

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Basketball legend, humanitarian and former Carmichael resident Vlade Divac has been named 2016 Person of the Year by the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce. Now general manager for the Sacramento Kings, the gentle giant will receive his honor at the Chamber awards banquet on April 8th.

The celebration will be among inaugural events at the new Milagro Centre on Fair Oaks Boulevard.

Learn About the Criminal Justice System

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, the Sacramento Police Department and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department are proud to announce their 16th Annual Citizens Academy.

The Academy was created to improve communication, foster a better understanding and develop relationships between members of the criminal justice system and citizens, including those from different ethnic, cultural, and faith-based communities. Since the start of the academy in 2002, there have been 15 graduating classes with more than 860 participants.

The program provides an overview of the criminal justice system (law enforcement roles, responsibilities and challenges) and engages citizens from all backgrounds in discussion, participation, and mutual learning about issues within the criminal justice system. Return Preparer Fraud is on the IRS Annual "Dirty Dozen" List of Tax Scams to Avoid **During the 2016 Filing Season**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Internal Revenue Service is warning taxpayers to be on the lookout for unscrupulous return preparers, one of the most common "Dirty Dozen" tax scams seen during tax season.

The vast majority of tax professionals provide honest, high-quality service. But there are some dishonest preparers who set up shop each filing season to perpetrate refund fraud, identity theft, and other scams that hurt taxpayers.

"Choose your tax return preparer carefully because you entrust them with your private financial information that needs to be protected," said IRS Commissioner John Koskinen.

Illegal scams can lead to significant penalties and interest and possible criminal prosecution. **IRS** Criminal Investigation works closely with the Department of Justice (DOJ) to shutdown scams and prosecute the criminals behind them.

Here are a few tips when choosing a tax preparer:

- •Ask if the preparer has an IRS Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN). Paid tax return preparers are required to register with the IRS, have a PTIN and include it on your tax return.
- •Inquire whether the tax return preparer has a professional credential (enrolled agent, certified public accountant, or attorney), belongs to a professional organization or attends continuing education classes. A number of tax law changes, including the Affordable Care Act provisions, can be complex. A competent tax professional needs to be up-to-date in these matters. Tax return preparers aren't required to have a professional credential, but make sure you understand the qualifications of the preparer you select. IRS.gov has more information regarding the national tax professional organizations.

•Check the preparer's qualifications. Use the IRS Directory of Federal Tax Return Preparers with Credentials and Select Qualifications. This tool can help you find a tax return preparer with the qualifications that you prefer. The Directory is a searchable and sortable listing of certain preparers registered with the IRS. It includes the name, city, state and zip code of: Attorneys, CPAs, Enrolled Agents, Enrolled Retirement Plan Agents, Enrolled Actuaries, Annual Filing Season Program participants.

- Check the preparer's history. Ask the Better Business Bureau about the preparer. Check for disciplinary actions and the license status for credentialed preparers. For CPAs, check with the State Board of Accountancy. For attorneys, check with the State Bar Association. For Enrolled Agents, go to IRS.gov and search for "verify enrolled agent status" or check the Directory.
- Ask about service fees. Avoid preparers who base fees on a percentage of their client's refund. Also avoid those who boast bigger refunds than their competition. Make sure that your refund goes directly to you-not into your preparer's bank account.
- •Ask to e-file your return. Make sure your preparer offers IRS e-file. Paid preparers who do taxes for more than 10 clients generally must file electronically. The IRS has processed more than 1.5 billion e-filed tax returns. It's the safest and most accurate way to file a return.
- •Provide records and receipts. Good preparers will ask to see your records and receipts. They'll ask questions to determine your total income, deductions, tax credits and other items. Do not rely on a preparer who is willing to e-file your

return using your last pay stub instead of your Form W-2. This is against IRS e-file rules.

- •Make sure the preparer is available. In the event questions come up about your tax return, you may need to contact your preparer after the return is filed. Avoid fly-by-night preparers.
- Understand who can represent you. Attorneys, CPAs, and enrolled agents can represent any client before the IRS in any situation. Non-credentialed tax return preparers who participate in the IRS Annual Filing Season Program, can represent clients in limited situations. However, other tax return preparers cannot represent clients before the IRS on any returns prepared and filed after Dec. 31st, 2015.
- •Never sign a blank return. Don't use a tax preparer that asks you to sign an incomplete or blank tax form.
- Review your return before signing. Before you sign your tax return, review it and ask questions if something is not clear. Make sure vou're comfortable with the accuracy of the return before you sign it.
- •Report abusive tax preparers to the IRS. You can report abusive tax return preparers and suspected tax fraud to the IRS. Use Form 14157, Complaint: Tax Return Preparer. If you suspect a return preparer filed or changed the return without your consent, you should also file Form 14157-A, Return Preparer Fraud or Misconduct Affidavit. You can get these forms on IRS. gov.

