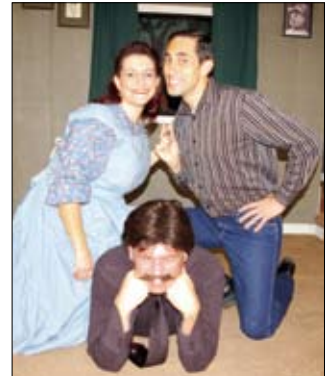

A Sweet Good-bye

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)- Carmichael pastry lovers have farewelled a sweet friend.

Becky Danek, one of three-generations of bakers, recently closed her store. Serving daily bread for 34 years at the Crestview Shopping Center, she, husband Ron and son Chris Danek maintained one of Carmichael's longest-running family businesses.

The store survived being hemmed in by supermarkets until recent months. "I

wanted to retire," explains Becky (72). "My son wants to take his family to Southern California. He's got all our recipes; he'll start a bakery there."

An Aladdin's trove for diabetics, the Danek store was famed for specialist recipes. Sugar-free macaroons flew off its shelves. Marvels saleswoman Becky: "People who hadn't had a birthday treat in years came for cakes." Weddings formed a big slice of the sugarless trade. A chocolate éclair that tasted and smelled like the real deal was a best seller.

Quality was a byword "My husband said you couldn't use cheap ingredients and have a good product," declares Becky. "If ingredients got too expensive, we discontinued items and developed others. In recent years, costs increased and profits hurt. We still had loyal customers but it wasn't enough. It was also hard to find and train staff to our level." After Ron Danek's 2008 death, Becky and son Chris (39) kept the dough rising. But a recent need to re-floor the bakery signaled their last loaf. "I was too old to deal with it,"

the boss decided. "Once I'd decided, my relief was unbelievable. I was up at 4 a.m. for over 30 years. My regular customers were sad but they agreed it was time for me to enjoy life."

In line with the family reputation for giving (unsold goods were frozen every day for food closets), Becky Danek plans a retirement volunteering for her church and local hospital. "I'll still enjoy cakes and pastries," she promises. "The more chocolate the better. But from now on, I'll buy them like everyone else."

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)- Loyal supporters were celebrated at a recent Carmichael Chamber luncheon.

Nielsen Opposes Limits to Second Amendment Rights

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) – The California State Senate passed on May 29th seven pieces of legislation to limit the Second Amendment rights of law abiding citizens. There was bipartisan opposition to several of these measures.

Long time public safety proponent, State Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber) voiced his objection to several bills that will limit an individual's fundamental right to keep and bear arms.

"These measures punish law abiding citizens who use guns and buy ammunition for legitimate purposes – personal safety, hunting, target shooting or simply adding to their collection."

Nielsen added, "Prohibition on firearms should target criminals, not law abiding citizens. It is just another excuse to disarm citizens who own and use firearms lawfully. Californians need the protection of their Second Amendment Rights now more than ever since the implementation of AB 109."

Democrat lawmakers passed the following bills:

- Senate Bill 47 (Yee) – Modifies the statutory definition of "assault weapon" to include a firearm which is a semiautomatic, centerfire rifle or semiautomatic pistol that does not have a fixed magazine.
- Senate Bill 53 (De Leon) – Purchasers of ammunitions must have ID and "authorization" from the Department of Justice (DOJ), purchases must be face-to-face, DOJ Database to track sales and purchasers, system funded by fees paid by vendors and purchasers.
- Senate Bill 374 (Steinberg) – Requires "Firearm Ownership Record" for all handguns and adds a \$19 fee.
- Senate Bill 396 (Hancock) – Bans "high capacity" magazines as of July 1, 2014.
- Senate Bill 683 (Block) – Extends the existing law requirements for handgun safety certificates to fall firearms (this includes the requirement for a certificate when purchasing, transferring, loaning, test, etc.).
- Senate Bill 755 (Wolk) – Prohibits those who commit non-violent crimes like DUI from possession of firearms for 10 years.

"These measures do nothing to reduce crime nor do they keep guns out of the hands of criminals," Nielsen said. "They simply restrict the rights of law abiding citizens."

To refute his colleagues' citation that guns caused mass violence, Nielsen responded, "Mass shootings are horrific; and the fact of the matter is that these multiple shootings are caused by individuals who are mentally ill. Mental illness is the problem – not guns."

"These mental health patients need help and access to services. If the Legislature wants to reduce crime, they should do something about AB 109. This state program is releasing thousands of mental ill and dangerous inmates and parolees onto our streets. If they were in custody or on supervised parole, they would at least be in some sort of treatment program and/or have access to medicine."

