



# **New Park Chief Cuts in at Whitney Lawn**

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - As grass goes, Whitney Lawn is long overdue and far preferable to the sad alternative: a condemned and fenced public

Dedicating the newly-grassed area of Carmichael Park, Supervisor Susan Peters last week dubbed it "a new field of dreams for Carmichael." Matching park funding, a \$35,000 Sacramento County grant enabled demolition of the old pool and its buildings. Once the gaping hole was filled, 31,000 square feet

of grass was planted and children last week staged Whitney Lawn's first soccer games. (On the dream perspective, the park district hopes to one day rebuild Carmichael's much-missed swimming pool on its original

In the meantime, tongue firmly in cheek, Peters invited Carmichael to "celebrate the grass." Young soccer players and vacationing kids then stormed the bunting with a banshee roar. "We're always looking for places to play soccer," grinned Carmichael Soccer Club leader Michael

Skala. "We're thankful we can use this field."

Whitney Lawn is phase one of a facelift for the 68-year-old park. The "Great Wall" corner at Fair Oaks and Grant will later this year be beautified with paths and a water feature. for the band shell area near North Ave.

The dedication event also introduced Carmichael to its new park district administrator. Taking the role after predecessor Jack Harrison's retirement, Tarry Smith shared ribboncutting duty with Supervisor

Peters. A former track athlete, baseball and football player, Smith approved the park's additional sports space. "Whitney Lawn is a positive way to reuse an area that was problematic," he said.

The administrator deemed Improvements are also planned the project's success a perfect omen for his new job. "It's clear the community loves its parks and takes every opportunity to get out and enjoy them," Smith noted. "We have many projects ahead to keep improving Carmichael leisure and recreation."

### **Fireworks Advisory**

#### Local Fire and Law Enforcement Agencies Attack Illegal Fireworks

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Announcing that they are once again targeting individuals who use illegal fireworks and those responsible for bringing them into California, local agencies will, for the seventeenth year in a row, institute a "Zero Tolerance" enforcement procedure

At a joint news conference on June 26th, representatives of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, Sacramento City Fire Department, Cosumnes Fire Department, Folsom Fire Department, Roseville Fire Department, and the Wilton Fire Department - along with representatives of the Sacramento City Police Department, Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Citrus Heights Police Department, Elk Grove Police Department, Galt Police Department, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, CAL FIRE and other representatives of the Greater Sacramento Area Fireworks Safety Task Force made the announcement.

In addition, the Task Force discussed its annual campaign to enlist the public's help in protecting their communities from the threat of illegal fireworks.

The Greater Sacramento Area Fireworks Safety Task Force is a safety coalition made up of representatives of local government, the fire service, the 413 non-profit organizations and charities who sell stateapproved fireworks in the Greater Sacramento Area, the media, and the state-approved fireworks industry.

### **Gas Prices** on Rise Again

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Average retail gasoline prices in Sacramento have risen 4.8 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.89/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 720 gas outlets in Sacramento. This compares with the national average that has fallen 3.8 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.57/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Sacramento during the past week, prices yesterday were 13.9 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 5.7 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 9.5 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 12.0 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"Gasoline prices are certainly a bit wacky right now across the country with prices moving in difference directions, but from what we saw in the last few days with oil prices, I'm hopeful that most areas of the United States will see new or continued relief for at least the first half of this week, with some areas seeing a continued drop for most of this week," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan.

# Homeless in Region Blessed by Union Gospel Mission

SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG) It can be a blessing to be homeless in Sacramento. No matter what brings men and women to the Union Gospel Mission near downtown, it is certain they will receive much more than the basic food, shelter and Gospel message they expect. The services men receive will help them greatly improve their daily lives, and if they're ready and willing to work hard, and learn about themselves and their addictions, they can find their lives transformed in ways they never imagined. Services for women are limited at this time, but a variety of daily services are available, and more are being planned for the near future.

