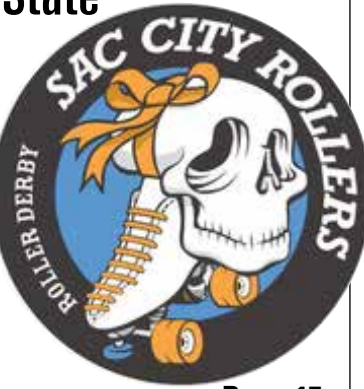

## A Passion for Parrots

Volunteering Time at Parrot Planet and the Wing Foundation

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Sara Walter loves parrots, and her passion for these beautiful creatures prompted her to volunteer her time at Parrot Planet. Established in 2013, Parrot Planet evolved from a parrot rescue service, the Wing Foundation ([www.thewing-foundation.org](http://www.thewing-foundation.org)). Dana Strome, an ardent parrot lover and parrot advocate, is a founder of both services.

Over a period of 20 years, Strome has rescued and rehomed over 800 parrots at her sole expense, with no re-homing fees required. Strome saw that too often parrots were sold with little to no regard for either their or their human counterparts' compatibility, welfare, or environment. This often contributed to many of the parrots ultimately having to find new homes. From this came a call to action resulting in the advocating of "The Parrot Bill of Rights," exclusion of certain parrots for sale, and the evolution of a completely new breed of parrot retail venue—Parrot Planet.

"The store is amazing and parents always bring their children in because it is really like a zoo and fun for them to interact with the parrots and get some education from the staff, including me, who volunteers and I absolutely love it. It is very therapeutic for me to be there helping and bathing birds and giving them attention," said Walter.

Parrot Planet has a cage-free philosophy and allows the birds, rescues, and babies raised in house to be out on manzanita stands where they can socialize and interact with store visitors. There is a section for the rescue birds called Rescue Island where people specifically looking to adopt can visit and get to know these birds.

Walter volunteers at Parrot Planet about 20 hours a week on top of working full time because she really feels there is a need to help these parrots. At Parrot Planet, these birds are taken in, cared for, housed, and taken to the vet. Potential adopters are interviewed and have to fill out an adoption contract; often, a home check is conducted to make sure the new home is suitable for the

parrots. There are also parrots available for adoption that are handicapped or damaged in some way due to not being cared for and housed properly. Walter herself recently rescued an abused Macaw in poor health and is slowly nursing him back to health with the help of a wonderful Avian Vet. "We consistently receive, on average, one bird per week

**Sacramento International Airport Named Among Top Five for Customer Service**

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Repeating its success from three previous years, Sacramento International Airport has been ranked fourth in North America for customer service by Airports Council International (ACI), the international trade association for commercial airports.

The awards were determined by the cumulative results of Airport Service Quality (ASQ) surveys collected in 2014. ASQ Awards recognize the best airports based on passenger surveys and are the only global survey measuring passengers' satisfaction while still at the gate. All airports use the same questionnaire and follow the same scientifically designed methodology.

Sacramento International Airport won fourth place in the category of Best Airport by Region-North America. The region includes the United States and Canada.

Since their creation in 2006, the ASQ Awards have become the world's leading airport passenger satisfaction benchmark, with more than 280 airports participating.

Sacramento International Airport also took top honors in 2012 and 2013.

"An award like this is the result of teamwork," said John Wheat, Director of Airports for the Sacramento County Department of Airports. "Airport and airline employees, the TSA, vendors, and partners are to be congratulated for creating a culture of customer service."

Airports ranking ahead of Sacramento in the Best Airports by Region-North America category were Indianapolis (first), Tampa (second), and Jacksonville (third).

## Effie Yeaw Hosts Breakfast for Early Birds

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - There is more to ornithology than binoculars and obliging birds: Add a nature preserve resonant with avian song, throw in an expert docent, and garnish with a breakfast fit for a kingfisher. You then have the Effie Yeaw Nature Center's most popular spring event. "Bird and Breakfast" is served Saturday, March 21st and Sunday, March 22nd at the center's facility in Ancil Hoffman Park. Reservations are required; the two-day fundraiser sells out every year.

Having attended, I guarantee a fun jaunt. Supporters will likely see 40 or more species and no bird gets left behind; your Sacramento Audubon guide will be as excited by finches as by rock-star birds like great blue herons and—yes, it's just possible—a bald eagle. This iconic raptor has recently been spotted in Gold River, so on our Carmichael Parkway stretch, we can boldly dream.

Equally fascinating is watching birds building and brooding during their most industrious season. Because Audubon experts locate nests faster

than their vehicles in parking lots, visitors will likely see the abodes of wrens, hawks, woodpeckers, and titmice. Higher and harder to spot, some hummingbirds will have nested by March. Viewing moms on gossamer nests is made easier through on-site viewing scopes.

A 25-year spring tradition, the \$40 (\$35 for American River Natural History Association or Audubon members) safari is followed on Saturday by a gourmet breakfast. Saturday's foray does not accommodate children. Family-friendly Sunday includes kids for \$10. On Sunday, Carmichael Kiwanis will serve pancake a breakfast.

Silent auctions of bird-related goodies accompany the meal. Proceeds assist the Nature Center. Effie Yeaw staffer Betty Cooper promises, "It's a rare opportunity to experience animal lifecycles and study the things you often pass by."

Neither excursion is recommended for very young children. Participants should wear comfortable shoes and bring binoculars. "Bird and Breakfast" begins at 8 a.m. on both days.

