# Farewell to Wonder-Land

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) "If God stands a child before you," said children's advocate Wess Stafford, "it is a divine appointment."

Retiring Wonder-Land School director Nancy McCreery could not agree more. "Any time you're in contact with a child,"

she says, "you have an impact. It affects how he relates to the world around him. Children are resilient but vulnerable. Their reactions to adults stay with them for the rest of their lives."

The school director and her mom Elsie Hall (90) spent over 45 years of their lives trying to make that reaction a positive one. The women started Wonder-Land

Christian Pre-School and Day Care as a way to help finances at one of Carmichael's oldest churches. Before 1968, Nancy worked for the Post Office and Elsie (previously a kindergarten teacher) checked groceries for Raley's. They decided a pre-school would fill some unused rooms at the American River Community Church and help

their house of worship make ends meet.

"I was in my 20s and mom was in her 40s," says the La Sierra High graduate. "We went back to school together and got Childhood Education credentials at American River College. Wonder-Land began as a morning-only pre-school."

## Budget Passed without Addressing Much of State's Debt

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)—The Legislature passed the 2013-14 state budget on June 14th — a budget that was negotiated among Democrats and with limited public review. The main budget measure — Assembly Bill 110 — passed with only partisan support by a vote of 28 to 10.

"The biggest goal of the Legislature should be to get control of the budget," said State Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber). "But that has not happened. There are built-in cost increases that have not been addressed."

Negotiated behind closed doors, the total state budget spends approximately \$108 billion in general fund monies, which are spent at the discretion of the Legislature.

Despite its lack of transparency, the budget did dedicate \$2 billion to partially pay down the state's debt, restored the adult dental program and child care services, and provided some funding for trial courts.

This budget, unfortunately, prioritized new spending over a more fiscally prudent approach that pays off state debt and unfunded retirement liabilities. The Governor's own Department of Finance estimated that the state's unfunded liability on employee retirement pensions is at a cost of \$180 billion to taxpayers.

It did not address many of the problems with the Governor's public safety realignment plan, also known as AB 109. It allowed prisoners more good time credit than they ever had nor will ever earn.

"Without changes to realignment, criminals will be more emboldened by no consequences for their continued criminality and will only prey upon more of us. The time to fix AB 109 is now," said Nielsen.

Assembly Bill 110 is the main budget bill that must be accompanied by 21 trailer bills — which implements the budget.

# Area Restaurants Needed for EatSMART Campaign

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA — (MPG) Sacramento-area restaurants can participate in Food Literacy Month this September during the Mayor's Year of Food without paying a cent. Proceeds will benefit California Food Literacy Center, which teaches local K-5 children basic cooking skills, nutrition, fruit and vegetable appreciation, food budgets and more while introducing children to healthy, sustainable snacks that taste good. The nonprofit also trains community members as Food Literacy Advocates in its 10-week Food Literacy Academy to teach more

children in the community.

September was declared Food Literacy Month after Assemblymember Roger Dickinson authored ACR-161, a resolution sponsored by California Food Literacy Center. The resolution aims to raise awareness about food literacy on the state level. In honor

of Food Literacy Month last year, California Food Literacy Center held a series of events in Sacramento during the month of September to promote healthy, sustainable eating, including a Kids Food Literacy Sandwich Contest, restaurant sandwich campaign and Food Literacy Fair. Preparations are under way

for this year's Food Literacy Month, which will once again feature a variety of activities focused on food literacy — understanding the impact of food choices on health, the environment and the community.

California Food Literacy Center was established in July 2011 to help kids improve their knowledge, attitude and behavior toward food through community food education. The nonprofit's efforts are yielding positive changes in perceptions of healthy food among youth.

After three months working with K-1 students at Capitol Heights Academy, 92 percent said they believe healthy food tastes good, and 88 percent knew how to read a nutrition label. # Effie Yeaw Gala a Sizzling Success

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) Sweltering weather melted the ice at the Effie Yeaw Nature Center gala and art auction last week.

While deer, turkey and squirrels had the good sense to lay low, over 350 Nature Center fans dressed up and melted. In its fourth year, the outdoor fundraiser drew record attendance and produced a record bottom line of over \$75,000.

