SACRAMENTO, CA - (MPG) Spring is always invigorating, and especially so this year. Sacramentan and internationally-known Gregory Kondos celebrated his 90th birthday this year on April 2nd. In honor of the occasion three shows of his work have been organized: "A Touch of Blue: Landscapes by Gregory Kondos" is a show of his oil paintings at the Crocker Art Museum until May 19th. "Happy Birthday, Gregory Kondos!" is an exhibit of his drawings in the Kondos Gallery

at Sacramento City College until April 26th. The third show, of prints of his Crocker show paintings, was held at the Roseville Arts! Blue Line Gallery and ended April 13th.

The Crocker exhibit includes 70 examples of his work spanning a 50 year period, illustrating how he has evolved as a painter. Many of his paintings are large, with bright colors capturing stunning landscapes of the coastal areas of southern California, river areas of the Sacramento Valley, Napa and Sonoma vineyards, Yosemite and Sierra mountains, New Mexican deserts, and finally

some landscapes of Greece and of France, where he now owns a second home. Kondos translates these scenes in different ways, but always in his own eye-riveting and dynamic style. "I am really led by the most important teacher out there, and that's nature." Like the Crocker Art Museum, Kondos is always creating new links with the public as well as new links between California and the world.

When this writer visited on a Saturday, there were many visitors relishing what Kondos sees and then paints his way. One painting, "Rosebud Farm"

(2002), is a scene from the Sacramento Valley. Visitors pondered the incredibly active, multi-colored brushstrokes capturing the different personalities of trees in contrast to the tranquil river and the cloudless sky.

You can almost feel Sacramento Delta breezes tousling the trees' leaves and rippling their reflections on the river. Other viewers were awed by the three-dimensionality of the Yosemite paintings, or mesmerized by the vivid blues and dynamic compositions of southern California seascapes.

IRS Releases the Dirty Dozen Tax Scams for 2013

WASHINGTON, DC - The Internal Revenue Service today issued its annual "Dirty Dozen" list of tax scams, reminding taxpayers to use caution during tax season to protect themselves against a wide range of schemes ranging from identity theft to return preparer fraud.

The Dirty Dozen listing, compiled by the IRS each year, lists a variety of common scams taxpayers can encounter at any point during the year. But many of these schemes peak during filing season as people prepare their tax returns.

"This tax season, the IRS has stepped up its efforts to protect taxpayers from a wide range of schemes, including moving aggressively to combat identity theft and refund fraud," said IRS Acting Commissioner Steven T. Miller. "The Dirty Dozen list shows that scams come in many forms during filing season. Don't let a scam artist steal from you or talk you into doing something you will regret later."

Illegal scams can lead to significant penalties and interest and possible criminal prosecution. IRS Criminal Investigation works closely with the Department of Justice (DOJ) to shutdown scams and prosecute the criminals behind them.

The following are the Dirty Dozen tax scams for 2013:

Identity Theft

Tax fraud through the use of identity theft tops this year's Dirty Dozen list. Identity theft occurs when someone uses your personal information such as your name, Social Security number (SSN) or other identifying information, without your permission, to commit fraud or other crimes. In many cases, an identity thief uses a legitimate taxpayer's identity to fraudulently file a tax return and claim a refund.

Combating identity theft and refund fraud is a top priority for the IRS, and we are taking special steps to assist victims. For the 2013 tax season, the IRS has put in place a number of additional steps to prevent identity theft and detect refund fraud before it occurs. We have dramatically enhanced our systems, and we are committed to continuing to improve our prevention, detection and assistance efforts.

The IRS has a comprehensive and aggressive identity theft strategy employing a three-pronged effort focusing on fraud prevention, early detection and victim assistance. We are continually reviewing our processes and policies to ensure that we

are doing everything possible to minimize identity theft incidents, to help those victimized by it and to investigate those who are committing the crimes.

The IRS continues to increase its efforts against refund fraud, which includes identity theft. During 2012, the IRS prevented the issuance of \$20 billion of fraudulent refunds, including those related to identity theft, compared with \$14 billion in 2011.