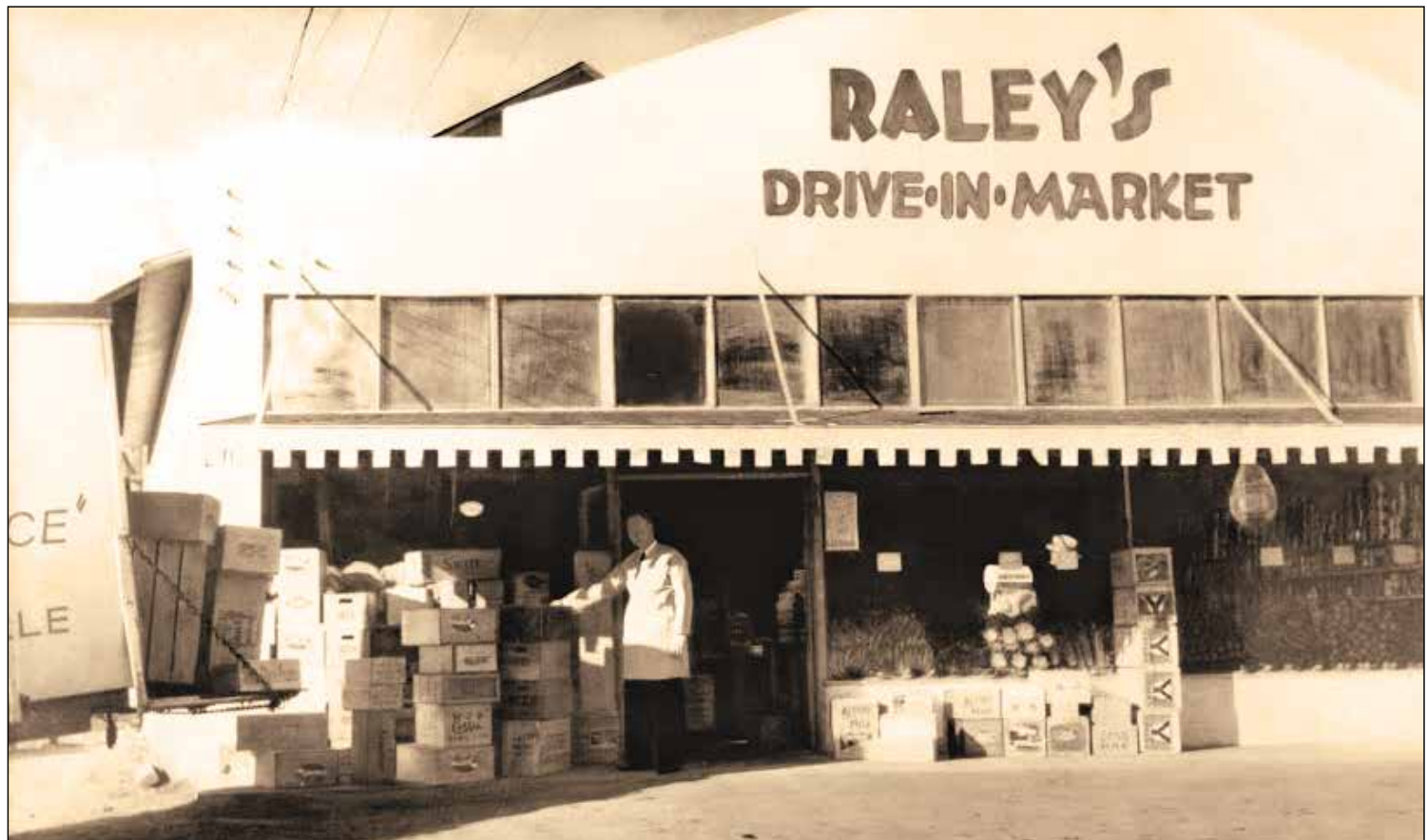

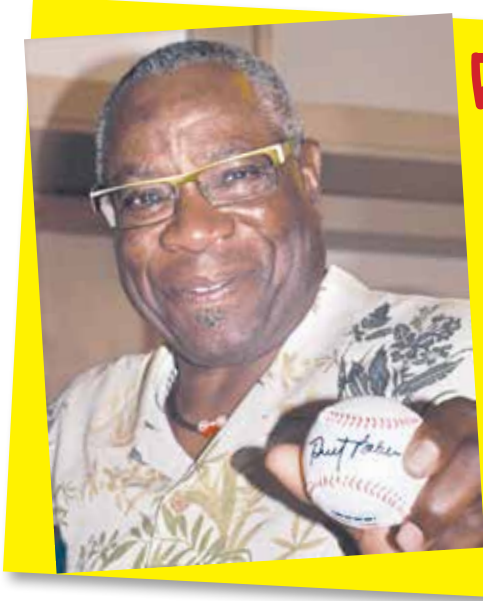

# Dancers Boogie Through the Weekend at Capital Swing Convention

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Nearly 1,000 people attended the 23rd Capital Swing Convention held at the Red Lion Hotel from February 12th through 15th. Dani Canziani, formerly from Sacramento and now living in Reno, has been the Chair of the event for the last 20 years. "Some people come for the competition, some people come to watch the show, some people come to take workshops," Canziani said. "You have all those different elements that make it all up."

Many of those attending were from the greater Sacramento area—including Rancho Cordova and Carmichael—but it is an international event, drawing dancers from many different states and internationally.

Glenda Smith of Rancho Cordova has been dancing seriously since 2002 and has participated in West Coast Swing since 2005; she has trophies from competitions all over the United States. In many events, the competitors don't know what type of music will be played or even who their partner will be until the very moment they are to begin the competition. Smith takes it all in stride. At this convention, she and KZ from San Diego placed 5th in the Intermediate Jack and Jill Division.

"It's been a great time," Smith said. "I've met so many people from all over the world. We always joke and say, 'if

only the leaders (of countries) would dance, we wouldn't have all these problems going on.'"

