**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Dancing man Isaac "Ike" Ortiz turned 103 on September 3rd. After a birthday dinner at his church, he plans to celebrate on the tiles.

He and his favorite partner have danced all summer to live bands in Carmichael Park. "It's what we love best," says his 88-year-old wife Isabel. "It keeps us young. ## Caltrans Behaving Badly

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - California's highways are crumbling. It's a simple fact that we need to send more funding toward fixing our transportation infrastructure.

Sacramento Democrats believe that funding must come from increased taxes on fuel and fees on drivers. But the knee-jerk reaction to go back to the public tax trough is unconscionable when multiple reports continue to show high levels of government waste. Consider the following facts:

- A recent report by the California State Auditor Report found that Caltrans approved the timesheets of an engineer who played golf for 55 workdays from August 2012 to March 2014.
- The Los Angeles Times recently reported that the government email addresses of dozens of California state workers were included in the hacked list of users of Ashley Madison, the online dating site for married people, including employees from Caltrans.
- A report by the nonpartisan and independent Legislative Analyst's Office recommends eliminating 3,500 redundant positions at Caltrans. The report found that this would generate \$500 million annually for road repair, without impacting current construction projects.

If we can afford to pay 3,500 redundant employees to do things such as play golf and seek illicit affairs, we can afford to pay to fix some potholes!

## Rules for a Healthier Game: Senior Softball Alive and Well

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - When the season is over and the last game has been played, softball players, friends, and family members all gather for a barbeque at Carmichael Park. Carmichael Park is where the games are played and where the members of the Golden Senior Softball Club of Sacramento stay healthy and have fun doing it.

The Sacramento area has what may be the largest senior softball club, with nearly 500 members. The best senior players join tournament teams and travel long distances to play. They are anywhere from 75 all the way to 85 and sometimes even older. Tournament team members come together from many different cities and states in the U.S.

There was no league consisting of four or more teams of 75+ players until the first one was formed in 2010. It began in Carmichael Park with four 75 and older teams and expanded to six teams in the third year. Since almost half of the players were over 80 years old, in 2014 they had eight teams—four 80+ teams and four 75-79 teams.

Most senior players know that playing team sports, especially

softball, keeps them active and healthy with great social contacts. Senior slow-pitch softball rules reduce physical contact and injuries. The most difficult part of playing is running the bases after you hit the ball. Even more strenuous is bending down to catch a grounder while still being able to throw the ball to first base.

The rules of senior softball modify normal rules to speed up the game and emphasize safety to avoid injuries. The pitch is an easy underhand lob that must have an arc of a minimum of six feet to a maximum of 12 feet above the ground. The batters' challenge is to hit a ball that is dropping down from a height. Pitchers prefer the 12 foot arc because it causes the ball to drop closer to straight down. This makes the ball harder to hit with a bat swinging level with the ground.

Senior softball uses a strike-zone mat that is much wider and longer than the standard home plate. It is determined by a mat on the ground that is 23" wide and 42" long. If a legal pitch that is within the height limitations drops down on any part of the large mat, it is a strike. Pitchers like to get "edgers" that land partially on an edge at the front, sides, or rear of the strike zone mat.

There are two bases at first base. One is for the fielder, while one is in foul territory for the runner. Runners to first base have a second orange bag attached to a white bag that they must touch while the fielder uses the white bag to avoid collisions at first base on close plays. At second and third base, the defender uses the base while the runner veers off to the opposite side of the base. Runners should not touch the base, but run past the base on the side away from the incoming ball to avoid any contact with fielders.

If the runner passes by the front edge of the base before the fielder catches the ball, then the runner is safe. It is illegal to slide into a base, so runners are permitted to run past the base. However, if the runner decides to advance to third base after overrunning second, he or she must go back and touch second base

before advancing. Plays at home base could result in collisions and injuries. To prevent this, runners have a line or second home plate that is at least eight feet away from the home plate. If a runner touches the second home plate or crosses the scoring line before the fielder catches the ball on the strike zone mat eight or more feet away, then the runner is safe. Men who can play but are unable to run the bases can get

a "courtesy runner" who does their running if they can get the hit. However, players are encouraged to do their own running—no matter how slow—for as long as possible because good legs are needed for a better life. These rules to avoid collisions and injuries allow seniors to play softball longer than most other team sports.

