

Still Going Strong


CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Two world wars; 18 US presidents; 12 men on the moon; dozens of military postings; 15 cars; 50 types of aircraft; four children, nine dogs and one beloved wife - 100 year old Carmichaelite Colonel Bob Stewart has memories of them all.

A child in Missouri, he watched freshly kitted soldiers marching off to WW I. In WW II, he took his own chances in uniform. During a lifetime at the wheel, he drove everything from a 1920s Studebaker to a contemporary Dodge. As a U.S. Air Force pilot, he tested aircraft in Arctic exercises. Before settling in 1960s Carmichael, he and his late wife Kay raised their children on military bases all over

In a lifetime of elections, the colonel posted a bumper sticker for just one president. Nods the old-timer: "I always had a lot of respect for Ronald Reagan.'

Bob Stewart spent his recent 100th birthday equally respected. Even a stately parade of wild turkey outside his home seemed to salute the centenarian. "You can't help but like the surroundings here," he observed. "There's always a good variety of activities to enjoy in Carmichael."

From athletics to art, variety has been the spice of his own life. He established high school records in javelin and high jump. While serving the Air Force, his roles graduated from pilot to engineer, logistics planner and eventually to base commander at Moody, Georgia. Based in London, he took tea with Queen Elizabeth. He collected antiques but also loved untamed wildernesses. He and his bride enjoyed a fishing honeymoon and with four children later in tow they explored most American National Parks. "We set up camp once in Yellowstone," Stewart recalls. "The family was sleeping

when I heard a noise. Outside, a big bear had his nose in our food. I didn't have a gun. I had a double-bladed axe. I ran after him. He took off in fear of my battle

Quick action in the face of danger was a career requirement. In 1940, he landed at Ladd Field to work where Arctic conditions

posed great aviation challenges. He took charge of the pioneering Cold Weather Test Detachment, operating planes and equipment in sub-freezing weather. This critical Alaskan work continued during WW II.

Apollo 11's lunar mission created milestone memories for nearly everyone alive in 1969.

Bob Stewart looked up at the newly conquered moon and pondered. "I had doubts about whether the moon landing would be repeated," he says. However, it was thanks in part to his help that astronauts took that giant step for mankind. Serving NASA

Public Safety Realignment Has Led to Increase in Crime

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - State Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber). former Chair of the California Board of Prison Terms, issued the following statement today regarding the Public Policy Institute of California's conclusion that crime has increased as a result of the Governor's public safety realignment program:

"The link between the increase in crime and the Governor's public safety realignment program is no surprise.

"This is consistent with the FBI's and the California Attorney General's yearly crime statistics when compared to last year's. The Governor and lawmakers can no longer deny the serious flaws in their prison reduction plan.

"I have said it before and I will say it again, the Governor needs to call lawmakers to action by declaring a special session to deal with public safety, where we can focus exclusively on correcting the deficiencies of prison realignment (AB 109) to protect Californians.

"We have to fix realignment before more citizens are harmed'

Enacted into law in October of 2011, the Governor's prison realignment plan (AB 109) sends certain convicted felons to county jails instead of state prisons. Local jurisdictions are struggling to meet the increasing demands of housing convicted felons. Realignment requires counties to incarcerate or find alternative programs for tens of thousands of drug dealers, burglars and other habitual felons who previously would have been sentenced to state







Two Pedestrians Struck By **DUI Driver - One Dies**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - On December 8, 2013 at approximately 5:12 p.m., James Carroll, a 55 year old male from Carmichael was driving a 2012 Toyota Camry on westbound Kenneth Avenue and stopped at the intersection of Fair Oaks Boulevard. The driver made a left turn onto southbound Fair Oaks Boulevard and positioned his vehicle in the two way left hand turn lane. Husband and wife, Donald and Valerie Hendrickson (79 year old male and a 76 year old female) from Carmichael were walking from the west side of Fair Oaks Boulevard to the east side just south of Kenneth Avenue and were located in the two way left hand turn lane. Carroll failed to



see the pedestrians crossing the roadway and the Toyota struck both of them. Both pedestrians sustained major head injuries and were transported to Mercy San Juan Medical Hospital. Donald Hendrickson died from his injuries at the hospital.

