*Sacramento Region* - As part of its community relations efforts and overall mission, the California Capital Airshow (CCA) recently, (June 25, 2010) fulfilled dreams of several aspiring young aviators throughout the Sacramento region. Yesterday, CCA along with several sponsors fulfilled the dream of 15-year old Carmichael resident, Angela Evans, of one day becoming a pilot. For a majority of her childhood, Angela has been battling illnesses and required to spend a considerable amount of time in the UC Davis Children's Hospital. Recently diagnosed with Crohn's Disease, in addition to other life threatening illnesses, Angela aspires to be behind the controls of an airplane as pilot-in-command.

"This was truly a joint effort where our community partners came together to make a little girl's dream come true. To see the sheer excitement on Angela's face when she stepped out of

the plane having never flown in her life was truly moving," said Darcy Brewer, executive director of the California Capital Airshow. "The Airshow is honored to have the opportunity to show not only Angela, but the community-at-large that wishes really do come true. Our hope is that Angela's story inspires children of all ages to dream big."

Additionally, the Airshow recently awarded scholarships to seven college-aged students from the Sacramento region to help assist in their pursuit of aviation, aerospace, aeronautics or related careers. The 2010 scholarship recipients are: Blake Andrus, Peter Blomquist, Jake Daum, Michael McKone, Ana Mendivil, Victor Rice, Da Hyun Shim. Each recipient identified a true passion and timeline for achieving their career goal.

"Many people already know how to fly and are experts at it; I don't want to be just another pilot, I want to contribute to the

industry, give them something they didn't have before, leave a mark and know that I gave back to the business that inspired so much passion in me," said Ana Mendivil, future aviation manager.

"Over the past four years, we have awarded more than 65 scholarships to deserving students from our region," added Brewer. "The California Capital Airshow strives to honor our past while inspiring our future leaders to do great things; with the help of local organizations such as the GenCorp Foundation, our scholarship program helps each of these winners do exactly that."

## CHP Enhances Cell Phone Use Enforcement



**Officer, I'll be with you in just a minute?**

*Sacramento Region* - In an effort to reduce fatal and injury speed-caused collisions occurring on county roads, the North Sacramento CHP area had additional officers out patrolling this week. The Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) approved the CHP's Comprehensive Approach to Reducing Speed II grant which provides enhanced enforcement on county roadways statewide. During this enforcement period there were 25 citations written for non-use of a hands-free wireless device, 7 stop sign violations, 6 verbal warnings and one citation for throwing a lit cigarette out of the window.

While speed is a primary collision

factor, drivers are also vulnerable to driving distractions such as talking with passengers, eating or drinking, and talking or texting on wireless phones, which increase the chance of getting involved in serious vehicle collisions.

Drivers need to focus one hundred percent of their attention on their driving at all times. Don't wait until you get behind the wheel before you decide to make a phone call. If you must use your cell phone, remember section 23123 of the California Vehicle Code requires that you use a hands free device. Plan ahead, buckle up, and don't drink and drive.

## The Pacific Flyway as Art – 40th Annual Festival Celebrates Traditional Wildlife Art Forms

*Sacramento Region* - Birders of a feather will flock together as the Pacific Flyway Decoy Association presents its 40th Wildlife Art Festival, Saturday

and Sunday, July 10-11, Double Tree Hotel Sacramento, 2001 Point West Way. Designed specifically for families, the event celebrates traditional

wildlife artworks with contests, displays of carvings, fine art, antique decoys, sculpture and interactive kids activities.

Whether you're an avid outdoor enthusiast, woodworker, birdwatcher, hunter, or fisherman, the weekend festival is an opportunity to marvel at the intricacies involved with the art of capturing wildlife in carvings, sculpture and paintings. The second longest running festival in the nation, the event benefits the Pacific Flyway Decoy Association's public education programs that emphasize the beauty of our native bird population and the original American art form of decoy carving, right here in the Pacific Flyway.

