THE RICH LOWRY COLUMN By Rich Lowry

The Callow President

"Stop just hatin' all the time." If you haven't been following the news, you might not know whether this bon mot was uttered by a character on the ABC Family show "Pretty Little Liars" or by the president of the United States.

Of course, it was the leader of the free world at a recent Kansas City. Missouri, rally, imploring congressional Republicans to start cooperating with him. The line struck a characteristically -- and tellingly -- juvenile and plaintive note.

How many books and articles have been written by conservatives seeking to divine the philosophical beliefs and lurking psychological motivations beneath the president's smooth exterior?

It's certainly true that the president is much further left than he'd ever admit, but the deepest truth about called the Ryan budget a "meanwich."

Obama is that there is no depth. He's smart without being wise. He's glib without being eloquent. He's a celebrity without being interesting. He's callow.

It's a trope on the right to say that Obama has quit, that he's not interested in the job anymore. It isn't true. If you are smug and unwilling to bend from your (erroneous) presumptions of how the world works, this is what presidential leadership looks like.

Obama evidently has no conception of the national interest larger than his ideology or immediate political interests. In terms of his sensibility, he's about what you'd get if you took the average writer for The New Yorker and made him president of the United States.

The notion that Obama might be a grand historical figure was always an illusion. Once the magic wore off, it became clear he's not really an orator. His greatest rhetorical skill turns out to be mockery.

The man who once promised to transcend political divisions is an expert at the stinging partisan jab. What Winston Churchill was to thundering statements of resolve, Obama is to snotty put-downs.

During the 2012 campaign, he hit Republican nominee Mitt Romney with relish over his promise to cut funding for public television: "Elmo, you better make a run for it." He has

He has made the Republican reaction to his lawlessness an ongoing joke.

The president's constant complaints about everyone else in Washington playing politics while he high-mindedly devotes himself to substance have all the maturity of Holden Caulfield's plaints about "phonies." Please, grow up.

Ever since he lost the House in 2010 and could no longer operate on the basis of sheer brute force, the president has relied almost entirely on tactical cleverness. It has been impressive on its own terms, whether it involves the invention of the "war on women" in 2012 or the double-dog dare to Republicans to impeach him now.


But this is basically all he's got -besides his infamous "pen and phone." He has already expanded the powers of the office beyond their legitimate bounds and may well take another quantum leap with an executive amnesty. But rarely has the presidency felt so small, at the same time discontents at home and chaos abroad loom so large.

It's not "hatin" to expect something better -- or at the very least a little less pettiness.

Yesteryear Rests Peacefully in Fair Oaks Cemetery

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Picturesque Fair Oaks cemetery was founded on October 21, 1902 on a halfacre of land. Ornate headstones commemorating patriarchs lie in close proximity to simple, unnamed grave markers. The list of interments is unique; the first official resident of the grounds was Sarah Vail, a Folsom native who died in a fire and was buried in 1903. There are two other women who were buried in 1898, but Miss Vail is the first authenticated burial at Fair Oaks Cemeterv



Other gravesites include a dozen Civil War veterans from both the Union and Confederate Armies who now share a common ground. Another notable resident is Myrna Opsahl, a 42 year old mother of four who died in 1975 during an early morning bank robbery in Carmichael. She was shot by the infamous Symbionese Liberation Army. (The radical group also


kidnapped and brainwashed heiress Patty Hearst during their reign of terror.) Alongside these graves are the plots of early 20th century people who are memorialized with small stone markers listing only last name and year of death. One in particular is a tiny headstone cradled amongst the roots of a large oak tree bearing the inscription: Bishop Baby - 1907. One hundred and seven years later, this little monument still brings on a melancholic sense.

Fair Oaks Cemetery manager of 17 years, Ray Young, takes great pride in the many years of service the cemetery has provided to the community. "We are one of the oldest cemeteries in the region." His staff includes office manager Terri Perrin, clerk Theresa Day, and lead ground-skeeper Guillermo Barron; they help Young maintain the tradition of honoring loved ones in

a placid and serene setting. The cemetery facilities now cover 12 acres and over 100 years of local history.

