



Little Libraries a Big Hit

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - They are small, cute as bugs, and they're popping up everywhere.

Worldwide, Little Free Libraries are now installed in more than 15,000 private yards. Part of a back-to-basics program, these libraries-on-a-stick promote literacy and neighborly values. People stroll by, choose a book, and often, says Carmichael teacher Ralphene Lee (75), they leave one in return.

This reading teacher's love of books did not end at her 2003 retirement. "People said I would be perfect to run a Little Free Library," she says. "Since then, I have had teacher friends in Florida, Reno and San Carlos who've started their own."

Assistance League of Sacramento Purchases Building

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Assistance League of Sacramento (2528 Yorktown Avenue) has purchased the property located at 2751 Fulton Avenue to house its philanthropic center, administrative offices, and retail business. This community based philanthropic organization serves over 20,000 individuals each year in the Greater Sacramento area.

This permanent home will allow the organization adequate space to operate its eight philanthropic programs, which service local school districts, hospitals, senior residences, and emergency and youth social services. It will also provide administrative headquarters and a permanent home for its resale retail business.

Assistance League Thrift Shop has operated from three leased locations in its 27 years of continuous business operation. This larger retail space will expand the charity's ability to generate revenue, which represents over 60% of the funding used to bring services to the neediest segments of our area. Assistance League provides school clothing for over 5,000 children in four local school districts each year.

Partnering with Wells Fargo Bank, the property will undergo renovation and is not expected to be operational until sometime in 2015. Greg Thomas, senior vice president Cornish Carey, has worked with the organization for over three years to purchase a property in the Arden-Arcade area suitable for both administrative offices and a retail business. Thomas said, "This is an ideal location in the Fulton Avenue corridor. It is close to the schools served by Assistance League. The proximity between the revitalization of Town & Country Village & Mueller Corner (Fulton and Marconi) and Kuni Auto (Fulton and El Camino) will boost Assistance League's ability to provide quality services to those in need." ★

Wells Fargo Foundation Donates \$50,000 to Improve El Soldado *Mexican American Veterans Memorial*

tall trees and nestled on a pillar stands El Soldado or as it has more recently been called, the Mexican American Veterans Memorial. This monument to the gallant and patriotic military service of Latino/Hispanic veterans is well on its way to receiving a much needed facelift thanks to the commitment from individuals and organizations alike. The Wells Fargo Foundation is the latest such organization to demonstrate its commitment, not just to veterans and their families, but also to the monuments that showcase their patriotic service.

"On behalf of all veterans, but especially Latino/Hispanic veterans, we are proud to accept this \$50,000 donation from the Wells Fargo Foundation," said Peter J. Gravett, CalVet Secretary. "This donation allows us to take a giant step forward in our quest to beautify and enhance El Soldado."

California is home to approximately 1.8 million veterans of which nearly 272,000 are Hispanic/Latino. El Soldado/ the Mexican American Veterans Memorial serves as a testament to the service and contributions of these Hispanic/Latino

the only monument nationally recognizing the military contributions of Latino veterans from all branches of the military to be located on state capitol grounds.

The Mexican American Beautification and Enhancement Committee and the California Department of Veterans Affairs (CalVet) are diligently working to raise \$800,000 to complete the renovations needed by El Soldado. The Memorial Committee and CalVet have established a plan that would fund and construct the enhancements in three stages at the following levels, respectively: \$300,000, \$500,000, and \$800,000. According to their input, each stage would look like a completed memorial, but each new stage would add significant enhancements to the design or landscaping of the prior stage.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Among veterans. > Dedicated in May 1951, the memorial consisted of a statue of a solitary infantryman. Known as "El Soldado," the statue stood on the grounds of the Mexican American Center in Sacramento. Weathered and worn over time, El Soldado remained at this site for decades until the location was rezoned by local government. The statue was donated to the State of California with the expectation that it would become an official and permanent state memorial. In 1975, El Soldado was moved to its present location across the street from the Main (West) entrance to the State Capitol.