My Truck Overfloweth

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)—Loyal Carmichael postal workers ventured out on a recent Saturday not only to deliver but to also collect. Over 18,300 pounds of donated food was the result.

The annual national food drive – sponsored by the National Association of Letter Carriers – is one day of the year when busy little mails trucks return to the Post Office heavier than when they left. From a single route, Carmichael mailman Barry Wilson piled 1200 pounds of non-perishables into his little truck and called it a day. “The food drive takes an extra two hours on top of my usual eight hours,” he explained. “My truck was piled pretty high.”

The largest one-day food collection in the nation has been an annual institution for NLCA workers since 1993. In that time, over a billion pounds of food have been gathered from American households. Canned and packaged non-perishables are then provided to local food closets.

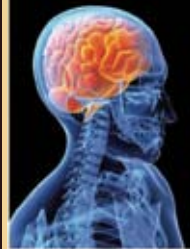

Congressional Hearing Reveals that Children in the Womb Feel Pain

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Liberty Counsel Action pledged its full support to HR 1797, the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act, a bill to provide protection for unborn children 20-weeks or older, who have the capacity to experience pain while being aborted.

In compelling testimony, health professionals disclosed the horrors of second trimester abortions and the pain those pre-born babies experience. In his testimony, Dr. Anthony Levatino, a former abortionist, described the process of inserting a thirteen-inch Sopher clamp with 2 1/2 inch jaws at the end with rows of sharp teeth. "Once you have grasped something inside, squeeze on the clamp to set the jaws and pull hard—really hard. You feel something let go and out pops a fully formed leg about six inches long. . . . Reach in again and again with the clamp and tear out the spine, intestines, heart and lungs."

"This is the reality of so-called 'reproductive health care,'" said Mat Staver, Chairman of Liberty

Counsel Action. "Cloaked in compassionate words, pro-abortionists do not care about women's health or fetal pain. In fact, Planned Parenthood and its minions fight against laws to bring abortion facilities up to basic medical clinic standards, require abortionists to have admitting rights at hospitals, or allow women to see a sonogram image of their unborn child before an abortion," Staver pointed out.

Dr. Levatino further revealed that after the first trimester, "any attempt to perform an abortion 'to save the mother's life' would entail undue and dangerous delay." Instead, OB-GYNs perform a Cesarean section if the mother's life is at risk, often saving both the mother and the preborn child."

The pro-abortion business does not want Americans to know what neurobiologist Dr. Maureen Condit revealed yesterday: a fetus responds to pain just like you and me, by withdrawing from the painful stimulus," Staver said. The Director of Human Embryology instruction for the University of Utah

School of Medicine told the subcommittee, "The neural circuitry responsible for the most primitive response to pain, the spinal reflex, is in place by eight weeks of development."

"In facilities hiding behind signs that advertise 'Women's Health,' nurses like Jill L. Stanek experience appalling stories of babies who survive abortion only to be zipped alive a biohazard bag," Staver noted."

At yesterday's hearing, (May 2nd, 2013) Rep. Trent Franks (R-AZ), the author of HR 1797, quoted Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. who said, "Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter." Liberty Counsel Action will not be silent until every American has the right to life—from conception to natural death," Staver concluded.

Liberty Counsel Action is a 501(c)(4), non-profit grassroots lobbying organization advancing religious and civil liberties, the sanctity of human life, the family, limited and responsible government, national security, and support for Israel.

Sacramento County DA Reports Recent cases of interest

CASE: Alim Hussain (05/31/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Alan Hengel, Insurance Fraud Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that 34-year-old Alim Hussain was sentenced to 120 days in county jail and placed on 5 years formal probation. Last month, Hussain was convicted by jury of felony grand theft auto.

On June 9, 2010, the registered owner of a 2000 Toyota Land Cruiser left his vehicle at Hussain's vehicle repair shop for transmission repairs. Soon after, the owner of the vehicle left the country and never paid for the repairs.

On March 17, 2011, Hussain conducted a fraudulent lien sale of the vehicle by failing to first notify the legal owner of the Land Cruiser, Schools Financial Credit Union, about the lien sale. As a result, the credit union learned of the lien sale after it had been removed as the legal owner of the vehicle. Hussain then sold the Land Cruiser to an unsuspecting buyer. The case was investigated by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

CASE: Rosemary Eusted (05/31/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Rosemary Eusted was sentenced by the Honorable Michael Kenny to 72 years plus 120 years to life in prison. Last month, Eusted was convicted by jury of 17 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with force against a child under the age of 14.

Eusted began continuously molesting two female family members in November of 1997 at her Rio Linda home. The victims were 6 and 7 years old at the time. They did not report the sexual abuse for several years out of fear of retaliation and further physical abuse.