Carroll was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and was arrested at the scene. He was booked into the Sacramento

County Jail and charged with 191.5(a) PC- Gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated and 23153 (a)(b)- Felony DUI causing injuries. This collision is still under investigation.

Driver Crashes Then Gets Out Of Vehicle and Runs Across Freeway

- On December 11, 2013 at approximately 4:24 a.m. a 36 year old male from Oakland, was driving a white 1993 Toyota Camry on eastbound I-80 west of Madison Avenue at an unknown speed. The Toyota struck the rear of a big rig which caused the driver to lose control of his vehicle. His vehicle traveled into the center divider where it struck a concrete wall. The driver exited his vehicle and began to travel across the freeway to the right shoulder. As he was crossing the

was approaching in the #3 lane and the right mirror struck him. A second vehicle, a white 2007 Volkswagon Jetta, traveling in the #6 or #7 lane also struck him. Two additional vehicles struck the pedestrian and he was pronounced dead at the scene. Bera Comments on Hearing on Iran Nuclear Deal

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) -Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. participated in a House Committee on Foreign Affairs hearing Tuesday at which Secretary of State John Kerry testified about the interim agreement on Iran's nuclear program finalized recently between Iran, the United States, and other leading nations. Bera offered the following comment:

"Today's (December 10th) hearing was a necessary discussion about the nuclear deal between Iran and the U.S. The agreement is an important step towards the widely-shared, international goal of preventing Iran from developing or acquiring

nuclear weapons, and while I am encouraged by the historic constructive progress made in

Geneva, I remain committed to an all-options-on-the-table approach towards Iran. In the months ahead, the U.S. and the international community must continue our vigilance and verification in Iran, and if Iran violates the interim agreement, or if a long-term accord does not materialize, they must be fully aware they will face serious consequences." Recent cases of interest

CASE: Robert Vasquez (11/22/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Marjorie Koller sentenced Robert Vasquez to life without the possibility of parole plus 25 years to life in prison. On October 10, 2013, a jury convicted Vasquez of first degree murder with the special circumstance of shooting from a vehicle and gun enhancements.

Early in the morning on September 12, 2010, sheriff's deputies responded to a report of a shooting near the intersection of Explorer Drive and Greensboro Circle in Rancho Cordova. When deputies arrived, they found Madalene Thomas inside her vehicle in the parking lot of a business

complex with a gunshot wound to her upper body. She was pronounced dead at the scene a short time later.

CASE: Leslie McCulley (11/22/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Greta Curtis Fall sentenced Leslie McCulley

to 31 years and 4 months to life in prison. On September 11, 2013, a jury convicted McCulley of four felonies, including aiding and abetting premeditated and deliberate attempted murder, aiding and abetting reckless evasion of peace officers, felon in possession of a gun, and possession of a stolen car. The jury also found true gun

On May 18, 2012, McCulley and Lucus Webb were spotted by Sacramento police officers driving a stolen car in the Land Park area. Webb was armed with a stolen .357 caliber revolver. When officers attempted a vehicle stop, Webb began driving at a high rate of speed and a chase ensued throughout Land Park and Hollywood Park. Part of the chase went through the St. Roberts Elementary school campus. Webb drove up to 70 mph through a small playground area with over 80 elementary school children on the playground. At one point, McCulley used the gun and shot out a passenger side window. The police disengaged the chase several times out of public safety concerns, but eventually located the abandoned car with McCulley and Webb nearby. Officer Randy Van Dusen and K9 Officer Bodie were called to the scene. They chased Webb into a residential yard where Webb shot Bodie point blank in the face, shattering his jaw and paw. Webb then shot at Officer Van Dusen, narrowly missing him. Officer Van Dusen returned fire, killing Webb. McCulley was quickly apprehended. She later admitted she knew of Webb's intent to kill an officer. She also encouraged Webb to kill an officer.

McCulley has a criminal history in Butte County dating back to 2008, including felony drug possession and drug possession for sale charges. McCulley had also given a statement in a 2010 Butte County case where she admitted that she wanted to shoot a CHP officer.

CASE: Kevin Johnson (11/25/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Alan Hengel, Insurance Fraud Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that 38-year-old Kevin Johnson (who is no relation to Sacramento Mayor Kevin Johnson) pled to felony charges of receiving stolen property and filing a fraudulent document with the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

In April 2010, Johnson purchased a 2002 Cadillac Escalade for \$8,500. Unknown to him, the vehicle's registered owner owed \$28,000 on the vehicle to SAFE Credit Union. As part of an insurance fraud scam, the owner falsely reported his Escalade had been stolen to the Sacramento Police Department and his car insurance company.

