Carmichael **Author Writes Acclaimed Book** on the Positive **Side of Aging**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Gloria Parker, an 86-year-old resident of Carmichael, has received critical acclaim for her narrative on the positive side of aging. According to Parker, most of the literature we read and the media images we see focus on the negative stereotypes of aging. As an author, a senior, and a senior advocate, Parker seeks to change the mindset that aging is a time to dread rather than a time to celebrate.

Utilizing research, her own life experiences, and stories from a group of seniors age 65 to 97, Parker weaves together a compelling and provocative account of how to age gracefully and gratefully. The Other Side of the Story is a thoughtful, insightful book that will make you reexamine your perception of the aging

Parker did not begin her writing career until after retirement at the age of 65. Her first published poem, "Coup," appeared in the International Library of Poetry in 1999. "Seeds of Violence" was published in Treasured Poems of America in 2000. Parker has also had her poems and articles published in a variety of Sacramento-area newspapers.

Parker was nominated for Poet Laureate of California in 2004, and at the age of 73, she published a collection of poems, At This Place, At This Time. In 2013, Parker published her memoir, A Seat at the Table.

"The story of the Lusitania has been overshadowed by the Titanic's sinking for nearly 100 years, even though it's far more interesting and intriguing," says Walters.

Though it is fiction, the book is based on real events and features historical figures. After enjoying the novel, you can look forward to a film version,

Tips for "Kids Eat Right Month" this August

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (STATEPOINT) - You want the best for your kids. As role models, parents and caregivers play a vital role in children's healthteaching kids about healthful foods and making sure they get enough daily physical activity.

More than one third of children and adolescents are overweight or obese, according to recent Centers for Disease Control and Prevention statistics. But childhood obesity, which is associated with elevated risks of high cholesterol, high blood pressure, bone and joint problems, and sleep apnea, amongst other adverse health effects, can usually be prevented.

"August, which is Kids Eat Right Month, is the perfect opportunity for families to focus on the importance of healthful eating and active lifestyles," says Marina Chaparro, registered dietitian nutritionist and spokesperson for the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.

- Cook healthfully. Involve your children in the preparation of all meals with age-appropriate tasks. Getting your kids involved helps teach them about food, and may entice them to try new foods they helped prepare.
- Eat right. Breakfast is a critical meal. Make sure no one in the family skips it—including you. In the evening, sit down together as a family to enjoy dinner and the opportunity to share the day's experiences with one another. Research indicates that families who eat together have a stronger bond, and children have higher self-confidence and perform better in school.
- Plan wisely. When planning meals, start by filling half the plate with fruits and vegetables, choosing low-sodium options. Make sure at least half the grains your family eats are whole grains. For beverages, choose water over sugary drinks, and opt for fatfree or low-fat milk. Also, be

mindful of appropriate portion

- Get moving. After meals, get moving together. Aside from being a great way to spend time together, regular physical activity strengthens muscle and bones, helps to achieve a healthy body weight, and supports learning. It can also help develop social skills and build self-esteem. Kids are encouraged to be active for 60 minutes per day.
- Consult an expert. A registered dietitian nutritionist (RDN) can deliver the highest level of nutrition counseling. Consider consulting an RDN to ensure your family is getting needed nutrients with a meal plan tailored to your family's lifestyle and busy schedule. So we've had to patiently wait for the next "Spring Sweet Onion" all the way from Washington State. Most of us think of Apples when we think of Washington. Even Oliver "Daddy" Warbucks told little orphan Annie, "It has to be Red Delicious Apples

from Washington." No mention of an onion

Walla Walla is actually the largest city in the county of Walla Walla, Washington. The name "Walla Walla" is an Indian name for "many waters." The one thing they are known for around the country is not that the first Presbyterian Church west of the Rockies was formed there. not that the first bank in Washington State opened there, not that Lewis and Clark passed through that region. No, the one thing they are famous for is a lowly root that's dug from the ground, an onion. In fact, it's so famous it became the official vegetable of Washington State in 2007.

