Brown Cuts 3800 State Vehicles

G. Brown Jr. today announced that an executive order to purge unnecessary vehicles has already cut the state's fleet by 3,800, which is expected to save \$11.4 million next year and bring in \$5 million from auction revenue. These cuts meet nearly 70 percent of the state's 5,500 vehicle reduction target, and deeper cuts will continue as the state eliminates more unnecessary vehicles across every department.


"Significant progress has been made, but we are not done yet," Governor Brown said. "I'm not satisfied with purging just 3,800 vehicles-state departments can make deeper cuts. Every department must eliminate the unnecessary vehicles that waste taxpayer money. There is no excuse for an excessive state fleet."

The Department of General Services, charged with implementing the Governor's executive order, estimates this first reduction phase will save the state more than \$11 million annually by eliminating surplus cars, trucks, vans, buses and heavy equipment. Auctioning these vehicles is estimated to bring the state at least \$5 million more in additional revenue. The Department of General Services is prepared to begin holding auctions in the Fall.

The largest reductions come from the following eight departments, which operate the largest fleets:

- · California Department of Transportation: 926
- Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation: 795
- California State Parks: 388
- California Highway Patrol: 322 • California Department of Fish &
- Game: 251
- CAL FIRE: 234
- California Department of Water Resources: 204
- California Department of Food & Agriculture: 111

On average, a state vehicle remains useful for five years and costs \$3,000 per year in maintenance, insurance and depreciation costs. Based on those figures, today's reductions could save the state up to \$57 million over five years.

The Department of General Services will continue to make even deeper cuts in the coming months to eliminate unnecessary vehicles across every department. In addition to reducing the size of its state fleet immediately, the state is examining its need for vehicles going forward. This examination will include reviewing how, when and why vehicles are used and will help departments implement more practical and cost-effective plans for the amount and type of vehicles needed to achieve their missions

Departments have also eliminated more than 600 vehicle home storage permits that are nonessential or cost ineffective. The Department of General Services expects to eliminate hundreds more.

In addition to cutting the state fleet, Governor Brown has already slashed spending in his own office by more than 25 percent and ordered state agencies and departments to:

- Recover millions of dollars in uncol-
- lected salary and travel advances;
- Ban spending taxpayer dollars on free giveaway and gift items;
- Eliminate 30,000 cell phones; and • Freeze hiring across state govern-

Tax Roll Totals Announced

Sacramento County Assessor Kathleen Kelleher announced that the 2011-12 assessment roll was completed on July 1. The gross assessed value of the combined secured and unsecured property tax roll totals approximately \$124.8 billion. This is nearly \$4 billion less than the 2010-11 assessment roll total, or a 3.07% decrease. The property tax revenue decrease totals nearly \$40 million overall. The loss to the Sacramento County general fund is 16.3% of the decrease, or approximately \$6.5 million.

Assessed value information for all Sacramento County parcels will be available July 5 on the Assessor's web site Parcel Viewer application.

The Assessor's Office reviewed the market value of over 187,000 residential and 2,700 commercial and apartment properties for the 2011-12 roll. Many of these reviews resulted in adjusted assessed values below their Prop 13 value. The adjustments will be reflected on tax bills issued in October of 2011. These adjustments in assessed value are provided for in California tax law and often referred to as Proposition 8 (Prop 8) adjustments, reflecting the 1978 ballot proposition that authorized them. This is the fifth consecutive year of widespread Prop 8 reductions in Sacramento County.

It is important to remember that Prop 8 value reductions are temporary. Once a property receives a Prop 8 reduction, its value must be reviewed each year to determine whether the January 1 fair market value remains less than its Prop 13 base year value (typically acquisition value) plus inflationary adjustments. The lower of these two values is the value used for property tax purposes.

The Assessor's Office will be accepting requests for Prop 8 review on residential and agricultural properties between July 5 and November 30, 2011. Further information on the Prop 8 review process can be found on the Assessor's web site.

