Happy Birthday Carmichael

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -Once a colony, now a proudly unincorporated community in Sacramento County, Carmichael will mark its 104th anniversary this Saturday.

A day-long festival in Carmichael Park will commemorate the 1909 launch of a real estate venture by town founder Daniel Carmichael. The Georgian-born entrepreneur purchased two large chunks of the old San Juan land grant and carved these into 10-acre blocks. The mini farms were offered to pioneers for around \$1000 each. Before this development, Charles and Mary Deterding farmed river bottomlands they called San Juan Meadows (now Ancil Hoffman Park) from 1906.

A few miles north, other families established ranches as early as 1860. The Coyle farmhouse stood where Mercy San Juan Medical Center is now established. Other trailblazers included the Deweys, the Kellys and the O'Donnels; now remembered by streets, parks and schools named after them. Otherwise -- before newcomers colonized the area -- only scattered dwellings punctuated vast spaces between Carmichael and Sacramento City.

Included in Founder's day attractions, a history display will offer residents a chance to examine old Carmichael photographs and to talk to an area historian.

For those who just want to have birthday fun, the anniversary promises much festivity. A pancake breakfast kicks off celebrations at 8:30 a.m. Opening ceremonies are at 10 a.m. and the Ma Barker Band begins a day-long program of American and British rock classics. Martial arts, hula and cheerleading demonstrations will provide more entertainment. Classic motor vehicles will form a car show on the Grant Avenue corner of Fair

Oaks Blvd.

Children's attractions will include carnival games, bounce houses, a Boy Scout camp-out and a visit from local firefighters. Sacramento River Cats mascot Dinger will make an appearance after 12 noon. Food and beverages will be available for purchase from food trucks.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -Archimedes the owl, Spirit the bald eagle, an elk named Tule and a lynx with the moniker of Mukluk will journey to Carmichael's Effie Yeaw

Nature Center on Sunday, October 6. Their sagas – along with those of bats, snakes, a raccoon called Radar and various raptors – are aimed to educate visitors during the Nature Center's annual Nature Fest event. Celebrity presenter is Gabe Kerschner, a regular guest of NBC's Tonight Show. Kerschner (59) runs Wild Things Inc. at a 35-acre animal sanctuary in Placer County. He and 60 species of rescued animals annually present hundreds of school programs geared to educate and entertain.

Kerschner's critters are an international cast. He has shown alligators, lemurs, a kangaroo named Steve (after Australian naturalist Steve Irwin) and Pook -- a white-headed Thai Gibbon

-- on national television. Nature Fest supporters will view a more regional ménage: "For this event, we'll show North American animals," says their protector. "An elk, a rattlesnake, a raccoon and a lynx. My bald eagle is Alaskan, so she's bigger than local ones. Spirit would have a wingspan of over 6.5 feet - if she had

both her wings." The magnificent bird demonstrates a common wilderness travesty. Explains Kerschner: "Since they've been protected, bald eagle numbers have rebounded. Some fishermen don't want competition. She was only a year old when she was shot. With one wing, Spirit could not have survived. She's gentle and awe-inspiring. When I show her, people get emotional. Children are amazed at her size. They love hearing how eagles dive and use talons to

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Nine-year-old Entrepreneur Nicolas Come, inventor of the, "Nicolas' Garden" Mobile App and digital platform, represented his company himself – without adult accompaniment - at SARTA's upcoming, "AgStart PitchFest Finals;" and was selected by the judges to be one of the final three companies to "pitch" in front of key agriculture and technology stakeholders/investors at SARTA's "AgStart Innovation Showcase," on October 16, 2013; as well as receive a scholarship to attend the U.C. Davis Childs Family Institute for Innovation and Entrepreneurship's Food, Ag, and Health Entrepreneurship Academy, on October 22 – 24,

Nicolas Come, the Sacramento-area third-grader, who just four months ago launched a company to encourage healthier eating among his generation (and took his "Farm-to-Fork" advocacy, all the way to the President of the United States), plans to again "pitch" by himself – without adult accompaniment -- against his final other two adult CEO competitors, at the October 16, 2013"Showhundreds. "Most people don't know that my 'Nicolas' Garden' App was always supposed to be 'Farm-to-Fork'," Nicolas reports. "With the team I recruited from Hacker Lab, we created the 'Fork' part. But now we need more funding and content partners for the 'Farm' part. If we win the 'Ag-Start Showcase,' competition, we can build the 'Farm' part of my company, and teach more kids where their food comes from, and why healthy food is better for them! I want my company and App to teach kids about growing their own gardens and farming, no matter where they live. I think a lot of kids are like I was: picky eaters. But once I started grow-

ing my own healthy food, I tried more of it, and liked it. I think 'Nicolas' Garden' can do that for other kids, too!"

