

I Didn't Pay My Taxes... Now What?

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Many of us dread April 15th. If we haven't paid our taxes, we dread April 16th even more—the first day you owe arguably one of the most powerful collection companies in the world: the IRS. 

EcoHousing Project Unanimously Approved

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Fair Oaks EcoHousing, a new cohousing community of 30 homes, was unanimously approved by the Sacramento County Planning Commission on April 13th by a vote of 4-0. Not one individual showed up to object to the project. Commissioner Eric Guerra called it "a wonderful neighborhood that will raise the quality of life in Sacramento County." This is the first time cohousing will be available in the Sacramento suburbs.

This environmentally friendly infill project is sponsored by a group of 11 local households, who are all investors as well as future residents. The project had previously received unanimous approval from the Fair Oaks Community Planning Council (CPAC) and "enthusiastic, unanimous approval" from the Sacramento County Design Review Advisory Committee (DRAC) in September 2014.

When completed, the 30 privately owned homes will be clustered on the 3.7-acre property bordered by Fair Oaks Boulevard and New York Avenue near Fair Oaks Village and the American River Parkway. The group has been working with architect and international cohousing expert Charles Durrett on the design of the community.

At the hearing, several future residents spoke. Bob Oyafuso, of Folsom added, "My wife has Alzheimer's and requires 24-hour care. Her cognitive skills are so diminished that she no longer is able to entertain herself.

Continued from page 1 Her quality of life depends completely on the interactions with others. When I investigated Fair Oaks EcoHousing I asked, "If my wife was sitting on our front porch, would you come up to her and say hello?" The response was an enthusiastic, "yes"! I'm here because I know my neighbors will greet her with love.'

The homes will range in size from two-bedroom flats to fourbedroom town homes, along with extensive community facilities and garden areas, using designs to promote the sense of a neighborly village. The new community is unique in that it is being designed, funded, and built by future residents who seek to live in a more socially connected and sustainable

neighborhood than traditional suburban developments.

The Fair Oaks property offers close proximity to the American River Parkway and its miles of bike paths, as well as Fair Oaks Village, Banister Park, the Sacramento Waldorf School, and the Rudolph Steiner College.

Green Design

Through its use of environmentally friendly design and building practices, Fair Oaks EcoHousing is expected to be one of the most sustainable new housing environments in the area. A variety of "green" strategies and technologies have been incorporated into the community's design. Among them are minimal paving, abundant natural lighting, and solar panels.

Fair Oaks EcoHousing will be the first cohousing community to be built in the suburbs of Sacramento. It takes inspiration from other regional cohousing neighborhoods, notably Southside Park Cohousing in downtown Sacramento, Wolf Creek Lodge in Grass Valley, Nevada City Cohousing, and several wellestablished communities in Davis. Nationally, there are more than 130 cohousing communities, with many others in Europe and Canada.



outstanding tax balance in four or fewer months. If you can pay in four months or less, call the IRS at (800) 829-1040 and make arrangements with them. The IRS will add penalties and interest onto your balance up and until the time you are able to pay the balance in full.

If you can't pay your balance in full within four months, you will need to ask for a payment arrangement called an Installment Agreement. This will give you up to six years to pay your debt in full. Depending on how much you owe, the IRS will have different standards for how much you will need to pay per month and how much documentation you will need to provide them as proof of how much you can afford to pay each month. Remember, interest and penalties are accruing on your outstanding balance. It is in your best interest to pay as much as you can, as quickly as you can, toward your balance.

If you truly can't afford to pay your outstanding tax balance, the IRS has another program called the Offer-In-Compromise. According to Mazel, this is essentially a negotiation you enter into with the IRS where you are able to settle your tax bill for less than the full amount owed. This is granted only to those who are in extreme financial hardship. You will be required to supply the IRS with proof of your financial hardship. If you are approved for this program, you will have up to 24 months to pay this reduced tax bill.

The IRS has one additional program, Currently-Not-Collectable. This program assists the taxpayer who has only enough money to pay for basic living needs, or even less, and enables the taxpayer to ask for a reprieve from collections. This allows the taxpayer time to get back on his/ her feet and then later enter into a repayment plan.

Mazel added that as long as you stay in communication with the IRS and work with them to resolve your tax issues, you can keep the most powerful collection company at bay.

Treating Test Trauma

Why Your Children's SAT/ACT Scores May Not Be Reflecting Their Full Ability and What to Do About It

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Is your high school student taking the PSAT, SAT, or ACT soon? Did they take it but not get a score commensurate with their classroom grades? They may be suffering from test trauma. There are three causes of test trauma: (1) gaps in knowledge, (2) gaps in logical thinking skills, and (3) gaps in confidence. But these problems can be solved surprisingly quickly with basic test-taking tactics and focused tutoring. You can help your child in time to achieve their best possible score on these important exams.

