CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Attended by record numbers, the annual Carmichael park egg scramble hid 5,000 treat-filled eggs last Saturday.

Easter celebrations brought

over 1,200 children with baskets, buckets and bags. Divided into age groups, the hunters swarmed an acre of spring-green grass. Parents hollered encouragement as kids harvested the 2014 egg crop in a few frenzied minutes. The event host, a suave six-foot bunny in bow tie and waistcoat, then dispensed

cuddles and photo-ops. County Supervisor Susan Peters augmented the candy haul from her meet-the-constituents table. Children were further indulged with face-painting and crafts. The Sacramento Fine Art Center provided paints and paper for junior watercolorists. Many bunny portraits resulted.

Del Campo JR ROTC Welcomes Returning Hero

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Returning hero Colonel Earl Farney was guest speaker at Del Campo High's recent ROTC Military Ball in Carmichael Elks. Now 78, Farney established the school's award-winning ROTC program. He is now retired and living in Camdenton, Missouri.

When invited to fly west for the event, the Col replied: "You realize it's 2000 miles from Missouri to Fair Oaks? Sure, I'll be there."

Respected by a quarter-century of Del Campo (San Juan District) students, his homecoming was an old war horse's tour of honor. Farney's Air Force career spanned 56 years and included long periods of continuous alert during the Cold War. He also served two tours in Vietnam and flew 100 combat missions over Cambodia. A master navigator and missile man, his Whiteman AFB squadron was the first to earn the "Golden Missile Trophy" as the best missile squadron in the 8th Air Force.

At the age of 42, (then) Major Farney was cited for heroism after a 1972 mission over Hanoi. His B-52 aircraft received serious damage from enemy surface-to-air missiles but managed to return to base. This adventure earned Farney the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Metro Fire Expands Reserve Firefighter Program



MATHER, CA (MPG) - Metro Fire recently announced the expansion of the Reserve Firefighter Program. This program provides members of the community the opportunity to be a valued team member at Metro Fire, supporting our all-hazard operations. Reserve firefighters are not full-time employees of the District.

They are civilians who are willing to drop what they are doing at the sound of their pagers, and help respond to fire, medical and other emergencies in our community.

The success of this program has prompted expansion. This year, Metro Fire will hire up to 25 more Reserve Firefighters to enhance the program. Currently, all Reserves operate from Rio Linda, but reserve stations will eventually expand to other areas of the District. Firefighter-specific training will be a regular activity for both experienced and newly-hired Reserves.

The Reserve Firefighter Program can provide a valuable career pathway, where the basics of firefighting can be learned while providing support to firefighting operations. Reserve Firefighters do not enter dangerous environments, but they do drive and operate water tenders, which are used to supply water in areas with limited access. They also staff an air unit to refill firefighters' air cylinders, and they establish rehab stations on larger fires for crews to recover after extensive effort.

"The design of the expanded Reserve Program is twofold," states Bill Daniels, Metro Fire Assistant Chief. "Reduce operational costs by internally supporting the needs of the District, while developing and mentoring the future firefighters within our own community." Reserve Firefighters will receive a small stipend for their time on duty, but the skills they will learn are invaluable. ★

Call 311 for County Help

Residents of the unincorporated area now can dial 311 to report all concerns directly to call customer service representatives Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on issues like abandoned vehicles or shopping carts, animals (stray, deceased or dangerous), zoning code violations, repairs needed for curbs, gutters or sidewalks, graffiti, illegal dumping, street light problems and, of course, potholes.

And now on the new smartphone app (available in the app

store for Apple and Android users), you can take a picture of the issue and attach it to your report from your phone.

Remember to report an issue within the unincorporated area, simply call 311, visit 311.sac-county.net or download Sac County 311 Connect in the app store on your smartphone.

Hexavalent Chromium in Drinking Water

CDPH Submits Final Regulation Package

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) submitted to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) its final proposed regulation establishing the first ever drinking water Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) for hexavalent chromium (Cr VI). More than 18,000 comments were received by CDPH regarding the proposed regulation. The proposed final regulation documents include the Summary and Response to comments received.

The proposed final regulation will take effect after it has been reviewed and approved

by OAL in compliance with the Administrative Procedures Act. This review can take up to 30 working days to complete. Once approved, the regulation is then filed with the Secretary of State and will become effective the first day of the following quarter.

"The drinking water standard for hexavalent chromium of 10 parts per billion will protect public health while taking into consideration economic and technical feasibility as required by law," said Dr. Ron Chapman, CDPH director and state health officer. If the regulation is approved

as expected, implementation of the new drinking water standard for hexavalent chromium will begin July 1, 2014.

