Church Fair Offers a Crafty Christmas

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - St John the Evangelist School's annual blowout, A Holiday Show of Hands, will ensure a crafty Christmas to more than 10,000

Holiday and entrepreneurial spirits annually soar as crafters install wares for the first December weekend at the Carmichael campus. In its 36th year, the three-day fundraiser jams Locust Avenue and surrounding streets with shoppers'

Wares are too diverse to list. Suffice to say that whether hand-knitted, jeweled, hammered, or turned from a potter's wheel, if it is tooled with artistry and love, St John's is the place to find it. The fundraiser began when organizer Pat Holbus had seven children at St Johns and supported the school's struggle to keep costs down for working families. That tuition fees are still among the lowest of Sacramento Catholic schools speaks to the event's continuing success. The 1976 debut event hosted 20 vendors. Booths now sell out at 150 spaces and prospective crafters are juried so merchandise is not duplicated.

"Every year, we want a good variety of goods and new vendors to keep the show fresh," explains Holbus. Folsom's Noelle Lask, for example, tools steam-punk trinkets. Placerville's Dianne Newman will offer unique scarves and hats. From Roseville, Catherine Davin markets repurposed glass and ceramic items. Sallie Gereg (The Mad Tatter) brings handwork from Fair Oaks. Dawn Trew produces hand-painted glass in her Orangevale studio. Mary Donnis is a Christmas crafter from Granite Bay, and Diana Boud annually sells out her much sought Maus Haus line of hand-stitched critters. Contributing vendors also journey from Loomis, Lincoln, Eldorado Hills, Elk Grove, and Citrus Heights to make the fair a holiday treasure trove.

Holbus now has 12 grandchildren, most of whom have attended St John's. Three

The fair's own hubble-bubble of industry is heartwarming, too. Knitters' needles click in tempo with Andy Williams it's the most wonderful time of the year for hat and mitten purchases. "Even if it's cold or raining, customers are determined to enjoy themselves," says Holbus. "They come from all over Northern

California; some even drive from out of state. For many, our Holiday Show of Hands is part of a tradition for friends to shop together. It's a weekend that says: hey, it really is Christmastime."

The fair is held at St John the Evangelist School, 5701 Locust Avenue, Carmichael, Hours are

9 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday, December 6th; 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday. Admission is free. Doors open on the evening of Friday December 5th, allowing preview shopping for a \$3 donation. For further information, call (916) 481-8845 x 216.

Sheriff's Santa Claus Project

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Since 1995, Deputy Michael Wright has spent the holiday season as "Santa Mike" for the Sheriff's Santa Claus Project.

Santa Mike visits the homes of families with children diagnosed with a terminal illness and families with special needs, as determined by the staff of Kaiser Hospital and the Sheriff's Department's Child Abuse Bureau. Kaiser recognized that Santa's hospital visits had such a positive impact on the children that it was important for Santa to visit these terminally ill children in their homes. Santa Mike graciously took on this task with the support of the Sheriff's Department and Kaiser Hospitals, relying on his own resources and donations from the Sheriff's Department, County employees, local businesses, and

the Sacramento community.

The Sheriff's Santa Claus Project operates on a year-round basis. However, the project does something extra special for local families with children receiving oncology treatments during the Christmas season. Santa and his elves personally visit with every child they encounter at Kaiser Hospital. They deliver stockings stuffed full of goodies during the week of Christmas, and Santa visits emergency rooms and other areas of the hospital where children are admitted. They will also visit children housed in local domestic violence shelters.

Sheriff's Deputies use donated funds to purchase gifts from local stores and gather toys donated by the Sheriff's Toy Project. All gifts are wrapped and then placed into hand-made Christmas stockings by the

During the holiday season, Santa Mike delivers toys, clothing, and Christmas stockings to these local families. He is accompanied by Mrs. Claus, several elves, and many Sheriff's Deputies as they deliver special wish list items (at times, household goods). In each home, they take photographs of the family with Santa and his elves.







Extortion as Conciliation

In a fit of postelection modesty, President Barack Obama is offering not to take executive action to amnesty millions of illegal immigrants -- provided Republicans do his bidding on immigration. It is extortion as conciliation. New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie often invites comparisons to "The Sopranos," but it is President Obama

who is making a tactic out of the HBO

mob drama his major postelection

initiative. His bipartisan outreach

now ends with a pointed "Or else ..."