As to commercial and apartment properties, the Assessor's Office will NOT be accepting requests for 2011 roll Prop 8 reviews. Owners of commercial and apartment property who believe their market value has declined below their factored Prop 13 value will need to file an assessment appeal. Information on the appeal process can be found on the Assessment Appeals Board web site.

SMUD Proposes New Rates

The SMUD Board of Directors is considering the General Manager's proposals to restructure electricity rates and invites your input. These proposals would not raise SMUD's system average rates or increase revenues to SMUD. This article provides an overview of the commercial proposals.

The General Manager's rate restructuring report includes three key proposed changes. One recommendation is to better collect the true costs associated with providing the infrastructure for a reliable, electricity delivery system. By infrastructure, we mean the poles, wires, transformers and substations that keep the entire system operating safely and efficiently. Right now, some costs for infrastructure are collected on the volume of electricity sold. SMUD wants to begin separating infrastructure costs from electricity costs so you know what you are paying for and why.

For very small commercial customers, the monthly infrastructure charge will increase from \$8.25 to \$12 per month (an increase of \$3.75) in 2012. Beginning in 2014, the monthly infrastructure charge

increase \$2 per month each year, over the next four year so that this charge is better aligned with the true cost of maintaining a robust electricity system. (Total of \$20 by 2017) Small commercial customers, who are now paying \$20.50 per month, will see their monthly infrastructure charge increase just once by \$1.50 in 2012 to bring their monthly infrastructure charge to \$22.00. To offset these increases, SMUD will reduce the cost per kilowatt hour for electricity each year that the monthly infrastructure charge increases.

The second proposal would have very small and small commercial customers join with medium and large commercial customers in having different pricing for electricity during defined periods of time or "Time of Use" rates. Small commercial customers would be asked to pay demand charges (the costs associated with delivering energy capacity from the electrical system. To make these proposals revenue neutral so that there is little or no impact on electric bills, SMUD will further reduce the cost per kilowatt

hour for all hours in the summer months, except during the hours of 3-6pm when electricity is most expensive. The charges for electricity will increase during 3-6pm to better reflect the true cost of what SMUD pays for electricity in the market place. Even with these changes, 95% of very small commercial customers...restaurants, barbershops and small professional offices... will see monthly bill impacts of less than \$10, even if they don't reduce energy from 3 to 6 pm on weekdays.

The third proposal would apply a late fee of 1.5% to bills that aren't paid within three days after the due date. Customers are given 19 days to pay bills, so the late fee would apply 22 days after the bill was issued. The late fee would only apply to the unpaid balance, not previous charges. Customers who call SMUD and establish a payment plan wouldn't be charged the

The General Manager is proposing a late fee because in 2010. more than 1.2 million unpaid bills (\$275 million in revenue) required several notices to be sent to customers for payment. SMUD has a fiduciary responsibility to collect unpaid bills, and so a late fee will encourage cus-

tomers to pay their bills on time. You can read the full General Manager's rate restructuring proposal at smud.org. 

DMV: "Ask George"

Expert Answers to Common DMV Questions



By George Valverde – Director, California Department of Motor Vehicles Do you have questions about general driving related requirements like registration and insurance?

Are you unclear about laws and restrictions related to driving?

The California Department of Motor Vehicles has answers.

Q: My daughter is seven years old but is particularly small for her age (just 59 lbs.). I know that the general rule of thumb is to have children six or younger ride in the back seat in a child safety seat, but since my daughter is so small, should I keep her in her safety seat even though she's over six?

A: Yes! The California Driver Handbook states that any child six years of age or younger or 60 pounds or less must be properly secured in a federally approved child passenger restraint system and ride in the back seat of a vehicle. This is an absolute must to ensure your daughter is as safe as possible when riding in your vehicle. For more information, please visit www.dmv.ca.gov. Save Time. Go Online!

Q: I was cited for speeding last week on a rainy day. I am really angry about it because I was going under the speed limit! The posted speed limit was 50 and I was going 45mph. How can the CHP officer justify this citation?