Little Libraries a Big Hit

Requirements are few, and no start-up capital is needed. Books come from library sales and from the ever-overflowing shelves of book lovers. Front yard kiosks may take the shape of school houses, Amish barns, covered bridges, or Mother Hubbard's cupboard. Some patrons tailor design their little libraries to match their houses. A three-teacher effort, Ralphene's mini library was built by former Bella Vista High School principal Targe Lindsay. "He didn't spend a

cent," said Ralphene. "He used old wood from his workshop. My brother-in-law, Bruce Lee, (another retired educator) got a post-hole digger to set it in the ground. I did the painting. I was warned about vandalism, but there hasn't been any. I guess people respect books too much to damage them."

Of around 30 little libraries in Sacramento, few are as well located as Ralphene's Hesper Lane spot (near Coyle Avenue). "I'm on a corner and close to a school," she explains. "Lots of parents and kids walk by."

After filling her shelves,

Ralphene watched from behind

her living room curtain as her

first customer arrived. "It was

a mom with a stroller," she

recalls. "She chose a book and

gave it to her baby. The baby

was admiring the book as they

walked away. I thought: wow, this works ...' Marianne Rayburn suffers from memory loss, but this has not ended this teacher's educational outreach. Every day, young visitors occupy the wooden bench in the Rayburn's Cayente Way yard (near Arden Way). "We came home once

to see three teenagers on the

lawn," savs Marianne's husband, Richard. "They were so totally engrossed in our books they hadn't even turned their car engine off."

More than 1700 children's titles are a legacy of Marianne's 28 years with the San Juan School District. Explains her husband: "Our library was a way to get Marianne's books back into young peoples' hands." Since its installation, another Little Free Library in Auburn was dedicated to the 64-year-old. "Her friends still regard Marianne as the finest teacher they've ever come across," says Richard Rayburn. "During her career, she didn't just teach children to read. She did everything she could to make them love reading."

Carmichael Artist Dianne Van de Carr (60), read about Little Free Libraries and convinced her retired doctor husband to build one for their Dell Road home (near Fair Oaks Boulevard). "Phil found an old cabinet and repurposed it," she says. "We used books that belonged to our children, and we found others in yard sales or thrift stores.

"The library has contributed a great sense of community to our street," she said. "Walkers stop by every day. Our local Montessori School brings children here on foot; it's a field trip for them. Sometimes I hear laughter in my yard and I look out and see children chuckling at something they're reading. People are so used to their electronic devices. But I say: nothing beats sharing a good old fashioned book. "

'A Hell of a Foray'

If an Israeli high-level official were caught on a hot mic candidly commenting on Secretary of State John Kerry's ill-fated act of Israel-Hamas peacemaking, he might call it "a hell of a diplomatic foray."

Kerry was caught sarcastically describing the Israeli offensive into Gaza as "a hell of a pinpoint operation" during his round of Sunday-show interviews two weeks ago, before telling his aide over the phone, "We've got to get over there," and "It's crazy to be sitting around."

Kerry's belief in himself as the Indispensable Man is touchingly quaint. His conception of the U.S. secretary of state is apparently frozen in a time when it was a position of unparalleled power and respect. Those days are gone.

Or as President Barack Obama might quip, to paraphrase his put-down of Mitt Romney's foreign-policy views during one of the 2012 presidential debates, "John, the 1980s want their secretary of state back.'

After six years of resetting, leading from behind, ending wars, nation building at home and pivoting to Asia, the U.S. has reduced itself to a husk of its former influence. When Kerry showed up in Cairo to meet with the president of Egypt, he was wanded by the guards, as if he had just wandered in from the airport security line.

Kerry underlined his dubious relevance by his inability to secure a cease-fire, and his dubious wisdom by making it his overarching goal. At this point, after Israel has committed itself on the ground, the U.S. should be seeking to give it the time it needs to do as much damage as possible to Hamas' military infrastructure, instead of effectively bailing out the terror group.