The oldest player on the team is 93, but on injured reserve from falling off a ladder. The oldest active player, Jack Jacinto, is very strong at age 88. There are

12 teams of players who are 75 or more playing weekly. That makes the Sacramento community the world capital of senior softball.

Former delivery room nurse Isabel dazzles with smiles and south-of-the-border jewelry; Ike is a debonair foil to her flamenco posturing. Others may move faster but, in his signature fedora, Ike moves way cooler. "We hear the music and we just want to move," says his wife.

Born in Arizona in 1912, Isaac Ortiz lost his coal miner father

as a toddler. He was raised by his mom, who later brought her family to California. After high school, he picked fruit and learned the floral trade. Construction work later kept him busy until he volunteered for the Navy in WWII. He served in the Pacific, flagging fighter planes on aircraft carriers. After 1945, he began a long civilian career in hydraulic engineering at

McClelland Air Force base. Family and friends helped celebrate his 103-year milestone at Saint Rose Catholic Church in Roseville. The uber-centenarian lets no dust settle on his dancing shoes. He plans to trip the light fantastic this Sunday in Carmichael Park. He attributes his long life and resilient health to "A good wife who never lets me sit still." ★

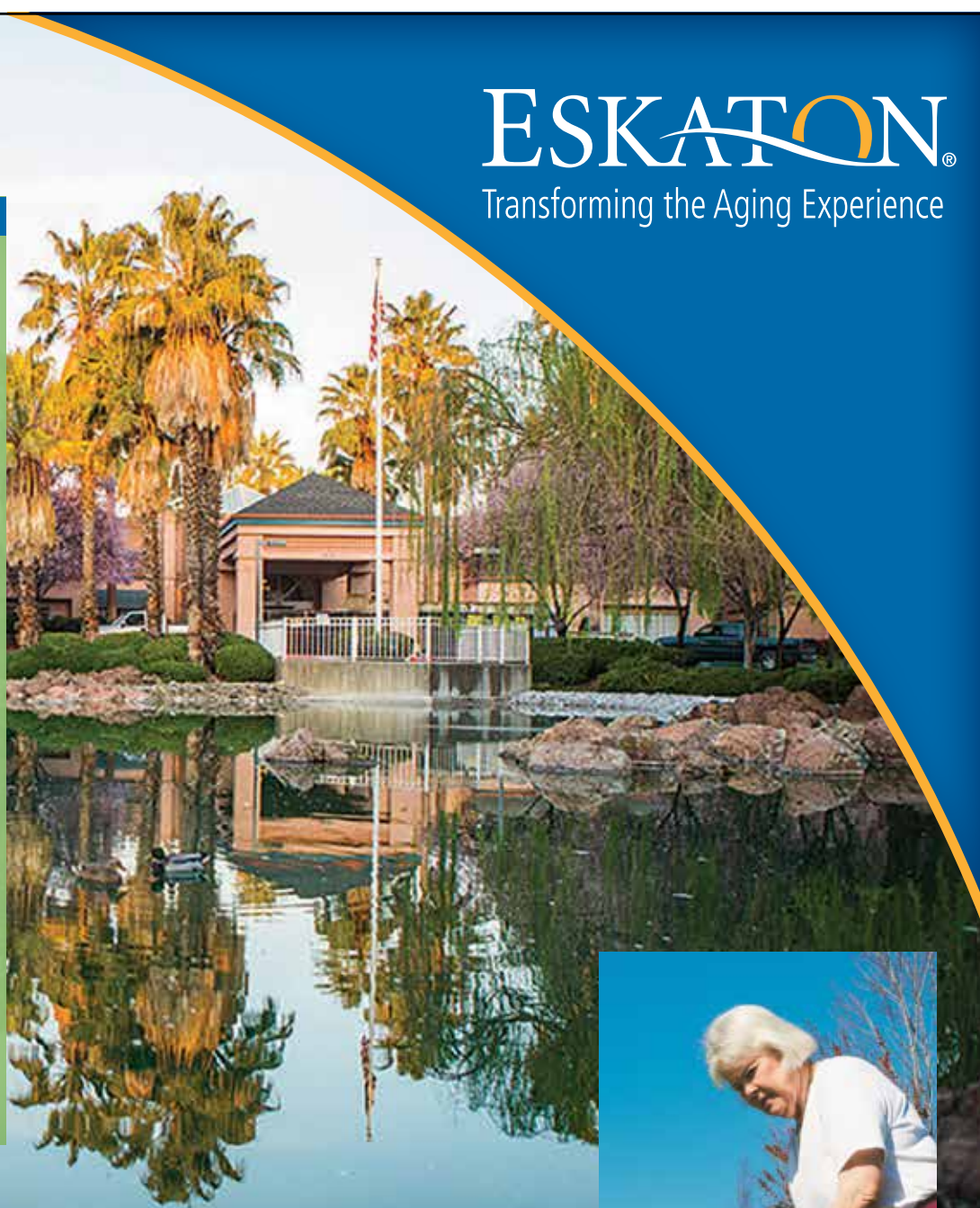

Blake Lively in "The Age of Adaline"

**"The Age of Adaline" (PG-13)** - Adaline Bowman (Blake Lively) survives a strange car accident while driving one night in 1938. A Very Authoritative Narrator tells us that due to some science-magic whatever, Adaline stopped aging, preserving her elegant blond 29-year-old form for all time. Tragic, I know.

After some years, Addy's unaging beauty draws suspicion, so she changes identities every decade to keep her immortality a secret -- she's kinda selfish. This keeps her from getting too close to anyone, or falling in love, until she falls in love with a guy whose father (Harrison Ford) recognizes her as the lost love of his youth.

