

Jesuit Boys' Soccer Finishes Ranked

No. 1 in Country by Maxpreps

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - (MPG) On Tuesday February 19, 2013, the new American River College parking structure opened to students. The construction of the \$24.5 million project, which also included a new student center and design area, is complete. It was built in part using taxpayer money provided by Measure M and is the second such structure to be completed in the Los Rios Community College District.

Since its inception in 1955, American River College has had a long standing tradition of teaching excellence but parking nightmares. Members of the surrounding Carmichael community have since dealt with

late and angry drivers, fighting for open curb every morning for decades. But it has been no picnic for students either, some reported driving around for more than 30 minutes to find open parking spots.

The massive pre-cast concrete structure, on the southernmost edge of the ARC campus, will feature four elevators, three staircases, 15 electric vehicle plug-in spots and 26 handicapped stalls. A grand stair on the north side of the structure welcomes students into the campus, as the project was designed primarily for pedestrian safety. Portions of its architectural features were mimicked from various parts of the existing campus, such as the library and fly tower over the Theater Arts

building.

A landscaped driveway leads cars in and out of the structure; a fenced pedestrian bridge passes over the roadway and leads students towards the campus. Several students admiring the pathway compared its likeness to a "theme park" entrance.

Dedication of the new structure took place on February 14 in front of more than 150 students, residents and school administrators. Dr. David Viar, ARC President, spoke to the to"student success." Also briefly speaking was LRCCD Board President Pamela Haynes and ARC Associated Student Body Vice President Omba Kipuke.

A Super-Charged vehicle, provided by the ARC Automotive

Technologies Department, was officially the first car to break the red ribbon and park in the new garage. A few dignitaries along with driver Ben French gave thumbs-up as the vehicle passed through the entrance and parked on the fifth floor. A reception for all whom attended was set up on the top floor and a tour of the amenities was available directly after the short ceremony.


Parking in the structure is open to the public with either a crowd and dedicated the project valid parking permit or a daily pass, available from machines located on each floor.

Students and residents alike praised the college for its beautiful expansion and now ample parking.

Snow Survey Shows Continuing Dry Conditions

SACRAMENTO Region, CA - (MPG) Snow surveyors have confirmed that water content in the mountain snowpack is well below normal for this date. The snowpack hasn't actually lost much water content since the season's first survey on January 2, when it was 134 percent of normal for that date, but it hasn't continued to build as winter has deepened because of the continuing warm weather that set in after the storms of late November and early December. In other words, the snowpack has not kept pace with the calendar.

As a result, the snowpack water content is only 66 percent of average for this time of year, and only 57 percent of the average April 1 reading, when the snowpack normally is at its peak before beginning to melt into the state's streams, reservoirs and aquifers. The snowpack – often called California's "frozen reservoir "- normally provides about a third of the water for California's farms and communities.



With no precipitation in the forecast, the Northern California region whose storms fill key reservoirs that supply water to farms and millions of Californians is headed toward the driest January-February on record (since 1920).

This is the normally rain-rich, mountainous area from Shasta Lake in the north to the American River basin in the south, where a scant 2.2 inches of rain has fallen since December, 13 percent of

The next driest January-February was in 1991, with 4 inches of precipitation. Forecasters note there could be a weather turnaround in March, but it is unlikely late-season storms will make up the water supply deficit.

"Near-record dry weather combined with pumping restrictions to protect Delta smelt are making this a gloomy water supply year," said Department of Water Resources Director Mark Cowin

'This scenario is exactly why we need an alternative water conveyance system as proposed in the Bay Delta Conservation Plan to both protect fish species and give California a reliable water supply."

"It means a lot to be honored by MaxPreps and the Army National Guard," said Jesuit head coach Paul Rose. "MaxPreps is a very objective ranking system, unlike other polls. I like this because it recognizes all the hard work the boys put in and the difficulty in our schedule." Coach Rose was inducted into the Sac-Joaquin Section Hall of Fame this season and he holds the distinction as the soccer coach with most wins in the state of California.

The Jesuit Marauders traveled extensively this season, finding tough competition wherever they went. Their only loss came against Jesuit of Portland, Oregon and their only tie was to Granite Bay – who they later beat in the championship game – in the Capital Challenge.

Jesuit Boys' Soccer Finishes Ranked No. 1 in Country by Maxpreps

While there were some games that the boys did not play well, those games ended up being one of the keys to their success as they helped the Marauders prepare for tougher games ahead.

The Jesuit offense was built on speed. Coach Rose believes that this team had the most speed on the front line of any team he has coached in his 34-year career. Niko Hansen, the Delta River League Player of the Year and an All-American, led the team with 35 goals and 16 assists. Hansen will play for New Mexico next fall. Joining Hansen on offense were senior Kaba Alkebulan (Cal Poly San Luis Obispo) and junior Evan Barrett. Alkebulan netted 18 goals and 12 assists while Barrett added 16 goals and 10 assists.

Jesuit's defense was incredibly strong all season. They did not allow a single goal in 23 of

their 29 games. Defenders Evan Glass (senior), Andrew Gosseln (senior), Anthony Ayala (junior), John Bovill (junior) and Matt Nemeth (junior) all contributed to that effort.

Master Sergeant Burlington Willardson of the California Army National Guard presented Coach Rose and the Marauders with the Army National Guard national ranking trophy at a spring sports assembly on Friday.

