SMUD Thanks Customers Who Help the Needy Pay Their Electric Bills

SACRAMENTO COUNTY. CA - (MPG) As the local economy continues to struggle, many folks find that making ends meet is especially challenging during the holiday season. Though times are tough, Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) customers continue to deliver for those in need. Fellow customers who are in need can get assistance paying their electric bill thanks to the EnergyHELP program. EnergyHELP provides an easy way to contribute funds to help struggling customers.

The program has been going nine years now and in that time, SMUD customers have contributed nearly \$3 million to EnergyHELP. More than 13,000 customers now voluntarily donate monthly to help struggling low-income SMUD customers keep the lights on.

Here's how EnergyHELP works: Customers can contribute automatically in their monthly bill payment to any of four partner charity agencies. The donation is tax-deductible, and SMUD sends 100 percent of the proceeds directly to the charity. Those charities then provide as much as \$200 in one-time bill assistance to low-income customers whose electric power has been, or is about to be, disconnected for non-payment. While typical monthly donations are between \$1 and \$10 per month, some customers contribute \$20 to \$100 per month.

Since EnergyHELP's start in 2004, a total of \$2,926,611 in assistance has been distributed to more than 19,000 local households in crisis through all four EnergyHELP partner charity agencies: Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services, the Salvation Army, Travelers Aid Emergency Assistance Agency, and the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership.

Based on customers' stepping up to help their neighbors, SMUD will surpass \$543,000 in annual pledged EnergyHELP contributions by this year's end.

Year-End Holiday Travel Highest in Seven Years

Over 11.7 Million Californians to Travel over Christmas & New Year's, Says AAA

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) – Consumer optimism is offsetting unresolved financial issues as millions of Californians help propel this year's holiday travel season into the second highest number of travelers seen in the past decade, according to the latest travel survey from AAA Northern California.

AAA predicts an estimated 11.7 million Californians will travel during the endof-the-year holiday season, representing an overall increase of 1.8 percent compared to 2011.

"For the fourth consecutive year, California has seen a slow to steady increase in travel volume," said AAA Northern California spokesperson Cynthia Harris. "This season we are experiencing the highest number of travelers since the 2006-2007 travel peak as Californians kick-start the New Year with a holiday vacation."

AAA estimates that more than 10 million Californians traveling during Christmas and New Year's will choose to drive to reach their holiday destinations, representing a 1.4 percent increase compared to last year. The air travel industry will also experience an increase of 4.4 percent this year as more than 950,000 Californians are expected to fly. Approximately 398,000 state residents are expected to travel by other modes of transportation, such as boats or trains. This represents an increase of 7.4 percent compared to last year.

Nationally, AAA projects that more than 93 million people will travel 50 miles or more during the holiday festivities. That's a 1.6 percent

increase compared to last year. Family travel constitutes 32 percent of total travelers during the year-end holidays. An average West Coast family of four will save money by

staying with friends and family, spending an average of \$1,048 on their trip. An average West Coast road trip will con-

sist of approximately 838 miles. Californians who take to the skies during this holiday season will pay an average price of \$203 per round trip ticket for the top U.S. air routes. This represents a decrease of three percent from last year. On a national level, air travel is expected to increase 4.5 percent as 5.6 million travelers will take to the skies.

According to AAA's latest travel survey, the most popular activities for West Coast families this holiday season will be dining, visiting family and friends, sightseeing, nightlife, and going to beach/waterfront areas.

AAA Winter Travel Survival Tips

• Pack a cellular phone and car charger. Have emergency num-

bers available. Carry your AAA

card for help in an emergency. For members who become stranded, AAA can be reached by calling 1-800-AAA-HELP (1-800-222-4357).

• If you become snowbound, stay with your vehicle. It is an excellent shelter and makes it easier for rescuers to find you.

· Stay focused. Avoid distractions such as texting, talking on the phone and adjusting the radio or other electronic devices.

