Four Sacramento Animal Shelters Come A Holy Land Experience **Together to Find 1,000 New Homes**

Sacramento SPCA, City Sacramento Animal Care Services, Sacramento County Animal Care & Regulation and Happy Tails Pet Sanctuary are holding a joint "Home for the Holidays" pet adoption special which will begin on Friday, November 26 and run through December 30. The goal of the holiday adoption promotion is to increase adoptions community-wide and to ultimately find new homes for 1,000 homeless animals by the end of 2010. During "Home for the Holidays" adoption fees for all animals will be reduced by half.

The four participating shelters will take in more than 35,000 homeless animals this year alone. This figure represents an increase over previous years due to the poor economy and other factors. Sacramento animal shelters are overburdened with hundreds of animals seeking permanent homes. Through "Home for the Holidays," the shelters will work together to boost adoptions, and will strive to facilitate 1,000 additional adoptions before the end of the year.

"We're hoping that when people are thinking of adding a furry or feathered

Pothole Crews Begin Repairs Repair: For a two to three week

Sacramento - The Sacramento County Department of Transportation (SACDOT) has started up Fall 2010 "Pothole Sweeps Week", which is an intensified effort to identify and repair potholes. This project is part of continuous efforts to improve preventative maintenance activities for unincorporated area roadways. Pothole sweeps are performed twice each year: in Fall to ready road surfaces for the storm season and in late Spring to repair potholes caused by inclement weather. This County-wide effort will begin in the Arden Arcade community -- which is the center of

our service area -- as follows: Work crews will begin inspecting streets and mark potholes with white paint. Residents are encouraged to call SACDOT Customer Service at 875-5171, or visit www.sacdot.com/ tools/eservices, to report additional potholes not identified by crews.

period after inspection, maintenance crews and equipment will sweep through streets and repair all identified potholes.

Note: These dates may change due to weather conditions.

The second phase of this project for the southern part of the unincorporated area will start on November

There are over 5,200 lane miles of paved roadways in the County unincorporated area and it's inevitable that somewhere in this large area of streets there will be potholes. SACDOT's policy is to: "Repair all potholes as soon as possible." The Pothole Sweeps Week program enhances ongoing pavement maintenance activities, which include SACDOT crews who are sent into the field Monday through Friday each week to specifically repair potholes.



Carmichael - To promote Christian worship, Saint Francis of Assisi choreographed the first nativity pageant in 1223. Secular controversy aside, restaging the New Testament account of Christ's birth is still a beloved tradition in many churches. Carmichael's oldest congregation - Carmichael Presbyterian at 5645 Marconi Avenue – is going all-out with its annual crèche. The two-night event is billed a "Hands-on Holy Land Experience."

A living nativity is centerpiece for the church's recreated Bethlehem village in commodious McMillen Hall. A Roman guard extolling visitors to pay taxes is the door greeter. In a jostling BC/AD marketplace, potters and tanners will tout wares and children's crafts will be offered. Three wise men and an innkeeper are civic docents; prayerful angels will hover and shepherds are attended by live lambs. While many pageants spotlight silent actors, the Presbyterian Madonna and husband Joseph will have plenty to say. Event coordinator Sharon MacLean says nativity stars will crib lines for curious questioners. "A church member is a script writer," she says. "She's come up with dialogue to keep our actors in character. We want children to feel they are talking to the Holy Family and the three wise men" MacLean's daughter Whitney takes the Virgin role for her third year. "At 19, she's really too old for the part," MacLean considers (Mary was thought to be around 16 when Jesus was born). "But Whitney volunteered because she's a deacon and likes talking to children. When she gets unexpected questions, she'll wing it. If we can't be completely authentic, we'll at least have fun."

Casting the Jesus role is a greater challenge. "We'd love to use a real



Sacramento – Arden Playhouse is pleased to present Dexterity, a new play by Michael Messmer, Sacramento's most prolific comedy playwright. Dexterity has a lot of heart and a whole lot of laughs as we see what happens to literary agent Jerry Goodman, a man who may be too kind for his own good.

Jerry has taken an option on a new novel. If he can't make a deal with a Hollywood producer to pick up the option, he is out of a job (and a huge amount of money). The producer asked Jerry to show him an authentic New England Christmas, so Jerry rented a farmhouse in Connecticut. Jerry's wife isn't happy about rearranging her life for the holidays but she's doing her

best to make things go well by bringing in part-time help to cook. Immediately complicating matters is a homeless man Jerry brought home. Dexter alters personalities from a barely verbal derelict who may be hearing voices to a seemingly well-educated, erudite and romantic assistant (who may suffer from narcolepsy). The cook thinks there's something familiar about Dexter and doubts he's really a homeless person, but a relationship begins to develop between them that adds both confusion and zest. When the producer and his wife arrive early, Jerry and his wife provide a plausible explanation for Dexter's presence. When Dexter discovers that the producer isn't what he seems, information is supplied that

appears to ruin the deal and Jerry's career. But Dexter isn't what he seems, either, returning Jerry's kindness with surprising generosity.