This January, the IRS also conducted a coordinated and highly successful identity theft enforcement sweep. The coast-to-coast effort against identity theft suspects led to 734 enforcement actions in January, including 298 indictments, informations, complaints and arrests. The effort comes on top of a growing identity theft effort that led to 2,400 other enforcement actions against identity thieves during fiscal year 2012. The Criminal Investigation unit has devoted more than 500,000 staff-hours to fighting this issue.

We know identity theft is a frustrating and complex process for victims. The IRS has 3,000 people working on identity theft related cases - more than double the number in late 2011. And we have trained 35,000 employees

who work with taxpayers to help with identity theft situations.

The IRS has a special section on IRS.gov dedicated to identity theft issues, including YouTube videos, tips for taxpayers and an assistance guide. For victims, the information includes how to contact the IRS Identity Protection Specialized Unit. For other taxpayers, there are tips on how taxpayers can protect themselves against identity theft.

Taxpayers who believe they are at risk of identity theft due to lost or stolen personal information should contact the IRS immediately so the agency can take action to secure their tax account. Taxpayers can call the IRS Identity Protection Specialized Unit at 800-908-4490. More information can be found on the special identity protection page.

Phishing

Phishing is a scam typically carried out with the help of unsolicited email or a fake website that poses as a legitimate site to lure in potential victims and prompt them to provide valuable personal and financial information. Armed with this information, a criminal can commit identity theft or financial theft.

If you receive an unsolicited email that appears to be from

either the IRS or an organization closely linked to the IRS, such as the Electronic Federal Tax Payment System (EFTPS), report it by sending it to phishing@irs.gov.

It is important to keep in mind the IRS does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as text messages and social media channels. The IRS has information that can help you protect yourself from email scams.

Return Preparer Fraud

About 60 percent of taxpayers will use tax professionals this year to prepare their tax returns. Most return preparers provide honest service to their clients. But, some unscrupulous preparers prey on unsuspecting taxpayers, and the result can be refund fraud or identity theft.

It is important to choose carefully when hiring an individual or firm to prepare your return. This year, the IRS wants to remind all taxpayers that they should use only preparers who sign the returns they prepare and enter their IRS Preparer Tax Identification Numbers (PTINs).



NFIB Study Predicts Job Loss in California Under New Tax

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) California may lose more than 26,000 jobs as a result of a little known provision of the new healthcare law called the Health Insurance Tax (HIT). A study released today by the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB) Research Foundation showed total employment in California will decline by between 14,322 and 26,296 by 2022 because of the increased costs associated with the HIT.

California's overall gross domestic product will also be reduced as a result of the tax. Over the next decade, cumulative lost sales among small businesses will be at least \$8.9 billion.

"Businesses in California are struggling under unprecedented costs from taxes and regulations. We need to do all that we can to increase jobs, not reduce them," said John Kabateck, NFIB California director. "This destructive tax

insurance, and will ultimately be passed on to consumers in the form of higher premiums.

Former Congressional Budget Office Director Douglas Holtz-Eakin estimates the HIT will increase premiums on insurance policies purchased in the fully-insured market by \$5,000 over the next decade. Eighty-eight percent of small businesses purchase their insurance in the fully-insured market.

Bipartisan legislation to repeal the HIT was introduced in February in the House of Representatives by Reps. Charles Boustany (R-La.) and Jim Matheson (D-Utah), and this month in the Senate by U.S. Senators John Barrasso (R-Wyo.) and Orrin Hatch (R-Utah).

The BSIM is a dynamic, multi-region forecasting model that analyzes the impact of policy "shocks" on the economy and is unique in ability among models to forecast the economic impact of such policy on U.S.

businesses differentiated by size of the firm. For this purpose, the BSIM adhered to the Small Business Administration definition of "small business" as firms with fewer than 500 employees.

Elder Theft Given Same Penalty 'Status' as Other Thefts Under Proposal

SACRAMENTO, CA – (MPG) A measure to ensure that theft from seniors would be treated with the same severity as other theft crimes today passed the Senate Public Safety Committee on a 6 to 0 vote.

Senator Marty Block, SB 543 author, said, "Stealing from seniors is particularly cruel because the victims are more vulnerable and often living on fixed incomes. We need to make it clear that theft from a senior is just as serious as other theft crimes."

