

## Residents Receive Free Tax Help at Local Centers

New website through United Way also helps local residents keep their tax refunds. Miles III Maria


#### **SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -**

Local households making less than \$58,000 a year can receive help filing their taxes for free as part of the region's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program led by United Way California Capital Region. Those interested can visit SAFE Credit Union's Rancho Cordova branch, 12519 Folsom Boulevard, or the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership, 10665 Coloma Road.

As part of the VITA program, United Way has created www. KeepYourTaxRefund.com, an online tool helping local residents save money this tax season.

"We want people to keep more money in their pockets and make our community stronger by taking advantage of tax credits," said Stephanie McLemore Bray, United Way president and CEO. "This website is an easy and effective way to file your taxes and save your money for what matters most to you."

KeepYourTaxRefund.com's filing tool is free to individuals or households making less than \$58,000 a year. For those making more, the cost is less than \$50. The website, which is powered by H&R Block software, saves users an average of \$200 in tax preparation fees. Users will need a valid email address and income forms,



taxes for free, if they qualify, or they can visit the Rancho Cordova VITA locations.

United Way also is seeking volunteers to distribute information about VITA. No prior tax law experience is necessary. Schedules and locations are flexible. For more information, contact United Way

## Senator Jim Nielsen **Appointed to Vice Chair**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California Senate President pro Tempore Darrell Steinberg (D-Sacramento) recommended and the Rules Committee unanimously confirmed Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber) to serve as Vice Chair of the Senate Committee on Budget and Fiscal

Experienced and knowledgeable in the state's convoluted budget process, Senator Nielsen will be an assertive steward as decisions are made on the spending of taxpayers' monies.

In response to the Governor's budget proposal, Senator Nielsen expressed his appreciation that the Governor advocated for fiscal restraint in presenting many of the same recommendations Republicans have made for the past decade.

"I appreciate the Governor's efforts; however, this budget proposal doesn't adequately address the structural deficit that continues to plague the state treasury. It also continues to fund the Governor's 'dream' of the High Speed Rail that California taxpayers don't want and can't afford."

Senator Nielsen added, "The state recently received more tax dollars than state financial experts predicted. These monies should either be returned to taxpayers or used to pay down the state's debt."

Citing cost-of-living adjustments and other automatic increases in the state's budgets, Nielsen vowed to push for reforms in the budget process.

"California's financial problems have not been erased by this temporary financial windfall created by a 'temporary tax increase' (Proposition 30) last year. We continue to be plagued by expensive on-going costs like the High Speed Rail project, and the Affordable Care Act also known as Obamacare."

Senator Nielsen continued, "The state has a massive \$355 billion 'wall of debt' that must be paid down so our economy can grow. Our state's economy is not recovering like the rest of the country. We must address the need to create more jobs for Californians who want to work."

## **Check Your Energy Use; Check Out a SMUD Power Monitor**

Use your Sacramento Public Library card to check out a "Kill A WattTM EZ" power monitor just like you would a book. Save money by learning how much power your appliances are using, and which are costing you the most money to operate. The monitor will help you decide how to better use them to save money.

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) donated 56 Kill A WattTM EZ monitors, two for each of the Sacramento Public Library's 28 branches. The tool helps customers realize energy efficiency benefits. SMUD's website, smud.org, has all the information a customer needs including tips and programs to help them save money.

The Kill A WattTM EZ is simple to use. Just plug it into the socket, and then plug the appliance into the device. Enter the cost per kilowatt-hour, and the monitor displays the cost of electricity as well as the kilowatt-hour usage to run the appliance. You can monitor the energy cost of any 110- or 120-volt appliance such as refrigerators, freezers, portable heaters, televisions and computers.

The monitor even calculates cost and forecasts costs by the week, month or year. You'll understand

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - how individual appliances can impact energy bills and determine if an appliance should be replaced with a more energy-efficient model, or perhaps unplugged, or plugged into a power strip that can be easily turned on when the appliance is needed.