Dexterity performances are on Friday and Saturday nights at 8pm through December 18th, with Sunday matinees at 2pm on November 21st and December 5th.





Butterflying exposes the whole bird to the heat of the grill and promotes faster cooking. Learn how to do it at www.groceryoutlet.com/holidays Serves 8 to 10

1 10 - to 12-pound turkey, butterflied 1 cup freshly squeezed lime juice (about 10 limes) 3 tablespoons dried oregano

1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, melted Canola oil

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

Place the turkey, bone side down, in a large baking dish. Cover the bird with 1/2 cup lime juice. Sprinkle oregano over the turkey and under the wings. Marinate for a few hours in the refrigerator, turning the bird at

Pat the bird dry with paper towels. Coat all surfaces of the turkey with oil, then sprinkle lightly with kosher salt and freshly cracked black pepper. Let the bird come to room temperature (approximately 30 minutes).

Combine the melted butter and the remaining 1/2 cup lime juice and set Prepare your grill with half of it on

high heat and leave half of the grill Place an aluminum roasting pan on

the side of the grill without heat.

Once the grill is hot, place turkey skin side down on the hot side of the grill for 6-8 minutes, until the skin starts to crisp. Flip the bird and grill for another 6-8 minutes.

Carefully place the turkey skin side up into the aluminum pan off the direct heat. Close the grill, and try to maintain an internal grill temperature of about 350-375° F. Baste the turkey with the butter

mixture and rotate the pan every 20 minutes. Grill the bird until a meat thermometer inserted in the thickest part registers 180° F, about 60 to 90

Transfer to a carving board, cover and let the turkey rest 15-30 minutes



Cooking Comfort Food With Apples

Jarlsberg Pork Tenderloin with Apples

4 ounces diced Jarlsberg

- 1 tablespoon dried breadcrumbs
- 1 1-pound pork tenderloin
- 1 teaspoon pepper ¹/₂ teaspoon dried thyme leaves
- ¹/₂ teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon peanut oil
- 2 large garlic cloves, minced 1 cup diced onion
- 3 peeled, sliced (3/4") Granny Smith apples (31/, cups)
- ¹/₂ cup apple brandy and ¹/₂ cup chicken stock (or 1 cup chicken stock)

Preheat oven to 400° F. Mix Jarlsberg with breadcrumbs and set aside. Cut tenderloin lengthwise in four equal strips. Mix pepper, thyme and salt; sprinkle on pork, wrap and set aside. Heat large ovenproof pan or skillet on medium-high. Add oil, swirl to coat and sauté garlic with onion 2 minutes. Add apples, cover and cook 8 minutes or until soft. Off heat, remove ¹/₂ the apple mixture and, using

spatula, create four 4-inch pancake

rounds with remaining apples. With each pork strip, make a donut circle, creating 2-inch hole in center; secure with toothpicks. Place pork rounds atop apple "pancakes." Fill pork center with cheese-breadcrumb mixture and cover with reserved apples. Bake 20 minutes. For doneness, cut into 1 round to check if meat is white. For well done, bake 5 minutes more. With spatula, carefully move rounds to serving plates. Reheat skillet on stove, pour in apple brandy and boil 2 minutes, scraping up brown bits. Add chicken stock and boil to reduce by half. Drizzle on pork rounds.

Spiced Sausage Slider

1 12-inch skinny baguette or 6 slider

Honey mustard

Relish (Sweet India or dill pickle style) OR sliced bread and butter pickles OR cornichons

¹/₂ pound thin-sliced, roasted spicy sausage: chorizo, Italian or kielbasa 1 large Fuji or Gala apple, cored and sliced thin

6 slices Jarlsberg cheese or try a premium aged Gouda, like Old

Tip: To roast sausage, preheat oven to 425° F. Spray a roasting pan with olive oil and cook sausage until well browned, about 25 minutes.

Slice bread or rolls horizontally to open. Place on foil-lined baking sheet and toast. Spread layer of mustard and relish on top and bottom halves. Arrange sausage, apple and cheese on bottom half. With roll (or baguette) tops to the side, broil 3-5 minutes until cheese begins to melt. Cover with tops (slice into 2-inch sliders if baguette) and serve.

You want someone who is smart enough to hire you because you're an intelligent, dependable, hardworking person who can deliver the goods!

