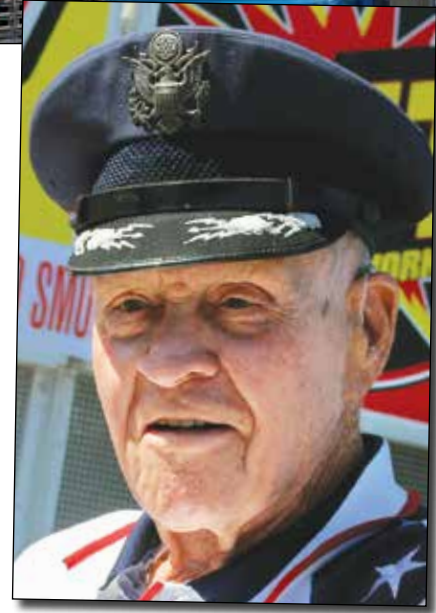

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The courage of American patriots was saluted by Carmichael's annual July 4th Parade on Saturday.

Grand Marshal was Lt. Col. Jim Grey (90), a retired Carmichael banker. Flying for the US Air Force during WWII, Grey survived 30 missions in legendary B-17 squadrons. Their perilous bombing raids into enemy territory inspired movies like "Memphis Belle" and "Twelve O'Clock High."

While not quite a Flying Fortress, Grey's parade transport was a powerful vintage Cadillac provided by local caddy collector Larry Bunfill. The blue 500-horse-power vehicle was one of only 200 produced to mark the national bicentennial in 1976. His driver, Elks executive Jim Warrick, is a member of the family that has organized Carmichael's parade for 57 years. The iconic auto and VIP passengers led a 100-unit pageant on its stately path along Fair Oaks Boulevard, from Marconi to Cypress Avenue.

Festivities continued all evening at the La Sierra Community Center and culminated with an \$8,000-plus fireworks display. ★



SMUD Receives National Recognition for Reliable Electric Operations

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) is one of 191 of the nation's more than 2,000 public power utilities to earn the Reliable Public Power Provider (RP3) designation from the American Public Power Association (APPA) for providing consumers with the highest degree of reliable and safe electric service.

Kenneth Stone, energy services and accounting manager at Braintree Electric Light Department of Braintree, Massachusetts, and executive committee member of APPA's RP3 Review Panel, presented the designees on May 18th during the association's annual Engineering and Operations Technical Conference held in Sacramento.

The RP3 designation recognizes public power utilities that demonstrate proficiency in four key disciplines: reliability, safety, workforce development, and system improvement. Criteria within each category are based on sound business practices and represent a utility-wide commitment to safe and reliable delivery of electricity. The RP3 designation now lasts for three years (up from two), so the 97 utilities that earned the designation this year join the 94 that received it last year for a total of 191.

"Utilities that have earned APPA's RP3 designation are implementing best practices for the industry and are a testament to public power's commitment to serving their community," said Stone.

"We're honored to receive the RP3 designation," said Maria Veloso-Koenig, SMUD director of Grid Planning. "Our utility staff puts in a lot of hard work to serve this community. RP3 represents a much appreciated recognition of this hard work."

This is the tenth year that RP3 recognition has been offered. APPA is the national organization representing more than 2,000 not-for-profit, community- and state-owned electric utilities. It is located in Arlington, VA.

Goats in the Moat

Wilhaggin Basin Has Eco-Friendly Trim

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - If it takes 100 goats two weeks to do what machines and herbicides might achieve in days, American River Drive residents have few complaints.

Employed by Sacramento County for brush clearing in Wilhaggin Detention Basin, the herd was recently trucked in from Herald. Over 14 days, the herbivores munched through the 10-acre trough that protects lowland Carmichael/Arden from floods. "It's the second year we've employed them here," said County senior engineer Rod Goss. "Goats take time to do the job but they're more cost-effective than sending in men and machines. They're good on steep terrain where human ankles have been turned. They free up County staff to deal with emergency situations at times of fire risk. After goats do their work, we've found weed regrowth is limited. Less ongoing maintenance is needed."

The Wilhaggin Basin is one of five County areas that Debbie Olympius's KD Goat Ranch herd was contracted to graze this summer. The owner sees her 400 animals as natural fire preventers: "Mower blades hit stones and cause sparks," she explains. "My goats don't do that. They also cohabit well with wildlife. They won't hurt quail or turkey chicks in the grass. Their droppings return nitrogen to the soil. Goats eat stuff other animals won't touch—invasive plants like blackberries or thistles. Machines spread seeds everywhere. Goats grind seeds down so they can't germinate. They're also quieter and nicer to have around."

