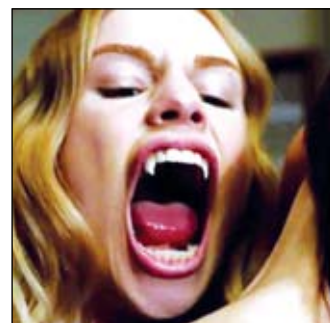

World's Best Motocross Racers Coming to Sacramento

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - No race is like it in California. The 46th Annual GoPro Hangtown Motocross Classic is back at Prairie City State Recreation Park Thursday, May 29th– Saturday, May 31st, with the pros racing on Saturday.

It's not just any motocross

race, but the oldest and one of the most coveted trophies on the 12-race Lucas Oil AMA Pro Motocross Championship Series. As host to professional motocross racing since 1968, the Dirt Diggers North Motorcycle Club (DDNMC) has developed the Hangtown Classic as the crown



jewel of the series, hosting the largest crowds of the season year in and year out.

Practice and time qualifications will be in the morning, opening ceremony at 12:25 p.m. and two motos each for the 250 and 450 classes. It will be a full action packed day from sun-up to sun-down.

To celebrate the 46th Annual Hangtown Classic, the pro pits

will be open in the morning to everyone—FREE. Adding to the excitement this year is a re-designed track layout which will add a fresh challenge to the riders.

With a new expanded seating and hospitality section for spectators, the modified course will not only provide new vantage points to watch all of the action,

Insurance Rate Reductions Bill Fails

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines' (R–Roseville) bill to immediately get rate reductions to insurance consumers (Senate Bill 1173) failed today in the Senate Insurance Committee on a 3-to-8 vote.

"I am extremely disappointed that the Committee failed to pass this important bill," said Senator Gaines. "California auto insurance is the eighth-highest in

the country and rate decreases take between four months and a year to get through the bureaucratic process. That's a travesty. Hardworking Californians deserve to benefit from valuable insurance cost savings immediately."

Senate Bill 1173 would have required that the Insurance Commissioner automatically accept any rate decrease application filed with the Department of Insurance. This would save consumers months worth of higher prices because of rate adjustments they're waiting on the Insurance Commissioner to approve.

In 1988, Proposition 103 established a rate review process to be implemented by an elected Insurance Commissioner and the Department of Insurance (DOI). The process includes a full application to be submitted to the department, public notice and a hearing if required.

Proposition 103 was aimed at combating the unchecked insurance rate increases happening at the time, and put tighter regulation and oversight on the industry to prevent abuses and discriminatory practices by insurers.

The regulations set in place also established a formula to cap the profits to the insurers, and restrict the costs that can be passed onto the consumers, specifically political use of premiums and fees paid.

"This bill would have upheld voters' intent to put protections on rate hikes and insurer profits, but also ensured that customers save money when an insurer is able to lower rates," said Senator Gaines. "I will continue to look for opportunities to advocate on behalf of California taxpayers and eliminate unnecessary bureaucratic processes that waste time and money."

Muriel Johnson Chairs May 31 Fundraiser for Parkway Gem

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Now in its fourth year operating as a non-profit, the Effie Yeaw Nature Center is preparing for its annual art-auction fundraiser with a new patron.

Celebrity painters have donated canvases for auction at the Saturday, May 31st event. Dozens of local artists have also provided juried work for sale at the *Painting Where the Wild Things Are* benefit. But best news for Effie Yeaw supporters is the event's endorsement by former Sacramento County Supervisor and Parkway lover Muriel Johnson. As honorary event chair, she follows in the footsteps of last year's benefactor, artist/philanthropist Marcy Friedman.

Johnson attended the 2013 gala and purchased a painting at auction. "Just by being there," said Effie Yeaw Fund Developer Betty Cooper, "community figures like Muriel, Marcy, Congresswoman Doris Matsui, Assemblyman Ken Cooley and Supervisor Susan Peters demonstrate that the Nature Center's work is vital. They are also attractions in their own right—people love events where they

Having lived near the American

River and enjoyed its Parkway for many years, Arcade resident Johnson presents an authoritative

voice in the nonprofit's favor: "The Effie Yeaw Nature Center and wildlife preserve exists as an oasis in an urban area, providing respite and opportunity for quiet reflection," she says. "Visitors—especially children—learn, discover and grow through direct outdoor experience. This annual art gala is a wonderfully enjoyable way to support the educational center, which is truly the jewel of the American River Parkway."