Kids will find plenty to do with a Blackbellied Plover (Shorebird) progressive painting station that will let

them learn about the bird and actually paint a carving in several steps. They will marvel at their accomplishment! A migration activity will also take kids on a journey, much like migrating waterfowl, in search of specific birds on the exhibition floor. When the task is successfully completed, everyone receives a migration certificate same as those used by The Federal Migratory Research Program (that shows where a bird was banded, migrated and collected).

Judged competitions will take place on the floor of the exhibition rooms throughout the weekend for all to enjoy, along with endless displays of wildfowl carvings, decoys, songbirds and antique decoys. Many of the West Coast's top experts in carving, painting, airbrushing, texturing and tool

operating will provide "how to" demonstrations in these techniques—eager to share their craft with the growing population of wildlife enthusiasts. Exhibitors will also be on hand to sell carving supplies, sculptures, books, wildlife artwork, prints, photography and original watercolors—showcasing the many art forms that capture wildlife beauty.

The Pacific Flyway Decoy Association is a 501 C 3 non-profit public charity association, dedicated to the preservation of wildfowl art through education. The organization was selected as a "Legacy Project" in 1999 by U.S. Congressman Mike Thompson, and the organization's remarkable history is now archived in the Library of Congress. Since 1982, the festival has been held at

Sacramento's Double Tree Hotel, right in the heart of the Pacific Flyway.

In the Old Testament prayer book, Psalms, there are over 4 dozen examples of someone crying out to God asking for a problem to be exterminated. In Psalm 143:12 the psalmist requests; "silence my enemies; destroy all my foes". Surprisingly, that petition is just a small part of his prayer.

Deliverance from the enemy or problem is not enough! The psalmist goes on to ask God for something even more important to significance and meaning in life. The psalmist shows that we humans need more than a God who solves our

So when you are facing a problem that is causing you much dissatisfaction by all means pray and ask God to do something about it, but don't stop there. Go ahead and ask for what God already knows you truly need. Ask for God's Love, Guidance, and Instruction.

# Regional Transit Budget Crisis to Affect Service to Disabled and Elderly

Sacramento - Citing a fiscal emergency the Sacramento Regional Transit District (RT) has announced it intends to significantly reduce its contribution to Paratransit, Inc. for the provision of transportation services for the disabled and elderly. The result will lead to changes in service boundaries, eligibility requirements and certain fares.

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), RT is obligated to provide transportation services for certain certified ADA individuals and has contracted with Paratransit to provide this service.

"Recognizing the reality of the budget situation, we at Paratransit had to make some really tough decisions," said Linda Deavans, Chief Executive Officer at Paratransit. "Our goal is to provide as much service as we possibly can under the circumstances."

Beginning July 1, 2010, Paratransit announces the following changes to its service:

**Service Boundary:** Under the ADA, trips that begin and end within a 3/4-mile radius of an active RT route or light rail station must be provided for certified ADA individuals. Earlier this year, RT eliminated

20% of its fixed route service resulting in fewer eligible trips. RT also reduced hours closing most service by 9 p.m. The reductions in service by RT mean that they are no longer obligated to provide ADA service via Paratransit where the routes have been eliminated or times reduced. Paratransit will, however, try to provide as much non-ADA service as possible despite the cuts but advises passengers to expect service denials due to insufficient capacity.

Paratransit will be forced to eliminate nearly all service to Elk Grove.

**Eligibility:** To be eligible, a rider must be registered as an ADA certified individual. Beginning July 1, 2010, RT will begin identifying and recertifying passengers registered solely on the basis of age. Passengers are encouraged to register with RT as soon as possible to ensure they are eligible for transportation services.

**Fare Structure:** Paratransit will continue providing most trips that do not meet ADA criteria but ADA monthly passes will no longer be accepted for these trips. Instead, the fare will be \$5 one-way, except airport one-way fares will be

\$50.

**Hours of Operation:** Paratransit plans no changes in its hours of operation. However, trips requested when RT is not operating are not considered ADA-qualified meaning there may be denials for service. Riders are encouraged to be as flexible as possible in negotiating ride times to help minimize non-ADA ride denials.