Honestly, there are so many ways to make a living in this world that there's no reason to put up with being reduced to a number like that. If some company out there is trying to hire someone by a false measure of success, then in my mind it's not a company worth working for in the first place!

Thanksgiving Turkey in 8 Easy Steps



A beautiful bird with all the trimmings can look even more appetizing when properly carved. Follow these simple steps when carving a turkey.

(NAPSA) - To help the bird you serve get "gobbled up" this holiday try these easy tips from "Flavors of America" TV host and cookbook author Chef Jim Coleman and Chef's Choice". These experts have teamed up to take you through the process of serving up the perfect bird, including choosing, seasoning, cooking and carving the turkey.

Choosing The Turkey

• Step 1: When choosing your turkey, allow 1.5 pounds for each guest. For eight guests, you'll want at least a 12 lb. turkey. There will be ample leftovers

• Step 2: If you're buying a frozen turkey, allow 24 hours of thawing for every four-to-five pounds; a fresh turkey should not sit more than 48 to 72 hours before preparation.

Hints: According to Coleman, there is no scientific evidence that bird gender makes a difference in quality or taste. Environment and feed, however, can determine a taste difference.

Turkeys can be frozen up to 12 months. If you have a frozen turkey

from last year, it's safe to cook for this year's feast if it has remained frozen throughout the year.

• Step 3: Flavor your turkey with Coleman's "holiday rub" (recipe for 12 lb. turkey).

2 Tbsp. chopped fresh thyme leaves (save stems)

2 Tbsp. chopped fresh rosemary (save stems)

2 Tbsp. chopped fresh sage (save stems)

2 Tbsp. minced garlic

2 Tbsp. minced shallots

3 lemons

Mix all ingredients above, set aside stems. Pepper to taste.

• Step 4: Wash turkey inside and out with cold water and pat dry with paper towels. Place turkey in roasting pan and lift up the skin starting near the neck, and rub mixture onto the meat under the skin.

Squeeze juice of one lemon over turkey. Use remaining herb mixture to coat top of bird. Prick two lemons and place them into cavity with the stems from sage, rosemary, and thyme.

• Step 5: Preheat oven to 350°. Cook until juice runs clear when turkey is pierced at the base of leg. The turkey is done when the meat thermometer reads 180° in the thickest part of the bird. After the turkey is cooked, let it cool for 15 minutes. Cooling makes the meat easier to slice.

How to Carve A Turkey

• Step 6: Use a very sharp carving knife to carve the turkey. Sharp knives are safer and they will help you smoothly cut thin, even slices without

shredding the meat. You donŌt have to be an expert to put a razor-sharp edge on your knife. A sharpener like Chef's Choice EdgeSelect 120 can make sharpening easy. The sharpener uses 100 percent diamond-coated disks and a revolutionary polishing stage to create a professional knife edge in seconds. "Two common mistakes people make after cooking their turkey is not waiting long enough for the bird to rest after it comes out of the oven, and improperly carving the turkey by using a dull knife or the wrong technique. If you slice the turkey too soon, most of the juices will run out and your meat will be dry. And if you carve improperly or use a dull knife, carving may be more difficult and your turkey could become unappetizing," Coleman said.

By following these turkey carving instructions, you can have a turkey that looks as good as it tastes.





A Film Review by Tim Riley THE NEXT THREE DAYS (Rated PG-13)

Based on the French thriller "Pour Elle" which few people outside of France have probably ever seen, "The Next Three Days" is realized by screenwriter/director Paul Haggis ("Crash"), who is well-known for psychological mind games and manipulation in his films. For good measure, Haggis is no stranger to the thriller game, having been the screenwriter on the popular James Bond film "Casino Royale." To the say the least, "The Next Three Days" affords Haggis the opportunity to combine his talent for emotional drama and suspenseful thrills, and as a result, a film that is very entertaining if not entirely compelling is delivered for the American audience.

Russell Crowe, reliably good for his brooding presence, has much to fret about as community college teacher John Brennan. As the film opens, he and wife Lara (Elizabeth Banks) are having dinner with friends, when the other woman makes suggestive remarks to John. This is unsettling to Lara, but nevertheless it is apparent that this Pittsburgh couple live in a state of wedded bliss, along with their young son. Next thing you know, the police are pounding on the door of their family home, and Lara is arrested for the murder of her boss.

Unfortunately, the evidence that convicts John's spouse looks strong, though we do not see a trial or learn

very much about the circumstances of the death, other than a few flashbacks to the scene of the crime where Lara is implicated. One thing that seems certain is that Lara could use a better lawyer. Notwithstanding the shaky legal defense, John remains utterly convinced of his wife's innocence and spends the next three years trying to clear her name. The movie's title does not reflect these lost years, but rather the amount of time needed to set in motion a desperate plan.