"The monitor puts knowledge and control in the hands of SMUD customers," said John Grindrod, SMUD program manager. "It is a tremendous way to show our customers the value of energy efficiency and help them save money," said Grindrod. "This service is one more way Sacramento Public Library can fulfill its mission to provide valuable information to the public – information that can impact their lives for the better," said Library Director Rivkah Sass.

The Sacramento Public Library system serves residents throughout Sacramento County - the same territory as SMUD - and more than 600,000 county residents have library cards.



## Sac Zoo Announces First Baby Born in 2014: a Coquerel's Sifaka Lemur

SACERAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Zoo welcomes its newest resident, and the first baby born in 2014: an infant Coquerel's Sifaka Lemur discovered by keepers the morning of Sunday, January 5th. The male weighed 121 grams at birth. Mother, father and infant are bonding in their habitat across from the Conservation

Coquerel's Sifaka have a unique brown and white coloration, and are distinguished from other lemurs by the way they move. All sifaka have arms, hips, hands, and feet specially adapted for vertical clinging and leaping. Their legs are extremely long relative to body and arm length. Using their powerful back legs, they travel through the forest jumping from one upright tree limb to another, easily leaping more than 20 feet in a single bound. On the ground, they cannot run on all fours because of their long legs so they travel by springing sideways to cover the distance. There are potentially less than 10,000 Coquerel's Sifaka living in the wild and they are native only to a small area of northwestern Madagascar. Coquerel's Sifaka are among the most endangered of the sifaka species – habitat





loss due to deforestation is the leading threat.

There are only nine Association of Zoos and Aquariums-accredited facilities in the U.S. that house fewer than 60 endangered Coquerel's Sifaka. To help preserve vanishing species, the Sacramento Zoo takes part in Species Survival Plans® initiated by the AZA, to cooperatively manage specific populations of typically threatened or endangered species in accredited institutions.


Open since 1927, the Sacramento Zoo is home to more than 500 native, rare and endangered animals and is one of over 200 accredited institutions of the Association of Zoos and Aquariums. Located near the corner of Land Park Drive and Sutterville Road in William Land Park, the Zoo is wholly managed by the non-profit Sacramento Zoological Society.

This Sacramento treasure inspires conservation awareness through education and recreation. Open daily from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm, general admission is \$11.25; children ages 2-11 are \$7.25 and one and under are admitted free. Parking is free throughout the park or ride Regional Transit bus #6.



It is a word of affirmation, comfort, agreement, and relief. It is a word that completes vows, promises, blessings, and all of our prayers. It is a word of release - signaling the end of far too lengthy worship services – and it is the "Get ready...Get set...Go!" when we have gathered around the dinner table to eat. The word, of course, is "Amen."

At its most basic definition "Amen" means, "Let it be." Thus, when we say "Amen" at the conclusion of our prayers, we are not saying, "the end" (though I've heard many children finish that way); we aren't finishing our prayers at all. We are actually beginning, for we are confirming and confessing our trust in the God to whom we have just prayed.

"Amen," then, is a sort of faith signature that we sign to our prayers. "Let it be," we are declaring, "as God wills it." So, every time we invoke this familiar word, we are saying "Yes" to God's perspective about the world and about us, and we are saying "No" to all other perspectives.

Every "Amen" becomes an argument to convince ourselves, over and over again, that God knows us best and knows what is best for us. And speaking of

tend to argue with ourselves, don't we? Late in the day, quietly in the dark; early in the morning before we've had our coffee or medication; driving alone with only the hum of the tires on the pavement: We have these conversations with ourselves that those in recovery have learned to call, "Stinking Thinking."

We create these stories inside our heads about who we are; how we have failed; how ashamed we should be of ourselves; how unworthy we are; how utterly useless our lifework has been; how we are a lousy father, mother, parent, business owner or whatever. I'm convinced that many people can't be quiet, and they can't still their minds because they can't bear what they say to themselves in the quiet moments.