The film goes for that dreamy, timeless, starlit moody look, and achieves it across different time periods. It all looks good, but the story feels undercooked. Things limp along at times, and the ending feels a little off-kilter.

**"Cyber-Seniors" (PG)** - How do you get a senior citizen from knowing nothing about the computers to deftly hustling Facebook friends to check out their latest Youtube video? Very patiently. That's one lesson in this charming documentary about a group of retirees paired with teen volunteers who teach them how to

use the Internet. When one senior posts her own cooking video to YouTube, it starts a contest among the old folks to see who can get the most "hits" online.

While at first, the cluelessness of the old folks is played for laughs, the real focus of the story comes from the new connections made and possibilities opened up. It's not meant to be an instructional film, but it does teach us a lot about the generational gap: It sure is deep, but not too wide to cross.

**"Beyond the Mask" (PG)** - An English mercenary, Will (Andrew Cheney), working for the British East India company, gets backstabbed by his employer and reinvents himself as a masked vigilante, seeking revenge against his enemies who have relocated to the American colonies just before the revolution. He teams up with an annoying Benjamin Franklin, who spouts popular Benjamin Franklin sayings because that's how he talked, I guess. Will falls in love with a nice lady (Kara Kilmer) and starts to learn that the key to redemption isn't vengeance, but good faith and Christianity. He still gets his vengeance, though.

**"American Heist" (R)** --Frankie (Adrien Brody) served time for a crime that he and his younger brother, James (Hayden Christensen), messed up. A free man again, Frankie gets together with his old robbery pals (Tory Kittles and rapper Akon) and pulls James in as a driver on their next job. James is trying to make a real living and patch things up with his girl (Jordana Brewster), but Frankie reels him in with guilt, and James botches yet another robbery. The two brothers are then forced to help with an even bigger, heist-ier heist. Is this the One Last Job that leads to a better life? Getting the answer might not be as exciting as you think.

