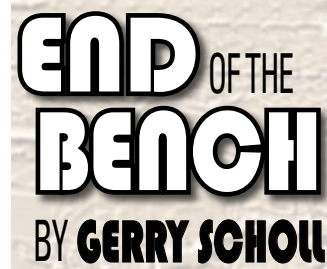

## Breakfast for the Birds



While a green heron surveys nature's buffet in American River shallows, a ruby-eye kite (right) hunts from on high. Breeding season behavior of waders, raptors, and scores of avian species will be observed during the March 19th and 20th Bird and Breakfast fundraiser at Effie Yeaw Nature Center.

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - There is more to ornithology than binoculars and obliging birds. Add a nature preserve resonant with avian song; throw in an expert docent; garnish with breakfast fit for a kingfisher.

You then have the Effie Yeaw Nature Center's popular spring event. Bird and Breakfast is served Saturday and Sunday March 19th and 20th at the center's facility in Ancil Hoffman Park. Reservations are required; the two-day fundraiser sells out every year. Supporters will likely see 40 or more species and no bird gets left behind; Sacramento Audubon guides get as excited about tiny finches as rock-star great blue herons, snowy egrets and—yes, it's just possible—a bald eagle, as the iconic raptors have recently been spotted in the neighborhood.

Equally fascinating are home-building habits during the most industrious time of the avian year. Because eagle-eyed Audubon scouts locate nests with expert ease, visitors will likely see wren, hawk, woodpecker, and titmice abodes. Higher and harder to spot, some hummingbirds will be nesting in March. Nest-watching is enhanced by on-site viewing scopes.

A 26-year spring tradition, the \$40 (\$35 for American River Natural History Association or Audubon members) safari is followed on Saturday by gourmet breakfast. Saturday's foray is for ages 12 and up. Family-friendly Sunday includes kids over six years for \$10 (\$8 for ARNHA or Audubon juniors). Groups are also welcome. On Sunday, Carmichael Kiwanis will serve a pancake breakfast.



Silent auctions of bird-related goodies accompany breakfast. Proceeds assist the Nature Center. Effie Yeaw staffer Betty Cooper promises "it's a rare opportunity to experience animal lifecycles and study the things you often pass by."

## 'Giovanni's Bucket List Vacation' Fund

Local Man Kicks off GoFundMe Account for Boy and Family Laughed off Airplane

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** -

Like most people who read their story, Keith Anthony doesn't know the Phoenix family—7-year-old Giovanni, his mom, Christina Fabian, and dad, Jorge Alvarado—personally, but he was deeply moved by their recent plight when they were removed from an Allegiant Airlines flight after Giovanni began to experience an allergic reaction to a dog that was on the airplane. As many stories reported, passengers applauded as the family—who was attempting a "bucket list" trip due to Jorge's stage-4 terminal throat cancer—exited the airplane.

Anthony, a father of two who lives in Roseville, wanted to make right what he saw as a major lack of compassion—and to help this family take their trips before Alvarado can no longer do so, and launched a GoFundMe page: "Giovanni's Bucket List Vacation" at <https://www.gofundme.com/zqr7vc9k>.

"I want to raise as much money for this family as possible," explained Anthony, who plans to send the money directly to the family. "They need to continue to create memories with their young son as long as they possibly can."

Anthony has been in contact with the Texas television station, NBC affiliate KCEN, which was one of the earliest stations to air the story of the family's plight on Feb. 24th, 2016.

Since Anthony started the GoFundMe fund for the family Southwest Airlines has offered airfare and tickets to Disneyland for the family. Now, any funds raised will be used for medical expenses, Jorge's final expenses, a college fund for Giovanni, or other needs.

Anthony said he will keep the GoFundMe page up as long as families contribute.

## Cooley Working to Save Historic Trademarks

Assemblymen Ken Cooley, Adam Gray, and Frank Bigelow Unite to Introduce New Legislation

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova), Assemblyman Adam Gray (D-Merced), and Assemblyman Frank Bigelow (R-O'Neals) announced recently the AB 2249 bill in response to the U.S. National Park Service's dispute with its concessionaire at Yosemite National Park.