So, they have to keep the volume of life turned up to earbleeding levels and they keep the pace of life at breakneck speed. These people aren't busy, they are suffering, and I can't blame them for wanting to smother the voices in their heads, because a majority of the time that selfguided narrative they are feeding themselves is erroneous, untrue, and downright destructive.

Obviously there are those who do not have the voices of shame and inadequacy screaming in their brains. There are those who have, shall we say, more narcissistic tendencies. Their thinking is about how great they are; how overlooked and persecuted they have been; how they are so much better than that other guy and why can't everybody see that.

"God knows," God knows we It's a line of thought on the other end of the emotional spectrum, but it is "Stinking Thinking" all the same.

This, then, is one of the great benefits of prayer - and I don't think it matters if that prayer is guided by means of a rosary, prayer beads, meditation, a daily repetition of a favorite Scripture, or some other spiritual practice. People who pray aren't simply memorizing a repeated litany of words or practicing religious rituals. They are, in a real sense, reprogramming their software. They are overwriting the faulty components of their thinking.

They are experiencing the transformation of their hearts and minds, for in learning to listen to God's voice in prayer (and listening is a learned art form) they can turn down the cacophony of voices around them. And yes, these other voices include the "Stinking Thinking" inside their own heads.

Those who learn to truly pray are empowered to say, "Amen, let it be!" to God's voice, and to shout in protest, "No, absolutely not!" to all other pretensions – especially those pretensions that are manufactured from within. Such praying may not get one everything he or she asks for, but such praying may lead one to getting what he or she needs; and to that, I must say, "Amen." ★

CASE: Kyacey Uscola (01/17/14)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kristen Ilharreguy, Domestic Violence Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Kyacey Uscola was convicted by jury of battery on a spouse or cohabitant, battery with serious bodily injury, and corporal injury on a spouse or cohabitant. The jury also found true that Uscola personally inflicted great bodily injury upon the victim under circumstances involving domestic violence and that he has a prior domestic violence conviction.

Uscola is a professionally trained mixed martial arts specialist who has fought several professional fights for the Ultimate Fighting Championship. On June 15, 2013, he assaulted the mother of his child causing her to suffer significant injuries, including a punctured lung, eight broken ribs, two lumbar fractures, an orbital fracture, and a life threatening pancreas laceration.

Deputy District Attorney Kristen Ilharreguy states, "This conviction would not have been possible without the hard work of the Sacramento Police Department, District Attorney Criminal Investigator Diane Hall, and District Attorney Victim Advocate Lisa Corral."

Uscola faces a maximum sentence of 13 years in prison. Sentencing is set for February 14, 2014 in Department 19 before the Honorable Patrick Marlette.

CASE: Francis Palacio (01/16/14)

#### PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Amy Holliday, Adult Sexual Assault **Prosecution Unit**

Palacio kidnapped the victim during the commission of each offense.

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Francis Palacio was convicted by jury of seven charges, including forcible sexual intercourse, oral copulation, sexual penetration with a foreign object, and kidnapping for the purpose of committing rape. The jury also found true allegations that

On July 13, 2012, the victim was walking on Walerga Road near Kirkby Way when Palacio stopped her to ask what she was doing in the area. After a brief conversation, Palacio pushed her over the guardrail at the side of the road, got on top of her, and began strangling her when she screamed. When she attempted to wave for help, Palacio dragged her down the embankment out of the view of passing traffic. He then committed forcible sexual acts against her and kicked her in the head multiple times before fleeing.

The victim called 911, but responding Sacramento County sheriff's deputies were not able to located Palacio. Palacio was ultimately identified as a suspect through the use of DNA analysis performed by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Crime Lab.

Deputy District Attorney Amy Holliday states, "I commend and thank Sacramento County Sheriff's Detective Bradley Jones and District Attorney Victim Advocate Mailyn Chuong for their hard work and dedication to obtaining justice for this victim."

Palacio faces a maximum sentence of 97 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for February 21, 2014 at 1:30 p.m. in Department 3 before the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard.