1. The Knowledge Gap: There are a manageable number of hard skills addressed on these tests. The math skills are the easiest to identify, test, and teach. Most are at the sophomore-class level, with a few questions reaching junior level (algebra and trigonometry). With an untimed practice test, you can quickly identify your student's opportunities for improvement and provide practice material that will build the necessary skills.

The English section tests a high school to early college level of vocabulary. The grammar skills tested are at approximately high school sophomore level. This means the avid reader has a distinct advantage. Rather than having your student read the complete works of Shakespeare, he/she can learn techniques designed to comprehend what is read, discern the meaning of words by context clues, and quickly get to any question's correct answer.

Consider the following example in which an SAT question asks the student to choose

between various meanings of the clearest path toward dealing the underlined word: "The coming decades will likely see more intense clustering of jobs, innovation, and productivity in a smaller number of bigger cities and city-regions."

In the above example, students should examine the text surrounding "intense" and come to the conclusion that the answer means "concentrated" or "dense" rather than "emotional" or "determined."

2. The Logical Thinking Gap: This is the focus of the ACT/SAT. Most questions in both math and English require you think beyond the hard skill and apply that knowledge to get to the right answer. This is easier than most students think and is critical in obtaining a high score on the test. There are simple strategies that help students understand how to approach the problems and apply their natural talents to grasp the meaning of the test questions. For example, taking a few seconds to make sure the student understands what the question is asking for makes a large difference in their score.

For example, "An object travels at fifteen feet per minute. How many yards does it travel in 24 minutes and 40 seconds?"

In this question, the student should realize that his initial feet calculation must be converted to yards. It is very likely the answer in feet will also be an answer choice.

3. The Confidence Gap: This is most common gap, and it is no wonder. We are a testfocused society and learn to view college entrance exams as one of the greatest challenges to a successful life. Of course, that is not really true; perhaps we should rethink our definition of success. Until that happens,

with test pressures is managing them. With the right cooperation between student and tutor or parent, it is easily overcome. A student taking classes or tutoring lessons can employ homework, the opportunity to work with other students tak-



ing the test, and encouragement from teachers and family to increase confidence.

For example, if the student has difficulty with geometry problems, tackling multiple problems found on actual tests will ultimately increase knowledge and confidence on the actual test. Then your student will face test day with no fear and the ability to get his/her highest potential score.







"Paddington" (PG) - Alone in London, wandering about with a big floppy hat and raincoat over his fuzzy fur, a talking bear fails to grab much attention, even though he's the incarnation of everything adorable. The bear is taken in by the Brown family, who name him Paddington after the station where they found him. Stern-but-loving dad (Hugh Bonneville) and open-hearted mom (Sally Hawkins) give Paddington a temporary home while finding him permanent residence and avoiding a conniving taxidermist (Nicole Kidman).

Those who have read the books -- or had the books read to them -- will be relieved to find that this actually is a decent, charming movie. It's not stupid, it has great visual style, tons of puns and a love for the character.

"The Wedding Ringer" (R) -An awkward, sweaty, fidgety guy, Doug (Josh Gad), is about to marry way out of his league (Kaley Cuoco-Sweeting), but he's got no best man, and no groomsmen at all to match his bride's side. In comes Jimmy (Kevin Hart), who sells best-man services. For the right price, he'll be your best man, the life of the party, and make you look good.

Hart and Gad are both real comedic talents, feeding into characters, each within their comfort zones -- but the chemistry isn't happening. You'll laugh, certainly, but this isn't the new must-see wedding-related guy comedy.

"The Gambler" (R) - An English professor and hardcore gambler, Jim Bennett (Mark Wahlberg), is an expert at putting it all on the line. Jim is in trouble with Bank of Mom (Jessica Lange) after he runs up huge debts with the boss (Alvin Ing) of the local gambling den. Not getting the message, Jim takes a huge loan from the kind of guy you don't borrow money from (Michael K. Williams), and then wades deeper into the gambling underworld.

As a remake of the James Caan original from the '70s, Wahlberg's turn just doesn't match up in style. He commits to his macho man on a mission, but what's the mission? There's not much substance in his self-destruction.

"The Boy Next Door" (R) -How bad does a movie have to be before it's actually fun to watch again? Realizing that their movie wasn't in the same galaxy as good, the makers of this film must have decided to shoot for the so-bad-it's-good zone. Jennifer Lopez plays a recently separated schoolteacher who doesn't have a shred of believability. She sets her eyes on the hunky 19-year-old next door (Ryan Guzman), and then they have bedroom times. Too bad for Lopez that when she tries to end it, the beefcake turns into a classic psycho.

