

Money Can't Buy Me Love



The latest sweetheart scam swindles unsuspecting women out of thousands of dollars in the Sacramento area.

SACRAMENTO, CA. – The Better Business Bureau warns online daters to be wary of potential love matches requesting money after two women report wiring thousands of dollars to an alleged Sacramento business owner they met online.

A Citrus Heights woman told

She later declined to wire more money as requested. After refusing to wire more funds, the man ceased communication with her.

"I went to the business address and it does not exist. No such business," grieved the woman. "I would love to see my money returned, but do not anticipate it. He makes elderly women victims with his sweet talk, poetry and professing love." Another woman's family filed a complaint with Better Business Bureau in July 2012 alleging the same situation. "My mother, a recent widow, is in contact with (the man)," wrote the daughter of the victim. "He has already gotten thousands of dollars from her." The woman allegedly attempted to retrieve the wired funds, but had no luck. 'Some online suitors may be more attracted to your wallet," said Gary Almond,

president of BBB serving northeast California. "If you choose to date online, be wary of wiring funds, meeting right away and those who try to get too close too quickly."

Carmichael **Recreation and Park District Demolishes Old Pool** CARMICHAEL, CA -

(MPG) The District Advisory Board recently approved a project to demolish the old pool at Carmichael Park and redevelop the area for recreation use.

Built in 1955, the pool served the residents of the community providing many aquatic activities. Since it was the only pool in town for years, thousands of children and adults cooled off at the pool participating in recreational swim, lessons, water aerobics classes, synchronized swimming and even scuba lessons. The pool was also home to the Carmichael Park Beavers swim team.

Over the years, governmental codes changed. The high-diving board was removed due to the shallow 10ft depth of the pool and the baby pool was removed when it could no longer be kept clean enough to meet modern health standards. By 2002 it was clear the pools infrastructure and buildings were no longer able to meet current codes and developed major problems with the pool vessel itself failing and leaking.

The cost to bring the facility up to code was prohibitive. In 2004 the decision was made to close the pool permanently.

The old pool has sat vacant for 9 years. To some residents the pool has wonderful memories, but to others the pool is an eye-sore and a potential safety hazard. Sacramento County is allocating some of the funds under Supervisors Peters' District 3's Community Programs to help demolish the old pool and make the area available for recreational use The pool is scheduled for demolition beginning February 13 and may take a few weeks for completion depending on the weather. District staff will then work to restore the area with turf.

Fifth Annual Youth Energy Summit Emphasizes "Green Business" More than 100 students learn about the business aspects of clean and sustainable energy

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - (MPG) The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD), a regional clean energy leader, hosted the fifth annual Youth Energy Summit (YES) training event January 25 and 26. The event emphasized the creation of "green" businesses. About 100 participating students teamed up to create "green" forprofit or nonprofit businesses and planned to partner with existing businesses to help them achieve sustainability objectives.

The keynote speaker provided a roadmap and an inspiration. Nikhil Arora is a young icon in the sustainable business model movement. YES teaches students the basics of energy science through lectures and interactive workshops given by energy industry professionals speaking on a range of topics spanning solar energy to waste management to alternative transportation.

Students will take what they've learned at YES and will finalize energy-related learning projects in their schools and communities. On April 26 at the state Capitol, students who joined YES learning teams will compete for scholarships by submitting their projects for the general public, legislators and

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) Shortly after 2am, Metro Fire crews responded to Commercial structure on Fulton Ave. and found visible flames and smoke showing from the roof. After performing a diligent search to confirm the building was unoccupied, Metro Fire crews immediately went into fire attack mode. While fire attack was occurring on one side of the building, ventilation crews quickly went to the roof to provide vertical ventilation, to aid the interior crews with locating and extinguishing the fire.

Thirty-four firefighters were engaged in fire attack, searching for victims, ventilating, salvage and overhaul. And as a result, crews were able to minimize the structural damage to the office area, while efficiently and effectively saving the remaining portion of the Auto Repair Shop and the two adjoin businesses.

