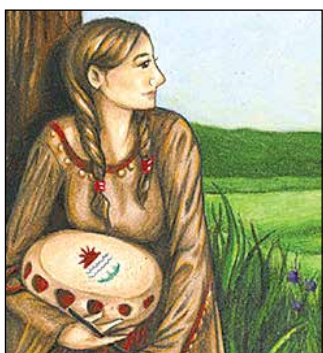

## Loving the Lido Shuffle Hideaway Relocates After Twenty Years

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - The end of the year brought changes for one of Carmichael's best-kept secrets: a main street eatery that broadcaster Stan Atkinson called "a cozy little hole in the wall." Among the longest serving of local restaurants, the 20-year-old Lido Café relocated and reinvented itself.

With more windows, more daylight, and a décor more continental than cottagey, the new place seems like a chic version of its funky former self. "Some customers preferred the old Lido," admits owner Shawna Rivera. "But new families are discovering us, and they love us. I've enjoyed both places; we simply outgrew the old one. With the move, we left the cozy hole in the wall behind. I wanted a more efficient home."

The move—a mere block further down Fair Oaks Boulevard—was hardly a quantum leap for Rivera and staff. And some things never change. Early birds still encounter the aroma of just-baked cinnamon rolls and (often) a hug from the chirpy restaurateur. El Camino High School graduate Rivera (55) feels she inherited her late mom's instinct to make people feel cozy and loved by feeding them. "I say my prayers every night that my customers are happy

and healthy," she says. "I believe my food is good for them."

A former hairdresser, Rivera took her first cooking lessons for a hobby and ventured opening a café for hair clients. This tiny refuge eventually took over three adjacent stores. "Things got crazy," she recalls. "I was cutting hair; cutting bread. I suffered an oil burn in the café and, as I healed, I took time to figure out my life."

## Region Employment Trends Show Growing Optimism

### Job Demand and Hiring Trends for Local Companies

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Optimism is strong for ongoing growth of the Sacramento regional economy in the New Year.

In direct contacts with top Sacramento regional employers, Pacific Staffing has discovered that 84% of company contacts expressed optimism for 2015 about ongoing economic and job growth in our region. Just 8% of those contacted in 2014 between November 12th and December 16th indicated a pessimistic outlook. Another 8% didn't or couldn't answer when asked, "Are you optimistic or pessimistic about the economy in 2015?" In what is traditionally the slowest period for hiring, the Sacramento

Employment Trends Survey has learned the majority of top regional employers will continue at a robust pace in hiring for the first quarter of 2015.

While weather and seasonal change often reduces the hiring market for Sacramento in the first

quarter of the New Year, 65% of companies report they are hiring in January, February, and March. In another measure of ongoing recovery and growth of the economy and hiring market in Sacramento, 49% of hiring was attributed by company contacts

to expansion or growth of their workforce in the first quarter. Thirteen percent (13%) of hiring was attributed to seasonal needs. Thirty-five percent (35%) of companies surveyed by phone

# Top New Laws for California Businesses

California Chamber Releases Its 2015 List



Several new laws will increase employers' wage-and-hour obligations in 2015. AB 1897 holds employers liable for wage-and-hour violations when they use staffing agencies or other labor contractors. If a contractor fails to pay its workers properly or provide workers' compensation coverage, the "client employer" can now be held legally responsible.

**SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG)** - The California Chamber of Commerce has released a list of new laws that will affect California businesses in 2015. Some of these, such as mandatory paid sick leave, make significant changes to the state's legal landscape. Others will have more limited impact. Here are some highlights.

**Mandatory paid sick leave:** AB 1522, the Healthy Workplaces, Healthy Families Act of 2014, requires employers to provide paid sick leave to any employee who worked in California for 30 days. Employers can limit paid sick leave to 24 hours or three days in each year of employment and can put a maximum cap on total accrual of 48 hours or six days. The effective date for the paid sick leave benefit is July 1st, 2015.

**Unpaid interns and volunteers:** AB 1443 adds unpaid interns and volunteers to the list of individuals protected from harassment and discrimination under the Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA), and it extends religious belief protections and accommodation requirements to anyone in an apprenticeship training program, unpaid internship, or any other such program.

**Driver's licenses:** AB 1660 makes it a violation for an

employer to discriminate against anyone who presents a driver's license issued to undocumented persons. Such actions constitute national origin discrimination under FEHA. The law also makes it a violation of FEHA for an employer to require a person to present a driver's license unless possessing a driver's license is required by law or the employer's requirement is otherwise permitted by law. Any driver's license information obtained by an employer must be treated as private and confidential.

**Public assistance recipients:** AB 1792 prohibits discrimination and retaliation against employees receiving public assistance. It also requires state agencies to prepare an annual list of the top 500 employers with the most number of employees enrolled in a public assistance program. The reports will be made public and will be prepared starting in January 2016.