Mostly nannies and babies, the grazers gave brief sylvan allure to Wilhaggin Basin. During the flock's evening stroll to a water ditch near the road, children lined fences. "It's like having a petting zoo next door," said a neighbor. "When they first arrived, the goats practically stopped traffic."

The herd is also educational. "Farm animals are something suburban children don't

often see," says their owner. "They're personable and fun to watch. Who wouldn't love a baby kid? Goats sometimes get bad press but if you treat them right, they look to you as a guide. You can trust them to make good decisions."

As protection from coyotes, rogue dogs, or—on one occasion—a mountain lion, Olympius's Great Pyrenean guard dogs stay overnight at grazing sites. Her human crew visits daily to count caprines and feed canines.

Spring is the mobile mowers' busy time. They recently cleared the La Riviera/Manlove Basin in Rosemont. A 60-acre Orangevale Park Department project followed. Cal Expo Basin was next under hoof. "It's a short season; everyone wants to get weeds and brush cleared before July 4," explains Olympius. "Then the goats rest at home until their fall breeding season." The secret to their happy employment is getting the babies used to travelling as soon as possible. "They're excited when we load them in the trailer," their boss. "They know

they're off to be somewhere new and interesting with their moms."

you plant, such as dandelion, prickly lettuce and purslane. But watch your flock around your vegetables though because they will happily eat those as well.

4. Gasoline-free tillers: Chickens have a natural tendency to dig and scratch, which is great for preparing a garden bed for planting. After the growing season, they will also happily till your garden and help clean out old plants, which prevents the buildup of disease and harmful bugs.

Right now is the ideal time to start a backyard flock. Not only

is it the start of the gardening season, but it's also "Chick Days"—a time each spring when baby chicks and ducklings and the tools needed to care for poultry are sold at most Tractor Supply stores. If you'd like to learn more about raising backyard chickens, visit the Know How Central section on www.tractorsupply.com.

"The health of the food and flowers in your garden is tied to the health of your soil," says Diedrich. "Whether in modest yards or wide open rural spaces, raising chickens can revitalize your garden and give plants a natural boost. Plus, let's not forget about the fun of collecting farm-fresh eggs every day, too."

Senator Gaines Opposes Wasteful Budget

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines issued the following statement regarding the Democrat majority-vote budget bill:

"While the budget plan does include attempts to reduce our wall of debt and save for a rainy day, California still has \$200 billion in outstanding liabilities, and we need to route every single spare dollar towards paying it down. Instead we are increasing spending by billions to pay for things like the absurd High Speed Rail project, exorbitant salaries for UC administrators, and welfare cash cards for drug felons.

Feet, Feats, Fetes and Defeats

We have watched many feats of strength through the years, but it was the strength of feet that captured the imagination of a record 25.4 million viewers in the United States on Sunday.

This time around, it was the U.S. women's soccer team—not men in tights—that escaped and prevailed with victory, as it brought home its third FIFA World Cup title while avenging its loss of four years ago by defeating Japan, 5-2, in Vancouver. Their feet did not fail them this time.

The record audience was the largest to ever watch a soccer game of any kind in the U.S. and bypassed the numbers for this season's NBA Finals, which was its largest audience in 16 years. National pride, as it does when the Olympics competitions come around, has a lot to do with the big results, but, nevertheless, the rise in interest in the World Cup event is astounding.

From little more than a curiosity when it began in 1991 until now, the Women's World Cup has commanded attention on the international stage. In turn, over time, the event has been an important factor that helped spur new interest and bolster participation in girls' and women's sports.

When the U.S. won the inaugural tournament in 1991 in China by edging Norway, 2-1, in the final, many of this year's stars were just venturing into youth soccer. They might not have known who Michelle Akers (10 goals in the '91 tournament) was, but they do by now. The awareness explosion came in 1999, when Mia Hamm and Kristine Lilly led the U.S. team to its second World Cup title, defeating China (5-4) on penalty kicks. That victory created one of the most memorable visuals of all time in women's sports when Brandi Chastain pulled off her jersey (as the men customarily

have done) and celebrated on the pitch in her sports bra after scoring the clinching goal before a delirious 90,000-plus fans at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. It's history, and now this team has made more history.