Quick, coordinated firefighting efforts resulted in keeping

the adjoining businesses operational and saving roughly \$1 million in structural damage and personal property; with only an estimated \$80,000 in damage to the building.

No firefighters or civilians were injured and at the time of this release, the fire is listed as still under investigation with the cause being unknown.





Bad Hatter Bandit Sought for Three Sacramento Area Bank Robberies

FBI Special Report

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) The Sacramento Violent Crimes Task Force (SVCTF) is seeking help from the public to identify a man suspected of robbing three Sacramento area banks during the past two months.

The dates of the robberies and locations that have been struck by the "Bad Hatter Bandit" are as follows:

• November 29, 2012: Chase Bank at 3501 Del Paso Boulevard, Sacramento

• January 10, 2013: Chase Bank at 1800 Douglas Boulevard, Roseville

• January 29, 2013: Chase Bank at 3501 Del Paso Boulevard, Sacramento

The Bad Hatter Bandit is a black male standing 5'7" to 5'9" with a small build. While his

suspect arrived at each location with a leather folio and wearing one of a variety of black hats. A note or verbal demand for cash was issued in each of the robberies and the suspect indicated that he was armed.

A second, black male standing 5'9" to 5'11" who has an average build accompanied the primary suspect into the bank during the robbery in Sacramento on January 29, 2013. This second suspect approached the teller, and told her that he had a weapon. According to witnesses, additional accomplices have been seen in the Bad Hatter

Bandit's getaway vehicles. To date, all vehicles used for the commission of the robberies have been stolen and a different vehicle was used for each robbery. While no weapon was seen in any of the three robberies, the

attire has changed frequently, the suspects are considered armed and dangerous due to the verbal threats. The cases are being investigated by the SVCTF, FBI, Roseville Police Department and Sacramento Police Department.

Hidden in Plain Sight

SACRAMENTO, CA -(MPG) "Craig Miller and I worked together on La Sierra's Branding Iron newspaper staff in high school," recalls Jennifer Corbin (née Wilcox). "Word of his death was just unbelievable. Craig was such a nice guy - lively banter, a quick wit somebody you enjoyed being around. It's hard to imagine anyone capable of killing people like that. I was stunned to learn that Charlene Gallego was living in the Sacramento area again. That has to be so disturbing for the families of her numerous victims.'

Miller was the sole male victim, and one of the last, of Gerald and Charlene Gallego's killing spree from 1978 to 1980. Infamously referred to as the "Sex Slave Murders," the heinous serial killings, involving kidnapping and rape, took place in California and Nevada.

The resurfacing of a serial killer in this community has reopened painful wounds. How and why did this happen?

A Summary Of Events:

October 10, 1956 - Charlene Adelle, born to Charles and Mercedes Williams; only child. In her adult life she is allegedly involved in drugs and prostitution. Two marriages end; one in annulment, the other divorce

1977 – Meets Gerald Gallego at poker club in Sacramento. Gallego had five marriages behind him, and a daughter (who would later file charges of incest, sodomy, oral copulation, and unlawful intercourse against him)

September 11, 1978 – First victims of Gerald and Charlene: seventeen-year-old Rhonda Scheffler and sixteen-year-old Kippi Vaught. On September 10, 1978, Rhonda and Kippi were shopping at Country Club Plaza in Sacramento County when Charlene enticed them into their van. Gerald and Charlene raped and further sexually abused the two victims throughout the night in rural Placer County.