Founded in 1978, Paratransit, Inc. is a private nonprofit corporation dedicated to providing transportation services to individuals with disabilities, the elderly and related agencies throughout the Sacramento County area. Today, the organization operates 150 vehicles, works with 40 different human services agencies and provides more than 800,000 trips annually for the disabled and elderly in the Sacramento area.

# Leaving Granny Behind

President Obama's Fiscal Commission—a group of lawmakers, former officials, and other experts charged with developing a bipartisan plan to stabilize our soaring national debt—is primarily holding closed-door hearings. The commission's co-chairman Alan Simpson, a former Republican senator from Wyoming, recently became an instant YouTube star with his rant against seniors as he exited one of the panel's sessions. That put Social Security defenders on high alert about what's going on in these meetings.

Simpson, who is nearly 80, has maintained that the founders of the program never expected anyone to actually live to 65 and collect. "People just died," he has said. "Social Security was never [for] retirement."

The program has always been

an easy target for deficit hawks and budget cutters because it's so big—the government's largest expenditure, just ahead of the Pentagon. But setting up a target isn't as easy as actually hitting it. George W. Bush found that out when he proposed privatizing the system so we could all invest in the likes of Enron, Lehman Brothers, General Motors, and Goldman Sachs. Thanks to a massive campaign by progressive interest groups, that proposal was shot down. But like Freddy Krueger in Nightmare on Elm Street, the nightmare of cutting Social Security never dies—it just returns in a new form every few years.

Tea partiers, egged on by Sarah Palin, were fond of claiming during the health-care debate last summer that government "death panels" were going to off our grannies, even though it was an outright lie. Now that we have a much more serious and credible threat to the well-being of our elderly poor population (the majority of whom are female) in possible cuts to Social Security, Palin and company are strangely silent.

Not so the progressive groups that want to preserve the program. Ashley Carson, Executive Director of the Older Women's League (<http://www.owl-national.org>) and member of the Social Security Works coalition, points out that those same grannies the tea party has apparently forgotten about are the ones who will suffer the most if

the program is cut.

Heidi Hartmann, president of the Institute for Women's Policy Research in Washington, agrees. "Raising the retirement age and other ways of cutting benefits would all have a devastating effect on older women, many of whom live alone and depend mainly or entirely on Social Security," she says.

The numbers bear this out. Women depend on Social Security more than men, and without it, close to 60 percent of elderly women would live in poverty. One reason is that women are far less likely than men to have a company-provided pension, and when they do get one it's most often based on a lifetime of lower earnings. So much for Simpson's "greedy geezers." Even younger women would suffer if the program is cut, since they are the majority of caretakers when a spouse dies and leaves young children, who draw Social Security until they're 18.

Simpson may have embarrassed some of less flamboyant members of the Fiscal Commission with his outburst, but it remains to be seen whether in their hearts they believe he's right. And whether granny is really in the crosshairs this time.

# Niello Honors Colonel Davidson

Sacramento Region - Assemblyman Roger Niello (R-Fair Oaks) has recognized World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam War Veteran Col. Ross Davidson during a Legislative Veterans' Recognition event held June 23rd at the Sacramento Convention Center.

Members of the Legislature were invited to nominate a veteran and Col. Davidson was selected by Assemblyman Niello to represent the 5th Assembly District.

Col. Ross Davidson served as a pilot in the Air Force throughout three wars: World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam

War. He survived 34 missions in World War II alone and was awarded 51 medals throughout his military career; including two Distinguished Flying Crosses, one of the highest honors in the Air Force.

During the 1950s, along with Col. Bernt Balchen, he landed a C-47 onto Taku Glacier in Alaska in order to deliver supplies to a group of stranded scientist. They achieved two historic landing and takeoffs on the glacier. Col. Bernt and he were nicknamed the "Lewis and Clark" of the Arctic due to their efforts.