Under current law (California Penal Code 666), if someone is convicted three or more times of a theft such as burglary, carjacking, robbery or grand theft, then any subsequent petty theft conviction may be punished as a felony. The law does not specify elder theft as a qualifying offense for the felony sentencing. The lack of specificity results in ambiguity for district attorneys as to what charge to bring against the defendant. District attorneys will thus often charge defendants

with multiple theft charges to ensure a prior theft charge is on the record if a conviction is won.

"SB 543 makes current law clear, and ensures that a theft crime against a senior is treated as seriously as theft from others," Block said.

District Attorney Bonnie Dumanis, whose office is sponsoring the bill, praised Senator Block's efforts to pass SB 543. "Our office continues to be committed to elder abuse prosecution and prevention," she said. "This law will make sure the punishment fits the crime and holds offenders accountable when they steal from our vulnerable senior citizens."

In addition to the San Diego District Attorney, SB 543 is also supported by the Elder Law & Advocacy of San Diego & Imperial Counties, Senior Community Centers, the California District Attorneys Association, the California State Sheriffs' Association and the Crime Victims Action Alliance. No opposition has been received.



Save Mart Supermarkets Works with DA's to Correct Waste Compliance Problems

SACRAMENTO, CA – (MPG) District Attorney Jan Scully announced on April 3rd that her office has joined 34 other California District Attorneys to reach a settlement in a civil enforcement action against Save Mart Supermarkets, headquartered in Modesto, California, totaling more than \$2.5 million. Save Mart Supermarkets operate throughout California, and includes Food Maxx, Maxx Value Foods and Lucky brands. The settlement concerns Save Mart's storage, handling and disposal of hazardous waste.

The statewide inquiry involved investigators from environmental and health agencies, hazardous waste inspectors, and participating D.A. Offices. Save Mart worked collaboratively with prosecutors and investigating agencies to address the specific violations that were found. As

a result, regulated wastes produced by Save Mart stores will be properly stored, handled, transported, and disposed of at proper facilities, and appropriate records will be kept documenting compliance with California law.

District Attorney Scully stated, "By joining with other District Attorneys, we can address common issues in many counties and achieve enhanced compliance with environmental regulations by large corporations throughout the state. When notified of the investigation, Save Mart moved quickly to address its shortcomings in handling hazardous wastes."

The settlement covers alleged violations occurring over several years and affects all of the 251 California Save Mart stores and distribution centers, including Albertson's Stores (acquired by Save Mart and

converted to either the Lucky or the Save Mart brand). Save Mart operates 16 Save Mart stores and three Food Maxx stores in Sacramento County.

Under the judgment filed in San Joaquin County Superior Court, Save Mart must pay \$2,557 million in civil penalties, costs and expenses for supplemental environmental projects furthering consumer protection and environmental enforcement in the state, with the Sacramento County Environmental Management Department receiving \$23,400 in civil penalties and cost recovery, and the District Attorney's Office receiving \$48,850 in civil penalties and investigation cost recovery. Save Mart will be subject to an injunction prohibiting similar violations in the future.

Borrow a High-Tech Energy Display from SMUD

SMUD is Loaning Customers a Useful Energy Monitor that Uses that New Smart Meter

SACRAMENTO, CA – (MPG) Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) customers can use their Sacramento Public Library card to check out an "EnergyAware" electricity use display. The device "talks" wirelessly to a customer's smart meter. It will let them know, in real time, how much power the home and its appliances are using, and which are costing the most money to operate.

Customers can track how their electricity use changes as they turn appliances on and off. The device displays electricity use in dollars and cents at the moment and cumulatively, helping customers estimate what the electricity portion of their bill might be. Customers can borrow the EnergyAware device like they would a book from the Sacramento Public Library's 28 branches and use it for up to two months. Information provided

with the device directs customers to SMUD's website, smud.org, where they can learn more about energy efficiency, and programs and rebates designed to help them save money.

EnergyAware is one of the first technologies available that allows customers to utilize the SMUD smart grid, which is interconnected by 620,000 smart meters installed on customers' homes and businesses.