#### CASE: Ronnie Vang & Joson Vang (01/15/14)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Valerie Brown, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that a jury returned a death sentence verdict for Ronnie Vang. His cousin and co-defendant, Joson Vang, was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole on January 10, 2014.

On December 4, 2013, two separate juries convicted Ronnie Vang and Joson Vang for the first degree murder of 44-year-old Keith Fessler. They were both convicted on additional charges of robbery, burglary, arson of the victim's house and theft of the victim's car. Ronnie Vang was also convicted of arson of the car and the attempted burglary of another home.

On June 23, 2009, the defendants broke into Mr. Fessler's South Sacramento home, stole several of his musical instruments, and hogtied Mr. Fessler. Ronnie Vang, who had been released from prison four days earlier, then shot Mr. Fessler twice in the back of the head before they set the house on fire. Ronnie Vang later said he killed Mr. Fessler to avoid being identified.

CASE: Nicholas Mangelli (01/14/14)

PROSECUTOR: Supervising Deputy District Attorney, Robin Shakely

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that yesterday Nicholas Mangelli pled guilty to the special circumstance murder of former Marine Michael Cole in his home during a robbery with the use of a knife on February 10, 2012.

Mangelli faces a sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for February 22, 2013 in Department 61 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

## Child Safety Update

#### **Protect Your Child From Concussions In Sports**

(NAPSA)—According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 1.6 to 3.8 million sports- and recreation-related traumatic brain injuries, such as concussions, occur each year. Most concussions go undiagnosed and untreated, which increases the risk of serious long-term effects in athletes.   - Unusual behavior
  - Loss of consciousness.

After a concussion, the brain needs time to heal. Athletes who have incurred a concussion have a greater risk of sustaining another. Repeat concussions, especially those that occur before full recovery, can increase the chances for severe issues later in life.

#### Safety-First Tips

Three ways to help minimize the risks for brain injuries are:

1. Keep the lines of communication open among parents, players and coaches. It's important that all parties feel comfortable talking about concerns that arise, including pulling an athlete from play when he or she is hurt.



#### PICKS OF THE WEEK



Benedict Cumberbatch in "The Fifth Estate"

"Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs 2" (PG) -- Brilliant scientist and inventor Flint Lockwood (Bill Hader) was a surprise success in the last film, in which he made a device that turned rain into food. In this follow-up to the last animated romp, Flint and friends must go on an expedition into a wild world of food-animal hybrids -- shrimpanzees, tacodiles and flamangoes to name a few of the pun-tastic creatures.

This new adventure successfully adapts to formula from the first and adds the right amount of tweaks. The pacing is fast and frenetic, with comedic action sequences that both thrill and tickle. The quick jabs and jokes -- verbal and visual -- are measured out at just the right rate.

"Rush" (R) -- Two drivers risk death on the racetrack in a six-year battle for supremacy in the prestigious Formula 1 racing circuit of the 1970s. James Hunt (Chris Hemsworth, Thor from "The Avengers," clean-shaven and dashing) is the Englishman and unstoppable party machine. If he's not racing, he's intoxicated

-- and sometimes the two overlap. His archrival is Niki Lauda (Daniel Bruhl, the sniper from "Inglorious Basterds"), a calculating and methodic Austrian racer.

Director Ron Howard uses his resources to full effect: pulse-pounding racing and a gentlemen's grudge between diametrically opposed athletes at the top of their games. While Hunt lusts after life-threatening situations; Bruhl calculates his risk before every race.

"Last Vegas" (R) -- With four distinguished performers leading a story about life and identity in older age, you'd think there would be something meaningful or at least entertaining about this film. Instead, you'll likely find yourself praying that the guys from "The Hangover" grow up before they become this bland. Robert De Niro, Morgan Freeman, Kevin Kline and Michael Douglas play four old buds in Las Vegas having the time of their lives. It's neither charming nor edgy, not too funny and not too sappy. I think it would be more entertaining to watch the actors drinking after a day of shooting than this schlock.