By the time Kerry returned home, he had been showered with so much criticism by the Israelis that the U.S. government was saying it could endanger our relationship. The question raised by Obama administration foreign policy again and again is, How can self-styled Smart Power be so dumb and toothless?

For all of Kerry's failings, he is a relative giant among a foreign-policy team composed largely of political hacks and post-American declinists. At least Kerry retains some of the old Democratic Party belief in America's importance in the world. His condemnation of Syria's use of chemical weapons last year was a stirring moral indictment of the Assad regime -- although President Obama immediately undercut him when he abandoned his own "red lines."

So far, Kerry's tenure as secretary of state is making Hillary Clinton's undistinguished stint look impressive by comparison. But that's mostly a matter of timing. It is his misfortune to be present at the unraveling, as crisis after crisis unfolds, with the administration lacking the interest or the tough-mindedness to effectively respond.

It is impossible to find anywhere in the world where our position or alliances are stronger than they were six years ago.

One hopeful theory about Obama foreign policy was that, after serial humiliations and failures, it would recalibrate toward more assertiveness, like Jimmy Carter did after the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan. But he seems content with America's new status in the world. John Kerry will just have to get used to it.

CASE: Michael Almeda & Rudy Villa (08/07/14) PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Donell Slivka, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Michael Almeda and Rudy Villa to life in prison without the possibility of parole. On June 30, 2014, a jury convicted Almeda and Villa of first-degree murder. The jury also found true the special circumstance of shooting from a moving vehicle and arming allegations.

On January 17, 2013, Almeda and Villa shot and killed Alexander Chavez in a drive-by shooting.

CASE: Felisha Blackmon, Aaron Bonner, Darryl Cartwright, Bonita Clayborn, David Ludd & Atlakea Scott (08/07/14)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Alan Hengel, Insurance Fraud Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Laurel White sentenced Aaron Bonner, Bonita Clayborn, David Ludd and Atlakea Scott following their no contest pleas to felony charges of insurance fraud and identification theft.

Ludd was sentenced to state prison for 2 years. Bonner was sentenced to one year in the county jail and placed on 5 years felony probation. Clayborn and Scott were sentenced to 240 days in the county jail and placed on 5 years felony probation.

Between May 23, 2011 and May 24, 2012, the six defendants impersonated insurance policy holders and submitted approximately 1,000 fraudulent claims for automobile windshield chip repairs to numerous insurance companies. The insurance companies paid nearly \$100,000 on these fraudulent

Cartwright's sentencing is set for August 27, 2014 at 8:30 a.m. and Blackmon's sentencing is set for September 10, 2014 at 8:30 a.m., both in Department 8 in front of the Honorable Laurel White.

CASE: Ryan McGowan (08/06/14)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tan Thinh, Special Investigations Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Ryan McGowan was convicted by jury of one felony count of unlawfully giving a large capacity magazine and one felony count of possession of an assault weapon. McGowan previously pled no contest to one misdemeanor count of possession of testosterone. At the time of these crimes, McGowan was a Sacramento sheriff deputy.

On July 15, 2011, McGowan was being investigated for violations of federal and state firearms laws. During a gun sale transaction, McGowan unlawfully gave a large capacity magazine to an undercover Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Special Agent. On November 3, 2011, agents recovered an Izhmash Saiga 12 gauge assault weapon and small bottles of testosterone at McGowan's residence.

Sentencing is scheduled for September 5, 2014, in Department 21 of the Sacramento Superior

CASE: Angel Huerta & Thomas Newcomb (08/06/14)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Elder Abuse Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Angel Huerta and Thomas Newcomb both pled guilty to robbing two elderly victims. On June 25, 2014, Huerta and Newcomb tricked a 90-year-old victim into opening his front door.

The defendants then violently knocked him to the ground, ransacked the house and stole several items before fleeing the house. The victim was unable to stand up without assistance.

On June 26, 2014, Huerta and Newcomb beat a 78-year-old victim in a driveway. The defendants then stole several items from the victim's car and fled when the victim's wife ran outside to help her injured husband, who had suffered a broken back.