Kathryn Mongeau of Rancho Cordova placed third in the Masters Division of the Jack and Jill event and performed a pairs routine with Rob Brown of Fresno. At a convention, the synergy of so many dancers can be electrifying. "When you're in a room with 800 people and the music's playing and we're all dancing, and everybody loves it like you do, oh my gosh, the energy in the room!" Mongeau said. "Everything is just so incredibly fun."

Another Rancho Cordovan, Theresa McGarry, placed fourth in the category of Sophisticated West Coast Swing. "I love creating the dance on the spot with a partner in competitions," McGarry said.

Not everyone comes for the competition. Although they have competed in the past, Billie and Art Swartz of

Carmichael attended this year to watch the events and participate in the social dancing. Now in their 80s, they have been dancing for many years. "It's just

the beauty of it, the way some people can get the body to move," Billie Swartz said. "It flows so beautifully when it's done right."

The Convention is put on by the Capital Swing Dancers club, which also holds a local dance on the third Saturday of each month at the Fair Oaks Community Center.

"We get people that drive a couple hours to come to our club dances every month. The convention is different, more national—international, honestly," Canziani said.

Richard Chung is one of those attendees who came from another country. He grew up in New Jersey, but now lives with his wife in South Korea. They are in the United States for a while to attend various dance conventions. The Capital Swing Convention, he said, is an excellent one. "Compared to other events that I've been to in the States, it has a (special) scale of class and professionalism to it," Chung said.

Everyone registered can participate in the social dancing between events at the conventions, even if they are not competitors. "It doesn't matter what size you are, what age you are, what color you are, what ethnicity you are, everybody dances with everybody," Smith said.

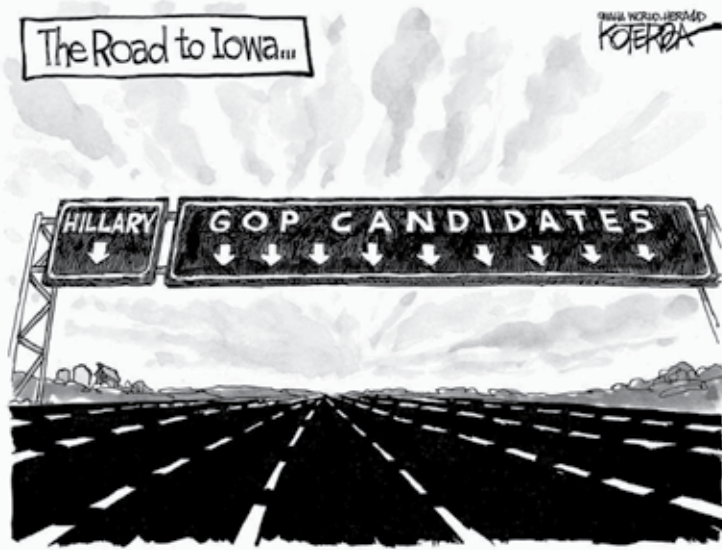

**The Return of Evil**

Where is Chris Kyle when you need him?

The late hero of the movie "American Sniper" made no apology for killing as many members of al-Qaida in Iraq, the precursor of ISIS, as he could get in his rifle sights.

After a captured Jordanian pilot was burned alive, who would object to Kyle, or any other American sniper, shooting down these murderous fanatics if he could get access to them? And who would quibble with Kyle's characterization of these people as "savages"?

Part of what the left finds objectionable about Kyle is his unshakable moral certainty. But in light of ISIS's spectacular advertisements of its own cruelty, Kyle's point of view holds up

very well. The ISIS beheadings last summer marked the return of the rhetoric of evil, because no other word will quite suffice for beheadings, crucifixions and, now, an immolation.

"Violent extremism," the administration's phrase of choice, obviously doesn't capture it. You can pile on the adjectives — hideous, savage, heinous — and still not get at the boundless malevolence of caging a man and burning him alive.

In his first statement after the horrifying news of the pilot's fate, President Barack Obama said the act reinforced the "viciousness and barbarity" of ISIS, which he repeated must be — what else? — "degraded and ultimately defeated." He added that "whatever ideology they're operating off of, it's bankrupt."

Argentina is bankrupt. Radio Shack is bankrupt. ISIS is evil.

Obama has used the word "evil" about ISIS on other occasions, although obviously not as often as his predecessor. George W. Bush made unapologetic use of the word and caught hell for it. On the left, it became a given that it spoke to his manifest unsuitability for the presidency.

Commentator Bruce Bartlett unburdened himself of this deep thought: Bush believes the Islamic radicals "can't be persuaded, that they're extremists, driven by a dark vision. He understands

them, because he's just like them."

Yeah, they were exactly the same except that one unhesitatingly ordered the hijacking of civilian aircraft to crash into skyscrapers, and the other unhesitatingly described that act of mass murder as evil.

What is it about the word "evil" that so offends the left?

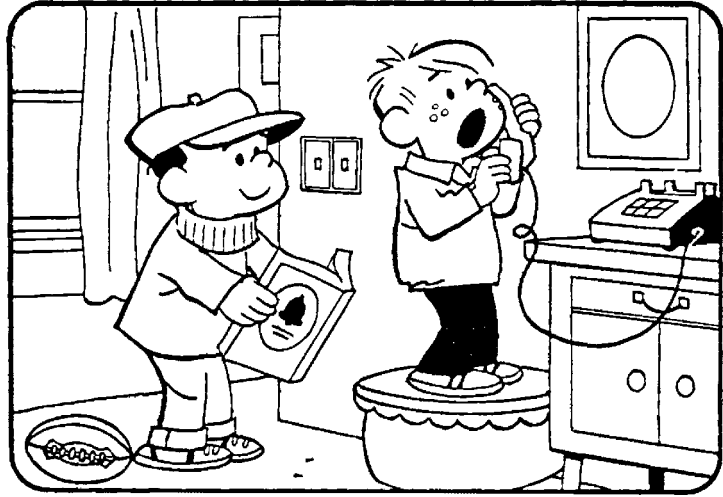
It smacks of a religious worldview that makes secularists uncomfortable. It sets up a natural opposition between good and evil that is altogether too confident in our own virtue for the left. It doesn't necessarily entail any particular policy response, but it tilts toward a total commitment to fighting the enemy, since a campaign to degrade evil feels inherently inadequate.

