# BBB's Top 10 Scams of 2011

SACRAMENTO REGION -Better Business Bureau released its list of top 10 scams of 2011 today. The list cites job hunters, home owners and internet users as top targets for fraudulent activity. 'The internet is a goldmine for

scammers," said Gary Almond, president of BBB serving Northeast California. "Some of these scams are annual players, but the rise of social media has added a few new twists to our list."

The list is compiled using data from Better Business Bureaus across the United States, documented via spikes in complaints and consumer inquiries. Following is the list, in no particular order, of scams and rip offs that took advantage of consumers across the U.S. in 2011:

#### Top Job Scam


BBB sees many secret shopper schemes, work-from-home scams, and other phony job offers, but this job-related scam can steal identities. The emails, websites and online applications look professional. Candidates are interviewed for the job (usually over the phone) and then receive an offer. In order to start the job, however, the candidate has to fill out a "credit report" or provide bank information for direct deposit. The online forms are nothing more than a way to capture sensitive personal data – Social Security number or bank accounts - that can easily be used for identity theft

#### Top Sweepstakes and **Lottery Scam**

This year's top sweepstakes scam was an email claiming to be from Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg announcing the recipient was the winner of \$1 million from the popular social networking site. BBB always urges consumers to never click links they are not sure about. Instead go directly to the homepage of the company mentioned. If they are really giving away \$1 million, there will be some kind of announcement on their

everything from grisly footage of Osama bin Laden's death to the latest celebrity hijinks have shown up on social media sites, often looking as if they have been shared by a friend When one clicks on the link, a prompt to "upgrade your Flash player" appears, but the file that downloads contains a worm that logs into the social media account, sends similar messages to the recipient's friends, and searches for personal data.

#### **Top Home Improvement Scam**

Always near the top of BBB complaint data are home improvement contractors who leave homes worse than they found them. They usually knock on the door with a story or a deal – the roofer who can spot some missing shingles or the paver

with some leftover asphalt who can give a great deal on driveway resealing. Itinerant contractors move around, keeping a step ahead of the law. The worst are those who move in after a natural disaster, taking advantage of desperate homeowners who need immediate help and may not be as suspicious as they would be under normal circumstances.

#### **Top Check Cashing Scam**

They contact a seller via a craigslist.org posting and send the seller a check for more than the amount they owe. The seller is then asked to deposit it into a bank account and send them the difference via wire transfer. A deposited check takes a couple of days to clear, whereas wired money is gone instantly. When the original check bounces, the

seller is out of the money wired and stuck with whatever her or she was trying to sell.

#### **Top Phishing Scam**

"Phishing" is when one receives a suspicious phone call asking for personal information or an email that installs a virus to hunt for personal data. The most pernicious phishing scam this year disguised itself as official communication from NACHA the National Automated Clearing House Association - which facilitates the secure transfer of billions of electronic transactions every year. The email claims one of the recipients' transactions did not go through and urges the consumer to click a link.

#### SMUD, Library Offer **Power Use Monitors**

SACRAMENTO REGION -If you have a Sacramento Public Library card, you can check out a "Kill A WattTM EZ" power monitor just like you would a book and learn which appliances in your home are using the most power and costing you the most money to operate. SMUD has donated 56 Kill A WattTMEZ monitors, two for each of the Sacramento Public Library's 28 branches, in an effort to educate customers about energy efficiency and about SMUD programs designed to help them save

The monitor is simple to use. Just plug the device into an electrical outlet, and then plug the appliance into the device. Enter the cost per kilowatt-hour, and the device displays the kilowatt-hour usage and the cost of electricity to run the appliance. Customers can monitor the energy cost of any 110- or 120-volt appliance such as refrigerators, freezers, televisions and computers.

The monitor helps customers understand how individual appliances can impact their energy bills and determine if those appliances should be unplugged or plugged into a power strip that can be easily turned on when the appliance is needed. The monitor even calculates cost and forecasts costs by the week, month or year.