The valley sits between the 49th parallel to the north and the 46th parallel to the south, along the foothills of the Blue Mountains. It is one of the most agriculturally rich regions in the world. This is the place where a French soldier named Peter Pierie brought onion seeds from the Island of Corsica in

the 1880s. Those seeds became today's Walla Walla Onion crop.

What makes a Walla Walla so special? They have to be harvested by hand. They have such a high water content (95%) they are easily bruised if harvested by machine. Second, they have one of the lowest pyruvic acid levels of any onion. Pyruvic acid is a sulfur, a natural chemical in the onion that makes you cry. The region is so unique for growing onions that if the Onion is not grown in the Walla Walla valley, you can't put the name "Walla Walla" on it. Walla Walla Sweet Onions are very delicate, so handle them gently.



California Jobless Claims Rise by Nearly 3,000

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - As of July 9th, the number of people filing new jobless claims across the country increased by 15,000 to 297,000, according to a weekly report from the U.S. Department of Labor. California saw an increase in new claims.

The four-week moving average was 279,500, or an increase of 4,500 from the previous week. The number of people claiming unemployment was 2.15 million, an increase of 758 from the previous week. In comparison, there were 2.47 million people claiming jobless benefits at this same time last year.

California reported an increase in new claims of 2,930. The state attributed the change to layoffs in the service industry.



Is Obama to Blame for Weak Economic Growth?

Commentary by Dr. Mark Hendrickson

A political science colleague sent me an article documenting President Obama's dismal economic record, and he asked me for added details and perspective. Here goes: True, economic growth under

Obama has been sluggish, fitful, faltering, historically weak, etc. However, if you look at the charts in the article—especially the second and third—you can see that U.S. economic growth has been trending downward for several decades. Conclusion: Our economic woes did not begin with Barack Obama. However, he has done nothing to reverse the trend; on the contrary, he has doubled down on the very policies that have hampered economic growth.

The headwinds opposing economic growth are generated by what Ronald Reagan referred to as "the government disease." No president has advocated. championed, and imposed more harmful government intervention than Barack Obama.

Here's a short list of those interventions:

Thus, less wealth is produced, economic growth is suboptimal, and the people are poorer than they otherwise would be. cessor, Obama undeniably has presided over more market-distorting government spending that any of his predecessors. To be fair, some of this spending was already baked into the cake—particularly the rising spending on Social Security and Medicare. Because federal entitlements operate on a "pay as you go" basis, these increasing expenditures to seniors do not consist of real economic returns on capital invested. Instead they transfer hundreds of billions of dollars from current workers to mostly retirees. Entitlement expenditures artificially inflate GDP and overstate the real wealth of the country, because those dollars represent purchasing power that does not arise from the production of actual goods or services.

2.) Rising debt. The greater the debt load, the more present income is diverted from present consumption to pav for past consumption. After a brief downturn following the 2008-9 financial crisis,total debt has risen by over 15 percent to a shade over \$59

trillion, according to the Federal Reserve. Over half of the \$7.35 trillion increased (some \$4.84 trillion) is government debt stemming from Obama's budgets.

Obama's policy of encouraging and facilitating loans to college students has seen student debt soar to over \$1 trillion with devastating economic consequences for the recipients. Young graduates struggling under the burden of debt have delayed marriage, child bearing, home buying, etc. In too many cases, college debt has stunted young American lives.

3.) Suffocating regulation. The Obama administration has burdened Americans with a record amount of federal regulation as measured by the number of new rules promulgated and pages in the Federal Register. The annual cost of the federal regulatory burden is now approximately \$1.9 trillion (only nine countries' GDPs are larger). As reported in Investor's Business Daily, "the cost of enforcing federal economic regulations is ... up 31 percent since Obama took office, and the 'Code of Federal Regulations' is 17,294 pages longer." Furthermore, as noted by

Obama's Council on Jobs and Competitiveness, the Sarbanes-Oxley law (which Obama inherited, but has not revised) and Dodd-Frank (which a Democratic Congress passed in 2010 with Obama's approval) have "placed significant burdens on the large number of small companies." Consequently, we are in the unusual and worrisome situation of businesses closing

opening, thereby shrinking employment opportunities and slowing economic growth.