If Bush was ill-served at times by his stubbornness and certainty, it's always worth remembering that Democrats were perfectly content to lose to al-Qaida in Iraq when Bush was ordering the surge in 2007, and Obama's insistence on pulling out of Iraq entirely was a priceless boon to ISIS.

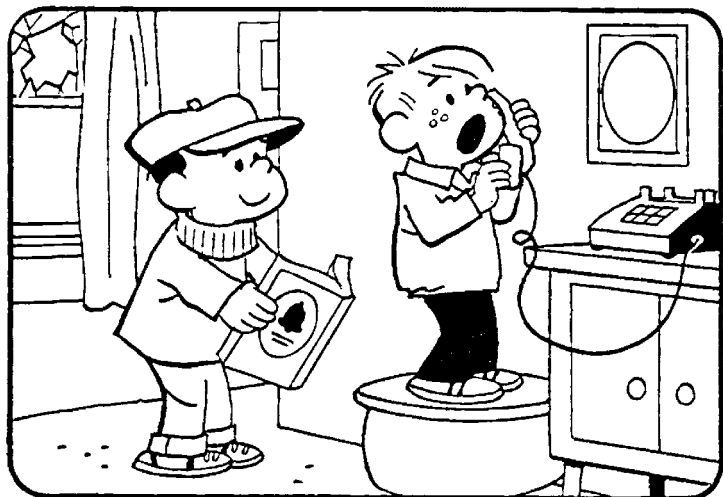
We were supposed to be beyond good versus evil, although the other side didn't get the memo and never left the field. It's almost as if the greatest trick evil ever played was persuading the left not to call it by its proper name.

## SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)

To ready shelter animals for adoption, medical services are often needed. Some animals come to Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter with abscessed teeth, skin conditions, and badly in need of grooming. Others may have internal medical conditions or been injured and in need of surgery. Still others just need some "manners" or a bit of TLC at a foster home. These are just some of the things Sacramento County does daily to prepare the roughly 15,000 animals for adoption that come to the shelter annually.

Shelter Veterinarian Jean Rabinowitz said, "Who would adopt a pet that needs hundreds of dollars in veterinarian services right off the bat? The answer is, not many. We need to address the health issues of our shelter animals in order to get these perfectly wonderful animals into permanent homes."

The County's Bradshaw Shelter has been awarded grants and donations for specialized medical equipment that helps provide enhanced veterinary services to more effectively treat the shelter animals. Whether it's to perform diagnostics or surgery, the state-of-the-art equipment like the digital X-ray machine, orthopedic power equipment, anesthesia delivery system, and the new dental unit enables County veterinarians to quickly assess, make diagnoses, and treat the animals that are on a journey to find new homes.

Department Director Dave Dickinson said, "Having this equipment at the shelter eliminates stressful offsite transport, speeds care and gets us to our goal of increasing adoptability of our animals, and simultaneously

reduces the shelter's population. We will always have animals in need of life-saving medical services, and community donations and volunteering can help the Shelter continue to offer these vital services to shelter animals."

In fact, the donation by Sacramento County residents, Jack and Kathleen Sellers, of nearly \$8,000 for a veterinary dental unit with compressor (\$5,995) and dental scaler (\$1,795) has already increased the adoptability of the Shelter animals.

"Something as simple as poor dental health can be the door to other detrimental and expensive medical issues," said Dr. Rabinowitz. "That's why this new dental equipment is so important. Through the generous donation from the Sellers, we can now treat the animals that come through our Shelter, get them healthy and ultimately to their new families."

Kathleen Sellers came to know Dr. Rabinowitz through her work to help senior and special needs Chihuahuas. At any one time, Jack and Kathleen have several of these senior citizen dogs in foster care on their ranch. While fostering a senior Chihuahua named Autumn from the Shelter, Kathleen brought her to Dr. Rabinowitz for surgery. Unfortunately, due to her age, Autumn was in advanced kidney failure and couldn't have the surgery. Kathleen, committed to her mission to help other Chihuahuas, was interested in fostering Pepper, another of Bradshaw's Shelter animals. Dr. Rabinowitz explained that, unfortunately, Pepper needed extensive dental work, and that's when Kathleen and her husband saw an opportunity to do even more to help shelter animals by donating the money needed for the dental unit.

Kathleen Sellers said, "We made this donation in memory

of Autumn and Pepper and also sponsored a Habitat Room at the Bradshaw Animal Shelter. Without the teamwork of the vets and the dental technicians who volunteer their time, this wouldn't have been made possible. I appreciate all the Shelter staff and volunteers for what they do to help these animals get forever homes."

When the public makes Special Medical Needs Donations, those contributions are earmarked for medical procedures for the County's Shelter animals or for needed surgical equipment, supplies, and medications.

In addition to donating medical funds, the community can help in other ways to get shelter animals adopted. The Shelter's volunteers and foster providers help shelter animals to brush-up on their manners and provide consistency and behavioral training, while other animals can get stressed out at the Shelter and need a home environment with a foster care provider. A little one-on-one TLC by volunteers and foster providers is often the solution that gets a skittish animal, or one that is acting out, on the right track to adoption.