This offer Republicans can't refuse includes the stipulation that the president will revoke his executive action in the event they pass legislation to his liking. How generous of him.

Obama's tack on immigration speaks to a president who is out of sorts and out of step, and recognizes his own political impotence. Unable to build a political case for one of his chief second-term priorities, he has to fall back on executive usurpation.

Prior to the election, the president delayed his threatened amnesty -- perhaps legalizing millions of immigrants -- because it might harm Democrats. It still became an election issue, with Republicans hammering away at it and winning resoundingly.

This electoral rebuke might give a less highhanded president pause. Not President Obama.

The president says that he'd still "prefer" that Congress itself change the immigration laws. For him, this is a positively Madisonian expression of respect for the American constitutional scheme.

President Obama is distressed that the Senate passed an immigration bill by a wide, bipartisan margin and the House refused to take it up. Fine. That is his right. He has legitimate means to respond.

For one, he could have barnstormed the country for amnesty during the election campaign, seeking to defeat officeholders and candidates who don't share his view on immigration. This is how legislative majorities are built.

With the election past, he can still build the political case for an amnesty and pressure House Republicans to act. If he could turn up the political heat enough, he might make House Speaker John Boehner buckle.

When it comes down to it, fiat is the only means for President Obama to reliably get his way. His promised executive action is a substitute for democratic politics, not an exercise in it.

No matter how frustrated the president is, there is no Chagrined and Impatient Clause in the Constitution that allows him to effectively make his own laws when he is irked at Congress. If so, Congress would have been neutered at the beginning. American presidents have been irked at Congress for as long as there have been presidents and a Congress.

What President Obama is threatening is not only politically graceless -- a rude gesture at the public, as Ron Fournier of the National Journal puts it -- it is a profound distortion of the mechanisms of American government.

Turkey Buying Tips



Whether you buy a fresh or frozen turkey, proper cooking and handling of the bird will ensure a delicious holiday meal. Here are some tips from the National Turkey Federation:

Purchase one pound of turkey per person to be served. This formula allows for the holiday meal plus a little left over for the prized turkey sandwich.
Ensure that the packaging is intact and avoid purchasing a bird with packaging that has rips or tears.
Save on supermarket specials by purchasing more than one turkey. A whole frozen turkey may be stored in your freezer for up to 12 months.

Select the size of turkey based on number of servings needed. There is no appreciable difference between female (hen) and male (Tom) turkeys in tenderness. white/dark meat ratio or other eating qualities. Hens typically weigh between 14 to 16 pounds and toms 15 pounds on up, so choose the size which best fits the number of dinner guests you expect. Select alternative turkey cuts if you are having a small gathering for the holiday. Other turkey products that are readily available include a turkey breast, tenderloins, cutlets, drumsticks or thighs. Or ask your butcher to cut a whole fresh bird in two halves, roast one half and freeze

• Thaw under refrigeration, in cold water, or in the microwave: Refrigeration: Allow approximately 24 hours per five pounds to thaw in the refrigerator. Death of Ferdinand the Eastern Bongo


SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)



Major Injury Crash Involving Reckless Driver

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - On November 20th at approximately 7:35 a.m., Robert Briggs, a 21-year-old male from Carmichael, was driving a 2001 Ford Expedition eastbound on El Camino Ave. west of Fair Oaks Blvd. at a very high rate of speed, weaving in and out of traffic on a wet roadway. A 14-year-old boy was sitting in the passenger seat and a 7-yearold girl was sitting in the right rear seat. Due to Mr. Briggs' reckless driving, he lost control of the Ford and veered out of control to the right, where the Ford struck a SMUD power pole. The Ford continued out of control, in an easterly direction, where it struck another SMUD power pole. This collision caused the second power pole to be severed from its

base. The Ford and the power pole continued traveling in an easterly direction where they both struck a tree, a brick wall, and then a house. This collision caused moderate structural damage to the house. The Ford continued veering in an easterly direction where it struck and knocked over a light pole. The Ford finally landed on its left side.

