making the legislative process more transparent."

If legislative Democrats are truly interested in transparency, they can start by being honest about their own transparency bill. ★

Bera Calls on Scott Jones to Reverse His Position on Terror Watch and Guns

ELK GROVE, CA - Today, (June 15, 2016) the Bera Campaign called on Sheriff Scott Jones to immediately reverse his dangerous opposition to legislation that would ban those on terror watch and no-fly lists from purchasing guns.

Jones stated his opposition to closing the loophole that allows suspects on the FBI terror watch list to buy guns during a January interview, where he claimed the bill has "numerous faults" and would only "make a few people feel better."

"Scott Jones' radical position against limiting gun sales to those on the terror watch list is dangerous, and puts him at odds with California law enforcement, the gun lobby, and even some Congressional Republicans," said Congressman Bera's campaign manager, Jerid Kurtz. "Taking steps to keep guns out of the hands of terrorists is a no-brainer, so Jones should immediately reverse his position and stop

playing politics with common-sense gun safety reforms."

The Bera campaign's call to Jones comes as members of the United States Senate filibuster in support of the "no-fly, no-buy" terror watch list gun reform bill, and the National Rifle Association (NRA) announces that they believe "that terrorists should not be allowed to purchase or possess firearms, period."

"I've been a strong supporter of preventing suspects on the FBI's terror watch list from buying guns, and I've co-sponsored legislation in Congress to do just that," said Representative Ami Bera. "I'm proud to co-sponsor the bipartisan bill to close the 'no fly, no buy' loophole, and it's a common-sense step forward in keeping our families safe that is long overdue."

Republicans other than Jones, including Donald Trump, Senators Pat Toomey, Angus King, Susan Collins, and John Cornyn, have

recently indicated a willingness to discuss efforts to close the gun loophole. Also, Republican Representatives Peter King, Robert Dold, Jr., and Daniel Donovan are sponsoring the no-fly, no-buy bill to close the terrorist watch loophole that Rep. Bera has been working to pass.

Today in a release, even the NRA stated, "Anyone on a terror watchlist who tries to buy a gun should be thoroughly investigated by the FBI and the sale delayed while the investigation is ongoing. If an investigation uncovers evidence of terrorist activity or involvement, the government should be allowed to immediately go to court, block the sale, and arrest the terrorist."

If so many people and groups can see the need for common-sense action to keep guns out of the hands of terrorists, why can't Scott Jones?

Sheriff Scott Jones Rejects Bera's Attack, Challenges Bera to Debate

Statement from Sheriff Scott Jones:

"As Sacramento County's top law enforcement officer, I have been on the frontline of protecting our communities. I host the Regional Terrorism Threat Assessment Center and sit as the Chair of the Central California Intelligence Committee. Our department works hand in hand with regional and federal partners to intervene in and prevent terrorist attacks right here in our region--nobody locally does more or feels more strongly about protecting our cities and neighborhoods from terrorism. My issue is not with keeping weapons out of the hands of terrorists, but rather my lack of faith that the federal government can develop and maintain a sufficient vetting system. There was a period of time when I myself was inexplicably on a list that precluded unimpeded air

travel.

"I absolutely support giving our law enforcement and intelligence agencies the tools they need to prevent future tragedies and believe Senator Cornyn's legislation strikes the appropriate balance between security and privacy. Right now we need to put politics aside and seek common ground and it is incredibly disappointing that Congressman Bera would politicize the tragedy in Orlando just days after so many Americans lost their lives to yet another terrorist attack, especially when his record of decision-making globally has consistently placed more Americans at risk.

"Instead of politicizing a tragedy and lobbying attacks via press release, I challenge Congressman Bera to a debate focused on national security and counter terrorism issues.

"Congressman Bera's only

official statement on the terrorist attack in Orlando was an extremely weak press release that labeled it a mass shooting, not an act of terrorism. Bera's lack of leadership and apparent lack of understanding of the threat that our nation faces from Islamist jihadist ideology is one of the main reasons that community leaders came to Sheriff Jones and asked him to enter the race for Congress," said Jones consultant Dave Gilliard.