In May of 2005, Eusted was convicted of two counts of child molest in Placer County of different victims whose ages ranged from 5 to 10 years old. These victims testified in the Sacramento County case.

One of the victims, who is now a mother of a little girl, stated, "Rosemary Eusted took away my innocence, my confidence, and my trust. I am sure she is satisfied that she left me with all of this confusion and terror. Little does she know that it is me who is satisfied knowing that there is one less dangerous person in this world who could hurt my daughter and the rest of our children."

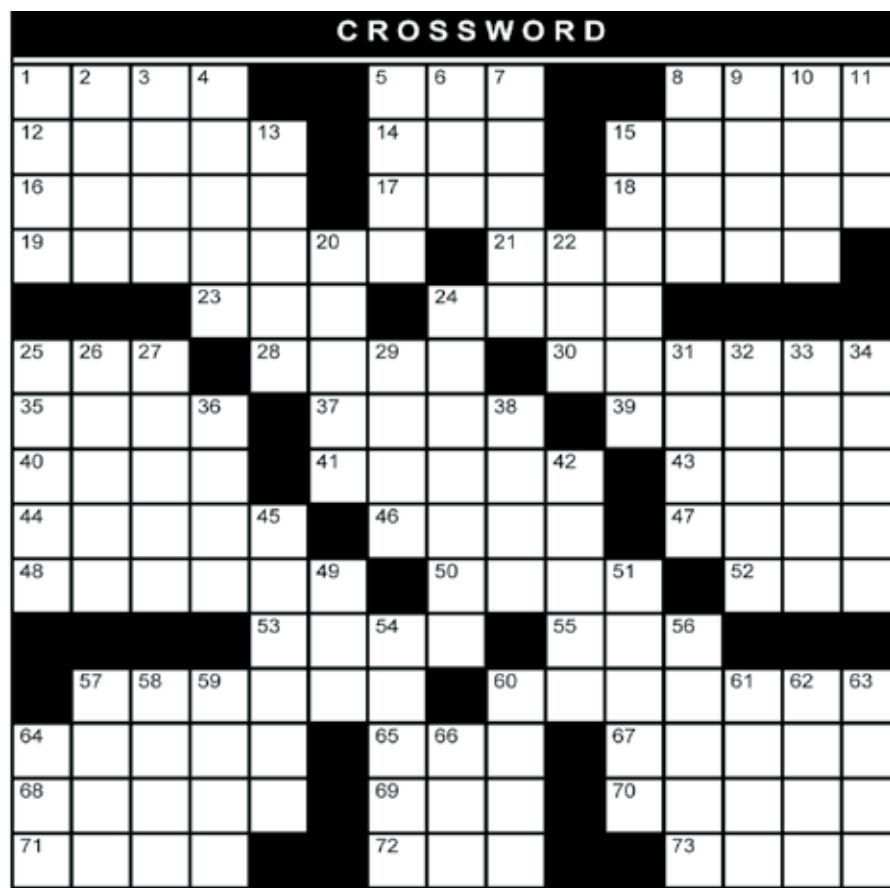

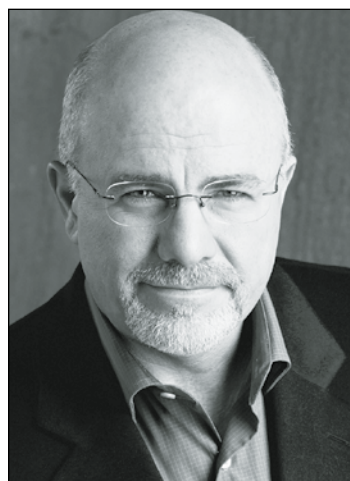

 Is it ever too late to get life insurance?

Dear David,

The only time it's really too late to get life insurance is after you're dead! But seriously, if you're older than 70 it becomes pretty difficult to get affordable coverage, because insurance companies figure you've pretty much got one foot in the grave already at that point.

You can get term life insurance pretty easily up until about age 70, and there are a few policies available past that point, depending on your health situation. But you really shouldn't need life insurance when you're that age and older. Hopefully, you've invested, saved, and set aside enough money to pay burial expenses and for a spouse—if you have one—to live on after you're gone.

Is it in the Will?

Dear Dave,
 My father is terminally ill, and my two brothers and I recently had a talk with dad about his estate. He wants everything,

except his house, left to us. He would like it to go to his long-time girlfriend, but it's not written that way in the will. Should we have the will changed to reflect this desire?