self-proclaimed, "Picky Eater," Nicolas Come decided to develop an entirely new, digital business model to support healthier living and fight childhood obesity late last year. Knowing how much he enjoyed learning to grow his own food, and cooking the resulting, healthy ingredients with his family, he outlined and diagramed an idea for a mobile application and supporting technology that would be, "by kids; for kids" -- allowing them to share healthy recipes, cooking tips, and other healthy options, in an easy, fun, digital format.

Convinced and emboldened that his idea was important, Nicolas bravely pitched his idea (by himself, while standing on a chair) to over 100 technical experts during a Sacramento Hacker Lab "Hackathon" (a weekend coding competition). At the Hackathon, Nicolas recruited a team of designers, computer programmers, and content specialists; and ultimately developed the concept for Nicolas' digital platform and business, known as, "Nicolas"

Now "live," the Nicolas' Garden website and mobile App case" before an audience of allows children and families to share healthy, family- and kidfriendly recipes, create meal plans and shopping lists, learn easy and fun cooking tips, play health-related games, and link to other healthy programs and services. In the next generation of the App, kids will earn points and badges for interactivity, growing gardens, making healthy choices, and participation. A map of local healthy eating events, farms, and venues will be available to support farmers markets, restaurants, and other locations and activities promoting family-friendly, farmto-fork programs.

He has appeared on numerous media programs conducting cooking demonstrations of his favorite recipes. He has also been


interviewed by dozens of print publications; in fact, in the merely four months that the App has been, "live", Nicolas has generated over nine million, positive media impressions worldwide, including media in Japan, India, Malaysia, Latin America, the United Kingdom, and many more. Nicolas has even shared his message (and his tiny business card), with the President of the United States! The White House selected Nicolas' photo with the President as the, "White House Photo of the Day!"

Convinced that that Nicolas' Garden Mobile App should be a vital tool to support the "Farm-to-Fork" initiative, Nicolas recently presented a cooking demonstration before over 100 teachers at an "Ag in the Classroom" Conference, inspiring instructors to incorporate his App in their classroom curriculum. He was also twice a featured chef at the California State Fair. When some people think of video game fans, they imagine stereotypes of anti-social introverts playing for hours in a dark room. But the industry has evolved far beyond these popular culture-driven caricatures. Gamers are a community and some are using their virtual worlds to improve the real world by establishing a number of game-related charities that have helped millions all over the

The Humble Bundle is probably the most famous. Every week, it posts a selection of video games available for download, and people can pay as much or as little as they'd like to acquire them. The Humble Bundle usually identifies a number of charities, and the buyer can allocate his or her funds to go to whichever ones they wish. Pay more than the average, and additional games or content is unlocked, raising hundreds of thousands of dollars weekly.

In a similar niche, the UK-based GamesAid also occasionally sells games to raise money for smaller charities that help disadvantaged children. However, they have also expanded their fundraising by reaching out in the gaming community through industry events and by selling game-related memorabilia on eBay.

If you really love to play games for a long period of time, Extra Life sets out to turn those hours into money for the Children's Miracle Network Hospitals. Extra Life is almost like a digital jog-a-thon, asking you to earn money by having others pledge for you to play a game on the platform of your

Child's Play is an organization set up to help those who don't have games for them to play at all. Established in 2003, Child's Play works similarly to the Make A Wish Foundation. Hospitals provide wishlists to Child's Play

of the goods that their hospitalized kids want, and Child's Play seeks to fulfill as many requests as possible either through monetary donations or by letting people directly fulfill wish-list requests on Amazon. Though the majority of requests tend to be video games, it's also possible to find books, toys, or even nail polish on the lists. Whatever the children desire, Child's Play aims to deliver.

The gaming industry has garnered more than its fair share of criticism, accused of "desensitizing" people to violence or keeping them from physical activity. Yet, these examples of gamers motivated by charity shows that some good has sprung out of the interactive entertainment community. There are already numerous ways to participate in gaming's long-hidden charitable side, with more assuredly to come.

"Adults often cry. She's our national emblem; they're appalled to see what an American maliciously did to her."