Residents Talk Transients and Scammers

Sheriff's Deputies Discuss Neighborhood Security

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - On Jan. 26th, Sacramento County Sheriff officers from all three shifts-morning, swing and graveyard—were on hand at La Vista School in Fair Oaks to discuss neighborhood security at a community sheriff's meeting with local residents and participants in active neighborhood watch groups. Deputies talked about projects they have been working on in the area, and members of the public expressed concerns and posed questions about suspicious activity in several Fair Oaks neighborhoods.

The main speaker of the evening was Deputy Jason Gillock, who is responsible for the Carmichael, Orangevale, Old Foothill Farms, and Fair Oaks areas. One issue that Gillock highlighted was the prevalence of a variety of ongoing scams, both by telephone and door-todoor solicitation. There is, for example, a so-called "grandma scam" that occurs when an elderly resident receives a phone call from a speaker who starts the conservation with words like, 'Hi, Grandma (or Grandpa). It's your grandson/ daughter." The scammer then proceeds to elicit as much personal information as possible before the resident realizes what is going on. Other scams include callers posing as representatives of local electric and gas companies, banks, and even the I.R.S. Sheriff's deputies urged the public to be extremely cautious when answering the telephone.

Another pressing problem, which is mostly the concern of the County Sheriff's Transient Enforcement Team, is the acute rise of suspicious activity throughout Sacramento County arising from the

homeless population. North Crime Prevention Specialist, Sherrie Carhart, said that, "One of the big complaints we get is people hanging out in front of businesses asking for money." Carhart also told the story of a local resident who did not realize that a transient had been camping out in her backyard for over two months. Sergeant Michael Haynes remarked that residents should report the presence of vacant houses in local neighborhoods, since unoccupied homes are a magnet for squatters and transients.

Since so much of this activity goes unreported by the public, law enforcement officers face a daunting challenge in their attempt to monitor and control incidents of suspicious transient activity, as well as the confidence tricks and scams, which they mentioned at Tuesday evening's meeting. In this regard, Sergeant Haynes mentioned one instance of "an older Russian gentleman who goes from house to house telling people that he's down on his luck and needs

help. We hear talk about him, but no one ever reports him." Unreported cases like these are more common than most people think, and if the sheriff is not informed about them, they continue to be a nuisance to the community.

In light of these difficulties, Officer Gillock encouraged the public to be diligent in reporting any and all suspicious activity. There are a number of ways this can be done. "We have on online reporting system," remarked Gillock, as well as the numerous telephone numbers through which the public can access the relevant branch of the sheriff's office. Apart from 911, a few of these numbers include the sheriff's non-emergency line at (916) 874-5115 and the sheriff's emergency number at (916) 974-5111. Nuisance complaints involving activities such as abandoned shopping carts, illegal dumping, street light problems, and vacant or dangerous buildings can be reported by dialing 311.

Andy Warhol: Portraits Coming in March to the Crocker Art Museum

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The status symbol of the disco era was the commissioned Warhol portrait. Opening in March 2016 at the Crocker Art Museum, "Andy Warhol: Portraits" features more than 160 works exploring the development of the artist's iconic portrayal of the famous or wealthy. Included are Polaroids, fashion sketches, photo-booth film strips, and more. Visitors will also have the interactive opportunity to create their own Warhol Screen Test using a 1960s film camera outfitted for the digital era.

"Andy Warhol: Portraits" spans Warhol's lifelong preoccupation with self-portraits in addition to images of the 20th-century luminaries who eagerly sat for him. Featured in this career survey are fashion scion Yves Saint Laurent, playwright Tennessee Williams, Pulitzer-Prize winner Truman Capote, and artists Keith Haring, Robert Mapplethorpe, and Jean-Michel Basquiat. Actors Judy Garland, Jane Fonda, and Sylvester Stallone epitomize Warhol's fascination with Hollywood and filmmaking.

"Celebrity fascination never goes out of style. It evolves with us generation by generation, through the transformation of media," said Crocker Curator Diana L. Daniels. "Andy Warhol was an original in making us lust for what we already have in abundance: images of sex appeal, power, and wealth."