**Harassment prevention:** AB 2053 requires employers that are required to provide mandatory sexual harassment prevention training to supervisors to include a component on the prevention of "abusive conduct." The law does not allow employees to sue for abusive conduct in the workplace unless the conduct

becomes discrimination or harassment against a protected class; it merely requires training on prevention of abusive conduct.

**Farm labor contractors:** SB 1087 imposes specific sexual harassment prevention training requirements on farm labor contractors. It places restrictions on licenses for farm labor contractors who have engaged in sexual harassment, changes the exam requirements, and increases licensing fees, bonding requirements, and penalties.

If a contractor fails to pay its workers properly or provide workers' compensation coverage, the "client employer" can now be held legally responsible. AB 2288, the Child Labor Protection Act of 2014, provides additional penalties for violations of California laws regarding employment of minors, including a penalty of \$25,000 to \$50,000 for "Class A" violations involving minors 12 years of age or younger. The statute of limitations for claims that arise from violations of employment laws is now

delayed or suspended until the minor is 18 years of age.

Other laws include AB 1650, which requires contractors who bid on state contracts involving on-site construction-related services to certify that they will not ask applicants to disclose information concerning criminal history at the time of an initial employment application; and AB 1852, which requires businesses that provide specified services to minors to provide a written notice to the parent or guardian of the minor receiving those services, including the business's policies relating to employee criminal background checks.