Watch Out for the Other Guy

They say that when it comes to intensity in sports, there's nothing quite like playoff hockey. Waiting for the NBA playoffs to come on the tube the other day, the click was made to switch over to the Washington Capitals-New York Islanders NHL opening round series. Even though the San Jose Sharks missed out on postseason play for the first time in over a decade (resulting in the firing of coach Todd McLellan), it would be worth checking out some of the stars of the game during the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

This game featured one of the brightest stars of all in Capitals winger Alex Ovechkin. The big Russian has led the NHL in goal-scoring in five of his eight seasons and has added 32 post-season goals in the seven years prior to this one. Sunday, the A's Scott Kazmir struck K.C.'s Lorenzo Cain on the foot, which resulted in the most logical form of retaliation --- Royals reliever Kelvin Herrera fired two consecutive hard projectiles at around 100mph at Lawrie, the first two feet inside and the second high and behind Lawrie's back. (Would that be considered a crime in some other line of work?). Herrera made a threatening gesture pointing to his head as he left the field, one of five more Royals ejected during that incident. Advice to Lawrie: "Look out!"

Some members of the San Francisco Giants' startingpitching rotation had better look out for their job security. Holy Moses! (Chris) Heston has climbed up on the hill and has been a revelation since taking over a spot when Matt Cain went back to the disabled list. The 27-year-old righthander is 2-1 after three solid starts, going 20.2 innings with a 0.87 ERA. The team as a whole had better watch out for all of the other teams in the National League West. Entering the three-game, home series with the L.A. Dodgers (9-3) Tuesday, the Giants were looking up at the entire division with their pitiful 4-10 record, third worst at the time in the NL for the defending World Series champs --- who have been playing more like chumps.

Those aforementioned NBA Playoffs are featuring a basketball revelation --- your very own Golden State Warriors, who have stockpiled a lengthy list of records and statistics during the course of their historic 67-15 regular season. This team can do everything, includter know where that big fella is ing park your car, stand in line and give you a ride home after the game. This top-seeded group had come accustomed to building sizeable leads early in games throughout the regular season. Its fast-strike capabilities were on display early in the first game of the first round, a 106-99 win over No.-8 seed New Orleans Saturday. The

Pelicans scored the first four points, but two minutes later it was 10-4 Golden State.

The Warriors, however, have also had the bad habit of coasting with leads at times, allowing opponents to get back into some games. That was also on display, as they built a 25-point lead that shrunk to just a five-point margin in the closing seconds. Game Two was a tighter affair and the Warriors didn't pull away until the last five minutes for a 97-87 win and a 2-0 lead in the series. In the playoffs, coasting will not be an option.

Two bad boys on the lookout for each other will be coming face-to-face on May 2 in Las Vegas. Floyd Mayweather, Jr., and Manny Pacquiao will be exchanging blows in a bank-breaking matchup for the welterweight boxing title.

Here at the EOB we lack interest in boxing and other similar exhibitions. Those feelings got their start a long time ago. The Gillette Friday Night Fights was a staple in boyhood in the late 50's and early '60's, until one of its stars, welterweight Emille Griffith, finished off (Kid) Benny Paret one night with a ferocious salvo of punches. Paret died ten days later. That was a shocking realization that nearly faded away during the Cassius Clay/ Muhammed Ali era, because Ali was such an intriguing character and champion.

But then came the brutal match in 1981 in which Ray "Boom Boom" Mancini knocked out Korean boxer Duk Koo Kim. The newspapers the next day ran a picture of Mancini landing a punch to the distorted face of Duk Koo Kim...to be remembered as a death blow when Duk Koo Kim died three days later. What's the sport in that?

Since then there has been disdain for boxing and its ultimate goal to inflict bruises upon the brain of the opponent until he collapses unconscious. That is not sport, but a barbaric exhibition that attracts huge audiences to this day. But, alas, we are mere Homo sapiens (from the Latin: homo (man); sapiens (wise, rational)), and remain a rather barbaric lot in many regards. \star







The Age of the Anti-Christian Pogrom

We live in the era of the anti-Christian pogrom. The slaughter earlier this month at Garissa University College in Kenya that killed nearly 150 people was the latest example of the bloodlust. Usually, such masscasualty attacks are indiscriminate. but the killers of the Somali-based al-Shabab terror group sought to be exacting during their all-day assault on the largely Christian university.