After losing the last final in 2011 to Japan on penalty kicks, the U.S. squad rebounded in the rematch and took control early, relentlessly attacking and scoring four times in the first 16 minutes of the match. Carli Lloyd, whose name will be first in the minds of young female soccer players going forward, scored three times, including the first two goals and the fourth, a 50-yard blast from the midfield line that caught Japan's goalie off guard. She scored six goals in the tournament. Abby Wambach (14 career World Cup goals), Alex Morgan (Cal), Julie Johnston (Santa Clara), Hope Solo, Lauren Holiday, Christie Rampone, Megan Rapinoe all left imprints in the hearts of the stars of the future.

There have been discussions of another possible first for a women's sports team, a ticker-tape parade through the Canyon of Heroes down Broadway in New York City for these champions.

Even sports fans that have scoffed at soccer over the years for what they perceived as a dull, boring, slow-moving, low-scoring exercise were won over. Besides, what else was there on the tube?

You could have seen some NASCAR racers or Tour de France cyclists crashing all over themselves. You could've watched Serena Williams beat up on her older sister, Venus, once again in the early rounds at Wimbledon. There was some forgettable golf tourney on—and the big golf news was off the course, involving the foot of that sport's No. 1 player, Rory McElroy, who ruptured an ankle ligament playing...

soccer...with friends and is doubtful for the upcoming British Open. Or, you could have followed the last-place Oakland A's as they continued to play last-place baseball.

And, what could be worse than watching your defending World Series champion Giants falter through a six-game losing skid? Having to listen to the ESPN television crew broadcast the sixth straight defeat, that's what! We may be homers here, but even Kruk and Kuip seem less biased for the Giants than the national crews are biased against the Giants. You could count on one hand the good things said about the champs. And what's with the extended interview with Max Scherzer of the Nationals and the week-old story of his no-hitter that was accompanied by too much dugout buffoonery while the Giants All-Star catcher, Buster Posey, was taking his at-bat in a close game? The winner between the total pitch count and the number of times analyst Curt Schilling said "I" was too close to call. What is he doing on a broadcast anyway? Unofficial polls reveal that a lot of people don't care much for him, including \$75 million worth of taxpayers in the state of Rhode Island.

Or, maybe it's just the losing that is getting to us—with the skid reaching seven games after the injured, short-handed, tired Giants again had their unfavorable travel schedule jerked around and had to play Sunday night back east, then fly 3,000 miles in the morning for a home game the next night, which they lost. The agony of defeat feeds on negativity. Too much bad karma surrounds this team right now. Maybe they just need a preacher (Hunter Pence) to come in and make things right again, or a reflexology expert to give them all foot massages. ★

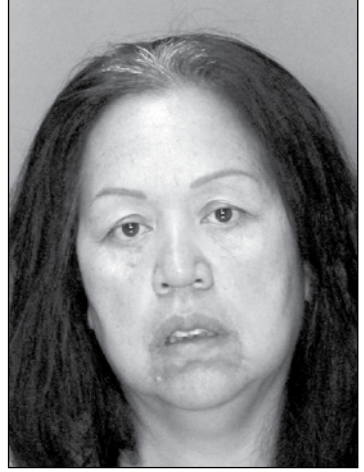
North Area Illegal Marijuana Grow Yields Six Arrests

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On July 6th, the Sacramento County Sheriff's North Problem Oriented Policing (POP) team orchestrated a large law enforcement presence and serviced a search warrant on multiple property parcels suspected of illegally cultivating marijuana for sale in Antelope, CA.



McMahon Sou Saetern was charged with marijuana cultivation and sale, conspiracy, animal cruelty, possession of a firearm by a felon, violation of probation, and unlawful streambed alteration.

The North POP team initially began an investigation into these properties, which led to this search warrant execution involving a unified effort from the Sheriff's Department Central POP team, Rancho

Cordova Police Department POP team, Sheriff's Impact/Narcotics Detectives, Placer County Special Investigations Unit, El Dorado County WNET, the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area task force

(HIDTA), CalMet, Mountain and Valley Marijuana Investigation Team (MAVMIT) investigators, and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department's Special Enforcement Detail.

During the execution of the search warrant on 28th Street

and Angus Way, Deputies discovered a large scale marijuana grow of approximately 950 plants and 200 pounds of processed marijuana, worth a street value of approximately \$4.5 million. Additionally, evidence of bird fighting was discovered and over 100 birds were removed from the property by Sacramento County Animal Control Officers.

