The majority of funding for these important projects comes from Proposition 1E, Disaster Preparedness and Flood Prevention, a voter approved program to "rebuild and repair California's most vulnerable flood control structures to protect homes and prevent loss of life from flood-related disasters, including levee failures, flash floods, and mudslides. Proposition 1E passed with 64 percent of the vote on the

November 7, 2006 General Election Ballot.

These budget proposals will now move to the Senate Budget Committee for its approval.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - (MPG) Average retail gasoline prices in Sacramento have fallen 6.4 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.90/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 720 gas outlets in Sacramento. This compares with the national average that has fallen 2.5 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.64/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Sacramento during the past week, prices yesterday were 34.0 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 17.5 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 9.5 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 21.9 cents per gallon lower than this day one year ago.

"Average gasoline prices have continued to quietly move lower in the last week across much of the United States at a time of year when we historically are accustomed to seeing prices move higher," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan.

Nurturing Gardens in Carmichael

CARMICHAEL, CA - (MPG) As garden parties go, it was low on lemonade; high on labor.

Ending a community program to promote sustainable landscaping, 15 volunteers last fall bent their backs to apply theory to a real yard. Areas of Randy and Elayne Anderson's Carmichael yard were overgrown and water wasting. Three days of prepping and a Saturday team effort saw it transformed with Mediterraneanstyle plantings, a designer river bed and efficient irrigation."It was great to see so many people pitching together to get this done," said semi-retired teacher Elayne. "Hands-on experience consolidates what you learn."

The Andersons' good fortune was also a harvest for 58 gardening-loving Carmichael families. Their Blue Thumb Neighbors

program included free workshops taught by landscape, irrigation and botanical experts. "Blue Thumb" denotes a commitment to water conservation and river protection. The course was one of a series sponsored by the Regional Water Authority and water providers (Carmichael Water District in this case) – in association with neighborhood groups. In previous summers, Natomas, Roseville and Rosemont got the Blue Thumb treatment. Carmichael broke the record for household participation. "It's about community pride," considers program coordinator Christine Kohn. "We love our gardens. But we know we can't continue to waste water; that we must protect what goes into our river and creeks."

A new state mandate requires water providers to reduce per capita water use 20 percent by 2020. Learning that 65 per cent of potable household water goes on gardens — and that 35 per cent of this deluge is wasted by poor irrigation — is a cool splash in the face to Carmichaelites now subject to metering. "Reducing outdoor watering is the easiest way to achieve lower water use," says program instructor Don Smith. Water management expert Smith adds: "English-style gardens suit an English climate. We don't have that here."

Workshop teacher Cheryl Buckwalter promotes a garden style called "new California landscape." "It's not really new," she qualifies. "It uses plants that have always thrived here." Buckwalter is not talking tumbleweed or cacti: in-vogue are rock rose, lamb's ear; nandina, California fuchsia, margaritabop and Mexican sage. All offer flower and foliage contrasts. All attract birds and beneficial insects.

plant what suits this climate. Blue Thumb classes taught us that creating plant zones (grouping plants of similar water needs) reduces water use. Mediterranean plants are attractive when they're nicely placed. In our area, a rock "creek bed" is more artistically appropriate than a mermaid. Our river stones are more beautiful than garden fountains." Most importantly, she adds: "they don't need water."



Traumatic Brain Injury Signs are Often Misinterpreted or Ignored

SACRAMENTO, CA - (MPG) Given an estimated 225,000 Californians living with traumatic brain injury (TBI), it's hard to understand how the signs of TBIs can be missed, misinterpreted or simply ignored. And yet, they are. The most common TBIs are concussions, nearly 3.8 million of which are caused by sports and recreation activities in the United States annually, as reported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Norma Vescovo, founder and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Independent Living Center of Southern California, Inc. (ILCSC), has seen an increase in the number of TBIs, including concussions or mild TBIs, at ILCSC and fully understands why TBIs are often missed.

"The majority of individuals who come to ILCSC don't realize they have an injury because TBIs, like concussions, can't be seen," said Vescovo.