Significantly, it was Warhol's commissioned portraits that became synonymous with power and beauty, wealth and accomplishment. The basis for Warhol's paintings was always his



presentation effaced the notion of the sitter's originality, or being one-of-a-kind.

The exhibition, which runs through June 19th, 2016, will be complemented by additional Museum programming, including portrait-making workshops for youth in March and April, live performances, Warhol-inspired parties, a symposium, and more. The Crocker is the only California venue for this career survey, which was organized by The Andy Warhol Museum, one of the four Carnegie Museums of Pittsburgh.

The Crocker Art Museum was the first art museum in the Western U.S. and is one of the leading art museums in California today. Established in 1885, the Museum features one of the country's finest collections of Californian art, exceptional holdings of master drawings, a comprehensive collection of international ceramics, as well as European, Asian, African, and Oceanic art. The Crocker is located at 216 O Street in downtown Sacramento. Museum hours are 10 a.m.-5 p.m., Tuesday-Sunday; 10 a.m.-9 p.m., Thursdays. 

Unconditional Love: The 'Project Love More' Interview with Alan Cosio

In a previous article "Say Hello Before Saying Goodbye," I explore how to support those experiencing loss by exercising unconditional love to those enduring terminal illness. As I began to explore this subject, an opportunity arose to interview Alan Cosio, founder of Project Love More. In October 2014, Alan lost his wife in a solo auto accident. Grappling at the hows and whys of this massive tragedy, Alan, a former youth pastor and now a single father of six, felt compelled to lead his family through this tragic episode in their lives with a radical approach. Either he could collapse and retreat, or he could choose to be thankful for all that he still had... and an unprecedented opportunity to move forward with unwavering purpose.

"You never know what a day will bring," Alan told me. "When we feel we have given all the love we have, we must to commit to love more!" His destiny now points to a deepening need to share his story. Alan insists, "We can, we must, we will...move forward with intention and purpose under any circumstance." In this inspiring interview, Alan shares his quest to equip us all with the power of unconditional love. This is the first of a four-part series Love, Hope, Mercy and Grace.

Part 1: Love

Davenport: Please share how "Project Love More" began.

Cosio: I refer to my start point as origins. I was blessed to experience a loving marriage with my best friend for nearly twenty years. When her life ended, I had an opportunity to reflect on our time together in a very profound way. As I spoke about this cathartic experience, I noticed that my story touched those who received it and those same individuals asked for more. When my grown daughter Jenny suggested I write a book on the subject of my own transformation, something clicked and "Project Love More" was born.

Davenport: How do *you* define unconditional love?

Cosio: I like to define unconditional love as loving without expecting anything in return. Love is the cornerstone of life and we are predisposed for love. It is biblical in nature, with multitudes of volumes written and sung about love concepts for centuries. The Greeks have six forms of love: four of which are eros, romantic love; *phileo*, brotherly love; *storge*, parental love; and agape, God's love for all. When I speak of love as unconditional, I desire to convey the healing power that comes from giving and receiving of this special love as a way of life

Davenport: Can you give us examples of unconditional love?

Cosio: In this journey of my life, I've discovered the meaning of what it is to love and be loved. Most importantly, the experience of unconditional love is something I will never forget. One example stands out when my late wife, Kathy, without hesitation, joyfully stepped in to care for my grown daughter's toddler son during her deployment in the US Army...twice! She loved on that child like he was her own. And he was a high-spirted boy!

The intriguing aspect of unconditional love is that usually it doesn't come naturally for everyone. Then, you may have difficulty in knowing the difference between unconditional love verses unaccountable love or even dysfunctional enabling love. The importance of knowing how to recognize this pure form of love is critical to receive and dispense it in a healthy, functional way.

Davenport: Thank you, Alan!

In an attempt to convey the intangibles of love concepts, Alan strives to unravel the power of choice in how we actuate love. 

Working-**Class Zeros**

We live in the age of working-class discontent, which, if it wasn't obvious before, has been made plain by the passions roiling 2016 presidential politics.

The media's preferred description of the average Republican voter has often been "the angry white male." This was crudely simplistic and meant to be pejorative. If the press wants to update the descriptor, it should refer to "the despairing white male." Or more accurately, the despairing white working class.

White working-class life in America has been in a slow-motion disintegration for decades, and it shows. The white working class is an archipelago of hopelessness. It is in a funk about the economy (almost 80 percent think we are still in a recession) and, more fundamentally, the American future.