Six people were arrested in connection to the illegal cultivation and sales of marijuana, with a variation of other charges including bird fighting, illegal possession of firearm offenses, and a Fish and Game code

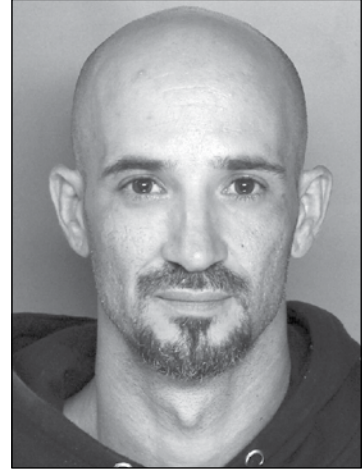
violation relating to disrupting the water flow of creek water and unlawful streambed alteration—a serious water diversion effort, especially during a critical drought.

The Sheriff's Problem Oriented Policing teams recognize that information from the

New Contract with DMV Pumps the Brakes on Tax Overcharges

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Car buyers should no longer be overcharged taxes after a discrepancy was discovered last year by Board of Equalization Vice Chair George Runner. Under a new contract with the Department of Motor Vehicles, the BOE will now have more oversight of motor vehicle private party use tax collection.

“Taxpayers should have confidence

that their government isn’t charging tax that isn’t owed,” said Runner. “This new agreement drives home that point.”

Last year, Runner called for a review of how tax rates were charged in a letter to the DMV. As a result, an internal review found that the DMV had used zip codes to charge taxes, even though zip codes are often split between cities and counties that

employ different tax rates.

“To avoid overpaying taxes, it’s important for Californians to know they can easily find the correct tax rate for their address at boe.ca.gov/taxrate,” added Runner.

The new contract helps DMV counter staff to determine the correct rate for car buyers who live in zip codes with more than one tax rate. The agreement also creates a

pilot program to explore and evaluate alternative methods to reduce reliance on five digit zip codes used to determine tax jurisdiction.

A BOE review found roughly 7,000 cases where taxpayers had been overcharged by the DMV. The Board will refund these overcharges to taxpayers. For further assistance, consumers may contact the BOE’s Customer Service Center at (800)

Pope Francis Goes Off the Rails

A quasi-religious movement now has a genuinely religious leader. The pope's encyclical on the environment is being hailed for its embrace of science, although it is about as scientific as the Catholic hymnal. Pope Francis writes that Sister Earth "now cries out because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her." Really? Is that what the United Nations' Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change says? The Catholic Church brings comfort and meaning to the lives of countless millions. That doesn't mean that climate science, economic policy and cost-benefit analysis are its core competencies. No one has ever said: Yes, but what did Gregory VII do to fight the

onset of the Medieval Warm Period? All that matters to the media, though, is that Pope Francis has taken an apocalyptic climate alarmism and given it the imprimatur of the Vatican. The same people who dismiss the pope on more central moral matters, like the dignity of life, are now attributing to him an authority that might have made Pope Innocent III, who challenged kings, blush. The document could have benefited from an editor cutting out the bizarre ramblings. The pope writes of "harmful habits of consumption," including "the increasing use and power of air conditioning." He argues that "an outsider looking at our world would be amazed at such behavior." That's assuming the outsider lives in a very cool climate, or doesn't mind sweating. Anyone not so lucky probably thinks the inventor of air conditioning should be canonized. While the pope pays lip service to technological advances, he doesn't truly appreciate their wonders. The Industrial Revolution was a great boon to humankind. Consider the unrelieved misery -- the disease, the poverty, the illiteracy -- before around 1800, when if you weren't an aristocrat, a general or a bishop, your life was probably nasty, brutish and short. But at least when everyone died at a

much earlier age, we weren't engaging in the ravages of the planet that so exercise Francis. This sinful assault on the Earth, by the way, largely consisted in taking otherwise completely useless glop from the ground and using it to power economic and technical advances that enriched average people beyond anyone's imagining. This is obviously a secular miracle of the highest order. And the bounty hasn't ended. Something like a billion people have been lifted out of poverty in places like India and China in recent decades as they have embraced markets and global trade. The pope should be delighted, except he has a blinkered view of capitalism as a zero-sum game benefiting only the privileged. For all that the pope portrays modern development as a long exercise in environmental devastation, it is the advanced countries that have the cleanest water and air, and are best prepared to adapt their way around any far-off environmental challenges. His encyclical will be portrayed as the best thing the church has done since Pope Leo dissuaded Attila from sacking Rome, but on climate change, it merely bends to the fashions of the hour. Goldfish's Sideways Swimming is No Stunt