Initially, individuals may experience any one of a number of symptoms, including confusion, concentration difficulties, dizziness or, most commonly, memory loss, all of which are also experienced by people who don't have

as they try to figure out what is wrong with them, but don't associate this with the TBI," explained Vescovo. "Nor do their families and friends code the behavior as being associated with the TBI. The unspoken expectation is that an individual with a brain injury will return to his or her 'normal' behavior, but he or she doesn't. And this is where Independent Living Centers (ILCs) can help."

Serving individuals living with disabilities, older adults and military veterans throughout Southern California, ILCSC, similar to other ILCs, provides a wide range of support and services to individuals living with a TBI. Some of these include evaluations, vocational and in-dependent living skills training, housing assistance, assistive technology, support groups and job coaching and placement.

ILCs also work closely with other organizations and providers in educating the community on the challenges, barriers and options for people living with disabilities.

"In the case of TBIs, educating the community is particularly important," states Vescovo. "Because TBIs are often misunderstood, it is critical to make the community aware of the nuances of such disabilities in order to better serve the individuals who live with them."

for Acute Rehabilitation for Mercy General Hospital Lynda Eaton, PT thinks the stigma of having or being associated with a TBI is the biggest barrier to increasing awareness. Eaton be-lieves that eliminating stigma is particularly difficult given individuals with TBIs are not happy to broadcast that they have a TBI because they don't want to become labeled as unintelligent.

As co-chair of Sacramento's Walk For Brain Injury, Eaton said, "We don't get the turnout you see with breast cancer and other diseases where people come out in tens of thousands with advocacy representatives. The brain injury community is different. Fewer people with TBI or their family members want to join the cause and be advocates. The stigma is so significant."

Eaton continued, "ILCs are not only our connection to services for people with TBI, such as low-cost housing and case management, but we rely on them for advocacy as well. If anyone can convince our clients to advocate for themselves, it's the staff at ILCs."

The California State Independent Living Council is an independent state agency which, in cooperation with the California State Department of Rehabilitation, prepares and monitors the State Plan for Independent Living.



Wind Driven Apartment Fire Quickly Knocked Down

Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District Report

ARDEN ARCADE, CA – (MPG) On March 22, 2013 at 04:29 p.m. Metro Fire units were dispatched to a report of an apartment fire on the 2400 block of Marconi Ave. The first arriving Metro Fire units reported a working fire in one of the upstairs apartments. Knowing that the high winds could drive the fire into the adjoining units,



firefighters rapidly deployed multiple hose lines to extinguish the fire and protect the other units. Additional firefighter searched for victims and ensured that the fire had not extended into the neighboring units. No victims were found and the fire was contained to the unit of origin.

Q: I recently changed my address through the DMV website. I have yet to receive a new ID. If I get pulled over, will I get cited for having an incorrect address on my license?

A: Great job on utilizing the DMV online services! Though you changed your address in our system, you will not be issued a new Driver License.

Type or write your new address on a small piece of paper with your signature and date. Keep it with your driver license and if pulled over you will not be cited. SHOTGUNS

A 12-gauge shotgun with a 3-inch chamber is probably the favorite of most turkey hunters, but a 20-gauge will also do a good job at reasonable ranges, and its lighter weight and recoil make it better for women and young hunters.

No matter what turkey gun you use, you need to do three things before taking it hunting. First, shoot it at a turkey head target to make sure it hits where it is aimed. Guns that shoot nearly a foot off

the point of aim are not unheard of and that means a missed or wounded bird.
Individual guns can be picky about shot size and load. Try several loads to find one your gun shoots best. Finally, find out how far your gun shoots a good pattern. That is your maximum range.
The "best" range for most 12-gauge guns is about 40 yards



It's not impossible to find a decent salvage car. But I'd take extra precautions to find out exactly why it was salvaged. If it's a salvage car because it was wrecked, I'd take a look at what kind of wreck caused the damage. Lots of people know how to repair and rebuild cars, so it might end up in better condition than before if you find the right mechanic. On the other hand, I'd probably walk away if the vehicle had been flooded. Some people claim they can fix waterlogged cars, but that's a tough job. In most cases water just doesn't do very nice things to onboard computer systems and wiring.