Despite loss of Sacramento County funding in 2010, the Center offers services to over 90,000 visitors per year. Notes Betty Cooper: "The support of caring people is what keeps us open and available for future generations. Muriel's participation confirms

Orchard Chosen as New SMUD CEO School's 100 Year Project Begins

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Arlen Orchard, general counsel, has been named to succeed John Di Stasio as the Sacramento Municipal Utility District's (SMUD) general manager and chief executive officer.

Orchard, a 24-year SMUD veteran, verbally accepted the offer from the SMUD Board of Directors to fill the GM position after a national search. The appointment was finalized when the SMUD Board of Directors issued a formal approval at its April 3rd meeting. Orchard assumed his new position April 12th. Di Stasio's last day as GM and CEO was April 11th. Di Stasio announced his retirement last fall after working at SMUD for more than 32 years.

"I am honored to be chosen by the Board of Directors and humbled to be given the opportunity to run this great organization," said Orchard. "That the Board chose from among the internal candidates speaks highly of the excellent work of SMUD's staff over the years."

Orchard says the focus on the customer and the community will continue to power SMUD

forward. "The utility industry and SMUD have many opportunities and also face many challenges. The guiding principle of delivering the best possible service and reliability at the lowest possible rates will continue to make SMUD a key community leader," said Orchard.

"SMUD attracted many strong candidates, each eager to lead one of the most progressive utilities in the world," said Genevieve Shiroma, president of SMUD's Board of Directors. "After many interviews, followed by thorough deliberation, it became clear that Arlen was the best choice to navigate SMUD

through the increasingly complicated legislative and regulatory environment, while keeping our power generation running, making progress reducing our carbon footprint, and ensuring that electric rates remain affordable," Shiroma said. "Arlen's expertise as SMUD's general counsel for more than a decade will serve our customer-owners very well."

Orchard moves to SMUD's top post after serving as general counsel for SMUD since 2001. In that capacity, he served as SMUD's top lawyer.

Orchard joined SMUD in 1990 as a staff attorney and served as assistant general counsel before accepting the general counsel post. He serves on the Board of Trustees for the Northwest Public Power Association and as the general counsel for the California Municipal Utilities Association. He also serves on the Boards of Directors of Capital Stage, a nonprofit professional theater company, the Greater Sacramento Urban League and the Sacramento Metro Chamber of Commerce. ★

SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG) - Arden Middle School students recently donned hard hats to dig in at the site of the 100-year-old school's centennial project—a \$5.5 million multi-purpose facility—now rising on the Watt Avenue campus.

Funded last year through voter-approved Measure 1, construction should be complete by spring next year. Amenities will include in and outdoor stages and a new cafeteria. Breaking ground, school's Principal Jeff Banks observed that enrolment has doubled since the existing multi-purpose facility was built decades ago. "The new facility will create a lot more space for our students," he approved. "It will also beautify the campus."

Sacramento Life Center Receives \$15,000 Grant

Women's Empowerment Launches Job Training Program For Sacramento Homeless Women

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Four formerly homeless women graduated today from Women's Empowerment's new Get A Job Kit paid job training program in manufacturing, warehouse, shipping and receiving. The four graduates were Katherine Carter, Lisa Costabile, Elizabeth Maag

and Kimberly Del Real. Women's Empowerment is the only nonprofit in the area to offer paid job training to women who have been homeless. The program prepares women to be work-ready and find housing, and provides free onsite child care and transportation assistance so they can meet with

a social worker and employment specialist, attend classes, connect to local resources, attend to their health needs and focus on job-readiness skills. After graduating, women can join the advanced program, which includes paid training partnerships with local employers, internships and one-on-one work

with employment specialists. The Get A Job Kit was created by Shirley Willey of Carmichael in 1990 and has helped thousands of university students, transitioning military men and women, emerging leaders, ex-offenders, at-risk youth – and Women's Empowerment graduates – create a professional image and develop professional skills.