September 30, 1978 – Married in Reno, moved to Nevada, then Houston, Texas under alias of "Feil" (the identity of which she allegedly stole from a cousin)

June 24, 1979 – Nevada victims three and four: fourteen-year-old Brenda Lynne Judd and thirteen-year-old Sandra Kay Colley- On June 24, 1979, Brenda and Sandra were lured into the Gallegos' van at the Washoe County, Nevada, Fair September 1979 – Gerald and Charlene moved back to Sacramento area April 24, 1980 - Victims five and six: seventeen-yearold Karen Chipman Twiggs and seventeen-year-old Stacy Ann Redican. The Gallegos kidnapped Stacey and Karen from Sunrise Mall in Citrus Heights,

California

June 1, 1980 – The couple marry a second time under name of Feil

June 7, 1980 – Victim seven: twenty-one-year-old Linda Aguilar, who was then four months pregnant

July 17, 1980 – Victim eight: thirty-four-year-old Virginia Mochel

November 2, 1980 – Victims nine and ten: twenty-twoyear-old Craig Miller and his fiancée, twenty-one-year-old Mary Elizabeth Sowers. This time, there are witnesses to the abduction - friends of Miller and Sowers - who write down the Gallegos' license plate number

November 17, 1980 – Gerald and Charlene are arrested

January 17, 1981 – Charlene gives birth to son Gerald Armond Gallego, Jr. while in prison; custody given to her parents, who change boy's name to Charles A. Williams

November 1982 - Trial begins. Gerald convicted of only four of the killings

November 1983 – Charlene pleads guilty to two counts of first-degree murder in California, and one count of second-degree murder in Nevada. In exchange for testifying against Gerald, charges against her are dropped in California, and she is sentenced to sixteen years, eight months, serving her sentence in the Department of Prisons Women's Center, Carson City, Nevada

1991 – Although she is to be released from prison early for good behavior, California officials inform her she will be arrested on other charges if full sentence not completed.

July 17, 1997 – Charlene is released from prison

October 1997 – She and her attorney, Joseph Murphy, meet with a reporter from sfgate.com. She claims (Gallego) has a contract out on her for testifying against him; feels like victim, not a criminal

2001 – Tells Fair Oaks cemetery personnel that her husband, Joseph Murphy, is dying of leukemia (he passes on April 27, 2001). She also advises she is a legal secretary. Murphy's gravestone reads, "Beloved father, grandfather, brother, uncle and friend." Does not mention "husband." He was 75 years old at time of death. July 18, 2002 – Gerald Gallego dies of rectal cancer while serving time on death row. February 7, 2010 - Son Charlie Williams dies at Camp Nathan Smith in Afghanistan "of injuries sustained while supporting combat operations" - also found on freedomremembered. com were reports that he died of a non-combat related injury.

with a full page story and photos. Memorial mass was held in Citrus Heights and he was buried in Fair Oaks Cemetery.

April 2, 2010 – Charlene (now Mary Martinez) moves to Fair Oaks, paying \$230,000 for her home

January 5, 2011 - Files "Gold Country for the Troops, Inc." with Secretary of State, listing herself, Mary Martinez, as President, and Daniel Martinez as agent for service of process. The same year, Gold Country for the Troops, via Daniel Martinez, joins Fair Oaks Chamber of Commerce.

May 21, 2011 - Event hosted by Gold Country for the Troops at 1079 Sunrise Ave # B335, Roseville

October 29, 2011 – Mary and Daniel Martinez, via Gold Country for the Troops, host "Halloween Fun, Feast & Treats" at their home. Flyer reads, "For our military and their families. ... Sponsorships and donations welcome."

May 5, 2012 - Event created to raise funds for Gold Country for the Troops and non-profit, Heart of the Matter ("sponsors foster care for our 4-legged military family members. As we know from our personal experience, when one of our troops deploy, they cannot take all of their family members, especially their little furry or feathered ones.") There is no official record of Heart of Matter's nonprofit status. Numbers provided by Martinez are erroneous.







Dear Dave.

I'm divorced and have a teenager who will be driving soon. What would be the best way to set up insurance for the child? - Mike

Dear Mike,

I suppose a break-up does change the dynamic somewhat, but with my kids I simply left the car in my name and paid the extra insurance cost for a

little while. For me, still being in control of the car as a dad outweighed the additional money I was paying in premiums. Having a minor child running around in the world with his or her name on a car title is not a good plan.