According to the American Values Survey conducted by the Public Religion Research Institute, only about 40 percent of the white working class say the country's best days are ahead. This is not only lower than college-educated whites (53 percent), but much lower than blacks (60 percent) and Hispanics (56 percent). It is astonishing to think that the white working class has a dimmer view of the nation's future than blacks, who have been historically discriminated against and still lag badly on almost every socio-economic indicator.

As noted by the National Journal's acute analyst Ronald Brownstein, a survey for The Pew Charitable Trusts picked up the same finding a few years ago. It asked people whether they expected to be better off in 10 years. Whereas two-thirds of blacks and Hispanics said "yes," only 44 percent of whites without a college degree said the same.

We are conditioned by the media to be obsessed with race, when class is an increasingly important divider. (No one ever earnestly says on a cable-TV show that we need to have "a conversation about class in America.") The class divide among whites shows up again and again on questions about the fairness of the country.

The American Values Survey finds that white working-class Americans distrust institutions like the government and business more

than college-educated whites do; they are more likely to think that their vote doesn't matter because of the influence of wealthy interests; they are more likely to think that hard work doesn't necessarily lead to success.

There is a sense among workingclass whites that America has gone off the rails, and has been that way for a long time. Sixty-two percent of them say American culture has gotten worse since the 1950s.

Besides the economic battering that lower-skilled workers have taken in recent decades, the working class is increasingly disconnected from the institutions that lend meaning and hope to people's lives: marriage, the workforce, churches and other institutions of civil society.

They believe that the long-standing American promise of a country where children are better off than their parents has been betrayed, and they sense that their time is past -- a sense reinforced by a pop culture that tends to consider them afterthoughts, or fitting subjects for mockery.

Although smaller than it once was, the white working class remains about 40 percent of the electorate. Its travails can't -- and won't -- be ignored.

pretty mellow (for cats, anyway), you can try to desensitize Jessup somewhat.

Do this by gradually reintroducing all the pets into one room. You'll need a helper for this. First, bring in Jessup and command him to sit or lie down and stay next to you. Keep a supply of treats in your pocket.

Next, have your helper bring in one of the cats, cradled in their arms or, if necessary, in a carrier. They should sit down across the room where Jessup can see them. If and when Jessup begins to react, tell him to sit and stay. Give him a treat if he obeys.

Do this for only a minute or so at first, and gradually extend the time each day. Avoid getting frustrated. If you can get Jessup to stay just a short time by your side and then calmly leave the room, that would be a big victory.





No Ship of Fools for These Cruise Acts

Garry Carson has heard it thousands of times on cruise ship elevators and as passengers walk into the theater where he's about to perform: "I don't like magic, but let's see if the guy is any good."

Some entertainers would have bruised egos not being recognized in a crowded place, especially one as small as an elevator. But after working cruise ships for roughly 5 months a year for 18 years, the well-traveled comedy magician knows the life of taking an act on the road where there are no roads.

"These people are not there because they love or even like magic," said Carson, pointing out a big difference between playing land-based shows and those on the high seas. Except for special sailings featuring live performances by major acts, virtually no one books a cruise based on the onboard entertainment.

Then there's the matter of demographics. Carson has noticed that the funny stuff that kills in the United States, United Kingdom, and Australia doesn't get the same reaction in Asia. "I have to get into the mindset of not relying on the comedy being as strong as the magic and mystery or laughter being as loud if I'm performing in certain areas of the world," Carson

It's not just an international hurdle for these guest performers; audiences on cruises out of Long Beach and San Pedro aren't the same as those embarking in New York and Galveston. References about grunge rock and coffee houses might work on Alaskan cruises sailing out of Seattle, but greeted with crickets on itineraries originating from Miami.

This hurdle is higher for standup comedians, hypnotists and, as Carson knows, magicians because their acts inherently rely heavily on audience participation. As Carson noted during a recent Mexican Riviera cruise out of San Pedro, on the Norwegian Jewel, people go on faith, expecting to laugh if it's a comedy act, be amazed if it's a magic show and do both if a hypnotist is about to go on stage.

What's a cruise ship entertainer to do?

"An old clown gave me this piece of advice: Never play the audience," said veteran comedian Chas Elstner, who before doing stand-up on 300 cruises and at countless land-based clubs was going for yucks as a featured clown for Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey. "There are so many nuances that you just sort of have to play through it all."

Elstner, from inside Carnival Conquest's Punchliner Comedy

Club, elaborated on what types of nuances.

