

lore recalls one little boy so enamored of this teacher that he purposely botched spelling tests so he could stay in at recess with his school ma'am. Older children vied for the task of coming to school at 5 a.m. in winter to stoke up the stove for classroom heating. Though school beautification was negligible in the 1920s, two palm trees were planted near the flagpole. These still stand

Farm chores took priority for pupils. They milked cows, picked crops and studied in stained bib overalls. During lessons, their horses grazed beside a school so isolated that the principal's house, known as the teacherage, was the only home in Arden

Park. The closest neighbor was a goat farmer, "Goatman" George Zwirkis, at Cottage Way.

The school was pressed into service for draft registration in WWII. PTA volunteers also rolled bandages, assembled care packages and distributed ration books. "Any number of community defense meetings were held at the school," recalled wartime Principal Herbert Winterstein. "The auditorium was filled with anxious and fearful residents. Our film projector was pressed into use to show defense films, even some of the London bombings." In his history of the

school, Winterstein wrote that students collected scrap metal; teachers practiced evacuation plans with wide-eyed children. "I recall some who held the teacher's hand just a little bit tighter," he said.

With post-war population growth, subdivisions proliferated like mushrooms on the vast Arden Arcade grasslands. So many new schools were built, that by 1970 the San Juan Unified School District was among the largest in California. Arden Middle School is one of the district's oldest institutions.

Gold Rush Days Activities Cancelled due to Drought

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Due to California's drought conditions and the enormous amounts of water needed to put on the annual heritage event, the traditional Gold Rush Days activities in Old Sacramento have been cancelled for 2014. The decision was made by Steve Hammond, President & CEO of the Sacramento Convention & Visitors Bureau, along with the City of Sacramento and other stakeholders of the event.

Each year, nearly 200 tons of dirt or decomposed granite is used to help transform Old Sacramento into a scene out of the 1850s. In addition to the visual transformation, the dirt also creates a safe foundation for the horses, wagons and various skits and performances taking place in the streets. However, it takes up to 3,000 gallons of water per day to keep the dirt dampened and dust down during the event, plus up to 100,000 gallons of water to clean up the dirt at the conclusion of the event.

Even without the traditional Gold Rush Days activities, guests are encouraged to visit Old Sacramento over Labor Day weekend. "With four museums and more than 100 shops, eateries and entertainment venues, there's always something happening in Old Sacramento," said Chris McSwain, Executive Director of the Old Sacramento Business Association. "We invite guests from near and far to visit Old Sacramento over Labor Day Weekend and stay tuned for some fun surprises that will be announced at a later date." 

Renner, 44, of Sacramento, has served as legal affairs secretary in the Office of Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. since 2011. He served as senior assistant attorney general at the California Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General from 2009 to 2010, where he was supervising deputy attorney general from 2006 to 2009 and deputy attorney general from 2000 to 2006. Renner was an associate attorney at Kronick, Moskovitz, Tiedemann and Girard from 1998 to 2000 and at Porter, Scott,

by Governor Brown. Weiberg and Delehant from 1997

to 1998. He earned a Juris Doctor

This position requires confirmation by the Commission on Judicial Appointments. The Commission consists of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye, Attorney General Kamala D. Harris and Presiding Justice Vance W. Raye. If confirmed, Renner will begin his term on January 5, 2015 and will fill the vacancy created by the elevation of Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye to the California Supreme Court. Renner is a Democrat.

Game Plots Ubisoft's Videogame Diversity Failure

During Microsoft's press conference at the annual Electronics Entertainment Expo (E3) videogame show this past June, developer Ubisoft's new videogame Assassin's Creed Unity was one of many show-stealers. The four-player cooperative gameplay demonstration painted a chaotic, grand picture of the tumultuous French Revolution, complete with ornate manors, haughty aristocrats, rampaging crowds, and, of course, decapitation. But one of the questions on the minds of game aficionados post-E3 was "Where are the women?"

As it turns out, there'll be no playable female characters in Unity. Maybe Ubisoft could've escaped with this oversight if they hadn't mentioned that playable women had been actively cut from the game. In an interview with Polygon, Ubisoft creative director Alex Amancio explained why. "It's double the animations, it's double the voices, all that stuff and double the visual assets. It was really a lot of extra production work."