In addition to silent and live art auctions, a raise-the-paddle effort for non-profit Effie Yeaw's Urban Nature Project (enabling visits for schools in low-income areas) raised more than \$17,000.

The mercury seemed stuck

at 107 degrees as festivities began. Stalwart guests arrived in shorts and sundresses; ice cubes bobbed in wine glasses; shaded tables were at a premium. Event patron Marcy Friedman favored self-aerating cotton lace and Congress Member Doris Matsui fanned herself with auction programs. Debonair auctioneer David Sobon glistened on stage like Freddy Mercury in concert. Assemblyman Ken Cooley admitted to being "not so Cooley tonight..."

In delicious contrast, a Jian Wang painting of Ancil Hoffman Park (on a cool spring morning) fetched the auction's highest bid: \$6,500.

"We feared the exhausting heat might hurt the event," said

Effie Yeaw spokesperson Betty Cooper. "But our guests kept their cool. The auction was lively and some wonderful art went under the hammer. After four years, we feel our fundraiser is really established on the community calendar."

Crowds, tables and trash were urgently bundled away before 9 p.m. Cooled at last by a rising Delta breeze, a mother deer appeared from the gloom, leading her thirsty fawn to drink at the Nature Center pond. "And that," whispered an event volunteer, "is what it's all about..."

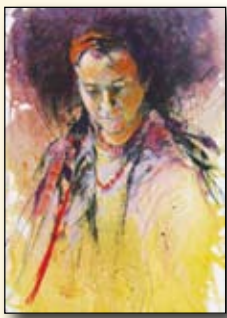

In the 1970s, we extended it to a full day service, also providing day care for children up to 12 years old." The eight-classroom campus spills into the sprawling church compound; even to its community garden. "We take our kids there regularly," says the director. "They learn about growing vegetables and they love to pick strawberries." From pre-school age, Wonder-Landers (current enrolment 55 children) also hear Bible stories. "They love acting out and singing the stories," says their leader. "It helps build a spiritual foundation for their little lives. Once you know the truth, you can't un-know it."

to Carrie Powers, an educator and children's pastor from Bayside Church in Citrus Heights.

"A career with children is a life well spent," McCreery considers. "God gave my mom and me an opportunity to be part of so many lives." Over many years, former Turtles have beaten a track to return and thank their mentors. "They are preachers, teachers, lawyers, doctors -- and parents," approves Nancy. They're proof that we did something worthwhile. Our students become productive. They take care of themselves. They love each other. Mom and I feel we've made a difference."