SMUD and the Sacramento Public Library see the program as a tremendous way to engage their customers on a grand level. "This service is one more way Sacramento Public Library can fulfill its mission to provide valuable information to the public – information that can impact their lives for the better

T," said Library Director Rivkah Sass. "The library is thrilled to partner with SMUD to help Sacramento residents lower their energy use," she added." he Sacramento Public Library system serves residents throughout Sacramento County the same territory as SMUD — and more than 600,000 county residents have library cards.

# Not the Usual Hoopla

CARMICHAEL - In a regime both vintage and current, fitness enthusiasts are doing the hula hoop in new earnest.

Spawned from alternative street art and night clubs, "Hoop Girl" classes are among adult courses offered at the La Sierra Community Center (5325 Engle Rd). Multi-colored, hand-crafted and sometimes battery-lit, equipment is not your momma's \$2 hoop. Neither are the routines

 taught by hoop professional Allison Miller — kids' stuff. "We spin from waist, hips, ankles, fingers - I am developing face hooping now," she says. 'You can also dance two-in-ahoop with another person. That takes practice. It sounds like an odd discipline but it's an effective workout that makes people feel like kids again.'

Swirling at hundreds of revolutions per minute is reckoned to burn between 300 and 500 calories per hour. "It doesn't feel like a like gym class, but you work your core muscles," says oneyear student Erin McDonough. "After a few minutes, you're actually sweating. I've gained a slimmer mid-section and more awareness of my body." Another acolyte bemoaned her former self-consciousness on the dance

floor. Teacher recommended an imaginary hula hoop and now the shrinking violet is a dancing queen. For orientation, Miller offers free jam sessions (hoops provided) at 4 p.m. on Sundays in McKinley Park, Sacramento.

An El Camino High graduate with a BA in French, Miller (23) rediscovered the hoop at UC Santa Cruz. "I came home from college with a hula hoop," she recalls. "Mom immediately was right there beside me, hooping." The student gained HoopGirl teaching credentials three years ago. "People drive from as far as Chico, Grass valley and Vacaville for my classes," she says. "There are very few licensed instructors in Northern California."

A craze of bubble-gum proportion in the 1950s, hooping's recent revival began a decade ago and was popularized by daringly costumed exponents on late night TV. Allison Miller's pavement performances illuminate Second Saturdays in Sacramento. She manufactures her own hoops to equip Monday night classes in Carmichael.

# Irish Born Sister Marie O'Connor Touched All with Sense of Humor, Generous Spirit

Sister Marie O'Connor was a woman of deep faith with a sense of humor and a generous spirit that touched all who met her. According to close friends, she shared those gifts widely.

"She saw humor in everything and her laughter was contagious,' said Sister Maria Campos who knew Sister Marie for 30 years. "She was the most generous and kind person towards others. People loved her."

Sister Marie was "Mercy hospitality personified," according to Sister Anne Marie Miller. "When you were with her she lifted your spirit, she affirmed, encouraged, and always was always grateful for any little thing you did for her," Sister Anne said. "I will miss her gentle spirit, her great generosity of self and, of course, her wonderful passionate, fullbodied laugh. She truly was a joy-filled Sister of Mercy."

Sister Marie died Jan. 18 in Auburn, Calif., at the age of 76. She had been a Sister of Mercy for 58 years.

Sister Marie was born April 19, 1935, in Dingle, Co. Kerry Ireland, to John and Mary O'Connor. She graduated from Presentation Secondary School, Dingle in 1953 and entered the Sisters of Mercy on Feb. 5, 1955, in Auburn, Calif. She professed temporary vows on Aug. 18, 1957, and final vows on Aug. 18, 1962

After completing Associate in Arts degree at Our Lady of Mercy College, Auburn in 1958, Marie was assigned to the central services department at Mercy General Hospital for four years. In 1962, she returned to her homeland and spent four years in vocation recruitment at Immaculate Heart Convent, (Abbeylands), Ireland. She traveled to various high schools throughout Ireland with a sister companion and met with students interested in religious life. This was how a number of sisters in Auburn were introduced to the Sisters of Mercy in Auburn. This assignment was a great delight to her father, who prayed every day that he would live to see her again. He passed away while she was in Abbeylands.