Then, when they turned 18, I put each of their cars into their names. This, of course, was dependent on them behaving and acting responsibly. They were legally liable at that age too. I'm sure the insurance costs went up, but at that point the financial risk and liability factors were on them, not me.

In this kind of situation, especially because there's more of a potential for disagreements, I think I'd do it that way. Just put it in your name for now, especially if you're putting money toward the purchase of a vehicle. - Dave

Where To Put The 15 **Percent?**


Dear Dave,

My employer recently stopped matching my 401(k) contributions. Together, my husband and I make about \$100,000 a year. Should I continue to invest in this option, or should I put money into an IRA? - Linda

If possible, I would put 100 percent of my retirement savings into a Roth IRA with good, growth stock mutual funds before messing with a non-matching 401(k). But remember, my goal if you follow the Baby Steps is to be debt-free except for your home, and have an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses, before you begin setting aside for retirement. These are the steps that allow you to be prepared for emergencies and free up your largest wealth-building tool, which is your income.

With your income, both you and your husband could open Roth IRAs and contribute \$5,500 each in 2013. That's a total of \$11,000 toward retirement next year, and it's only 11 percent of your income. With this in mind, I'd advise going ahead with your 401(k)s after your Roth IRAs are in place. That would flesh out the remaining four percent and give you guys 15 percent of your income going toward retirement! - Dave



The big guns have arrived in January, and this has nothing to do with the NRA. Guns galore run rampant at the movies, from "Gangster Squad" to this week's "Parker."

Even Hansel and Gretel are in the gun business, toting weaponry that would be the envy of mercenaries fighting battles from the sands of North Africa to the jungles of South America.

When he was a vampire hunter, Abe Lincoln didn't use machine guns, as I recall, but the titular characters in "Hansel & Gretel: Witch Hunters," having escaped the gingerbread house, rely on the massive firepower of automatic weapons.

The gun culture is more comfortably at home (if it can be stated this way) in "Parker," only because Jason Statham is by now a very familiar figure as the tough guy in a string of action pictures, most of them requiring the use of you-know-what.

"Parker" is notable because it is based on one of the many crime novels from prolific author Donald E. Westlake, who created the hard-boiled noir environment in which a professional thief became an iconic anti-hero.

A veteran of hard-hitting action thrillers, Jason Statham is just right as charismatic bad boy Parker, a ruthless criminal who surprisingly operates under his own stringent ethical code.

Parker is not your ordinary thug, though he will beat an adversary into an unrecognizable pulp. He operates by a code of honor to only steal from those who can afford the loss and to

bring no harm to the innocent bystanders.

Above all, Parker is a thief, capable of extreme violence, but he's not a psychopath, like some of the desperate criminals with whom he has to regrettably associate to get the job done.

The action begins brilliantly with a large caper at the Ohio State Fair, where an elaborate plan is in place to steal the \$1 million take from the weekend gate receipts.

Parker is recruited to the heist by Hurley (Nick Nolte), his crime world mentor and father of his girlfriend Claire (Emma Booth), to whom Parker is extremely devoted.

An expert at planning and executing seemingly impossible heists, Parker is daring and meticulous but all he requires from his crew is absolute loyalty and strict adherence to the plan.

The Ohio State Fair robbery turns deadly because of a crew member's reckless behavior, and as a result, Parker declines to join vicious crime boss Melander (Michael Chiklis) and his gang for their next big job.

Not willing to take no for an answer, Melander's gang of thieves turns on Parker with a brutal attack, leaving him for dead by the side of a deserted road.

The most inept member of the Melander crew is Hardwicke (Micah Hauptman), the spoiled nephew of a ruthless Chicago mob boss. And he's the one who supposedly administered the coup de grace to Parker.