The goal of the Union Gospel Mission, whether meeting basic daily needs or providing long-term alcohol and drug rehabilitation and life skills, has always been "to love the unlovable, care for those the

world has written off, and preach the Gospel with truth, love, and kindness, never going beyond what the Bible says." The love and kindness shown by volunteers and staff is seen and felt by their homeless "guests" as they experience the compassion first-hand, and see it put into practice daily throughout

Located at 400 Bannon Street, off of Richards Boulevard, one block from the Greyhound Bus station, the Mission is open 365 days a year and has been a staple in the fabric of Sacramento County for over 50

In 1962, eight businessmen - seeing there was a need for a mission outreach to the needy right here at home – were moved to create a place where alcoholic men from Sacramento could go to hear the Gospel and get a second chance to improve their lives. Originally located on Second Street in what is now Old Sacramento, the

campus consists of the main building, a chapel, a Women's Clothes and Accessory Closet, and a warehouse - all sitting on one acre of

The Mission provides over 9,600 meals to men, women, and children monthly, including special holiday meals. (In addition to in-house meals, the Food Basket Program provides food boxes twice a week to low-income families going through a crisis situation.)

Clean beds are provided nightly for 60 homeless men and 24 men in the 9-month extensive recovery program. Showers, new toiletry products, and other essential items are also available. Free clean clothes, haircuts, and even a postal mail address helps guests begin to feel like a part of this community as they begin to regain feelings of dignity and self-worth.

One of the Mission's major lifechanging programs is the intensive 9-month in-house drug and alcohol

recovery program provided to men who are serious about making a permanent change in their lives and eventually becoming a productive part of society. Participants are provided daily Christian-based classes, vocational training, one-onone counseling, mentoring, chapel services, medical assistance, and monthly bus passes. They are challenged daily to develop Christ-like behavior in their daily routines.

Six months into recovery, students can enter the "Next Step" phase, preparing to join the workforce. With the help of data specialist Danny Vanek, a graduate of the program, they work on their resume, get business cards, learn to use a computer, attend job fairs, and eventually begin to pound the pavement, looking for what may be their very first "real" job.

Also essential to the daily operation of the Mission are the 40 Christian denomination churches from every corner of the Sacramento region and beyond. Every evening of the year, a different church delivers an uplifting message, leads worship with live music and testimonies, and helps serve dinner to homeless and low-income residents, including families. Residents in the rehab program attend this chapel

service, and participate in their own and other special days on the calworship each morning to set the tone for their day.

Women also receive services at the Mission. Bible study is held every Thursday at 9:30 a.m. Homeless women and the working poor - single women and mothers-in the community who are struggling to make ends meet, are provided with a food box to take home. They are then treated to a free shopping spree in the Women's Clothing (and accessory) Closet, enabling them to be well-dressed for job-related events and in other areas of their lives.

Necessary toiletries, hygiene products, and other essential items are also available. They can also receive items for their children. Services for women are limited at present. A new, much larger warehouse is scheduled to open in the near future, which will house the Women's Clothes Closet and other expanded services for women. Homeless women are presently referred to shelters such as Maryhouse-Loaves and Fishes.

Annual programs include a Homeless Birthday Party in the summer for participants, many who have never had a birthday party. Activities are held for every holiday endar, such as a Valentine's Dinner Banquet and handing out phone cards on Mother's and Father's Day. Hundreds of food boxes are given away during the months of Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. A warming center is available, with hot coffee and pastries during cold

As a 501 (c)(3) non-profit, the Mission operates as a voluntary Christian organization. There will never be a charge for any service or goods provided to any recipient at the Mission. With a growing database of over 45 thousand donors, the Mission operates totally without tax or government support of any kind, and is funded entirely by the generous donations of these individuals, churches, and other organizations in the community. All financial information – including tax return forms – is available at the Mission website.

After 50 years of serving the needs of homeless and the working poor, the Union Gospel Mission runs like a finely-tuned machine, smoothly integrating the needs of daily homeless with on-site program participants, and women and families who seek rest and help throughout the year. A testament to the success of their services is that of 25 permanent paid staff at the Mission, 15 are graduates of the men's rehab program - some having been with the Mission for over 20 years.



