Windows of Faith

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)-As Rome was not built in a day, Carmichael Presbyterians can't gripe that finishing touches to their 1951 Sanctuary were only recently installed. Sixty-plus years, said congregant Jimmi Mishler "was worth the wait."

Representing auspicious events in the life of Jesus, eight new stained glass windows illuminate the church chancel. These were part of 1951 designs commissioned from Bill Cummings' San Francisco studio. When the parishioners

erected their sanctuary to accommodate Carmichael's growing post-war population, the windows were left out. According to Mishler – dubbed "squeaky wheel" by church building committee members – subsequent generations simply forgot the intended feature. Only during her research into the Sanctuary's existing windows did the penny drop. The manufacturers asked: "Were those eight chancel windows ever installed?"

Confessed Mishler: "I know nothing about them."

Completing the church design for the glory of God then became her mission. It was not just a

matter of knocking eight holes in the lofty chancel walls. To frame new windows, fresh adobe must replicate bricks of yore. Lead-light iconography must be designed. Inevitably, fundraising must occur.

"We were fortunate that people in our congregation stepped forward," said Mishler. "Some windows memorialize their beloved family members."

In 1946, teenage Presbyterians made adobe bricks for the church's original chapel. Their descendants repeated history. In one muddy weekend, young congregants last year used 67-year-old templates to produce nearly 200 bricks for the chancel project.

The original window designer was no longer available. Artist Geraldine Ensminger of the McKeever Studio in Vallejo was chosen to produce panels compatible with existing illuminations. She interpreted Biblical symbolism - and Bill Cummings' old sketches to depict the Annunciation, the Nativity, the Epiphany, the Baptism, the Transfiguration, the Crucifixion, the Resurrection and the Ascension.

Employers Catch a Break, But What About the People?

After months of assuring the public that everything was right on track, the Obama administration turned 180 degrees this month and announced that it was suspending implementation of the "employer mandate" provision of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) for a year. They should not stop there. The troublesome "individual mandate" should be suspended as well and the whole rushed plan should be replaced with reforms that can give Californians better healthcare at a more affordable price.

First, the business mandate. Under the ACA, businesses with 50 or more full-time equivalent employees have to offer "affordable" health insurance to their employees or face a \$2,000 fine for each employee (excluding the first 30).

Employers have been

screaming for months about the complex, confusing and costly implementation of the ill-conceived law. With the little information they did have, they ran the numbers and started cutting hours or laying off employees to avoid triggering ACA penalties. Early results pointed to a disaster for business and for low-income California

delaying the employer mandate and hope he delays it again forever – then moves on to the individual mandate.

Under the individual mandate, people will face a minimum penalty of \$695 by 2016 if they do not purchase one of the costly plans required by the President's

And for Californians, it will be costly. Healthcare analyst Avik Roy writes in *Forbes* magazine that health insurance premiums in California will increase between 64%-146% under the ACA even though cost control was a central promise of the plan. Worse, the Administration announced last week that they will not verify incomes for the massive subsidies provided to help offset these costs, laying the groundwork for a vast, expensive entitlement program with no accountability.

Like businesses, individual Californians deserve at least a

I applaud the President for one-year break from the overpriced and coercive plan, but if we could get out from under it forever we could make changes right here in our state that would get more people better and cheaper care without signing over 15-percent of our economy to the government.

We could start by eliminating any "standard benefit package" requirements and letting people buy customized plans that cover exactly what they need and nothing more; giving them the ability to purchase inexpensive plans from other states; and demanding transparency in hospital pricing.

These pro-consumer moves would lead to far greater competition and ultimately to lower costs and better service for everyone.

We should also free up everyone involved in healthcare delivery and payment – insurers, individuals, medical device makers, hospitals, pharmaceutical

companies - from unnecessary regulations, so they can innovate and deliver new, improved services at a better value for consumers. It is greater productivity-not price controls-that will ultimately rein in healthcare

If it's a good idea to suspend the business mandate for a year, it's a good idea to suspend the individual mandate for a year. People are just as confused and just as shell-shocked about the astronomical price increases as businesses are. In fact, it's a good idea to suspend it indefinitely until California gets the leadership in place that will try the many other reforms that can achieve the ACA goals of more and better care for less money.

Governor's Signing of Enterprise **Zone Killing Bills**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) Association Californians to Improve Enterprise, Employment and the Economy, (CIEEE) a coalition of workers, business owners and California residents concerned about attacks on Enterprise Zones, issued the following statement on July 11th regarding the signing of AB 93 and SD 90 legislation disguised as reform that effectively eliminates local government's only remaining tool to drive job creation and economic growth.

