**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - While gardeners all over the nation are raking leaves, Irv Faria and his wife Pauline let them lie. In fact, the octogenarian Carmichael couple actually collects fallen foliage from neighbors' rakings. "We scatter leaves all over the garden," says Faria. We like the extra color they add to our mini Vermont. And they improve the soil."

More than 50 years of mulching has enriched botanical possibilities in their Carmichael Creek woodland. In the process, retired American River College professor Faria and his wife have nurtured a habitat—certified by the National Wildlife Federation—which brings added delight for the green thumbed couple. Many varieties of birds nest here in spring; wild turkey forage in flocks; newly-born fawns hide under low

In fall, male deer materialize sporting

massive antlers and herd their females toward parkway breeding grounds. "I looked out our bedroom window the other morning and a giant buck was just standing there, looking in," marvels Faria. "My dog had a fit."

The Faria's glade offers these visitors food, water, and seclusion in the built-out suburbs. Human visitors also feast in rich seasonal color. "We like to share our garden with people who are interested in maples," says Faria. Purchasing their steep acre in the 1960s, the couple labored to establish terraced landscaping beneath 70 native

oaks. They planted over 200 Japanese maples of many varieties. Explains Faria: "Some are tall, some are low-growing. Their leaves have different shapes and colors. We tried to achieve a layered tapestry and we enjoy the contrasts of red, gold, orange, and brown against green." Adding to the fall kaleidoscope are many dogwoods, birches and late-blooming native flowers.

Every season brings change to their paradise, and no two autumns are the same. "Our drought caused the leaves to fall earlier this year," notes the gardener. "Some of the usual brilliant colors just haven't happened. But we can't complain. Every day in a garden like this is an adventure."

# **State Water Project Contract Negotiations Set to Begin**

The Public is Invited to Monitor Sessions Live or by Phone

### **SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -**

On Monday, November 24th, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) announced it will begin negotiations with State Water Project (SWP) Contractors in December on proposed amendments that would modify SWP water supply contracts. DWR Director Mark Cowin said the public will be invited to observe the negotiations in person and to listen on the phone using a callin number

Cowin said the objective of the negotiations is to develop terms and conditions for proposed amendments to DWR's water supply contracts with the 29 public agencies that purchase SWP water for distribution to their customers. The proposed amendments would define the rights and obligations of DWR and the contractors who would benefit from the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) should the BDCP be implemented.

Cowin stressed that the negotiations are not a forum for making decisions about approving the BDCP. "These negotiations are entirely separate from other BDCP planning activities and the ongoing BDCP evaluation process," he said.

DWR will open the negotiations to the public to observe and provide comments to DWR at the end of each negotiating session. Members of the public also may submit written comments within seven calendar days following the negotiating sessions.

The first session will be from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on December 10th in Room 1131 of the California Natural Resources Building, 1416 Ninth Street, Sacramento, CA. Seating is limited, but the public can listen to the negotiations by calling 1-719-359-9722, passcode 138000#. Public parking will be available in the parking garage at 10th and O streets.

Cowin said the first session will focus primarily on ground rules and other negotiationrelated processes and will not address substantive amendment issues. As such, it may adjourn early if the agenda items have been addressed or by mutual agreement of DWR and the SWP Contractors.

Due to the frequency of negotiation sessions and the requirement for quick turnaround of meeting materials and announcements, DWR requests that interested individuals sign up for placement on the email distribution list. Individuals can email swpcontractamendmentforbdcp@water.ca.gov. They also may visit the SWP Contract Amendment for the Proposed BDCP website: www.water. ca.gov/swpao/swpcontractamendmentforbdcp. The website will provide information about the project and advance notice of each negotiation session.

Pasion and Enriquez met as colleagues at a small firm in Sacramento in 1999 and developed a friendship. They began collaborating in joint venture projects in 2010 and shortly after opened their own architecture firm: Pasion & Enriquez Architecture. "Thanks to this community's generosity, we can continue to reach even more women and teens who feel scared and alone and instead provide them with a support system and the care they need."

The Sacramento Life Center's mission is to offer compassion, support, resources, and free medical care to women and couples facing an unplanned or unsupported pregnancy. The center's licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and two mobile clinics, all providing free services including well woman exams, pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds,

The stroke abruptly turned Anna's world upside down. Here in the twilight of her life, you'd think she should be set comfortable. Looking at all the obstacles mentioned above, he came up with several in-expensive recommendations and ideas that made it practical to live at home longer, comfortably and safely.