"I'm a veteran, and I was homeless for a year and out of work for 10 years," Carter said. "Having a job reminds me that I'm worth something. I want to be a standup person in this community, so it's good to be back in the workforce. This is just the beginning."

"When my husband lost his job and we had to move to the shelter, all I could do was collect cans," Maag said. "I came to Women's Empowerment, and now I have work experience and a paycheck. My kids are working hard to get good grades and do their part. I want to show

them I can do my part too." "I'm 44 and I felt like I missed out on life until I came to Women's Empowerment," Costabile said. "Now I feel like my life is just starting. And with the training we've received, we can walk into any employer and be more of an asset. Now I'm ready to start a career. Whatever I need to do, I'll do it."

Congresswoman Doris Matsui toured the new program last week after honoring Women's Empowerment with the inaugural Women's Appreciation Award for Organization of the Year in March.

"Women's Empowerment provides a warm and safe environment for homeless women, empowering them to make the changes needed to obtain jobs, stable housing, and make healthy choices for themselves and their children," Matsui said. "The good work being done by Women's Empowerment is evident in the results of those they have helped."

"When I came to Women's Empowerment, I hadn't worked in 13 years, and it felt like the light at the end of the tunnel was gone," Del Real said. "Now I feel like I have hope again, and I just want to help people. I loved working on the Get A Job Kits because they help people not give up hope."

Challenge to Hillary Is Democratic Win-Win

Hillary Clinton is in a formidable position to win the Democratic presidential nomination in 2016, should she decide to run. But someone else also is in an enviable position: Whoever challenges her.

The dynamics of the Democratic 2016 race so far feel more like an incumbent president clearing the primary field of any potential spoilers prior to a re-election bid rather than a wide-open nomination contest. At this early juncture, the question is not so much who will be her opponent(s), but whether she will have any, or even one.

She certainly should. Any serious Democrat with some gumption and ambition would be a fool to pass up the race based on the forecast of a

Clinton coronation. Running against Hillary in 2016 is the greatest growth opportunity in the Democratic Party.

Whoever runs against Hillary will, for at least some period of time, be the hottest thing in American politics. On the cover of Time. Interviewed on all the Sunday shows. A figure of fascination whose every move is followed obsessively by every political outlet in the nation.

All of this happens right out of the gate. It would be a massive barrage of free advertising in exchange for the act of showing up. What politician with national aspirations wouldn't want such a prominent platform?

What he or she would do with it is anyone's guess. That would depend on the proficiency and message of the challenger's campaign, but history suggests that it would more likely than not get some traction.

As much as politics abhors a vacuum, the media hate a stale political narrative. Watching Hillary Clinton march unopposed to the Democratic nomination would be nightmare of tedium for journalists who thrive on conflict and drama. The rooting interest of the press will be for someone to run against Hillary, and to make a real race of it.

As a presidential campaign, Hillary Clinton 2.0 so far looks as though it will be like Hillary Clinton 1.0, only

more so. Her campaign will operate on the basis of sheer blunt political force and cold hard cash. Its rationale will be inevitability and the history-making prospect of the first woman president.

She is very unlikely to face anyone with the sheer political skill of Barack Obama, or with a narrative that fits the moment as precisely as his did in 2008. But she hasn't changed. Some of the same factors that accounted for her vulnerability last time haven't gone away: She lacks a deft political touch; the energy of the party is to her left; she has a resume, but not accomplishments; she is cautious to a fault.