## Food for Families Raises Almost Three Million Pounds of Food in Holiday Donation Campaign

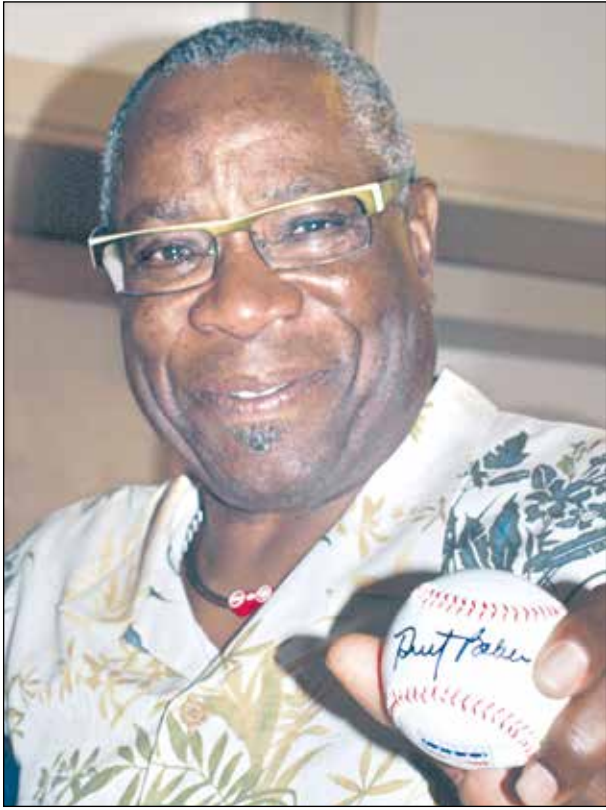






# Chamber Names 2015 Community Heroes

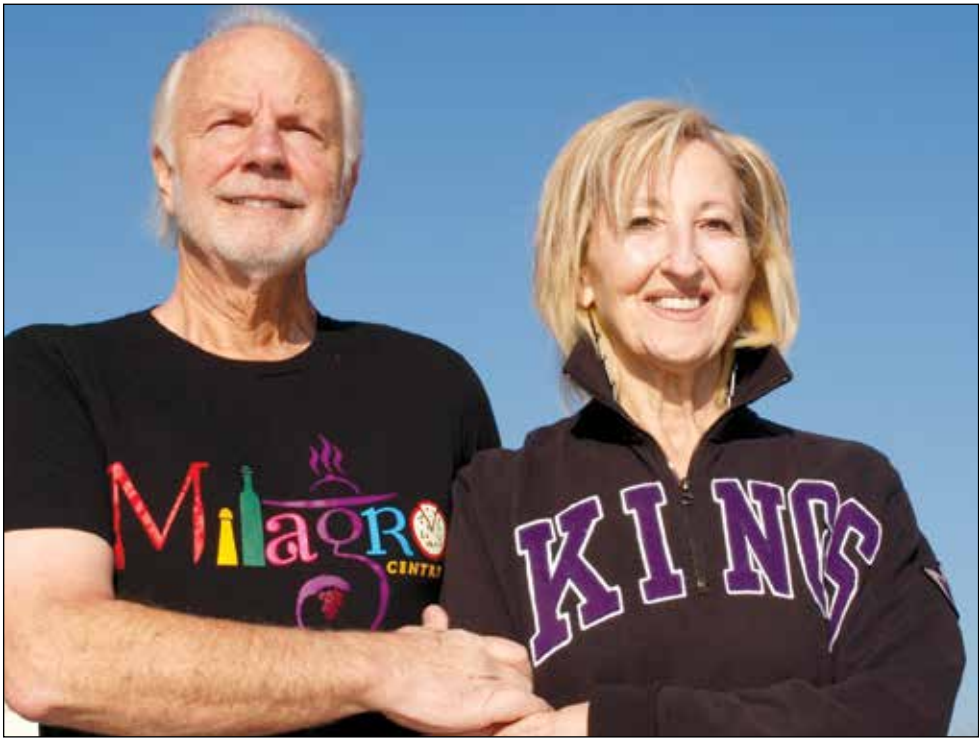

## CHP Highlights New Laws Affecting Motorists

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The mission of the California Highway Patrol (CHP) is to save lives. One way to assist in accomplishing this mission is to ensure all California drivers are familiar with a couple of new laws designed to keep the motoring public safe.

Modified Limousine Safety Requirements: Regulations/Inspections (SB 611, Hill)

This law creates a modified limousine inspection program that must be implemented no later than July 1st, 2016. Through this program, modified limousine terminals will be inspected once every 13 months by the CHP. The new law also defines a modified limousine as a vehicle that seats not more than 10 passengers, including the driver, and has been modified, altered, or extended in a manner that increases the wheelbase of the vehicle, sufficient to accommodate additional passengers. SB 611 also requires modified limousines to be equipped with two readily accessible and fully charged fire extinguishers. The driver or operator of the modified limousine must notify the passengers of the safety features of the vehicle, including instructions for lowering the partition between the driver and passengers and the location of the fire extinguishers.

Driver License Eligibility: Undocumented Residents (AB 60, Alejo)

Beginning January 2nd, 2015, the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) will issue an original driver license to an applicant who is unable to submit satisfactory proof of legal presence in the United States. The applicants are required to provide satisfactory proof of identity and California residency and must meet all other qualifications for licensure, which includes demonstration of the basic knowledge, skills, and ability to have the privilege of driving. This law was adopted during the 2013 legislative year. It does not change the day-to-day operations of the CHP.

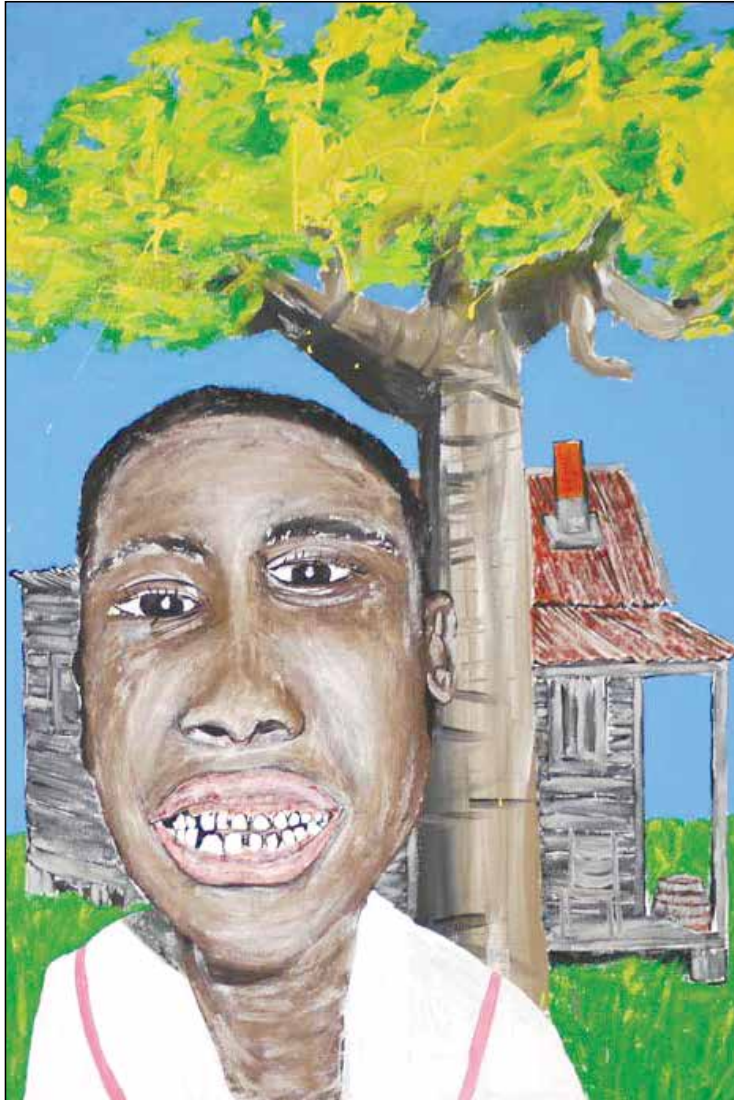
# NCA Aspiring Artist Debut 2015

say they will not hire in the first quarter.