Regardless, do as much research as you can into the car's history. See if CARFAX has a record. But if the seller doesn't know anything and other searches don't turn up good information, my advice is to say no. Make sure you check with your insurance company before you make the purchase too. Salvage cars are sometimes





Medicare: Did You Really Pay for That?

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - (MPG) Last summer, Barack Obama riled a lot of entrepreneurs when he got carried away at a campaign event and told any American who had built up a successful enterprise, "you didn't build that." An even greater backlash awaits any politician who dares to tell Medicare recipients, "You didn't pay for that"-for there are far more seniors than entrepreneurs in our country.

Time after time during Election Year 2012, seniors and near-seniors reacted to the slightest mention of Medicare reform with indignation and the emphatic insistence, "Don't you dare touch Medicare; I've paid for it!" There is only one problem with that statement: In a mathematical sense, it isn't true.

The amount that American workers have paid and are paying into Medicare isn't enough to fund all the benefits that are being paid out to seniors under Medicare. The trustees of Medicare have stated that the promises they have made exceed their projected revenues by tens of trillions of dollars. Senator Tom Coburn (a physician in private life) has estimated that the average American couple contributes approximately \$110,000 to Medicare over their working careers and receives over \$330,000 of Medicare benefits. On Feb. 20, USA Today cited Urban Institute data pegging those same figures at \$88,000 and \$387,000, respectively. There are differing estimates of the size of the gap, but clearly Medicare suffers from an unsustainable funding deficit.

Let me hasten to say that I have sympathy for those who make the "I paid for it" case.

Through decades of their working lives, millions of seniors paid into the system and were promised that Medicare would be there for them starting at age 65. These citizens played by the rules, acted in good faith, and held up their end of the bargain.

The problem is that the politicians in Washington have not acted in good faith. Instead, they have committed a gigantic fraud by underfunding the program. The fact of the matter is that we've been swindled, and the anger and sense of pending betrayal that many seniors feel is understandable. At the same time, we, the people, need to accept some responsibility for this sorry state of affairs.

Certainly, the members of Congress and presidents who allowed the imbalance between Medicare income and expenditures to get so out of whack are ethically culpable. Still, "we the people" share some responsibility for the Medicare fiasco. The mistake was naïveté and gullibility. We can see now what an enormous mistake it was to trust politicians' promises.

Regrets and recriminations aside, the question now is: Where do we go from here? What are our options? The only way that the oncoming flood of baby boomers will be able to receive all the Medicare benefits that they were promised would be to either increase payments into the system or reduce disbursements from it.

We already have seen how volatile, contentious, and divisive the political strife over Medicare has been. Sadly, it is likely to get much worse. Generations will be arrayed against generations.

On the one side, gray-haired Americans will demand that the promises made to them, and for which they upheld their end of the bargain, be kept. The

progressives have played a masterful political game; they will have huge numbers of average Americans who think of themselves as anything but socialists egging them on and supporting them in their quest to absorb and appropriate more property. The great American middle class, which has the most to lose when Big Government supplants the private sector, will be energetically demanding some of the very policies that will crush the life out of the economy.

On the other side, at some point the younger generations are going to rebel against the debt slavery to which they have been subjected, and they will push back as a matter of economic survival and a desire to feel as free as their elders once did. Responding to pressure from the young, the federal healthcare blob inevitably will ration health care.

What a terrible price Americans will pay for falling for the seductive promise of a benign government caring for us all in our old age. Not only will the country be poorer and less free, but the quality of health care itself is bound to decline-all while our societv is riven between young and old when the common enemy is the idea that the compulsory economic relations imposed by government comprise a way of life that is somehow more just, more harmonious, more helpful, and more prosperous than a society in which each individual's life and property are his own and economic exchanges are voluntary (i.e., a society in which people are free).

Rancho Seco Recreational Area to Host Fishing Derby

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) Pack up the tackle box, load up the rod and reel and head out to the Sacramento Municipal Utility District's (SMUD) annual trout derby at Rancho Seco Recreational Area on April 6 and 7. Fishing enthusiasts hooking the heaviest trout win cash prizes at this popular event. The fishing event has become a tradition for many and has attracted thousands of local anglers since starting in 1993.