4.) Tax policy. Business tax rates have remained unchanged under Obama, and that has had negative consequences in a world that has been shifting toward lower corporate profit taxes. By allowing the United States to have the highest corporate tax rate in the developed world, American businesses are migrating abroad via the corporate inversion maneuver.

5.) The war on work. While constantly professing concern for workers, Obama has consistently supported and implemented policies—ranging from a higher minimum wage to federal jobs programs to anti-business policies that have shrunk the number of jobs (see the Labor Force Participation Rate). Obama's prize legislative achievement, the Affordable Care Act, has shrunk the number of hours worked (and consequently the amount of wealth created) by incentivizing employers to reduce the number of fulltime jobs. According to David Stockman, the United States has two million fewer fulltime workers now than it did in 2007

Bottom line: President Obama's policies have crippled the American economy.

HILLARY AGAINST THE UBER ECONOMY

Grandmothers may know best, as Hillary Clinton has put it in tweets, but judging by her latest economic speech, they don't necessarily get or like Uber.

The ride-sharing service is synonymous with the new efficiency and convenience enabled by information technology, and is anathema to regulators and entrenched interests everywhere. Add to the list of its critics the presumptive Democratic presidential nominee.

Hillary Clinton didn't mention Uber by name but warned about the disruption caused by it and other companies in the so-called sharing economy. Her husband wanted to build a bridge to the 21st century; Hillary worries about the downsides of "advances in technology and expanding global trade."

Republicans would be foolish not to

welcome a contrast with Hillary over some of the hottest companies in the world. The Bush campaign let it be known that Jeb will order an Uber ride in San Francisco during a campaign swing there.

In the liberal imagination, the sharing economy is hurting workers by substituting part-time, contractor work for higherpaying full-time jobs that come with the full panoply of traditional benefits and protections. This line of attack creates the impression that these new firms are sucking workers from stereotypical 9-to-5 jobs so they can be dispossessed by tech-savvy entrepreneurs. But obviously something is drawing workers to this kind

In a study for Uber, Princeton University economist Alan Krueger found "drivers who partner with Uber appear to be attracted to the platform in large part because of the flexibility it offers, the level of compensation and the fact that earnings per hour do not vary much with hours worked, which facilitates part-time and variable hours."

Uber is really a paragon of choice. Its drivers decide when or if they are going to work, and customers call it up at will. It cuts out the middleman in the form of the shabby, highly regulated taxi cartels more concerned with their own interests than customer satisfaction or convenience.

And that gets to the real issue, which is control. The sharing economy tends to do an end run around regulators, and to challenge entrenched business interests that benefit from a cozy relationship with government.

As a disrupter of sclerotic practices in the economy and government, the sharing economy is predictably the subject of a furious regulatory and legal counterassault. Uber has been a target in cities around the country, and abroad.

Presumably the CEOs of sharing-economy companies in the U.S. don't have to worry about being hunted down and jailed (at least not until Bernie Sanders is president). But when Hillary pledged to "crack down on bosses who exploit employees by misclassifying them as contractors," it was clear what she was talking about. She is signaling her intention to declare open season on innovators not to the liking of the regulatory-business complex.

One would think that new services that link up workers and customers in creative ways would be welcomed, not feared. But Democrats are increasingly the party of economic nostalgia. They still want that bridge to the 21st century; they just want to travel the other way.

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: How can I adopt a war dog like the dog in the movie "Max?" --J.T. via email

DEAR J.T.: While "Max" is a compelling movie, adopting a former military working dog takes a fair amount of research on your part, and the ability to care for dogs that have high energy and need plenty of attention and continuing training.

All military dog adoptions are handled through the Department of Defense Military Working Dog Adoption Program at Lackland AFB in Texas. Dogs eligible for adoption were retired due to age, injury or sickness. Not all dogs saw combat. Some worked in national security, while others were trained as working dogs but did not meet the standards for military service.