Despite the optimistic outlook, regional acquisition and mergers combined with seasonal layoffs is reducing workforces at 6% of Sacramento regional employers polled in the first three months of 2015.

There are many skills in demand: Sacramento employers demonstrated a strong demand for accounting/finance, general office/clerical, warehouse, and shipping and manufacturing

skills. Customer service, sales, engineering, and information technology skills continue to be sought by the area's top regional companies. Some firms report hiring out of the market for specialized IT and industry proprietary technical skills like automated construction estimating.

There will be challenges in 2015: The New Year brings new laws including sick leave changes and ACA requirements employers are concerned about. Another worry in the Sacramento market is finding qualified applicants, especially in IT and construction trades, with employers also citing retention of current skilled workers as a growing issue.

Of Sacramento regional top companies, polled by industry, 37% are service, 30% are manufacturers, 21% are construction, and 12% are retail.

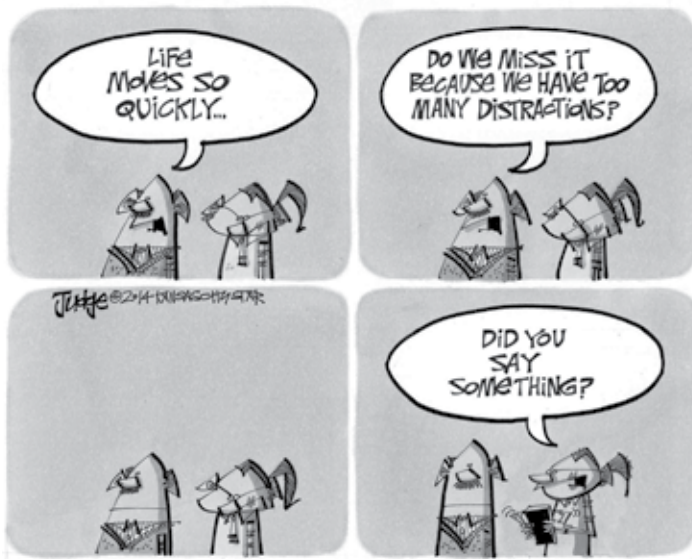

**Obama's Cuban Olive Branch**

Candidate Barack Obama said that, as president, he would talk to anti-American dictators without precondition. He didn't mention that he would also give them historic policy concessions without precondition.

His surprise unilateral change in the U.S. posture toward the Castro dictatorship came without even the pretense of serious promises by the Cubans to reform their kleptocratic, totalitarian rule.

The trade of Alan Gross, the American aid worker jailed in Cuba for the offense of trying to help Jewish Cubans get on the Internet, for three Cuban spies is understandable (we also got back one of our spies, and Cuba released several dozen political prisoners as a sweetener). The rest of Obama's sweeping

revisions -- diplomatic relations and the loosening of every economic sanction he can plausibly change on his own -- are freely granted, no questions asked. It is quid with no pro quo.

There is no doubt that economic sanctions are a blunt and dubious instrument, and reasonable people can disagree about their wisdom (I've gone back and forth about the Cuban embargo through the years). But dictatorial regimes hate them for a reason. All things considered, they want more economic wherewithal rather than less.

Cuba is heavily dependent on the largesse of its ideological partner Venezuela, whose irrational, left-wing policies have helped trash its economy. Just as the Cuban dictatorship faces the dire prospect of the collapse of Venezuela's support, here comes El Yanqui to cushion the blow. The Castro regime will take a cut of the increased trade, remittances and tourism that will spring from Obama's concessions.

Consider tourism. The Cuban military has an enormous holding company called GAESA. One of its companies, Gaviota, operates an extensive network of hotels and resorts, according to the strategic consultancy Stratfor. Imagine if the Pentagon owned the Marriott and Hilton hotel chains. That is the Cuban tourism industry in a nutshell.

About a million Canadian tourists go to Cuba every year. In total, more than 2 million tourists visit annually, and yet the Castro regime is still standing.

It is true, of course, that the embargo -- which Obama can't lift on his own -- hasn't ended the Castro regime. On the other hand, there is little reason to believe that lifting the embargo will end it, either. Our vast trade with China hasn't yet made Beijing any less repressive.

The Cuba embargo is condemned as a relic of the Cold War, but it is the regime itself that is a relic, an inhuman jackboot left over from the era when people actually professed to believe in workers' paradises.

There are holdout believers, still. The liberal elite has often treated Fidel Castro as a cute, plucky figure of defiance, and even now, the government has determined apologists in the U.S. Congress.