"Today, (June 16, 2016) Sheriff Jones sent a letter to Congressman Bera, challenging him to a debate on the issue of National Security and Counter-Terrorism. Congress will soon leave Washington for their annual summer recess, so there should be no problem finding a date when Congressman Bera will be in the district and available to debate," said Gilliard.

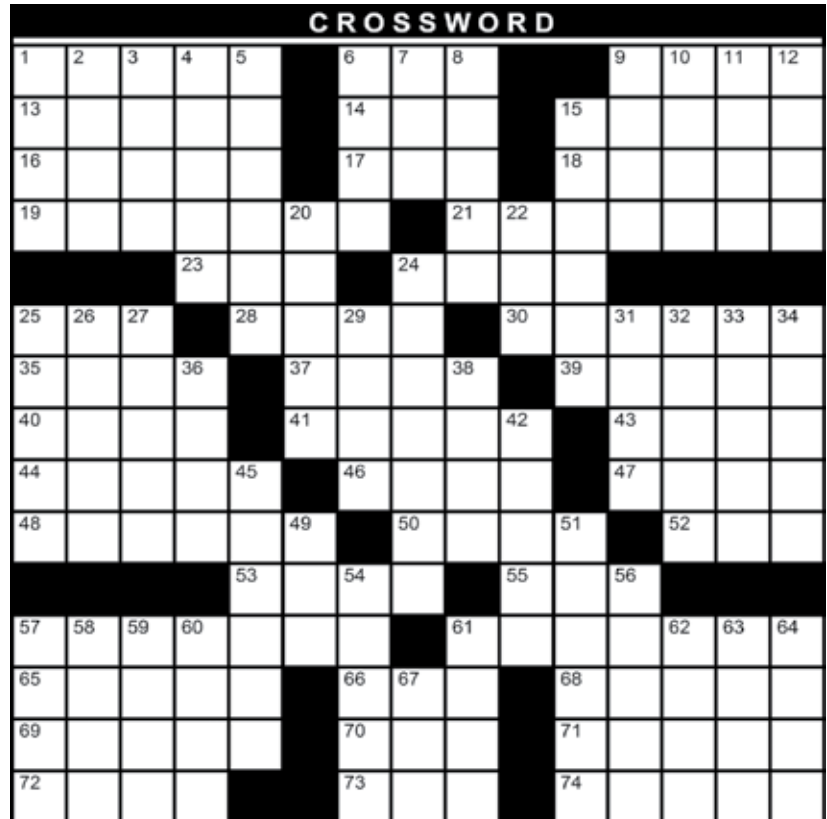

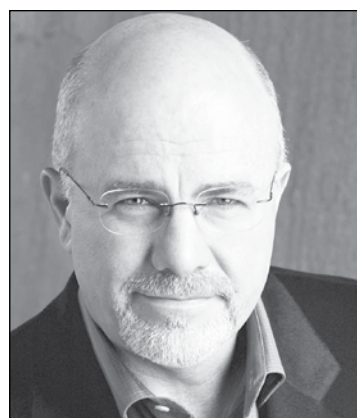

incomes, is around \$52,000. I would challenge you to think about and work toward what you could be doing at age 60 that will make you that much or even more.

Baby Steps, motivation, and retirement

Dear Dave,

I make \$38,000 a year working in the trade show industry, and I'm about to start Baby Step 3. It took 14 months to pay off \$8,000 in debt for Baby Step 2, so I'm wondering how long it should take to save up my three to six months of expenses. I've also not done a lot toward retirement. I'm 52, and I'm worried about that. How can I stay motivated in the Baby Steps and handle retirement worries?

Dear Donna,

The general time frame I look at for saving up a fully funded emergency fund is six months to a year. Your take-home pay should be about \$3,000 a month, so three to six months of expenses will probably be in the neighborhood of \$8,000 to \$10,000. If it took you about a year to pay off that much in debt, then it should take about a year to accomplish this.

But if you start building retirement right now and have an emergency, you know what you'll use? You'll use your retirement. That's why the emergency fund comes before retirement in the Baby Steps. The average household income in America, which is often two

EPA FIVE-YEAR REVIEW OF THE AEROJET SUPERFUND SITE

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) began its first Five-Year Review (FYR) of the cleanup actions within the Aerojet Superfund Site (Site) in Rancho Cordova, California. The purpose of a FYR is to evaluate whether the cleanup actions for the Site are protective of human health and the environment.