Today's filing also complies with timelines imposed by the Alameda Superior Court in Natural Resources Defense Council, Inc. v. California Department of Public Health.

Battle of the Wilderness

Civil War Reenactment at Gibson Ranch Park

NORTH SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - May, 1864: "General Grant, promoted to commander of the Union Armies, planned to engage Lee's forces in Virginia until they were destroyed. North and South fought in an inconclusive battle in the Wilderness. Lee inflicted more casualties on the Union forces than his own army incurred, but unlike Grant, he had no replacements."

—Library of Congress, American Memory

May 4–May 22, 1864 marked a grueling battle that served as the crossroads of the Civil War and led to the conclusion of combat within America. The field of battle was 2100 square miles of Virginia wilderness with towering trees, thick underbrush, and swamps of brackish water. Each day, the resounding sounds of gunshots and booming cannon blasts rang through the region, including the sleepy community of Spotsylvania, VA.

General Grant and his Union men were camped on one side of the Rapidan River while General Lee's Confederate Army was on the other side. The exchange of black powder musket fire caused massive, uncontrollable underbrush fires which burned to death wounded Union and Confederate soldiers alike before their comrades could rescue them.

Not believing that General Lee could reach the area until May 5th, Grant intended to advance to the West, consolidate troops and position his forces to attack the Confederates. Alerted to General Grant's movements, Lee quickly devised a daring scheme to charge ahead and assault Union forces unexpectedly from the east. So began the infamous Civil War Battle of the Wilderness.

On Saturday, May 3rd and Sunday, May 4th, Gibson Ranch Park will host a Civil War Reenactment of the Battle of the Wilderness, with all the thrilling anticipation of the original

conflict. This is the second year Gibson Ranch Park has been transformed into a living history destination for Civil War battles, featuring the National Civil War Association's professional reenactors. The Ranch's gently rolling hills and other natural amenities provide the perfect venue to recreate one of America's most politically charged struggles, initiated 150 years ago.

The event will showcase life during the Civil War with living history camps, Civil War music and dancing, a mix of modern day and period food vendors, crafts representing the 1860s and a historical fashion show. Kids' activities will be held in "Civilian Town."

Two battles will be fought each day. On Saturday, the camps open at 9:00 a.m., the first battle is at 1:00 p.m., the second is at 4 p.m., and the camp closes at 5:00 p.m. On Sunday, the camps open at 9:00 a.m., the first battle is at 11:00 a.m., the second is at 2:00 p.m., and the camps will close at 3:00 p.m.

This year, Blood Source and Talk 650 KSTE are teaming up to help increase the valuable, life saving blood supply in our

region. People can donate blood at any Blood Source or mobile unit to determine who the Civil War battle winner is. Donors can choose General Grant's Union Army by using donor card #7001, or General Lee's Confederate Army by using donor card #2100. Results will be announced at the beginning of each battle. Go to the Blood Source or Gibson Ranch Park Facebook page to see Dominick, Vince, and Michael duel each other.

A guest appearance by Armstrong and Getty's after show staff is scheduled. Gibson Ranch Park event organizers and sponsors SAFE Credit Union, 650 KSTE Radio, and Recycle Industries have worked to provide a great family event. There's something for everyone at the Civil War Battle of the Wilderness reenactment.

Admission to the Civil War experience is \$7. Kids under 10 years old are FREE. Win free tickets to the Battle of the Wilderness by listening to KSTE Talk 650. For more information, visit www.gibsonranchpark.com or call (916) 806-3868. ★

Reports from Sacramento Metro Fire District

Metro Fire Responds to Three Structure Fires in Less than Six Hours

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Just after 4am, the first of three fires was reported in Citrus Heights, at a closed-down mini mart at Auburn Blvd. and Sandalwood Drive. First-arriving crews were informed that transients frequently inhabited the building. With the potential for victims inside, the decision was made for an offensive fire attack, searching for occupants while putting out the fire. The interior was heavily charged with smoke and crews found the seat of the fire to be in a rear storage area. No occupants were inside and crews extinguished the fire, while keeping the structure intact. Amount saved is estimated at \$200,000, with damage approximately \$50,000. The cause of the fire is currently under investigation.

The second fire took place in a mobile home park on the 9100 block of Greenback Lane in Orangevale, just after 5:30am. Crews arrived to find two adult residents standing outside a trailer that was well-involved with fire. Both residents had significant burn injuries and were transported to UC Davis Medical Center. Nearby trailers were also threatened, so crews on scene simultaneously treated the patients, knocked down the fire, and protected exposures. Unfortunately, the residents' dog perished in the fire. Crews were able to protect adjacent units from any damage, though the trailer of origin was a total loss. Cause of the fire is undetermined at this point. The trailer did not have any working smoke alarms.