From 1967-1968, trained as an EKG and EEG technician at Mercy General Hospital in Sacramento. She was assigned to Mercy San Juan Hospital in Carmichael, Calif., where she spent the next 20 years moving throughout the hospital with her mobile unit, doing either an EKG or an EEG for patients in various departments, including surgery and intensive care.

In 1989, Marie took a sabbatical at Milltown Institute in Dublin and on her return to the

activities at the Motherhouse in Auburn for three years. From 1994 until her retirement in 2006, she was one of the support staff at Mercy General Hospital in Sacramento. She served at the information desk and was the first face of mercy for patients being admitted, for visitors to the hospital and for employees coming to work.

After formally retiring, Sister Marie served as a volunteer and then in prayer ministry at Mercy Convent in Sacramento. She spent this past year in our Lady of Lourdes Retirement Center.

Sister Marie's "special hobby" was to care for her friend Sister Bridget Mary Flynn, "She was dedicated to helping her every weekend with what ever she needed done," Sister Maria Campos said. "She truly will be missed by all."

Sister Marie is preceded in death by her brothers Jack, Jeremiah and Father Patrick, sisters Bridie Carroll and Kitty Graham. Survivors include her brother Larry (Maura), Michael Joseph (Teresa), many nieces, nephews and her religious community.

Mass of Christian burial will be celebrated on Tuesday, January 24 at 11:00 am. at Our Lady of Mercy Chapel, Auburn. Memorial donations may be sent to Sisters of Mercy retirement fund, 535 Sacramento St., Auburn, CA 95603.





# Freedom Gets a Boost

Every once in a while, the Supreme Court takes notice of the Constitution and actually comes to the defense of that thing called freedom. True, it doesn't happen often, and hasn't happened much at all for, oh,

100 years or so. But it can and does happen. This time, the issue concerns the relationship between commerce and religion, and freedom came out on top.

We can work with this. The backdrop is this... A small Lutheran school in Michigan (the Hosanna-Tabor Evangelical Lutheran Church and School) hired Cheryl Perich to teach many subjects, including theology. After a semester, she developed narcolepsy and said she couldn't show up for work for a month after the Christmas break. The kids would just have to wait.

But in this competitive market, failing to deliver educational services could be financially devastating, not to mention very detrimental to the kids. So the school hired someone to take her place. When Perich finally showed up for work, she sensed that she had been replaced and prepared a disability lawsuit. The school tried to give her benefits in exchange for resigning, but she refused. So she was finally fired for insubordination and causing disruption.

It's not a particularly unusual case. Businesses face this sort of thing all the time. The way the law works, businesses are routinely blackmailed by disgruntled employees who demand to be paid, even though they aren't wanted. It's beyond me why a person would want to work at a place where he or she is not wanted, but that's the way it is. And the law, citing their "civil rights" to other people's money, usually comes down on the side of the worker.

The EEOC decided in favor of the Perich, but the school persisted, and the case went to the high court. Here the justices delivered a surprisingly sensible decision on interesting grounds. The Constitution says that the government can't interfere with religion. Perich was teaching religion at a religious institution. For the government to demand her reinstated, it would be a clear imposition on this institution and an obvious violation of the First Amendment.

"Requiring a church to accept or retain an unwanted minister, or punishing a church for failing to do so," said the court, "intrudes upon more than a mere employment decision. Such action interferes with the internal governance of the church, depriving the church of control over the selection of those who will personify its beliefs. By imposing an unwanted

minister, the state infringes the Free Exercise Clause, which protects a religious group's right to shape its own faith and mission through its appointments."

Darn right. But wait! What about her "civil rights"? The court said that whatever the employee's legal rights would be in a normal commercial institution, they can't possibly apply in the case of a commissioned minister of a religious institution. Otherwise, we would have the government effectively deciding who must or must not be a minister, which obviously contradicts the whole point of the First Amendment.

The language of both the majority and concurring opinions makes a series of uncommonly sensible points. The concurring opinion by Samuel Alito and Elena Kagan points out that it is part of Lutheran teaching that disputes be handled within the community and not be taken to secular courts. But this teacher, Perich, totally disregarded this core principle and immediately started threatening the school with a lawsuit.