This excuse carries some weight. Making a game is no easy task, and the teams at Ubisoft are already on crunch time trying to meet the game's October release date.

However, Ubisoft is a worldwide development powerhouse

with virtually unlimited resources. Ubisoft's ex-animation director Jonathan Cooper, noted for his work on the animation-heavy Assassin's Creed III, begged to differ from his former employer's statement. He stated that adding playable female characters would only be "a day or two's work," plenty of time considering the many months before release.

Amancio's statement loses even more credibility when you look at Unity's immense scale. Unity reportedly has the largest city of all Assassin's Creed games, and because it's being built on new generation consoles, it's also the best looking and most detailed. Clearly the amount of money, time, or labor available is not a problem.

However, we can't be too quick to judge. Protagonist diversity is a major problem facing gaming today, with big games typically featuring white male leads. The Assassin's Creed series, on the other hand, has featured protagonists of Native American, Syrian, Creole, and African descent. Not only that, women are regularly playable either in multiplayer or as the main character.

In some ways, this makes Unity's decision to cut female characters even more disappointing. It seems like Ubisoft is on the right track to pioneer diversity among big-name developers, especially when their other major game this year, Far Cry 4, features a Himalayan protagonist. However, Amancio made sure to mention that Unity will feature strong female characters in supporting roles.

The Assassin's Creed series holds a special place in gaming not only because it allows us to explore history, but because it allows us to explore history from perspectives that other games rarely touch upon. The cut of playable women from Assassin's Creed Unity is disheartening, especially because of the weak excuse given for their non-inclusion. Women were integral to and active in the French Revolution, and we should be able to play as them. Considering that the casts of Ubisoft games have historically been far more diverse than that of other large developers, it's unfortunate to see them take a backwards step.



President Obama's Man-Caused Disaster

As a defender of the nation's borders, President Barack Obama is a hell of a pool player. Obama's recent game in a Denver bar with Colorado Gov. John Hickenlooper was bright and cheery, as one would expect of a president who didn't have any depressing visits to frightened ranchers, overwhelmed border agents or desperate migrants on his future itinerary.

The first rule in a crisis for any executive is put on his windbreaker and boots and get out on the ground. President George W. Bush didn't do it soon enough after Hurricane Katrina and, politically, could never make up for it, no matter how many times he visited New Orleans. Obama's bizarre resistance to visiting the border on his

fundraising swing out West fueled talk of the influx as Obama's "Katrina moment."

The Katrina analogy is over the top because the border influx isn't a deadly catastrophe swallowing an American city. It also is too generous because Bush didn't do anything to bring on Hurricane Katrina, whereas Obama's policies are responsible for the influx of immigrants. It is, in the argot of his administration, a "man-caused disaster."

According to the Los Angeles Times, the number of immigrants younger than 18 who were deported or turned away from ports of entry declined from 8,143 in 2008 to 1,669 last year. There were 95 minors deported from the entire interior of the country last year. At the same time, the number of unaccompanied alien children arriving from El Salvador, Guatemala and Honduras exploded from less than 4,000 several years ago to 40,000 since last October.

The White House brushes off criticism that Obama is avoiding the border as mere "optics," in contrast to its highly substantive focus. But it is still not taking the crisis seriously. The nearly \$4 billion the president is requesting is not fundamentally about enforcement that will reverse and end the tide, but about managing the influx.

A devastating critique by the Center for Immigration Studies notes that about half of the money goes to the Department of Health and Human Services "for acquisition, construction, improvement, repair, operation and maintenance of real property and facilities." The enforcement portion of the request, according to CIS, "is not truly geared toward removal," but instead to "recouping costs for temporary detention and subsequent transporting of

The administration's reaction to the crisis is just another in a long series of acts of bad faith on immigration. It is asking Congress for more money for its priorities at the same time the president is promising, in effect, to suspend yet more immigration laws in response to the failure of "comprehensive immigration reform."