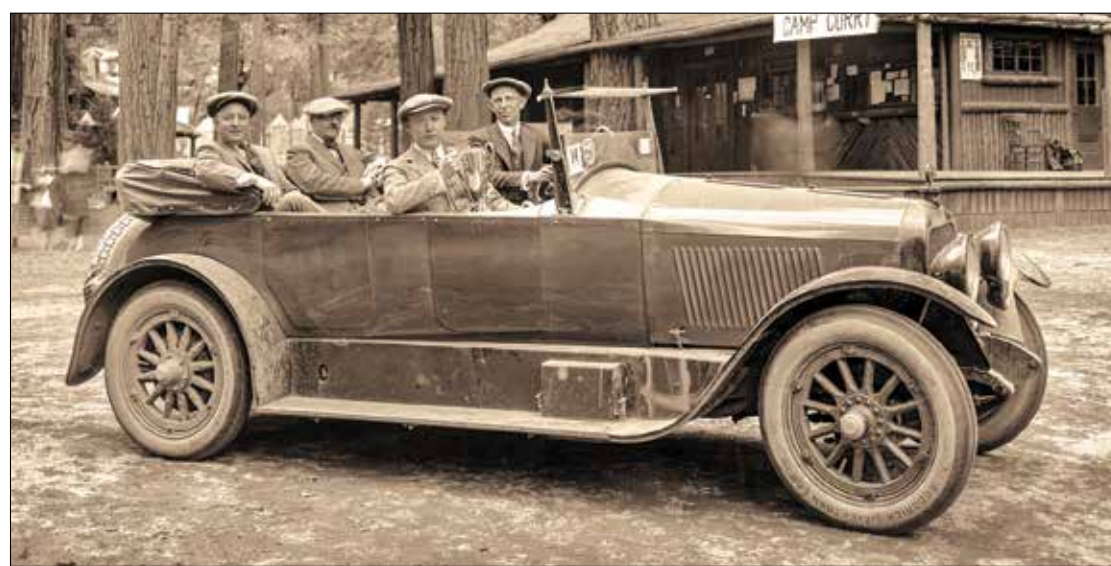
The current concessionaire has operated at the Park since 1993, but after losing its bid to renew its contract it lost its claim to the names of several landmarks—which have existed for many decades more than the current contract—as its intellectual property. Unable to resolve the dispute, the National

Park Service has re-named several historic landmarks.

On March 1st, the Ahwahnee Hotel will become the "Majestic Yosemite Hotel," Curry Village will become "Half Dome Village," the Wawona Hotel will become "Big Trees Lodge" and Badger Pass Ski Area will become the "Yosemite Ski and Snowboard Area."

AB 2249 ensures nothing of the same occurs in a California state park. To keep concessionaires from co-opting state landmarks, this bill adds to state law a prohibition on concessionaires claiming ownership of a name associated with a California state park and declares such a claim disqualifies any bidders from future contracts if they attempt such trademark claims.

"AB 2249 clarifies that in our state parks, an awarded food or lodging contract does not entitle the concessionaire to any legal claim of a trademark," said Assemblyman Cooley. "Moreover, this bill would

disqualify them from further consideration as a bidder if they made any such statement."

"Our state parks are not like football or baseball stadiums, trading sponsorship deals to the highest bidder," said Assemblyman Gray. "The people of California protect and preserve

these landmarks as a part of our history, and it is the people of California who own their storied names."

"I have the privilege of representing Yosemite National Park and know first-hand how treasured these landmarks are by the people of our state," said Assemblyman

Bigelow. "I'm proud to co-author AB 2249 to protect historic sites up and down California."