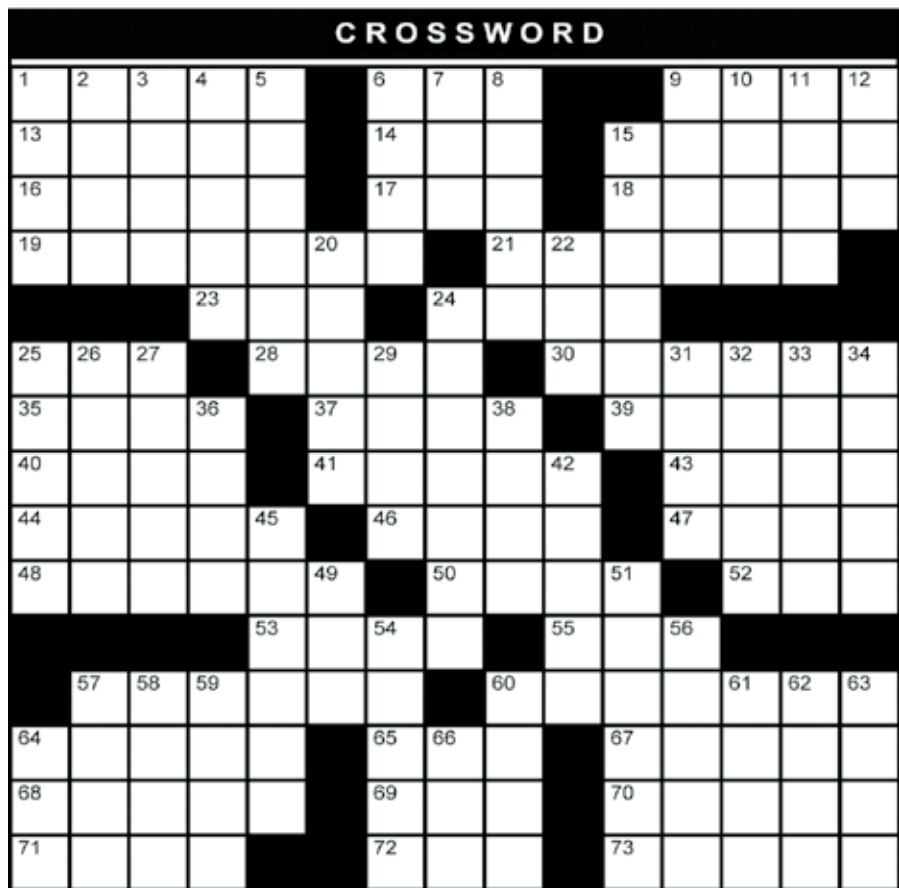

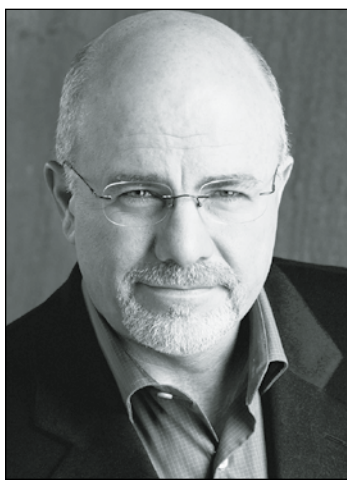

 I borrowed \$30,000 from my aunt to buy a condo eight years ago. We had a deal that she would get her money back, plus a piece of the profits, when it sold. If there were no profits, she would get back her original \$30,000. Recently the condo sold and I lost the money I put into it, plus my aunt's money as well. I make good money and don't have any other debt, but I'm a little resentful now that she wants me to pay her back. Do you have any suggestions?

Dear Christine,  
 I don't want to be mean, but you have no right to be resentful toward your aunt. This is the deal you signed up for, and she did nothing wrong. Wanting her money back now isn't greedy or malicious on her part, and it's definitely not worth putting a family relationship at risk.

I know what you're thinking, because it's just human nature. You just went through a lot, and the situation didn't work out as planned. Plus, it doesn't sound like your aunt is hurting financially if she put \$30,000 toward helping you in the deal. Part of you is thinking she has plenty of

money, so why doesn't she just forgive the debt and forget about everything?

If you were barely scraping by, I might suggest that you sit down and talk with her over a cup of coffee, explain the situation and ask her to forgive the debt. Right now, the little girl part of you is whining, "Oh, come on. Just let me go!" But the grown-up Christine knows better. That part of you is whispering, "You know what to do..."

Pay her back as quickly as possible, and get this bad deal behind you for good. You said you make good money, so just take care of your responsibility. It'll hurt some, but it's better than taking a chance on ruining the relationship with a very generous and loving aunt.

### Watch What You Give Them!

Dear Dave,  
 I'm working on my debt snowball, and I'm trying to settle with a pushy collector. I don't have the \$9,000 I owe, but I have \$3,000 I'd like to offer as a settlement. Recently the collector has started asking for a lot of information I don't feel comfortable providing.

What should I do?

Dear Daniel,

Lots of times in these kinds of situations collectors are trying to gather up as much information as possible in order to sue you. Even if that's not the case here, there's no reason for you to be supplying them with a bunch of extra info. Just offer them the \$3,000, and make it clear that your financial coach—which is me—told you not to answer any more of their nosy questions.

Make sure they understand that your offer of \$3,000 stands as a settlement of the debt today. If they're willing to accept the offer, get a statement in writing saying that the \$3,000 represents payment in full before you cut the check. If they choose not to accept your offer, and they keep asking questions that are none of their business, just tell them to call back when they're willing to discuss terms. Then, hang up!