A: According to the California Driver Handbook, California has a "Basic Speed Law." This law means you may never drive faster than what is safe for current conditions. Since it was raining and the roads were likely wet and slippery, the CHP officer must have determined that you were going faster than was safe for the weather that day. To avoid this situation in the future, pay careful attention when weather conditions are poor and take extra caution as you drive, because you can get cited for speeding even if you're

following the posted speed limit. For information on this and other speed laws, consult the California Driver Handbook online by visiting http:// www.dmv.ca.gov/pubs/pubs.htm. Save Time. Go Online!

Q: I recently renewed my vehicle registration, but after I left the DMV I realized that they charged me late fees! I'm positive my registration was not paid late; I paid it in person three days before it was due. Can I get my money back, and is there an easier way than going back to the DMV office? A: Yes, you can definitely request a refund if you believe you were charged incorrectly. What's even better is that the DMV now offers

an Online Refund Program through which you can request your refund online at www.dmv.ca.gov for certain types of refunds. Specific criteria must be met to participate in the Online Refund Program, and in this case, your request does qualify to be completed online. Please visit https:// mv.dmv.ca.gov/isr/welcome.do.

There, you can download the instructions, complete and submit your form online. Save Time. Go Online! It's fast, safe and easy!

Q: I am trying to plan ahead and budget enough money for my car registration renewal. Is there any way I can *find out what I owe ahead of time?*

A: Yes, you can calculate your fees ahead if time if you want to know before you receive your registration renewal notice, but only if it's less than 75 days before your renewal fees

are due. Calculating your fees is easier than you might think! Simply visit www.dmv.ca.gov and click on the tab labeled "Vehicle Registration". There is a bullet point on that page that says "vehicle registration calculator"; click on that link and you'll be taken to a list of registration renewal options. Select the appropriate option from that page, and you will be directed to the calculation form. Once you're finished entering the appropriate information, click on "calculate fees" and your amount due to the DMV will be displayed for you. Save Time. Go Online!

Q: What documents do I need to bring with me on the day that I apply for a driver license?

A: If you're age 18 or over, remember to bring an original (or certified copy) of your Birth Certificate or Legal Presence document on the day you apply. You must also provide your social security number as well. If you are under the age of 18, the above requirements apply in addition to the requirement that your application be signed by your parents or guardian. If under the age of 17 ½ you must also provide your certificate of completion of driver's education. And remember to bring your proof of insurance card for your drive test – this is one of the more commonly forgotten documents and can save you from making an extra trip to the DMV. That Tough Decline

There's another slow grounder to short. We've seen it way too many times this season. Now there's a chopper to second — enough of those too.

Watching poor Miggy — Miguel Tejada of your San Francisco Giants playing well below the level we've been accustomed to through his fine career has been tough.

At 37 and in his 15th season, the six-time All-Star and 2002 AL MVP with Oakland is clearly on the decline. Tejada played at least 156 games in twelve seasons, has 303 homeruns and almost 1300 RBI. He's still out there almost every day, but we're not seeing much production. He's lost his edge on defense and there's not much pop left in his bat.

And people are taking shots at the guy. There have been occasional flashes of his old brilliance — a great play or big hit here or there. When he hit a grand slam earlier in the year he had some extra giddyup in his homerun trot and fans hoped that might key an offensive resurgence. But, no. The consistency seems to be gone for good.

In a clutch situation, though, would you want a veteran performer who has been there thousands of times before or somebody else? It's a tough call and a tough transition to make.

I can relate to what Miggy is going through. After 36 years of softball, I've done things this season that I've never done before (that I can remember; the recall may be in decline as well). Three errors in one

game. Three pop-ups in another. My annual hitting slump has gone longer than ever before. The decline is an uncomfortable experience. Is it time to move myself down in the batting order and let someone younger, faster and stronger move up? Maybe.

My mother-in-law passed away a short time ago in our home. The old gal really liked her sports. Her special love was football, especially college, and her favorite teams were USC an Notre Dame. Now, whenever I think of how much I dislike anything USC, I'll think of her. We enjoyed watching sports together. She was a Dodger fan way too long, having lived in the south state many years. She would make me shudder when she remembered her favorite team of Tommy LaSorda, Steve Garvey, Davey Lopes and the rest.