Meghan Ramczyk, Rescue/Foster Coordinator said, "I liken the shelter to city living, and just like people, city living can stress them out; that's where foster providers are truly life savers and can help an animal decompress in a home environment. I've seen remarkable transformations in animals with just a couple weeks offsite. When potential adopters see a happy animal, they are more apt to adopt them."

### Recent cases of interest

#### CASE: Terence Bowman (02/25/15)

#### PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Adult Sexual Assault Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that Terence Bowman was convicted by jury of forcible rape.

On January 3, 2014, Bowman forcibly raped the victim in her Oak Park home. Following the sexual assault, the victim immediately walked to UC Davis Medical Center to obtain medical treatment.

Bowman previously suffered felony convictions of first-degree robbery and resisting an executive officer. He faces a maximum potential sentence of 23 years in state prison. Sentencing is set for March 13, 2015 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Russell Hom.

#### CASE: Sarah Stephens (02/20/15)

#### PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Eric Kindall, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced today that Sarah Stephens pled no contest to voluntary manslaughter and felony child abuse in connection with the death of her infant son, Ryder Salmen.

On April 29, 2012, relatives noticed that Stephens appeared to be "out of it" and her 2-month-old son Ryder was lethargic. Ryder was taken to an emergency room and methadone was detected in his system. He was given an antidote and revived. Stephens did not have a prescription for methadone at the time.

On September 28, 2012, emergency personnel were called to Stephens' apartment, where they found 7-month-old Ryder dead. Testing revealed he had received a lethal dose of methadone, alprazolam and oxycodone. Stephens did not have current prescriptions for any of those drugs at the time. Subsequent testing conducted by the District Attorney's Laboratory of Forensic Services determined it was scientifically unlikely the fatal overdose came from breast milk.

Stephens is facing a maximum potential sentence of 12 years and 4 months in state prison. Sentencing is set for March 27, 2015 before the Honorable Ben Davidian.

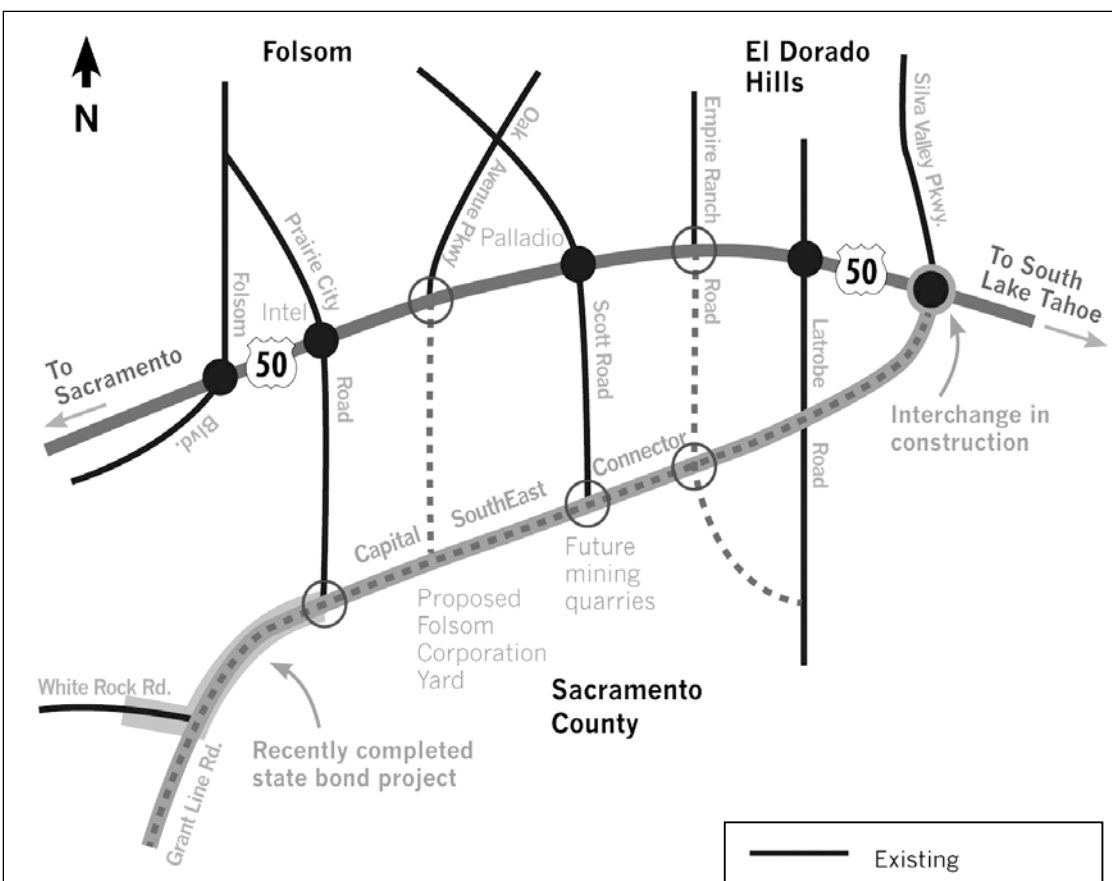

# Engineering and Environmental Work Underway on Connector Segment

Joint Powers Authority Board Approves Contract With Dokken Engineering

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)**

The Capital SouthEast Connector Joint Powers Authority (JPA) has approved a \$1.4 million contract with Dokken Engineering for preliminary engineering and environmental documentation for the 5.5-mile segment on White Rock Road from Prairie City Road in Folsom to Latrobe Road in El Dorado Hills.

The 35-mile Connector will connect Interstate 5 south of Elk Grove to Highway 50 at the new Silva Valley Parkway interchange just east of El Dorado Hills.

"The Connector will provide a safe travel option to Highway 50 while relieving congestion along that crowded corridor, and we're excited about playing a direct role in moving the project forward," said Rick Liptak, Dokken Engineering president.

