Carmichael Woman's Ode to Birthplace By Susan Maxwell Skinner CARMICHAEL, CA – (MPG) What do Carmichael and Lodi

have in common? Here's one thing: the same Daniel Carmichael who founded this Sacramento County town 103 years ago also spread his wealth in Lodi. The real estate giant had many Lodi relatives and – in his

glory days - owned property there. Descendants remember "Uncle Bud" Carmichael and his famous gold-topped cane. The gent's Lodi visits included wife Myrtie, who came "dripping diamonds."

The two towns also have author Toni Christman in common. The Carmichael woman has compiled an illustrated history of her San Joaquin County birthplace. Our Time to Shine is her fond tribute to a Wild West town that grew up. "Lodi has a checkered past," the retired government worker says. "In the early days, horses raced on town streets; people gambled on anything that moved. A newspaper owner shot a man dead. For fear of robberies, merchants took money to the bank via tunnels."

In the 1990s, Christman's father bequeathed a fat package containing 95 years of documents. "He and my ancestors kept receipts, bills – everything relating to their lives," she marvels. "They knew they would be valuable someday."

Day-to-day records of farm life were an Aladdin's trove to Christman. 1940s bills show that her grandfather paid \$27 for three tires; 36 eggs cost \$1.32; her mom spent 10 post-childbirth days in hospital and paid \$93. "The depression was tough for them," she affirms. "My uncle is shown making sausages to feed family and neighbors." Other photos recall Lodi's changing fortunes. It was once a melon growing center. A 1936 snap shows her

Motorcycle Awareness is a **Group Effort**



CHP Special Report

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) California is home to more than 1.3 million licensed motorcyclists and some of the best riding weather year round. Unfortunately, the state has also experienced an increase in the number of people killed in motorcycle-involved collisions. The California Highway Patrol (CHP) is preparing to address the problem with the help of a federal grant that will fund a yearlong, lifesaving effort.

"Motorcycle awareness is a priority for the California Highway Patrol and a key to saying lives on the roadway," said CHP Commissioner Joe Farrow. "Education combined with enforcement will help reinforce the concept that all motorists need to safely share the road."

Each year hundreds of motorcyclists are killed in collisions and thousands are injured According to preliminary data from the CHP's Statewide Integrated Traffic Records System, there has been nearly a 20 percent increase in the number of motorcyclists killed from 2010 to 2011. The recent increase follows a two-year decline (2008-2010) in motorcycle-involved collisions.

To reverse the trend and reduce motorcycle-involved collisions resulting in injury or death, the CHP has begun an intensive public awareness campaign which will run through September 30, 2013. In addition to enforcement, the campaign includes an education component which will be achieved through public service announcements, social media, public outreach events, and motorcycle safety and road-sharing presentations throughout California.

The author's research included newspapers and libraries. She found photos of Civil War soldiers in Lodi; of steam boats passing through; of an "Avenue of Churches" (Central Ave) built by pious Germans. She also sought other families' treasures. Lodi's Moore family offered a 1920s gem: the famous D. W. Carmichael - suited up like a city slicker — in their vineyard.

"This was the first I knew of Dan Carmichael's Lodi connection," says Christman.

"He and his sister came from Georgia as teenagers. He did farm work and studied business in Stockton. I was fascinated that my home town had this link with the place I now live."

VIPs aside (and many celebrities have Lodi links) Christman aimed to spotlight forgotten citizens in Our Time to Shine. "These people struggled to shape a diamond in the rough; to make Lodi an important Californian center," she explains. "Their stories and photos recall the hardships and joys along the road."





A Film Review by Tim Riley

LINCOLN (Rated PG-13)

Steven Spielberg delivers a brilliant masterpiece on American history with "Lincoln," from a screenplay based in part on the book "Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Lincoln" by Doris Kearns Goodwin.

Fear not, history is far from a ponderous, tedious exercise with this lively exploration of the full measure of this great president, a man whose passion and humanity is on full display.

The rich human drama that played out near the end of the Civil War is all the more impressive because Daniel Day-Lewis skillfully makes Abraham Lincoln the tall, elegant and imposing figure of authority that history informs us was the case.

To its everlasting credit, "Lincoln" dwells on the final

four months of the 16th president's life and presidency, when a shattered nation teeters on the very real possibility of the Union forever dissolved.

History, but not the movie, enlightens us on Lincoln's use of Draconian emergency powers during the Civil War, such as the suspension of habeas corpus and outright media censorship.

There's very little battlefield action here, and what there is merely sets the tone for certain political necessities that follow from ending the war so that the United States is once again whole

"Lincoln" the movie focuses on the extraordinary steps that the president took in doubling down on the war effort, not merely to end the Civil War but to push for the enactment of the 13th Amendment that would permanently abolish slavery.

