

Governor Aims for California Hunters Ban on Lead Ammo

is Bad Policy

California became the first state in the nation to create an all-out ban on the use of lead ammunition. In a move that spites the law enforcement community, hunting enthusiasts, and family businesses; Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill 711. This law will be effective "as soon as is practicable," but no later than July 1, 2019.

This law will severely restrict hunting for law-abiding Californians and; consequently will negatively impact small businesses that rely on sportsmen and sportswomen.

Northern California is home to some of the world's greatest outdoor activities. From hiking to fishing to hunting, our region provides the resources for the most traditional and wholesome outdoor activities celebrated in the United States. Hunting, in particular, has been a familyhonor tradition, an activity that is passed down through family outings. It is the premier activity to teach succeeding generations about firearm safety, habitat and species conservation, and the appreciation for food origins. Distressingly, this bill may effectively destroy time-honored family outdoor gatherings; and end a vital component of rural life in California.

It takes a strong degree of optimism – or maybe even gullibility – to believe that the lead ammunition ban is less than a direct attempt to end all hunting in California. AB 711 is another step by several small, but influential, special interest groups, whose desire is to eliminate hunting in California. These groups know a ban on traditional ammunition is a backhanded way to keep hunters from visiting California (and forcing California's hunters to look for other opportunities in other states) and as a way to implement more gun control in

Very few manufacturers make this type of ammunition as they require special waivers.

Furthermore, the Governor's own State Department of Finance estimates that, in view of the lack of availability of nonlead ammunition, AB 711 could result in a net loss of \$9 million to the Department of Fish and Wildlife. The Department of Finance analysis also noted that California would be put at risk



Carmichael History Talk: Tales of Two Cities

Carmichael's 1909 founder spread himself famously thin; pre-Depression bankruptcy was hastened by too many projects and too little cash. But few Sacramentans know just how widespread Daniel "Bud" Carmichael's interests were.

He dallied in DC politics; in millionaire days he possessed oil wells in Bakersfield, five or more hotels in San Francisco; real estate in Vallejo and - as recently rediscovered - huge acreages of Lodi farmland. From political influence to property, he lost it all. In 1936, he died penniless and shamed in a tiny San Francisco apartment that was part of a hotel he once owned.

Daniel's tale - and that of his Carmichael Colony -- are fascinating and illusive studies. On Saturday, November 2, I will share what I have learned in a history talk at the Carmichael Park Clubhouse.

The presentation of local stories and antique photographs begins at 1p.m. Our town's development from the old San Juan and Rancho del Paso land grants will be a central theme but this talk offers a new element: a review of Lodi history from Toni Christman. My fellow historian last year published "Our Time to Shine," an illustrated journey through her native Lodi's past.

Our research overlapped when we discovered my Daniel's footprints in her town. Emigrating from Georgia in his teens, the farm boy labored in the San Joaquin area before conquering Sacramento. His sister Ora married and settled to grow grapes in Lodi. Though Daniel had older half-brothers, Ora Moore was his only full sister and the siblings were close. When he made his Sacramento fortune, he visited Lodi like touring royalty. His descendants still recall Uncle Bud's chauffeured car; his gold watch and cane. They say his

Nationwide Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Sheriff's Department will partner with the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) for the seventh time and collect potentially dangerous, expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs for destruction on Saturday, October 26, 2013, from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. There will be four collection sites within the Sheriff's jurisdiction:

- Sheriff's Garfield Station 5510 Garfield Avenue Sacramento, CA 95841
- Sheriff's Florin Station 7000 65th Street Sacramento, CA 95823
- Rancho Cordova Police 2897 Kilgore Road Rancho Cordova, CA 95670

• Antelope High School 7801 Titan Dr Antelope, CA 95843

The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked.

Many Americans are not aware that medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are increasing at alarming rates, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from familv and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the

toilet or throwing them away both potential safety and health hazards.

Collection sites will accept any medicines in capsule and tablet form brought in for disposal. Intra-venous solutions. injectables, and needles will not be accepted. Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of this initiative.

Prescription drug abuse is a serious public health and safety issue. This take-back event is an opportunity for residents to help make their homes safer by disposing of their unused and unwanted prescription drugs. ★

Health Technology No Substitute for Compassion

The folks at Google are both smart and wise: Smart enough to invent Google Maps and wise enough to warn everyone who relies on this technology for driving directions that their maps are to be used "for planning purposes only." There is simply no telling what kind of traffic, detours, weather, or other unforeseen setbacks you might run into on your way to Grandma's.

Ideally those who rely on technology for diagnosing and treating disease are cautioned to exercise a similar wisdom. As good as we think we are at maintaining the body by way of scans, apps, and sophisticated computer programs, there remains a significant wild-card within the mind of the individual involved.

"There are many facets of the patient that tend not to shine through if the electronic medical record is all we have to go on." writes Richard Gunderman, M.D. in a recent column in The

Atlantic. "A robot can collect and process data, but good medicine requires more than information management. It takes effective communication, deep insight, and genuine compassion."

Taking the time to learn where a patient is coming from, what they're thinking, even saying a word or two to calm their fears, is not just good bedside manner. As Gunderman notes, it's good medicine.

Some years ago a man who severely cut his hand while using a table saw ran screaming into the emergency room of a local hospital. The attending doctor asked that he be given a dose of morphine to calm him down. When he continued screaming, he was given a second dose. And then another. And then another. Realizing that the drug was having absolutely no effect, the doctor put his hands on the man's shoulders, looked him straight in the eye and said, "You're going to be just fine." Very quickly the man relaxed and fell asleep.