"Governor Brown is making a grave mistake today by signing AB 93 and SB 90," said Craig Johnson, who also serves as President of the California

Zones. "California's landmark Enterprise Zone program was created to generate economic development in some of the state's most economically distressed areas by helping minority and underserved communities spur private investment, retain employees and create jobs. Signing these bills eliminates program and greatly affects millions of Californians who live in these regions as well as minorities, veterans, displaced workers, recipients government assistance and others in need of jobs.

"And while the Governor claims the bills will help create

of Enterprise jobs and grow California's economy, analyses of current voucher data shows that less than 1 percent of the current vouchers would qualify under the new plan, which spells disaster for millions of hard working Californians.

"However, we are hopeful that the Governor and the Legislature can work together to develop legislation that will restore Enterprise Zones and ensure continued support for California businesses willing to invest in economically depressed areas, hire local residents, and help underserved communities."



Longhorn Spirit Still Kickin'

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - When La Sierra High School opened its doors in 1955, "Rock Around the Clock" made its debut, the Salk polio vaccine was approved by the FDA, and Disneyland opened to the public.

La Sierra was the third high school to open in the San Juan District area, the first two being San Juan and El Camino. Because SJ and EC already had football fields, it was determined that LS didn't require one, and that its "home" games would be held at EC.

LS had a western theme, and the mascot choices were pink/gray Lancers or blue/ white Longhorns, with the latter winning. Its newspaper was "The Branding Iron."

Stan LeProtti, PE director and football coach, received permission from the University of Texas to use its longhorn logo. Interestingly, UT football team captains had the final vote on the high school's nominated homecoming queens, based on photographs and essays.

Isabel (Ybarra) Devine (Class of 1974) won Homecoming Queen one year. "We were told to write an essay on 'children of today and education.' I thought it was wild at the time, being sent to UT, but ultimately realized it was very fair, because there would be no favoritism."

remembers rallies, "Roundup Days," and dances. "They were packed. Mr. Johnson (principal) would be at the dances with a ruler, because you had to be 12" from your partner."

The teaching staff was passionate about its students. Drama teacher Mr. Keeney built a stage in his class from personal funds. In the early 1970s, biology teacher Earl J. Koobs successfully battled the establishment with his "Save the Soil" campaign to preserve a narrow strip of land between The boys' physical fitness LS and Garfield Elementary

Famous LS graduates included meteorologist Kristine Hanson, and famed guitarist Craig Chaquico, founding member/leading guitarist of Jefferson Starship.

With declining attendance, SJUSD decided to close LS in 1983. The remaining classes were transferred to Mira Loma, El Camino, or Del Campo.

"In the last days of the '82-'83 school year," recalls Steve Angelo (Class of 1985), "there was a strong feeling of unity between the students and staff. It was strange the first part of my junior year at Mira Loma. There seemed to be a sense of segregation, almost like we didn't belong. On the first school pride day there were a lot of La Sierra shirts or jackets worn. It didn't go over well, but we were still a little angry and we missed our school. Mira Loma was a good school and I have some good memories from there as well, but it just wasn't La Sierra."

Although high density, low income housing was originally planned for the 40 acres, Carmichael Park and Recreation District ultimately obtained the entire facility. The campus segued into the La Sierra Community Center in 1985-home to the Sacramento Fine Arts Center, Chautauqua Playhouse, two schools for the emotionally challenged, and a skate park.

Seven years ago, Dan Habacker (Class of 1978) created the Longhorn Classic Golf Tournament which is held every year at Haggin Oaks. All classes, coaches and

teachers play in the tourney, and in the Longhorn spirit, all net proceeds are donated to Junior Achievement of Sacramento.

Asaro is now in Community Relations for the Rivercats and in his office is a plaque listing all LS students who earned a navy blue, except one. Sheryl Swainthe only girl to earn the coveted

color – received it the year the school closed, missing out on the celebration and rally. She almost missed earning the color as well.

"On the last day La Sierra was open," said Asaro, "she had one test still to run – the mile. She had failed her previous attempt. Doug Rennie told her, 'You be here at such-and-such time. I've got some running shoes for you and I'm going to pace you. You're going to do this.' She

Last year, Asaro located her in Utah. He then contacted the other navy blues, and brought them all to Raley Field for a pre-Rivercats game event, where Swain was finally presented with her navy blue plaque in front of 10,000 patrons.

made it by twenty seconds."

"These navy blues were obviously older," recalls Asaro, "but they were all fit and still active."

The Longhorn spirit is still kickin' with the August 3rd Longhorn Classic and an All-Class Reunion at Haggin Oaks, so round up the herd! To play the Longhorn Classic,

For the 1960 Winter Olympics, LS Longhorns ran the torch from outside of Sacramento all the way to Squaw Valley. In January 1962, Look mag-

with a sock hop in the evening. And, then, there was the "streaking" fad (taking clothes off and running naked across an open area). A handful of LS boys decided to streak all-girl Loretto High School during its assembly. On stage, a nun fanned her habit out on either side in an unsuccessful effort to cover the naked boy streaking behind her.