Newcomb had two previous felony car theft convictions and Huerta had a previous felony car theft and felony DUI with injury conviction. At the time of the crimes, both defendants were on active felony probation. Newcomb had recently been released from county jail under realignment

The defendants will be sentenced on September 3, 2014 in Department 61 before the Honorable

Sacramento County Expresses Opposition to State Delta Plan

-This week, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors formally submitted comments challenging the findings of the Bay Delta Conservation Plan (BDCP) state environmental impact report (EIR) and federal environmental impact statement (EIS). Of significance, the comments expressed the frustrations of many residents with a plan to build twin tunnels and take additional water from the Sacramento Delta.

A recognized expert on water issues and elected representative of Sacramento's Delta communities, Supervisor Don Nottoli expressed, "The BDCP proposes to irreversibly change, and in many instances, permanently destroy the generations-old socioeconomic fabric and physical landscape of the Delta.

"Constructing massive twin tunnels won't produce any more water, but make no mistake, it will leave a legacy of negative impacts people. The BDCP doesn't solve California's water problems and sacrifices the Delta to benefit others. Simply, this is not acceptable, and never will be."

Among the many flaws in the environmental reports, the County noted that there are major negative impacts to the lives of county residents, the local economy, and natural resources in and around the Sacramento River, the Delta itself, and south Sacramento County communities where twin tunnels are slated for a 10-12 year construction project.

The Supervisors cited the following significant impacts that the planning document either inadequately addresses or ignores altogether: Direct/indirect impacts to existing legacy communities and agriculture from long-term construction activities and project operations; Uncertainties surrounding future water project operations and how these

on the Delta, its economy, and its operations will impact water supplies; Impacts to the roadway/ transportation network from construction activities; Impacts from the conversion of agricultural land to habitat; Economic and social impacts to the local Delta communities from the long term displacement of businesses and residents; Impacts to Airport operations; and, Impacts from changes to drainage pattern changes resulting from project construction.

> Next, federal and state agencies tasked with reviewing comments will evaluate and consider the comments submitted by stakeholders, including, non-governmental organizations, individuals, and governmental entities. It is important to note that given the huge volume of comments submitted, the evaluation process will take several months at best. It is anticipated that a Final Draft document will be prepared following the evaluation process.

Why You're Probably on an NSA Watchlist

I was talking with one of my colleagues the other day, and he raised a very interesting question, one that deserves consideration by anyone worried about their digital privacy. He read an article that championed the idea that the more steps one took to protect their privacy by using anonymous Web-browsing tools like Tor, the more likely that individual would be targeted for "surveillance" by

The article went on to say the NSA closely watched user accounts searching for information on non-Windows operating systems like Tails or Linux. The authors of the article suggest the NSA presumes anyone interested in using technology to protect their privacy is a potential threat to national security. On the other hand, those taking no steps to demonstrate privacy concerns (as evidenced by an interest in available tools) are not.

Let that sink in for a moment.

Supporters of the sentiment that security must trump privacy will tell you that if you have nothing to hide, you have nothing to fear. A more apt statement to be garnered from the article is if you have something to hide, the government has something to

Right now, the NSA operates an Internet surveillance tool called XKeyscore. This program allows them to place every Tor user in the world under ongoing surveillance. This completely negates the supposed anonymity the system was designed to provide.

The NSA's own description of XKeyscore suggests its use is widespread, collecting metadata and relational information about Internet and telephone usage.

This is then stored and is searchable in real time. The interesting point about XKeyscore's use vou should keep in mind is the NSA's decision that anyone interested in privacy is considered a potential terrorist. Think about that for a moment.

The Pew Research Center Internet and American Life survey found in September 2013

that: "86% of Internet users have taken steps online to remove or mask their digital footprints -ranging from clearing cookies, encrypting their email, and avoiding using their real name, to using virtual networks that mask their Internet protocol (IP) address

"55% of Internet users have taken steps to avoid observation by specific people, organizations, or the government."

Or, more simply, more than half of the population of the United States that uses the Internet is categorized as potential terrorists requiring government surveillance to "protect us." From whom is the government protecting us?