Republicans in Congress should crumple up the president's border request in a ball and start over, with an emphasis on holding migrants near the border and working through their cases quickly to address the short-term crisis, and provisions for interior enforcement to address illegal immigration more

Of course, even if such a bill were to pass and to be signed into law, that'd be no guarantee that the president of the United States would enforce it. That speaks to an entirely different man-caused disaster.

Man Pleads Guilty To Sex Trafficking with **Underage Girl in Sacramento Area**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Marquist Piere Bradford, 28, of Chicago, pleaded guilty on Thursday, July 24, 2014 to sex trafficking of children by force, United States Attorney Benjamin B. Wagner announced.

According to court documents, in early 2012 Bradford recruited a 15-year-old girl to travel from Fresno to Sacramento where she was used by Bradford as part of a prostitution business from January 19 through February 5, 2012. According to court documents, Bradford maintained an apartment in Rancho Cordova, which he used as a base of operations for a prostitution business that spanned the Sacramento and Bay areas, as well as cities outside California. At least two of Bradford's victims were under the age of 18. Bradford fled from Sacramento to the Chicago area after law enforcement recovered the victim in this case.

This case was the product of an investigation by the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office and the Sacramento FBI Innocence Lost Task Force. Assistant United States Attorney Matthew G. Morris is prosecuting the case.

Bradford has remained in custody since his arrest in

Springfield, Ill. in April 2012. He is scheduled to be sentenced by United States District Judge Morrison C. England, Jr. on October 23, 2014. Bradford faces a maximum statutory penalty of life in prison and a \$250,000 fine. The actual sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of

Sacramento County Residents Indicted For Tax Refund Fraud Scheme

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned an eight-count indictment on Thursday, July 24th against Sergey Shchirskiy, 38, of Carmichael, and Vladislav Atamanyuk, 27, of Rancho Cordova, charging them with conspiracy to defraud the United States and aggravated identity theft, United States Attorney Benjamin B. Wagner announced.

According to court documents, the defendants conspired to file multiple fraudulent tax returns using other people's identities. The returns falsely claimed refunds based on fraudulently reported income and the Earned Income Tax Credit. The defendants caused the fraudulent refunds to be directly deposited into bank accounts that they controlled

This case is the product of an investigation by the Internal Revenue Service, Criminal Investigation and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Assistant United States Attorney Michele Beckwith is prosecuting the case

If convicted, the defendants face a maximum statutory penalty of 10 years in prison for the conspiracy, and a mandatory two years in prison for identity theft, as well as a \$250,000 fine. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables.

The charges are only allegations; the defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

Governor Brown Signs Agreement with Mexico to Reduce Dangerous Greenhouse Gases

MEXICO CITY - On Monday, July 28th, the first full day of California's Trade and Investment Mission to Mexico, Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. and Mexican environment officials signed an agreement to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions and combat climate change.

"California can't do it alone and with this new partnership with Mexico we can make real progress on reducing dangerous greenhouse gases," said Governor Brown.

This agreement was signed by Governor Brown, Mexico's Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Undersecretary Rodolfo Lacy and Mexican National Forestry Commission Director General Jorge Rescala

"Mexico and California have a long and rich history of environmental cooperation, and recognize each other as strategic partners in coping with climate change challenges and protecting and preserving our natural resources. The agreement signed will take our joint work to a whole new level of cooperation, which will reflect in tangible and concrete results that will inure to our mutual benefit," said Mexico's Ministry of Environment and Natural Resources Undersecretary Rodolfo Lacy.

Monday's pact seeks to enhance cooperation through a range of activities, including: Aligning greenhouse gas reduction programs and strategies; Collaborating on fire emergency response along the border and other climate change adaption strategies; Improving air quality, including reducing pollution and expanding markets for clean energy technologies; and Strengthening fuel and truck efficiency standards and supporting green freight initiatives.

"In line with the priorities of the Mexican Government for the forestry sector, the Memorandum of Understanding signed today with the State of California lays down the conditions and excellent opportunities for mutual cooperation to strengthen our capacity to prevent and respond to forest fires, a key issue in our common border," said Mexican National Forestry Commission Director

General Jorge Rescala Pérez. The agreement with Mexico comes on the heels of similar agreements signed in 2013 with the governments of British Columbia and the states of Oregon and Washington and China's National Development and Reform Commission – the first agreement of its kind on climate change between the commission and a subnational entity. For the past

several years, the California Air Resources Board and Quebec have worked together to fully harmonize their cap-and-trade programs.