# CSLB Nabs **Unlicensed Contractors**



Unlicensed contractors pose huge financial risks for homeowners who hire people who have not been qualified to perform the work, or undergone a criminal background check.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) – Three people who knew better than to perform contracting work without a state license turned up at a Contractors State License Board (CSLB) undercover sting operation in Rancho Cordova on June 6, 2013.

Unlicensed contractors pose huge financial risks for homeowners who hire people who have not been qualified to perform the work, or undergone a criminal background check, and who don't carry workers' compensation or general liability insurance if injury or damage occurs on the property. Unlicensed operators operate in the underground economy and create unfair business competition for law-abiding contractors.

CSLB's Statewide Investigative Fraud Team (SWIFT), along with investigators from the Department of Consumer Affairs' Division of Investigation and Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, cited seven individuals who illegally bid for landscaping, concrete, painting, fencing, tree, and plumbing work at a one-story residence.

"Contractors who have lost their license are fully aware that they are contracting illegally," said CSLB Registrar Steve Sands. "If you disregard contracting laws, you'll be caught and held to answer in Superior Court."

One of the former licensees, Anthony Eugene Bodiford of Woodland, doing business as Planet Rock Landscape, was

arrested on misdemeanor charges of contracting without a license and illegal advertising after he submitted a bid for more than \$8,000 to do fencing and landscape work. Contractors can only request a down payment of 10% of the total estimate, or \$1,000, whichever is less.

Bodiford's contractor license expired in 2011. Two others with revoked licenses went to the sting house but did not submit bids, and will receive administrative citations for illegal contracting and advertising violations.

Undercover CSLB investigators mostly used the online bulletin board craigslist.org to identify potential suspects. Property owners considering improvement projects should always consult CSLB's online instant license check to ensure that the contractor license is in good standing before hiring anyone to work in or around their home. In California, CSLBlicensed contractors are required for all home improvement jobs totaling \$500 or more in combined labor and material costs.

The seven people who received Notices to Appear in Superior Court all face misdemeanor charges of contracting without a license (Business and Professions Code Section 7028). First-conviction penalties for contracting without a license include up to six months in jail and/or up to \$5,000 in fines; subsequent convictions bring harsher penalties.

Six were cited for illegal advertising (Business and Professions Code Section 7027.1). State law requires that contractors include their license number in all advertisements, including online ads. Those without a license can advertise as long as the ad states they are not a state-licensed contractor, and the combined total of a project's labor and materials costs is under \$500.

Suspects must appear in Sacramento County Superior Court, 720 Ninth St., Sacramento (MAP). A court date has not been determined.



#### Is Combining Them Smart?

Dear Dave,

My son has a \$115,000 mortgage at 5.8 percent. He also has a home equity line of credit of \$40,000 at 9 percent. Currently, he can get a 30-year loan at 3.5 percent, or a 15-year note at 2.75 percent. His take-home pay is between \$70,000 and \$80,000 a year, and these are his only debts. Should he combine the mortgages into one loan?

- Daniel

Dear Daniel,

First, I only recommend mortgages of 15 years or less. Now we're looking at a 2.75 percent loan versus a 5.8 percent loan versus a 9 percent loan. I advise people to put home equity loans

under Baby Step 2 of my plan, which is pay off all debt except for the house, provided that the loan is less than half of your annual income. Based on the

income figures you gave, this sit-

uation is kind of on the bubble.

If I were in your son's shoes, I'd probably combine the two loans and refinance. I'd go for a new \$155,000 fixed-rate mortgage at 2.75 percent, with no balloons and no calls. This kid can live a good life and get the mortgage paid off pretty quickly

with the kind of money he's making.

But if it's me, I'm getting as short a term as possible on a refinance—maybe even a 10-year note instead of 15 years. Just imagine him getting all this knocked out and still having the majority of his life ahead of him. That's financial peace!