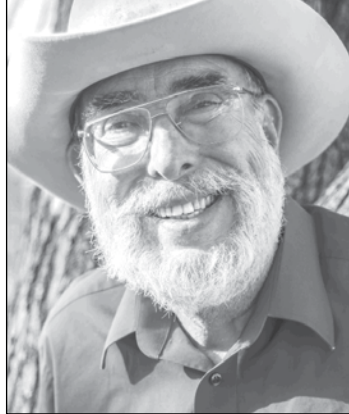

### Jerking for Crappie

Want to try something a little different when crappie fishing this spring? Try jerking for them. Jerking is a technique that's been used in some parts of the country for quite a few years but is just now catching on in others. Here's how you do it. Rig a minnow or jig under a bobber, cast it under crappie cover, then move it with short, quick jerks every minute or two. Beneath the surface, your jerks make the bait dart erratically for a second and then flutter down, simulating a wounded baitfish, and that really excites a crappie. When using this tactic, expect strikes to come within a few seconds of one of those quick jerks. The darting movement will get a big crappie's attention, and the slow fluttering fall that immediately follows will be too much for them to resist.

## No Trophy for You

NFL quarterbacks fear Pittsburgh Steelers linebacker James Harrison. So should participation trophies, the ubiquitous trinkets given to children for merely showing up and rounding out the rosters of local sports leagues.

The other day, Harrison learned that his sons had brought a couple of them home and was none too pleased: "I came home to find out that my boys received two trophies for nothing, participation trophies!"

He swiftly returned the offending tokens and explained himself on Instagram: "These trophies will be given back until they EARN a real trophy. I'm sorry I'm not sorry for believing that everything in life should be earned and I'm not about to raise two boys to be men by making them believe that they are entitled to something just because

they tried their best."

Harrison can be forgiven for having any touchy-feely sentiment wrung out of him by clawing his way to the top of the most punishing meritocracy in all of sports. He was signed by the Steelers as an undrafted rookie, got cut multiple times and considered quitting and becoming a truck driver like his dad, until he finally caught on in the NFL, where they don't honor you for participating.

Most people are still with Harrison, if a Reason-Rupe poll from last year is to be believed. It found that 57 percent of people think only winning players should get trophies, putting a clear majority on the side of the atavistic impulse to reward only victory.

The trophy has gone from exceptional reward for excellence, to nice gesture, to practically an entitlement. When a cash-strapped Little League in Oklahoma canceled its participation trophies a couple of years ago, one parent complained, "Thanks little league for failing my son and disappointing him as well."

Writing in The New York Times, author Ashley Merryman cites a Southern California branch of the American Youth Soccer Organization that distributes about 3,500 awards per season, with about a third of players getting two awards each. Local branches of the soccer outfit, according to Merryman, spend as much as 12 percent of their budget on

trophies.

The popular i9 youth sports league exemplifies the award-happy times. As a newspaper report explained, "To protect the other children's self esteem, there are no MVPs. Every player is given a sportsmanship award, a participant award and a celebratory icon in their on-line i9 'Trophy Case.'" What, no ESPY Arthur Ashe Courage Awards?

There is such a thing as winning and losing, and excelling and failing. It's OK for kids to understand that, and in fact, if they don't, they are going to be shocked by life. There's no reason to try to hide it under a raft of automatic trophies that will never be as valued as something truly extraordinary or truly earned.

Participation -- and effort -- should be its own reward. No one gave us trophies when my Little League team scuffled to a pathetic losing season on the dusty neighborhood ballfield. We participated, we got humiliated, and we moved on, having indubitably established what James Harrison said of his sons' unearned trophies: "Sometimes your best is not enough."