THE REVIEW PROCESS

Superfund law requires EPA to evaluate the protectiveness of remedial systems every five years until the Site has been cleaned up sufficiently to allow unrestricted access to the property. Upon completion of the review, which is due by September 30, 2016, a copy of the final report will be placed in the information repositories listed below and online at EPA's web page at <http://www.epa.gov/superfund/aerojet>. The Site will continue to be cleaned up and monitored during the review, and the next FYR will be in 2021.

CLEANUP

The Site covers 5,900 acres near Rancho Cordova. Since 1953, Aerojet and its subsidiaries have manufactured liquid and solid propellant rocket engines for military and commercial applications, and, have in the process, formulated a number of chemicals. In addition, the Cordova Chemical Company operated chemical manufacturing facilities on the Aerojet complex from 1974 to 1979. Both companies disposed of unknown quantities of hazardous waste, including trichloroethene (TCE) and other chemicals associated with rocket propellants and various chemical processing wastes. Wastes were disposed of in man-made ponds, landfills, injected into very deep wells, rainfall and other sources mixed with waste in soil and move down to groundwater, and by open burning. In 1979, volatile organic compounds were found off-site in private wells, and, in 1983 the American River. In January 1997, perchlorate was found in drinking water wells off-site. The most prevalent contaminants in groundwater are TCE, perchlorate, and N-Nitrosodimethylamine. The Site was divided into eight sections, or operable units, to assist prioritizing the cleanup plan schedule for this Site. The Western Ground Water Operable Unit (OU-3), Perimeter Groundwater OU (OU-5) and Boundary OU (OU-6) have Record of Decisions in place. The remaining OUs where cleanup decisions will be made are OU-1, OU-4, OU-7, OU-8, and OU-9. This review will primarily cover any interim and present cleanup actions on the Site for Western Ground Water OU (OU-3) and Perimeter Groundwater OU (OU-5), which are the only two OUs with remedies in place.

SMARTLY COMIC BUDDY ACTION ADAPTS TO "CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE"

the Prom and voted "Most Likely to Succeed." Despite all that, Calvin displayed an act of kindness to the sad sack Robbie that was never forgotten.

Jump to the present day, Robbie has been transformed by six hours a day of training into the physical specimen for which Dwayne Johnson became known as "The Rock" during his early career in the WWE world of wrestling.

Fittingly, Robbie has jettisoned his old name for that of Bob Stone, a moniker that suits his new role as a confident charmer with a rock-hard physique and a daring, skilled CIA operative with an exciting life that Calvin can only imagine.

Sadly, Calvin has become a risk-averse accountant stuck on the middle rung of the corporate ladder and commanding zero respect from his colleagues. His marriage to high school sweetheart Maggie (Danielle Nicolet) has hit a rough patch.

As the high school reunion looms, Calvin takes stock of his life and ponders what might have been. Suddenly, Bob shows up and invites Calvin for a beer a couple of days prior to the big reunion.

Maybe he's a tough guy, but Bob still has a few quirks. He wears a unicorn T-shirt and an unfashionable fanny pack. His love for "Sixteen Candles" serves as a reference point apropos of nothing of significance, but provides a soft edge to his gruff exterior.

Within hours, Bob's seemingly casual request for Calvin to analyze some financial data takes a suspicious turn, leading to a shaky path of underground transactions and high-stakes plot over stolen encryption codes that pose a threat to national security.

Bob's superiors, including a

tenacious Agent Pamela Harris (Amy Ryan) with a sadistic streak abetted by her own goon squad, believe Bob is behind a scheme to sell state secrets, while Bob claims to be tracking the real villain, code-named Black Badger.

Meanwhile, the funny part of the cloak-and-dagger mischief is that Calvin, despite his vigorous denials of involvement with Bob, is suspected by the government spooks of being in cahoots with a rogue agent, such that his home and office are invaded by gun-wielding agents.

"Central Intelligence" sets a nice rhythm to the action by exposing Bob and Calvin as polar opposites. Bob thrives on action and brute force, a trait demonstrated on the first night at the local tavern when Bob takes down four bullies with hardly a sweat.