The Governor first announced the Trade and Investment Mission to Mexico in his 2014 State of the State address and met with Mexican Consuls General from cities across California in March. Last week, ahead of the trip, Governor Brown met with Mexico's Secretary of Foreign Affairs José Antonio Meade Kuribreña in Sacramento and invited Mexican President Enrique Peña Nieto to meet

later this year in California. The Governor is joined on the Trade and Investment Mission to Mexico by a delegation of state legislators and senior administration officials. A delegation organized by the California Chamber of Commerce with the help of the California Foundation for Commerce and Education that includes approximately 90 business, economic development, investment and policy leaders from throughout California is also participating in the trade mission.

"Divergent" (PG-13) -- In a grimly gray futuristic version of Chicago, people are assigned to groups based on personality types and aptitudes. Teenage Triss (Shailene Woodley) is a Divergent -- she doesn't fit into any of society's groups. An uptight faction ruler hatches a plot to exterminate the Divergents, forcing Triss to team up with a hunky peer named Four (Theo James) in a fight against the forces that keep humanity contained.

This is the latest young-adult fiction sensation to jump from book to big screen. Viewers will notice some stark similarities to other movies spun from young-adult novels -- a strong female protagonist in a dystopian setting forced to fight against an oppressive society, for starters. Unfortunately for this semi-sleek thriller, it does not stand a chance in a head-to-head chal-

and make young Tim look like the murderer. Now grown up, the brother and sister (Karen Gillan and Brenton Thwaites) are determined to prove to the world that the mirror is truly evil, clearing Tim of any guilt. As they try to document the terror that ruined their lives, Kaylie and Tim are forced to relive the nightmare of their childhood.

This family-based flick goes for the suspense-andatmosphere style of scares, and doesn't do much with goreand-guts. It's a slow burn. The film bounces back and forth between the childhood trauma and the adults who are trying to deal with it -- it builds the dread if you're able to ride with it.

"God's Not Dead" (PG) -- In a college introduction to philosophy class, the first assignment is to write "God is dead," on a piece of paper and sign your name. Josh (Shane Harper) is a freshman student who refuses to forsake his faith, and he is then challenged to prove God exists and debate the professor in front of the class. This is all stretched out by a bunch of subplots where all non-Christians are hilariously awful people. There's even a cameo by some "Duck Dynasty" people, for some reason. This movie only knows how to preach to the choir.

"Twelve O'Clock Boys" (NR) --This short documentary explores an urban phenomenon: dirt bikes and four-wheelers screeching down the street of Baltimore's poorest neighborhoods. Twelve O'Clock Boys are a local nuisance who do stunts on their illegal vehicles, able to elude a cash-strapped police force operating under a no-chase policy. The documentary follows "Pug," a little boy who dreams of nothing more than riding with the gang.





What's the difference between a Chapter 7 bankruptcy and Chapter 13 bankruptcy?

Dear Claudia

Chapter 7 bankruptcy is what most people think about when they hear the word "bankruptcy." It's total bankruptcy, almost like dropping an atomic bomb on your entire financial picture.

Virtually all of your unsecured debt (except student loans, child support and money owed to the IRS) is wiped out. These things are not bankruptable. About 98 percent of the time, creditors of your other unsecured debt things like credit cards and alike — get nothing. Items that are secured debt, such as your car or house, are treated a little bit differently. If you're behind on payments, you may be allowed to get current. In most cases, banks will allow you to re-sign in a process called reaffirming the debt.

Dave Says

Chapter 13 bankruptcy is a payment plan structured over five years. In it, you have to pay all of your secured debt. If it has a lien on it, you pay 100 percent to keep the item. You also have to pay a portion of your unsecured debt. Again — like in Chapter 7 — debt to the IRS, child support and student loans don't go away. For any other unsecured debt, you can pay a percentage of what's owed. An overall payment plan is developed, and you make those payments for five years.

Defeating Hamas will be a big problem for the power brokers because shame and honor are all that matter in this part of the world. Fool me once, shame on you. Fool me twice, shame on me. We will not be fooled again.