# Red, White and Ooh! Celebrating the Fourth with Fireworks

SACRAMENTO REGION. CA (MPG) - America's 237th birthday will soon be celebrated with fireworks that shimmer in the sky and gleam from the ground. Where you ooh and aah on the Fourth of July depends on whether you go public to watch an aerial display or private since local laws allow the sale and use of state-approved consumer fireworks in Sacramento County from June 28 through July 4.

That's good news for local youth groups, service clubs, churches and other cash-strapped area non-profits hoping for booming business from a temporary wooden stand over seven toasty days

Sunrise Little League, for one, plans to improve its ball field at C-Bar-C Park in Citrus Heights with proceeds raised from its TNT Fireworks stand at 7601 Sunrise Blvd. next to Safe Credit Union. Also in Citrus Heights, a new batting cage and fencing for its backstop are what Mesa Verde High School Softball Boosters is planning to buy with money earned from its TNT stand at 8477 Auburn Blvd. next to California Burgers. Out of its Phantom Fireworks stand next to Pastor Auto Care at 7920 Old Auburn Road, volunteers of American Legion Post #637 will raise funds for a local Boy Scout troop. In the next city over, the Antelope Community Tennis Association will raise funds to resurface courts and keep membership dues low with a Phantom stand next to Rite-Aid at 4300 Elverta Road.

In Carmichael, Glen Oaks Swim Club will help keep kids afloat as members with a Phantom Fireworks location near Quicker Stop Market at 6725 Winding Way. Over in Orangevale, food and other resources for needy local families will spawn from sales at the Assist Local Foundation's Phantom stand adjacent to Dairy Queen at 9295 Greenback Lane. Meanwhile, Fair Oaks Presbyterian Church, which will run a TNT stand on its own turf at 11427 Fair Oaks Blvd., has earmarked proceeds for its youth, starting with summer camp scholarships. Bella Vista High School Band Boosters will offset competition fees, uniforms, insurance and other costs with funds raised at its TNT stand near the Olive Garden Restaurant at 5445 Sunrise Blvd. in Citrus Heights.





# Here Comes the Final Wave of Cell Phone and Texting Enforcement



To reduce the number of distracted drivers on Sacramento area roadways, and to test our enforcement tactics, law enforcement agencies in the Sacramento region will be conducting the final wave of three high-visibility enforcement efforts that will last through June 30.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) – Drivers in the greater Sacramento region who are observed texting or talking on a hand-held cell phone will be targeted in a special enforcement operation that will last through June 30. Thirty-seven local police departments and the California Highway Patrol (CHP) will participate in the enforcement effort.

This is the third and final highvisibility enforcement period that was developed to test tactics that may be employed nationally in the future. In 2012, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) awarded the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) \$600,000

SACRAMENTO REGION, to fund three waves of enforce-ment along with the message "Phone in One Hand, Ticket in the Other," designed to educate drivers about the dangers of distracted driving.

A total of 3,008 citations were issued during the first wave last December, increasing to 4,750 during the second wave in February. The special enforcement region stretches from Modesto to Marysville and from Vallejo to South Lake Tahoe.

"Distracted driving is a dangerous problem," said OTS Director Christopher J. Murphy. "For everyone's safety, drivers need to focus on the road and refrain from talking or texting on a cell phone. California has strict

mobile device laws in place and this "Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other" campaign offers a constant reminder to drivers to do the right thing and practice safe driving."

Drivers caught talking or texting on a hand-held cell phone will receive a first-time ticket costing a minimum of \$162, with a second offense costing \$285. However, the goal of the special enforcement operation is not to issue tickets, but to raise awareness about the dangers of distracted driving.

The California Office of Traffic Safety offers these simple tips to keep you or someone you know from being a victim of distracted driving:

• While talking on a cell phone, up to 37 percent of the brain function needed for driving is used toward that conversation, rather than driving.

rather than driving.

• Turn off your phone, and/or put

it out of reach while driving.

• Include in your outgoing message that you can't answer while

you're driving.

• Don't call or text anyone at a time when you think they may

be driving.
• Remember: Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other.