SMUD also offers EnergyAware to customers who request one when they register as SMUD "My Account" users on smud.org. My Account allows customers to maintain their accounts online and pay their bills as well as see their energy use.

EnergyAware is simple to use. Just plug in the device and it will immediately begin calculating electricity use in kilowatt-hours and in dollars and cents. There are no wires and nothing else to

install in the home or on the meter.

SMUD completed a two-and-a-half year smart meter deployment program last year. Smart meters are the backbone of the smart grid and they provide customers with two-way communication, allowing them to make many of their own energy choices. Knowledge is power, and knowing how much power is being used allows customers to tailor energy use to their own needs, saving money and minimizing their impact on the local environment. As SMUD's smart grid continues to be built, more products like the EnergyAware electricity use display will be available so customers can use less energy while maintaining their comfort and lifestyles.







Forgiven debt

Dear Dave,

I have some old debts that have been forgiven. Should I still pay these if and when I have the money?

- Matt

Dear Matt,

First, you need to double-check and make sure the debts have been officially forgiven. Commercial debts, such as old credit card debt, are almost never forgiven. They might be in default, or it may be that the company has written it off, but that's not the same as being forgiven.

Years ago, my grandfather loaned me money when I was in college to pay for part of my tuition. He forgave that debt not long after, so I didn't owe him the money morally, legally or in any other way. But in a commercial setting, meaning you're dealing with a bank or other lender, that doesn't happen.

If a credit card company decides to take less than the original amount owed, that's a business decision that has changed the terms of the deal, both morally and legally. Sometimes they'd rather have a bird in the hand rather than promises in the bush. You don't have an obligation to pay the original amount because the terms of the deal have been altered.

Forgiven is forgiven. That means the deal and any obligation is completely wiped out and gone. But chances are, Chase or MasterCard aren't going to call you up and forgive the debt.

incursion into North Korea to extract a prisoner. Maybe that lunatic Kim Jong-un got an early look and decided this was as good a time as any to threaten nuclear war on the United States.

Out in the field, the G.I. Joes are betrayed by sinister forces, resulting in most of the group being eliminated in one horrific aerial attack of their base camp.

The sole survivors are Roadblock, the new recruit Flint (D.J. Cotrona), and the tough but sexy Lady Jaye (Adrianne Palicki). The assault appears to be the handiwork of Cobra Commander (Luke Bracey), but I am not entirely sure.

What is apparent is that the President (Jonathan Pryce) is a clone of the duly elected commander-in-chief. As part of the Cobra conspiracy, the faux U.S. leader ordered the termination of the G.I. Joes.

Meanwhile, up in the Himalayas, Snake Eyes (Ray Park) and Jinx (Elodie Yung) are engaged in great martial arts combat as they attempt to capture the traitorous Storm Shadow (Byung-hun Lee).

The fight sequences are even more dramatic and exciting when Snake Eyes and Jinx battle a slew of ninjas while flinging themselves on ropes tied to the sheer mountainside cliffs.

Given that the alien force of Cobra has taken over the White House, Roadblock and his decimated crew turn to the only person who can help them in their dire need.

Retired General Joe Colton (Bruce Willis), who coined the nickname for the G.I. Joes, is the only soldier to be trusted. He also knows something combating diabolical plots.

For someone no longer on active duty, General Colton's private residence contains more weaponry and ammunition than an entire Army base. In every room, there are hidden closets and cabinets full of assault weapons.

Meanwhile, the fake President has convened a summit of nuclear powers, including North Korea, China, Russia, France, Britain, and India. His dastardly plan is a game of nuclear chicken aimed to force all others to disarm.

For reasons that are not really evident, the President appears bent on total nuclear annihilation of planet Earth. A total wipeout of civilization seems counterintuitive if you seek world domination. What is to be gained from a scorched earth?

Of course, not everything makes sense in an action film like "G.I. Joe: Retaliation." It's all about the choreography of great gun battles, martial arts stunts and hand-to-hand combat.

One thing "G.I. Joe" is not about is a sensible plot and snappy dialogue, though the faux President, smarmy and oozing with villainy, spouts some of the best nasty lines as if he were the bad guy in a James Bond film.