The third fire occurred just before 10am on the 5700 block

of Eastridge Drive in North Highlands. An alert neighbor called 911 after noticing smoke from the vents of an unoccupied home. Crews quickly made entry into the residence and were able to contain the fire to the bathroom. Aggressive salvage protected most of the residents' personal belongings. Amount saved is estimated at \$150,000 with damage at approximately \$5,000.

The cause of the fire is currently under investigation. No firefighters suffered injuries in any of these fires.

Protect your family; test your smoke alarms every month, and change the batteries when you change your clocks. ★

Suthep Po-ngam in "The Rocket"

"Gimme Shelter" (PG-13) -- A tattooed teen named Apple (Vanessa Hudgens) runs away from her abusive addict mother (Rosario Dawson), and finds a new set of hardships ahead of her. Apple -- shaken, unwashed, starving and pregnant -- finds her father (Brendan Fraser) in an affluent New Jersey suburb. Eventually, she finds her way into a shelter for pregnant teens and forms real human connections.

While based on true events, the story is told in stilted, cliched lines that sound like they could only be put together from scraps of old PSAs. This isn't to discredit the performances. Hudgens has never been further from her peppy Disney Channel image.

"Gloria" (R) -- Single and over 50, Gloria leads a fulfilling life outside of her office job. She's into yoga, self-improvement classes and keeping up with her adult children. The audience first sees her moving confidently through a nightclub, dancing and checking out other singles. Gloria's life turns a corner when she meets Rodolfo, a slightly older man who helps Gloria embrace her passion for life.

This Chilean import strikes a fine balance between laughter and drama. Gloria isn't a wacky older dame, nor is she a sad story about life's later years. She's a three-dimensional person at a point where she wants love in her life, but she's strong enough to not fall apart without it.

"The Rocket" (Unrated) -- Ahlo is a 10-year-old Laotian boy who must be bad luck. He was born a twin, but his brother did not survive -- an ill omen, as superstition says that one twin will be cursed and the other blessed. One day, Ahlo's village receives news that they have to leave their land because it will be flooded to make the reservoir for a new dam. Of course, people are quick to blame such misfortune on Ahlo once they find out he's a twin. The boy decides he's going to re-write his fate -- he's going to enter a rocket-building contest and win. "The Rocket" tells a unique, transporting and uplifting story.

"The Selfish Giant" (Unrated) -- Best pals and partners in crime, Arbor and Swifty are perpetually in trouble at home and at school. Both are adolescents living in a bleak and recessed British town brimming with abandoned lots and rusty metal. Arbor is the wiliest one who gets Swifty to ditch school. The boys start getting paid by a local scumbag for bringing in stolen scrap metal and wires with their horse carriage. From the beginning, you can see tragedy stalking the pair.

THE HISTORY CHANNEL

• On **April 30, 1888**, a hailstorm devastates the farming town of Moradabad, India, killing 230 people and thousands of farm animals. Most of the victims died instantly when hail the size of oranges rained down from the sky, striking them.

• On **April 28, 1897**, the Chickasaw and Choctaw, two of the Five Civilized Tribes, become the first to agree to abolish tribal government and communal ownership of land. "Citizen Kane," now revered as one of the greatest movies in history, made its debut at the smaller RKO Palace Theater and was a failure at the box office.

• On **April 29, 1968**, "Hair," the now-famous "tribal love-rock musical" that introduced the era-defining song "Aquarius," premieres on Broadway. "Hair" quickly became not just a smash-hit show, but a genuine cultural phenomenon.

• On **May 3, 1980**, 13-year-old Cari Lightner of Fair Oaks, Calif., is killed by a drunk driver while walking along a quiet road when the car swerves out of control and strikes her. Cari's tragic death compelled her mother, Candy Lightner, to found the organization Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD).