"We have been seduced by our technologies," said Dr. Neal Slatkin, chief medical officer for Hospice of the Valley, in a recent article in the San Jose Mercury News, implying that the hi-tech approach is not always the best approach.

This is not to suggest that anyone who sees technology as important is devoid of compassion. There is danger, however, that the state of one's thought gets marginalized as we become more and more dependent on something that takes only

one aspect of the patient - some might even say the lesser aspect – into consideration.

"The tender word and Christian encouragement of an invalid," writes Mary Baker Eddy in her seminal work on health and healing, "pitiful patience with his fears and the removal of them, are better than hecatombs of gushing theories, stereotyped borrowed speeches, and the doling of arguments, which are but so many parodies on legitimate Christian Science, aflame with divine

Although written almost a century before the term "high tech" came into vogue, an analogy can be drawn between Eddy's "gushing theories" and Dr. Slatkin's "seductive technologies". In either case, a ready remedy can be found in the simple willingness to be compassionate, to love, and by doing so, to remove the fear that lies at the root of so much suffering.

"The secret of the care of the patient," said famed physician, Francis Peabody, at the close of a lecture he gave at Harvard Medical School in 1925, "is in caring for the patient."







Each season nature provides us with the nutrients that are bodies need naturally. When we think of fall we naturally think of foods that are warm and comforting.

The fall in Ayurveda terms is actually called Vata. The qualities for Vata are cold, dry, and rough. If you look outside your window you can see the qualities of fall in the dry and brittle leaves being blown around by the wind in the air. The weather tends to be dry and chilly. Consequently our bodies get dried out (this sensation we often feel in our throats and sinuses), our fingers and toes get colder more easily and we start feeling the lack of sunlight in our day. In order to stay balanced we seek warmth, moisture, and our foods get heavier and oilier. Think grounding or comfort foods.

"Fall-ing" out of health? If we are not careful, those comfort foods, and the drying effects of fall can take our bodies completely out of balance and set the body up for colds and flu's.

The Steps to be "Fall-bu-lous" Healthy:

1. Just like the leaves outside, the weather can create a feeling of being "scattered". Staying on a steady schedule (back to school organization anyone?) can combat the effects and keep

2. This month, eat end of summer fruits. They are loaded with fiber and clean out the intestinal tract. As we move into winter begin eating seasonal fruits. - 7. Reduce dry snacks like crackers, pretzels, and vinegar chips. If you pack a snack eat nuts or juicy fruits.
- 8. Reduce ice cold drinks.
- 9. Favor foods that are sweet (this does not mean sugar!), sour, and salty (this does not mean to begin salting your foods. Canned and packaged foods are naturally higher in salt content).
- 10. Minimize foods that are too spicy, bitter, or astringent. These foods are lighter and colder and will increase the dryness in our
- 11. Eat your biggest meal of the day during lunch whenever possible. This increases our digestion and maximizes the nutrients to our body.
- 12. For those areas where sunlight is already starting to be reduced, take a break outdoors. 10 to 15 minutes of sunshine three times a week can generally produce the body's requirement of vitamin D. Take a walk, eat your lunch or sit outside when you can, to get as much natural

us calmer and less stressed. Use sunlight as possible. If not, take a quality grade vitamin D.

> 13. Break a sweat is most effective earlier in the day. (I know for some moms and work schedules this is not always easily achieved-but it is possible). Building strength and endurance does not have to mean joining an expensive gym. Walking daily is beneficial for all ages. Just remember to stay warm. Get creative and move it!

Jesuit High School's Physics Class Scores 100% Passing Rate on Last Year's AP Exams

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The second time's the charm for Jesuit High School's physics teacher, Jessica Scheimer, and her students in Carmichael. Ms. Scheiner's physics class achieved a 100 percent passing rate on last year's AP exams, after achieving 96 percent the year prior.

Ms. Scheimer, a Knowles Science Teaching Fellow (KSTF), attributes the achievement to confidence, hard-work, and facing everyday challenges throughout the year. She was able to overcome time constraints by mentoring her students during after-school hours and on weekends. Her goal is to push students to learn physics at a deeper level and to inspire them to continue their studies in science.

Ms. Scheimer acknowledges that the challenge of the AP exam is not just for the students,



but for her as well. She believes her good rapport with her students and their trust in her contributed to the class being able to accomplish a perfect score. She also acknowledged KSTF for the confidence it has given her as well as the support of like-minded colleagues with whom she can collaborate and use as resources.

This year Ms. Scheimer hopes to achieve another perfect score, but believes the challenge will be much greater with the

transition to AP Physics I and II, rather than the current model of just one AP physics course.

At a time when many are expressing concern about the nation's efforts and achievements in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM), it may be worthwhile to examine teaching approaches that inspire. Ms. Scheimer is available to:







Beyond the general loss of revenues, AB 711 will cost additional money. According to the state Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW), this measure would impose a cost of \$1 million to write new regulations, develop a process to certify

purchase detection equipment, among other things.

This is a bad bill for local economies and for the state treasury. This bill is costly and it is so disappointing that the Governor signed it into law.

Hunting in the United States adds up to \$76 billion in positive economic impact. In California alone each year, 53,000 jobs are supported, \$452 million in state tax revenue is collected, \$473 million in federal tax revenue is collected and \$3.6 billion is

I have images of the seven-seater roadster in which he transported prospective buyers to clay colony roads. I've read a report of Daniel and Myrtie opening the first Carmichael school in 1917. I have pictures of his two beautiful Sacramento homes. These are all valuable additions to my pictorial archive -- but confound it - I have never seen Daniel photographed in the town he gave his name. I would gladly buy lunch for anyone who could produce that illusive snap.