Meanwhile, Calvin hates action and violence. When Bob reminds Calvin that "he's in" on the caper to clear his name, Calvin insists that he's not a part of it. The difference between these two is a classic set-up for a buddy, action comedy.

There's more to it when Bob reveals that he still has a real affection in a hero-worship way toward Calvin.

While Bob has become the strong, powerful dude, he still looks at Calvin like he's the big hero from high school days, reminding him that he's still the Golden Jet.

At some point, and not too surprisingly, Calvin may have to summon his dormant inner-hero to come to the rescue. The script has some good zingers, with one of them being Bob saying to Calvin, "You're like a black Will Smith."

For the most part, "Central Intelligence" thrives and succeeds on two central points. First is the dynamic chemistry between Dwayne Johnson and Kevin Hart; they need to reunite in another adventure. Second is the breezy pace of the action itself.

Don't expect any big deal with "Central Intelligence."

Go along for the ride, giving little thought to the plot itself, and enjoy the entertainment value provided by the very likable lead characters. ★

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE (Rated PG-13)

You can't go too far wrong pairing the hulking, powerful Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson and the diminutive funnyman Kevin Hart as mismatched partners in a buddy action comedy, and "Central Intelligence" has enough smarts, in dialogue and action, to deliver the goods.

Johnson and Hart, who for lack of a better definition could be called the Mutt and Jeff of action comedy, develop into the bickering partners that bring to mind the "Rush Hour" franchise and "Midnight Run."

I suspect that the former reference is more familiar to most than the oddball comic road trip of "Midnight Run" in which Robert DeNiro's taciturn bounty hunter has to lug a talkative mob accountant Charles Grodin cross country.

If you haven't seen this film, it's a must-see.

Okay, back to "Central Intelligence," where the essential premise rests on life twenty years after high school, during which Johnson was, it would seem so improbably, an extremely chubby geek with the unfortunate name of Robbie Weirlicht.

As the hopelessly uncool high school senior, Robbie, the super-sized kid with a gentle soul, was an easy prey to campus bullies and suffered the ultimate humiliation when he was hurled, naked, into center court at a school pep rally.

Hart's character, Calvin Joyner, also known by the impressive nickname, the Golden Jet, was the Big Man on Campus, the King of

Democrats Pull Off Bait and Switch Budget

Assemblyman Travis Allen's Abstains in Protest of California Democrats' Bait and Switch Budget

"Today, in protest of the Sacramento Democrats' all-time high spending package, I abstained to vote in order to highlight California's one party majority budget process which has once again led to historic and unsustainable state spending at the expense of hardworking Californian taxpayers.

"While the Governor has been touting 'fiscal restraint' since January, in a classic bait and switch, Jerry Brown and his Democrat colleagues today displayed the opposite. "What is abundantly clear is that once again Democrats alone are intentionally overspending taxpayer money on a bloated state bureaucracy, high speed rail, expanded welfare programs, and Obamacare in order to create a false "fiscal emergency" that will lead to future calls for higher taxes and borrowing.

"One party domination in California has resulted in the nation's highest taxes, worst regulatory and litigation environment, and created our present day situation where Californians experience the nation's highest poverty rate and businesses leave our state in droves.

"Instead of business as usual and simply pushing the red button in California Republicans' traditional "no vote" on the budget, I abstained as a wake-up call to Californians: Sacramento

Democrats will come back, this November and in future years, to ask for ever increasing taxes, fees, and bond measures to pay for future expenditures ignored by today's irresponsible budget."

Senator Nielsen on Passing of Largest State Budget

The Legislature passed the state budget Wednesday afternoon on a 27 - 11 vote. Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber), Vice Chair of the Senate Budget Committee, issued the following statement:

"This budget is a steadfast attempt at fiscal restraint but not worthy of a yes vote. It is still the largest budget in the history of California; it does little to change how government does business.

"I compliment my colleagues and the Governor for their earnest effort but this budget does not go far enough to plan for a looming recession.

"I don't like the \$10 vehicle license fee increase to every car that will generate \$330 million a year for DMV, of which \$70-\$80 million will continue to be transferred to the General Fund instead of our roads.