But Parker survives the attack (the first of many such encounters), and after a quickly miraculous recovery, he is bent on vengeance against the men

who betrayed him and made off with his share of the loot.

Melander had boasted that the proceeds from the state fair heist were meant to finance a really major score of stolen jewelry. And so Parker traces the gang to the glitzy confines of tony Palm Beach.

Posing as a wealthy Texas oilman, complete with the ten gallon hat and cowboy boots, Parker feigns interest in buying a big piece of local real estate.

As luck would have it, Parker meets struggling real estate agent Leslie (Jennifer Lopez), who happens to have an encyclopedic knowledge of the island and its wealthy socialite inhabitants.

The extremely attractive Leslie tells Parker that she's pushing 40 and still living at home, after a nasty divorce, with her soap opera-obsessed mother (Patti LuPone).

Believe it or not, Parker keeps everything strictly professional and does not fall for Leslie's obvious romantic interest in him, even after he's seen her stripped down to her underwear.

With her unexpected help, Parker uncovers the gang's plan to make off with more than \$50 million worth of jewels that are part of a famous estate auction.

That Parker is a crisp, proficient killing machine is all the more reason that Jason Statham landed the role. This movie is a perfect fit for the British actor, all the better for his gruff physical nature.

With minimal dialogue, Statham's anti-hero is the lone wolf vigilante who will go from one ferocious fight scene to the next with single-minded tough guy intensity.

Not surprisingly, given Statham's natural talent for considerable action, "Parker" is a coolly efficient action thriller that gets a lot of mileage from its protagonist.

Full of bone-crunching fights and profusely bloody battles, "Parker" is a bare-knuckles thriller that pumps the action adrenaline to a high level.



Business Expert Offers Tips for Capitalizing on Unpredictability

As we pass the five-year anniversary of the start of the economic recession in December 2007, many observers focus on what was lost:

• 8 million jobs

• 146,000 employer businesses

• 17.5 percent average individual earnings

But the businesses that survived the Great Recession and are thriving today didn't focus on losses then – and they aren't now, says Donna Every, a financial expert who has published three non-fiction business books and recently released her first novel, "The Merger Mogul," (www. donnaevery.com).

"The entrepreneurs who are successful during times of uncertainty are so because they don't rely on the standard approaches they'd use in predictable times, and they look for opportunities – the positives -- in situations that would have been considered negatives five years ago," Every says.

"It's similar to how we deal with the weather. In places where it's sunny most of the summer, we wouldn't leave our house each morning packing coats and umbrellas just in case. The weather's predictable. But in the winter and other seasons when the weather can quickly change, we head out with a different mindset."

For businesses, switching gears to deal with inclement economic conditions involves adopting new perspectives and practices, she says.

"I incorporated some of these in 'The Merger Mogul' because it's set during the recession and my protagonist, the mogul, had to adapt," Every says. "He used many of the strategies I teach my business clients for thriving during economic uncertainty."

What are some of those strategies? Every outlines them:

• Build on what you have, not toward what you want: Instead of setting goals and then seeking out the resources you'll need to meet them, assess what you have available and decide what you can achieve with that. This not only saves you the time and expense of pulling together resources you may not have, it also gives you the advantage of working from your business's individual and unique strengths.

• Follow the Las Vegas rule: Tourists planning a weekend in Las Vegas will often set aside the amount of money they're willing to gamble and lose -- on cards or the slots. That way, they won't lose more than they can afford. During an uncertain economy, entrepreneurs should calculate their risks the same way. Rather than going for the biggest opportunities as you would in prosperous times, look for the opportunities that won't require as much of your resources. Calculate how much you can afford to lose, and always consider the worst-case scenario.

• Join hands and hearts: Competition is fine when things are going well, but when times are tough, you need allies. Explore forming partnerships with other entrepreneurs so you can strategize to create opportunities together. With what your partners bring to the table, you'll have more strength and new options to work with.