Her family had a ramp built so she could get into her house safely. She could not afford to remodel her entire bathroom, but was able to remove the shower doors in order to access the tub easier and put up a shower curtain. Anna had grab bars installed and James helped her get a customized tub transfer bench so she could slide into the tub. Anna also widened the bathroom door so she could fit her walker through. James recommended an inexpensive way to lower her bed and added a small handle so she could get into her bed safely. Anna can now stay in her home and live a full life without moving.

On November 19th, Senator Ted Gaines (R-Roseville) denounced the University of California Board of Regents' committee decision to raise tuition by as years. This committee approval sent the tuition increase proposal to the full Board of Regents for a vote on November 20th.

Senator Gaines said, "If the full Board approves this plan, it will be another gut punch to middle-class families already struggling to make ends meet in this high-cost state. Just two years ago, Californians had their taxes increased with Proposition 30, after being promised that the money would be used to

college. This year, only about 2% of those funds have been spent on universities. What an embarrassment.

"The UC administrators much as 25% over the next five should also be ashamed of themselves. They are compensated like tech company CEOs with exorbitant salaries and lavish pensions. It's unconscionable that students are being asked to dig deeper while the expansion of the UC ruling class continues without pause.

"Rather than raise tuition, the Regents need to reduce spending, offer more online classes and limit faculty and executive pay raises. Any year there is a tuition increase, there should be

tration salary increases.

"I say no to the misguided and punishing tuition hikes. Our world-class universities must be open and available to everyone in the state, not just the wealthiest sliver. I hope the Regents agree with me and vote tomorrow to protect our students.





### Why Jonathan Gruber Deserves Our Thanks

The epic search of the Greek philosopher Diogenes for an honest man is finally over. His name is Jonathan Gruber, an MIT economist once known as an intellectual architect of Obamacare, although his status is being rapidly downgraded by the law's supporters with every one of his uncomfortably frank utterances about President Barack Obama's signature initiative.

Video surfaced of Gruber saying at a panel discussion at the University of Pennsylvania last year that the law was written in a deceptive, nontransparent way to exploit "the stupidity of the American voter." Gruber swiftly went on MSNBC to explain that his comments should be discounted because he was speaking "off the cuff." Then two other involves imposing taxes, regulations and

videos surfaced of him saying much the same thing at different venues.

Gruber has done us all a favor by affording us an unvarnished look into the progressive mind, which values complexity over simplicity, favors indirect taxes and impositions on the American public so their costs can be hidden, and has a dim view of the average American.

Complexity is a staple of liberal policymaking. It is a product of its scale and reach, but also of the imperative to hide the ball. Taxing and spending and redistributive schemes tend to be unpopular, so clever ways have to be found to deny that they are happening. This is what Gruber was getting at. One reason Obamacare was so convoluted is that its supporters didn't want to straightforwardly admit how much the law was raising taxes and leveraging the young and healthy to subsidize everyone else.

Gruber crowed about the exertions undertaken to make an unpopular tax on expensive health-insurance plans, the socalled Cadillac tax, more palatable. It was levied on employers instead of employees. No one realized, Gruber explained, that the tax would be functionally the same even if not directly imposed on workers. This wasn't a one-off deception. This kind of sleight of hand is crucial to the progressive project, which always mandates at one remove from the average person so he or she won't realize that the costs are passed down regardless.


The debate between conservatives and liberals on health-care policy and much else comes down to how much average Americans can be trusted to make decisions on their own without the guiding, correcting hand of government. An assumption that Americans are incompetent is woven into the left's worldview. It is reluctant to entrust individuals with free choice for fear they will exercise it poorly and irresponsibly.

So Gruber deserves to be listened to, even if he ultimately got it wrong. The public is smarter than he and other Obamacare supporters give it credit for. It has never believed the magical, deliberately deceptive promises about Obamacare, or supported the law that continues to be a drag on the Democratic Party.

Rather than congratulating themselves on their cleverness, the law's architects might better reflect on how, even with crushing majorities in the House and the Senate, they had to lie and obfuscate to get Obamacare passed. That is damning commentary, not on the American public, but their misbegotten handiwork.

# **DMV Extends Office Hours and Adds Appointments** for First-Time Driver License Applicants

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) announced that it is extending office hours and adding appointment opportunities to support the issuance of all original driver licenses, including licenses that will be issued under Assembly Bill (AB) 60 starting on January

"DMV is committed to providing excellent customer service to all Californians," said DMV Director Jean Shiomoto. "Customers with appointments have much shorter wait times, and now all customers seeking new driver licenses will have extra appointment opportunities."