Your eyes just pop out to read the court wholly endorsing the Lutheran view: "Hosanna-Tabor discharged the respondent because she threatened to file suit against the church in a civil court. This threat contravened the Lutheran doctrine that disputes among Christians should be resolved internally without resort to the civil court system and all the legal wrangling it entails." For courts to interfere 'would dangerously undermine the religious autonomy."

Again, darn right.

But you know what the problem here is? The court wrapped its defense of freedom here in clerical robes only. In order to enjoy the autonomous right to hire and fire, you have to be a religious institution, and it has to pertain to someone who is teaching, however little, some aspect of doctrine. That's the right decision, but why shouldn't the same principle apply across the board to all commercial institutions and, indeed, to all private institutions? Why should religious institutions be the exclusive beneficiary of a laissez-faire policy?

All businesses, all nonprofits, all private clubs, all neighborhood associations have internal policies and should enjoy the right to manage their own affairs without government intrusion. To impose a government plan on their labor policies is a serious compromise of rights and liberties, which must always include not only the right to associate but to disassociate.

The critics of the case worry that the decision is too broad, so broad that the court didn't even bother to define what a minister is. The critics are completely wrong. This court decision is the right one, but the problem is that it is too narrow: In the name of freedom, all privately

owned groups should be granted the same right to manage themselves.

Interestingly, this case even has implications for the current political war over Mitt Romney's activities at Bain & Co., a private equity firm that specializes in corporate restructuring. Its work can result in either profits or losses, expansions or closings. People are hired, people are fired. Who decides? The owners and managers do — in response to market trends — so it should be always and everywhere in a free society.

Newt Gingrich, apparently, doesn't like this idea. He calls Romney a corporate raider who needlessly puts people out of work — as if Gingrich knows better than the stockholders how to run a company.

A particular issue for Gingrich concerns a steel mill in Kansas that Bain was instrumental in closing, leaving massive job losses behind. Hello? Steel? Its production was once integral to the U.S. economy, but those days ended some 30 years ago when overseas companies demonstrated that they could do the same thing at a fraction of the cost. Is Gingrich really suggesting that every means should be used to keep steel plants open, even if it means looting American businesses and consumers who are forced to pay the highest possible prices for no good reason?

This way of thinking puts Gingrich on the side of Cheryl Perich: against the rights of the property owners. Just as the Supreme Court said, such a system would involve massive coercion against people and intolerable intrusions into the private affairs of others.

Whether it is a tiny religious school or a multinational corporation, up with freedom of association and freedom of disassociation! That's the way liberty works. Its genius is its capacity to adapt the economic environment to a changing world, so that we stay on the path of growth to support rising living standards for humanity. The stasis of a socialist, state-run economy is not an option in today's world, and neither is the economic stagnation that comes with national protectionism and special privileges for workers. You can't have genuine profit and expansion without the possibility of losses and plant closings, and without the owners of institutions having control over who can and cannot get paid for services.

What applies to the Lutheran school should apply to every sector of society that is privately owned, whether or not their workers are called ministers. It is not only religion that needs protection against government interference. Everyone does. Granted, this would be a gigantic step in the right direction.

Recent case of interest

CASE: Donald Fernandes (01/20/12)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Ruanne Dozier

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable David DeAlba sentenced Donald Fernandes to 26 years to life in prison for the first degree murder of Karen Curtin.

Fernandes and the victim were in a dating relationship. In January 2010, Fernandes called a former girlfriend and told her he was at the victim's house and that she was injured. When Fernandes refused to call 911, the former girlfriend called police asking them to check on the victim. When police arrived at the house, they found the victim lying on her bed with a severely crushed skull, a sock shoved in her mouth, and a plastic bag over her head. Fernandes was still at the house and told police that the victim tried to hit him with a hammer when he took it from her and hit her with it.

The victim was transported to UC Davis Medical Center where she died three days later. An autopsy revealed that she suffered 10 separate lacerations to the head, consistent with being hit in the head with a hammer. Her cause of death was from blunt force trauma to the head.