After the collision, all three occupants in the Ford were trapped and had to be extricated from the vehicle by the Sacramento Metro Fire Department using the Jaws of Life. The driver sustained several broken ribs and was transported to Mercy San Juan Hospital. The 7-year-old girl sustained lacerations to her face and head. The 14-year

old-boy did not appear to have any visible injuries. Both children were transported to UC Davis Medical Center in Sacramento. All three occupants were wearing seatbelts; however, the 7-year-old girl was not in a booster seat as is legally required for her height and age. Alcohol and/or drugs do not appear to be a factor in this collision.

El Camino Ave. between El Tonas Way and Fair Oaks Blvd. was closed for several hours as SMUD was called out to the scene to replace the two power poles that were damaged in the collision. No commute routes were affected by this incident. No other vehicles were involved in this incident.

Multiple Occupancies Damaged in Howe Avenue Strip Mall Fire

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In the early morning of Saturday, November 15th, Metro Fire crews responded to 925 Howe Avenue in the Arden area for a report of visible flames from a commercial strip mall. Crews arrived to find multiple units well involved with fire.

Firefighters forced into the building and began attacking the fire from within. As the fire intensity increased, operations turned defensive so as not to put firefighters at an unreasonable risk. Crews were pulled out of the building and off the roof, with multiple hose lines still in place from the outside. A second alarm assignment was called due to the exposures threatened, but was not needed.

Firefighters from Metro Fire and Sacramento Fire worked together to get the fire knocked down. Crews extinguished the fire, ventilated the structure, and protected adjacent units from extension. Though two occupancies were damaged by the fire, the aggressive tactics of the crews on scene

Small Businesses Beware: Phone Directory Scam Returns

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - An invoice scam that targets small business owners is cropping up once more in the Sacramento region. Solicited offers are being sent from Open Business Directory Ltd., believed to be located in Boston, MA. They have an "F" rating with the Better Business Bureau (BBB) and 1,636 complaints and 64 negative reviews.

Businesses receive a fax with an offer to list their company name in an online directory. All they have to do is fill out their contact information and return the form. A few days later, the business receives an invoice with an outstanding balance of \$1,238 for a two-year subscription to a website that closely resembles the Yellow Pages. When businesses do not respond to the invoice, they are threatened with being sent to collections.

The law is clear: Title 39 of the United States Code, Section 3001 requires that solicitations such as these include a conspicuous disclaimer, in 30-point font, stating, in part, that it is a mere solicitation. BBB reviewed a copy of the solicitation sent to a business in Vacaville, and the legally required disclaimer was present, but not up to size.

How to Avoid the Scam:

Do not respond: If you receive a fax or phone call from a company asking for your business information for an online directory, hang up and do not respond.

The Yellow Pages name and logo: Scammers often use the name and "walking fingers" icon to lend credibility to their scam. However, they are not affiliated with the popular phone directory in any way.

Don't trust Caller ID: Scammers have the ability to spoof a phone number, which means it may look like you are receiving a call from a trusted organization or business.

Contact your BBB: If you have questions or think you have been the victim of a scam, contact your local BBB at www.bbb.org.

Recent cases of interest

CASE: Joseph Leonard (11/21/14)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Amy Holliday, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Joseph Leonard was convicted by jury for the first degree murder of Toussaint Harrison and the attempted murder of Justin Oliphant. The jury also found true allegations that Leonard committed these crimes due to bias against the ethnicity of the victims, and that Leonard used his vehicle as a deadly and dangerous weapon during the commission of each

On June 6, 2013, Leonard confronted the two African-American victims in the parking lot of the McDonald's at Arden Way and Howe Avenue after observing them speak briefly to Leonard's Caucasian female companion. After a short altercation, Leonard drove through the parking lots of several businesses in an attempt to hit Mr. Oliphant with his truck. Mr. Oliphant was able to get out of the way and avoid being hit. Leonard then struck Mr. Harrison with his truck causing severe head injuries, which resulted in his death two days later. Mr. Oliphant and other witnesses reported they heard Leonard use racial slurs towards the victims before and after the crimes.

Leonard faces a maximum potential sentence of 36 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for January 9, 2015 in Department 21 before the Honorable Steve White.

CASE: Patrick Murphy, Michael McMillen & Antoinette Pierce (11/20/14) PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sue Wilson, Consumer & Environmental Protection Division

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Patrick Murphy, Michael McMillen and Antoinette Pierce were arrested on multiple charges relating to defrauding elderly persons. The defendants engaged in a systematic conspiracy scheme targeting seniors, resulting in an aggregate loss of more than \$1 million.