WHEREAS, the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District, Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District was authorized by an assessment ballot proceeding conducted in 2006 and approved by 68.78% of the weighted ballots returned by property owners, and such assessments were levied by the Advisory Board of Directors by Resolution No. 2006-04 passed on May 2, 2006; and WHEREAS, on April 2, 2013 by Resolution No. 2013-02, the Board ordered the preparation of an Engineer's Report for the Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District (the "District") for fiscal year 2013-14; and WHEREAS, pursuant to said Resolution, the Engineer's Report was prepared by SCI Consulting Group, Engineer of Work, in accordance with 22665, et. seq., of the Streets and Highways Code (the "Report") and Article XXIII of the California Constitution; and WHEREAS, said Engineer's Report was filed with the Secretary of the Board of Directors and the Board of Directors has reviewed the Report and wishes to take certain actions relative to said Report. It is the intention of this Board to continue to levy and collect assessments within the District for fiscal year 2013-14. Within the District, the existing and proposed improvements ("Improvements") are generally described as the installation, maintenance and servicing of public facilities, including but not limited to, landscaping, sprinkler systems, park grounds, park facilities, landscape corridors, ground cover, shrubs and trees, street frontages, playground equipment and hardcourt areas, senior and community centers, drainage systems, lighting, fencing, entry monuments, basketball courts, tennis courts, running tracks, swimming pools, other recreational facilities, security guards, graffiti removal and repainting, and labor, materials, supplies, utilities and equipment, as applicable, for property owned and maintained by the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District. Installation means the construction of recreational improvements, including, but not limited to, land preparation, such as grading, leveling, cutting and filling, sod, landscaping, irrigation systems, sidewalks and drainage, lights, playground equipment, play courts, recreational facilities and public restrooms. Maintenance means the furnishing of services and materials for the ordinary and usual maintenance, operation and servicing of said improvements, including repair, removal, or replacement of all or part of any improvement; providing for the life, growth, health and beauty of landscaping; and cleaning, sandblasting and painting of walls and other improvements to remove or cover graffiti. Servicing means the furnishing of electric current or energy for the operation or lighting of any improvements, and water for irrigation of any landscaping or the maintenance of any other improvements. # Red, White and Ooh!

## Celebrating the Fourth with Fireworks

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) – America’s 237th birthday will soon be celebrated with fireworks that shimmer in the sky and gleam from the ground. Where you ooh and aah on the Fourth of July depends on whether you go public to watch an aerial display or private since local laws allow the sale and use of state-approved consumer fireworks in Sacramento County from June 28 through July 4.

That’s good news for local youth groups, service clubs, churches and other cash-strapped area non-profits hoping for booming business from a temporary wooden stand over seven toasty days.

Sunrise Little League, for one, plans to improve its ball field at C-Bar-C Park in Citrus Heights with proceeds raised from its TNT Fireworks stand at 7601 Sunrise Blvd. next to Safe Credit Union. Also in Citrus Heights, a new batting cage and fencing for its backstop are what Mesa Verde High School Softball Boosters is planning to buy with money earned from its TNT stand at 8477 Auburn Blvd. next to California Burgers. Out of its Phantom Fireworks stand next to Pastor Auto Care at 7920 Old Auburn Road, volunteers of American Legion Post #637 will raise funds for a local Boy Scout troop. In the next city over, the Antelope Community Tennis Association will raise funds to resurface courts and keep membership dues low with a Phantom stand next to Rite-Aid at 4300 Elverta Road.

In Carmichael, Glen Oaks Swim Club will help keep kids afloat as members with a Phantom Fireworks location near Quicker Stop Market at 6725 Winding Way. Over in Orangevale, food and other resources for needy local families will spawn from sales at the Assist Local Foundation’s Phantom stand adjacent to Dairy Queen at 9295 Greenback Lane. Meanwhile, Fair Oaks Presbyterian Church, which will run a TNT stand on its own turf at 11427 Fair Oaks Blvd., has earmarked proceeds for its youth, starting with summer camp scholarships. Bella Vista High School Band Boosters will offset competition fees, uniforms, insurance and other costs with funds raised at its TNT stand near the Olive Garden Restaurant at 5445 Sunrise Blvd. in Citrus Heights.

As volunteers for these groups work their mojo to move assortments and individually sold items, customers looking to get the most bang for their buck could become overwhelmed by the wide range of firework prices and performances. To help the patriotic and philanthropic, here’s our annual fireworks guide that includes all 11 of the new state-approved fireworks for 2013 along with the best returning items. Fireworks are listed by price and rated on a 5-star scale for performance, duration, distinctiveness and overall comparative value. Judges included firefighters of Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, Station 65 in Rancho Cordova, where the test was conducted.