AAA Air Travel Tips

• Hit the web before the airport. Check in online up to 24 hours before flying and print your boarding pass at home. Many airlines offer discounts for prepaying during online check-in.

• Pack light. Avoid checked bag fees and bring carry-on luggage only. Check with your airline on the maximum size of bags allowed in overhead bins. TSA regulations require the name on to exactly match your name as it is printed on your governmentissued identification.

· Make reservations for accommodations and rental cars ahead of time so prices can be locked in. Air fares are typically cheaper if arrangements are made early.

• Liquids and gel carry-ons will only be allowed in containers no larger than 3 ounces and must be placed in a quart-size Ziploc clear plastic bag.

Do you remember even one gift that you received last Christmas? What about the 4th gift? Chances are you don't, or at least you have to think on it awhile. The reason we don't recall is because it probably wasn't a gift that we needed or even wanted. Our consumer culture has taken gift giving to the 450 Billion dollar mark during the Christmas Season! Retailers love it but giving more material gifts to one another is not in line with the true meaning of Christmas. I challenge you to give more by giving differently this Christmas season.

In the gospel account of Jesus' birth a prophecy from Isaiah 7:14 is attached and applied to Mary's little son. "The virgin will be with child and will give birth

to son, and they will call him the relational gift of the birth of Immanuel" which means, "GOD WITH US." The name Immanuel constitutes a relational promise to the people of Israel and to the whole world. In this new born, God is coming near. The transcendent God is becoming the immanent God! Jesus is a relational gift.

This concept of relational giving is further supported in the Gospel of John. John 1:14 reads, "The WORD became flesh and made his dwelling among us." The phrase "made his dwelling" is one word in the biblical language. It literally means "tent" and it was used in reference to the Old Testament tabernacle. Bible translator Eugene H. Peterson paraphrased this verse as "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood." Here we see again the concept of relational nearness. In Jesus God has given us a relational gift. In Jesus we can experience all the attributes of God for our benefit and for His glory. In Jesus we have the tabernacle, the meeting place of heaven and earth. In Jesus we meet the transcendent God face to face

Once we discover and receive

Jesus, we must ask ourselves if our current practice of giving at Christmas time is in line with the relational way that God gives. The way to give more is not by giving more presents but by giving more presence! I challenge you to follow God's relational giving example by determining to give more of yourself, more of your time, your hands, your words and your heart to others. Consider volunteering in a community service organization like a food closet or toy drive. When you do shop for material gifts why not purchase gifts that foster relationships. What about carving out the time to actually visit someone in person that you have lost contact with? Visit someone in your extended family who is homebound and have a cup of Christmas Tea as the classic Christmas poem by Tom Hegg illustrates so vividly. Give more by giving relational gifts this Christmas!



It's that time of year when the house gets decorated and the gifts get wrapped, but have you ever thought about some of the traditions we follow year after year and how they came about? I did, and tried to get some info on a few of them at best!

Let's start with 'ole St Nick. St. Nicholas was born in 280 A.D. in Patara, a city of Lycia, in Asia Minor. He became the gift giver of Myra. His gifts were given late at night, so that the gift giver's identity would remain a secret. St. Nicholas was eventually named the patron saint of children, sailors, Russia, and Greece. St. Nicholas was a Christian priest, who later became a bishop. He was a rich person, and traveled the country helping people. What about the beleaguered fruitcake? According to "The joy of Cooking," by Irma Rombauer and Marion Becker, "Many people feel that these cakes improve greatly with age. In 1939, Copywriter Robert L. May of the Montgomery Ward Company created a poem about Rudolph, the ninth reindeer. May had been "often taunted as a child for being shy, small, and slight." He created an ostracized reindeer with a shiny nose who became a hero one foggy Christmas eve. A copy of the poem was given to Montgomery Ward customers. In 1949 Johnny Marks wrote the song and Rudolph was relocated to the North Pole. The rest is history!