California's Yosemite National Park is on the short list of America's most magnificent parks and is filled with historic landmarks built decades ago—some

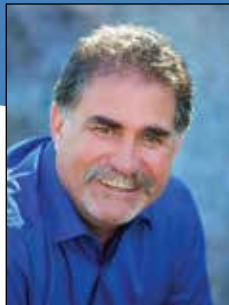

SAHU Supports Bipartisan Budget Package to Delay ACA Healthcare Taxes

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

The Sacramento Association of Health Underwriters (SAHU) applauds the House of Representatives for passing the Omnibus Appropriations Bill that contains provisions that would delay the implementation of the Affordable Care Act's "Cadillac tax" on high-cost health plans and the health insurance tax (HIT) levied on all private health insurance. The budget package will delay the implementation of the Cadillac tax for two years and creates a one-year delay on the HIT.

"This is great news," said SAHU president Marcy McCulloch. "If the Senate follows suit and President Obama signs into law, this will be a big win for employers considering all that they have to do currently to comply with ACA mandates. If implemented, the Cadillac tax

and HIT will push healthcare costs even higher and hurt middle-class workers."

"The Cadillac tax needs to be repealed or aggressively reshaped if it is going to offer any real-world solutions," said Brad Davis, local insurance broker and SAHU board member, "as these taxes do very little to rein in healthcare costs. Hopefully Congress uses the delay to put some serious thought and consideration into how to make this work for Main Street America."

The delay of the Cadillac/excise tax is effective for 2018 and 2019, meaning that without further legislative adjustment or repeal, the tax will now be scheduled to take effect beginning in January 2020. SAHU supports the delay of the Cadillac/excise tax as a short-term measure, but they remain fully committed to a

complete repeal of the tax given its projected widespread impact on employer-provided insurance coverage.

# Library Program Aids Vets

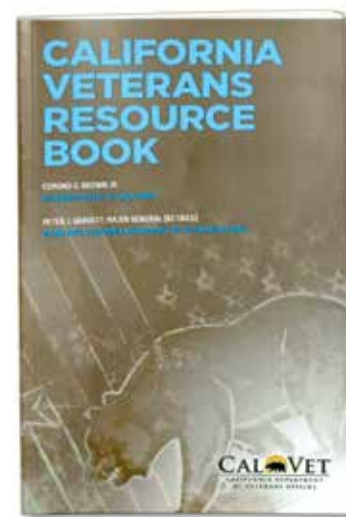

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - A veteran resource station has boosted services offered by Rancho Cordova Public Library. The facility, which opened at the end of January, assists veterans and their families to connect with their benefits.

"We'll help them fill out forms," pledged library Branch Manager Jill Stockinger. "We'll let them access their VA records by computer; we'll refer them to help if they're in crisis or needing food and shelter. This service is much needed in Rancho Cordova. We have many residents who fought in WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and Middle East wars. We also have hundreds of homeless veterans here and in surrounding areas. Some don't know how to get



their benefits. They served us, now we can serve them."

The Veterans Connect @ the Library program has established 28 similar outposts in California. Joining Sacramento Central and Southgate Libraries, Rancho Cordova hosts the third

Sacramento center. Organizers are inviting veterans to attend the Jan. 29th kick-off event, which will feature speakers, music, free refreshments, and free advice. After opening, the station will operate at least three days a week. Veterans and non-veterans of any age are sought as station helpers. Online volunteer training is provided at the library; a commitment of at least two hours per week is requested.

The program is funded by a Library Services and Technology Act grant, administered through California State Library in partnership with the California Department of Veterans Affairs.

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Kaiser Permanente physicians and staff in Sacramento will offer screenings for area residents who may be eligible for free cataract surgeries that will be performed this spring.

The screenings, by appointment only, will be on Saturday, April 16th, at the Kaiser Permanente Point West Medical Offices, 1650 Response Road, Sacramento.

The surgeries are part of Mission Cataract USA, an annual program in which participating doctors provide the sight-restoring procedure

to hundreds of people across the nation who have no health insurance and can't afford the operation. This is Kaiser Permanente's 21st year in the program. Kaiser Permanente physicians and staff will perform as many as 20 free cataract surgeries on eligible individuals in early May.

date back to the 19th century. The Ahwahnee Hotel was built in the 1920s in a valley meadow with the sheer granite of Half Dome as its backdrop; its filing for the National Register of Historic Places explains its name comes from a local Native American word meaning "deep, grassy meadow." Nearby Curry Village is named after the couple who established a summer camp there in 1899. The Wawona Hotel, in the southwest corner of

Yosemite National Park, was originally constructed 140 years ago, in 1876. All three were placed on the National Register of Historic Places in the 1970s.