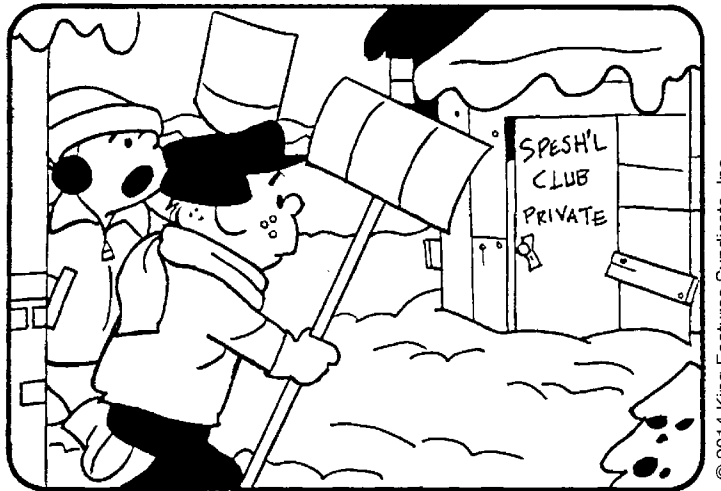
If Cuba were a racist apartheid-style system rather than a communist dictatorship, no one would be so eager to do business with it. The great and good celebrate the Obama changes as the end of an era. But they will replenish the coffers of a Cold War regime that is stubbornly still standing.

# END of the BENCH

## A Hall of Fame All Your Own

Every year about this time sports fans have to wade through an insufferable period of argument and debate regarding the Baseball Hall of Fame.

We've heard it all before, and we will hear it all again and again for as long as we all shall live.

What former major-leaguers deserve to be voted in? What players do not? What about the steroid era and inflated numbers? Who was using performance-enhancing drugs and who was not? What about the cocaine-use days of yore? What about amphetamines?

What about the live-ball era, the lowering of the pitchers' mounds, the band-box ball parks, Coors Field, spitball pitchers, East Coast bias, prejudices of yesteryear, the politics of the voting, career-shortening injuries, or the effects of technological advancements in equipment, training, scouting, travel, media exposure, etc.? What about those scoundrels of the early years that were admitted despite their faults? What about the "morals clause" in the bylaws?

There are always so many factors to be considered by the Baseball Writers' Association of America members who are deemed worthy of casting the deciding ballots.

So, what about Bob? Bob Nightengale of USA Today had a vote this year. In his Tuesday column, Nightengale contends that it is time for the writers to stop guessing, because "we have absolutely no idea who was clean and who was dirty" during the steroid age, and go ahead and vote for the "worthy" players of that era, such as Barry Bonds and Roger Clemens (who were), and Mike Piazza and Gary Sheffield (who maybe were).

Four players emerged elected this year when the smoke cleared, all on-the-field, deserving candidates (we think): Randy Johnson, Pedro Martinez, John Smoltz and Craig Biggio (about time). The first three are first-ballot selections; Biggio was chosen in his third year of eligibility. No Jeff Bagwell, Tim Lincecum, Lee Smith, Fred McGriff, Jeff Kent, Alan Trammell.

Every voter, and most every fan, sifts through his/her own criteria to decide what players they think are Hall of Fame caliber. Putting everything else aside, the "eye test" will determine if a player has the goods to be anointed into one's personal Hall, whether or not the player's likeness ever holds a place in Cooperstown. On an individual level, that is more important than the enshrinements into the official baseball museum.

More significant than any of the great sports halls of fame that celebrate the accomplishments of others that have entertained us through the years, are personal, famous (or infamous) moments that every fan that was ever a participant harbors as memories lodged in the deep recesses of the mind.

Pete Rose is the hits king; Bonds is the home run king; Jerry Rice set a ton of records; so did Walter Payton, Wilt Chamberlain, Michael Jordan. Maybe you were there to see a great moment, or maybe you weren't. Maybe you remember where you were when something spectacular went down, or maybe you don't.

But, you probably do remember many little details about that time you made a diving stop behind third base in the city championship game when you were twelve years old and jumped to your feet to throw the runner out to get your team out of a tight spot.

You probably remember the smell of the gym the time your team was struggling and needed a big lift to get back into the homecoming game, and you went to your trademark crossover dribble move two times in a row for driving layups that sparked a come-from-behind victory.

Certainly you vividly recall when the whole team was sick with the flu and your star player was out, and you stepped up with a double-double performance that helped secure a playoff spot.

If you close your eyes you can picture that wide-open turf in front of you and feel your steps on the ground as you returned that punt for

a touchdown. Or you can feel the soccer ball deflecting off your fingertips as you preserved a win in the closing seconds.