Be prepared for a long wait after submitting the application -- up to a year or more. First

priority for adoption goes to law-enforcement agencies, if the dog is still fit for duty. If not, the dog's handler can adopt it. Only after that do dogs become available for adoption to civilians. Some dogs, sadly, are not adoptable due to temperament or severe injuries.

In addition to patience, be aware that you don't have control over what type of dog is made available -- although vou can state your preference on the application. Be prepared for some pre-adoption expenses as well: If selected to adopt a MWD, you'll need to travel to where the dog is being kept (most likely, Lackland) at least twice, once to be interviewed and meet the dog, and again to pick it up if your application is approved.



Records Shattered During 2015 California State Fair



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - Record numbers of guests attended the California State Fair in 2015 and business was incredibly strong for vendors and horse racing during the 17-day annual State Fair. Total attendance grew to 787,833 in 2015, up from 750,445 in 2014. This represented more than 37,000 additional visitors—a 5% increase year over year—that came to Cal Expo to celebrate the best 17 days of summer.

The average daily total attendance was the highest since 2007 at 45,992 and the average daily paid attendance was the highest in 10 years. Paid attendance was up 4.1% from 556,440 to 579,338. The State Fair has run for 17 days since 2013; from 2007-2009 and from 2011-2012 the Fair ran for 18 days. In 2010, the Fair ran for

The Fair celebrated its best opening Saturday and Sunday in nine years (total attendance) and its best opening week in 10 years (total attendance). The middle Saturday of the Fair (July 18th) was the single highest paid attendance in more than 10 years at 66,469 and had the largest food and beverage sales in the history of the California State Fair with nearly \$1.1 million in a single

The 2015 State Fair was packed full of more than 3,000 exhibits and events that featured technology and agriculture and celebrated the best of the Golden State. The State Fair also saw another year of expanded programming and entertainment that attracted a diverse group of individuals. International rugby, international soccer, the Inaugural National U.S. Drone Racing Championships, the Inaugural Extra Virgin Olive Oil Competition, a new State Fair Chef. champion livestock animals, the largest carnival in Northern California, more than 120 food vendors, and big-name entertainers contributed to the success of the 2015 Fair.

"We wish to thank the public for its overwhelming support of the California State Fair, as a stimulator of fun and personal discovery, a contributor to a more friendly and educated society, and a cultivator of dialogue and thought," said Rick Pickering, CEO of the California Exposition

& State Fair. Pickering further stated that "the 2015 State Fair, through such themes as education, competition, technology, food, water conservation, entertainment and celebration, further showcased the ever growing leadership role that Californians play in our region, nation, and world."

Food and Beverage

As the largest food festival in Northern California, food and beverage sales broke records in 2014 with sales at \$8.3 million, and that trend continued in 2015 with gross sales increasing 14% with more than \$9.5 million in sales in 17 days—a substantial contribution to the Sacramento economy and further proof that this region loves its food.

The majority of food vendors saw increases in sales including fan favorites such as Cardinali's Pizza, which was up 53%; Pepe's Mariscos, which was up 11%; and Country Fair Cinnamon Rolls, which was up 14% in sales. Wine Slushie sales were up 20% and sales of California's awardwinning wine in the Save Mart Supermarkets Wine Country were up 7%. A revamped Craft Brew Pub saw an 87% increase in sales compared to 2014.

The single highest grossing food stand was Terry's Barbecue, which had sales of \$413,177. In total, nearly \$1 million was spent at the barbecue stands at the Fair.

Horse Racing

2015 was the first year that the State Fair was granted three weeks of live horse racing. The 11 days of horse racing at the Miller Lite Racetrack Grandstand proved to be successful with more than \$2.2 million in bets placed for races at Cal Expo. The per person wager at the track was up 14.4% (\$64.77 in 2015 vs. \$56.64 in 2014) and the attendance at the track was up as well. Horse racing on the final weekend of the Fair attracted nearly 14,000 fans. The final day of the Fair saw 6,324 race fans—a record number of attendees at the

Butler Amusements carnival sales were up 13.5% from \$4.095.097 in 2014 to \$4,651,109 in 2015, an increase of \$556,013. The final Saturday of the Fair proved to be the

largest grossing day for the carnival in the history of the California State Fair.