Of course, much of this is conjecture, and I'm sure you can find lots of reasons for so many of the traditions, but what does it matter? I found all my info on the good 'ole internet. All we should care about is what the meaning of Christmas is all about. It is about loving and caring. It's not about big fancy presents, but about sharing yourself with others. So enjoy the mince pies and the turkey, even the fruitcake. But remember that the word love needs to be at the top of the list. It lasts so much longer than all the bright shiny things we get on Christmas Day.

Wherever you are, it will be a Merry Christmas just the same. For our troops in Afghanistan, it is "De Christmas Akhtar de Bakhtawar Au Newai Kal de Mubarak Sha." For those in still in Iraq, it's "Idah Saidan Wasanah Jadidah." For our friends south of the border, its "Feliz Navidad." But for all it's still MERRY CHRISTMAS AND A HAPPY NEW YEAR!!! "Home For The Holidays"

SACRAMENTO, CA - (MPG) Wells Fargo Home For The Holidays has become a community concert tradition that officially kicks off the holiday season in the Capital Region. The Sacramento Choral Society and Orchestra unveiled their 17th season of this Christmas program on Saturday, December 8 in Memorial Auditorium in the heart of downtown Sacramento to a packed crowd of over 2500 guests. The hall sparkled in its recent renovation enhanced with festive lights and holiday decorations. The Sacramento Children's Chorus, Lynn Stevens, Director, was the guest Chorus on a program that was filled with both familiar and new works for chorus and orchestra. The event also unveiled the SCSO's new Christmas CD "Home for the Holidays".

Music Director Donald Kendrick put led his forces through a program that started in darkness with the purity of the Sacramento Children's Choristers singing Benjamin Britten's "Hodie, Christus Natus Est" from his familiar "Ceremony of Carols". Lara Hoggard's "Personent Hodie" (written for the Dallas Symphony) rang out in full force from the Choral Society through the darkened hall with only the light of their candles that surrounded the audience in a warm glow. Both choirs moved gracefully in procession from the first balcony to the stage as the formidable SCSO Orchestra showed their true grit in a polished reading of Leroy Anderson's "Christmas Festival".

John Rutter's "I Wish You Christmas" was sung with a touching poignancy and clarity by the SCSO followed by the Sacramento Children's Chorus who filled the hall with Dan Forrest's arrangement of "The First Noel". Lynn Stevens conducted the children in an old English Carol "Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day" featuring Bailey Jones' crystal clear, warm young soprano voice with excellent accompaniment by Harpist Beverly Wesner Hoehn. One of the most ethereal parts of the evening was the performance of Barlow Bradford's "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" that featured members of the Handbell Choir from St. John's Lutheran Church in Sacramento. The haunting arrangement and lush string writ-

ing created a spell binding effect.

To honor the 20th anniversary of the Sacramento Children's Chorus, the founding Conductors Kendrick and Stevens joined forces with their organizations to create a brand new commissioned work that received its premiere on the first half of the program. They selected American composer Randol Alan Bass whose "Festival Magnificat" is dedicated to these two arts groups. The work is a fiery and virtuosic celebration for full orchestra, children and adult voices that will remain in the repertoire for ensembles around the globe to enjoy. From its fanfare beginnings to the quiet and introspective middle section, the composition is appealing and energetic with a brilliant handling of the orchestration. Kendrick carefully kept the balances of his mighty forces in control and delivered an historic moment artistically

with style and nuance. It is a welcome addition to the repertoire and hopefully will enjoy a long life.

SMUD Board of Directors Approves 2013 Budget

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA
– (MPG) Despite continued economic challenges, budget maintains low rates and reliable service

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Board of Directors has approved a \$1.35 billion budget. The 2013 budget is designed to keep SMUD positioned as a progressive leader in the utility sector without any new rate increases next year.