The most underused character is Cobra Commander. You'd think he would be a commanding figure of sheer malevolence and supreme villainy. Instead, he's practically a cipher.

"G.I. Joe: Retaliation" is a film likely to be reviled by critics. Bu I think it offers its target audience pretty much what they want in an action film of this kind. On the plus side, the film moves at a great pace with plenty of thrilling stunts.

At this early stage, the year 2013 is shaping up as a busy one for hardcore action films, often starring or featuring aging superheroes who still have drawing power at the box office.

Dwayne Johnson, not yet old but who's been around for awhile, and Bruce Willis, who is charitably almost a member of the senior action circuit, have starring roles in "G.I. Joe: Retaliation."

This latest film, based on the Hasbro toys, is a sequel to "G.I. Joe: Rise of the Cobra," a film I did not see due to some valid excuse. I think I have a doctor's note for missing the screening.

In any case, with this type of action film, it hardly matters if you miss one of them, what with the action being largely generic and cartoonish, easily explained by any twelve-year-old boy.

The film begins with some promise as Channing Tatum's Duke and Dwayne Johnson's Roadblock, elite squad members of the G.I. Joes, bond over some video games and family life.

Unfortunately, Tatum doesn't stick around very long. He may have had a commitment to appear in another film that looked more promising for his future. The action begins with an

Wind Whipped Roof Fire at the Zinfandel Grille Extinguished by Metro Fire Crews

SACRAMENTO, CA—(MPG) On April 8, 2013 at approximately 10:28 am Metro Fire units were dispatched to a report of a structure fire at the Zinfandel Grille at 2384 Fair Oaks Blvd. in Sacramento County. The first arriving Metro Fire units reported a working fire showing from the roof area. Metro Fire Companies immediately began fire suppression activities while assuring all



IRS Releases the Dirty Dozen Tax Scams for 2013

The IRS also has created a new web page to assist taxpayers. For tips about choosing a preparer, red flags, details on preparer qualifications and information on how and when to make a complaint, visit www.irs.gov/chooseataxpro.

Remember: Taxpayers are legally responsible for what's on their tax return even if it is prepared by someone else. Make sure the preparer you hire is up to the task.

IRS.gov has general information on reporting tax fraud. More specifically, you report abusive tax preparers to the IRS on Form 14157, Complaint: Tax Return Preparer. Download Form 14157 and fill it out or order by mail at 800-TAX FORM (800-829-3676). The form includes a return address.

Hiding Income Offshore

Over the years, numerous individuals have been identified as evading U.S. taxes by hiding income in offshore banks, brokerage accounts or nominee entities, using debit cards, credit cards or wire transfers to access the funds. Others have employed foreign trusts, employee-leasing schemes, private annuities or insurance plans for the same purpose.

The IRS uses information gained from its investigations to pursue taxpayers with undeclared accounts, as well as the banks and bankers suspected of helping clients hide their assets overseas. The IRS works closely with the Department of Justice (DOJ) to prosecute tax evasion cases.

While there are legitimate reasons for maintaining financial accounts abroad, there are reporting requirements that need to be fulfilled. U.S. taxpayers who maintain such accounts and who do not comply with reporting and disclosure requirements are breaking the law and risk significant penalties and fines, as well as the possibility of criminal prosecution.

Since 2009, 38,000 individuals have come forward voluntarily to disclose their foreign financial accounts, taking advantage of special opportunities to comply with the U.S. tax system and resolve their tax obligations. And, with new foreign account reporting requirements being phased in over the next few years, hiding income offshore will become increasingly more difficult.

At the beginning of 2012, the IRS reopened the Offshore Voluntary Disclosure Program (OVDP) following continued strong interest from taxpayers and tax practitioners after the closure of the 2011 and 2009 programs. The IRS continues working on a wide range of international tax issues and follows ongoing efforts with DOJ to pursue criminal prosecution of international tax evasion. This program will be open for an indefinite period until otherwise announced.

The IRS has collected \$5.5 billion so far from people who participated in offshore voluntary disclosure programs since 2009.