Appreciate depreciation Dear Dave,

I'm self-employed, and I travel about 30,000 miles a year in my van. I'm three payments away from having the vehicle paid off, but it has 170,000 miles on it. Do you think it would be a good idea for me to buy a new van and have the tax advantages that would go along with it?

Doug

Dear Doug,

There are two things you can do on taxes when it comes to your automobiles. You can straight line depreciate them, which is what you do with expensive vehicles, or you can write off the mileage. That's a good idea if you drive a lot. The thing is, you get the mileage whether you have debt or not.

Let's say you bought a \$25,000 van. If you depreciate that over five years, that's \$5,000 a year. If you made \$65,000, and take \$5,000 from that, you'd pay taxes on \$60,000. If you didn't have that, you'd end up paying \$1,250 in taxes. In other words, you'd be spending \$25,000 over five years to save \$1,250 a year on taxes. That's a trade I don't think you want to make.

Remember, too, that you basically destroy whatever you drive. You have to think of your vehicle as overhead. So, you're going to destroy a \$25,000 van or a \$5,000 van all in the same period of time. As a businessman, which would you rather destroy? The answer is whatever is the least expensive and gets the job done!

I have two credit cards. One charges me an annual fee of \$79 and the other a fee of \$39. Should I cancel these and not worry about my credit score? I'd like to buy a house in the next two or three years.

Dear Ken,

In my mind, there's no such thing as a good credit card. My advice is to go ahead and cancel them.


When you stop borrowing money and don't have any open accounts, your credit score will slowly disappear. The big thing is that you don't want to be caught in no-man's land in terms of a credit score. You want either a fabulous one, which means you're in debt all of the time, or you want no score because you don't have any open accounts.

By the way, did you know that you can still qualify for a mortgage, even with no credit score? There are still mortgage companies out there that will do manual underwriting. It takes a little extra effort, but in my mind that's a small price to pay.

Cancel the cards, Ken. I've never met a millionaire who prospered thanks to credit cards and their gimmicks!

Price could be right

Former Cy Young winner among those who might be dealt by Friday

ew days in baseball have as much excitement off the field as the non-waiver trade deadline. Last year there were 12 deals made before the deadline, and that doesn't even take into account the 19 trades made earlier in the month.

Although this year's deadline isn't until Friday at 4 p.m. ET, there have been plenty of moves made already. The first big domino to fall was Reds ace Johnny Cueto going to Kansas City for a package highlighted by 2014 first-round pick Brandon Finnegan. The Astros also bolstered their rotation with Scott Kazmir, and the Angels and Pirates added injury replacements at third base (Conor Gillaspie and Aramis Ramirez).

Now more than ever, teams are willing to buy at the trade deadline because the extra wild card spot allows more teams to be in contention. Eighteen clubs were within five games of a playoff spot as of Monday afternoon. Here is a list of the most likely players to be traded by Friday afternoon and some possible locations where they could end up.

Detroit Tigers: David Price and Yoenis Cespedes

Although the Tigers just acquired him last July, Price could be on the move again. He is going to be a free agent in two months, and there's a strong possibility the Tigers won't be able to re-sign the former Cy Young Award winner. And given that they are below .500 and have to leap four teams to secure a wild card spot, the Tigers may sell off their free agents-to-be.

Price won't fetch the same return he did last year — a top-50 prospect (Willy Adames), a young pitcher (Drew Smyly) and a young infielder (Nick Franklin) — because he would only be a two-month rental, but he is still the best player on the market. A contender such as the Dodgers, Giants, Blue Jays or Cardinals may be interested.