## Overeating Puppy Isn't So Cute

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: I watched a "cute" commercial today where a toddler sneakily pours dog food on the floor for the family puppy to eat. I think it was really irresponsible of the dog food company to show that without noting the risks to dogs that overeat, particularly puppies. Maybe a better commercial would be the mom rushing the dog to the veterinarian to make sure he doesn't die of bloat. Why would the company present this as cute? -- Shocked in Syracuse, New York

DEAR SHOCKED: You don't need me to answer why the pet food company presented the commercial in that way. Cute sells, right? Because you're concerned about the way the situation is presented, with no apparent consequences for the puppy (bloat is a possible risk for dogs that eat a large amount of food in one sitting), you can contact the company either through its

website or in writing. Now, what if that situation happened in real life? Your toddler gets into the dog food and sits there happily feeding the family pet, for who knows how long before you discover them. You'll need to monitor the dog closely. Bloat, known clinically as GDV (gastric dilatation-volvulus), happens when a dog's stomach enlarges, twists and puts pressure on surrounding organs. It's a very serious condition that can cause death in just hours. Overeating is one possible cause of bloat.

If your dog's stomach is distended, it tries to belch or vomit without success, it's weak, panting and salivating, rush it to the vet. If your pet shows no symptoms but you're concerned, contact the vet for instructions.

## The Ones Flying Over the Cuckoo Nest

When Forty Niners head coach Jim Tomsula retreats to his office and plops down into his chair and exhales that long, deep sigh of exasperation that has been building up for months, the words of Randle McMurphy might spew forth. "I must be crazy to be in a loony bin like this."

Tomsula has only himself to blame. Having accepted the role of leader of the 49ers' version of a psych ward back in January, Tomsula should've known what he was getting himself into, having been around for eight seasons as the team's defensive line coach. He has witnessed first-hand most of the nonsense that has been going on around 49ers quarters. It has been well-documented. It has been a lot. It has been nuts.

With successful, but self-combustible, former coach Jim Harbaugh having flown the coop to roost at his alma mater, University of Michigan, it is up to Tomsula to douse the flames of the burning pile that was left behind.

It did not begin well for the 47-year-old, first-time (in the NFL) head coach, starting with that forgettable, uncomfortable, unimpressive, initial news conference. Maybe he decided it would be a good idea to "take a look at the film," as they like to say, of that regrettable opener and work on his game. Since then, he has "overcome adversity," as they also like to say, and has performed admirably in his media appearances, all the while dealing with continuing weird issues with player personnel, and trying to stabilize the dysfunctional nature of the 49ers' roster and on-field results.

Maybe this is the right guy to restore some order and normalcy to the operation. They say the players really like him, at least by comparison to the sometimes seemingly maniacal Harbaugh,

who had a reputation for rubbing people the wrong way and wearing out his welcome, despite his great winning percentage.

At least Tomsula has his defensive experience to fall back on...since he joined the staff in 2007 the 49ers have ranked in the top four in the league in fewest total rushing yards and lowest average per carry allowed, and fewest points and yards allowed per game. The return of arguably their best player in linebacker NaVorro Bowman will bolster the defense that has lost key players in Justin Smith, Aldon Smith and Patrick Willis

Tomsula rose through the ranks in modest fashion, compared to most of the top coaches. He played and later was an assistant coach at little Division II Catawba College in North Carolina, spending time away from his family and living out of his car for a while to get his feet wet teaching the game. He coached several years in NFL Europa, including 2006 as head coach of the Rhein Fire. But, perhaps, a guy who chose to tag his son (James) with the middle name "Bear" might have the right mindset for this job.

An impressive coaching team has been assembled to surround Tomsula. Four members of the staff have been defensive coordinators in the NFL. Three have been offensive coordinators. Two have been head coaches, Eric Mangini (def. coordinator) and Tony Sparano (tight ends; hello, Vernon Davis?). And, there is no more "Fear of Harbaugh" in the building.

Quarterbacks coach Geep Chryst was promoted to offensive coordinator, a move reportedly (CSN Bay Area) endorsed by QB Colin Kaepernick. "...He's very open to what the players' input is during the game, during the week...open to taking shots

down the field and opening up the playbook." Sounds like the all-controlling Harbaugh kept things under his thumb last year, when the offense sputtered with frustrating clock-management and red-zone efficiency problems.