Hall of Fame moments, no doubt. But, back to those poor baseball writers that are entrusted with a most difficult task. Many have resorted to making judgments on players based on varying degrees of evidence or a lack of evidence.

Nightengale complains that "What we've accomplished is turning the Hall of Fame voting into a travesty." He continued on in his article using words such as "clueless...farce...absurdity...mockery."

For far too long those same words were often used in connection with the college football mythical national championship, which in Division I had forever been determined by vote, rather than on the field of play. Absurd. A travesty.

At long last, this season's title will go the winner of the final game of a four-team playoff format (that will, hopefully, be expanded soon to an eight-team field).

Under the former systems in prior seasons, we likely would be awaiting a championship game pitting Alabama, that had been ranked No. 1, against previously-undefeated defending champion Florida State. But, what do you know! Those two teams were beaten on the field in the new semifinal playoff round played on New Year's Day.

Oregon (13-1), led by Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Marcus Mariota, destroyed FSU, 59-20, in the Rose Bowl in Pasadena. A parade of five FSU turnovers and 639 yards of total offense had the Ducks flying past the Seminoles into the championship game. Ohio State (13-1) rallied from a 21-6 deficit for a 42-35 upset of the Crimson Tide on the strength of 281 rushing yards in the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans to reach the finale set for Monday night in Arlington, Texas. ★

### Recent cases of interest

**CASE: Oscar Castillo (12/22/14)**

**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Omar Singh, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit**

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Oscar Castillo was convicted by jury of two counts of lewd and lascivious conduct on a 14 year old. In November 2013, Castillo molested a 14-year-old female family member in her family's home.

Sentencing is set for January 23, 2015 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 20 before the Honorable Donald Currier.

**CASE: Giovanni Mabon (12/19/14)**

**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Molly Steber, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit**

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Michael G. Bowman sentenced Giovanni Mabon to 25 years to life in prison. On November 14, 2014, a jury convicted Mabon of first-degree burglary, attempted robbery and assault by force likely to result in great bodily injury. The jury also found true two prior convictions.

On September 12, 2013, Mabon broke into a family's home in Elk Grove when an 18-year-old female was home alone. Mabon assaulted the young woman, causing injury, and then fled the home. He was identified by fingerprint and cell tower evidence.

In 2009, Mabon was convicted of robbery in Alameda County. In 2010, he was convicted of first-degree burglary in Contra Costa County.

**CASE: Elon Green Jr. (12/18/14)**

**PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Elder Abuse Prosecution Unit**

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Elon Green Jr. was convicted by jury of felony criminal threats, felony residential burglary and misdemeanor elder abuse. The jury also found true that Green had previously served time in prison for being a felon in possession of a firearm.

On September 2, 2014, 42-year-old Green approached his parents' house. When he saw his stepmother in the garage, he rushed towards her and repeatedly threatened to kill her. She retreated into her house, locked the doors and called 911. Green then entered the attached garage and attempted to break through the interior door with a screwdriver. Green's 86-year-old wheelchair bound father tried to stop Green's attack. In response, he assaulted his father.

Green's criminal history includes four separate prior felony convictions for felon in possession of a firearm, a misdemeanor high speed evasion from law enforcement, and several drug and alcohol related charges. Green has previously been sentenced to prison on two occasions.

Sentencing is set for January 23, 2015 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 10 before the Honorable Greta Curtis Fall.

### PICKS OF THE WEEK



Rosamund Pike, Ben Affleck in "Gone Girl"

**"Gone Girl" (R)** -- Based on the best-selling novel by Gillian Flynn, this film adaptation tells the twisty story of a screwed-up marriage between two god-awful, selfish people. Nick (Ben Affleck) goes to the police because his wife of five years, Amy (Rosamund Pike), has gone missing. She's a pretty young lady, so the search gets national attention. The police and media put intense scrutiny on Nick and Amy's marriage -- which, of course, is full of secrets and sleaze.

Director David Fincher ("Fight Club," "Se7en") has fun with the dark themes and off-putting scenes of the story. He dialed in the perfect setting for a moody, atmospheric thriller by bringing his whole crew of award-winning technicians, including Trent Reznor, the industrial rocker who won an Oscar for the score he put to "The Social Network."

**"A Walk Among the Tombstones" (R)** -- As a stone-cold ex-cop, Matt Scudder (Liam Neeson) works as a private investigator in modern New York City. Some bad guys lose their wives to super-bad guys, and Neeson is called in to punish the extra-wicked. As Neeson campaigns through the underworld, he picks up a self-

appointed sidekick in the form of a homeless, streetwise teen (Brian Bradley). Neeson's character is unflappable -- seen it all -- but this job just might push him too far.

Neeson has really nailed down the Icy Badass Harboring Inner Pain role. You might think it would be old by now, but he keeps upping his game. This film focuses on suspense and stomach-churning tension over shaky, flailing fight scenes. Neeson walks like he's the Grim Reaper on his way to an appointment.