"The Fifth Estate" (R) -- This film looks behind the headlines to tell a dramatized version of the rise of Wikileaks -- the controversial online organization that publishes classified government information. At its center is the polarizing Julian Assange (Benedict Cumberbatch), a white-haired Aussie who believes it's his personal crusade to expose the darkest secrets of the world's most powerful organizations. The film is big on details, short on thrills. The script and direction somehow miss the mark, and the real-life story of espionage, exposure and informational warfare gets watered down into a sort of melodrama.







#### Obama vs. Nuns

It takes some doing to get embroiled in a court fight with nuns who provide hospice care for the indigent. Amazingly, the Obama administration has managed it.

Its legal battle with the Little Sisters of the Poor is the logical consequence of Obamacare's conscience-trampling contraception mandate. The requirement went into effect Jan. 1, but Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor issued a New Year's Eve injunction against enforcing it on the Little Sisters.

They are Catholic nuns who follow the doctrinal teachings of the church and therefore oppose contraceptive and abortive drugs and sterilization, all of which Obamacare mandates that employers cover in their insurance plans. Given the ongoing delays, waivers and exemptions associated with the law, it would seem natural simply to let the

Little Sisters go about their business of pouring out their hearts for the sick and dying.

But this is a fight the administration won't walk away from. For it, it is a matter of principle. And the principle is that the state trumps the convictions of people with deep-held religious beliefs.

When the contraception mandate first caused an uproar, the administration contrived a so-called accommodation for religiously oriented groups (actual churches have always been exempt). But whoever crafted it had a sick sense of humor. The very same document by which a group registers its moral objection to contraceptives and abortifacients also authorizes the insurer to cover them for the group's employees. What the accommodation gives with one hand, it takes away with the other.

The Little Sisters refuse to sign such a document. They happen to be in an unusual situation because they get their insurance from another religiously affiliated organization opposed to contraceptives and abortifacients, so it may be that these drugs don't get covered no matter what. But the Little Sisters can't be sure of this -- the regulations are complicated and subject to change.

Regardless, they don't want to sign. They want no part in authorizing coverage of contraceptive or abortive drugs. Enthusiasts for the mandate scoff. What the nuns are objecting to, they insist, is just a piece of paper.

Just a piece of paper? So is a mortgage. So is a wedding certificate. So is a will.


The Little Sisters deserve deference. Their religious sensibility is different than that of the mandarins of President Barack Obama's administrative state. In a dispute over what their conscience tells them to do or not to do, the Little Sisters are better positioned to know than anyone else.

Besides, who is harmed if the Little Sisters don't provide contraception coverage? They are a voluntary organization. They aren't imposing their views on anyone. Who, for that matter, is harmed if a secular organization run by people with moral objections to contraceptives and abortifacients refuses to cover them? Employees are still free to go out on their own and get contraceptives, which are widely available. If this sounds like an outlandish imposition, it is what people managed to do throughout American history all the way up to last week.

Instead of respecting the moral views of the Little Sisters, the administration hopes to grind them under foot by force of law. For shame.



## **SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans Available to California Small Businesses**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Small, nonfarm businesses in 35 California counties and neighboring counties in Arizona and Nevada are now eligible to apply for low-interest federal disaster loans from the U. S. Small Business Administration (SBA). "These loans offset economic losses because of reduced revenues caused by the drought that began on January 1, 2014, in the following primary counties," announced Tanya N. Garfield, Acting Director of SBA's Disaster Field Operations Center-West.

Primary California counties: Alameda, Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, Contra Costa, El Dorado, Fresno, Inyo, Kern, Kings, Los Angeles, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Mono, Monterey, Sacramento, San Benito, San Bernardino, San Joaquin, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Santa Clara, Stanislaus, Tulare, Tuolumne and Ventura;

Neighboring California counties: Orange, Placer, Riverside, San Mateo, Santa Cruz, Solano, Sutter and Yolo;

Neighboring Arizona counties: La Paz and Mohave;

Neighboring Nevada counties: Clark, Douglas, Esmeralda, Lyon, Mineral and Nye.