Apparently, from ourselves. This is madness.

Aside from this, there's another important point you need to be aware of. I remember arguments I had with my peers when I was 10 years old. It was the height of the

Cold War, and we were debating the need of missiles to stop intercontinental ballistic missiles. But it didn't stop there. We argued about whether we needed antimissiles to stop the ICBMs. And anti-anti-missiles to stop those.

Similarly, you might remember the quote attributed to Willie Sutton, who supposedly said that he "robbed banks because that was where the money was." In the ongoing battle between government snoops and people interested in protecting their privacy, the snoops will always concentrate their activities where they will have the most impact.

Just as Apple computers have not been targeted with viruses by online threats nearly as much as their Windows PC counterparts, growing use of alternate operating systems like Linux, Tor and Tails raises the interest in their users. Quite simply, they choose to "hide" something.

As in all technology-dependent conflicts, each side will reinvent its tools to defeat the tools used by their opponents. Thus, it is important to acknowledge that the tools we use to "enhance" privacy are simply that -- tools. The only way to truly keep personal information "private" is to not share it.

Having said that, how many social media platforms (Facebook, et al.) do you partic-

Think about it.

PICKS OF THE WEEK



Spider-Man

"The Amazing Spider-Man 2" (PG-13) -- Since he defeated the villain in the last movie and got the girl, Peter Parker (Andrew Garfield) loves being Spider Man. He should be careful, though; a flashback shows that Peter's genius parents left behind a trove of dangerous super-science research, just waiting to be discovered by the right psychopath. Spidey's got his sticky hands full in this sequel -- dodging lightning bolts from Electro (Jamie Foxx), grappling with the Green Goblin (Dane DeHaan) and trying to keep a healthy relationship with his charming gal (Emma Stone).

The special effects have never been better, Spidey's action scenes are thrilling as ever, and the stars of the show all turn in quality work. But there are just too many threads in this web. With weird pacing and a heap of subplots, it's hard to follow the action beyond the "boom-bang-pow."

"Only Lovers Left Alive" (R) --Sick of vampires? Don't give up just yet. Now that every two-bit production has taken a stab at the romanticized monsters, a talented

director and a magnetic cast spread their wings, leaving their mark on the genre. Tom Hiddleston is an underground musician who mourns mankind's downward direction. Hiding out in a dilapidated corner of Detroit, he's been in a centurieslong romance with Tilda Swinton, currently on a trip to Tangiers in search of high-quality hemoglobin.

This couple is just too cool for mortality. Director Jim Jarmusch puts just the right level of moodiness into every scene. While the characters and locales are depressed, the movie itself is as enjoyable as a tall drink of the good stuff.

"Fading Gigolo" (R) -- An unassuming handyman, Fioravante (John Turturro), hears about a unique job opening -- his dermatologist(Woody Allen) knows of two gorgeous women interested in having a threesome with the right guy. Hesitantly, Fioravante agrees, and a quirky adventure into for-profit intimacy begins, with Allen acting as his nebbish pimp. It's a plain vanity project -- Turturro wrote and directed this movie where he plays an oddlooking man with prodigious skills but it's undeniably charming.

"The Ouiet Ones" (R) -- An Oxford professor (Jared Harris) doesn't believe in ghosts. He takes a team of attractive college students to study the creepiest, most obviously possessed orphan girl they can find (Olivia Cooke). She's always talking to an imaginary friend while things tend to break. fly around or catch fire around her. The university pulls the plug on the research, so the professor makes the super-smart decision to continue the study in an old house in the middle of nowhere. Unfortunately, the film relies a little too heavily on sudden noises to get cheap jumps. It's just not as scary or quiet as you'd expect.

Good Housekeeping Just-Right Tomatoes

At the farmers' market, buy tomatoes at various stages of ripeness, so that you'll have a few to eat that day and more for the rest of the week. If you're not planning to serve tomatoes within a few days, choose ones

that are firm to the touch. To ripen, put them in a brown paper bag, placing them shoulder (stem) side up, and store at cool room temperature for a day or two. Don't put tomatoes in the fridge — and don't stand them on their shoulders on the windowsill. Pretty as the display may look, this bruises them (and doesn't help ripening).