Barring unforeseen delays, the preliminary engineering and environmental review work is expected to be completed by the end of 2015, after which final design, right-of-way

acquisition, and construction can begin when additional funding is secured. This could occur as early as 2018.

"This contract is an important step for the project as it will enable us to put any available funding to work quickly once the initial alignment and right-of-way is set," said Tom Zlotkowski, JPA executive director.

The total estimated cost to design and construct the segment, which connects with a recently improved two-mile segment to the west on White Rock Road between Prairie City Road and Grant Line Road, is \$54.5 million. In addition to revenues from the Sacramento County Measure A transportation sales-tax program, funding is expected to come from a combination of state and local sources.

The Connector's overall first phase, envisioned to be completed between 2018 and 2023, will include construction of a Connector "backbone" over the 35-mile alignment that includes four continuous

lanes; expanded at-grade intersections; a separated path for pedestrians, bicyclists, and equestrians; and right-of-way preservation for the project's full build out.

The project's second phase includes interchanges and additional high occupancy vehicle (HOV) lanes, or car-pool lanes, as needed in some segments and would be completed as demand necessitates and additional funding is made available.

Construction of the Connector is expected to create more than 5,400 new full-time jobs and generate \$310 million in new labor income, \$831 million in new regional economic output, and more than \$23 million in new indirect business tax revenue. Over 20 years, the Connector is expected to create more than 25,000 total new direct and indirect jobs and generate \$2.5 billion in new economic output and \$182 million in new indirect business tax revenue.

child support payment process easier," said Terrie Porter, director of DCSS. "It benefits the children and their families when parents are able to make payments on time."

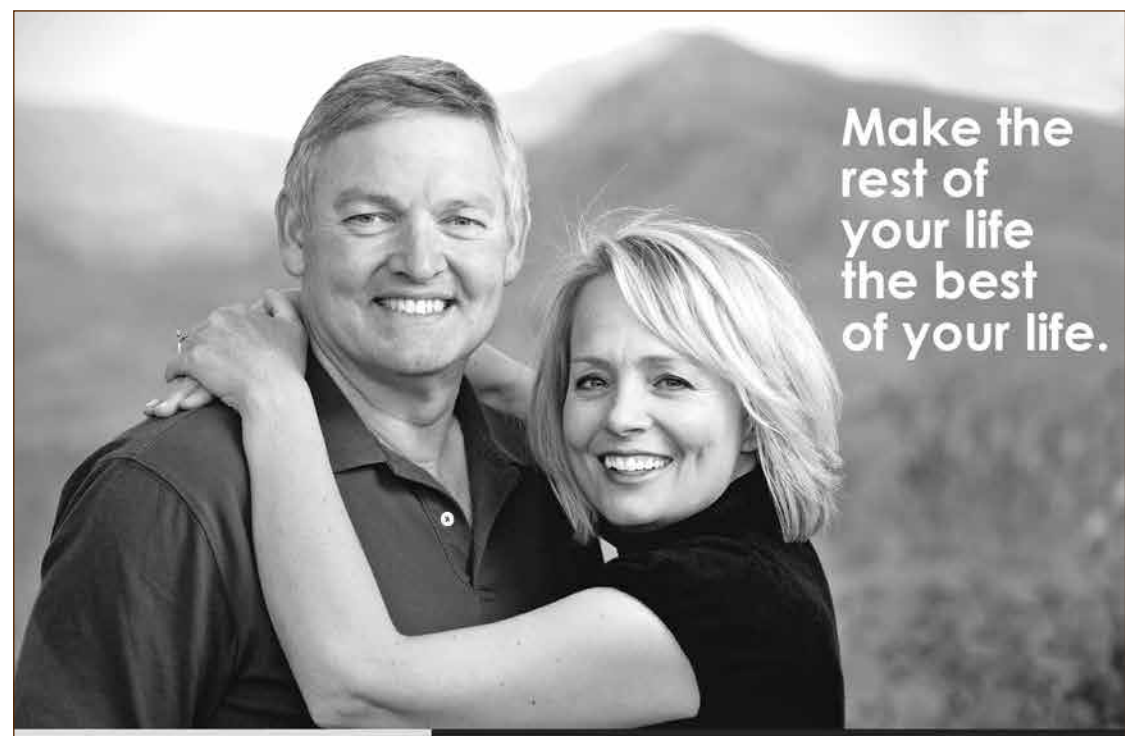

Welch has launched a project to teach adaptive dance to amputees and brace wearers and is attempting to develop an adapted dance protocol to reduce risk of injury to this population.

Academy Fellows—who must be certified by the American Board for Certification in Orthotics, Prosthetics, and Pedorthics (ABC)—are noted with the "FAAOP" credential after their names.

The Academy inducts Fellows each year at its Annual Meeting and Scientific Symposium. The 42nd Annual Academy Meeting will be held in Orlando from March 9th through March 12th, 2016.

**PICKS OF THE WEEK**



Natalie Dormer in "The Hunger Games: Mockingjay"

**"The Hunger Games: Mockingjay -- Part One" (PG-13)** -- After wrecking the Hunger Games and igniting a revolution, Katniss (Jennifer Lawrence) -- the franchise's arrow-slinging teen heroine -- is determined to rescue Peeta (Josh Hutcherson) from the clutches of the evil President Snow (Donald Sutherland). Katniss gains new allies from District 13 led by Alma Coin (Julianne Moore), who means business, and from the Capitol when Cressida (Natalie Dormer) and her camera crew flee. However, it seems like Katniss and the 13ers have different priorities.

Those two words at the end of the title tell you everything else you need to know about the movie. "Part One" is now the universal code for "we stretched out a single book of material into two bloated movies, because you'll see both anyway, and we'll get twice as much money." It's a shame. While the looks and performances are all there, this movie -- or more accurately the first part of a movie -- has a lot of set up and no climax.