The 2013 Nature Fest represents homecoming weekend for another wild ambassador. Kerschner's great horned owl was rescued six years ago at nearby American River College. "He broke a wing falling from a nest in the oaks on campus," says the naturalist. "We figured he must be an extra wise owl; he went to college. So we called him (after the mathematical 'wise one') Archimedes." Kerschner's talks

lines – often of bald-eagle/baldnaturalist genre - fly thick and fast. "I try to be entertaining," he says. "A laugh keeps interest going. You want people to experience a full range of emotions; it makes learning memorable."

Kerschner's critters are not the only educators at the 2013 Nature Fest. Resident Effie Yeaw raptors and reptiles will interact with visitors. The "Twilight" generation will be open-fanged by bat encounters. Spreading wings under the aegis of Sacramento "bat lady" Corky Quirk,

As a wellness Doctor, I am extremely concerned about the obesity epidemic and the plethora of health problems skyrocketing as a result, including diabetes, heart disease and high blood pressure. A major component of the obesity crisis is the availability of plentiful and cheap processed foods, often high in sugar, salt and unhealthy fats. We have evolved to seek out these flavors because they are present in calorie-dense foods. But, in modern Western society, the calories our ancestors had to struggle for are now overabundant.

The Newest Research

A brand-new study published in the journal Nature Neuroscience gives further credence to the idea that unhealthy food can indeed be addictive. Unhealthy foods may alter the brain's ability to tell us when we are full. When this brain "switch" is turned off, junk food ceases to satisfy, and an individual craves more of it – in other words, he or she becomes addicted.

Is Food Addiction Real?

Consider the definition and criteria for addiction. An addiction is a compulsion that often becomes destructive to personal health and social relationships. The term has long described abuse of drugs or alcohol. Today, science shows that the same brain activity associated with drug and alcohol addiction is also present

Could You be Addicted to Junk food?

problem gambling, as well as use of seemingly benign substances like food.

Several of the behaviors used to diagnose addiction are evident in cases of compulsive eating, including loss of control over use, repeated failure to change behavior and continued use despite negative consequences.

Brain Chemical Changes May Trigger Overeating

Several neurochemicals and hormones work in tandem to control our appetites. Imbalances of any of these may be possible causes of overeating and food addiction.

For instance, in an extensive study on addiction, patients' brains showed decreased dopamine receptors. Dopamine is a neurotransmitter that activates the brain's reward system, reinforcing behaviors that cause pleasure. A decline in dopamine receptors is implicated in heroin and cocaine addictions. According to scientists, a similar process occurs in food addiction.

Cortisol, best known as the "stress hormone", may also play a role in food addiction. The endocrine system reacts to high levels of cortisol be releasing natural opioids (chemicals that alleviate pain and cause euphoria) to reduce the effects of stress.

These opioids are also released in reaction to consumption of enjoyable food. Compulsive overeatingthereforemaymanifest as a reaction to emotional strain as the brain seeks pleasurable opioids to combat stress.

Addiction is Often Hardwired

Research shows that some peoples may have an ingrained tendency toward addiction. Many gastric surgery patients who defeat food addiction seem

in compulsive behaviors like to transfer to another addiction, such as compulsive shopping or

Which Foods Are Addictive?

The most notoriously addictive food ingredient is sugar. It triggers release of opioids and dopamine, the chemicals linked to addiction. Researchers observe that sugar withdrawal symptoms parallel those of withdrawal from morphine or nicotine. Carbohydrates, especially highly processed ones, also show great potential for addiction.

Tips for Beating Junk Food Addiction

If you feel that you are addicted to unhealthy foods, it is important to avoid situations and foods that could trigger a binge for you. This could mean taking a route home from work that avoids your favorite fast food outlet or unplugging the television if you find yourself tempted by commercials for junk foods. In cases where junk food addiction is out of control, therapy and nutritional counseling may be in order.

Finally, remember that it is extremely difficult to adhere to a diet that deprives you of all pleasurable foods. Eat sensibly andenjoyhealthy, satisfying foods that do not trigger overeating. The Progressive Crusade **Against Tax Cuts**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

There's an ongoing effort by President Obama and fellow "progressives" not only to continue to blame George W. Bush for every economic woe facing America — even as every economic indicator is far worse under Obama — but to permanently discredit the value of tax cuts. Tax cuts are an unmitigated evil that progressive crusaders must forever exorcise.

For President Obama and his allies, this is a project they're taking back to the Reagan years, starting with an assault on President Reagan's enormously successful 1981 tax cuts. Their campaign, however, can't end with Reagan. They need to venture way back to Andrew Mellon in the 1920s.