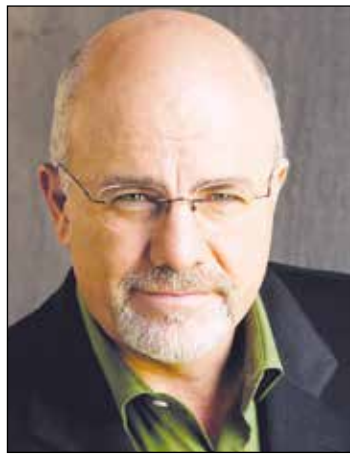
The 49ers finished 8-8 and out of the playoffs last season, Kaepernick seemed to regress as the leader of the offense, and the production on that side of the ball was well below typical 49ers standards. The team ranked 25th in total points, 20th in total yards and had the third fewest passing yards. The hope is that Kaepernick's off-season workouts with former MVP QB Kurt Warner and the addition of deep threat Torrey Smith will help in those regards.

The defense appears to be coming around, but the offense has been uninspiring through three preseason games and is unlikely to be divulging any precious secrets in the final one at home against the San Diego Chargers. It's a wait-and-see situation.

We will all find out in due time if the rebuilding, regrouping and establishing a new comfort-zone with the new staff will translate to more victories on the field, and reestablish San Francisco's status as an upper-echelon organization in the league.

The 49ers, just 4-4 at home last year, host Minnesota (7-9, 2-6 on the road) in the opener, a Monday night special, Sept. 14.

You've got to be crazy to play football at the NFL level, as young, retired former 49er Chris Borland would tell you. And when Tomsula prepares to send his band full of lunatics out there to bash against the Vikings, we recommend he finishes off his pregame pep talk in McMurphy style... "Which one of you nuts has got any guts?!!!" ★

# Sacramento County DA Reports



## Recent cases of interest

**CASE:** Malanje Phea

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Shelly McGill, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that 45-year-old Malanje Phea was convicted by jury of sexual penetration with a child under 16, oral copulation with a child under 16, multiple counts of lewd acts with a child under 14, multiple counts of lewd acts with a child 14 or 15 years old, furnishing cocaine to a minor, and furnishing ecstasy to a minor.

From 1996 to 2009, Phea sexually abused various minor female family members. In 2012, one of the minors reported the abuse to law enforcement. Through subsequent investigation, all victims were identified.

Phea faces a maximum potential sentence of 48 years in state prison. Sentencing is scheduled for October 16, 2015, in Department 29 before the Honorable Timothy Frawley.

**CASE:** Allen Dee Taylor

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Domestic Violence Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that Allen Dee Taylor was convicted by jury of felony false imprisonment with use of a screw driver, assault with a deadly weapon, criminal threats, and child endangerment.

On August 11, 2014, deputies responded to a 911 hang up call at Taylor's residence. Officers immediately noticed Taylor appeared to be under the influence of a controlled substance. When the victim, Taylor's girlfriend, attempted to remove the children from the home, he armed himself with a screwdriver and took hold of the victim, pressing the weapon into her side, threatening her if she tried to leave. Taylor refused to follow the officer's commands to drop the weapon. The officers drew their weapons and Taylor responded by corraling the crying children behind him. After other officers arrived to distract Taylor, they were able to gain control of the screwdriver. After a brief struggle, the officers arrested Taylor.

Due to his prior criminal record, Taylor faces a maximum potential sentence of 23 years in state prison. Sentencing is scheduled for October 10, 2015, in Department 10 before the Honorable Patrick Marlette.

**CASE:** Robert Steward

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that 37-year-old Robert Steward was convicted by jury of attempted carjacking.

Steward traveled to Sacramento on April 17, 2015, three days after being released from a Bakersfield prison. He went to his mother's residence, but discovered she had moved. Steward walked down the street and approached a parked car with the victim and her 13-year-old son sitting inside with the driver's side window rolled down.

Steward punched the mother in the face, forcibly removed her from the car, and threw her into the street. When he got into the victim's car, the keys were not in the ignition. One of the victim's family members rushed outside and fought Steward off until he left the scene. During the struggle, Steward dropped some paperwork he had been carrying, which contained his name. He was later identified as the perpetrator by the victim's son.