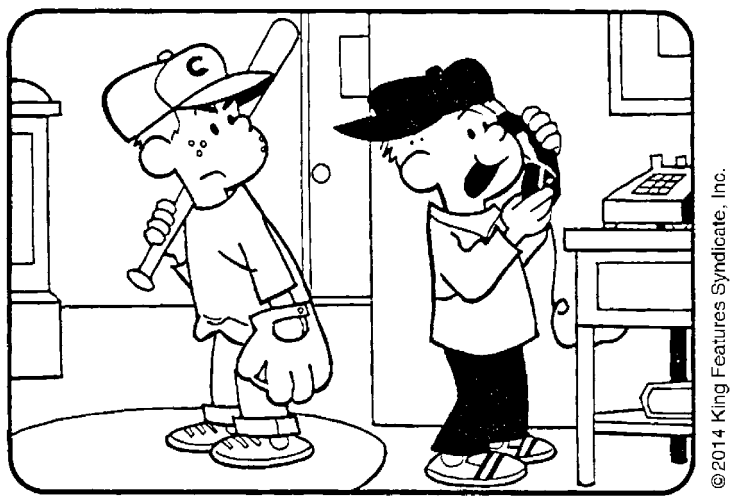
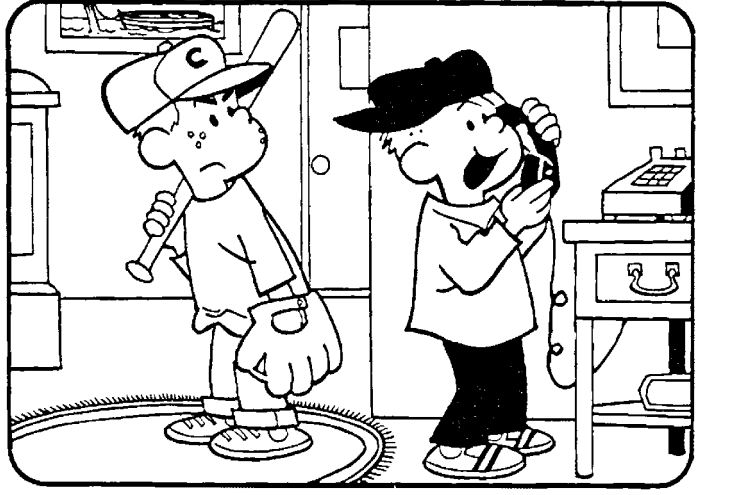
There will be a tendency among some Democrats to want to see Hillary spared the rigors of a competitive nomination battle. This is a mistake. The only thing worse for Democrats than Hillary getting roughed up in the primaries would be her getting nominated without any chance to exercise her atrophied political muscles.

Whoever runs against her would in fact be doing her a kind of service, although surely an unappreciated one. And who knows? Hillary's prospective candidacy may look unbeatable, but she's been inevitable before.

Lucy Fry in "Vampire Academy"

"Monuments Men" (PG-13) -- In the final stretch of World War II, the retreating German army had orders to destroy priceless works of art before they could be recovered by the Allies. The Monuments Men were an unlikely fighting force of curators and art historians tasked with going behind enemy lines to save these treasures. George Clooney, Matt Damon, Bill Murray, Cate Blanchett and Jean Dujardin comprise the all-star cast.

Even with a dream-team ensemble and rich source material, the storyline limps along when it should sprint. The crew splits up into their own subplots, united mainly by droning speeches insisting that this is a super-meaningful mission.

"Vampire Academy" (PG-13) -- At a secret Hogwarts-for-vampires located somewhere in Montana, supernaturally pretty vampire teens learn to master their powers. Lissa (Lucy Fry) is special vampire royalty. As a "Moroi," she gets more magic powers -- they're the good witches of vampire world. Rose (Zoey Deutch) is Lissa's protector, a Dhampir -- another type of OK vampire.

There's trouble brewing with the evil Strogai -- that's vampires who act more like, ya'know ... vampires. However, most of the plot revolves around vampire best friends and their choices among the vampire boys. Why can't the undead just be monsters again?

"About Last Night" (R) -- Two couples in modern-day Los Angeles explore the ins and outs of love, romance, lust and friendship -- all with a lot of comedic energy and frank sex talk. Danny and Bernie (handsome-man Michael Ealy and comedy live-wire Kevin Hart) are best buds playing the field when they both fall into iffy romances. Danny and Debbie (Joy Bryant) are the more virtuous couple. Is it love? Is it dating? Is it true that only fools rush in? Classic quandaries. Bernie and Joan (Regina Hall) despise love, ridicule each other mercilessly, and yet neither one can truly walk away.

