SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The 2013 season of Best of Broadway (running three September weekends at Fair Oaks Village amphitheater) will mark a special anniversary. Forty years ago, singer/teacher David MacDonald had a Mickey Rooney moment. "I said to some friends: hey, let's do a show and raise money for needy kids," he recalls. "Through the years, we've had our ups and downs (losing \$33,000 worth of sound equipment to theft this year was a stellar downer) but we've always managed to pull through. When I

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Every year in Sacramento County hundreds of students are expelled from school because of involvement in on-campus violence. In order for these students to be readmitted to their schools, especially in cases reaching the court system, they must successfully complete a sanctioned violence prevention program. Project SAVE (Safe Alternatives and Violence Education) is one such program.

The mission of Project SAVE, operated by the Sacramento County Office of Education (SCOE), is to reduce youth violence and weapons possession through strong partnerships with local agencies. The mission emphasizes that weapons possession and violent behavior are unacceptable, especially on school grounds. Since 1998, Project SAVE has served more than 2,500 young people in Sacramento County. Nine out of ten participants remain violencefree after participating in the program.

# Labor Day Travel Surge

**Over 3.9 Million Californians to Travel, Biggest Increase This Year** 



The latest travel forecast predicts that more than 3.9 million Californians will travel 50 miles or more from their homes this upcoming three-day Labor Day weekend.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The upcomingthree-day Labor Day holiday is predicted to reflect a significant increase from last year's holiday, according to AAA Northern California's most recent travel survey

The latest travel forecast predicts that more than 3.9 million Californians will travel 50 miles or more from their homes this upcoming threeday Labor Day weekend. This represents an overall increase of 6 percent compared to last year.

"This resurgence of travel is partly due to improved consumer confidence, which is at a much higher level than 2012," said AAA Northern California spokesperson Cynthia Harris. "Although there are lingering budgetary concerns, Californians will not let this last opportunity to celebrate summer go back without a quick holiday getaway.'

This year Labor Day trips by automobile will be the preferred mode of transportation with more than 3.1 million Californians driving to reach their destinations. This represents a 6.2 percent increase compared to 2012. More than 514,000 Californians are planning to travel by air, an increase of 4.4 percent compared to last year. Approximately 300,000 state residents are expected to travel by other modes of transportation, such as rail, bus and watercraft. This represents an increase of 6.1 percent over 2012.

Nationally, just over 34 million people will travel 50 miles or more during the Labor Day weekend, representing a 4.2 percent increase compared to 2012.

AAA's survey shows that visiting family and friends, dining, shopping, and visiting beach/waterfront areas will be the preferred leisure activities for West Coast families. Other favorite activities over the weekend are expected to be biking, hiking and sightseeing.

The San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge will be closed in both directions Labor Day Weekend in order to take the original East Span out of service and to open the new East Span to traffic. The closure will begin Wednesday, August 28th at 8:00 p.m. and the new East Span is scheduled to open on Tuesday, September 3rd at 5:00 a.m.

#### Tips for Stress-Free **Road Travel**

Ahead. Carefully •Plan consider your route to determine departure and arrival times,

taking into account the expected higher level of congestion on the roads.

•Take Transit, Telecommute, or Carpool. If possible, avoid driving between the East Bay and San Francisco during the closure. Instead, take public transit or try telecommuting. Several transit operators will provide enhanced or augmented services during the closure.

•Form a Carpool. Take advantage of HOV lanes (High Occupancy Vehicle lanes).

• Use Detour Routes. For those who must drive, use alternate bridges as detour routes for transbay travel.

•Get Current Traffic Conditions. Stay up-to-date on current traffic conditions and driving times by visiting the 511 Traffic page or call 511 and say either "traffic conditions" or "driving times" from the Main Menu. During the closure, 511 will automatically exclude the Bay Bridge and instead provide driving times for the fastest alternative routes.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - So much for nasty politics. In bipartisan accord, mayoral candidates Virginia Stone and Annie Marszal last week sat down to English tea and cucumber sandwiches.

Though both women covet the Honorary Mayor's chain, such meetings reflect the friendly nature of campaigning in unincorporated Carmichael. Indeed, the rivals found plenty in common for chit-chat: Annie's grandmother lives at Carmichael Oaks senior residence, where Virginia works; Virginia often stops for gas at Carmichael Chevron, whose business Annie represents.

The annual mayoral race is a fundraiser for the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce. The mayor has no political power but is a figurehead at civic events and active in Chamber interests. Current Honorary Mayor is SMUD executive Esteban Nava.