The budget reflects a balanced approach that will keep SMUD on track to meet its long-term goals and continue to meet challenges presented by an increasingly complex business and regulatory environment. The budget provides

funding for all programs, projects and initiatives needed to meet the strategic targets set by the Board of Directors. The budget continues to contain costs while enhancing cus-

tomer service.

Despite the prolonged economic downturn, SMUD is managing its finances well. The budget is balanced without having to raise rates. SMUD is keeping a close eye on spending and continuing to improve operating efficiencies while investing in long-term projects that provide value for customers. While previous financial forecasts had envisioned economic growth by 2013, that now appears doubtful. New-service connections will likely

be minimal, and electricity sales are expected to decline slightly.

Some major projects highlighted in the spending plan for next year include:

- Completion of the corporate yard, the East Campus – Operations Center (EC-OC); Completion of the construction portion of the smart-grid grant project;
- Continued enhancement of customer service;
- Continuation of smart-grid development following successful completion of smart meter deployment and;
- Continued research into compressed-air energy storage and a 25-megawatt system of modular,

natural gas-fired reciprocating engines for a pilot project to help manage the variability of wind and solar power to meet SMUD's Integrated Resource Plan goals.

Although SMUD continues to feel the effects from the slow-growth economy, SMUD starts 2013 with a strong cash balance. When combined with cash generated from operations, capital spending will be covered without the need to borrow.

To address reliability, the budget includes funds to purchase property for a new location for the North City Substation and to overhaul a combustion-turbine at the 500-megawatt Cosumnes Power

Plant, SMUD's largest. For customers, the budget includes the introduction of a new My Account online service that will utilize smart meters and give customers access to far more energy-management information. Also, the Customer Experience Excellence initiative will commence and be utilized to evaluate customer needs and determine how to meet those needs with technology, programs and services.

SMUD customers continue to pay significantly less for electricity than most Californians and as of January 2013, about 26 percent less than residential customers who are supplied by neighboring PG&E. As the nation's sixth largest

community-owned electric service provider, SMUD has been providing low-cost, reliable electricity for more than 65 years to Sacramento County (and a small portion of Placer County). SMUD is a recognized industry leader and award winner for its innovative energy efficiency programs, renewable power technologies, and for its sustainable solutions for a healthier environment. SMUD is the first large California utility to receive more than 20 percent of its energy from renewable resources. For more information, visit smud.org.



KILLING THEM **SOFTLY** (Rated PG-13)

The bleak landscape of smalltime gangster thriller "Killing Them Softly" rests not just with urban decay, but with the backdrop of the run-up to the 2008 presidential election.

Based on the George V. Higgins novel, "Cogan's Trade," this criminal enterprise film involves petty hoods and sleazy losers who are pretty much oblivious to world affairs and the economic meltdown.

As if to create a sense of impending doom, "Killing Them Softly" makes plentiful use of radio and TV clips of posturing by various political figures to underscore the gravity of America's financial crisis.

The political chatter is little more than background noise to the crooks and wiseguys who foolishly scheme to rob a high-stakes mob-protected poker game. Even in a bad economy, they just want a quick score for big bucks.

A longtime hanger-on in the underworld, Johnny Amato (Vincent Curatola), now in the dry-cleaning business, has come up with a slick plan to rob the card game run by regular dealer Markie Trattman (Ray Liotta).

To complete the actual theft, Johnny turns to jittery young crook Frankie (Scoot McNairy), who is fresh out of jail and flat broke. In other words, Frankie is the perfect patsy.

For his part, Frankie makes the dubious choice of tapping for a partner his drug-addled friend Russell (Ben Mendelsohn), a gleefully seedy Australian junkie whose latest criminal enterprise involves dog theft.

The Markie Trattman card game is a convenient target because Markie once imprudently boasted of his complicity in a robbery of one of his own mob-protected games.

Naturally, the conspirators are only too certain that

the mob's suspicion will fall immediately upon Markie, the guv most likely to know all the inside information.