"Our state parks showcase the beauty and incredible history of California, and should always serve the interests of the people," said Assemblyman Cooley. "This bill is a small but vital act to protect our parks for many future generations of Californians to enjoy."

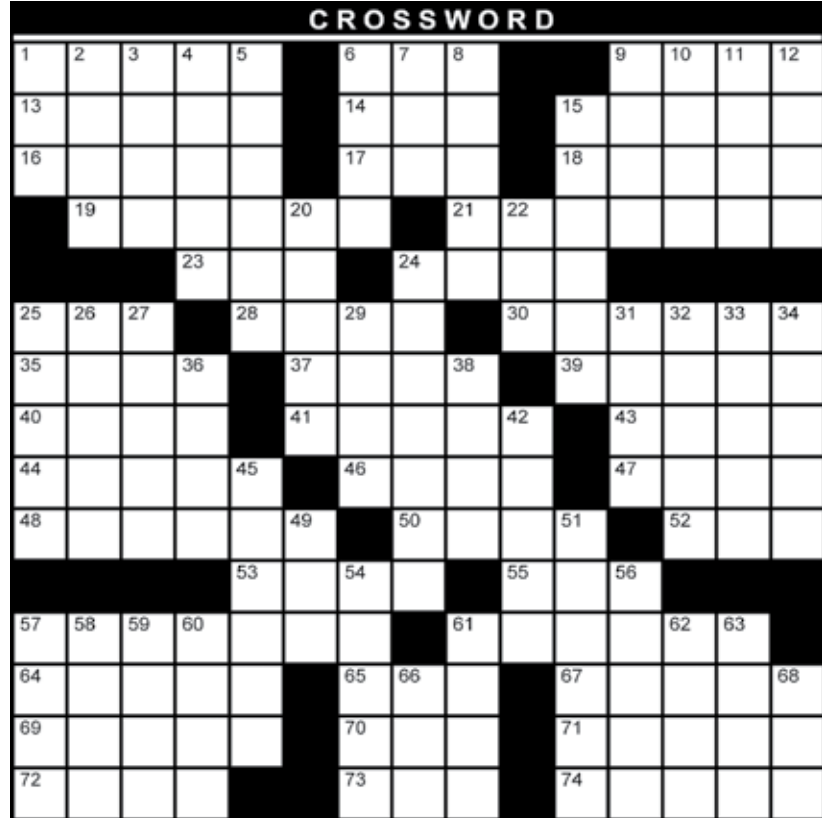

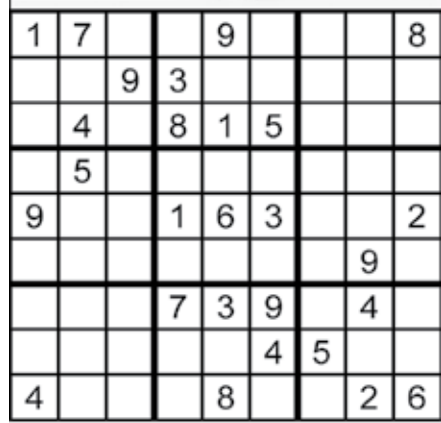

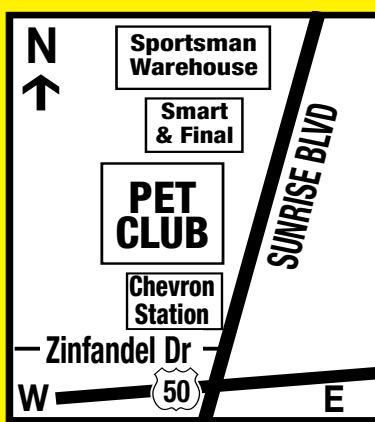

Have you ever picked up a prescription at the pharmacy and opened the bottle to find pills so big that only your horse could swallow them?