DOG OF THE WEEK

"Pompeii" (PG-13) -- Swords, sandals, leather armor and lava. These are the things that Pompeii has plenty of. Engaging performances, non-corny dialog and originality -- these apparently had not been invented yet. Milo (Kit Harrington, "Jon Snow" of HBO's "Game of Thrones") is dreamy young slave gladiator who sure can swing a sword. He sets his sparkly blue eyes on an equally pretty noble girl (Emily Browning), who is engaged to an evil Roman senator. Then a volcano erupts, and they run from it. Much of the film looks like it could be freeze-framed and then printed on the cover of a paperback romance novel. It just needs a better, more suggestive title -- something about swords or heat or eruptions.

Berry Sorbet

This refreshing dessert is ready in just 5 minutes. You also can try other frozen fruits, such as peaches, melon or blueberries.

- 1 package (20 ounces) frozen strawberries or raspberries
- 1 container (8 ounces) plain low-fat yogurt
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- Fresh berries (optional)

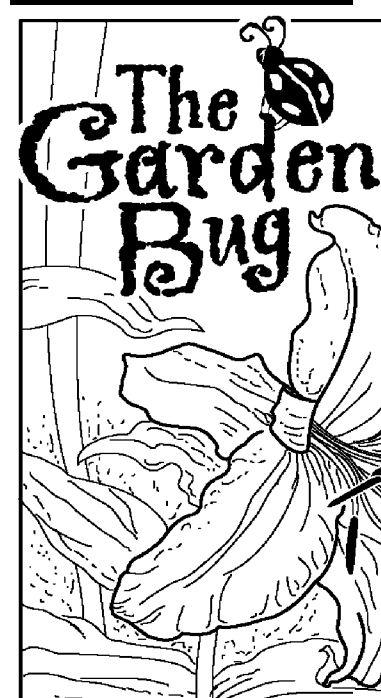

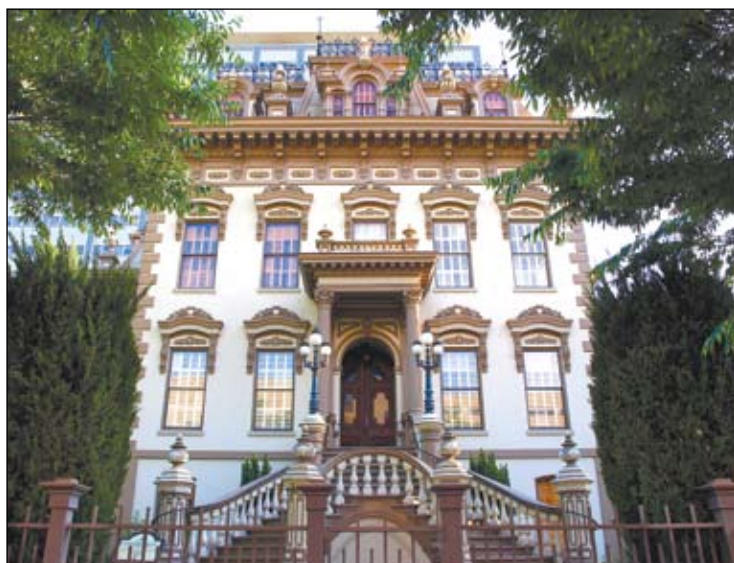

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Supervisor Susan Peters was among 2014 honorees named by Stanford Youth Solutions (formerly the Stanford Home for Children) at a recent fundraiser gala.

Peters serves as board chair of the Leland Stanford Mansion Foundation. Over 14 years, she helped raise \$22 million to preserve the Victorian mansion in downtown Sacramento. The landmark is part of Stanford Youth Solutions history: Governor Stanford's residence was given to the care of "friendless children" by his widow in 1900. Sisters of Mercy ran the home as an orphanage and it later housed dependant teenage schoolgirls.