Mellon was Treasury secretary throughout the Republican administrations that followed Woodrow Wilson's exit from the White House in 1921. He was a superb Treasury secretary, with few peers before or since.

Unemployment under Wilson's "progressive" presidency had hit almost 12 percent. In 1921, the newly inaugurated president was Republican Warren Harding. As Harding's Treasury secretary, Mellon argued against spending increases as "stimulus" for economic growth and, instead, pushed for tax rate cuts. It was a Reagan-like move, with Reagan-like results. By 1923, unemployment dropped to under 3 percent, where it (roughly) remained throughout the 1920s under Harding and his Republican successor, Calvin Coolidge.

The economy did not begin its crash and sustained slide until the presidencies of Herbert Hoover, a Republican, and FDR,

a Democrat. Both Hoover and FDR jacked tax rates through the roof. The federal tax rate on income reached a breathtaking 94 percent under FDR. As historian Burt Folsom shows, FDR actually considered raising the upper rate to 99.5 percent on income above \$100,000. (Yes, you read that right.)

FDR, for the record, despised Andrew Mellon. He subjected Mellon to an intense, intrusive investigation of his income-tax returns, pursuing him to his deathbed. FDR had a vendetta against Mellon's entire philosophy on taxation. It became personal as well as political.

Here's a Mellon insight that FDR no doubt detested: "It seems difficult for some to understand that high rates of taxation do not necessarily mean large revenue to the government, and that more revenue may often be obtained by lower rates."

FDR certainly didn't understand, though his Treasury secretary, Henry Morgenthau, eventually came to that conclusion. "We have tried spending money," said Morgenthau. "We are spending more than we have ever spent before and it does not work. ... I say after eight years of this administration we have just as much unemployment as when we started. ... And an enormous

Morgenthau figured out what Andrew Mellon already knew. Said Mellon: "The problem of government is to fix rates which will bring in a maximum amount of revenue to the Treasury and at the same time bear not too heavily on the taxpayer or on business enterprises.'

And so, during the Harding and Coolidge administrations, Mellon succeeded in promoting tax-rate cuts rates across the board, with upper-income rates

reduced from 73 to 24 percent. The cuts were very similar to Reagan's in the 1980s. And like under Reagan — and contrary to liberal mythology — total tax revenue to the Treasury actually increased.

Under Reagan, federal revenue rose from \$599 billion to almost \$1 trillion. Under Mellon's stewardship in the 1920s, revenue went from \$700 million to above \$1 billion. And unlike under Reagan, Mellon's policies eliminated the budget deficit. (Coolidge was able and willing to cut spending where Reagan did not.)

For President Obama and his fellow liberals, these are inconvenient, unwelcome facts. They believe they need higher taxes to feed and sustain their government class. Democrats are banking on that government class — which they want to expand and unionize — to keep them in power not another four years but another 40

Tax cuts are anathema to our president and progressives. And so is the wisdom of Andrew Mellon.

Recent cases of interest

CASE: Ravinesh Singh & Tony Van (09/20/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sheri Greco, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Ravinesh Singh was convicted by jury for the first degree murder of 22-year-old Joseph Montoya and found true that he personally discharged a firearm causing Montoya's death. The jury convicted Tony Van of being an accessory to the murder.

On October 13, 2008, Singh approached Montoya in front of a residence in South Sacramento and shot him in the face. He then fired three more shots into his body after Montoya fell to the ground. After the murder was committed, Van drove Singh away from the scene.

Singh faces 50 years to life in prison. Van will be sentenced to credit time served. Sentencing for Singh is set for November 15, 2013 at 10:30 a.m. in Department 12 before the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard.

CASE: Winzer Deandre Hayden (09/20/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney William Satchell, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that 29-year-old Winzer Deandre Hayden was convicted by jury of first degree murder. The jury also found true that he personally used a firearm causing death.

On July 10, 2012, 18-year-old Wesley Wheeler and his two friends got into an argument and physical altercation with Hayden's cousin. Moments after the altercation, Hayden pulled out a handgun and shot at Wheeler several times, striking him in the buttocks and back. Wheeler died at the scene.

Hayden faces a sentence of 50 years to life in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for October 17, 2013 in Department 19 of the Sacramento Superior Court.

CASE: Duewa Lee (09/19/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Nancy Cochrane, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Cheryl Meegan sentenced Duewa Lee to 16 years and 4 months to life in prison. On July 19, 2013, a jury convicted Lee of torture, two counts of mayhem, and six counts of beating a child with assorted allegations of use of deadly weapons and the infliction of great bodily injury. The jury also convicted Lee of two additional felony counts of child abuse.