After the Vietnam War, Col. Davidson settled down in

Carmichael with his family and became a businessman. Today Ross is still a businessman and community activist. He has donated one of his dress uniforms to the veteran's Memorial Museum in Branson, Missouri.

"It is important that we recognize veterans and it is extraordinary to see individuals who have dedicated their lives to service in times of war and peace. We need to occasionally stop and reflect on their service and sacrifice for our country. I was honored to be with all the veterans at the ceremony and proud to recognize Colonel Davidson," said Assemblyman Niello.

# Financial Overhaul Misses the Mark

the beneficiaries of an ongoing federal bail-out. The federal government has already injected over \$145 billion of taxpayers money into these two companies and the Congressional Budget Office estimates that the ultimate cost could continue to rise as high as \$380 billion. The absence of any effort to address this mounting catastrophe is nothing short of a national disgrace.

"To add insult to injury, the financial regulation bill continues the approach to our nation's largest financial institutions which led to the financial crisis. Giving the federal government the power to determine which financial institutions present "systemic risks" will further distort the financial system towards the "big banks." Institutions whose failure would be considered to be a threat to the economy will be deemed to have an implicit federal guarantee while their smaller competitors will not.

"In this regard, the outcome of this legislation may not be so bright for smaller community banks. As Sarah Wallace, chair of the board of directors of First Federal Savings and "Loan Association described the bill: "Creditworthy borrowers will be denied loans as small banks devote more and more energy to regulatory compliance."

"One of my major concerns with the legislation is that it will

create regulatory bottlenecks which will impede lending at a time when our economy is fragile and unemployment in the 3rd Congressional District is in double digits. Mark Zandi has advised both Republican and Democratic policymakers He predicts the bill will reduce credit to business and households by \$80 billion a year.

"Does this sound all too familiar? Unfortunately, the reliance on the political system rather than the discipline of the market place may ultimately distort economic outcomes. Failing financial institutions should face expedited bankruptcy proceedings rather than the bill's resolution authority designed by politicians and run by a newly created federal bureaucracy.

"This Conference Report on financial regulation is simply the wrong medicine and a missed opportunity to provide for meaningful financial reform. It fails to address the major causes of the financial collapse and I fear that it takes us down a road that we have traveled before." *Congressman Dan Lungren serves as Ranking Member on the House Administration Committee in addition to serving on the Judiciary and Homeland Security Committees.*