Johnson figured out that he had been scammed and asked the California Highway Patrol (CHP) about getting the title to the vehicle. Since the vehicle was legally owned by the credit union, the CHP told him that it was considered stolen and that he needed to allow the CHP to inspect the vehicle. Johnson refused to allow an inspection. Over the next few months, Johnson spent thousands of dollars replacing the Escalade's frame and body with a GMC Yukon frame and body he had bought at a salvage yard. He reassembled all of the Escalade's

parts onto the salvaged frame and body. Johnson then filed a fraudulent vehicle inspection certification with the DMV in order to get the vehicle registered as a salvaged Yukon under his girlfriend's name. In August 2011, Johnson was stopped by Sacramento police officers when he tried to evade a DUI checkpoint. Upon inspecting the vehicle, it was determined that the vehicle was a stolen Escalade, and Johnson was arrested.

Johnson faces up to one year in the county jail. Sentencing is set for January 6, 2014. CASE: Daniel Weddle (11/20/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Aaron Miller, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Daniel Weddle was convicted by jury for the first degree murder of his wife. The jury also found true that he personally discharged a firearm during the commission of the murder causing death to the victim. Weddle was also convicted of assault with a semiautomatic firearm on the victim's roommate and it was found true that he personally used the same firearm during the commission of the assault.

Roughly six weeks before the December 1, 2011 murder, Weddle moved out of the apartment he shared with his wife because she told him she wanted to end the marriage. Weddle moved back home with his parents. On the day of the murder, he came to the apartment at his wife's request because she had found some belongings were missing. The wife's roommate was also home. When Weddle saw some of the family law divorce paperwork that his wife had been working on, he became

enraged. He retrieved a handgun from the bedroom, returned to the room where his wife was and pointed the gun at the roommate as leverage to force his wife to sit down. He then shot his wife six times, killing her.

Sentencing is set for December 20, 2013 at 11:00 a.m. in Department 18 before the Honorable Cheryl Chun Meegan.

The Bad Faith Presidency

At the end of the day, the root of President Barack Obama's mendacity on Obamacare was simple: He didn't dare tell people how the law would work. He couldn't tell people how the law would work.

Forthrightness was the enemy. It served no useful purpose and could only bring peril, and potentially defeat. It had to be banished. Instead, President Obama made the sale on the basis of dubious blandishments and outright deceptions.

If this is the only way to pass your signature initiative -- and a decadeslonggoalofyourparty--itoughttogive you pause. But Obama was a natural at delivering sweeping and sincereseeming assurances that just weren't true. This kind of thing is his metier.

If he were awoken at 3 a.m. and told that he had to make the case for

nationalizing the banks by denying he was nationalizing the banks, he would do an entirely creditable job of it, even without a teleprompter. The salesmanship for Obamacare represents in microcosm the larger Obama political project, which has always depended on throwing a reassuring skein of moderation on top of left-wing ideological aims.

All politicians are prone to shaving the truth and trying to appear more reasonable than they are. Obama has made it an art form.

He will never admit his deep bias toward the growth of the federal government, or that he doesn't care that much if Iran gets the bomb, or that he is liquidating the American leadership role in the Middle East. No, no -- he is just trying to make government work, giving diplomacy a chance and pivoting to Asia, respectively.

In this vein, the things that the president couldn't say about Obamacare keep mounting. The New York Times reported the other day on how the word "redistribution," which aptly describes the law's intent and effect, is anathema.

"These days the word is particularly toxic at the White House," according to the paper. "But the redistribution of wealth has always been a central feature of the law and lies at the heart of the insurance market disruptions driving political attacks this fall."

Heaven forbid that the president tell people that. The Times notes that the last time the president mentioned redistribution, it was -- of course -- to say that he wanted nothing to do with it.


In private, the president admits that he has kept his true ideological self carefully under wraps. According to the authors of "Double Down," Mark Halperin and John Heilemann, Obama brought up climate change in a political strategy meeting in 2011 as an example of his undue caution. "Maybe I should just come out and say what I really feel," he said. "Maybe I should just say what I think about everything."