As time passes, the chances of reopening the case are slim and John grows increasingly frustrated as he sees how his wife's incarceration has affected raising his son and keeping the family together. Appeals have been pursued, and denied. Lara, who suffers from diabetes, turns suicidal, and a failed attempt turns John to more frantic measures. Given his academic background, he launches into full scale research, not to win in court but to figure out a way to orchestrate a prison break. John obtains wise counsel from Liam Neeson's ex-conturned-author Damon Pennington, who suggests a complicated roadmap so that Lara may be liberated from

What is set in motion is not just a jailbreak but risky planning that causes John to mix it up with some unsavory characters in very treacherous situations. For his trouble in trying to score fake passports and social security cards, John is beaten up by low-life scum who may come to regret messing with someone like Russell Crowe. In any event, there is palpable tension all throughout the planning phases, even when John is nearly caught trying to break a lock

at the detention center. Meanwhile, Haggis teases the viewer with the possibility that Lara is actually guilty, which makes rooting for the couple a test of faith.

The excitement really gets ratcheted up when the prison break scheme is in full swing. I'd rather not reveal too many details about the staging, so as to not to spoil the surprises. Suffice it to say, it's a thrill ride fueled with imminent exposure and serious danger. Now, it is fairly easy to quibble with numerous plot holes. How does a law-abiding community college professor manage to evade all manner of law enforcement from the local to federal level? To be sure, one must suspend disbelief, but in so doing the entertainment payoff is very high. "The Next Three Days" excels at fomenting tension and suspenseful thrills. Just enjoy the ride, as well as the superb performances by Russell Crowe and Elizabeth Banks.

I came to a sharp fork in the deeply rutted road of my life this fall. I had to decide if I would continue to limp around on Saturdays in my beloved but inefficient '87 pickup, or sell it off to some poor soul in more need of it than I.

My eight cylinder American-made truck has a relatively small engine in it, the most petite offered in its day. Still, you can feel the engine torque the body of the truck when you turn it on. Perhaps that's why is gets only about a dozen miles to the gallon, and that's at 50 mph with a strong tail wind. If I'm towing anything, or have a heavy load in the truck's bed, the miles per gallon figure crashes into the single digits. In short, my fine truck is not what you'd call fuel efficient.

But a rural geologist needs a truck. It's part of the image, isn't it?

Still, lately I've been strongly tempted to sell the thing off. The truck costs money in gas and oil. It requires funds to insure. New studded snow tires add to the fun. The truck is

old enough it breaks down, including in the middle of the road, leading to towing bills and major charges from my mechanic. (I suspect my pickup pays his mortgage, but perhaps it only seems that way to me.)

There's always the dream of a new, more fuel efficient truck. There are models that actually shut down some of their cylinders on the highway when they are not needed, helping to boost mpg figures. Or I could switch to a smaller truck entirely, making efficiency gains hand over fist. And, of course, the new truck could be a glaring vellow with red flames painted down the sides. What could

But perhaps we Americans have learned something in this recession. Maybe rather than allowing myself to be seduced by an expensive new truck I'd seldom use, I'm better off sticking with what I've got. My ride isn't swank. The cab is smelly, a mix of the aroma of wet-dog, decaying cushions, and deep-seated mold. The engine runs a touch rough sometimes. I burn just a bit of oil. And I don't get great gas mileage. But I don't put many miles on the truck. And I can operate and fix my truck for far less than the price of the annual interest of a top-of-the-line new truck, even one without flames painted on the sides.

It may be corny to say it. But most of us citizens of this fine republic have had to reexamine at least some of our financial priorities in recent years. I know it's felt that way to me.

I could, in truth, live without a truck at all. But it's convenient to have one for taking loads of yard waste to the dump, for lending to young and strong folks moving from

one home to another, for towing utility trailers, and for taking a load of household goods (where does all the stuff come from?) to the annual church rummage sale.

So I'm going to keep my old truck. It's not always convenient to use, because it does break down. On the other hand, I can think of it as an adventure every time I drive, something no new truck offers an owner. Maybe that's the kind of outof-the-box thinking we need to hang onto during this long crawl upward out of the deep recession into which

Here's my last thought, one meant to remind us of the season and to help us through our financial challenges.

Modern trucks are a marvel of engineering and even basic science. And it's a fundamental truth that, more broadly speaking, there is still a powerhouse of science and engineering research in this large and diverse country. Everything from modern medicine to electronics to agricultural engineering to research in genetics is rapidly gaining ground. Perhaps with our renewed personal values about what's really important, and our bedrock national advantages in sciences and engineering, the U.S. will see progress in the coming years in many important respects.

May it be so.