### New for 2013

• **Game Time (TNT), \$39.99** – This rookie scores with intense crackle and wide-spreading sparks in the late innings, but the height and overall performance aren’t powerful enough to hit it out of the park. *93 seconds. 3 Stars*



• **Phantom Phlash Phinish (Phantom), \$18.99** – Phantastic Phountain. Second-runner-up for “Best New Fountain” has strong duration, altitude, spread,

titanium crackle and whistle. *108 seconds. 4 1/2 Stars*



• **Serenity (Phantom), \$15.99** – Noiseless fountain opens with lovely lava lamp-like lumps (thank you, nitrocellulose!) and peacefully pleases with seven colors and white chrysanthemums. *59 seconds. 4 Stars*



• **Phantom Spy-Ro-Mania (Phantom), \$14.99 for two** – A flickering fuse spirals around a tube of crackles and sparks, leading to a whistling tube sidecar that produces four deliciously irritating shrieks. Equivalent of TNT’s lower-priced Spiral Lite (\$5.99, 4 Stars) that debuted in 2003 and was, itself, a copycat. *34 seconds. 3 Stars.*



• **Surfs Up (TNT), \$10.99** – “Best New Fountain” runner-up. Gorgeous globs lead to a



wave of multiple effects worthy of exclams of “cowabunga!” Some of the best and widest-spreading titanium rain and crackles for the price. Just about the only thing lacking is an apostrophe in the contractive name. *58 seconds. 4 1/2 Stars*

• **Twilight Magic (Phantom), \$9.99** – Earns “Best New Fountain” honors for three exciting rotations of crackle-and-whistle and wide-spreading sparks at a comparatively super price. *57 seconds. 5 Stars*



• **Eenie, Meenie, Miney, Moe (Phantom), \$9.99 for four** – Sold as a set of four, these cutely named, but lackluster fountains all emit chrysanthemums and crackle, but blink at the onset and you’ll miss the pearl of blue, red, green or yellow that is the distinguishing feature. *42 seconds. 2 Stars*



• **Rainbow Rays (TNT), \$5.99** – Solid value-priced freshman delivers on height and crackle. Duration is one of the longest in the state at this price point. *56 seconds. 4 Stars*



• **Poopy Pooch (Phantom), \$5.99 for two** – It’s all business with this scatological novelty that has an ash-producing snake pellet squeezing out of a cardboard dog’s behind. Been sold by others for years under the name Poopy Puppy, but Phantom is the first to classy up California with this daytime item. They’re sold in pairs, so if the first doesn’t satisfy, there’s always No. 2. Yeah, we went there. *22 seconds. 2 Stars*



• **Cheeky Fountain (TNT), \$3.99** – Colorful sparks, silvery rain and crackling stars gush out of what resembles a fun-labeled kid’s juice box. Price is fair and so is the performance. *37 seconds. 3 Stars*



• **Recess (TNT), \$3** – Two whistles serve as the recess bell, and before playtime is over you’re treated to fleeting, albeit impressive altitude, crackles, chrysanthemums and multiple colors. *24 seconds. 3 1/2 Stars*



### Best of the Rest (4-5 Stars)

• **Opening Show (TNT), \$59.99** – Budget permitting, last year’s “Best New Finale” is a 500-gram must-have. The climax at the

2-minute mark is intense. Be no closer than 20 feet away for this one. *130 seconds.*

• **Delirium (TNT), \$49.99** – Fan-shaped 500-gram fountain is pricy, but its intensity and beauty are bona fide stunning. *133 seconds.*

• **Phantom Crown Jewel (Phantom), \$49.99** – Intense 500-gram display of white flowers, colored pearls, gold chrysanthemums and silver crackle. Packs a wallop, though that also reduces burn time. (Note: Prices for many of the items listed here have gone up due mainly to higher costs in China. Still, a \$20 price hike from last year, even though the cost is now on par with other 500-gram items, is a doozy.) *82 seconds.*

• **Peacock Tail Fan Fountain (Phantom), \$34.99** – Last season’s “Best New Fountain” builds excitement with each dazzling stage. Works out to 65 cents per second, but still a must-have. *54 seconds.*