As a crazy thought experiment, his aides let him dabble with heartfelt sincerity. To the next meeting he brought a list of causes dear to him, all liberal cliches: climate change, immigration reform, poverty, Israeli-Palestinian peace, closing Gitmo and gay marriage. Only gay marriage surfaced in the presidential campaign because he couldn't bear any longer to hide what he really thought.

He knew the danger of too much forthrightness.

Slow Down on Mortgage Acceleration

Dear Dave,

Should I pay a nominal fee to be enrolled in a mortgage accelerator program? - Jennifer

Dear Jennifer,

No, you should not. Mortgage accelerator programs are similar to the biweekly mortgage deals floating around out there. Paying

on your mortgage biweekly is fine.

Paying for the privilege is not. In the biweekly mortgage program, you make a half-payment every two weeks. By doing this you will pay off the typical 30-year note in about 22 years. It works because there are 26 two-week periods in a year, and 26 half-payments equals 13 whole payments. It pays off your mortgage early because you're making an extra payment every year. That's what's doing it. There's nothing magical about every two weeks; it's the fact that you're paying extra principal.

Instead of paying your mortgage company an unnecessary "nominal fee," just make an extra payment each year. Or, pay one-twelfth of a payment as a principal reduction with a separate check, in a separate envelope, every month. By doing that, you'll pay off the loan just as quickly as with a biweekly arrangement.

If you're just now taking out a mortgage and your lender can do a biweekly setup at no cost, then that's great. Take them up on the offer. But we're not going to pay them an additional fee so you can make extra payments on the principal. That's just stupid!

Giving Beyond Tithing

Dear Dave,

My husband and I tithe, but right now we're on Baby Step 2 of your plan and we're expecting a child in a few months. Since we're trying to pay off all our debt except for our home, what should we do about giving beyond our tithe in this situation?

Dear Carrie, Evangelical Christians recognize two types of giving in the Bible—tithes and offerings. The tithe is off the top, before you do anything else. That's why I recommend people put it on the top line of their budget forms.

After that, offerings are almost impossible to find in Scripture until you've first taken care of your family. The normative method found is that offerings are to be taken out of your surplus. In my mind, while your family is in debt and you're busy taking care of your household, there is no surplus. Just because something tugs at your heartstrings or someone spews out a toxic sermon on giving doesn't mean that you need to give offerings above your tithe.

But here's the good news. Once you've paid off your debt and have a fully loaded emergency fund in place, you'll have the rest of your lives to open up and give like never before. Getting out of debt means you will gain control of your most powerful wealthbuilding tool—your income. And when that happens, you can give with extraordinary levels of generosity.

There are three things you can do with money—spend, save and give. And when you reach a point where you can give well, it's the most fun you'll ever have with money!



ARC Volleyball Program Draws Inspiration from Historic Season

Despite a disappointing finish, players and staff are encouraged by their achievements in 2013

The American River College women's volleyball team's season came to an end with a loss to Grossmont College Sunday Dec. 8. The team lost 0-3 (25-18, 25-20, 25-21) in their final contest of the California Community College Athletic Association's state championship tournament.

The Beavers achieved multiple historic feats in 2013, winning the first Big 8 Conference championship it the program's history and making its first appearance in the state tournament in 20 years.

Though disappointed in its performance at the tournament, the team is proud of its season.

"I think if we did (consider) it a possibility then we would have worked harder for it and been more prepared for what is going to happen at state." said Hareland

After losing in the Northern California playoff in 2012, several members of the team used the experience and disappointment to as inspiration going into the 2013 season. Sophomore libero Sophi Lozano - who will play spring volleyball with ARC before pursuing a walk-on opportunity with Sacramento State University sees an opportunity for her younger teammates to emulate this process in hopes for a better performance at the state level next season.

"The freshman now that are going to be sophomores, they have this idea of what it's going to be (like), they know what the pressure's going to be and they can prepare for that all season," said Lozano.

Head coach Ashlie Frame has similar hopes for both her freshman and sophomore athletes.