This is Steward's second strike conviction. His criminal history includes assault with a deadly weapon and being a felon in possession of a firearm.

Steward faces a maximum potential sentence of 15 years in prison. Sentencing is set for September 18, 2015, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 39 before the Honorable David Abbott.

**CASE:** Brian Quillin  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Kim Zdobnikow, Community Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that 27-year-old Brian Quillin pled no contest to felony vandalism. The Honorable Ben Davidian sentenced Quillin to 210 days in county jail and five years searchable probation. He was also ordered not to possess graffiti tools or paraphernalia, not to associate with known graffiti taggers, stay 100 yards away from the locations of the offenses, and pay restitution to the victims.

On February 6, 2015, Quillin tagged his graffiti moniker "PHERM" on the Pioneer Square building in Old Sacramento. On February 9, 2015, he tagged the same moniker on a sound wall near Wintergarden and Northgate Blvd. He tagged the moniker again on a billboard along Highway 160 on March 29, 2015. The total amount of damage was estimated to be \$2,200 to \$2,700.

A Sacramento City Code Enforcement officer recognized the PHERM moniker from a 2008 graffiti case, which initiated an investigation by the Sacramento Police Department, Code Enforcement, and the District Attorney's Office. Social media accounts belonging to Quillin contained images of the current graffiti and posts regarding the 2008 graffiti vandalism prosecution, all of which was used to tie him to the crimes in this case. ★

## Offseason deals: A look back

Donaldson starring in Toronto; Ramirez, Sandoval struggling in Boston

There's always a frenzy about the trade deadline, and this year's deadline was no different — arguably the wildest one in years. But the moves made by MLB teams in the offseason have a much greater impact on all 30 teams.

This past winter, teams spent over \$1.7 billion on free agents, not to mention various extensions given to players already under contract. Some have gone well, but many (see: every Red Sox move) have not gone so well. Here's a breakdown of the five best and five worst signings and/or trades of the 2014-15 offseason:

### FIVE BEST MOVES

#### Josh Donaldson, Blue Jays

Donaldson has been playing at a high level for three years now, but he's truly blossomed into a bona fide star and MVP candidate this season for Toronto. Giving up Brett Lawrie, top prospect Franklin Barreto, and two young pitchers is no small fee, but Donaldson is lighting baseball on fire, hitting .301/.369/.584 with 36 home runs and an AL-best 7.4 WAR.

#### Max Scherzer, Nationals

Scherzer signed the second-largest contract ever for a pitcher this winter with the Nationals and has fully lived up to the \$210 million price tag. He's currently sporting a career-best 2.88 ERA and 0.98 WHIP to go with an excellent 209 strikeouts over 178 innings. Scherzer threw a no-hitter in June — which was a perfect game until the 27th batter, Jose Tabata, was hit by a pitch that he leaned into.

#### Yoenis Cespedes, Tigers (then traded to Mets)

Cespedes has already tied a career high in home runs and has a decent shot to set career highs in batting average and slugging percentage as well. He was acquired from the Red Sox for Rick Porcello, who turned out to be one of the worst acquisitions of the offseason, posting a 5.47 ERA after getting an \$82.5 million extension. As a comparison, Cespedes is currently sixth among hitters with 5.7 WAR.

#### Nelson Cruz, Mariners

Cruz was one of the best values of the offseason two winters ago when he produced 3.7 WAR on a one-year, \$8 million deal with the Orioles, but he's been even better this season after getting \$58 million over four years from the Mariners. The All-Star is on pace to set career highs in home runs, on-base percentage, slugging percentage, WAR and walks, even while playing in the pitcher-friendly confines of Safeco Field.

#### Jason Heyward, Cardinals

Heyward came at a high price — All-Star pitcher Shelby Miller and prospect Tyrell Jenkins — but he's been as strong as ever in his last sea-

son before free agency. With excellent defense as always, he's hitting a career-best .291 and is on pace to set a career high in stolen bases. He's currently 22nd among hitters with 4.0 WAR.