**"Love is Strange" (R)** -- Ben (John Lithgow) and George (Alfred Molina) have been together for about 40 years, and only just decided to get married in a nifty little ceremony in Manhattan. Unfortunately, George's job as a music teacher at a Catholic school is terminated. They've known about and tolerated his partner for years, but his marriage apparently puts him over the line. The couple lose their apartment, and each of them have to crash with family and friends in different parts of the city. It's a fine movie about love, its long-term place in our lives and how it changes as we grow.

**"The Two Faces of January" (R)** -- A couple of happy, attractive newlyweds (Viggo Mortensen and Kirsten Dunst) take a trip to the sun-soaked Mediterranean coast, not actually intending to get caught up in any love triangles or homicides. But, as you know, these things tend to happen. The happy couple -- who may be hucksters themselves -- strike up a friendship with a young American tour guide/scam artist (Oscar Isaac) working in Greece. The plot forces the three to run toward Turkey after an accidental killing. This scenic little jaunt quickly becomes a confusing, sexually charged escapade fraught with all types of danger.

## GOOD HOUSEKEEPING

### Bistro Mashed Potatoes

- 3 pounds Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and cut into 1-inch chunks
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 1 cup whole milk
- 4 tablespoons margarine or butter, cut into pieces

1. In 4-quart saucepan, place potatoes, 1 teaspoon salt and enough water to cover; heat to boiling over high heat. Reduce heat to low; cover and simmer about 10 minutes or until potatoes are fork-tender. Drain.

2. Meanwhile, in 1-quart saucepan, heat milk, margarine and remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt over medium-low heat just until margarine melts.

3. Return potatoes to 4-quart saucepan. With potato masher, mash potatoes until almost smooth. Add milk mixture and continue to mash until well-blended. Reheat over low heat. Makes about 6 cups or 8 accompaniment servings.

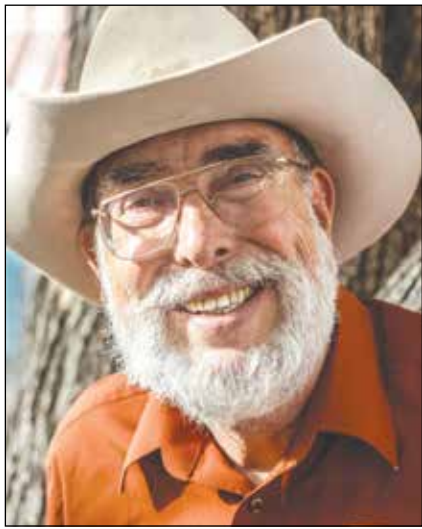

isn't painted, and I drove by the other day and your porch post still leans, and I thought I noticed that dead tree still out in your back yard."

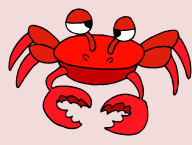
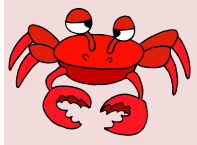

# Help Protect Kids from Fraud and Identity Theft

## Tips for Safeguarding Children's Sensitive Information

**SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG)** - Parents go to great lengths to shield their children from life's bumps and bruises, but even the best bicycle helmets and baby gates can't ward off a hazard that has surfaced in recent years. Identity theft is a threat many moms and dads don't know how to protect against.

"Identity theft is at an all-time high, and criminals are targeting children more aggressively than ever," said Mike Sullivan, director of education for Take Charge America, a national nonprofit credit counseling and debt management agency. "Their credit history is clean, and most parents don't even think to check their kids' credit reports, so it's easy for criminals to do serious damage over a long period of time."

Sullivan offers five tips for parents to safeguard their kids from identity theft:

Protect kids' Social Security numbers: Parents should store kids' cards in a safe and hidden place, and think twice before giving out their child's number.

Health care providers may need this information, but is it necessary for Little League or a library card, or are there other options for identification?

Pay attention to their online activity: Kids surfing the web or checking email or social accounts may unwittingly click on links or download content from unknown sources, putting sensitive information at risk. Parents can teach their kids appropriate online conduct and utilize an array of tools that help protect them online.

Protect financial accounts: Many parents open savings accounts for their children, but they must be careful to keep financial statements private, ensure accounts can't be accessed without their approval, and opt out of any marketing to avoid credit card offers in their children's names. To opt out of credit card offers for five years, call 1-888-5-OPT-OUT (567-8688) or visit optoutprescreen.com.

Understand warning signs: Parents who receive credit card

offers in their kid's name should be wary, as this may mean their identity has been compromised. Other signs include denial of a bank account or driver's license, or collection calls or bills addressed to a child.