A student told The Associated Press, "If you were a Christian, you were shot on the spot." One witness described his best friend begging for his life, pretending to be a Muslim; when he couldn't recite a Muslim prayer, he was shot to death. Another recalls seeing three girls praying for

help: "The mistake they made was to say, 'Jesus, please save us,' because that is when they were immediately shot."

The Obama administration's reaction to this atrocity carried out by Islamic zealots for avowedly religious reasons was typically shorn of any specific reference to what had happened, or why. The administration reverted to its core strength of tightly scripted euphemism. In his statement, President Barack Obama said that "innocent men and women were brazenly and brutally massacred." True enough, but he couldn't bring himself to say who had been shot by whom. He vowed to stand with the Kenyan government and people "in their efforts to bring communities together," the closest he dared step to the unmistakable religious dimension of the murders.

Secretary of State John Kerry urged steadfastness in the fight against "violent extremism," the administration's term of art for Muslim extremism. President Obama can't restrain his anger over Bibi Netanyahu saying that Arab voters are turning out in droves prior to the Israeli election, but if coldblooded killers gun down Christians for their faith, he turns to careful verbal gymnastics.

As a matter of sheer intellectual honesty, we should be forthright about the religious hatred that motivates attacks on Christians. If

the administration worries about playing into the Islamist narrative of the Western "crusaders," the 11th century wants its foreign policy back. In country after country, Christian communities are embattled and vulnerable, and obviously in no condition to crusade for anything. They don't want to take back Jerusalem; they want to survive. At Garissa, it was the typical depressing story of insufficient protection from the government, either out of indifference or incompetence or both. Warnings of a coming attack on a university had been ignored. An elite police unit didn't respond to the attack on the university until hours after it had begun.

The least we can do is to speak up forcefully about the plight of threatened Christians and urge governments to do more to protect them. It is one of the scandals of our time that the president of Egypt has been a more courageous voice on this than the president of the United States. There will be more Garissa-like attacks to come, demonstrating with heartbreaking starkness the disparity in martyrdom between radical Islam and Christianity. The "martyrs" of militant Islam strap on suicide vests and commit hellish acts of mass murder; Christianity's martyrs die as innocents, often with a prayer on their lips.

DEAR MICK: You'll need to consult Dany's veterinarian. However, if the vet will only consider surgery, you can get a second opinion. Find out if a veterinary ophthalmologist is available in your area. This specialist can evaluate Dany's condition, confirm whether it is cataracts (there is at least one other condition that might be mistaken for cataracts) and recommend the next course of treatment.

According to Animal Eye Care, small cataracts can be somewhat common in older dogs. They may not interfere with vision at all, and no medical treatment may be needed. While cataracts can't be reversed, you can make

it more difficult for them to grow.

The most important thing is to make sure Dany stays healthy. Senior-dog illnesses, especially diabetes, can affect her eyes and increase the risk of cataracts. So keep up with scheduled checkups, and make sure she eats a proper diet. If she's on medication, make sure she takes it.Nutritional supplements that contain antioxidants reputedly help slow cataract development, and in fact, at least one eye-specific supplement, Ocu-Glo, is available by prescription from the vet. Avoid using supplements developed for humans, as other ingredients in them may not be good for dogs. Also, be wary of products that claim to reverse cataracts: Only surgery can get rid of them.



Whole Foods **Recalls Raw Macadamia Nuts**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Whole Foods Market is voluntarily recalling packaged raw macadamia nuts due to possible salmonella contamination. Salmonella is an organism that can cause serious and sometimes fatal infections in young children, frail or elderly people, and others with weakened immune systems. Healthy persons infected with salmonella often experience fever, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting, and abdominal pain. In rare circumstances, infection with Salmonella can result in the organism getting into the bloodstream and producing more severe illnesses such as arterial infections (i.e., infected aneurysms), endocarditis, and arthritis.

The recalled product was labeled as "Whole Foods Market Raw Macadamia Nuts" and was packaged in 11 oz. plastic tubs. The recalled product has a best-by date of February 4th, 2016, and a UPC code of 7695862059-1. Senator Gaines' Privacy Package Moves Forward


SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines announced that two of his California Privacy and Consumer Protection Act bills related to drone use-Senate Bills 170 and 271-passed the Senate Committee on Public Safety with unanimous, bi-partisan support.

"Privacy issues, especially in today's fast-paced internet and technology era, are among the most important policy issues facing Californians," said Senator Gaines. "We must protect the public's right to privacy and more importantly, their safety, from inappropriate drone use. These bills address this new reality and create harsh penalties for those who cross the line. I look forward to their

continued support."