"For the first time, Army National Guard representatives will present the Army National Guard national ranking trophy to nationally ranked boys soccer teams," said LTC Christian J. Johnson of the Army National Guard. "We take great pride in doing so because the trophy symbolizes the indomitable spirit common to high school athletes and the U.S. Soldier. It is our honor to share this symbol with the team, coaches, parents,

MaxPreps uses an intricate computer program to determine team rank – known as the "MaxPreps Freeman Rankings." Prior season history, school size, and comments on message boards are not considered in the MaxPreps rankings. The computer-based system utilizes the huge number of game results stored in the MaxPreps database. Generally, the more a team wins the higher the ranking, but the system also takes into account quality wins (against other highly ranked opponents) and strength of schedule. For example, a team's ranking is hurt more by losing to a team that





What Should I Do If I am Missing My W-2?

If you are missing your w-2 you could call the IRS and inform them that you are missing your w-2. Before calling them make sure you contact your employer. If they don't respond then make the call to the IRS. Have your information available such as your Social Security number to verify your identity. They may ask you about your previous filing status. Even if you don't know it that would not stop the conversation. At least you should provide them with Social Security, your address and possibly your birth date.

Can I Use Pay Stub Information If I don't Have MY W-2?

If you are about to file and you still don't have your w-2 you may file a substitute for w-2 form 4852. Basically you will be filling out the information that is normally on the w-2 which is your gross wages and your tax withholdings. The IRS may be able to give you the information

File Substitute for W-2

File the tax return with this information on form 4852 which is the substitute for the w-2. Suppose that you discovered that your information is substantially inaccurate. You may then file an amended tax return form 1040 X. Amended returns are a nuisance. I would suggest that if the information that you submitted originally needs just a minor correction that you don't worry about it. Just when you receive an IRS notice telling you that your information is not correct agree to whatever information they have if theirs is accurate.





Dear Kevin,

If I were in your situation, I would not move in with the in-laws. You've got an absurd amount of money wrapped up in those cars. I'd sell the stupid things, start living on a budget and paying down debt, and keep my dignity.

In my mind there are only two scenarios where you'd even consider taking the in-laws up on their offer. One is where they're absolutely wonderful people and you have a great, non-toxic relationship with them, where everyone involved knows their boundaries. What do you think about the HARP program, and what exactly is it?

Dear Ivy,

The Home Affordable Refinance Program is designed for people who have made their payments on time but are underwater on their mortgages. Being "underwater" means they owe more on their homes than the homes are worth. So basically it gives them the opportunity to

refinance their home loans.

The HARP program is the only part of the Making Home Affordable program that actually worked. And to be honest, it has worked well. In contrast, the recent Home Loan Modification program is a piece of junk and all about political posturing. About 93 percent of the people who applied for a home loan modification didn't get one. It was just another case of the government pretending to do something.

I'd advise looking into the HARP program if you've got a good credit history and you're underwater on your current home. Lots of HARP program applications are being approved, and the deals are closing. That's what really matters when you find yourself in a situation like this.



A Faithful "Dove Story"

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)

- Doves are part of Biblical and romantic symbolism. The feathered harbingers also symbolize peace and hope in many cultures. Few locals know that Carmichael has its own dove story.

A journal by Arcade historian Nellie Jellison relates the tale. Her account dates from the 1840s, when pioneer John Sinclair coowned the huge Mexican land grant called Rancho del Paso (its eastern extremity is now part of Carmichael). In Sinclair's home, his wife employed several Indian women as servants. According to Jellison, one maiden "possessed marvelous beauty

and was the daughter of a chief." Though she had a suitor among

her people, she was beloved of a tribesman from the north. With a raiding party, the determined intruder stole his love and headed for the mountains. Her tribesmen pursued. In a desperate fight, two fatal arrows were shot and the lovers perished. Indian legend says that to immortalize their devotion, the Great Spirit transformed them into doves. Every season thereafter, the couple could be seen in the tree under which they fell. The rancho's Victorian lore said that — during the dove hunting season — no sportsman's aim could harm the couple. If shot, they vanished like phantoms.

The fabled dove tree is long gone and all that remains intact of Rancho del Paso's massive spread is two acres in Carmichael. Here stands the 1850s house that bloodstock magnate James Ben Ali Haggin built for his farm manager John Mackey. Probably the oldest house in Sacramento County, it is now owned by Teri and Rick

"We have a pair of doves that nest here every spring," reports Teri. "When I first heard the legend, I had goose bumps. I felt sure our birds were the lovers. It's a wonderful feeling that this place is their refuge. Our home's history is enriched by the legend of the doves."

By replacing and managing fixtures and lamps, savings of 50 percent to 75 percent are possible.

Following a successful yearlong pilot, the Advanced Lighting Controls (ALC) program is now available to all medium and large business customers in the SMUD service territory. The program provides rebates and incentives for commercial customers to switch over to technologies they might not otherwise afford and provides manufacturers an entry into the marketplace that might not be available for years to come.

Proof of performance is already being realized. Twelve companies joined the SMUD ALC pilot program a year ago and expect to see annual savings ranging from \$5,000 to as much as \$100,000. Funding for the pilot was provided by an American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Department of Energy Smart Grid Infrastructure grant and other SMUD funding.