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: Help! I went to feed my goldfish, "Sparks," this morning, and he was having trouble swimming. It's almost like he's swimming sideways. What's wrong with him? -- New to Aquariums in Oakland, California

DEAR NEWBIE: What's happening is most likely a worrying condition commonly called "swim bladder disease." While it's not precisely a disease, it can happen for a couple of reasons, and you need to take action immediately. A change in the water's pH, for one, can cause your goldfish almost immediate distress. If you recently changed the water or cleaned the tank, or if you haven't done either in a while, that pH balance may be the culprit. Change the water again, paying close attention to the water conditioner you're adding, and making sure to match the temperature of the new water with that of the old to prevent stressing out Sparks. The other possibility is diet. When fed nothing but dried pellets, or fed too much, fish can get constipated or bloated. That can manifest as distressed swimming -- like swimming sideways, or even upside down. Don't feed Sparks anything for two or three days. Then, start with a low-protein food -- many aquarium owners recommend chopping a frozen pea into tiny bits and feeding the fish. Once Sparks recovers, watch him carefully in case he develops an illness, like white spot disease (also known as ich), which can happen when fish are stressed. And look into joining an aquarium or nearby goldfish owners club so you can learn about keeping your fish healthy. Send your questions or tips to ask@pawscorner.com. 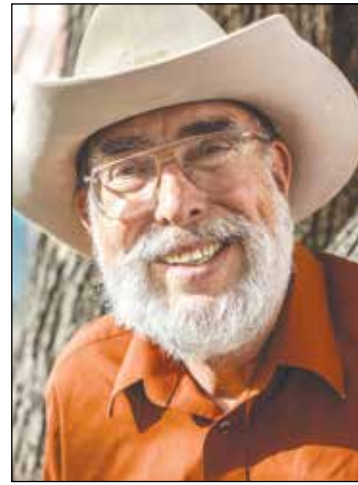

The Dodgers are 11-6 in his starts, but scored just three, two (twice), one (twice) and zero runs in those losses...The **last 10 regular season no-hitters** were thrown by National League pitchers in NL ballparks. Felix Hernandez's perfect game in 2012 is the last by an American Leaguer. Only one of the last 13 no-hitters featured games with a DH...On June 30, the **Oakland A's** lost to Colorado 2-1, which lowered Oakland's record to 6-20 in one-run games this season. According to Baseball-Reference.com, only the Boston Braves in 1935 have been worse in the modern era. The Braves were 7-31 in one-run games and finished the season 38-115...Hitters have yet to figure out young Seattle lefthander **Mike Montgomery**. In his first seven starts, he's allowed just 34 hits and 13 walks over 50 innings. His best two outings were back-to-back shutouts. The first whitewash was a five-hit, no-walk performance in a win over Kansas City. That gem was followed by a one-hitter with only four walks at San Diego. With another hat tip to Baseball-Reference.com, it must be noted that Montgomery is the sixth pitcher in the divisional era with two shutouts in his first six career games. Since you asked, the other five are Pedro Astacio (Dodgers), Burt Hooton (Cubs), Steve Rogers (Expos), Wayne Simpson (Reds) and Jeremy Sowers (Indians)... The **San Francisco Giants'** six-game slide last week could be traced to walks and strikeouts. The Giants batted just .230 but struck out 48 times and drew just seven walks. San Francisco pitchers walked 25 and whiffed just 28 while posting a 5.63 ERA in sweeps at the hands of **Miami** and **Washington**... Baltimore's **Bud Norris** has recently lost his spot in the Orioles' rotation, but should he make another start without completing it, Norris will tie Tony Armas with the most starts in a career without a complete game (167).

NUMBERS GAME

97/37/9

Over his last eight starts, **Chris Sale** of the Chicago White Sox has 97 strikeouts and has allowed just 37 hits and nine walks. His opponents in those eight games (Texas and Minnesota twice each, Baltimore, Tampa Bay, Houston and St. Louis) are all at .500 or better when he faced them.