You would be afraid to even try to take one out of fear that it would get stuck in your throat and you might choke on it. Maybe you could chop it into pieces or grind it up and sprinkle it on your cereal. One way or another, though, you just have to take your medicine.

# It Takes a Tribe

Thirty-seven years ago, the federal government passed a law to keep Indian children safe. Today that promise, embodied in the Indian Child Welfare Act, is under assault.

America's multibillion-dollar adoption industry and its allies seek to undermine ICWA's enforcement by filing lawsuits they hope to take to the Supreme Court. If successful, the lawsuits would deny tribes of their right—and their duty—to look after the welfare of their children.

As Indian people, we've always known that it's in our children's best interests to stay in their families' homes and to remain connected to their tribes. In 1978, Congress recognized this fact and passed ICWA, which aims to "protect the best interests of Indian children and to promote the stability and security of Indian tribes and families."

Congress passed ICWA because such protections were desperately needed. In the 1970s, state officials would frequently tear Indian children from their homes for reasons of cultural chauvinism and ignorance. Then, children were served up to America's adoption industry. ICWA hoped to stop this cultural genocide by creating a legal presumption that Indian children belong in their own homes or with other family or tribal members.

To guarantee this protection, ICWA gave tribes the ability to intervene in state courts on behalf of tribal children who had

For example, ICWA requires proper notice to parents and tribes of adoption proceedings. This helps ensure all adoptions are fair and transparent. Only those trying to force or illegally procure adoptions would be opposed to such minimum safeguards.

Casey Family Programs, the Child Welfare League of America and several other child welfare organizations, in response to Goldwater's legal challenge, said ICWA "applies the gold standard for child welfare decisions for all children, and unraveling its protections could cause significant harm for Indian children."

These organizations deal with both private adoptions and state foster-care cases. And they all agree that the "ICWA embodies the best practices in child welfare." We've known this for years.

History shows that only Indian people can be counted on to protect their children. The adoption agencies seeking to overturn the ICWA claim that they know what is best for Indian children. But often, their interest lies in collecting adoptions fees quickly and with minimum fuss.

Tribal nations will defend the ICWA with everything they have. Fortunately, President Obama has been a staunch ally in honoring the federal government's promise to uphold the ICWA. This country must not return to a time in which others decide what's best for tribal children.

been removed from their homes. Today, the ability of tribes to protect their children remains vital.

Consider the case of an adoption attorney in Oklahoma who was recently charged with 25 felony counts, including child trafficking. Sadly, those who make a living offering Indian children up for adoption often stoop to dubious tactics. Without ICWA, tribes would be helpless to protect those children.

Yet attacks on the law continue. Recently, the Goldwater Institute—claiming to speak for all Indian children in foster care or up for adoption—filed a lawsuit, hoping to have the Supreme Court declare ICWA un-constitutional.

This would strip Indian children of the law's valuable protections. The Court would have to decide that it knows the best interests of tribal children better than their tribes do. This would be breathtakingly arrogant and ignore the repeated failures of the United States to protect tribal children.

# The Populist Revolution: Bernie and Beyond

The world is undergoing a populist revival. From the revolt against austerity led by the Syriza Party in Greece and the Podemos Party in Spain, to Jeremy Corbyn's surprise victory as Labour leader in the UK, to Donald Trump's ascendancy in the Republican polls, to Bernie Sanders' surprisingly strong challenge to Hillary Clinton—contenders with their fingers on the popular pulse are surging ahead of their establishment rivals.

Today's populist revolt mimics an earlier one that reached its peak in the US in the 1890s. Then it was all about challenging Wall Street, reclaiming the government's power to create money, curing rampant deflation with US Notes (Greenbacks) or silver coins (then considered the money of the people), nationalizing the banks, and establishing a central bank that actually responded to the will of the people.