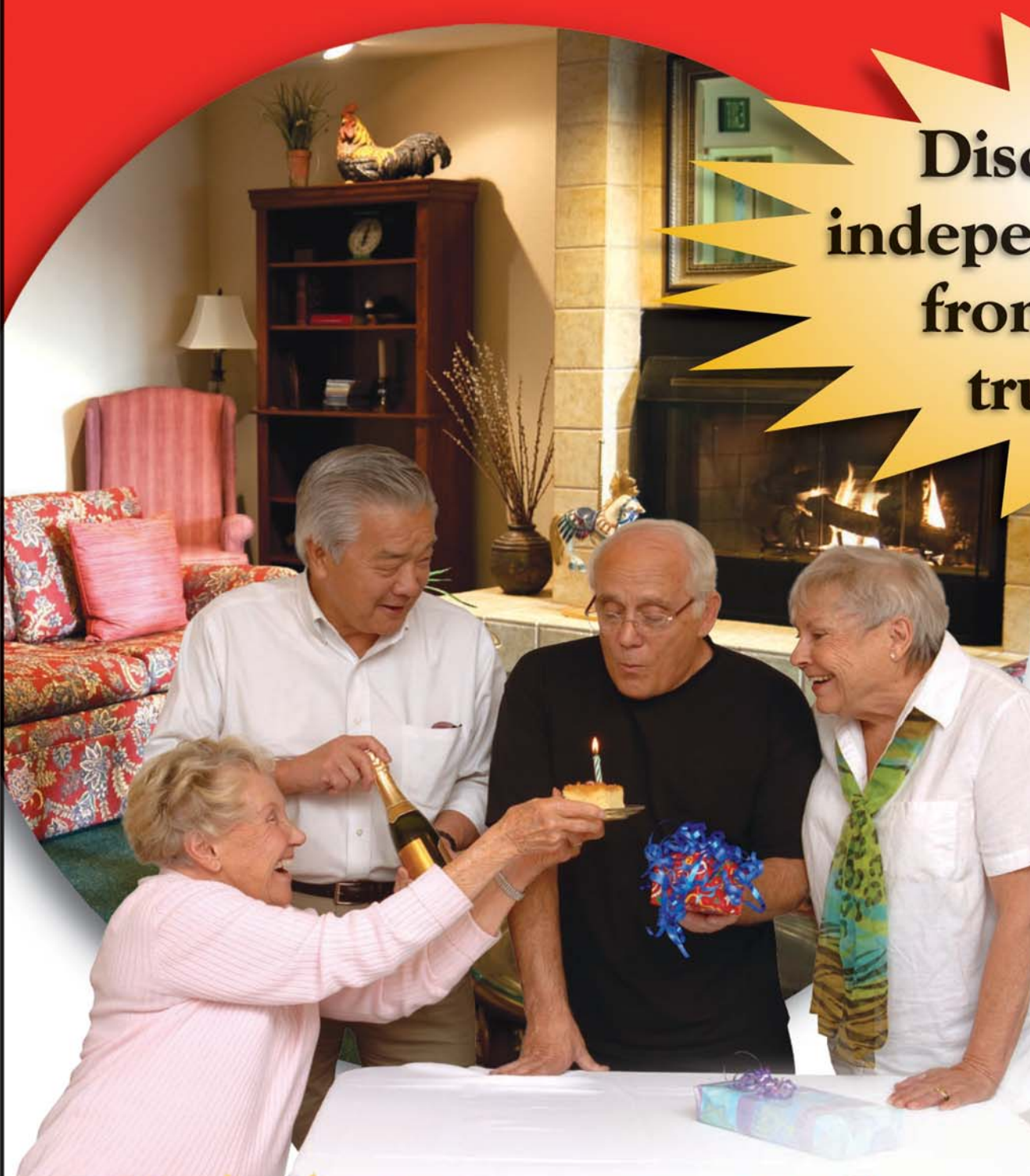

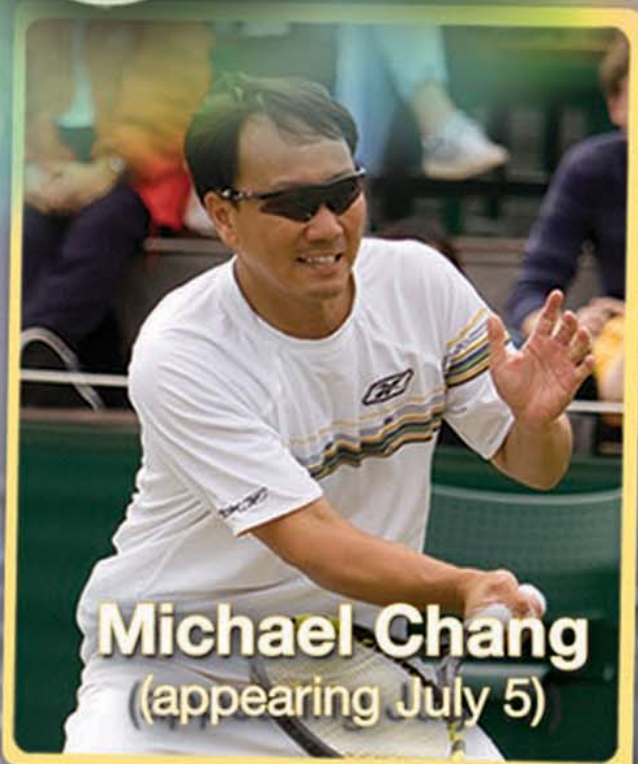