Cespedes is another free agent-to-be, and the Tigers will be extra motivated to move him because a clause in his contract will make it impossible to get a compensation pick if he leaves in free agency. The left fielder is having one of the best seasons of his career, and teams such as the Mets, Angels or Pirates — all of which need offense — could be interested.

Philadelphia Phillies: Cole Hamels and Jonathan Papelbon

Hamels' name has come up a lot lately since he is one of the few players on the Phillies' dismal roster with significant trade value. Hamels has a fairly reasonable \$67.5 million left on his contract, which runs through the 2018 season — with a \$20 million team option for 2019 — although the Phillies will likely have to eat some of that money. The Dodgers, Rangers and Astros have been connected to Hamels.

Papelbon has been vocal about wanting out of Philadelphia, but he would bring a much smaller return because — barring an injury — his \$13 million option will vest for next year. A team looking for bullpen help such as the Nationals, Blue Jays, and Cubs could be interested.

San Diego Padres: Justin Upton, James Shields and Craig Kimbrel Even after winning eight of their last 11 games, the Padres are 7.5 games out of a wild card spot. With Upton set to hit the open market this winter and unlikely to return, it could make sense to trade him to a team looking for more power such as the Mets, Pirates or Angels and re-stock a farm system that was devastated by their rapid rebuild.

Shields still has \$65 million over three years remaining on the contract he signed last winter, but he could be an attractive arm for a team looking to bolster its rotation such as the Dodgers, Blue Jays or Tigers. He is striking out more batters than ever (10.2 K/9) but also allowing more walks (3.3 BB/9) and home runs (1.4 HR/9) than ever.

The reliever market is always busy in July, and Kimbrel — who was acquired by the Padres last offseason — is among the best available, even in a down year. A losing team doesn't have much use for a closer, and the Padres could be looking to unload his \$25 million remaining over two years.

Cincinnati Reds: Mike Leake, Aroldis Chapman and Jay Bruce

Cueto has already been sent packing, and Leake — also a free agentto-be — could be next. The former first-rounder is just entering his prime and has consistently had an ERA in the mid-to-upper-3.00s, but the Reds are viewed as unlikely to re-sign him this winter.

Chapman and Bruce would fetch larger hauls and signal a complete rebuild. Chapman is on a reasonable contract (he isn't eligible for free agency until after the 2016 season), and Bruce has just \$13.5 million guaranteed past this year. Bruce would interest teams looking for a longer-term solution than Upton or Cespedes.

Extra bats: Adam Lind (Brewers), Gerardo Parra (Brewers) and Ben Zobrist (A's)

The Brewers and A's are well out of contention, and Parra and Zobrist are set to be free agents this winter. Lind could be a very good platoon bat for the Cardinals, and the Mets, Royals or Giants could be a good fit for versatile Zobrist or Parra.

Extra starters: Jeff Samardzija (White Sox), Yovani Gallardo (Rangers) and Mat Latos (Marlins)

A pair of free agents-to-be and a starter on a cost-cutting team, these three fit the bill of pitchers who will likely be on the move this week. The Yankees, Blue Jays and Dodgers will likely be among the most interested

Extra relievers: Francisco Rodriguez (Brewers) and Tyler Clippard (A's)

With the Brewers and Athletics out of contention, these pitchers may be on the move. Clippard has less money tied to him long-term, which makes him more affordable to small-market teams.

Craig Biggio, Randy Johnson, Pedro Martinez and John Smoltz were inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame Sunday in the largest class elected by the Baseball Writers' Association of America since 1955. Biggio, who played 20 seasons with the Astros, became the first player to reach 3,000 hits, 600 doubles, 400 stolen bases, and 250 home runs and holds the major league record of being hit by 285 pitches (in the modern era). Johnson, who pitched for six teams over 22 seasons, was enshrined in a Diamondhacks hat, the lone team he won a World Series with in 2001. Martinez led the majors in ERA five times and the league in strikeouts three times, winning three Cy Young Awards and one World Series with Boston. Smoltz is the first pitcher to ever amass 200 wins and 150 saves, as he switched to the bullpen in 2001 after undergoing Tommy John surgery. ...