Over a century later, Occupy Wall Street revived the populist challenge, armed this time with the Internet and mass media to spread the word. The Occupy movement shined a spotlight on the corrupt culture of greed unleashed by deregulating Wall Street, widening the yawning gap between the 1 percent and the 99 percent and destroying jobs, households, and the economy.

Donald Trump's populist campaign has not focused much on Wall Street; but Bernie Sanders' has, in spades. Sanders

has picked as will so will I figure up the baton where Occupy left off, and the disenfranchised Millennials who composed that movement have flocked behind him.

### The Failure of Regulation

Sanders' focus on Wall Street has forced his opponent Hillary Clinton to respond to the challenge. Clinton maintains that Sanders' proposals sound good but "will never make it in real life." Her solution is largely to preserve the status quo while imposing more bank regulation.

That approach, however, was already tried with the Dodd-Frank Act, which has not solved the problem although it is currently the longest and most complicated bill ever passed by the US legislature. Dodd-Frank purported to eliminate bailouts, but it did this by replacing them with "bail-ins"—confiscating the funds of bank creditors, including depositors, to keep too-big-to-fail banks afloat. The costs were merely shifted from the people-as-taxpayers to the people-as-creditors.

Worse, the massive tangle of new regulations has hamstrung the smaller community banks that make the majority of loans to small and medium sized businesses, which in turn create most of the jobs. More regulation would simply force more community banks to sell out to their larger competitors, making the too-bigs even bigger.

In any case, regulatory tweaking has proved to be an inadequate response. Banks backed by an army of lobbyists simply get the laws changed, so that what was formerly criminal behavior becomes legal. (See, e.g., CitiGroup's redrafting of the "push out" rule in December 2015 that completely vitiated the legislative intent.)

What Sanders is proposing, by contrast, is a real financial revolution, a fundamental change in the system itself. His proposals include eliminating Too Big to Fail by breaking up the

biggest banks; protecting consumer deposits by reinstating the Glass-Steagall Act (separating investment from depository banking); reviving postal banks as safe depository alternatives; and reforming the Federal Reserve, enlisting it in the service of the people.

### Time to Revive the Original Populist Agenda?

Sanders' proposals are a good start. But critics counter that breaking up the biggest banks would be costly, disruptive and destabilizing; and it would not eliminate Wall Street corruption and mismanagement.

Banks today have usurped the power to create the national money supply. As the Bank of England recently acknowledged, banks create money whenever they make loans. Banks determine who gets the money and on what terms. Reducing the biggest banks to less than \$50 billion in assets (the Dodd-Frank limit for "too big to fail") would not make them more trustworthy stewards of that power and privilege.

How can banking be made to serve the needs of the people and the economy, while preserving the more functional aspects of today's highly sophisticated global banking system? Perhaps it is time to reconsider the proposals of the early populists. The direct approach to "occupying" the banks is to simply step into their shoes and make them public utilities. Insolvent megabanks can be nationalized—as they were before 2008. (More on that shortly.)

Making banks public utilities can happen on a local level as well. States and cities can establish publicly-owned depository banks on the highly profitable and efficient model of the Bank of North Dakota. Public banks can partner with community banks to direct credit where it is needed locally; and they can reduce the costs of government by recycling bank profits for public use, eliminating outsized Wall Street fees and obviating the need for

derivatives to mitigate risk.

At the federal level, not only can postal banks serve as safe depositories and affordable credit alternatives, but the central bank can provide it just a source of interest-free credit for the nation — as was done, for example, with Canada's central bank from 1939 to 1974. The U.S. Treasury could also reclaim the power to issue, not just pocket change, but a major portion of the money supply—as was done by the American colonists in the 18th century and by President Abraham Lincoln in the 19th century.

### Nationalization: Not As Radical As It Sounds

Radical as it sounds today, nationalizing failed megabanks was actually standard operating procedure before 2008. Nationalization was one of three options open to the FDIC when a bank failed. The other two were (1) closure and liquidation, and (2) merger with a healthy bank. Most failures were resolved using the merger option, but for very large banks, nationalization was sometimes considered the best choice for taxpayers. The leading U.S. example was Continental Illinois, the seventh-largest bank in the country when it failed in 1984. The FDIC wiped out existing shareholders, infused capital, took over bad assets, replaced senior management, and owned the bank for about a decade, running it as a commercial enterprise.