We have nowhere else to go. And the rockets won't stop. The folks in Ashkelon cannot shower, have a bowel movement, get more milk or walk a dog without wondering if they are taking their lives in their

own hands. There is another Gaza underneath Gaza. Hamas could have built hundreds of schools, paved thousands of roads, built hundreds of kindergartens with the cement and iron they have used to build these underground bunkers and tunnels (and you wondered why Israel put a blockade on bringing building supplies into the Gaza strip?).

These tunnels to hell are filled with ammunition. And no women or children, not a single elderly person is brought to safety there. They want them on the street - on the roof, standing right behind - nice and close to the terrorist firing the

Hamas has refused to let journalists out of Gaza. Why? They need them to take pictures and record the carefully staged piles of bloody children and women. If the journalists leave, they have lost the vehicle for distributing their bloody ad campaign.

So we have to go in there and do things none of us want to do, but we have to.

So this is why we are all so sad. Israelis want peace so badly.

But we also desperately want to live. We love life, and we are not about to let anyone, let alone a bunch of deranged thugs take it away from us.

So yes, this is a fight to the death for both sides.

Remember, if they win, you are



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The California environmental movement today declared its unanimity in calling on Gov. Jerry Brown to halt fracking in the state. Environmental leaders sent a letter signed by more than 70 environmental and health organizations to the governor urging him to be a true climate leader and place a moratorium on dangerous and extreme oil extraction processes. The letter's signatories include national organizations such as the Natural Resources Defense Council, the Sierra Club, Center on Race, Poverty & the Environment and 350.org, as well as statewide groups including the California Nurses Association and Californians Against Fracking, a coalition of about 200 organizations.

In the Public Policy Institute of California's poll released Wednesday night, 54% of Californians oppose fracking, while 56% of adults in Central Valley and 55% in Los Angeles oppose these extreme extraction methods. The poll also finds that 65% of Californians favor the state making its own policies to address climate change.

"Californians want a halt on fracking in our state," said David Braun of Californians Against Fracking. "It is far past time that Gov. Brown listens to his constituents and lives up to his promise to be a national leader in combating climate change. The entire California environmental movement has united to call on Gov. Brown to stand up for the health and safety of California and our planet and stop fracking."

The letter delivered today to Gov. Brown states: "It's time for California to catch up with the other states that have acted to protect public health and the environment on this critical issue. Ramping up dirty oil production through fracking and other risky extraction techniques is at odds with California's clean energy, climate, water and air quality goals. It's time for you to do what is right for California and impose a mora-

Bill McKibben, Founder, 350. **org:** "As the science has grown steadily clearer, fracking has come into sharper focus: it's a dead-end technology that takes our society away from where it needs to go, benefitting only the oil barons.

Gov. Brown, who has been a leader

on so many environmental fronts in the past, needs to catch up with the science and lead here too!"

Kathryn Phillips, Director, Sierra Club California: "The evidence continues to mount that fracking threatens California's water, air and climate. Gov. Brown has the power – and the responsibility – to protect the state from calamity without doing harm to the economy simply by imposing a moratorium on these extreme oil extraction methods."

Damon Nagami, Natural Resources Defense Council: "Rushing ahead to expand fracking-which will further strain water supplies and risk contaminating the little that remains-during a record-breaking drought is dangerous and irresponsible. Californians have made it clear. We want the governor to take the time necessary to fully evaluate the risks and how to protect against them."

Latest state poll shows majority of Californians oppose fracking; Governor Brown must stop fracking to address climate change, protect residents and conserve water.

Dr. Sandra Steingraber, Co-Founder, Concerned Health Professionals of New York and Americans Against Fracking: "Throughout our history, California has been a standard-bearer in countless environmental and health movements. Once again, Californians and their environmental organizations agree on what the state needs to do to protect the health and safety of its communities. It is time Gov. Brown looks at the evidence and represents the growing number of Californians who support a stop to fracking."

Dr. Robert Gould, President of Physicians for Social Responsibility: "Fracking threatens to impose widespread impacts on the health of our communities and our children. By stopping fracking in California, Gov. Brown could prevent a potential increased risk of cancer, neurological and respiratory problems that could harm thousands of families in our state.'