With more bluster than brains, Frankie and Russell manage to pull off the robbery and escape without being recognized. But only a fool believes in a foolproof plan.

And there's the rub. While the low-rent hoods are congratulating themselves, the mob takes drastic steps to deal with this situation, bringing in the seasoned enforcer Jackie Cogan (Brad Pitt).

Dealing through the mob's buttoned-up middle manager Driver (Richard Jenkins), Jackie is hired to investigate the heist and restore the criminal status quo. It won't be easy or pretty.

While Jackie is cool, cynical and detached, his usually efficient manner is constrained by the bureaucratic mentality of the unseen mob bosses who expect Driver to communicate their instructions.

The essential imperative for Jackie is not only to mete out punishment, but to deliver a message to would-be thieves that no one is beyond the reach of a criminal enterprise jealously guarding its turf.

Though he's the consummate professional, Jackie finds it's frustrating to navigate mounting complications, so he brings in trusted colleague Mickey (James Gandolfini) to assist with the assignment.

The once reliable Mickey has now become surprisingly unpredictable, seeing how he's much more interested in overindulging in alcohol and prostitutes than taking care of business.

A gangster thriller that involves contract killers is bound to be violent. "Killing Them Softly" certainly has its share of mayhem, including one of the most brutally grotesque beatings of recent memory.

But this crime story plays out to a different tempo than others in the genre. Indeed, the violence is either sadistically brutal or just

simmering below the surface, keeping the audience on edge.

Surprisingly, the hoodlums are often garrulous, talking at great lengths often to the point of annoyance. This is particular true when the dimwitted Frankie and Russell prattle on like high school stoners.

The political context frequently gets in the way of the film's essentially nihilistic worldview. Quite frankly, it seems unlikely that hoods would hang out in dive bars where C-SPAN is the TV channel of choice.

"Killing Them Softly" also goes against the grain by doing unusual things like making Ray Liotta a relatively sympathetic figure and James Gandolfini even more malevolent than his turn on "The Sopranos."

The film's saving grace is Brad Pitt's unflappable, subdued performance as the world-weary hired gun. And when his Jackie has a conversation with Mickey or Driver, it's worth paying attention.

"Killing Them Softly" is not effortlessly categorized, and as such, it may not find its audience easy to reach. In short, this film was not made for hardcore action junkies.

This column space has frequently extolled the virtues of vintage TV series being released on DVD. I am not about to stop the practice now.



A Recent Case of Interest

CASE: Weili Kao (12/13/12)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Valerie Brown

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that the Honorable Patrick Marlette sentenced Weili Kao to 15 years to life in prison for the murder of Truly Lo.

On May 11, 2004, Kao was at home with her 16-month-old baby and six-year-old stepdaughter, Truly Lo, while Truly's father was at work in the Bay Area. Kao became angry at Truly and slapped her, pinched her ears and sent her to the bathroom for a timeout. One hour later, Kao found Truly sitting rather than standing as ordered. She grabbed Truly around the neck and dragged her to a closet where she beat her with a hanger, lifted her up by her neck and violently knocked her to the floor twice. Although Truly was unresponsive, Kao put her in bed and waited until the next morning to take her to the hospital. As a result of the assault, Truly suffered severe brain damage and had been in a coma since 2004. In 2005, Kao was convicted by jury of several counts of child abuse and was sentenced to

16 years in prison. Truly never regained consciousness and remained in a persistent vegetative state until her death on December 21, 2010. Kao was then charged with murder and subsequently pled no contest to second degree murder and waived three years of credits for time she has already served on the child abuse charge.

At sentencing, Truly's father, Thomas Lo, spoke about Truly's "tender heart" and how, even at six years of age, she showed immense compassion and interest in caring for others. Mr. Lo stated that despite his hope she would one day wake, "Truly decided to leave us to reunite with her mom in Heaven. There is no fear, no tears and no suffering.'


Carmichael Event to Honor VIP and Local Achievers