Senate Bill 170 mandates an increased sentence when a drone is used to deliver contraband into a prison or county jail. The bill also makes it a misdemeanor to fly a drone over a prison or county jail

Keeping contraband out of prisons and county jails is critical to running safe and orderly facilities. With public access to drones increasing, this issue is becoming even more of a challenge. As drones become smaller and easier to operate, virtually anyone will be able to use the device to drop contraband into a prison or county jail. Drones can also be used to gather sensitive information from



Senate Bill 271 safeguards children from kidnapping, harassment, stalking, or a host of other potential harm by making it illegal to fly drones over public schools grades K-12 during school hours. The bill also makes it illegal to capture images of the campus during school hours or during extracurricular activities.

This bill is intended to stay ahead of the technological curve by providing a safeguard for children

while they are at school and provides an important layer of privacy to students at a place that should be a sanctuary.

"Drones are already helping our schools protect kids from harm. But in the wrong hands, they can be threats to safety in thousands of ways that we are only starting to imagine," said El Dorado County District Attorney Vern Pierson, who testified in support of the bill. "This legislation gets ahead of the issue and helps make our campuses safe.'



Depths of Fields Army "Shooter" Tells War Stories



when the draft caught him. From Ranger School in Georgia, the corporal was mistakenly sent to Sharpe Army Depot (near Stockton) and found himself jobless. "I'd once had a basketball picture published," he confides. "So I went to the base newspaper and told them I was a photographer. They taught me to take and process pictures; 90 days later, I was in Bien Hoa, (South Vietnam) with a camera.

4A wounded private was being carried off. I saw the picture in my head, raised my camera, and shot two frames. The Army owned all my film but I kept the best negative. I got permission to release it and it made the cover of Newsweek.

"I was in line for chow when three greasy guys jumped off a jeep and asked if I was Pacholik. They said, 'Good;' their other 'shooter' just got killed. I should go with them." I joined the 9th Infantry and on my fourth day, I was in combat. I raised my Olympus to my camera exploded. I didn't know I was bleeding from shrapnel in my face; the medics told me."

Awarded a Purple Heart, Pacholik decided he was




Hamburger Hill hero: The picture made the cover of Newsweek and cost "shooter" Pacholik his army job. Photo

indestructible. For the next two years, he slogged from battlefield to battlefield. He accompanied the 5th Special eye; a bullet hit the lens and the Forces (AKA Green Berets) to the Ho Chi Minh Trail and recorded all passages-from enemy convoys to peasant carts. "I wanted to be another Robert Capa," he reflects. "I didn't care

about the risks. The Vietnamese Army Rangers called me Little Tiger. Soldiers accepted me. I ate the same food, dug my own fox holes, and we talked. I wasn't some smart-ass reporter. I was another grunt in the mud."

On duty with the 101st Airborne Division, Sergeant Pacholik took his best picture

during the ferocious battle of Hamburger Hill. "I was on the next hill, helping with supplies and being shot at," he remembers. "A wounded private was being carried off. I saw the picture in my head, raised my camera, and shot two frames. The Army owned all my film but I kept the best negative.



Meantime, he studied journalism in Modesto. "I was a loner," he reflects. "Nobody on campus talked to me because I'd been in Vietnam. I'd always wake at three in the morningthat's when Viet Kong raids came." In such hours, combat memories returned, and eventually-between successful careers as a newspaper photographer, a stockbroker, a school teacher, and veteran outreach volunteer—the survivor got his stories written.

In his 2013 novel called

got permission to release it and it made the cover of Newsweek."

Because Army higher-ups hated conflict losses being so graphically shown, the gritty snap cost its shooter his job. "I did 46 days of KP (kitchen patrol) and guard duty and faced court-martial," he says. Representing himself, Pacholik recalls "winning the living hell

sent the medal in the damn mail."

"Crab Louis," Pacholik recycles chaotic elements of Vietnam to a Falklands War scenario. Published last year, the "Night Flares" stories are vignettes from his Vietnam tours. Though plots meander from horrific to macabrely funny, a tough sinew of humanity binds them. A final yarn unfolds decades after the war. On jury service, fractious citizens are unified by a self-loathing American vet and a North Vietnamese Army survivor. Learning that each nearly died at Hamburger Hill, one-time mortal enemies are bonded by respect. Now a zealous patriot, the immigrant persuades fellow jurors to serve their nation and complete "their mission."

Though Pacholik's tales are as battle scarred as his own arms, legs, and face, "Night Flares" is not just about war. "It's about people's humanity, he explains. "We were the ones who persevered; we should be proud. I want to show that people who survive the unimaginable horrors of war should be tough enough to live life afterwards.'