Wannabes can still enter the

race. Candidates must be Chamber members and should live or work in Carmichael. The 2013-14 winner – to be announced in November – will be decided by his or her fundraising efforts for the benefit of Chamber and community.





first Labor Day The celebration was observed in New York City in 1882. It was not intended to be the official end of summer. It was a movement to honor "the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country." A bit more than a decade later, Labor Day became a national holiday.

Not many years later, it became evident that the American worker was such an exceptional and efficient creature, work hours would soon be reduced to mere shadows of their former oppression. For example, economist John Mayhard Keynes, in the teeth of the Great Depression, predicted that technological advancements would soon lead to a 15-hour work week.

In the mid-1960s, congressional leaders boldly predicted a two-day work week by the year 2000. That prediction has apparently only rung true for congressional leaders, as the average time workers spend on the job has ballooned over the years to nearly 50 hours per week.

Meanwhile, it is well known that our peers in Europe and other "developed" countries, enjoy bountiful quantities of leisure time (on average, putting in 400 fewer annual

work hours than Americans). while enjoying equal levels of productivity. Working more hours simply hasn't translated to greater production or higher levels of satisfaction, and the predictions of "less work, more rest" is a farce for today's laborers.

And while we mostly recognize the need to protect our health by eating right, staying hydrated, exercising, and the like, Americans are notorious for ignoring the body's need for intentional times of rest. More so, we ignore our mental, emotional, and spiritual need for rest.

In the book of Genesis, the ancient writer says that on the final day of the first week, God rested. Was God tired? No, God set an example by abstaining from his creative work, and pausing to enjoy it.

The word for rest, used in those Genesis accounts, can be translated "to soulify" or "to enhance one's soul." More practically it means "to catch one's breath" or to "renew the spirit." So when we pause to catch our breath, to renew our spirit, or recharge our souls, it is an imitation of God - it is worship.

Lettie Cowman, a devotional writer from a century ago, illustrates this so well with one of her stories from Africa. She wrote about an Englishman who was exploring the deepest jungles of the continent, traveling like British royalty. He had brought with him fine wines, his favorite foods, tons of books and parchments, furniture, and clothing.

He had so much that he had to hire an army of strong men from

the local villages to portage all this material through the jungle. On the first day of his grand safari, he pushed the laborers at an exhausting, God-forsaken pace. He wanted to cover as much distance as possible, and he did exactly that.

As he lounged in his tent that evening, he concluded that if such a pace could be kept, why, he would see most of the continent, and his journey would be a quick one. But on the second morning, the hired Africans refused to move. They just sat there, and no amount of pleading, cursing, or bribery could make them move.

Finally, one of the young men explained that they were not especially tired. Rather, they had gone too far and too fast on the first day, and they had to "wait for their souls to catch up with their bodies."

Cowman concluded her story with these words of reflection (and I remind you, her words are a century old): "This whirling, rushing life which so many of us live does for us what that first march did for those poor tribesmen. But here is the difference: They knew what they needed to restore life's balance; too often we do not."

So on this weekend that marks the official end of summer, don't simply grill your burgers or down a few beers. Do less. Sit still. Take a nap. It will be an act of worship.



#### **Bankruptcy** Just For Her?

#### Dear Dave,

My husband and I would like to buy a home in the next year or so. My credit is in pretty bad shape, so we've decided to work on getting his credit in better shape in order to qualify for a mortgage loan. I have \$104,000 in debt, and \$92,000 of that is in student loans. He has \$13,000 in debt, with \$7,000 of that a repossession on a car for which he was a co-signer. Can I file bankruptcy on my debts only? – Latrell

#### Dear Latrell,

You can't file bankruptcy on certain, specific items. By the way, student loans are not bankruptable. Even if you filed, you would still have all that debt hanging around your neck.

I want you to own a home, but I don't want your home to own you. Neither one of you have done very well with money so far, and at this point I'm afraid a house would be a curse instead of a blessing in your lives. I would encourage you to build a stronger financial foundation before you buy a house. In short, this means you need to get out of debt, save money, and start living on a budget.

Latrell, buying a house when you're broke and deeply in debt is never a good idea. I'm not trying to be mean, but I really think you're asking the wrong question. I don't want you



to try and use bankruptcy as some kind of escape from this situation. Right now, I want you to change your behavior with money and get things cleaned up with a good, organized financial plan in your lives. - Dave

#### Dear Anonymous,

Yes, it should. Your life changes every month, and your budget should reflect the ebb and flow of your life.

Now, some things will stay the same. Your house payment or rent should fall into this category. If you have a car payment, which I hope you don't, that would be the same too. There shouldn't be a big difference in the amount you spend on food most months though. You might spend more in this category during November and December thanks to the holidays, but overall it should remain pretty steady.