Most of the action takes place during the month of January 1865, when the re-elected Lincoln makes an all-out effort to secure passage of the Amendment in the ill-tempered House of Representatives.

The president relies on the help of Republican Thaddeus Stevens (Tommy Lee Jones), powerful chairman of the House Way and Means Committee and a fiery and often irascible advocate of the abolitionist movement.

Lincoln's secretary of state William H. Seward (David Strathairn), a former political adversary during the 1860 election, was an indispensable ally in the fight to save the Union, and as such, he helped, albeit reluctantly, organize a lobbying effort to spread patronage in an ingenious vote-buying scheme.

Some comic relief comes from a trio of lobbyists (John Hawkes, James Spader and Tim Blake Nelson) who run around Capitol Hill offering lucrative government jobs to the very Democratic congressmen who were not otherwise inclined to abolish slavery by any measure.

Meanwhile, plenty of fireworks take place not just in the halls of Congress but inside the White House as well. Sally Field fully realizes the complicated role of Mary Todd Lincoln, alternately supportive of her husband or so emotionally overwrought as to be a thorn in his side.

More family drama intrudes with Mrs. Lincoln's insistence that oldest son Robert (Joseph Gordon-Levitt) not join the war effort. Even against the president's wishes, Robert wanted to join the Union Army, not seeking any favor because of his station in life.

Without the knowledge of Secretary Seward, Lincoln sends a delegation to Richmond in an attempt to negotiate the surrender of the Confederacy. Meanwhile, he has to stall this peace effort just long enough to pass the 13th Amendment.

The political intrigue in the nation's capitol is fascinating. Lincoln realizes that unless the abolition of slavery is enshrined

We often catch the Great in the Constitution, the reconstituted Union is unlikely to pass the Amendment when Democratic representatives from the South join the Congress.

battle to save the American Union, Lincoln comes into view as a master strategist brokering deals with members of the opposition as well as recalcitrant members of his own party.

It's never a good idea to come away from a movie with the notion that the historical figures have been depicted with accuracy and fairness. "Lincoln," though, seems like an honest attempt to capture the essence of one of the most compelling figures in the history of mankind.

Spielberg's "Lincoln" is ambitious filmmaking at its best. This brilliant film shows that the president was not just a multifaceted statesman and military leader, but also a dedicated and introspective family man coping with an enormous number of challenges.

Daniel Day-Lewis is simply superb as Abraham Lincoln. If he's not nominated for an Academy Award as Best Actor, I would question the judgment of the voters.

Authorized Users Don't Help Your Credit

Dear Dave,

My brother asked me to put his name on my credit card as an authorized user. He said it will help improve his credit score. Is this true, and would it help my score in any way?

- Anna

Dear Anna,

Your brother is wrong. It will not improve his credit score at all. As an authorized user, he is not the owner of the debt. There's a high likelihood that it will affect your credit score in a negative way, though, because there's a good chance he'll do some dumb things with your card.

Look at it this way. Why would someone give him credit, or raise his credit score, just for using your credit? It doesn't make sense. Your credit score is affected by things like whether or not you pay your bill on time. The card isn't in his name, so really all this amounts to is him having fun with your card, and you're the one who's liable for the damage. The truth is that authorized users shouldn't even show up on a credit report.

It sounds like your brother has some financial problems. While I admire the fact that he wants to fix things, this is not the answer. Don't misunderstand what I'm saying, Anna. Chances are he's not trying to con you.

He probably just got some bad information. But the hard truth is this: If you go along with his idea, it's not going to help him, and it's going to hurt you. Don't do it!

Dear Greg,

I'm an NFL season ticket holder for the Tennessee Titans. But I've been debt-free for years, and my family's financial future is very secure. Whether the Titans win or lose, or whether I watch the games in person or in front of the television, has no impact on their security. However, if you're sitting there with credit card debt, a car payment and living paycheck to paycheck, you've got no business buying season tickets. Get yourself out of debt, build an emergency fund, and make sure your family is taken care of first. Then you can have some fun. Live like no one else so that later vou can live like no one else. And then, if that includes season tickets to your favorite football, baseball or hockey team, have a

Remember, this kind of thing is entertainment. I know a lot of silly people out there act like whoever wins a football game is a matter of life and death, but it's just a game. Your life and your financial future are not games, and they're not things to be taken lightly. First things first, Greg. There will be plenty of time for that kind of fun when you can afford it!

DEPARTING PASSENGERS

Arrive two hours in advance of departure.

Parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Customers should give themselves time to find alternative parking in case their favorite location is full. Customers must pay the posted rate at whatever parking option they select.

Daily parking for both terminals is clearly marked and available at the parking garage and the daily lot near the garage. Upon entering the airport, drivers should look for signs to daily parking and keep to the right.

The economy lot usually fills to capacity during Thanksgiving and Christmas. To minimize impact, the daily lot is now available at a reduced maximum daily rate of \$12.






