

Increase in **Whooping Cough Cases in California**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Dr. Ron Chapman, director of

the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and state health officer, warned that the number of pertussis (whooping cough) cases is increasing in California.

CDPH has received reports of 1,711 cases of pertussis occurring from January through April 2014, more than triple the number of cases in the same period last year.

"Pertussis peaks in incidence every 3-5 years as the number of susceptible people in the population increases," says Dr. Ron Chapman. "As the last peak in California was in 2010. we are concerned that the recent increase in reported cases suggests that another cyclical peak is beginning."

Infants too young to be fully immunized remain most vulnerable to severe and fatal cases of pertussis. Most of the 77 hospitalized cases to date in 2014 have been in children three months of age or younger. This year's two pertussis deaths. the first reported in California since 2010, occurred in infants. To prevent severe pertussis in infants, CDPH recommends that pregnant women receive a pertussis vaccine booster during the third trimester of each pregnancy, and that infants be vaccinated as soon as possible.

More than 90 percent of this year's reported pertussis cases have been in children younger than 18 years of age, including 32 percent who were 14 through 16 years of age. Outbreaks of pertussis in elementary, middle, and high schools have been reported throughout the state.

It's important that both children and adults are up-to-date on their immunizations. Booster shots for pertussis are critical because, unlike some other vaccine-preventable diseases, neither the pertussis disease nor vaccine confers lifelong immunity.

To prevent pertussis, CDPH recommends that pregnant women receive a pertussis vaccine booster during the third trimester of each pregnancy, even if they've received it before. Infants should be vaccinated against pertussis as soon as possible. The first dose is recommended at two months of age but can be given as early as sixw weeks of age during pertussis outbreaks. Children need five doses of pertussis vaccine by kindergarten (ages 4-6).

California 7th grade students receive the pertussis vaccine booster as required by state law. Adults should receive a onetime pertussis vaccine booster, especially if they are in contact with infants or if they are health care workers who may have contact with infants or pregnant women.

normal snowfall, the spring snowmelt can still result in swift and cold river flows that can create treacherous conditions for all recreationists-waders, swimmers, paddlers, boaters, anglers, and even hikers cooling off at the water's edge. Lower water levels can also expose hazards or make

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), California State Parks and its Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) caution that even though the water content of California's mountain snowpack is below normal, the snowpack is rapidly melting as mid-spring temperatures continue to rise. As warmer weather and longer days speed up melting snow in mountainous regions, water temperatures will continue to drop and flows can

Education:

Veterans earn a Life Coach certificate by participating in a program that teaches them how to adjust their belief system from anticipating failure and anticipating success. Veterans are referred to local colleges and universities and/or enroll in Dr. McQueen's career/academic assessment, counseling, and job training curriculum.







CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - In its fifth year, the Effie Yeaw Nature Center "Painting Where the Wild Things Are" fundraiser sold out and netted a record bottom line of over \$66,000.

The center has operated under the aegis of the American River Natural History Association since losing Sacramento County funding some years ago. Fundraiser proceeds will help the Carmichael facility and its 80acre preserve keep founder Effie Yeaw's educational mission alive. Programs serve children and adult students from Sacramento and surrounding counties.

After silent auctions, nature themed art went under the hammer. The American River Parkway featured in many paintings, animal creations caused much paddle waving. Jeanette Morrow's ceramic running rabbit with squirrel passenger took second place in the juried exhibition and raised \$600. A heron sculpture caused a bidding flutter, selling for \$1,400. Turkey, deer, ducks and a swimming dog were also auctioned in effigy.

Judged "best of show," a Debbie Gualco painting of the American River bluffs at Fair Oaks fetched the auction's highest bid: \$5,500. Auction proceeds were split between the non-profit and participating artists.

In addition to art sales, a raise-the-paddle effort for Effie Yeaw's Urban Nature Project (enabling visits from schools in low-income



Please Practice Water Safety

The warm weather is here and the Department of Regional Parks is anticipating an active summer on the American River. To help insure youngsters enjoy the water safely, the American River Parkway Foundation is again funding loaner life jackets for the 2014 Kids Don't Float Program that are available at 7 sites along the American River Parkway, including Ancil Hoffman Park. This is the fourth year the foundation is providing life jackets.

The Foundation is also providing new signage at the life jacket distribution sites.

Each sign features the message that kids don't float and if they are under age 13 they must wear a life vest per the Sacramento County Ordinance and are invited to borrow a jacket and return it. For more information about the program, please visit regionalparks.saccounty.net.