# CHP Holds Free Teenage Driving Class "Start Smart"

SACRAMENTO REGION – The leading cause of death for teenagers in America are motor vehicle traffic collisions. In an effort to reduce motor vehicle traffic collisions in California, CHP Valley Division will offer a free Start Smart class during National Teen Driver Safety Week (NTDSW). According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), mile for mile, teenagers are involved in three times as many fatal crashes as all other drivers. The goal of the NTDSW is to raise awareness and seek solutions to unnecessary teen deaths on our Nations roads.

The CHP's Start Smart program is a driver safety education class which targets new and future licensed teenage drivers between the age of 15 -19 and their parents/guardians.

The Start Smart class will cover collision avoidance techniques, driver responsibility, collision trends, distracted driving laws and alcohol related driving laws. The program also offers an opportunity for new drivers and parents/guardians to ask CHP Officers clarifying questions.

- In 2009 there were 5,623 fatalities in motor vehicle crashes involving 15-20 year-old drivers, including 988 (or 18%) drunk driving fatalities.
- In 2009, 619 (or 16%) of drivers under the age of 20 involved in a fatal crash were reported to have been distracted while driving, including 138 drivers with cell phones.

The next class will be held Thursday, February 16, 2012 from 6:30 P.M. till 8:45 P.M., at CHP North Sacramento Area, 5109 Tyler Street, Sacramento, CA 95841.

Parents/guardians interested in signing up the class will need to register for the class by calling Officer Dutton at (916) 338-6710 x 247 (space is limited). It is encouraged that parents/ guardians attend the class with their teen driver. Funding for CHP's Start Smart programs are provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Administration.

It may take the consumer to a fake banking site to "verify" account information or it may download malware.

#### **Top Identity Theft Scam**

This scam is so prevalent that many hotels are posting warnings in their lobby. Here's how it works: The guest receives a call via the phone in the room in the middle of the night. It's the front desk clerk, very apologetic, saying their computer has crashed and they need to get the guest's credit card number again, or they must have gotten the number wrong because the transaction won't go through. Scammers are counting on the guest being too sleepy to catch on that the call isn't from the hotel at all. By morning, the credit card has been fraudulently charged.

#### **Top Financial Scam**

After the federal government announced or expanded several mortgage relief programs this year, many sound-alike websites popped up attempting to fool consumers

into parting with their money. Some sound like a government agency, or even part of BBB or other nonprofit consumer organization. Most ask for an upfront fee to help deal with the mortgage company or government (services easily done for free), and almost all leave consumers in more debt than when they started.

**Top Sales Scam** Sales scams are always popular, but the internet has introduced a whole new way to rip people off. Penny auctions are popular because it seems like one can get something useful-cameras, computers, etc. - for below retail. Consumers actually pay a small fee for each bid and if they do not win, they lose all the bid money. Winners often are not the top bidder, but the last bidder when time runs out. Although not all penny auction sites are scams, BBB recommends treating them the same way one would legal gambling – know exactly how the bidding works, set a limit, and be prepared to walk away before exceeding that limit.

#### Scam of the Year

The BBB phishing scam -Hundreds of thousands, perhaps millions, of people received emails imitating an official notice from BBB. The subject line says something like "Complaint Against Your Business." The instructions tell the recipient to either click on a link or open an attachment to get the details. If the recipient does either, a malicious virus launches. The virus can steal banking information, passwords and other critical pieces of information needed for cybertheft. BBB is working with security consultants and federal law enforcement to track down the source of these emails, and has already shut down dozens of hijacked websites. Anyone who has opened an attachment or clicked on a link should run a complete system scan using reputable anti-virus software. If a computer is networked with others, all machines on the network should be scanned.

# **Metro Firefighters Respond to Christmas Tree Fire**

Several Occupants Displaced From Fire Related Damage

SACRAMENTO - January 21st, 11:30pm - Metro, and Sacramento City Firefighters responded to 2501 Hurley Way to a report of a fire in a second story apartment. # **Metro Fire Responds to Duplex Fire** in Citrus Heights with A Teenager Burned