The First Amendment Is Such a Nuisance

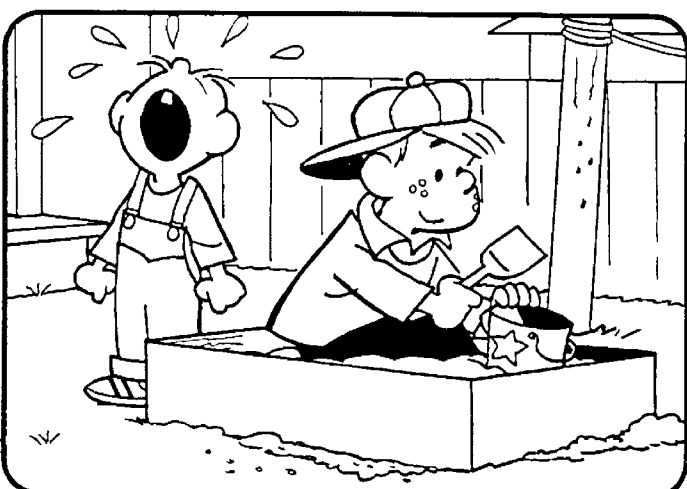
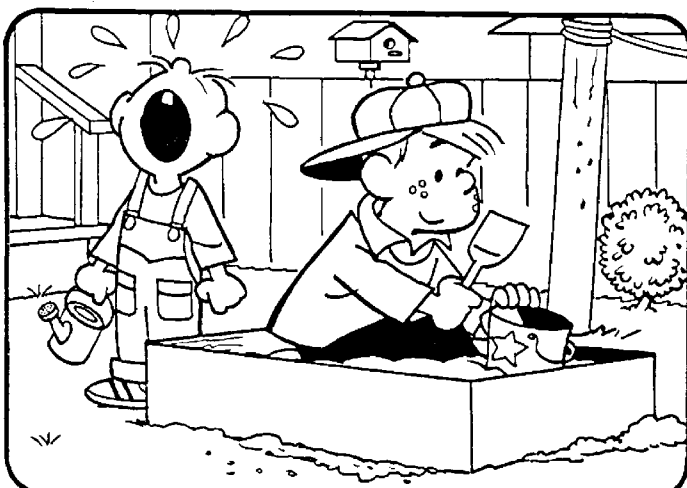
Every time the Supreme Court rules in favor of the First Amendment in a campaign-finance case, the left recoils in disgust. The court's 5-4 decision in McCutcheon v. FEC is the latest occasion for the rending of garments and gnashing of teeth. The court struck down the limit on the aggregate amount a donor can give to candidates and political-party committees, ruling it incompatible with First Amendment protections for political expression. The left pronounced itself outraged. The First Amendment is for strippers, flag burners, pornographers, funeral protesters and neo-Nazis, but not for people trying to give money to political parties or candidates. In his decision for the court, Chief Justice John Roberts noted that contributing to a candidate is political participation just

like volunteering for a campaign or urging others to vote. "Money in politics may at times seem repugnant to some," Roberts writes, "but so too does much of what the First Amendment vigorously protects." The decision in McCutcheon should have been a slam-dunk. Campaign-finance law limits how much a single donor can give in an election cycle to \$5,200 for a federal candidate and \$64,800 for a party committee. The court let these so-called base limits stand on grounds that under the landmark Buckley v. Valeo decision, direct contributions to candidates hold the greatest possibility for creating corruption. But if you accept the base limits, the aggregate limits on the total anyone can give to candidates in a single cycle (\$48,600) and to party committees and PACs in a single cycle (\$74,600) make no sense. By the logic of the law, if a contribution to one candidate of \$5,200 or less is not corrupting, there should be no fear that a donor giving a couple of dozen candidates that amount will be corrupting. Each of the candidates is receiving the proscribed amount or less. Once a donor hits the aggregate limit, though, it functions as an outright ban on further donations to candidates or parties -- even though these donations aren't corrupting. This is an impingement of his political rights

without any upside of preventing graft. The critics of the decision object to it partly on egalitarian grounds: Very few donors have the resources to contribute enough to bump up against the aggregate limits, so the decision gives disproportionate influence to a few people. A free political system always has such disparities. At the root of the left's opposition to McCutcheon, and Citizens United before it, is that it reduces governmental control over the political process. That control is taken, ipso facto, to be a good thing. Remember: The position of the Obama administration in oral arguments over Citizens United was that the government could ban books printed by corporations. Nancy Pelosi, the House minority leader, has proposed amending the First Amendment to give the government more latitude to limit political expression. In his decision, Roberts writes "that the First Amendment 'is designed and intended to remove governmental restraints from the arena of public discussion, putting the decision as to what views should be voiced largely into the hands of each of us.'" For those lamenting the decision, that is precisely the problem.

“Going with the Flow” Caring for Dementia and Alzheimer’s

correcting a person’s “faulty reality” lest we participate in a “lie.” Well, it took a while, but experts finally realized that all this really accomplished - as it would for most anyone - was to produce in our memory-loss loved one more anger, more resistance and more withdrawal.