Over a century and a half, the grand old lady of N Street suffered many utilitarian alterations, at least one fire and the inevitable nicks and scuffs of constant use. Now restored to gubernatorial splendor and deemed a state historic park, the 19,000 square foot mansion is open to the public as a museum. Much of its antique furniture was once

used by the Stanford family. The home also serves as a venue for state receptions and, lacking an official governor's residence, California Governors entertain there. Stanford Youth Solutions is now headquartered in North Sacramento.

an "exemplary mother," Allen sought therapy from the non-profit for her daughter's trauma problems and later began a youth group for the teenager. Allen is now mentoring many other young people. ★

Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Month

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Fatal collisions involving motorcyclists have been increasing in California over the past few years. In an effort to change this disturbing trend, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) and Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) are hoping to save lives through a month-long motorcycle safety and awareness campaign during May.

With more than 1.3 million licensed motorcycle riders in California, most drivers are likely to find themselves sharing the road with a motorcyclist on a regular basis.

"Regardless of your mode of travel, safety comes first," said CHP Commissioner Joe Farrow. "By staying alert and using common sense and courtesy, drivers and riders alike can help to create a safer roadway environment for everyone."

According to 2011 data from the CHP's Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System (SWITRS), fatal motorcycle collisions accounted for nearly 16 percent of the total number of fatal collisions in California. SWITRS data also indicated the number of people killed in motorcycle-involved collisions increased nearly 20 percent from 2010 to 2011. An additional eight percent increase was noted

between 2011 and 2012, when 467 people died in motorcycle-involved collisions.

"Motorcycle riders must be mindful of their skills and vulnerabilities," said OTS Director Rhonda Craft. "Meanwhile, other vehicle drivers must be mindful to always look for motorcycles. Getting home safely involves concentration on driving and consideration for everyone on the road."

A key component to reduce the number of motorcycle-involved collisions is training. Regardless of a motorcyclist's skill level, the CHP encourages all riders to seek life-long training opportunities. The California Motorcyclist Safety Program (CMSP) is the state's official motorcycle training program. With more than 130 training sites throughout California, the CMSP offers courses for both new and returning riders. To enroll in a CMSP course, call 1(877) RIDE-411 or visit their website at www.camsp.org.

Important safety reminders for motorcyclists are: always wear a helmet and protective gear; remember, "no skin below the chin," it can save your life; watch your speed, and assume people in cars do not see you; try to stay out of blind spots, especially around large trucks; and lane splitting is

not prohibited if done in a safe and prudent manner.

Reducing the number of motorcycle-involved collisions goes beyond training and prevention on the part of the motorcyclists. According to the Motorcycle Safety Foundation, more than half of all fatal motorcycle collisions involve another vehicle. In addition, SWITRS data indicates on average, more than one quarter of fatal motorcycle-involved collisions occur within an intersection.

The CHP and OTS offer the following tips for driving safely around motorcycles: give motorcycles extra room; remember that a minor rear-end collision involving a motorcycle can have major consequences; look twice for motorcycles and always check and double check blind spots and mirrors before changing lanes or merging; passenger vehicles should remain extra vigilant when entering or crossing intersections; nearly one quarter of all fatal collisions in California occur within an intersection.

New Proof of Identity Regulations Proposed for DMV

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) announced today that the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) has published the proposed regulations for AB 60—the new law requiring DMV to issue a driver license to applicants who can prove identity and California residence and meet all other licensing requirements, such as passing the written and behind-the-wheel driving exams.

“DMV is committed to successfully implementing this new law to increase safety on California roads and protect the high level of security in our licensing and identity verification procedures,” said DMV Director Jean Shiomoto. “We will carefully consider the public comments we receive on these proposed regulations and make revisions as necessary.”

State law requires motorists to prove identity and legal presence to obtain a driver license. Under AB 60, motorists who cannot prove legal presence must prove identity and California residency to obtain a license. The proposed regulations released today define the categories of documents DMV will accept to verify the identity and California residence of future applicants.

DMV anticipates continually updating a list of specific documents—for example eventually allowing a Mexican Consular Card as a sole means of proving identity—as DMV works with other governments to finalize methods of electronically verifying documents.