Targeting Potholes

Sacramento County's Department of Transportation recently conducted its Spring 2014 Pothole Sweep which is an intensified effort to identify and repair potholes -and is part of continuous efforts to improve preventative maintenance for roadways in the unincorporated

Pothole sweeps are performed twice each year: in late spring to repair potholes cause by inclement winter weather and in the fall to ready road surfaces for the storm season. The most recent effort identified and filled 3,250 potholes in District 3.

There are over 5,400 lane miles of paved roadway in the unincorpo-

Annually, 970 potholes are reported to Sacramento County. Besides those reports, SACDOT has an on-going program that checks road conditions resulting in 41,000 potholes on average being repaired each vear.

If you know about a pothole, there is a simple way to report it by calling one number -- 311.Call center representatives are ready

Monday through Friday, 7 am to 6 pm to answer questions, route calls, and manage cases for verification and resolution.

Four People Shot in **Drive-By Shooting**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The victim with non-life threatening motive of this shooting. Anyone Sacramento County Sheriff's Department is investigating a shooting that occurred around 12:30 a.m. on June 1st on the 6500 block of 46th Street. Multiple callers reported hearing shots fired in the area. When Deputies arrived, they assessed three shooting victims who were all transported to local hospitals with non-life threatening injuries. Approximately an hour and a half later, a fourth shooting

injuries emerged from the same location, likely shot during the earlier incident.

It is not known if any or all of the shooting victim's know each other or how the incident began. Preliminary information has revealed that possibly more than one vehicle was involved in the shooting.

year we are asking water enthusiasts to adjust with water-related activities to the drought conditions. Water conditions in some waterways are low enough to make for hazardous boating. It is also critical for everyone in or around the water to wear life jackets at all times, no matter if water levels are low."

"Spring is a wonderful time to recreate in California's waterways," said Sylvia Ortega Hunter, DBW's Deputy Director. "But please read the safety tips in this water safety warning because making a mistake could

Water safety tips: **Know the Water**

- Sudden immersion in cold water can stimulate the "gasp reflex," causing an involuntary inhalation of air or water. It can even trigger cardiac arrest, temporary paralysis, hypothermia and drowning. When faced with swift water, even the strongest swimmers may
- be easily overwhelmed. Cold water entering the ear canal can cause vertigo and disorientation. This may confuse swimmers, causing them to venture deeper into the water.
- Recreating in PG&E canals and flumes is strictly prohibited. Stay out of canals and flumes,

which are very dangerous due to slippery sides and fast moving water.

Lower lakes and rivers can expose hazards like rocks and trees, or make them closer to the surface.

Know your Limits

- Swimming in open water is more difficult than in a swimming pool-people tire more quickly and can get into trouble.
- Cold water causes impairment leading to fatalities. It reduces body heat 25 to 30 times faster than air does at the same temperature.
- Many unseen obstacles can be lurking below the water's surface. Swift water can make these obstacles even more treacherous. Guided trips for inexperienced paddlers are recommended.

Wear a Life Jacket

- Conditions change quickly in open water and even the best swimmers can misjudge the water and their skills when boating or swimming. Wearing a life jacket can increase survival time.
- A life jacket can provide some thermal protection against the onset of hypothermia and keep you afloat until someone else can rescue you.

Parental Supervision

Actively supervise children in and around open bodies of water, giving them your undivided attention. Appoint a designated "water watcher," taking turns with other adults. Teach children that swimming in open water is not the same as swimming in a pool, they need to be aware of uneven surfaces, river currents, ocean undertow and changing weather.

Know the Law

- Every child under 13 must wear a Coast Guard-approved life jacket when on a moving vessel that is 26 feet or less in
- A Coast Guard-approved life jacket must be carried for each person on board a boat. This includes rigid or inflatable paddlecraft.
- · Every person on board a personal watercraft (popularly known as "jet skis") and any person being towed behind a vessel must wear a Coast Guard-approved life jacket.
- It is against the law to operate a boat or water ski with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.08 percent or more. You can be arrested even when your BAC is less than 0.08 percent if conditions are deemed to be unsafe.





VA Health Care's Socialist Paradise

For the left, the Department of Veterans Affairs is how health care is ideally supposed to work. No insurance companies, no private doctors, no competition -- just the government and the patient.

The VA is an island of socialism in American health care. It generally provides adequate care -- to a limited universe of people and for only certain conditions -but has long been plagued by scandal. It is perhaps the worst bureaucracy in the federal government. As with all such single-payertype systems, the cost of the notionally free health care is in the rationing, in this case the wait times that have had desperately ill vets hung out to dry for months.