"There are significant changes

to regulations and laws that will affect our daily lives including our water rights. These changes include special treatment for marijuana growers slipped into this budget, without public debate or transparency."

Senator Gaines Opposes Wasteful Budget

Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) today issued the following statement regarding the Democrat majority-vote budget bill:

"This massive budget spends a record \$122.5 billion out of the General Fund, an increase of \$6.9 billion from the prior year. While the budget plan does include a meager attempt to save for a rainy day and pay down debt, California still has an estimated \$330 billion in outstanding liabilities, and we need to be routing every single spare dollar towards paying it down.

"The Governor himself has

"California's spending is growing at little over six percent, yet our economy is sitting at a projected two percent growth, this is clearly a ploy to remove the sunset of Proposition 30 and continue to increase taxes in the

state of California," said Chávez.

"This is made apparent by the very fact that we are increasing spending at an alarming rate that our economy simply cannot keep pace with. When the Department of Finance projects a four billion dollar deficit by 2019-2020, there is a problem and that problem is we are passing pork filled unbalanced budgets."

"While there are many things in this budget that are worthy of support: an increase of two billion to the rainy day fund, increased spending of Proposition 98 funds for education and 400 million

in funds for Early Childhood Education, it is a budget that is unsustainable and I fear, just as many Californians fear, a recession that could be worse than what we experienced in 2009," stated Chávez.

'Finding Dory' Fun, but Flawed

The tears of joy and sorrow we shed for "Finding Nemo" are replaced by tears of laughter with "Finding Dory," a flawed, yet rib-tickling sequel to Disney's watertight, undersea treasure of 2003.

The animated fish tale continues one year after the young and disobedient Nemo was reunited with his understandably overprotective dad Merlin (voiced by Albert Brooks). (Yeah, I'm siding with the father - sue me.) Now it's time for Dory (Ellen DeGeneres) to find her long-forgotten parents. Suffering from chronic short-term memory loss, an affliction that caused her to separate from her family in the first place, the bubbly blue tang must rely on her instincts and friends both old and new.

Dory's quest involves more fish, sea birds and marine animals than what would be found in six Monterey Bay Aquariums. Excessiveness is a common sequel mistake, and it's a shame that even the talented filmmakers at Disney and Pixar can't help themselves. Other than the hilarity of a couple of rock-hording sea lions (Idris Elba and Dominic West) and a grumpy octopus (Ed O'Neill), the countless critters

thrown at us are superfluous.

Even more disappointing, too many animals require super powers besides the ability to speak English in order for Dory to meet her goal. It's one thing for a beluga whale (Ty Burrell) to have sensory powers enviable to Superman, but when a mollusk takes the wheel of a runaway truck on a busy highway, the term "jump the shark" becomes way too appropriate. It's one thing for aquarium fish to escape a dentist's office in Baggies, but an octopus hijacking a moving truck? This isn't a Saturday morning cartoon, people.

Despite the occasional sinking feeling of a story that loses its way at times like Nemo and Dory, "Finding Dory" floats

on fun. The rapid-fire gags and puns will require repeat viewing to catch them all, and even though "classic" status won't be attached to the "Finding Nemo" follow-up, anyone who doesn't laugh and laugh loudly watching this sequel is all wet. **3 1/2 of 5 Stars.**

Released alongside "Finding Dory" is an adorable 6-minute short, "Piper." The beach-set film centers on a hungry baby sandpiper learning to overcome hydrophobia. Get to the theater on time because late arrivals will miss some of the most realistic computer animation Pixar has ever done, meaning that the entire industry has ever done, along with a too-cute story sure to put everyone in a good mood for the main attraction. ★

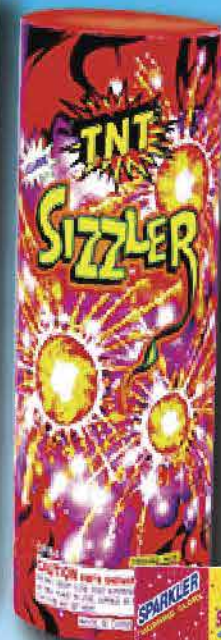