Today we stand upon the shoulders of the previous generation of caregiving experts, and we now have learned that the key to caring for memory loss is to simply “be in the moment” and “go with the flow.” That sounds simple, but we know it’s hard to accomplish without help and practice.

For my work, I try to keep abreast of the latest developments and writings. I recently read the book, “I’m Still Here” by John Zeisel, Ph.D., which is a great addition to materials for family (and institutional) caregivers addressing memory loss. Within the context of the overarching concepts of “being in the moment” and “going with the flow,” Dr. Zeisel provides a number of practical applications, including how to effectively manage agitation, apathy, anxiety, and aggression. He also provides the five keys for meaningful communication, and seven rules of relationship building.

So, now when mom asks—for the tenth time—“When is your father coming home from work?” daughter-caregiver can respond by “redirection” and say, “I don’t know, but mom, what shall we make for dinner? Can we make it together?” And, while behaviors will always be varied, unpredictable and inconsistent, the chances are, the family experience will be more meaningful.

I appreciate Dr. Zeisel’s discussion so much that I ordered a box of his books to share with my team, with friends and with other readers. I have 15 more to give a way. First come, first served for 15 of you to email me to have your own copy as my gift to you.

SAVVY SPORTS FILM "DRAFT DAY" SCORES BIG WINNING TOUCHDOWN

DRAFT DAY (Rated-PG-13)
A Film Review by Tim Riley

Quality sports films are not uncommon. More recent really good ones that come to mind include "42" and "Moneyball." Other popular favorites are "Field of Dreams," "The Natural," and "Bull Durham."

Oddly enough, all the sports films mentioned so far have been focused on baseball, perhaps proving, to some extent, the national pastime's enduring popularity, even if the NFL claims supremacy.

Ivan Reitman's "Draft Day," obviously produced with the cooperation of the NFL, breaks the mold, turning out a solid gridiron saga that's finely tuned to front office maneuverings rather than pigskin heroics on the turf.

In many respects, "Draft Day" is the football equivalent of "Moneyball," where it's about the dynamics of fielding a team. The drama is behind-the-scenes, and here it all takes place in one day, leading up to the NFL's annual draft of college players at New York's cherished Radio City Music Hall.

Kevin Costner is like the John Wayne of sports films.

Whether it's the well-known baseball titles or films like "Tin Cup" and "For the Love of the Game," Costner owns every sports film in the same way Wayne owned the Westerns.

Hardly anybody is more credible than Costner as the aging competitor or athletic mentor. His Sonny Weaver, Jr. is the besieged general manager of the woeful Cleveland Browns, a venerable NFL franchise with a blue collar fan base clamoring for a winning team.

Sonny's personal and professional life is on trial for the course of one day. His father, the former beloved

appears to be a person of solid character.

One takeaway from "Draft Day" is that character does matter. It's a subject that weighs heavily on Sonny's mind as he digs deeper into the background of Bo Callahan, the star quarterback of the University of Wisconsin, where even his coach (Sam Elliott) seems oddly reticent to sing his praises.

Tempers flare from time to time, whether in the Cleveland war room, where Sonny keeps his assistants mostly in line with the game plan, though the hot-headed Coach Penn is practically unhinged during Sonny's controversial moves to keep everyone guessing until the clock almost runs out on making the draft pick.

Tom Welling's Brian Drew is the team's current quarterback, but he's coming off an injury that some believe has him washed up. Naturally, the veteran player thinks otherwise and delivers a potent message to the GM.

Ivan Reitman ("Ghostbusters" and "Animal House") has a long track record of hit comedies. "Draft Day" is a departure for the director, both in tone and subject matter. While there are humorous moments, "Draft Day" is a sports drama focused on characters rather than action on the field.

Just like "Moneyball," there's plenty of talk in the backroom and on the phones. To spice up the conversations, the director employs the split-screen technique to add some tension to the negotiating process. Mostly, it works, but some may tire of the frequency.

Before leaving home for the office on draft day, Sonny tucks a slip of paper into his pocket. Since the camera lingers on this move, we know it has significance. Indeed, it explains everything once all is said and done.

I'll admit that being a sports fan facilitates the enjoyment of this movie. But Costner and the whole cast are so good, and the dialogue is so sharp and crisp with palpable tension in the air, that "Draft Day" is intriguing, compelling entertainment.

To this sports-loving critic, "Draft Day" has jumped right into the pantheon of the best sports movies, and that's a tribute to the entire production team. They run with an attitude that produces a champion. ★