The usual Obamacare excuses don't apply here. The existence of the VA isn't

politically controversial. No one is trying to repeal it, or "sabotage" it. What we're seeing is simply unaccountable bureaucracy

When the benchmark was created for VA facilities to get vets appointments within 14 days, meeting the goal was easy: All it took was logging appointments dishonestly to hide the wait time. This is how poorly performing government bureaucracies have met goals from time immemorial; it's why, on a much more vast and monstrous scale, Soviet five-year plans were always such runaway successes on paper.

The VA system worked for everyone but the patients -- and the whistle-blowers. The daughter-in-law of a Navy vet in Phoenix who died after never getting follow-up for his "urgent" case was told, in lines that perfectly capture the spirit of socialized medicine: "It's a seven-month waiting list. And you're gonna have to have patience."

But the bureaucracy acted with alacrity when its reporting scheme was at risk. In St. Louis, the former chief of psychiatry says he was put under administrative investigation when he complained about wait lists. A whistle-blower who worked in Fort Collins, Colo., alleges that she and a colleague were transferred when they refused to hide wait times.

So far, the VA affair is running the usual course of Obama administration scandals,

with the requisite denial and lack of accountability. VA Secretary Eric Shinseki has referred to the incidents as "isolated cases" (even though 26 facilities are now under investigation). No one has been fired.


The White House has reverted to its default position of maintaining that it doesn't know much about what's happening in the vast government it always wants to make bigger. Spokesman Jay Carney seemed to suggest that the president first heard about the scandal on CNN.


Of course, the problem with wait times and the trustworthiness of the VA's own reporting wasn't news. The Government Accountability Office has been warning of it since 2000. It headlined a December 2012 report, "VA HEALTH CARE: Reliability of Reported Outpatient Medical Appointment Wait Times and Scheduling Oversight Need Improvement."

The VA obviously isn't going anywhere, but the scandal should be the occasion for making it more transparent and accountable, and giving vets more choices. As of now, it represents a case study in how a bureaucracy tends to its own interests, even at the expense of veterans relying on it for matters of life and death.

PICKS OF THE WEEK



Ralph Fiennes in "The Grand Budapest Hotel"

"The Grand Budapest Hotel" (R) -- Perched high in the mountains of an obscure eastern European nation, the Grand Budapest Hotel once hosted the most prestigious (and eccentric) of the old high society. In the creeping dawn of the second World War, "The Grand Budapest's" preening hotel concierge (Ralph Fiennes) and his faithful lobby boy fight for their lives and an odd-looking Renaissance painting.

Writer/director Wes Anderson forges on with his signature style -- painstaking detail, the quirkiest characters and a dry sense of humor. Anderson also makes use of his menagerie of talented stars appearing in smaller roles (Ed Norton, Tilda Swinton, Bill Murray and many more). Outshining all of this is the sincere and comedic performance from Fiennes.

"Ernest & Celestine" (PG) -This beautifully animated French
import follows the unlikely love
between an artistic mouse and
grouchy bear. In this world,
the bears rule the snowy city
streets, while mice must live in
underground tunnels, fearing the
hungry bears above. Celestine
(voiced by Mackenzie Foy in

the English version) is a mouse with a passion for painting who gets caught by a bear while she's on the surface. The two strike a mutual agreement, making them mismatched friends and fugitives from their respective societies.

It's a refreshing visual experience to see an unfamiliar animating style that still sings with the artistry and quality you'd expect from a top-tier Disney or Pixar film. Of course, the story is just as adorable as possible, with the artsy mouse unlocking the bear's love of music.

"Joe" (R) -- Nicolas Cage steps up in this violent drama that showcases the inherent talents of the otherwise oddball leading man. Joe (Cage) is hardworking guy in a backwoods town -- he has a heart of gold situated next to a boiling temper. Joe wants to do right and break the cycle, but he's always falling back into rage and outbursts. Joe hires 15-year-old Gary (Tye Sheridan) to his working crew, and takes the quiet boy under his wing. Gary's abusive father and Joe's protective nature could put Joe on a path to destruction or redemption.

"Authors Anonymous" (PG-13) -- In a hopeless group of aspiring authors, the least intelligent of them all is the first one to land a publishing agent. Henry (Chris Kline) wants to quit his day job and live the literary life, but he just can't explain the unexpected success of ditsy Hannah (Kaley Cuoco). It uses the mockumentary style of filmmaking popularized by Christopher Guest. "This is Spinal Tap" and "A Mighty Wind" put real comedic talent in front of the camera in a way that let bizarre characters step into the real world. This movie is the work of somebody who couldn't quite pull that off.