Check your child's credit: Parents who believe their child is at risk for identity theft should request a credit report from Equifax, Experian and TransUnion. The process for requesting a report on behalf of a child is different for each credit bureau. The steps and required documentation can be found on their respective websites.

If a child's identity has been stolen, parents immediately should file a police report, contact the Federal Trade Commission at 877-ID-THEFT (438-4338) and place a fraud alert on the child's file with all three credit reporting companies.

Bequeathing beauty clients to her siblings (two brothers and a sister are also coiffeurs), she hung up her blow drier and completed a culinary degree.

The chef experiments fearlessly. With each dinner, her trademark focaccia comes doused in sweet brown butter. "My sister and I have a running competition over our carrot cakes," she says. "Her recipe is good, but we both know whose is best..." Rivera's culinary mantra simmers down to three words: fresh, fresh, fresh. "Everything on my menu is homemade, and we never use substitute ingredients," she explains. "Only real butter goes in our cakes and on our toast. You can still have the yummy stuff and be healthy." The 125-pound dynamo confides: "Just don't overdo the yummy stuff."

Restraint might seem a tall order. Store front shelves groan under homemade gateaux, cookies, tortes, and cobblers. Rivera's pastry chef produces a wild berry scone that commands

a fan club. Some diners return several times a week. A lately deceased nonagenarian hosted weekly dinner parties for 15 or more chums at the café. Breakfasts here start at \$5.95. A soup and salad lunch combination costs \$7.95. The dinner menu includes a meatball pasta dish (with soup or salad) for under \$15. "I keep prices down by doing all the shopping myself and making everything from scratch," says the host.

From her home in neighboring Fair Oaks, Rivera heads to work each day at 5:30 a.m. A weekly shopping marathon consumes six hours. "Luckily, I'm a morning person," she confirms. "But I feel I've never had a day of work because I love what I

do. I have a great husband (pro boxing official Don Rivera), and great children and grandchildren. I've known some of my customers since they were children. Now they're bringing their own kids to eat here. My Lido and my Lido families are my joy."

cultures.

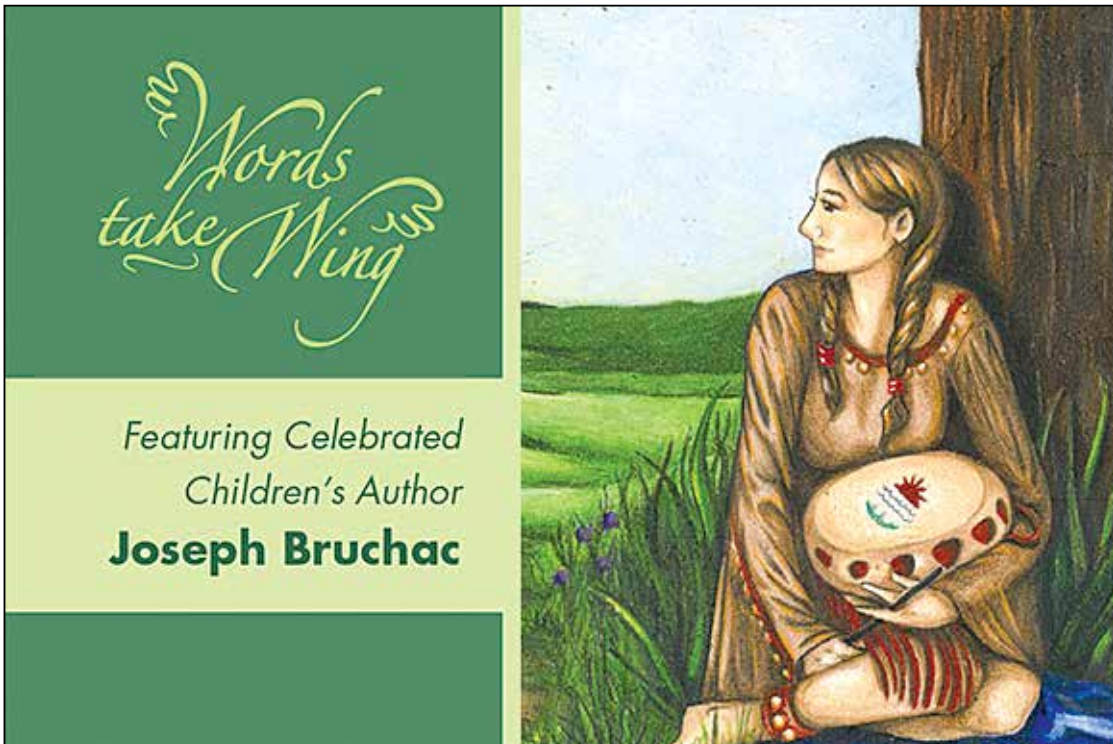