Caroline Farrell, Executive Director, Center on Race, Poverty and the Environment: "California on Gov. Brown's watch is currently using extreme oil extraction techniques like fracking in the very communities the state has identified as within the top 20 percent overburdened communities in the state. It is time to stop adding on to the burdens experienced by these communities and start investing in local renewable technologies that bring jobs without compromising community health."

Fracking uses huge volumes of water mixed with dangerous chemicals to blast open rock formations and release oil and gas. The controversial technique has been used in over 1,000 California oil and gas wells, endangering California's air, water, wildlife, public health and climate.

The draft fracking rules put forth by Gov. Brown's Division of Oil, Gas and Geothermal Resources allow regulators to rubber-stamp multiple fracking events and allow oil companies to conceal dangerous chemical use. Rife with weak protections and industry loopholes, these proposed rules do not consider the long-term and wide-ranging environmental, public health and economic consequences of fracking in California.

Last week, ProPublica reported that California officials have ordered an emergency shutdown of 11 oil and gas waste injection sites and a review of more than 100 others out of concern that companies are pumping fracking fluids and other toxic waste into drinking water aquifers.

In response to Gov. Brown's continued refusal to protect residents by stopping fracking, more and more California communities are moving forward with local measures to halt fracking and other extreme extraction methods.★

Federal Judge Rules Gerawan Farmworker's Lawsuit Against **ALRB Will Move Forward**

FRESNO, CA (MPG) - U.S. District Court Judge Lawrence J. O'Neill ruled on July 24th that the lawsuit filed by a Gerawan farmworker against members of the Agricultural Labor Relations Board (ALRB) alleging civil rights violations will move forward to trial. In February of this year, Gerawan farmworker Silvia Lopez sued the gubernatorial appointees and regional staff alleging that their refusal to count the Gerawan farmworkers' decertification votes violated her 1st and 14th Amendment rights.

"Silvia and her co-workers have been fighting since last November to have their decertification votes counted. The ALRB regional staff and board have been repeatedly denying the farmworkers' constitutional rights. We are pleased that the judge ruled that our lawsuit can move forward," said Paul Bauer, Silvia Lopez's lawyer.

In November 2013, the

farmworkers at Gerawan Farms in Fresno held a lawful decertification election on whether to continue being represented by the UFW, which abandoned the workers more than 20 years ago. The ALRB has refused to count the ballots, which have remained locked at the ALRB since the election was held. In response, farmworkers have demonstrated at the ALRB offices in Visalia and Sacramento and Ms. Lopez sued the ALRB board members for violating her constitutional rights by continuing to refuse to cofunt the

After Ms. Lopez sued the board in February, the ALRB general counsel filed a motion to dismiss the lawsuit against members of the board and the regional director. In the decision handed down, Judge O'Neill ruled that the part of Ms. Lopez's suit alleging 14th amendment rights could not move forward, but ruled that the part

alleging violations against her 1st Amendment rights of association will move forward. A trial date on this lawsuit will be set in the coming months.

"I am happy that I will get to face the members of the ALRB and regional director at a trial. My co-workers' and my rights have been denied for more than 280 days. It's not right. I'm glad that the judge saw that I have a real case and will let part of my lawsuit move forward. All the farmworkers want is to have our votes counted. We will not stop fighting to have our voices heard and our rights protected," said Silvia Lopez, who is one of thousands of Gerawan farmworkers fighting to get rid of the UnitedFarm Workers

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Greta Curtis Fall sentenced Jake Clark to 3 years plus 25 years to life in prison. On June 17, 2014, a jury convicted Clark of first-degree murder. The jury also found an arming allegation to be true. In December 2011, Sacramento police officers responded to a call of a male shot on Interstate 80 at Norwood Avenue. Upon arrival, officers found a male who had been shot in the upper body.

He was transported to the hospital where he was declared dead.

In March 2013, Jake Clark was arrested for shooting and killing the victim Ghulam Ayobi. The victim's wife, Shajia Ayobi, was previously convicted of first-degree murder and sentenced to 26 years to life in prison.