- Dan

Dear Dan,

I'm really sorry about your dad. I know this isn't easy for you guys, but I'm glad you're all working together to make things right. Yes, the will needs to be changed to reflect his wishes where the house is concerned. If he is still of sound mind and able to make that decision independently, the will should describe exactly what he wants to happen with every piece of his estate.

There is an alternative though. It's fine if he simply wants to give her the house. But he could also leave her a life estate that says she gets the use of the home as long as she's alive. Then, upon her death, it would revert to you. Essentially, the house would be left to you, but she would have use of it during her life.

This is a more traditional approach in these kinds of situations, but it's your dad's will and his estate. He can do whatever he wants. But remember, if he deeds the house to you and you give it

to her, you'll have a gift-tax situation on your hands. You don't want to get into that mess!

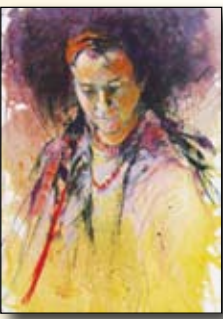

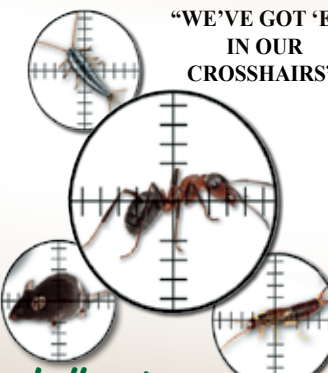

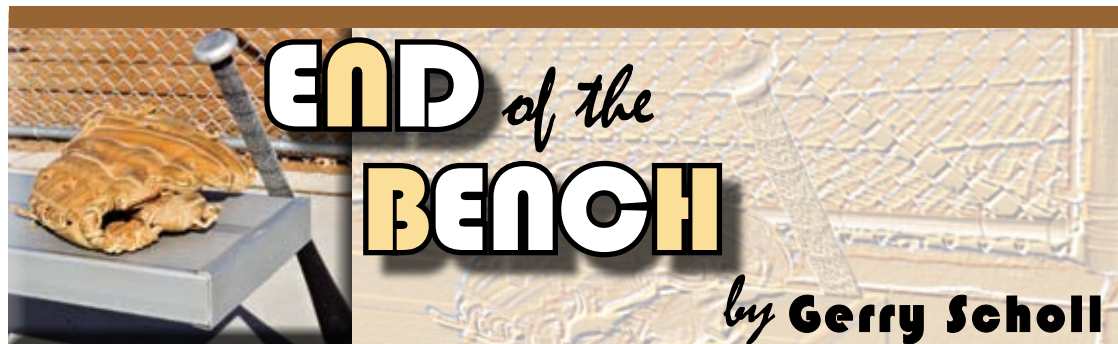

The young White Sox right-hander went into his pitching motion — rocking back, hands together, raising both arms above and slightly behind his head. As

he brought his hands and arms forward he clipped the top of his cap and knocked the bill of the cap down over his eyes. Blinded, he stopped and a balk was called. A run scored and the other runners moved up a base.

All the while there were snickers and chuckles throughout the peanut gallery, and laughter from the opposing dugout. The coach went out to the mound for a few words to try to squelch the embarrassment. That didn't work.

There was just one way to deal with it all. Nine straight faster-than-ever fastballs right down the middle struck out the side and number-five had come into his own right before Mother's very eyes, walking off the field to a hearty round of applause. At least, that's the way we liked to remember it.

For a little personalized therapy, this temporary-zombie chilled quietly on the couch in front of the television watching some baseball and that old shared memory came to mind.

Perhaps it was no coincidence that on this fateful day to remember, with those thoughts and memories swirling, it was a Giant Angel (Angel Pagan of the Giants and his game-winning, walk-off, inside-the-park home run) that was the hero of the moment.

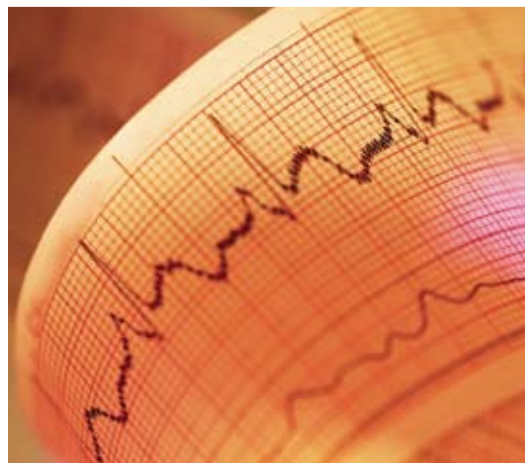

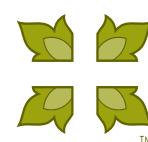
