Declared World Champion at Aberdeen (Scotland) in 2006, Jack Magee showed caber-tossing prowess during the recent Celtic Ceilidh in Carmichael

The former US Marine huffed, puffed and ran arrow-straight while balancing a 17 ft log in his palms. He then tossed it to bruise park turf and garner onlookers' cheers. Magee (71), a Scottish entertainer who frequently sings the national anthem or Amazing Grace for

veteran burials, attributes his formidable strength to "whiskey and haggis."

Quad exercises toughen essential manly thighs, advises the Amador County resident. "But the best way to train for the caber is just to get out and do it." As a gold medal champion, Magee is in demand to teach disciplines required for international Highland game competition. Caber lesson one: log on. A Douglas fir is needed.

Magee scouts local forests before log-prep. "It's got to be perfectly straight," he advises. "You cut down your tree; strip the bark; let it dry for six months before you sand and paint it." Magee hauls caber selections around Gaelic celebrations atop his three-quarter ton pickup truck. "I've been known to take them on camping trips," he says. "You stay in shape by throwing something every few days. It might take five years to be good at it. But if you're not strong, fit and atheltically inclined, you won't succeed in 50."

Like many ancient sports, caber tossing originated from macho exploits: Suggest Magee: "Maybe some Highlander wanted to get over a stream. Or to climb

a fortress in battle. He probably chopped down a tree and tossed it where it was needed. But it just as likely originated from men drinking whisky and arguing over who could toss a log further..."

Carmichael's day-long Fall Ceilidh was also celebrated by bagpipers, singing minstrels and Gaelic dancing. The annual event is presented by the St Andrew's Society of Sacramento. For information, call (916) 719-5725. Contact caber tosser Jack Magee at (209) 295-2057.

Jane Schwartzberg cringes when she hears someone say that a terrible accident or frightening medical diagnosis made them realize what's important in life.

"In some ways, I do wish everyone could experience a taste of terminal, if that's what it takes to make them appreciate the intangible gifts we receive not just during the holidays, but all year," says Schwartzberg, co-author with Marcy Tolkoff Levy of "Naked Jane Bares All," www.nakedjanebaresall.com, a new book that shares Jane's story with candor and humor.

"But I wish they'd known all along, and I hate the thought of goodness coming at the expense of so much suffering."

Schwartzberg says she was clear about what's most important before she was diagnosed with stage four incurable breast cancer. As a mother, wife, daughter, sister, aunt and friend, she knew that all that really matters is how much love we give and receive.

According to Schwartzberg the holidays are a wonderful opportunity for people to remember that and to focus on who they love. But, too often, they become a source of anxiety, stress, and tension. Financial concerns, having too much to do, and missing loved ones were among the top

Schwartzberg's "love train" is a metaphor for all of the people she chooses to share her life with. "They are rooting me on and giving my family and me love and support," she says. "I try to be as meticulous and thoughtful as I possibly can be with those on board, and that means making sure they know how much I love and value them."

ONE HEALTH, ONE MEDICINE

Fascinating Facts About Humans And Animals

(NAPS)—If yours is like most households in the United States, you have at least one pet.

That's a good thing, considering that people who understand health care have discovered something interesting about animals—they can help improve your health.

How Pets Help Your Health According to Dr. Heather Douglas, DVM, St. George's University/School of Veterinary Medicine, '06, pets can be good for you in four

- Blood pressure
- Cholesterol levels

ways. They can decrease your:

- Triglyceride levels
- Feelings of loneliness.

 The CDC goes on to say that pets can increase your:
- Opportunities for exercise and outdoor activities

• Opportunities for socialization. Adds Dr. Douglas, it's a good idea to include your dog in your exercise regimen. Whether it's running, walking or even yoga (which dogs seem to enjoy), start slowly and gradually build up tolerance to avoid injury to either of you. One day a week of yoga practice can improve your flexibility, strength, balance and focus.