"Free Money" from the IRS & Tax Scams Involving Social Security

Flyers and advertisements for free money from the IRS, suggesting that the taxpayer can file a tax return with little or no documentation, have been appearing in community churches around the country. These schemes promise refunds to people who have little or no income and normally don't have a tax filing requirement – and are also often spread by word of mouth as unsuspecting and well-intentioned people tell their friends and relatives.

Scammers prey on low income individuals and the elderly and members of church congregations with bogus promises of free money. They build false hopes and charge people good money for bad advice including encouraging taxpayers to make fictitious claims for refunds or rebates based on false statements

of entitlement to tax credits. For example, some promoters claim they can obtain for their victims, often senior citizens, a tax refund or nonexistent stimulus payment based on the American Opportunity Tax Credit, even if the victim was not enrolled in or paying for college. Con artists also falsely claim that refunds are available even if the victim went to school decades ago. In the end, the victims discover their claims are rejected. Meanwhile, the promoters are long gone. The IRS warns all taxpayers to remain vigilant.

There are also a number of tax scams involving Social Security. For example, scammers have been known to lure the unsuspecting with promises of non-existent Social Security refunds or rebates. In another situation, a taxpayer may really be due a credit or refund but uses inflated information to complete the return.

Beware: Intentional mistakes of this kind can result in a \$5,000 penalty.

Impersonation of Charitable Organizations

Another long-standing type of abuse or fraud is scams that occur in the wake of significant natural disasters.

Following major disasters, it's common for scam artists to impersonate charities to get money or private information from well-intentioned taxpayers. Scam artists use a variety of tactics. Some scammers operating bogus charities may contact people by telephone or email to solicit money or financial information. They may even directly contact disaster victims and claim to be working for or on behalf of the IRS to help the victims file casualty loss claims and get tax refunds.

They may attempt to get personal financial information or Social Security numbers that can be used to steal the victims' identities or financial resources. Bogus websites may solicit funds for disaster victims. As in the case of a recent disaster, Hurricane Sandy, the IRS cautions both victims of natural disasters and people wishing to make charitable donations to avoid scam artists by following these tips:

- To help disaster victims, donate to recognized charities.
- Be wary of charities with names that are similar to familiar or nationally known organizations. Some phony charities use names or websites that sound or look like those of respected, legitimate organizations. IRS.gov has a search feature, Exempt Organizations Select Check, which allows people to find legitimate, qualified charities to which donations may be tax-deductible.
- Don't give out personal financial information, such as Social Security numbers or credit card and bank account numbers and passwords, to anyone who solicits a contribution from you. Scam artists may use this information to steal your identity and money.
- Don't give or send cash. For security and tax record purposes, contribute by check or credit card or another way that provides documentation of the gift.

Call the IRS toll-free disaster assistance telephone number (1-866-562-5227) if you are a disaster victim with specific questions about tax relief or disaster related tax issues.

False/Inflated Income and Expenses

Including income that was never earned, either as wages or as self-employment income in order to maximize refundable credits, is another popular scam. Claiming income you did not earn or expenses you did not pay in order to secure larger refundable credits such as the Earned Income Tax Credit could have serious repercussions. This could result in repaying the erroneous refunds, including interest and penalties, and in some cases, even prosecution.

Additionally, some taxpayers

are filing excessive claims for the fuel tax credit. Farmers and other taxpayers who use fuel for off-highway business purposes may be eligible for the fuel tax credit. But other individuals have claimed the tax credit although they were not eligible. Fraud involving the fuel tax credit is considered a frivolous tax claim and can result in a penalty of \$5,000.

False Form 1099 Refund Claims

In some cases, individuals have made refund claims based on the bogus theory that the federal government maintains secret accounts for U.S. citizens and that taxpayers can gain access to the accounts by issuing 1099-OID forms to the IRS. In this ongoing scam, the perpetrator files a fake information return, such as a Form 1099 Original Issue Discount (OID), to justify a false refund claim on a corresponding tax return.

Don't fall prey to people who encourage you to claim deductions or credits to which you are not entitled or willingly allow others to use your information to file false returns. If you are a party to such schemes, you could be liable for financial penalties or even face criminal prosecution.