"Like with cruises out of L.A., it seems the first night is hit or miss," he said. "They take a day to get energized. It can't be because they're tired from traveling since most live within a short drive to the port. I can't figure it out. But then the second and third night, it's like, oh my God, California audiences just become wonderful "

For cruises out of the East Coast, New York in particular, Elstner said audiences take their time warming up to a comic. "They want you to prove you're a funny guy first, and then they'll allow you to do your act," he said.

Tough crowds have also been the experience for master hypnotist Asad Mecci with cruises out of New York.

"You really have to hammer them right away," said the Toronto-based entertainer. "New Yorkers want to see how confident you are on stage. If they feel as though you're hesitating when you're delivering your lines they will definitely make trouble for you. When New Yorkers love you they really love you. When they hate you they really hate you."

Cruises leaving Los Angeles area ports draw audiences that are, in Mecci's words, "more chilled out and relaxed."

"It is stereotypical but it's the

back, chilled out, relaxed, fun group of people."

His take on audiences from southern states depends on whether they hail mostly from Dixie, meaning out of such ports as New Orleans and Mobile, or the handful of Floridian harbors.

"Southerners, in particular, are really rooting for you," Mecci said. "Out of Florida you'll get some cat calls and other types of heckling, where in New Orleans it's dead quiet during the parts I'm telling jokes and tales."

Mecci stopped short when asked which region of the U.S. spawns the most entertaining hypnotized subjects, but he did say that participants out of New Orleans are a blast.

"I just think their energy level is super high," he said. "They're excited to be in the theater watching the show and that kind of translates on stage as well."

As a comic, turned cruise director, turned comic, Mark Hawkins has performed before audiences of all regions many times over. While he'll respond with an "of course" when asked if L.A. cruisers are different than those from New York—"You can see that just walking around the ship" -he says that regional variances disappear as they enter the lounge.

"When they become an audience, the reality is people are people," Hawkins said moments before taking the Punchliner stage aboard the Carnival Conquest. "The demographics are very different, but the people are very much the same."

A pet peeve of Hawkins, one of the few he doesn't joke about in his act, is the myopia of certain comics, particularly those who pander to audiences with regional material just for easy laughs.

"There's comedians who bring a Southern act to cruises out of Texas and doing jokes that start with, 'Hey, how many people here love the Waffle House?,' and they get immediate applause. They are these things peppered in the act to get applause, and comedians who

truth," he said. "They're a laid do this annoy me because they're when he opened for the group and insulting the audience. I hate when people say people in the South are stupid. They're not. They're smart, they're cool, they're hip, and you should treat them like they're smart and cool and hip.

"It annoys me when comics complain about regional differences. Yes, they have different accents, but they're still just people—they're married, they've got problems, and when you stop treating them like they're different they treat you with more respect."

Hawkins describes his act as "very personal," drawing much of his material from being a husband and father of two daughters just doing as best he can. "About 10 years ago I found there are certain things that are universal and I made the show as common as I could. It's hard to offend somebody when I'm talking about me."

Another cruise favorite whose shows are personal in nature is musical comedian Steve Moris. Working for Princess, Disney, Royal Caribbean, and Celebrity,

would jam with Brian Wilson and gang during concerts. Because his routines are heavy on classic Baby Boomer-era tunes, and yarns about how he and his siblings were parented and comical self-deprecation, Moris said he doesn't feel the need to modify material based on where a cruise originates.

"No matter where I go working cruise ships, everybody loves the music-it cuts right through," said Moris from the Regal Princess' Vista Lounge, where he performed to an audience the prior night. "I don't change the act because I talk about growing up as a Baby Boomer, and everyone can relate to what mom and dad did. The music I add to the act is universal."

That doesn't mean he considers his crowds as cookie-cutter. His takes on playing before East Coast and West Coast prove that.

"The toughest crowds I may have-may have-are from the New York area, which is ironic because both sides of my fam-

So which is it? We've heard it a million times that "defense wins championships," but you cannot win anything without at least a little offense in the mix.

Certainly, offense was at a premium Sunday in Super Bowl 50 at Levi's Stadium, where the Denver Broncos' defense led the way in a 24-10 upset over the Carolina Panthers.

Teams with top defenses have been winning the most recent Super Bowls, but over the last eight title games offenses have averaged just under 30 points.

Denver's offense didn't have to do much. The Broncos' defense scored on a fumble recovery and set up "drives" of minus-1 and 4 yards that resulted in 10 points. Denver's 11 first downs and meager 104 passing yards and 194 total yards was just enough. It could be argued that -- without including turnovers -- Carolina's defense was the better defense. Carolina earned 21 first downs and 315 total yards.