"Based on a study by Glenn N. Levine and others published in the Circulation journal of the American Heart Association," she says, "there is an association between pet ownership (primarily cat or dog) and lower blood pressure. It was also found that dog owners, who are more likely to exercise with their pet, may have a reduced risk of obesity. Dog ownership is also associated with decreased cardiovascular risk and may have some role in reducing cardiovascular disease.

"The human-animal bond is an amazing phenomenon that offers health benefits to both the person and pet. Incorporating man's best friend into a workout regime can add fun to exercise, while improving the health of both the human and animal involved."



Having pets is good for your health, doctors say.

Furthermore, according to a study by the Stroke Institute of Minnesota, owning a cat can dramatically reduce your chances of dying from heart disease by 30 percent. The researchers suspect a dog study would provide similar results.

A Smart Place To Study These Ideas

One place where the study of the interaction between humans and animals is at the forefront is St. George's University, a fully accredited center of international medical and veterinary education on the island of Grenada in the Caribbean. There, faculty from 140 countries and students from around the world are looking into how learning about the health of humans and animals can be related.

At St. George's, the Schools of Medicine and Veterinary Medicine, the Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and the Windward Islands Research and Education Foundation provide a collaboration of expertise to support the concept of "One Health, One Medicine" and to take students from residency to fellowship training to employment. It's all part of the university's global approach to medicine.

Ten Study Skills All Students Should Know

(NAPS) - In school, your child takes English, history, math and other classes. But a key area of academic development isn't taught in a specific class, and without it, a student will struggle to excel in school. That skill is studying.

Sylvan recommends the following tips for elementary and secondarylevel students to help improve their study skills:

- 1. Planners are a sanity saver. Time management is tricky. Having all major deadlines, due dates, events and extracurriculars in one place helps kids visualize their week, manage their time and stay on track.
- 2. Breaking it down is a good thing. Understanding how to break daunting projects into more manageable ones is a key skill. For example, to make studying for a giant math final approachable, list all the concepts on the test and review them one at a time.
- 3. Organization isn't overrated. Keeping notes, projects and reading materials in logical order helps kids find what they need right away, cutting down on time spent tracking things down and upping time spent actually studying.
- 4. Good notes matter. Practice picking out the "main ideas" in conversations with you, in news reports or in magazine articles.
- 5. Study slow and steady. The best way for kids to do well on tests is to review the information daily at home. Studying with friends in small groups outside of school can encourage this.

6. Harp on homework. Getting home-

work done thoughtfully and on time is one of the most fundamental study

- 7. Concentrating is critical. To avoid distraction, make sure their cell phones are tucked away and don't let a chatty classmate cause them to lose focus.
- 8. Directions aren't always direct. Students can get tripped up by homework or test instructions. Encourage kids to listen carefully and spend plenty of time reading directions. Also make sure they know it's OK to speak up if they don't understand testing directions.
- 9. Know you've got help. If prepping for tests is a tough ordeal and your

child is losing confidence, a lack of study skills could be to blame. Luckily, there are places to go for help. For example, Sylvan Learning at http://tutoring.sylvanlearning.com/study_skills_programs.cfm has a great record of helping kids improve study skills.

10. It's fine to have fun. Come up with some cool "rewards" with your kids—extra time with you, a favorite treat, later curfew—to let them know you recognize their efforts. Support and encourage them and keep your sense of humor. It all helps.



PICKS OF THE WEEK



Helen Mirren in "Red 2"

"Red 2" (R) -- A handful of renegade CIA retirees go back into action to kill bad dudes and recover a nuclear weapon. The aging -- but still deadly -- ensemble includes Bruce Willis (tough guy and hero), John Malkovich (the Mad-Dog Murdoch of the crew) and Helen Mirren (elegant and sophisticated, even when operating an automatic weapon). Mary-Louise Parker rounds out the cast as Bruce's civilian girlfriend.