• **Alpha Wolf (Phantom), \$24.99** – Green and purple droplets, gold shower and crackling stars finale are awesome. No whistles, doesn’t need them. *83 seconds.*

• **American Spirit (TNT), \$22.99 plus bonus** – This fountain of red, white and bluish stars, gold showers and decent whistles and crackles makes the cut because it comes with the pleasing, 90-second Sizzler Fountain. *80 seconds.*

• **O-Blivion (TNT), \$19.99** – This lord of the ring-shaped fountains emits multi-colored chrysanthemums with pine and impressive titanium crackles. *125 seconds.*

• **Pyropalooza (TNT), \$19.99** – Excellent height, crackle and vivid hues – a vivacious visual. *115 seconds.*

• **Hasta La Vista Baby (Phantom), \$19.99** – Like color and hate whistles? Then this is a solid pick with a screech-free spectrum of fast-changing colors. *125 seconds.*

• **Funky Monkey (Phantom), \$19.99** – This pyrotechnic primate features red pearls and a solid overall performance. *90 seconds.*

• **Mad Dog (TNT), \$17.99 for two (buy one-get one, or BOGO)** – More classic than rabid, this old dog spews amazing crackles, whistles and multi-color sparks. *80 seconds.*

• **Firecracker Fountain (Phantom), \$17.99 for two (BOGO)** – Lives up to its name with a remarkable crackling barrage alongside multi-colored pearls. *76 seconds.*

• **Phantom Night Owl (Phantom), \$14.99** – Phantom’s only internally glowing fountain

(eyes and mouth light up) has four loud screeches and an exciting overall performance. TNT discontinuing the similar-effect LOL Fountain makes this one even more unique. *65 seconds.*

• **Night Treasure (TNT), \$14.99** – Looks like a fan fountain, and it is, albeit only for the final 22 seconds. Still quite impressive. *98 seconds.*

• **King of Bling (Phantom), \$18.99 for two** – The crackles heard during the final third sound just like popping popcorn. Majestic chrysanthemums and whistle. Great value now that it’s now a BOGO. *90 seconds.*

• **Radiant (TNT), \$10** – Named “Best New Fountain” in 2011, this modern classic has a stunning performance for the price. Pushes the legal limit for spreading sparks and the fish effect is awesome. A must-buy. *93 seconds.*

• **Luck of the Irish (TNT), \$9.99** – Still holding its own after a dozen years, this classic features gold and silver spray, red and green balls, crackles and four super-loud whistles. *75 seconds.*

• **Lil Red Devil (TNT), \$9.99 for two (BOGO)** – Packs plenty of heat for the size and price. Ends strong with wide-spreading titanium crackling sparks. *35 seconds.*

• **Phantom Dragon Slayer (Phantom), \$9.99 for two (BOGO)** – Got some white, blue and lemon chrysanthemums, rowdy crackles and red stars going on. *66 seconds.*

• **Little Miss (TNT), \$4.99** – This value-priced opening act packs plenty of color plus silver rain and crackles. *47 seconds.*

• **Moondance (Phantom), \$4.99 for two (BOGO)** – Little dynamo emits loud crackles, purple pearls and glittering gold and white sparks. Note: Equivalent to TNT’s 17-year-old classic Purple Rain, \$5.99 for two. *45 seconds.*

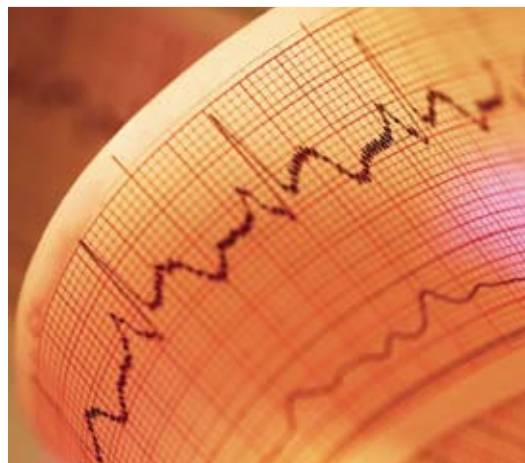

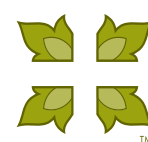