When tomatoes are ready, you can refrigerate them for a day or two, but extended cold storage will make



BOE Notifies California Retailers of Upcoming Visits

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA -Retailers throughout the state are receiving letters from the California State Board of Equalization (BOE) notifying them about upcoming visits from Statewide Compliance and Outreach Program (SCOP) teams. The visits are intended to educate retailers about properly reporting sales and use tax, increase compliance with tax laws, and maintain outreach efforts to assure taxpayers that the state's tax system is fair and equal for all Californians.

The BOE is mailing letters to 8,539 business owners in the area including Sacramento (95827).

SCOP teams conduct doorto-door, in-person visits in the zip code areas they cover. It is important for retailers to understand that the BOE asks only business-related questions, and does not inquire about personal financial information. Businesses found to be operating without a seller's permit are provided instructions on how to register with the BOE, as well as information about other


necessary licenses. Home-based businesses are not visited.

Since 2008, SCOP has visited 489,056 businesses statewide to verify that retailers are registered and to ensure noncompliant businesses do not have an unfair advantage over registered businesses that are reporting their sales and use taxes and/or fees to BOE.

The BOE has found that more than 98 percent of the California businesses are operating with the correct permits. However, noncompliance contributes to more than \$2 billion in uncollected sales and use taxes that make up part of the state's "tax gap" - the difference between the amount of taxes owed and the amount paid, negatively impacting all state taxpayers.

Asking for a Raise

Dear Dave,

What's your advice on asking for a raise at work when you have more responsibility than a co-worker but the same title on paper? After being with my company four years, I feel like I should make more money and I have the right to complain about this.

Vanessa

Dear Vanessa,

Sorry, no. You don't have a right to complain. You agreed on your pay, and you are doing your job the way your character and integrity tell you to do the job. If someone else is a slacker in the same position, that doesn't mean a whole lot in terms of your personal compensation.

I've got several people at my company who hold similar positions and make similar money. Some of them have been here for years, while others are relatively new. I don't pay people for how long they've been in the building, and I don't want anyone on my team who doesn't give 100 percent. Now, that may be a different issue than pay, but at the same time I don't want someone who gives 50 percent and I pay them 50 percent. I want everyone

at 100 percent, but that kind of thing isn't your problem. It's the company's problem, because she

works for them and not you.

If you honestly feel like you deserve a raise because of your effort and performance, that's fine. Sit down with your leader and make a logical and reasonable argument for why you deserve more money. But don't bring up your co-worker and what he or she makes in the discussion. That's just not relevant. What is relevant is your worth and the value you bring to the organization.

But a comparative analysis with someone else on staff just isn't a good idea. I'd stay away from that, Vanessa.

Paying the Insurance **Penalty**

Dear Dave,

My wife and I live in New York, and we've had whole life insurance for several years. There's a seven percent penalty if we cash out the policies now. If we wait a few years, we won't have to pay into the premiums anymore. Should we cash out the policies anyway?

Brian

Dear Brian,

The reason you won't have to pay into the premiums anymore is because you built up enough savings, and they are not paying you enough on the savings to amount to anything. The amount

they should have been paying you versus the way they were ripping you off will buy the life

It's not like you can pay for it because you still have probability of death. As long as there's a probability of death there's a cost to life insurance. The only question is whether you're paying out of your savings account or your checking account. In this case, you're paying out of savings.

The seven percent figure is just your surrender charge, so I'd get out of that policy soon. Here's the problem, Brian. If you die today, do you know what they'll pay? Face value. They won't pay face value plus the savings you paid for. In other words, you'll lose your savings.

I'd get term life insurance in place by the end of the week. Compare prices on term, because you'll be surprised at the difference some companies charge for term insurance. Make sure you get good 15- to 20-year level terms policies valued at 10 to 12 times your annual incomes. - Dave