DMV anticipates processing approximately 1.4 million additional driver license applications during the first three years after implementation of AB 60. The DMV will be offering the following additional services:

Extended Saturday office hours by appointment for all new driver license applicants at up to 60 DMV field offices across California starting Saturday, January 3rd, 2015.

Increased number of available appointments in many field offices that will hire additional staff.

New driver license applicants will be able to schedule

appointments with the DMV up to 90 days in advance, double the current 45-day window.

Starting December 1st, 2014, all first-time driver license applicants must make an appointment to visit their local DMV office. However, four new driver license processing centers will continue to offer both walk-in and appointment services: Lompoc, Stanton, Granada Hills (all opened November 17th, 2014) and San Jose (opening December 1st, 2014). Appointments are recommended.

These additional services will be available to all customers seeking an original driver license, the applicant's first license received in California, whether under AB 60 or otherwise. Customers applying for an original driver license will need to do the following:

Make an appointment to visit a DMV field office up to 90 days in advance (or walk-in or appointment at the temporary driver license processing centers in Lompoc, Stanton, Granada Hills, or San Jose).

Study for the driver license

Complete a driver license application form (DL 44) available at the DMV office

Provide DMV with either (1) social security number and proof of identity and legal

presence, or (2) proof of identity and California residency under AB 60. (Last week, DMV posted the list of documents that applicants will need to bring to DMV to obtain a new driver license under AB 60. Details regarding these documents are available on the AB 60 webpage at www.apps. dmv.ca.gov/ab60/index.html.)

Pass a vision test, TouchScreen knowledge (written) test, and if applicable, a road sign test

Give a thumb print

Have a picture taken

Schedule a future appointment for the behind-the-wheel driving test

Applicants under 18 applying for an original driver license will also need to submit proof of driver education completion. For further information about obtaining a new driver license, refer to the California Driver Handbook or visit www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/ dmv/dmv/dl/driverhandbooks.

It is easy to make an appointment to go into a DMV field office; you can make an appointment online, use the DMV now app, or call 1-800-777-0133. Appointments are available up to 90 days in advance for new driver licenses and 45 days in advance for other services.

# **Competitive** Gaming: What are "ESports?"

Unless you're an extravagant Kinect player, or jump around a lot while playing tennis on your

Wii, you likely don't think of video games as being in the same category as competitive sports. True, when it comes to burning calories, video games aren't the same as competing in track and field, no matter how much you jump around while playing.

But, when it comes to professional level competition, playing video games is on a path to

becoming just as popular as professional sports.

The term is "esports," and it covers a lot of territory. Though it applies to competitive shooters such as Call of Duty and Halo, it most often implies more strategic games like Starcraft II, Dota 2 or League of Legends. Most often played through the MLG (MajorLeague

Gaming), esports is the organized competition of video game "athletes", the best of the best at the games that they play. These competitors participate in tournaments where hundreds of thousands, or even sometimes millions, of dollars are at stake. These tournaments attract millions of viewers worldwide whenever they are broadcasted over online streaming services such as Twitch.

Esports are much bigger than a lot of people believe. Starcraft II has been called South Korea's

national sport, and the game has similar levels of popularity in many other Asian countries. That being said, esports has had trouble catching on in the U.S. Just recently competitive video game players celebrated another wall knocked down when the U.S. decided to grant them the same rights to go in and out of the country as any athletic competitor. League of Legends is one of the most popular games (video or not) ever. Cam Robinson, in his show Reality Check on Gamespot.com, calculated that enough hours are put into playing LoL every month to build another Great Pyramid of Egypt, with plenty of hours

But being an esports competitor isn't all fun and games. Pro gamers take their trade seriously, playing their game of choice for hours a day in order to keep up with the competition. They receive their income from sponsors and from tournament winnings, so they have serious incentives to play well in tournaments. The competitors play scrimmages against other pro gamers or pro gaming teams, or host LAN (Local Area Network) matches with their friends and teammates. The LAN matches simulate a tournament environment, where

your opponents are nearby instead of miles away.

Esports is on the rise. It's a booming competitive market that's only getting bigger, and it wouldn't be a surprise to see esports broadcast on live TV in the near future. Whether it be Halo, Call of Duty, or Starcraft, professional gamers work hard to make sure that they're the best at what they do. As the years have gone by, they've gained more respect for their "sport," and hopefully, esports will soon be viewed by the public as comparably prestigious to any athletic competition.

A few weeks ago late on not talking enough --- after Halloween night, there was another knock on the door.

With a bowl full o' treats at the ready, the door was opened to greet one more band of happy princesses and goblins, and one 10-year-old boy in a halfhearted costume --- an Oakland Raiders' silver-and-black football jersey.