The 12-year-old victim was left in the care and custody of Lee who systematically tortured and abused the child over a three month time period. Lee beat her with electrical cords, put a hot iron on her back, stapled her ear, heated a metal spatula and placed it on the child's buttocks, threw the child down stairs, stomped the child's chest and abdomen and didn't allow her to eat. The child suffered life threatening injuries and has some permanent

With an extraordinary amount of courage, she was able to disclose the abuse to a stranger at the Department of Motor Vehicles when Lee stepped outside. It took an extraordinary amount of courage for that citizen to take action and help the victim.

Deputy District Attorney Nancy Cochrane states, "I'd like to thank the Sacramento Sheriff's Department, especially Detective Tony Saika, for all of their hard work and commitment to this case and District Attorney Victim Advocate Mailyn Chuong for her assistance throughout this case.'

CASE: Justice Gaddis (09/16/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Noah Phillips, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that Justice Gaddis was convicted by jury of multiple charges, including assault with a deadly weapon and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true allegations of gun use and that Gaddis committed the crimes for the benefit of a criminal street gang.

The assaults stemmed from a dispute between Gaddis and the victim. Gaddis pistol whipped the victim during

Sentencing is set for October 11, 2013 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Russell Hom.

CASE: Elijah Goethe (09/13/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Thomas Asker, Targeting Armed Recidivist Gangsters **Enforcement Team (TARGET)**

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Patrick Marlette sentenced Elijah Goethe to 94 years to life in prison. On June 13, 2013, a jury convicted Goethe of first degree murder, attempted murder, shooting into an occupied motor vehicle, and gang and gun allegations relating to the shooting death of Joseph

On October 12, 2008, Joseph Washington was shot and killed in the Golf Course Terrace neighborhood southeast of the Sacramento Executive Airport. His friend, D'Andre Lawrence, was shot in the face but survived

The murder was motivated by another shooting that took place a few hours earlier at 65th Street and 4th Avenue, in which two members of Goethe's gang were seriously injured. Evidence presented at trial suggested that Goethe and his co-conspirators erroneously believed the perpetrators of the first shooting were members of a south Sacramento gang. In retaliation, Goethe and his unidentified accomplice mistakenly targeted the victims' car. The victims had no involvement in any of the previous shootings, no criminal history, and no gang ties.







Criminal Tax Evasion Bill Headed to Governor's Desk

Legislation Could Help Recoup Part of the Approximately \$9 Billion in Tax Evasion Annually

A bill that will codify a partnership made up of the California State Board of Equalization (BOE), Franchise Tax Board (FTB), Employment Development Department (EDD), and Department of Justice (DOJ) is headed to the Governor's desk. Legislation unanimously supported by the BOE (Assembly Bill 576, V. Manuel Pérez) would strategiexisting resources from the partners' respective departments.

"The underground economy costs California billions of dollars every year and makes it even more difficult for legitimate businesses to operate in our state," said Board of Equalization Member George Runner. "This strategic bi-partisan effort will better coordinate state efforts to combat criminals who by avoiding their tax obligations on the rest of California."

Criminal tax evasion in California's underground economy deprives the state of approximately \$9 billion annually through a spectrum of illegal activities such as selling counterfeit goods like "knock off" designer items, exploiting victims of human trafficking, and smuggling tobacco products and other goods into California without paying the required taxes. A report issued

SACRAMENTO, **CA** (**MPG**) - employment tax evasion using effectively impose a tax increase by the UCLA Labor Center this year pegs this loss at 11 percent of the total tax revenues owed to the state.

> AB 576 creates the Revenue Recovery and Collaborative Enforcement (RRACE) Team to formalize data sharing and communication among the BOE, FTB, EDD, and DOJ. The legislation enables these agencies to strategically collaborate and criminally prosecute those who evade state sales, use, excise,

income, and employment taxes, with no added cost to state taxpayers. The team's efforts will benefit Californians through its likely recovery of tax dollars which are vital to providing state services, such as public schools, highways, public safety, and health care programs.

The five-member California State Board of Equalization (BOE) is a publicly elected tax board. The BOE collects more than \$53.7 billion annually in

taxes and fees supporting state and local government services. It hears business tax appeals, acts as the appellate body for franchise and personal income tax appeals, and serves a significant role in the assessment and administration of property taxes.