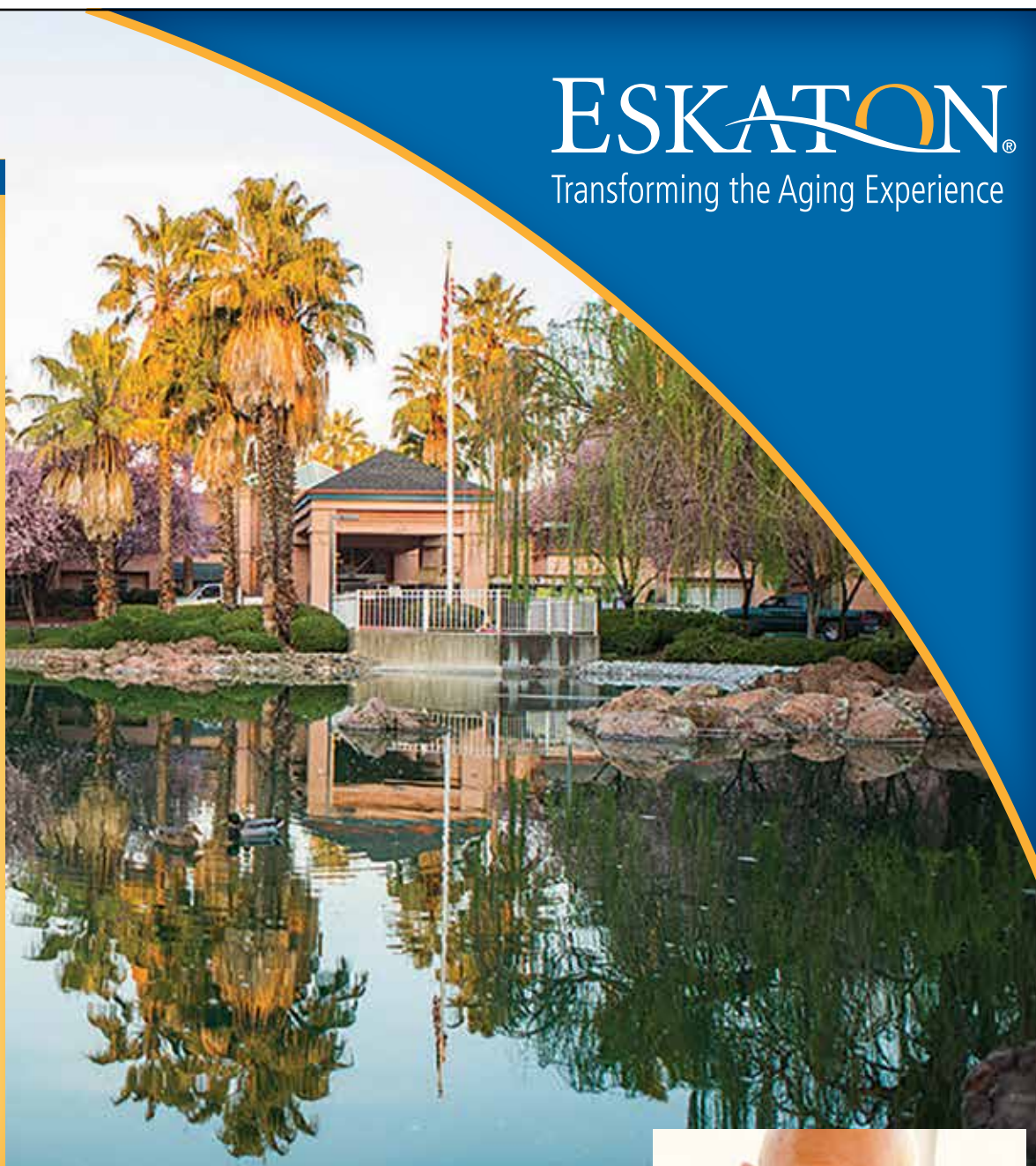

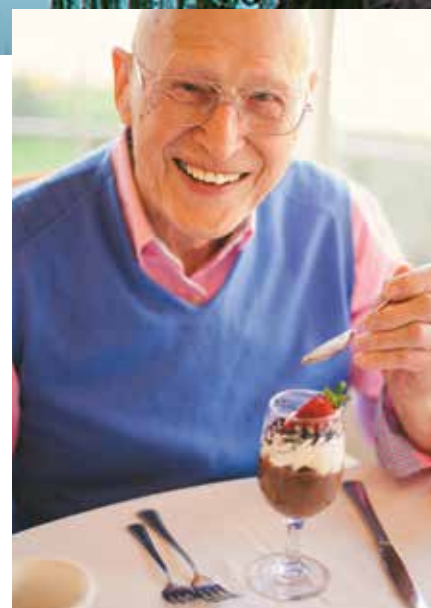