"The Raiders?!! Don't you know that they don't scare anybody anymore?" (Clever enough to be self-amused, I suppose, but the little kid didn't get it).

The Raiders were still without a victory at the time. Since then, they did manage to turn one shocking trick in beating the Kansas City Chiefs, 24-20, Nov. 20, in Oakland, to avert the likelihood of a winless season. (Thanks, Raiders, for giving your fans that much). With four winning teams remaining on the Raiders' schedule, including the 49ers next Sunday, all signs point to a 1-15 finish.

They Raiders players and coaches must have stuffed themselves on leftover-turkey sandwiches before last Sunday's game at St. Louis....before those fellows awoke from their tryptophan hangovers, the Rams had rambled to a 35-0 lead just twenty minutes into the contest --- that was clearly no contest. The 52-0 final was the second-worst loss in franchise history (the worst was 55-0 to the Houston Oilers in 1961).

"Thanks for nothing" was the general consensus regarding that performance, or lack thereof, as the often-heard reaction following the ugly loss was "unacceptable."

There were plenty of turkeys to go around through the turkeyday season.

In the days leading up to the S.F.-Seattle game, Seahawks RB Marshawn Lynch was fined by the NFL for not talking enough (to the media). Teammate Richard Sherman could be facing a fine from the league for talking too much about Lynch Sherman's meeting with the press for the purpose of mocking the policies of the turkeys in the NFL offices, who are yet to realize they might be better off telling the players not to talk at all, because most of what they have to say is nothing more than gobbledygook.

The 49ers will just have to accept having cranberry sauce shoved in their faces for now. If they want to take offense and do something about it, they'll have their chance a week from Sunday in the rematch at Seattle.

Thankfully for football fans, there were other games to watch over the holiday weekend.

In a rare exception, the Detroit Lions (8-4) showed that they are still relevant by Thanksgiving Day. Their 34-17 win over the Chicago Bears was a rather interesting affair until the Lions rather wild contest, a 42-35 loss pulled away with 10 unanswered fourth-quarter points. The teams combined for 670 passing yards, with Detroit superstar Calvin Johnson catching 11 passes for 146 and two touchdowns.

Sunday, quarterback Phillip Rivers went 34-for-45, for 383 yards and three TDs, and led the San Diego Chargers 80 yards to a touchdown with just 38 seconds

left to defeat the Baltimore Ravens 34-33. The New Orleans Saints (just 5-7, but still alive in their division race?) survived a 435-yard passing day by Pittsburgh's Ben Roethlisberger and held off the Steelers, 35-32.

The NFL game of the week, though, was the quite-likely Super Bowl preview between two teams that are rolling and two quarterbacks on course for glorification in the Hall of Fame, Green Bay's Aaron Rodgers and New England's Tom Brady. It was the first matchup ever between the two greats as starters, and they did not disappoint.

It was easy, as a viewer, to be transfixed by the play of the two leaders as they directed their teams through this classic, high-caliber game, won by the Packers over the Patriots, 26-21. Rodgers passed for 368 yards and a pair of TDs, while completing 24 of 38, Brady was 22 of 35 for 245 and two touchdowns. There were no interceptions and no fumbles. Both teams lead their divisions at 9-3.

The college level produced a few gems of its own. Alabama (11-1), once again, rose to the top of the rankings as a result of its win over Auburn (8-4). In another intriguing Iron Bowl --- an event that also rarely disappoints --- the Crimson Tide pulled away from the Tigers late to win, 55-44.

Rivalry Week delivered several exciting results. No. 2 Florida State (12-0) beat Florida, 24-19; No. 5 Baylor (10-1) edged Texas Tech, 48-46; No. 8 Arizona (10-2) downed then-No. 13 Arizona state, 42-35, to reach the Pac-12 title games versus Oregon (11-1); No. 12 Georgia Tech (10-2) upended then-No. 9 Georgia, 30-24 in overtime; No. 23 Nebraska (9-3) beat Iowa, 37-34, in overtime, but the Cornhuskers' coach still got fired.

Even Cal's final game of the season (unfortunately) was a to BYU, in Berkeley, that left the Bears at 3-6, 5-7, and not bowleligible. The nearly 48,000 on hand witnessed a combined 280 rushing yards, 60 first downs, and 826 passing yards on 61 completions in the see-saw battle. Quarterback Jared Goff set a single-season Cal record with 32 touchdowns.