Frivolous Arguments

Promoters of frivolous schemes encourage taxpayers to make unreasonable and outlandish claims to avoid paying the taxes they owe. The IRS has a list of frivolous tax arguments that taxpayers should avoid. These arguments are false and have been thrown out of court. While taxpayers have the right to contest their tax liabilities in court, no one has the right to disobey the law.

Falsely Claiming Zero Wages

Filing a phony information return is an illegal way to lower the amount of taxes an individual owes. Typically, a Form 4852 (Substitute Form W-2) or a "corrected" Form 1099 is used as a way to improperly reduce taxable income to zero. The taxpayer may also submit a statement rebutting wages and taxes reported by a payer to the IRS.

Sometimes, fraudsters even include an explanation on their Form 4852 that cites statutory language on the definition of wages or may include some reference to a paying company that refuses to issue a corrected Form W-2 for fear of IRS retaliation. Taxpayers should resist any temptation to participate in any variations of this scheme. Filing this type of return may result in a \$5,000 penalty.

Disguised Corporate Ownership

Third parties are improperly used to request employer identification numbers and form corporations that obscure the true ownership of the business.

These entities can be used to underreport income, claim fictitious deductions, avoid filing tax returns, participate in listed transactions and facilitate money laundering, and financial crimes. The IRS is working with state authorities to identify these entities and bring the owners into compliance with the law.

Misuse of Trusts

For years, unscrupulous promoters have urged taxpayers to transfer assets into trusts. While there are legitimate uses of trusts in tax and estate planning, some highly questionable transactions promise reduction of income subject to tax, deductions for personal expenses and reduced estate or gift taxes. Such trusts rarely deliver the tax benefits promised and are used primarily as a means of avoiding income tax liability and hiding assets from creditors, including the IRS.

IRS personnel have seen an increase in the improper use of private annuity trusts and foreign trusts to shift income and deduct personal expenses. As with other arrangements, taxpayers should seek the advice of a trusted professional before entering a trust arrangement.

Compassion Quiets the Mind, Improves the Body, Embraces the World

For most it probably seemed like a pretty insignificant coincidence (if anyone even noticed). For me it was proof positive of the remarkable influence for good included in human consciousness.

I was sitting in a breakout session a couple weeks ago with about 50 or 60 others at the "Practicing Mindfulness & Compassion" conference hosted by the U.C. Berkeley-based Greater Good Science Center (GGSC). Immediately adjacent to us were three or four other breakout sessions, with only the thinnest of walls separating us. The concrete floor, high ceiling, and massive windows throughout the converted assembly plant we were meeting in only served to amplify all the discussions taking place.

At one point our group leader, Dr. Paul Gilbert, professor of clinical psychology at the University of Derby in England, took us through a "guided meditation" where we were asked to visualize our "critical self." Although our group was completely silent

during this time (after all, we were meditating), I couldn't help but notice the chattering and laughing going on in the rooms around us.

This was followed by a brief discussion of our impressions – what did the "critical self" feel like, what did it look like, and so on.

Dr. Gilbert then asked us to spend some time thinking about our "compassionate self." This was when something extraordinary happened.

"What did that feel like? What did it look like? What did you notice?" asked Dr. Gilbert. After listening to a few responses, I raised my hand.

"I noticed that for the first time in almost an hour this entire building was completely silent."

Although this may not have been exactly what Dr. Gilbert was looking for, I went on say that it seemed to me that by embracing a compassionate frame of mind – giving up any sense of judgment, remorse, guilt, anger, fear – we were able to quiet not only our own thoughts but instill quietness for many others as well; most noticeably those in the surrounding breakout sessions.

Was this a coincidence? A classic case of positive thinking or mind over matter? I don't think so. I've always felt that whatever sense of mental or physical peace we might experience isn't the result of our getting a whole bunch of individual minds to be in sync but, instead, is a natural response to the intentions of a singular divine Mind – a Mind that, in this instance, enabled us to see in others, consciously or not, what we were beginning to see in ourselves.

In other words, compassion

begets compassion, which an increasing number of scientific studies show leads to healthy minds, bodies, and societies – not to mention quiet conference centers.