**"Foxcatcher" (R)** -- Based on real events, this film looks at the toxic

relationship between two wrestling brothers and the rich man who sees them as his way to greatness. Channing Tatum plays Mark Schulz, a once-revered Olympic wrestler who is invited to train for the 1988 Seoul Olympics at the estate of John du Pont (Steve Carrell) -- the not-so-athletic heir to a fortune. David Schulz (Mark Ruffalo) is Mark's older brother, coach and a hitch in John's control over Mark.

This is a movie of steady building suspense, meaningful small moments and an undeniable sense of aggression and violence just under the surface. Tatum plays a seemingly simple, icy character, but you can tell there's a lot of energy and confusion swirling behind that heavy brow. Carrell's role is often described as a "transformation," and it fits -- he is unsettling and almost unrecognizable.

**"The Captive" (R)** -- A young girl goes missing in an instant, leaving no trace and little to clear the guilt from her father (Ryan Reynolds). Almost a decade later, the parents are divorced, damaged and still searching for the people who kidnapped their daughter -- somebody who apparently kidnaps and abuses children, and spies on the parents while their lives fall apart. You'll endure plot twists and TV crime-show cliches, and all you'll be left with an icky feeling.

**"The Better Angels" (PG)** -- This ponderous black-and-white film takes us into the childhood of Abraham Lincoln, but it's not a biography, and it's certainly no history lesson. Much of the story comes from the environment -- little sounds of nature, a timely breeze swaying the old oak branches. But it's easy to miss the story. It's a more moody, artsy look at growing up and the role of virtues. It's plain to see that filmmaker A.J. Edwards has drawn on his work with Terrence Malik; he just hasn't reached that level with this offering.

every month that are surrendered to us. On occasion, they are left in boxes in front of our store. We do ask that people wait until we open to bring them safely inside. Some of the reasons they are surrendered are because they have behavior problems, their owners have died and the family brings them in, or the owners' life circumstances have changed and they can no longer care for the parrots, and some parrots we receive are rescued because of abuse and neglect."

Parrot Planet doesn't receive many donations, so volunteers run the program with their own money. Walter said, "Taking care of these birds gets costly, but it's the right thing to do."



Marshall and Marty are both Blue and Gold Macaws who were recently adopted. They actually both chose their owners and demanded in their own ways to be taken home, which is a very common action for parrots. Blue and Gold Macaws are native to South America. 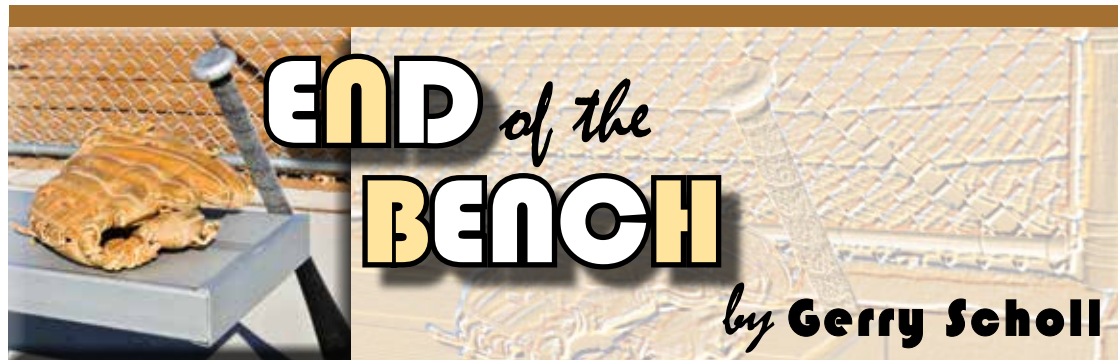

## Against All Odds and Then Some

There have been many sports tales of rags-to-riches, little engines that could, defying the odds, “overcoming adversity,” worst to first, triumphant underdogs, coming out of nowhere, “one shinning moment.”

Individuals and teams have battled to overcome great odds with the deck stacked against them to achieve tremendous things in sports. The seemingly impossible has become reality, like climbing Mount Everest.

Many worthy accomplishments in sports have been portrayed in movies based on the events, such as Rocky, Hoosiers, Rudy, Seabiscuit, Invictus, Cinderella Man, Glory Road, 42, Miracle and others.

There have been countless stories of individuals rising up from the depths of difficult backgrounds or even dire existences to be successful on the sports stage. People like Jesse Owens and Jackie Robinson have overcome social disadvantages or prejudices to break down barriers in the world of sports. Others have prevailed over physical shortcomings to make their marks, such as the “little” guys that managed to have careers in the NBA like Spud Webb, Calvin Murphy, Muggsy Bogues, Nate Robinson and Isaiah Thomas.

We have seen limitless surprises throughout team sports, including some recent World Cup soccer shockers. The NCAA basketball tournament always seems to produce some madness — Texas Western defeating Kentucky in 1966; Jim Valvano’s NC State Wolfpack winning in 1983; Villanova upsetting Georgetown in 1985; the Butler Bulldogs’ great two-year run that came up just short both times in 2010-11; Cal’s win over Duke during the 1993 tournament. And don’t forget when Notre Dame broke UCLA’s 88-game winning streak during the 1973-74 season.

As predicted, the New York Jets upset the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl III. The 1960 Pittsburgh Pirates walked-off

over the legendary New York Yankees. Little Fresno State won a College World Series. Boise State shocked Oklahoma in the 2007 Fiesta Bowl, the same season that Stanford, a 41-point underdog, took down the mighty USC Trojans and tiny Appalachian State went into the Big House and demoralized the Michigan Wolverines. The Golden State Warriors swept the Washington Bullets in 1974. The Oakland A’s dismantled Cincinnati’s Big Red Machine. After more than fifty years of futility, the San Francisco Giants have won not one, but three World Series. An expansion team in New York evolved to forever being remembered as the “Miracle Mets” when it won the World Series in 1969.