What was a truly radical departure from accepted practice was the unprecedented wave of government bailouts after the 2008 banking crisis. The taxpayers bore the losses, while culpable bank management not only escaped civil and criminal penalties but made off with record bonuses.

In a July 2012 article in The New York Times titled "Wall Street Is Too Big to Regulate," Gar Alperovitz noted that the five biggest banks—JPMorgan Chase, Bank of America, Citigroup, Wells Fargo and Goldman Sachs—then had combined assets

amounting to more than half the nation's economy. He wrote:

"With high-paid lobbyists contesting every proposed regulation, it is increasingly clear that big banks can never be effectively controlled as private businesses. If an enterprise (or five of them) is so large and so concentrated that competition and regulation are impossible, the most market-friendly step is to nationalize its functions.

"Nationalization isn't as difficult as it sounds. We tend to forget that we did, in fact, nationalize General Motors in 2009; the government still owns a controlling share of its stock. We also essentially nationalized the American International Group, one of the largest insurance companies in the world, and the government still owns roughly 60 percent of its stock."

A more market-friendly term than nationalization is "receivership"—taking over insolvent banks and cleaning them up. But as Dr. Michael Hudson observed in a 2009 article, real nationalization does not mean simply imposing losses on the government and then selling the asset back to the private sector. He wrote:

"Real nationalization occurs when governments act in the public interest to take over private property. ...Nationalizing the banks along these lines would mean that the government would supply the nation's credit needs. The Treasury would become the source of new money, replacing commercial bank credit. Presumably this credit would be lent out for economically and socially productive purposes, not merely to inflate asset prices while loading down households and business with debt as has occurred under today's commercial bank lending policies."

### A Network of Locally-Controlled Public Banks

"Nationalizing" the banks implies top-down federal control, but this need not be the result. We

could have a system of publicly-owned banks that were locally controlled, operating independently to serve the needs of their own communities.

As noted earlier, banks create the money they lend simply by writing it into accounts. Money comes into existence as a debit in the borrower's account, and it is extinguished when the debt is repaid. This happens at a grassroots level through local banks, creating and destroying money organically according to the demands of the community. Making these banks public institutions would differ from the current system only in that the banks would have a mandate to serve the public interest, and the profits would be returned to the local government for public use.

Although most of the money supply would continue to be created and destroyed locally as loans, there would still be a need for the government-issued currency envisioned by the early populists, to fill gaps in demand as needed to keep supply and demand in balance. This could be achieved with a national dividend issued by the federal Treasury to all citizens, or by "quantitative easing for the people" as envisioned by Jeremy Corbyn, or by quantitative easing targeted at infrastructure.

For decades, private sector banking has been left to its own devices. The private-only banking model has been thoroughly tested, and it has proven to be a disastrous failure. We need a banking system that truly serves the needs of the people, and that objective can best be achieved with banks that are owned and operated by and for the people.

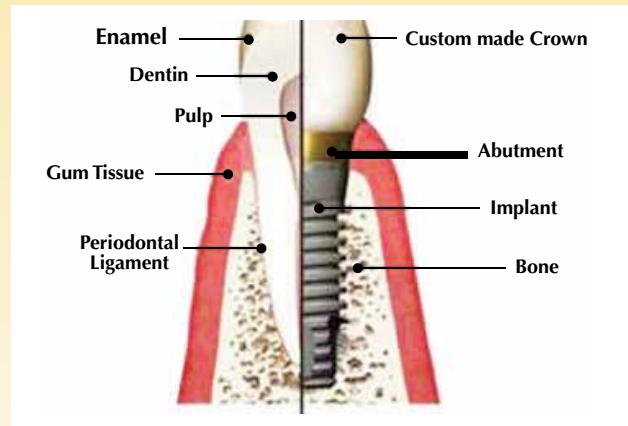