The District Attorney's Office launched an investigation after receiving a case from the State Contractors License Board, in which an elderly victim was defrauded of \$80,000. All of the 11 victims had construction work done at their homes by Murphy and McMillen, who are not licensed contractors. The defendants gained the victims trust and from 2009 through 2014, took large amounts of money from them. The amounts far exceeded the repairs and improvements actually needed or made to the victims' homes. In many instances Murphy asked to be paid in cash and showed some of the victims how to obtain cash advances on their credit cards. The defendants often drove the victims to the bank to get cash. In one incident, Murphy took an elderly victim to her bank to "help" her apply for a home equity loan so she could give him more money. Murphy also directed several victims to write checks to Pierce telling them that she was his wife, his employee or the co-owner of the business. Nearly all of the checks written to Murphy and McMillen were cashed at check-cashing stores. Checks written to Pierce were deposited into her personal bank account.

The investigation also revealed Murphy was convicted in 2001 of defrauding elderly victims in New York, totaling \$1.1 million, with nearly identical facts.

The defendants are scheduled to be arraigned on November 24, 2014.

The jury also found true that Johnson had previously been convicted of assault with a deadly weapon and robbery, bringing him within the provisions of California's Three Strikes law.


On September 6, 2011, three men entered First Bank on Howe Avenue and committed a takeover style robbery. Two of the men were dressed in security outfits. The other man wore coveralls and covered his mouth with a dust mask. The three men were able to flee with over \$5,000. Johnson was identified through phone records and his vehicle description. On September 12, 2011, two men dressed in camouflage did a take-over style robbery at the California Community Credit Union in Elk Grove and fled with approximately \$18,000. Johnson was implicated in this robbery through phone records and witnesses identifying his vehicle in the area.

Johnson faces a maximum potential sentence of 60 years to life in state prison. Sentencing is set for January 23, 2015 at 9:00 am in Department 15 before the Honorable Kevin McCormick.

PICKS OF THE WEEK



Jason Clarke in "Dawn of the Planet of the Apes'

"The Hundred Foot Journey" (PG-13) -- Madame Mallory (Helen Mirren) has dedicated herself to the painstaking perfection of the finest restaurants in France. Much to her chagrin, Papa Kadam (Om Puri) and his family, fresh from India, decide to start a new restaurant and a new life in the rundown building just across the street from Mallory's hallowed establishment. Hassan is heir to his father's Indian cooking legacy, but he's drawn by the allure of fine French cuisine, and Madame Mallory's sous chef (Charlotte Le Bon).

This uplifting Disney treat could have been too sweet, but comedic and dramatic talents of Mirren and Puri keep things interesting. Foodies will appreciate how much the camera and audio embrace the food at the heart of the story.

"Dawn of the Planet of the Apes" (PG-13) -- Mankind has hit hard times, what with the virus that wiped out half of the population and the uprising of enraged extraintelligent apes. Surviving humans in the remains of San Francisco must figure out what to do about the nearby Ape Army that's settled in the woods. Is there room for both of us? Even if the leaders try to keep things cool, how long can

Just like in the prequel, you'll find yourself sympathizing with the apes more than the people. Master motion-capture actor Andy Serkis (who gave awesome performances for King Kong and Gollum) reprises his role as Caesar, the conflicted leader of the apes. The action sequences are big and exhilarating, and the film's more personal moments also come through.

"As Above/So Below" (R) --Beneath Paris lies the catacombs -- a miles-long twisted labyrinth walled with human remains. To one young researcher (Perdita Weeks) and her crew of tag-alongs, this sounds like a great place to go crawling around with cameras on their heads. They don't find the mythical stone they were looking for, but they do find a tunnel into their own personal nightmares. The setting is grim and dark enough, but this found-footage flick will leave you more nauseous than spooked.

"Kids for Cash" (PG-13) -- In Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, more than 3,000 children were incarcerated for minor misconduct, all while one judge raked in nearly \$3 million in kickbacks from the companies running the detention centers. One girl was even sentenced to juvenile detention for making a fake MySpace account as a joke on her school's assistant principal. Each kid who entered Mark Ciavarella's courtroom was railroaded to the maximum possible sentence, because every kid he locked up put money in his account. This documentary examines the scandal, the impact it's had, and what it says about our justice system.