The biggest fluctuation you may see is in your utilities. I heat my house with natural gas, so the bill is much higher during the winter months. It's just the opposite during the summer. We burn electricity to run the air

conditioner, so the electric bill is higher in summer.

This is part of the reason I urge people to do a budget on paper, on purpose before the next month begins. You may look at the upcoming month and realize the kids have soccer pictures scheduled. There may be a school trip planned, or they may need back-to-school clothes and supplies.

When it comes to a budget, there's no easy out. Things change from month to month, and you need to think, plan ahead, and itemize so your budget is an accurate reflection of your life! - Dave





# GMY Phone Scam Dials in on Older Adults

#### BBB warns to never give out bank account numbers to callers

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Better Business Bureau Serving Northeast California warns older adults to hang up on phone calls claiming to be from a company calling itself GMY after an Elk Grove woman received several phone calls from the company requesting bank account information.

The Elk Grove woman grew suspicious of phone calls her elderly mother was receiving as early as 6 a.m. when she intervened in the communication.

"When I got on the phone, they tried to convince me my mother would be receiving a card to pay for her medical care," said the woman. "They went on to ask for her bank account numbers. I wouldn't give them any information when they refused to tell me their phone number or company name."

The woman eventually spoke to someone identified as a supervisor who told her the company name was GMY. Consumers from across the country have reported similar scams in which the same company name is utilized. In other calls, the company may claim to be working with Medicare to issue new cards.

"It doesn't matter who claims to be on the phone; do not give unsolicited callers your bank account or social security numbers," said Gary Almond, president of BBB Serving Northeast California. "Always

make sure you are speaking with a trustworthy person and business before taking the conversation any further."

To avoid this and similar scams, BBB offers the following tips:

Do not give personal information to unsolicited callers.

The government does not call, text or email. Also, the government should already possess the necessary information and should not ask for your social security number or address.

Do not accept free medical services or equipment in exchange for your Medicare number.







# Martin Luther King's Dream and the Declaration of Independence

August 28 marks the 50th anniversary of the 1963 March on Washington. Martin Luther King Jr.'s speech at that great rally is rightly honored as one of the greatest speeches in American history. All Americans recognize the soaring rhetoric of the final portion of the speech, where King speaks of a dream of an America without legal discrimination or racial prejudice. But the first part of that speech, wherein King speaks of the Declaration of Independence and Constitution, is not as well-known but deserves to be. That portion demonstrates King's commitment to the conception of justice held at the American founding.

In the third paragraph of King's text, he says that "when the architects of our Great Republic wrote the magnificent words of the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, they were signing a promissory note to which every American was to fall heir." With this reference to the declaration, there is a clear echo of that other great American speech from 100

years before King's March on Washington speech: Lincoln's Gettysburg address, which speaks of America as "dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal."

A "promissory note" is not one of those terms we use frequently, but it's a powerful term. It's not a hope or a wish. In fact, there was an international agreement in 1930 which defined a promissory note as implying an unconditional promise. For King, the Declaration of Independence, which he quoted directly from, was a promissory note that the United States would ultimately guarantee for all people "the unalienable rights of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." As King then said, "It is obvious that America has defaulted on this promissory note." King was not calling for the destruction of the American political order, but rather for us to be true to the ideals of the founding, and that's why it is important that he quoted the Declaration.

It is more than reasonable to assume that King could have been so disheartened by the treatment of blacks in the United States that he would have rejected the proposition that the United States had the capacity to correct past wrongs and ultimately be true to the Declaration's claim about the equality of rights for all people. Instead, he said that "we refuse to believe that the bank of justice is bankrupt." It is interesting to contrast this with someone like Howard Zinn, author of "The People's History of the United States," a widely assigned textbook that portrays oppression as central and unending in American history, who seemed to believe that America had no capacity for respect for rights

and could never improve. King added that "we refuse to believe that there are insufficient funds in the great vaults of opportunity in this nation." For nearly all individuals, it doesn't take more than one or two unfulfilled promises made by another to result in giving up on the possibility of working with that person or group. Despite the unfulfilled promise of the protection of rights and the protection of freedom, King hadn't given up on America.

Finally, at the end of King's speech is a beautiful sequence where he presents images of a truly post-racial society— and there again is one more reference to the Declaration of Independence. As he begins this "dream" section, he says: "I still have a dream. It is deeply rooted in the American dream. I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up, live out the true meaning of its creed: We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal."

King's hopes were rooted in that powerful second paragraph of the Declaration of Independence that claims that no man by nature is ruler or the servant of another. It's not just a great statement during a social struggle, it's a great statement about what it means to be an American.