• Capitalize on the unexpected: Surprises can have positive outcomes if you handle them nimbly by finding ways to use them to your advantage. Instead of planning damage control for the next unexpected contingency, look at it as an opportunity. Get creative as you look for the positives it

presents.

• When life is unpredictable, don't try to forecast: Focus on what you can do and create now rather than what you can expect based on what happened in the past. In good times, that information can be a helpful and reliable way to make predictions, but savvy entrepreneurs don't count on that in uncertain times.

"While the U.S. economy certainly is improving, there's still too much uncertainty both here and abroad to go back to the old ways of doing business just yet," Every says.

"If you've survived the past five years, you've probably been relying on many of these strategies – maybe without even realizing it," she says. "Don't abandon them yet, and if there are some here you aren't using, work toward incorporating them, too."

SAVING YOUR HEART

We are into the heart mood as we near Valentine's Day with every heart cliché' you can think of. And we all love the flowers and the candy and the cards too. Maybe we should be thinking long and hard about the real heart that keeps us going every day instead of the candy ones. The number one killer in the U.S. is heart disease. But when you think of heart problems, you picture an overweight middle-aged man, right? What if I told you the number one killer of women in North America is heart disease? Got your attention, huh? It accounts for a third of all deaths in women and far surpasses the prevalence of breast cancer. It's true, and that's why Cardiologist Dr. Martha Gulati and Pharmacist Sherry Torkos took on the task of getting women, who often neglect their heart health, to take notice in their book "Saving Women's Hearts." While the stats can be frightening, the good news is that most risk factors for heart disease can be changed. You can bet my ears perked up when Sherry took me on the Myths and Misconceptions of women and heart disease on my POPPOFF Radio Show.

1) Heart disease is only an issue for elderly women: While heart disease is the chief killer of women over 65, it is the second leading cause of death in women ages 45-64 and the third leading cause of death in women 25-44.



2) Women should be treated less aggressively after a heart attack than men: Absolutely not. The unfortunate reality is that women are treated less aggressively after a heart attack and are also morel likely to die after suffering a heart attack.

3) Risk factors for heart disease are the same in women as in men: Not so. Certain conditions are more likely to cause heart disease in women than in men, such as metabolic syndrome and menopause. Stress is also more likely to damage women's hearts.

4) Sex increases the risk of heart attack: It is commonly thought that sex is a major trigger for heart attacks, yet only 1% of heart attacks are brought on by sexual activity.

5) Coffee is bad for your heart. While too much caffeine can raise blood pressure, coffee actually contains significant amounts of antioxidants. A recent review of 21 studies found that women who drank one to four cups daily actually had a lower risk of heart disease.

6) Nuts can raise cholesterol levels: Nuts are a good source of soluble fiber and other nutrients and research has found that consuming a handful of nuts daily can lower cholesterol and the risk of heart disease.

7) Hormone replacement therapy protects against heart disease: In fact, menopausal women who participate in estrogen replacement therapy actually may be at increased risk for heart disease.

So I asked Sherry how I can save my heart, and she shared these nine ways:

1) Get at least 7 hours of sleep every night. Women who sleep 6 hours or less have been shown to be at greater risk.

2) Take 10,000 steps a day. Use a pedometer and gradually

increase the number each day. Exercise fights heart disease in numerous ways.

3) Have oatmeal with chia seed for breakfast. The soluble fiber in oats and chia can help lower cholesterol.

4) Eat more fish, garlic, and green tea. These foods help cut heart disease risk.

5) Choose whole grain bread/ pasta and brown rice over white rice. Studies show that highly refined carbs are worse for your heart than foods high in saturated fat, like red meat and butter.

6) Avoid foods that contain trans-fatty acids. They can raise cholesterol levels and increase risk of heart disease.

7) Don't sweat the small stuff. Stress is a major risk factor for heart disease.

8) Laugh more. Laughing relaxes and expands blood vessels, which protects the heart.

9 Get screened for heart disease...beginning at age 20!