Anglers can cast a line into the 160-acre lake from the shoreline or one of six fishing piers. Small boats with electric motors are also allowed (no gas motors). In addition to trout, the freshwater lake is home to bass, bluegill, red-ear sunfish, crappie and catfish. Just in time for the derby, Rancho Seco Lake was recently stocked with 1,500 pounds of trout and 500 pounds of trophy trout.

Gates open at 6 a.m. and close at 5 p.m., rain or shine. Derby tickets are \$5 per person plus a daily park fee available at the park gate both days. A valid California state fishing license is required for those 16 or older. Anglers hoping to win a cash prize must check in their fish before 5 p.m. on the day of the catch. Cash prizes will be awarded to those catching the heaviest fish in three separate categories – adult, youth and kids.

The 400-acre Rancho Seco Recreational Area offers more than just fishing. The full-service facility offers picnicking facilities, RV and tent camping sites, and beach and swimming areas.

Rancho Seco Recreational Area is 35 miles south of Sacramento, approximately 15 minutes east of Highway 99 on Twin Cities Road. The park is owned and operated by SMUD. Admission to the park is \$10 per car (\$8 for seniors).

The Dow Jones is Lying

The Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA) is at a record high, and the unemployment rate has ticked down to 7.7 percent, but this is no time to celebrate. The economy is still in the doldrums.

A little perspective: The news media trumpet changes in the Dow as though it tells us almost all we need to know about the economic fate of the American people. That's nonsense. Not everyone thinks the arbitrary index of 30 busily traded bluechip stocks is terribly relevant to gauging the condition of the economy. Moreover, the

average, which reflects the daily change in the companies' stock prices, is not adjusted for inflation. In nominal terms the Dow hit a record high of 14,447.29 this month. But in real adjusted terms, the average is only at the level reached in the year 2000. In other words, if you invested in the companies that year, you're no richer now, because the dollar has depreciated thanks to the Federal Reserve. That doesn't sound so remarkable.

Fixation on the Dow might encourage neglect of other, less upbeat economic indicators. While the DJIA soared, the unemployment rate dropped to only 7.7 percent last month, which is disturbingly high, especially when you consider that the Great Recession officially ended more than three and a half years ago. Even better light is shed on the employment picture by

looking at the civil employment-population ratio. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, before the recession the rate was over 63 percent. During the recession it hit a low of slightly over 58 percent and has barely recovered since. (In the late 1990s it was close to 65 percent.)

In light of such dismal signs, how are we to account for the stock market? The Federal Reserve is working hard to keep key interest rates close to zero. The Fed has bought hundreds of billions of dollars in long-term government securities ("Operation Twist") in order to lower the return from such investments. This drives money seeking a bigger return into the stock market and commodities. If this explains the run-up in stock prices, it sounds more like a bubble than a marker of

returning economic growth.

The government and its central bank, in fact, have done virtually everything wrong if their intention was to put the economy on a sustainable path to prosperity. The recession was caused by distortions created by government housing and monetary policies. Instead of backing off and letting the economy realign with real economic factors, the Obama administration and the Bernanke Fed seem intent on reinflating the pre-recession housing bubble as well as inflating a new stockmarket bubble. (The Fed has also been buying up mortgage bonds from banks to help stimulate housing sales.)

This is a dangerous path. By definition, such artificially induced frenzies cannot be sustained. When officials get nervous and pull back, the bubbles will burst and the economy

will be back in recession. Even if employment gains are made during the apparent recovery, they will be short-lived, and the unemployment rate will turn up again. This government policy, therefore, is a cruel hoax on workers who were harmed by the earlier recession, who have struggled to get back on track, and who are now being set up for a reprise of their misery.