“These proposed regulations detail how applicants will be able to prove identity and California residency to obtain a driver license under AB 60,” Shiomoto added. “Although these regulations are not final, we encourage future applicants to begin gathering documents now that they

will use to prove identity and residency.”

The proposed regulations also describe a secondary process for applicants who are unable to produce the documents otherwise required to prove identity. Under that secondary review, applicants must interview with a DMV investigator who will attempt to verify the applicant’s identity. California is the first state in the nation to offer a secondary review process for applicants that lack typical identification documents to prove identity.

“As we prepare for the issuance of licenses in California, it’s important that those who will benefit from AB 60 begin to gather the appropriate documents in order to apply for a driver’s license,” said LA City Councilmember Gil Cedillo, a longtime advocate of increasing the number of Californians able to get a driver license. “I also highly encourage individuals to study for the written test and begin taking driving lessons. All of these things will make the process of attaining a driver’s license much easier.”

DMV encourages the public to review the proposed regulations and make comments. The public comment period begins on Friday, May 9, 2014, and closes 45 days later on Monday, June 23, 2014, at 5:00 p.m. Comments on the proposed regulations can be sent to Legal Affairs Division, P.O. Box 932382, Mail Station: C128, Sacramento, CA 94232 or by e-mail to LADRegulations@dmv.ca.gov.

DMV will also conduct two public hearings to receive comments on the proposed regulations, one in Northern California and one in Southern California, as follows:

June 26, 2014, 10:00 a.m.–4:00 p.m., Caltrans District 4, Auditorium, 111 Grand Avenue, Oakland, CA.

June 24, 2014, 10:00 a.m.–4:00

p.m., Junipero Serra Building, Carmel Room, 320 W. Fourth Street, Los Angeles, CA.

After the public hearings, consideration of the public comment and any necessary revisions, DMV will deliver final regulations to OAL for review and approval. AB 60 requires the DMV to begin issuing licenses pursuant to AB 60, no later than January 1, 2015.

All future applicants will have to pass the standard written and drive exams, so DMV encourages future applicants to begin studying the California Driver Handbook available on the DMV webpage at www.dmv.ca.gov. For more information on AB 60, including sample interactive tests, webcasts, and information about public comment, visit: <http://apps.dmv.ca.gov/ab60/index.html>.

An applicant able to meet these identity and California residency requirements and all other requirements for licensure will be able to receive a driver license. SMUD Honors High School Teachers



More than two dozen teachers were honored by SMUD for participating in the pilot program Energy, Science and Engineering Academy (ESEA). The teachers from Rosemont High School and the School of Engineering and Sciences, tie energy-related learning into their English, social sciences and math classes. Nearly 600 students in the two schools are participating.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) honored 29 teachers from two local high schools who are teaching students about energy using linked learning curriculum. SMUD believes the curriculum will help increase students' interest in energy and related careers in engineering and technology. The teachers were honored by SMUD General Manager and CEO John Di Stasio at a SMUD Board of Directors' meeting.

The new pilot program is called Energy, Science and Engineering Academy (ESEA). The teachers from Rosemont High School and the School of Engineering and Sciences, both in the Sacramento City Unified School District (SCUSD), tie energy-related learning into their English, social sciences and math classes. Nearly 600 students in the two schools are participating.

SMUD partnered with Sacramento State University and SCUSD in the effort. The curriculum was implemented this current school year. Last summer, 29 teachers participated in Sacramento State University's "summer institute," a workshop designed to help teachers develop knowledge in energy-related issues. They are now able to build energy-related projects into the core courses they teach their students. The summer institute was very successful with teachers learning from SMUD and other industry subject matter experts. The SMUD experts also provided contacts in the energy industry for teachers to continue ongoing networking.

The School of Engineering and Sciences is now an ESEA. Twenty-one teachers and 525 students, grades 7-12, are involved in the new learning. Eight teachers and 34 ninth graders at Rosemont

are participating. Both schools are also offering the Center for Energy Workforce Development (CEWD) Energy Industry Fundamentals course.