Romack won both the 1960 LPGA Tour Leesburg Open as well as the 1961 Tour Rock Cities Open, but it was her amateur career that was even more remarkable. She won the Canadian Amateur Championship (1953) and the USGA Women's Amateur Championship (1954) and won the California State Amateur a record four times (1952, 1954, 1956, 1958). Born and raised in Sacramento, Romack had a career golf record unmatched by any other woman locally. She learned the game early from Bing Maloney Head Golf Professional Bus Pendleton and then later from Haggin Oaks Head Golf Professional Tom LoPresti. In 1955, her golfing prowess earned an invitation from then-President Dwight Eisenhower for lunch. Romack is now retired and living in Florida.

Elliott "Bus" Pendleton was a head golf professional fixture at William Land GC and Bing Maloney GC for nearly four decades and had an undeniable impact on local public golf. Pendleton was born in 1907 and was an outstanding amateur player, winning the second annual California State Fair Golf Championship when it was held at the Del Paso Country Club. It was at Del Paso where graduated high school but soon

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Two- Pendleton was first introduced to golf. A native of Fort Bragg, he moved with his family to Sacramento in 1919. Shortly after arriving, he sold newspapers downtown during the week and on weekends caddied at Del Paso. Pendleton won his first tournament in 1922, a handicap event on the old Arcade course featuring sand greens. Two years later he opened a golf shop at the old Weinstock-Lubin department store at 12th and K streets. Pendleton took the head professional job at Land Park in 1935 and assumed additional duties as head pro at Bing Maloney when it opened in 1952. Bus paved a lot of roads for the success golf has today in the community. He's also helped many others go on to successful careers in golf. Some of his pupils included Al Geiberger, Barbara Romack, Judy Ghilarducci, Frank Elston and Geoff Gorman, who would



Hogan Golf Co. Geiberger, the first touring pro ever to shoot a 59 and a success on the Senior PGA Tour, was his most famous pupil. Pendleton passed away in 1996 at the age of 89.

It is appropriate that the lady that people called "The Mother of Sacramento Junior Golf" be inducted along with some of her prized golfers that played in the tournaments she ran. Irene Kaminsky grew up a fan of the game and dedicated her long life to creating tournaments and opportunities for junior golfers to learn the game of golf. She helped create the Sacramento Golf Council and was its very first woman member, acting as the Treasurer for over two decades. Says longtime Haggin Oaks Director of Golf, Ken Morton, Sr., "The impact and influence of Irene on junior golf here in Sacramento cannot possibly be overstated. Her passion and ardent support for the young golfers in our community led to every significant local junior golf tournament and the creation of the Sacramento Golf Council. It is only appropriate that the tournament she founded, the Sacramento City Junior Championship, has a trophy with her name etched on it in perpetuity. Kaminsky passed away in the early 1980's making it all the way into her 80's.

Ed Burt got his start working for the Marksville Appeal-Democrate after he



joined the Sacramento Bee staff in 1942 as a courthouse reporter. He worked his way up through the general assignment and copy desks until the avid sportsman landed his dream job as the golf writer. He remained the golf voice for the newspaper until his retirement in 1972. During his tenure, he received special awards from the Northern California Golf Association, the Sacramento Golf Club and the McClatchy Broadcasting 25-Year Club for his service to the area and local golfers alike. He covered every local golf event imaginable, from the Swing at Cancer (where he would later handle publicity in retirement) to interviewing Lawrence Welk about his golf game when he was here locally for an event. Burt's contributions to celebrating and publicizing golf in the Greater Sacramento area were immeasurable. Probably saying it the best is a plaque Burt received from the Northern California Golf Association that read: "To Ed Burt for special recognition in sketching the game of golf and its golfers exactly as they go without prejudice to friend or foe." Burt passed away in 1976 at the age of 69.

Started in 1983 as Sacramento Area Youth Golf Association (SAY Golf), The First Tee of Greater Sacramento helps young people develop life skills and core values through the game of golf. Those core values are courtesy, perseverance, responsibility, respect, honest, confidence, integrity, sportsmanship and judgment. TFTGS offers multiple programs designed for specific skill levels that allow young people to advance toward greater mastery of golf. But the central purpose extends far beyond hitting a ball onto a green and into the hole. Its well-established rules of etiquette and emphasis on sportsmanship-like conduct along with the high-level of hand-eye coordination required to play competently, provides an ideal backdrop to practicing self-discipline, setting goals and learning to respect others.


I eschew the practice of generosity to the less fortunate only during the month of December! Fulfilling Jesus' wish list is something His followers need to do all year long, whenever and wherever these