### PICKS OF THE WEEK



Michael Fassbender as "Frank"

"Guardians of the Galaxy" (PG-13) -- Peter Quill (Chris Pratt) -- or "Starlord," as he tries to get people to call him -- is an aspiring space bandit who stumbles into possession of the All Powerful Space Gem. Well, it turns out that a merciless alien warlord really needs that space gem for his space genocide. The Galaxy's best hope lies in Starlord and his reluctant allies: an illtempered raccoon-hybrid (Bradley Cooper), a green assassin lady (Zoe Saldana), a rampaging alien who doesn't get figurative language (Dave Bautista, also known for pro wrestling and MMA) and a talking tree guy (Vin Diesel).

It's everything you want from the Marvel super-summer movie, with enough of a twist so it doesn't feel like a recolored Avengers. If you missed it on the big screen, it's still well-worth picking up before the inevitable sequel.

"Dolphin Tale 2" (PG) -- In the last movie, a dolphin named Winter received a second chance thanks to a prosthetic tail fin and a group of dedicated humans. This time around, Winter loses her tank mate, and it's up to a pair of teenagers

(Cozi Zuehlsdorff and Nathan Gamble) to care for Winter and help find her a new companion. There's some human-based drama, too, but the real draw lies in the sea creatures, the struggles to care for them in the right way, and the aquatic photography.

Some critics have panned it as a little too saccharine-sweet. It's certainly sentimental, but there is drama enough to entertain without stealing too much screen time from the pretty animals. This is a feelgood flick that families and aspiring biologists can enjoy together.

"When the Game Stands Tall (PG) - The De La Salle Spartans high-school football team had an unbelievable winning streak of 151 games under the leadership of coach Bob Ladouceur (Jim Caviezel). Then in 2003, out of nowhere, they started losing. A series of offthe-field tragedies coincide with the losing streak, making it even more important for coach to get everyone's spirits back up. While the football scenes are intense and engaging, the stuff before kickoff and in the locker-room just doesn't have the tension.

"Frank" (R) -- An eccentric and inspiring musician spends his life wearing a cartoony papermache head and writing music in a notation system that he invented himself. By Frank's side are his soul-mate (Maggie Gyllenhaal) and a somewhat bewildered young drummer (Domhnall Gleeson). This oddball semi-adventure follows a brilliant-yet-bizarre frontman whose character is drawn from several real-life rockers with complicated or unique personas. Oddest of all was the decision to cast Michael Fassbender in a role that hides his face for the duration. If you've got an urge for a flick with some spunk and a skewed perspective, give Frank a chance to weird you out in a good way.

Use The Right Pan

Be sure it's the size and type specified in the recipe. Choose a shiny or dull gray aluminum; very dark metal may cause overbrowning.

If packing for a party, stick to recipes without dairy toppings, swirls or sticky glazes, and wrap brownies individually.

There are many studios and many more artists, but not every black belt makes for a good instructor. Among good instructors, not all are adept at teaching children. Trust your judgement when choosing your child's teacher. Ask questions. Are all the classes taught by the same instructor? How much experience does the instructor have teaching children? Does the instructor smile at and seem to be having a good time with the children in the class? Is the instructor fair, firm and consistent when discipline is needed? Would you like to have this teacher teach you?

No studio should have problems with questions and you sitting in on classes before making a decision.

Choose a martial arts studio that doesn't have a long commute or an inconvenient location. Location is a crucial factor in any martial arts experience as it tends to dictate just how often your child will attend. Inconsistent attendance is the quickest way for your child to lose interest. All children thrive on consistency.

Be aware of all costs involved. Watch for hidden fees or contracts that lock you in for a long time. Most studios operate on the same business model as a gym where you buy a membership and you are on the hook for a year or more. Should your child lose interest in attending, you may be left paying a bill for the remainder of the contract.

Hidden fees are sometimes attached to the martial arts experience. Belt testing, contest, and special equipment fees are another way studios hide the true cost of attending. There are no hidden fees and never any contracts at Nemuri Kuma Jujitsu.

Special belt packages are also common. Be leery of the coveted "black belt". Ask yourself, "Just what am I buying?" Families are often sold these deals and children are often awarded black belts but these ranks are rarely applicable to the adult. Young black belts who stop training at 12, and return in their 20's, often find their skills fit a 12 year-old body and not their adult frame. At Nemuri Kuma Jujitsu, when your child earns a rank promotion, it is never tied to a belt testing fee. Rank is merit based and determined by your child's abilities.

Martial arts training enhances growth in body and mind. These connections are crucial to cognitive development and classroom achievement. Well connected and disciplined minds find learning to be a joy from grade school through college.