Fair Oaks The Way it Was (1976) recounts: "In the early 1890s, a man, a representative of the Howard & Wilson Publishing Co., which was seeking land for a colony, rode up a trail along the American River and was greatly impressed with the beauty of the land, especially a stand of moss-draped oaks along the north shore of the river. He had found his site. It was known as 'Sunset Colony' and was later named Fair Oaks because it looked like Fair Oaks, Virginia." The publishing company purchased 9,000 acres and helped settle the area known today as Fair Oaks, California.

Pioneers from the Midwest and East with names such as Slocum, Straith, and McClatchy were families that helped

The Fair Oaks Cemetery District (FODC) oversees the day to day operations of the facility and serves Fair Oaks, and parts of Carmichael and Rancho Cordova. Various community organizations, such as the Fair Oaks and Carmichael Chambers of Commerce, the Fair Oaks Rotary, and the Orangevale Grange, partner with the FOCD and help to maintain this resting place.

work? Have you tried it and been disappointed? Do you find your thoughts drifting to the negative even though you try to make them positive?

Positive thinking is extremely powerful. It is essential to goal achievement. Positive thinking begins the process of attracting the circumstances and people you need in order to get where you want to go. Positive thinking is a crucial component of problem

If you haven't had great success with positive thinking, you are likely discouraged. Even if you may not have realized the results you had hoped for, what's the

alternative? Negative thinking?
Although you may be skeptical about positive thinking, no one can claim negative thinking is

preferable.
Since negative thinking will certainly exacerbate any problems, you have nothing to lose by thinking positively. Positive thinking has benefits without any negative side effects.

Negative thoughts are displaced with positive ones. Many people have far more negative thoughts than they realize. Start by monitoring what you think about. Supplant each negative thought with a positive one. For example, replace I can't with I can, it won't work with I'll find a way to pull it off, I don't know how with I'll find a way, and I don't want to fail with I'll be successful.

Changing your thoughts is a continuous process. Even the most positive people have negative thoughts. However, they catch themselves and immediately engage in positive replacement.

With practice, your positive thoughts will far outnumber any negative ones and the negative ones will be more readily displaced.

Although positive thinking is great, two additional components are required in order to realize its full, unlimited potential. Your positive thoughts must be accompanied by a positive plan and positive action. Your positive thoughts will facilitate plan formulation and motivate you to take action.

Your plan is the roadmap that delineates the steps required to attain your goal. A goal can be something you want to accomplish, a problem that needs to be solved, or an obstacle to be overcome.

A common pitfall is to make each step in your plan too large. It's hard getting started on a big step. Make sure you divide each big step into smaller, more manageable segments. By so doing, you reduce the likelihood of becoming overwhelmed.

If you have problems formulating a workable plan, tap into your positive thinking. Direct your mind to discover a workable plan. Leave you mind open to all possibilities. Be patient. An idea or inspiration can come at anytime, from anywhere.

A plan is dynamic. It can be modified as needed at any time. You can add, change, or eliminate steps. Your positive thoughts keep your mind receptive to any alterations you'll need to make.

Once your plan is in place, you must take action. Without action nothing happens. Start with the first step in your plan. It doesn't

matter how small the step might be, getting started is what's imperative. Procrastination is particularly debilitating when you want to get started. The longer you delay taking action, the longer it will take before you see results.

After the first step, take the next one. Continue taking action until your goal is accomplished. If you get side tracked, stumble, or suffer a setback, just get back on course. As long as you keep moving forward, you will ultimately be successful.

Begin with positive thoughts. Next create a positive plan. Then take action. Utilizing this combination strategy enables you to accomplish more than you previously thought possible.

This is exactly the same method used by all great achievers. ★

establish Fair Oaks and the surrounding expanse. The Fair Oaks Bridge and the arrival of the railroad spurred growth, and Fair Oaks became known as the crown of the Sacramento Valley in the heart of California. A local publication of the period, The Tattler quipped: "Now that we have two M.D.s, the people have concluded that we need a cemetery." Two and one half acres at Olive Street and New York Avenue were purchased for the sum of \$250.00 from S.E. Keifer for use as a cemetery. Bylaws were drawn up and lots were apportioned to the stockholders. Fair Oaks Cemetery Association President C. H. Slocum allocated the remaining plots for future sale.