Father's Day. A day that could mean so much more to so many more dad's. If we only knew.

Yes, it's seems like it was just yesterday that my son was born. Where did twenty years go?

And it seems like it was just the day before that my father passed away as we held hands and I looked into his eyes for the last time. Where did twenty seven years go?

I remember one late afternoon, just after a storm had passed, driving on the 680 freeway with my son. He was sitting in the passenger seat (which was actually legal back then). I noticed he was staring at the clouds for some time, holding my hand. With a great deal of certainty, he said matter-of-factly, "Dad, God is a hand. He just reaches down and holds you."

Profound. He was only about four years old. I just let the moment sink in, not saving a word for miles.

On another trip about a year later, on a day that followed a particularly rough week, we shared another of those spiritually special moments. Again, as he sat next to me, he just patted the top of my right hand with his in that way that a son does. He turned and looked at me and said "This you're the dad and I'm the boy."

It was just yesterday that I took him to his first baseball game at the Oakland

Coliseum. Thank God for cameras. All he wanted to be for years afterwards was a big league baseball player. It drove

him to be a fantastic player, and an even better teammate. All those days coaching and practicing now seem like a blur, but what a blur!

Years later we made baseball trips to the Midwest and New York. When I had learned that they were closing old Yankee Stadium I was determined to get him there. We spent a week in New York. It was dad with his grown son just hanging out in the Big Apple. And we got to see the Yankees sweep the Twins. A treasure I'll never forget.

When it came time for buying his first car, he did all the research. He checked things out online, then made his decision. A good deal, but he did learn what "As Is" means real fast.

We once made a trip to Fort Bragg for a long weekend. We stopped in for dinner at a fancy restaurant. I mentioned to the staff where we were from, and that I had returned after many years to share their great food with my son. The owner, chef and the waitress all helped coach him on "how to act in a nice restaurant, especially went taking a young

lady out for dinner." It was really a kick to see him enjoy it.

I remember going to my first professional basketball game with my dad. Somewhere I still have the ticket stub. The Warriors and John Havliceck's Boston Celtics at the Cow Palace. It was awesome. I think I was eight.

I remember the times my dad spent coaching me. I didn't know until years later that he was an All-League star in high school and three-time league champion. I didn't know he was also a track and field star.

I remember many of our family camping trips. His pancakes, scrambled eggs, and burnt toast. I remember how we would all play games and cards on the old wooden camp tables under dim lights and blankets.

One Sunday, my dad and I and a bunch of family friends went to a 49er's and Ram's game at Candlestick Park. It was so much fun, because my team, the Rams, came back and won in the fourth quarter. I often say I was a Rams fan as a little kid just so I could get more of his attention for rooting for the other team.

There were days I would go with him to run errands and meet his buddies. I learned over the years that he got into just as much trouble goofing off as I did. It made our relationship so special to know those things about him.


I remember my dad's passing. Almost every little detail. Especially sitting in the room with him alone for the hour after he passed. Silent. Serene. Relief. Joy. Great appreciation.

Rarely a day goes by that I do not

think about my dad. I know I would give a year of my life to spend just one more day with him. Never does a day pass that I do not

yearn for seeing my son. He is off finishing college, then off to the rest of his life soon after.



Roll the Money

Dear Dave,

How should I handle my 401(k) when moving from one job to another?

- Tracy

Dear Tracy,

I would roll it to an IRA. Your new company, if you move it there, will have limited choices for your 401(k). You'd also probably have a lengthy waiting period for verification and the potential add-on fees and taxes.

Plus, with an IRA you can cash it out if something really bad happens. But I rarely ever advise people to cash out their IRAs. The only exceptions are extreme cases, like to avoid bankruptcy or

foreclosure. Even then, hardship withdrawals are very difficult to get. And again, this kind of thing should never be done except in an absolute, worst-case scenario.

Just roll your money into a traditional IRA, Tracy. It's called a direct transfer IRA, and that way there will be no taxes on it. You want the money to go directly from the 401(k) to the IRA. Then, you'll have the freedom to choose from about 8,000 mutual funds and move the money around, if you like.

In other words, you're in control. That's the way it should be when it comes to your money!

vary by age. For children, a typical case of pertussis starts with a cough and runny nose for one to two weeks. The cough then worsens and children may have rapid coughing spells that end with a whooping sound. Young infants may not have typical pertussis symptoms and may have no apparent cough.

Parents may describe episodes in which the infant's face turns red or purple. For adults, pertussis may simply be a cough that persists for several weeks.