40th Annual Eppie's Great Race Honors Former Winner

SACRAMENTO REGION to "Run for Rach" in memory of (MPG) - On Saturday, July 20, the "world's oldest triathlon" – Eppie's Great Race – will celebrate its 40th annual event on the American River Parkway. Over 10,000 participants will arrive from throughout Northern California, where they will run, bike, and paddle their way through the course (a total of nearly 25 miles).

This year, the Junior Iron Person Division of the race has been re-named in honor of Rachel Anne Gray, a former winner in that division. On Sept. 2, 2012, Rachel passed away after a tragic car crash. Her father, Fair Oaks Water District General Manager Tom Gray, will compete in the race this year, along with his wife Bridget and several friends of Rachel's.

Born Nov. 7, 1990, Rachel was only 21 at the time of the accident. An avid runner, she completed many distance races including her first ultra-marathon just months before her passing. Two years ago, she received a degree in International Business from CSU-Sacramento, three years after graduating from Bella Vista High School.

This year's Great Race participants are being challenged

Rachel Gray. When you feel like slowing down or stopping, think of Rachel and push through to the end – just like she would have done.

Over the past four decades, Eppie's Great Race has grown from an event that started as a fun publicity stunt for the Eppie's restaurant chain to a fundraiser that has raised over \$1 million for programs benefitting Sacramento County's mentallyphysically-challenged population.

While paddling in a kayak down the American River in June 1974, Eppie Johnson was challenged to launch - and sponsor - a race that featured three different athletic events. (The term "triathlon" was unheard of up to that point.)

The entry fee for the first Great Race was \$10, with only 138 participants showing up. Since then, some of the world's most famous athletes have joined in. In 1976, Harry Cordelios was the first blind athlete to finish the entire course. Ten years later, Olympic medalist kayaker Chuck Lyda won the race. And in 1993, well-known paraplegic athlete

Mark Wellman competed and ended the race by dramatically crawling across the finish line.

Each year, Eppie leads a "Great Team" - featuring renowned sportspersons, celebrities, and local business leaders – that sets the pace ("time to beat") a week in advance of the Great Race. Any participant or team beating the Great Team's finish time is treated to a free breakfast at a Brookfield's restaurant.

Within the last few years, Eppie launched a new element: a Kids Duathlon, in which children ages 17 and under are challenged to run 2.5 miles and bike 6 miles. Last year, over 200 young people participated.

Ten years ago, Eppie's Great Race even went international when three citizens of the Czech Republic (former Great Race participants) decided to start a similar event in their country.

This year's Great Race is expected to attract over 2,000 competitors, but there is still plenty of room for additional participants, volunteers, sponsors, and spectators. Additional racers will result in more money being donated toward Sacramento County's Therapeutic Recreation Services.





PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Uriel Ojeda pled no contest to molesting a 13year-old child and admitted the allegation of substantial sexual conduct. The remaining charges will be dismissed in the interest of justice at the sentencing hearing. Under the agreement, Ojeda will be sentenced to 8 years in prison. He was immediately remanded into custody.

Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham states, "This is a fair resolution of the case based upon the facts and circumstances. The victim and her family can move forward with their lives and be proud that they had the courage to report the abuse to the Sacramento Diocese and law enforcement."





Getting the Guilt Trip

Dear Dave,

My parents have always had financial problems, and they recently lost their home. They have a place to live, but since that time my father has been asking me for money. He calls me over to talk about this when my mother isn't there and my husband isn't home. He's even asked for half of a \$150,000 inheritance I received from my grandparents. He's really making me feel guilty, and I'm not sure what to do.

Dear Elena,

Your brain knows what to do, but your heart is having a hard time doing it. Your father is a manipulator, and we're not going to let that pattern continue. There's nothing wrong with doing a few, short-term things to help them get back on their feet. But in return, you should expect them to change the behaviors that have put them in this situation.

Also, there should be no more private meetings with your father. If he wants to talk, make sure he understands it will be with your husband and mother present. To this point all of his schemes have been on the side. and this needs to be brought out into the open and stopped. You

love your parents. That, along with your dad's behavior, is what's making this so difficult. But participating in this sort of thing isn't going to help them. You take away a person's dignity when you subsidize them permanently. You also change their status and their ability to stand on their own two feet.

Any help you give needs to be short-term in nature—a gift. You and your husband should be in agreement on exactly what you're going to do, and it should be on your terms. Don't get involved in giving them money every month for the rest of their lives just because they had you. That's not how this works. There's an ongoing sense of entitlement here that needs to be nipped in the bud!

Unless you're talking about an emergency situation, home improvements would fall into

the category of wants, not needs. If you'd like new carpet, nicer windows or an updated kitchen, these things need to wait until after you've completed the first three Baby Steps.