The Fair Oaks Cemetery District (FODC) oversees the day to day operations of the facility and serves Fair Oaks, and parts of Carmichael and Rancho Cordova. Various community organizations, such as the Fair Oaks and Carmichael Chambers of Commerce, the Fair Oaks Rotary, and the Orangevale Grange, partner with the FOCD and help to maintain this resting place.

Fair Oaks Cemetery is an allinclusive memorial park serving the various regional communities. Interments include an array of plans ranging from the moderately priced Oak Knoll
Niches to specially placed and designated plots available throughout the grounds.





Small Businesses Solicited at a Costly Price

Businesses beware: solicited offers to renew a Fictitious Business Name (FBN) are once more making their way into the mailboxes of business owners. The offers inform a business that their FBN will soon expire and that to renew they need to return the attached paperwork and pay a fee. However, businesses have complained that the offers are misleading, giving them the impression the offer is from a local government agency. According to complaints, business owners have received similar offers from Corporate Records Service, California State Corporations, and California Business Compliance Agency.

In particular, BBB received 15 complaints about a company located in East Sacramento, Compliance Filings, Inc. Businesses complain that they are misled by the company's solicitation and end up paying a \$125 fee to file—a fee that is 2-3 times more than what some local counties charge. Although the company responded to most complaints by issuing refunds, they have typically kept a portion of the refund for a processing fee, or fees they claim to have paid to a government agency on the business's behalf.

One complainant, a business owner in San Francisco, said, "It pains me to know that this fraudulent company is targeting small business owners who are at the very core of our economy."

These solicitations are legal to send, but they must include very specific disclaimers. Title 39, U.S. Code, Section 3001, requires that a disclaimer be placed on the outside cover or envelope. It also requires a disclaimer on the front and back of every page of the solicitation with conditions prescribed by the U.S. Postal Service. According to the USPIS website, the solicitation must be conspicuously placed in boldface capital letters and in 30 point-font. Upon review of the most recent documented solicitation BBB received, sent by Compliance Filings, Inc., the disclaimer was not conspicuously placed and the font was not up to size. When BBB contacted the company about their unresolved complaints and advised that they might be in violation of guidelines prescribed by the USPIS, Compliance Filings, Inc. did not respond. Due to their volume complaints, one BBB considered to be of a serious nature, and failure to answer all, the company currently has an F rating.

Similar offers have caused controversy in the past, resulting in legal action by local governments. In 2011, the Riverside County District Attorney's office charged a County resident with two felonies after sending similar solicited offers with a counterfeit government seal. Similarly, the United States Postal Inspection Service (USPIS) warns against being misled by similar solicitations, and on their website states, "Don't be victimized by con artists who try to get your company to order goods or services by mailing you solicitations designed to look like invoices."

PICKS OF THE WEEK



Amy Poehler in "They Came Together"

"Draft Day" (PG-13) -- On the morning of the NFL draft, the general manager of the beleaguered Cleveland Browns (Kevin Costner) faces 12 grueling hours of highstakes decision making, with little to go on but instinct. He has to pick which athletes to pull onto his team, with each choice affecting the life of a young athlete. He's second-guessed on all sides, especially by the team's hot-head coach (Denis Leary).

Fortunately, the movie isn't all statistics and business talk. Director Ivan Reitman ("Ghostbusters" and "Up in the Air") gives things the right touch -- even in this tense atmosphere, there's room for humanity and humor. Costner plays the sports-boss role like a champion.

"Night Moves" (R) -- Three environmentalists blow a hydroelectric dam with a homemade bomb, then contend with consequences they didn't expect. Josh (Jesse Eisenberg), the leader, is silent and calculating. Dena (Dakota Fanning) comes from an upper-crust family, but she's not interested in wealth. Ex-Marine Harmon (Peter Sarsgaard) is the

only radical who seems to revel in the defiance and destruction. After the blast, they split up and lay low -- paranoia stalking each one.

This movie is a slow boil. The suspense is palpable, but not in your face. The exact beliefs and motives of the three eco-terrorists aren't really given in detail. It's a story meant to leave you questioning. Was it worth it? Even the bombers are left without a clear answer.