### FIVE WORST MOVES

#### Hanley Ramirez, Red Sox

Ramirez has consistently hit well throughout his career whether he's been playing shortstop or third base, so the Red Sox wanted to get his bat in the lineup — even if it meant putting him at a position he hadn't played before, left field. Not only did his bat completely sour (.249/.291/.426), Ramirez has been rated as the worst defensive player in baseball according to UZR and DRS and worst overall player according to WAR — all for a gaudy \$88 million price tag.

#### Victor Martinez, Tigers

After averaging 3.1 WAR over the first 10 full seasons of his career, Martinez was rewarded with a new four-year, \$68 million deal from the Tigers that has been a spectacular failure. He has career lows in batting average (.239), on-base percentage (.295) and slugging percentage (.361) — all by fairly wide margins — and he missed a month with inflammation in his left knee. His negative-1.5 WAR is topped only by Hanley Ramirez.

#### Pablo Sandoval, Red Sox

Sandoval turned down larger offers from several teams to come to Boston for \$95 million over five years, and he's gotten off to an inauspicious start. He has career lows in batting average (.251), on-base percentage (.300) and slugging percentage (.384) while looking far worse defensively than he has in the past. His negative-1.4 WAR is the third-lowest mark in baseball.

#### Ervin Santana, Twins

After pitching consecutive seasons with a sub-4.00 ERA, Santana was rewarded with a four-year, \$55 million deal from the Twins. But three days before Minnesota's first game, he was slapped with an 80-game suspension after testing positive for stanazolol, a performance-enhancing drug. Even when he has pitched, Santana has a 5.40 ERA with a career low 6.23 K/9 and more walks and home runs allowed than he has averaged for his career.

#### Billy Butler, A's

Butler was one of the first players to sign a major league deal over the offseason, a three-year, \$30 million contract with the Athletics that was surprisingly large considering he produced negative-0.5 WAR in 2014. He's following that up with career lows in batting average (.238), on-base percentage (.311) and slugging percentage (.358) with a negative-1.2 WAR that is sixth-worst in the league.

### AROUND THE HORN

The Seattle Mariners fired GM **Jack Zduriencik**, who joined the organization in October 2008. The Mariners went 505-595 overall during his tenure and failed to make the postseason. Zduriencik had three top-three picks in the draft, and none turned out well for the franchise. **Dustin Ackley** (No. 2, 2009), **Danny Hultzen** (No. 2, 2011) and **Mike Zunino** (No. 3, 2013) have produced 8.0 total WAR over eight seasons. ...

**Jake Arrieta** threw a no-hitter Sunday night, the first for the Cubs since 2008. He struck out 12 batters and allowed only two baserunners — **Enrique Hernandez** on a walk in the third inning and **Jimmy Rollins** on a walk in the sixth inning — to earn his league-leading 17th win of the season. ...

The Toronto Blue Jays will name former Cleveland Indians president **Mark Shapiro** to the same position. Shapiro was the Indians' GM from 2001-10, when he was promoted to team president. Shapiro, 48, was named Executive of the Year twice. His teams made the postseason only three times, but the Indians never did finish last in the division during his tenure. ...

Marlins outfielder **Giancarlo Stanton** was on track to begin his first rehab start Tuesday after he broke the hamate bone in his left hand June 26. He is expected to join the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads. ...

Red Sox DH **David Ortiz** hit his 494th career home run, passing **Lou Gehrig** and **Fred McGriff** for 27th on the all-time list. He's on pace to hit his 500th career home run before the season ends. ...

Boston's **Hanley Ramirez** will make the transition to first base after making the transition to left field from shortstop this season. He has struggled defensively, earning the league's lowest Ultimate Zone Rating score (minus-16.7) and Defensive Runs Saved score (minus-19). ...

MLB won its case against **Barry Bonds** when arbiter Frederic Horowitz ruled that teams did not collude against the former Giants slugger by not signing him. In 2007 — at the age of 42 — Bonds led the league with a .480 on-base percentage with 28 home runs but did not receive a single contract offer, even after publicly saying that he would play for the league minimum.