Let's review. Baby Step 1 means saving up \$1,000 in the bank for a starter emergency fund. Baby Step 2 is paying off all debts except for your home. The third Baby Step is going back to your emergency fund and building it up so you have an amount equal to three to six months of expenses in case something goes wrong.

Once you've gotten to this point, you'll be able to save and do some other things, including a few home improvements!





PACIFIC RIM (Rated PG-13)

Directing a sci-fi action

adventure where giant robots clash with monstrous creatures from the center of the earth is a natural wish fulfillment for Guillermo del Toro.

A self-described "fanboy," del Toro is within his element for directing Pacific Rim, which seems pitched to the sensibilities of Japanese cinema that celebrated such monsters as Godzilla and Mothra.

With the impending annual Comic-Con geek fest in San Diego, the Mexican-born filmmaker could arrive at the event as a conquering hero. Maybe he did in the past, and I am just not aware of it.

Set in the near future, *Pacific* Rim finds that the human race is at a critical crossroads, following apocalyptic attacks on coastal cities around the world, including San Francisco, Manila and Hong Kong.

Creatures emerging from the depths of the sea look like a mixture of dinosaurs, sea serpents, and horribly deformed alien creatures. These legions of monstrous creatures are known as Kaiju, the Japanese word for giant beast.

The monsters destroy bridges and tall buildings as if they were rambunctious kids knocking over building blocks or Legos. Goodbye, Golden Gate Bridge. Too bad they didn't attack London because I would love

to see a monster tangle with the London Eve.

To combat the Kaiju, a special type of weapon was devised: massive robots, called Jaegers (German for "hunters"), controlled by two pilots whose minds are synched via a neural bridge, called "The Drift."

Unfortunately for mankind, the sea monsters keep mutating into every more powerful creatures, bent on nothing short of complete annihilation of the planet.

On the verge of defeat, the forces defending humanity have no choice but to turn to two unlikely heroes a washed up former pilot (Charlie Hunnam) and an untested trainee (Rinko Kikuchi).

Hunnam's Raleigh Beckett was a Jaeger pilot in the initial Kaiju wars when he co-piloted a giant robot with his older brother on a mission that went badly.

After the death of his sibling, Raleigh had dropped out of the monster bounty hunting, doing odd jobs along the Alaska coast while others tried to figure out ways to fortify the coastal areas from the monster invasion.

As the world hangs in the balance, Raleigh is dredged out of retirement by his former commander, Stacker Pentecost (Idris Elba, a suitably nononsense tough guy), for a desperate play showdown with the Kaiju.

The problem, of course, is that it takes two to pilot the 25-story tall robots, and a pilot's partner has to be someone with whom sharing your brain requires the utmost bond of trust and confidence.

Meanwhile, Kikuchi's Mako Mori is a beautiful Japanese martial-arts expert who's a candidate for a robot pilot position, though she must first prove herself capable of enduring the intense training.

Known only to commander Pentecost, Mako's past includes a dark secret about a childhood encounter with the Kaiju that still brings nightmares that must be purged from her memory. Interestingly, a red slipper is a symbol of the mental torment.

Not surprisingly, there is a severe competitive streak in the international cast of robot pilots, and after Raleigh and Mako tangle in a martial arts contest, they become partners in the robot called Gipsy Danger.

Del Toro has an affinity for Ron Perlman, having used him in his Hellboy films. Fittingly, Perlman's Hannibal Chau is a sleazy black market operator in Hong Kong, selling the salvageable body parts of dead

More comic relief comes from a pair of wacky scientists, Charlie Day's high-pitched voiced Dr. Newton Geiszler thinks he create a neural bridge with a Kaiju, while his partner (Burn Gorman) is just plain eccentric.

The success of the Jaeger program requires Raleigh and Mako to become a wellconnected team. For his part, Raleigh is a loner who grapples with trust issues, and so it is no easy task.

Fans of this genre are anxious to move on from the obvious plot contrivances and get to the essence of what is expected from an action film with roots in the anarchic Godzilla genre.

Pacific Rim does not disappoint those who want to enjoy the spectacular clash of the titans, as robots and monsters bang away at each other with ferocious intensity.



"When he was in charge of and Rehabilitation (CDCR): Pennsylvania's Department of Corrections, it had an inmate mortality rate 62 percent higher

found California's rate deficient.

"Now, he's entrusted with the disastrous realignment program. This dumping of more felons onto municipalities expands the injustices of AB 109 and puts all of us and our families at greater risk.

"Mr. Beard may be a noble, well-intended man, but he's not the man for the job.'


After a lifetime of delay, the gleaming new panels took only hours to install. Recalls Mishler: "Geraldine said she'd never had an easier installation.'

to succeed with this, but if you believe God can help you to achieve true contentment in your life, you will succeed.