Finally she admitted to converting to the Giants. For several years up north that's who we watched, and she didn't know any Dodgers anymore. She loved the Panda (Pablo Sandoval), the one with the hair (Tim Lincecum), and the one with the beard (Brian Wilson).

She would impress me sometimes with names or tidbits from the past that she would remember. As things gradually broke down through her personal homestretch it was hard for her to sit through a game and her memories became jumbled. She enjoyed reading my columns the last few months. When the vision worsened she had one of us read them to her, but we could tell she was having trouble following along.

But her favorite thing was the family Jeopardy sessions. At 84 she was a little slow but still pretty good, and right up to her final few days she would surprise everyone with an answer.

Surprisingly, this leads me to Derek Jeter. How can anybody give this guy a hard time? It seems he's always "played the game the right way." The Captain, Hall of Famer for sure, big-play guy, has been the shortstop every team would want. I was annoyed to hear the knocks Jeter was taking through the early part of the season. Give the guy the respect that's due — five championships, five Gold Gloves, 12-time All-Star, 147 post-season games with 30 doubles, 20 homers and a .309 average, 15 seasons with the same team and the first Yankee ever to reach 3,000 hits should earn it.

Also 37, sure his numbers and range are fading, but he's still capable of greatness. He showed it in a big way Saturday, with a long homer for #3000, and a 5-for-5 day, including a game-winning single in front of the home fans.

Certain performers should be immune to criticism down the stretch. Their history should warrant "a big-league hang-with-'em," as Giants broadcaster Mike Krukow might say. Hold your tongue. Let them play it out. They can see the finish line before them and know the tough transition is beginning. Watch and enjoy what they have left and hope to catch a few more blasts from the past.

The first recorded criticism of Jesus in Luke's Gospel was about who he was eating and drinking with. It came from the religious leaders of his time. They "grumbled at His disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with the tax-gathers and sinners?" And Jesus answered and said to them, "It is not those who are well who need a physician, but those who are sick, "I have not come to call righteous men but sinners to repentance." (Luke 5:30)

Here we see a very good case of labeling and stereotyping. Taxgatherers in those days were traitors who worked for the hated Roman Empire. Sinners were Israelites who were not practicing Jews. Both groups were shunned by the religious leaders of Jesus day.

Jesus knows His mission and compares himself to a physician.

Making a U-Turn

Physicians are expected to be around sick people! That's their mission. In the same way Jesus is a spiritual physician and has come to call those "sin sick of soul" to repent.

Just last month I was eating and drinking (water) at a beautiful outdoor wedding reception. All around me were the decked out guests of the bride and groom. No one looked physically or spiritually sick to me! And yet if Jesus were with me He would see past the beautiful smiles and sexy clothing and see any spiritually sick souls. He is after all the "heart knower" John 2:24-25. The only way I would have a clue as to a person's spiritual orientation and condition would be to actually ask them. But typically I don't go up to strangers and ask "And how are you doing spiritually, really?" So I was polite. I asked for names, occupation and attempted to find some common ground with those at my table.

This statement about "calling sinners to repentance" by Jesus challenges me to view my Sunday congregation differently. Some people still "dress up for church" and appear to be at their best, smile and all. And yet these words of Jesus remind me that there are "soul

sick sinners" sitting in the pews! Truthfully, we are all sinners in need of repentance. There really are none who are righteous. (Romans 3:10-11) So I, as a Pastor, must heed the call of Jesus myself & declare it to others.

Jesus calls all to repent. Repentance means to change our mind and thus our direction in life. Repentance is making a U-Turn. First you stop then you turn and go in the opposite direction. It is far more than just feeling sorry about breaking one of God's commands. One young woman at my table told me that she had become a vegetarian in the recent past and that she had never felt better in her life. She had "repented" of her traditional diet and turned and started eating a whole new menu. That's what Jesus is calling us to. He knows what our souls really need, a right relationship with our Creator, and repentance from sin is the first step in God's direction. It's time to heed the call of Jesus.