"SBA eligibility covers both the economic impacts on businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers that have suffered agricultural production losses caused by the disaster and businesses directly impacted by the disas-

ter," Garfield said. Small, nonfarm businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private, nonprofit organizations of any size may qualify for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) of up to \$2 million to help meet financial obligations and operating expenses which could have been met had the disaster not occurred.

"Eligibility for these loans is based on the financial impact of the disaster only and not on any actual property damage. These loans have an interest rate of 4% for businesses and 2.625% for private, nonprofit organizations, a maximum term of 30 years, and are available to small businesses and most private, nonprofits without the financial ability to offset the adverse impact without hardship," Garfield said.

By law, SBA makes EIDLs available when the U. S. Secretary of Agriculture designates an agricultural disaster.

Secretary Tom Vilsack declared this disaster on January 15, 2014.

Businesses primarily engaged in farming or ranching are not eligible for SBA disaster assistance. Agricultural enterprises should contact the Farm Services Agency (FSA) about the U. S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) assistance made available by the Secretary's declaration. However, in drought disasters nurseries are eligible for SBA disaster assistance.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure Web site at https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela.

and application forms are also available from SBA's Customer Service Center by calling (800) 659-2955 or e-mailing disastercustomerservice@sba.gov. Individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing may call (800) 877-





## With LENS, Offender Data Quickly Reaches Officers on Beat

A police officer on a DUI stop, logs into the online Law Enforcement Notification System (LENS) and finds that not only is the driver under federal supervision for a prior drug offense, but the conditions of release stipulate no alcohol use.

By statute, following release of a prisoner convicted of a drug trafficking crime, crime of violence, or sex offense, the U.S. Probation Office must notify the chief law enforcement officer of the state and of the local jurisdiction when

an offender moves into their jurisdiction. All 94 probation offices nationwide are now using LENS to make these notifications easier and more efficiently. And because LENS notifies local law enforcement at the beginning of supervision, it also promotes greater public safety.

For years, notification meant that paper documents with the prisoner's basic information and criminal history, plus their conditions of supervision, were compiled, and then mailed to law enforcement offices. This process was time consuming and the information varied—some districts

included photos, others just basic descriptions with height, weight, and eye color. Once the information reached its destination, there was still the problem of how to get it to the people who really needed it— the detectives and patrol officers on the street.

LENS was developed by the federal Judiciary to change all that. LENS pulls information already in the Probation and Pretrial Services Automated Case Tracking System (PACTS) database, and populates a website where local law enforcement officers can use a secure log-in through their smartphone, tablet

or computer to see a photo slideshow of certain offenders or as points on a map, showing where they live. They can see the name of the offender, a description, criminal history, aliases, conditions of supervision, and the contact information for his or her probation officer. In addition, the information for the offenders in the system can be searched across multiple jurisdictions and filtered by offense and demographics.

Following a bank robbery, suppose an eyewitness gives a description of one of the perpetrators. Detectives log into LENS, filter offenders under

supervision in the area for the type of offense—in this case, bank robbery—and by the basic physical description provided by the witness. The search produces a list of offenders fitting the description with photos, allowing for a virtual

LENS also is a time- and costsaver for probation office staff. LENS can pull the necessary information from PACTS in a fraction of the time it takes staff to compile the documents by hand. And if the local law enforcement agency has signed up for an email account, notification is at the click of a button. It's immediate and

there are no postage costs. Even in those instances where a law enforcement agency is still receiving paper documents, LENS still creates the documents more efficiently for the probation offices.

Recently LENS was expanded to begin automated deployment of FBI Flash Notices, alerting the FBI and other law enforcement agencies running a criminal records check through FBI when a subject is placed on supervised release, pretrial diversion, or probation. Thirty-two districts now are live on Flash.