While the explosions are big and bright, this film has an acute case of sequel-itis. Willis looks bored for most of the proceedings. The jokes don't land the way they did in the prequel. Sir Anthony Hopkins has a fun role as a scientist -possibly the mad kind. If you truly enjoyed the first round, then go ahead and rent this as a follow-up.

"Jobs" (PG-13) -- Steve Jobs had an undeniably dramatic and intriguing life. From his early years, to the launch of Apple Computers, all the way up to his triumphant return to the company

he built and then lost. Ashton Kutcher clearly put in the research for his role as Jobs. Josh Gad -- a more comedic type -- does a great job of depicting Steve Wozniak, the techie who built the first Apple motherboard, and a companion to the often anti-social Jobs.

Sadly, the film never rises above

the point of worshipping Steve Jobs.

The tone of the movie is hard to pin

down -- I thought I was watching a

parody for a good portion of the run

time. People respond to every word

Jobs utters with bated breath, just on the edge of applauding nothing. Even when the movie shows the darker side of the man, it's feels more obligatory than organic. "Knightriders" (Blu-ray) -- This 1981 low-budget treasure finally makes it to Blu-Ray. See, there's this radical roadshow going through small-town America -- a Renaissance Fair bloodsport on wheels. The film tells the oh-sowonderful story of men in medieval armor who ride around on dirtbikes and fight with swords and flails. Ed Harris turns in a swell performance as the gang's delusional leader -- his character takes the knight stuff a little too seriously, while all

of the other performers just want

Knightriders to achieve the same

commercial success as Monster

directed this little ditty and promptly

went back to making monster flicks.







Obama Loses His Cool

BarackObamaisthecoolestpresident we've had since John F. Kennedy, at least according to conventional standards for such things. Obama has always been a brand as much as a politician, one that has been perceived as sleek, smart and up to date.

Then along came Healthcare.gov. Its failure to launch is a signal event in the long political battle over Obamacare and perhaps an inflection point in the president's image. It's hard to maintain a sense of truly being on the cutting edge of change when you can't build a website.

Obama's cool was, in part, an artifact of world-class marketing. Graphic designer Michael Bierut writes in the book "Designing Obama" (yes, there's such a book) of how impressed he was watching Obama rallies in 2008: "The awe-inspiring part was the way all the

signs were faithfully, and beautifully, set in Hoefler & Frere-Jones's typeface Gotham." If only the folks at Health and Human Services were consumed with such attention to detail.

The Obama team's technological prowess reinforced the sense that it owned the future. Except it had no bearing on how the president would or could run the government. We've now learned that the president doesn't know how to make a government website work, or know to check to see if it's going to work. "Neither he and I are technology geeks," Vice President entrepreneurs who can take an idea Joe Biden explained the other day.

When selling the prospective glories of his website, President Obama compared it to Travelocity and Amazon, leaders in a private sector that is highly flexible and reactive and where failure means extinction. Government is nothing like that. It never has been and never will be. It is plodding and bureaucratic, beholden to political imperatives and often stuck in practices that make no sense.

A presidential campaign can hire whomever it wants without taking account of procurement rules or any other bureaucratic impediment. It is a private entity subject to the laws of competition. It exists more in the world of Travelocity than Healthcare.gov.


At the end of the day, the president has been a dazzling frontman for what is, in essence, the Department of Motor Vehicles. He has created a glittering image of hope and change that has little to do with a rumbling, ramshackle federal government that is still largely built along mid-20thcentury lines. Instead of imbuing government with his sense of cool, he has been left apologizing for a government failure that profoundly runs against the zeitgeist.

celebrate We the Internet and, with pluck and creativity, make it into a reality that we can't live without. It is one of the ironies of the Obama Era that the same kids whose lives are defined by a dizzying array of endlessly changing choices have voted for a president invested in protecting a government that embodies the opposite. It may be that after five years, they are beginning to get a clue. A new Quinnipiac poll shows young people disapproving of the president 54 percent to 36 percent.