"They Came Together" (R) -- Paul Rudd and Amy Poehler throw chemistry at each other in this dead-on parody of the Hollywood romantic comedy. You know the drill: They can't stand each other at first, then love pulls them together, then something arbitrarily pulls them apart so they have to publicly declare their love and get back together at the end. The movie maybe goes too far in pointing out just how many tropes and cliches it has borrowed from the old formula. Director David Wain ("Role Models" and "Wet Hot American Summer") assembles his extensive crew of very funny friends to fill the cast.

"Moms' Night Out" (PG) --Looking for a family comedy that takes mom's side, but ends up confirming her darkest fears at the same time? This faith-based feature follows Allyson (Sarah Drew), a harried suburban mother of three who plans a desperately needed night of fun with her best friend (Andrea Logan White) and their pastor's wife (Patricia Heaton). The ladies fear that their families will collapse into chaos and danger without them, and that's pretty much what happens. The moms' night out turns into a sometimes-funny frenzy of anxiety and adventure, pushing the quiet lesson that moms should be glad to stay at home.



(MPG) - Some of our readers have expressed concern about chemtrails (chemical trails) and have requested that we cover this issue. I thought I'd bring it directty to you, our readers, and give you a chance to weigh in on the issue.

The white clouds that strea the skies in the wake of highflying planes are contrails (condensation trails), and are formed from water vapor in aircraft exhaust. Contrails are formed only at very high, cold altitudes, usually above 8 km where the air is less than -40 degrees C with high humidity. Contrails cannot form at lower altitudes or at higher temperatures, so when people see what appear to be contrails at lower altitudes, they believe they must be something else: chemtrails.

Two of our readers saw what they believed to be chemtrails, and they took photos to document the low altitude trails near their homes. The photos from Carmichael were taken by the reader's eight year old child.

According to people who observe what appear to be chemtrails at low altitudes, the vapor clouds seem to last longer than contrail clouds, and they have observed trails emitting from places other than the engines. One chemtrail observer


noted that substances are visibly pulled down from the clouds by gravity (see top photo).

Opinions are widely split; some people think all trails are contrails, and some believe that chemtrails are not only real, but are being used by the government for nefarious purposes.

Do you think low flying a craft are emitting contrails or chemtrails? If you believe they're chemtrails, what do you think they are, and what do you believe their purpose is?

Repair Now or Buy Later?

I'm driving a 10-year-old car with 195,000 miles on it. The car needs \$1,500 in repairs, and it's worth \$5,000. I have \$40,000 in cash saved, \$40,000 in investments and I make \$80,000 a year. I also have \$15,000 in student loan debt, but the only other thing I owe on is my house. Should I pay to repair the car or buy something else for \$15,000?

Dear Dave,

Nice name! If you wrote a \$15,000 check for a newer car and wrote a \$15,000 check for the student loans, it would leave you with \$10,000. I wouldn't buy a \$15,000 car in your situation. I'd buy a \$10,000 car. You could \$3,500 if it needs repairs, combine that with your money and get a \$13,500 car. Then, you could write a check and pay off the stu-

This is a tough one for me, because I have three dogs of my own. I've got a pug that's older than dirt, a shih tzu with an attitude and the best golden retriever on the planet. I love animals, and like you, I've got a lot of rental properties. But I don't allow animals in my properties.

Some people have accused me of hating all animals except sell your current car for around my own. I can tell you that's not true. But the fact is a lot of people don't take good care of their animals and keep an eye on them. It's hard enough to find trustworthy, responsible renters these days, and if you add a dog or cat on top of that you're just

asking for trouble. I've had situations in the past where I had to spend \$10,000 to clean up a house after a tenant had a dog or cat in there. They'll chew things up, stain and stink things up, and tear things up. Sometimes you even have to replace the floorboards!

I had a lady offer me \$10,000 deposit the other day on one of my properties, just so she could move in with her dog. I said no. It's in all my leases now — no animals. I don't allow them in at the beginning, and if one of my tenants gets one after they move in they either have to find a new home for the animal or move out themselves. At that point they're in violation of the lease.

The problem is I really do have a heart for animals. I love them. But as a landlord who's running a business, it just doesn't make sense.