The architects of this shameful program are would-be social engineers who think they can design something as complex as a modern industrial economy. Such conceit should be obvious to all. Simply put, it is impossible for politicians, bureaucrats, and economic advisers to acquire the knowledge they would need to possess in order to accomplish what they say they want to accomplish. The knowledge most vital for smooth-running

markets is not aggregate statistical data available to government agencies. Rather, it consists in the subjective preferences of consumers, the expectations of producers, and the radically decentralized and dispersed information about resources, technologies, and techniques. The market's price system captures and conveys this information in a way that government operatives could never dream of. In fact, compared to the collective wisdom of the market process, politicians, bureaucrats, and economic advisers are dismal ignoramuses.

It's time they learned some humility and let us alone.



Pastor Joe: The Challenges of Making a Comeback in Life

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA- (MPG) The 1300-1400 blocks of C Street in Sacramento is an encapsulated thoroughfare for the displaced and disadvantaged.

One of the neighborhood organizations offering assistance is Safehaven Ministries of Sacramento, Inc., where "Pastor Joe" Talancon is the senior chaplain. "There are a lot of groups who come out here, drive up with food and clothes, and leave. But, they're not hanging out, building relationships.'

Talancon knows the challenges of making a comeback in life. His parents were "swingers" and drug use was a constant in his Fair Oaks childhood home. "I like to say I grew up in the devil's den."

He was evicted from Bella Vista High School, then La Vista (a continuation school) for getting high and stealing. He overcame the addictions of drug, alcohol, and smoking, and survived three divorces.

He joined the Army to get healthy, serving five years in Germany, and a year in Fort Riley, Kansas. "In Germany I was still getting high.

They didn't test for acid." After his father died of cancer, his mother was diagnosed

with multiple sclerosis and her parents took her into their home. When Talancon learned that his grandfather had been molesting her, he took her out, and cared for her until a convalescent home became necessary

"I was back in the streets, running hard; back to what I was in before I joined the Army.

"I decided at the age of 37 that I was done. I went to bed for a month, got rid of everybody in my life, and ended up getting clean.

"A month later, my third wife acknowledged she had

a problem with alcohol and codeine. She went through the Kaiser outpatient program and got clean. About six months later, she became pregnant with my only child, a daughter. In 2005, she got really sick. Got her to the hospital on Friday. On Sunday, she died from sclerosis and liver damage.

"I made a covenant with God that if he would take better care of me - my diabetes was out of control and I was overweight - so I could raise my daughter (who was seven at the time), then I would go the streets and preach to the homeless."

In 2002, he bought a clutch shop, but his employees ran it. "I was gone for almost a year spinning out of control - not getting high or anything – just not knowing if I was coming or going."

Meanwhile, Pamela Jaspar, a woman who sang with him in a community choir, invited him to join her and a minister to feed the homeless. The two began seriously dating.

He returned to the shop. "It supported the ministry to feed the homeless. We fed about 350 out here every Saturday."

He also set up a church in the shop for about six months. "The beams have metal crosses throughout the shop."

The shop, however, wasn't succeeding at the necessary level, so he walked away from it. He and Pamela married, but his tow truck business went under. "I was making money here and there, helping at shops, working cars, or helping with recycling appliances. Pamela was working full-time and putting up with me.

"I was taking food, clothes, furniture to people who were just getting into apartments and didn't have anything. I even had a food closet in my motherin-law's garage in South Sacramento. There were bakeries who gave us bread. We did that for about a year."

In addition to serving as community chaplain with the Sacramento Law Enforcement Chaplaincy (providing death notifications for the coroner and other agencies after suicides, murders), he now has an office through which he can provide assistance and ministry to those who need it most.

"This last year, we had almost 500 breakfast burritos on Christmas morning, and we had 35 sleeping bags to give away, but 200 people. Since we've been out here, we haven't seen any fights in our lines. If they didn't need a sleeping bag, they gave it back and took something else – beanie, pair of gloves, scarf, blanket, or jacket. Instead of being greedy, they shared with each other. It took years to get to that point. I've seen stabbings in lines, fist fights. You've got to be able to reassure them that there's enough, and that we'll be back.


"We also work with Interfaith Council. They have donated close to 3,000 sleeping bags in the last three years.

"We want churches throughout Sacramento to accept the homeless into their churches on Sunday; to bus them out and back. If we expect our homeless to become mainstream acceptable, we have to show them that they're acceptable to