One thing is for sure, dominating defenses (unless that is the thing you love most) lend themselves to aesthetically displeasing football. This not-so-Super-Bowl featured 15 punts, a sub-.500 pass completion rate, seven fumbles (four lost), six turnovers, 12 sacks, 18 penalties for 153 yards, four out 29 possible third-down conversions and a 3.9 yards-per-play average. Great D combined with lousy O equals: Ugly!

This was a matchup between the top-rated Denver defense and the top scoring-offense of Carolina. But Carolina's defense had created the most turnovers (39) during the regular season, added nine more in two playoff games and had a plus-20 differential, while Denver's D had created 27, but the Broncos also gave up 31. It was the Panthers' four inopportune turnovers that proved to be the difference in their loss.

Some have claimed that the latest version of Denver's Orange Crush defense was the greatest defense of all time, even though if Carolina had not coughed up three fumbles the Panthers' D might have been seen as the better one on this day.

Besides that, there's the 1985 Chicago Bears, widely considered to have possessed the most dominating defense ever. That unit allowed only 12.4 ppg. and had two playoff shutouts (combined 45-0 score) before stifling the New England Patriots 46-10 in Super Bowl XX, led by Hall of Fame linebacker and former Forty Niners head coach Mike Singletary and defensive coordinator Buddy Ryan's famed "46 defense." The Bears held the Patriots to minus-19 yards in the first half and a total of seven yards rushing for the game. Watching highlights of that Super Bowl along with ESPN's recent "30 for 30" show about that team, it's easy to say the Broncos were not even close. And, how about Pittsburgh's Steel Curtain, the 49ers' great defensive teams, or the original Orange Crush?

Interestingly, the Panthers entered the game as the No.-2 rushing team this season at 142.6 per game, but facing Denver's No.-3 rushing defense they elected to open things up and attack the Broncos' No.-1ranked pass defense instead. That's the same tactic the Patriots tried in 1985; it failed both times.

There is no defense for Panthers QB Cam Newton's poor-sport behavior post game. After bringing great joy to his teammates with his enthusiastic histrionics and "Dabbing" dance throughout Carolina's 17-1 mark going into the game (while many others took offense to him having a bit too much fun), "Superman" was out of character after the game. His short, terse answers and abrupt departure from his press conference were not well received. Combining that with his failure to pounce on a fumble late in the game, rather than "Dabbing," his reputation went into "Moon Walk" mode, sliding backwards.

Meanwhile, Broncos QB Peyton Manning's "rep" received a boost, winning his second Super Bowl while on his way out with his probable retirement, after becoming the oldest (39) QB to start a Super Bowl. His "rep" as a product "rep" also received a boost, as he deftly made it clear that he drinks Gatorade before a game and celebrates victories with his good buddy Weiser. "The Sheriff" is quick on the draw.

Your Golden State Warriors, on the other hand, would be quick to tell you that the best offense is a great defense, but everyone else would tell you it is the Warriors' offense that is the best defense because other NBA teams simply cannot keep up. The Warriors fast-paced offense led them to last season's title and has been paving the way to their record-setting mark of 46-4 through Monday, with league-leading (by wide margins) statistics of 115.4 ppg. and 42.7% three-point shooting.

Good offense, alone, is surely not the answer. As analyst Jerry Reynolds often says about Sacramento, offense is not the problem for the Kings. They rank third in the NBA at 106.9 ppg., but are last in defense, allowing 109.1. Commentator Doug Christie recently stated one of his "keys to the game" for the Kings was "basketball." --- meaning both offense and defense.

Slipping farther from their shot at the eighth and final playoff spot in the Western Conference has led to the conversation that coach George Karl's head coaching position is in jeopardy. Will the dysfunctional Kings soon be under the guidance of their ninth coach since the 2006-07 season? That's a recordsetting pace. They say it is easier to replace the coach than the players, but it might be time for the Kings to consider the alternative. And who would want to coach this team?

Actually, the Kings' coach-of-theyear job may be a most desirable one. You could sign on, coach a horrible roster of incompatible, indifferent players, lose a lot of games, get fired long before your contract expires, get paid an enormous sum for your short stint, and ioin 49ers former coach Jim Tomsula on a remote tropical isle somewhere and while away the hours discussing the tremendous benefits of being a losing professional coach.

As for deciding which is more important to winning ways --offense or defense --- for the most part, you usually need both, so we will always remain on...de fence. \star