There is an ongoing revival of the fascination with the ultimate sports “miracle,” the “Miracle on Ice.” (Check out the ESPN “30 for 30” episode “Of Miracles and Men”). A reunion was held last Saturday in Lake Placid, N.Y., celebrating the 45th anniversary of the U. S. Olympic hockey team’s victory over Russia in the semifinals of the 1980 Games that preceded its win over Finland for the gold medal. The American team of collegiate amateurs unbelievably beat what many considered to be the greatest hockey team ever assembled, 4-3, in what is universally accepted as the biggest upset in the history of sports.

At the reunion at Herb Brooks Arena, named for the late coach of the team, some players said they felt as though it was a miracle to have won that game, while others chose to discount the “miracle” tag and said it was “just a game” and the “result of hard work,” but also “one heck of a big upset.”

Whether or not to classify anything that happens in sports as a “miracle” is a matter of semantics. Choosing whatever words we prefer to use to describe the astonishing, astounding, awesome, unbelievable, miraculous, sensational, thrilling, remarkable, riveting,

amazing, surreal, stupendous twists and turns of events in the course of sports keeps this job interesting and fun.

But, it is now about time to move along to the other job — another world where all sports nonsense means nothing — a job touring a variety of classrooms in which the young students have been dealt some of the worst cards imaginable.

There...to lend a helping hand to provide the most basic needs, or to try to help influence some progress to a better level, or to help guide some along a path to learning to cope with their surroundings and their futures.

There are an unfortunate array of issues from class to class... tube-feedings going on; medications; physical disabilities; speech, sight, hearing and eating problems; behaviors; fragile, oh so fragile young people; wheelchairs, walkers and harnesses; helmets; diaper changing; autism; emotional disorders; learning disabilities...sometimes it seems as though the odds are only going to get worse.

Will a Great Hope ever come along to touch them all and heal them? We can only hope, but there will most likely be no Obi-Wan Kenobi, nor anyone else, coming to their rescue.

Too often it seems too hopeless, too helpless to rally for an upset, to overcome, to win even the smallest battles, let alone achieve any fantastic victories.

But, there are those that are relentless; some with great heart and determination to attain some goals, some small measures of success. Their rewards are mostly felt within.

To be of any assistance within their midst is a reward more heartfelt than any game-winning hit, clinching free throw, buzzer-beater or championship.

To reach any student enough to elicit the slightest smile, even if only for one shinning moment, is a home run, even though we know what these kids really need is a miracle. ★

Sunrise MarketPlace Executive Director Kathlynn Carpenter said, “We welcome the California Dream to Citrus Heights. # Neonatal Doctor is Community Hero

## Mercy's Carolyn Getman Honored at Carmichael Event

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Neonatologist Carolyn Getman is among community leaders whom the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce will celebrate as 2015 citizens of the year.

The nomination, said Getman (57), is an unexpected perk following 25 years as a physician. For the last 15 years, she has directed the Mercy San Juan Neonatal Intensive Care Unit that will mark a quarter-century of service this year. "We're tucked away here in our little world,"

she said. "Even in this hospital, many people don't know what we do. But we know how important it is."

So important indeed that 450 tiny lives per year are assisted by Getman's team of eight doctors and many specialized staffers. "Caring for critically ill babies and eventually seeing them go home doing well, that's an incredible feeling," said the physician. "When they're born with multiple medical problems, their parents are devastated. Helping families through this time gives you a good perspective for the future. I try to treat families the

way I would want to be treated myself, to have a personal involvement with them."

Getman speaks not only as a physician, but as a mom. Married 22 years to pediatrician Greg Cohen, she had problems during her own first pregnancy. "Thanks to special care, the second pregnancy went fine," she said. "I was so thankful to be able take my babies home after delivery. I can only imagine how hard it would be to leave the hospital without your child." Her first son is now in college, planning medical studies of his own.

Getman's own childhood was a career decider, too. The physician's daughter helped mom run dad's Berkeley practice. Her medical education began

at Stanford University and continued with neonatal training at UC Davis. Moving to Fair Oaks in 1990, she assisted then-director Doctor Robert Kahle at Mercy San Juan's fledgling NICU. In those days, infants born as prematurely as 25-weeks of gestation occupied six beds. Now the unit has 26 incubators. Some babies treated there are only 23 weeks old at birth.

Getman observed that in her own lifetime neonatology has seen incredible advances. As the nation grieved the death of President and First Lady Kennedy's infant son in 1963, science responded in overdrive. "Patrick Kennedy's death spurred tremendous research," she explained. "Premature babies

sometimes don't produce enough of a substance called surfactant, which stops their lungs from collapsing. We can now administer it, through a tube, into a baby's lungs. In the last decade, nutrition has come to the forefront. We now know babies must be started on IV nutrition immediately after birth; it's vital for them to receive their mother's breast milk as soon as they can tolerate feeding."

Each September, she and fellow NICU physicians eschew sterile protocol to picnic in Carmichael Park with scores of Mercy NICU graduates. "Some of the babies I've treated are now my own kids' age," said their former doctor. "For a physician, seeing them is a reward and privilege. It also allows us to

encourage other parents with new babies in the hospital. We can tell them we just spent the day with children who had the same problems as their babies, and that they are now growing up and doing well. It gives parents hope.

"It gives doctors hope, too."

The Carmichael Chamber of Commerce's Person of the Year celebration will be held on Friday, March 27th at the La Sierra Center (5325 Engle Road).