Earlier in the day I had a chance to chat with world-renowned meditation teacher and best-selling author, Dr. Jon Kabat-Zinn, about this. In response to my question about the source of compassion he said, "It comes from the realization of our interconnectedness." Like the right hand naturally reaching out to remove a splinter lodged in the left, compassion is a natural, inevitable and, I might add, divinely inspired inclination.

Even more than a desire to relieve the suffering of others, compassion is born of an innate recognition that we are all embraced in a universal and unconditional love. Although all too often this recognition lies buried beneath the stress of circumstance, this doesn't mean it's beyond our capacity to discover, uncover, and benefit from.

All it takes is a willingness to listen and the humility to respond.

Another painting, "Rutherford Vineyard" (1989), is the largest painting in the show (88" by 88") and one of several the museum owns. The horizontal shadows of the grapevine rows and the slanting stakes create visual action, drawing the viewer's eyes into the distant hills. This vibrant painting has been transformed into an artist-signed poster for the exhibit which is being sold at the Museum Store. A gorgeous show catalog, masterfully-written by Scott A. Shields, Chief Curator and Associate Director of the Crocker Art Museum, can also be bought here. The museum's first floor, where the store and cafe is located, is open to the public without admission.

"El Capitan, Yosemite" (1990) is a massive and majestic painting celebrating the beauty of this national park. More than any other artist, Kondos has been artist-in-residence there, living in a cabin for a number of month-long residencies.

The Chinese revere his Yosemite paintings. Several Chinese museums have displayed them or have his work in their collections. Three years ago the Sacramento artist and gallery owner, Shimo, who was born in China, invited Kondos to show with him at a world exposition in China. Kondos has since been invited to exhibit his Yosemite landscapes at the Ningbo Museum of Art and the Shanghai Art Museum. Kondos

was the first non-Chinese painter whose work was included in the Ningbo Museum of Art's collection. Another Chinese museum, the Museum of Contemporary Art in Shanghai, has begun to collect his paintings. That's not surprising, as the Chinese have a long artistic tradition of capturing nature with spontaneous, minimal brushstrokes, as Kondos also does. Currently, Kondos is getting ready to send 15 paintings to an art gallery in China. "The Chinese are crazy about me. They really respect me and what I'm trying to achieve with


my work," says Kondos. Kondos has also shown his paintings at the Zapion in Athens, Greece.

The painter's first visit to Greece in 1963, where his parents were born, was a turning point for him. "The two colors that dominate Greece are blue and white: The blue of the air and the ocean, and the bright white buildings." His trips to Greece transformed how he used light and shadow to create greater dimensionality in his paintings. One outstanding example in the Crocker show is "Metora, Monastery of the


Holy Trinity" (2006). The monastery, built in the 14th century, is perched at the pinnacle of a steep, high, narrow butte.

In addition to the Crocker show, there is an exhibit at Sacramento City College. While art instructor in the mid-70's there, Kondos was the director of the Little Gallery. When he retired in 1982 after 27 years at the college, the gallery was renamed after him. In stark contrast to the Crocker show, the Kondos Gallery exhibit spotlights the artist's graphite and pen and ink drawings, mostly small, with some larger charcoal drawings. These elegantly-grouped drawings are gestural studies of Greek island villages, New Mexican pueblos and other structures, irises and tulips and such American monuments as the Grand Canyon of Arizona and the Statue of Liberty in New York City. This exhibit, curated by Suzanne Adan, also spans 50 years of the artist's work, but this is an exhibit of his sketches, which are the starting point or foundation of his paintings. Like his paintings, the drawings demonstrate his masterful skills at capturing space, light and shadow to create dimensionality and depth of field, often with just a few simple strokes of a pencil or pen.

When traveling, Kondos always keeps a small sketch pad in his pocket so he can draw anytime he sees a scene that captivates him. "You never know when a drawing will become a

painting," says the artist. Kondos keeps every drawing he creates, keeping them in files. His wife, Moni Van Camp Kondos, drives the car wherever they travel and Kondos draws as she drives and wherever they stop. This show is very precious to the couple as these drawings remind them of their many travels together and their love of drawing. "I'm from the old school of art," stresses Kondos. "Learn to draw well first - it is the skeleton of a painting; the paint is the flesh. If you can't draw, you can't paint!"
