Red Cross Accepts LargestRT Sees Many Major ServiceDonation for Haiti ReliefReductions & Additional Layoffs

Sacramento Region - Sacramento Sierra Chapter of the American Red Cross accepted their largest check for the Haiti Relief and Development Fund on Tuesday, March 9 from Raley's President & CEO, Michael Teel. From January 16 through February 13, all 134 Raley's, Bel Air, Nob Hill Foods and Food Source stores featured donation boxes for Haitian earthquake relief at their check stands, which brought in more than \$149,000.

"We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of so many Raley's customers and employees," said Teel. "It's a true testament to our community's giving spirit – we knew many people wanted to aid relief efforts in Haiti, and by converting our Food For Families collection boxes

The check was presented at the Raley's Supermarket located at 4900 Elk Grove Boulevard in Elk Grove. Sacramento Region - To address an estimated \$13 million budget deficit for Fiscal Year 2010 and a cumulative \$25 million budget shortfall for Fiscal Year 2011, the Sacramento Regional Transit District(RT) held a public hearing to discuss proposed service changes for implementation on June 20, 2010. The public hearing was held on Monday, March 8, in the RT Auditorium.

RT ridership and fare revenue have been adversely affected by the downturn in the economy, state furloughs and high unemployment. Fare revenue is now projected to be approximately \$7.9 million below budget and sales tax based revenues dedicated to transit continue to decline.

State sales tax revenue, which experienced a decline this past summer of 8.8 percent, was further reduced by 10 percent in mid-February, for a total reduction of 18.8 percent or

2009 and September 2009, a hiring freeze, freezing employee pay, employee furloughs, and 60 layoffs scheduled for April 2010 the RT Board must now consider



Nine service reduction scenarios were presented as potential options. RT staff also sought input from the RT Board and the public regarding all routes and services. The proposed service changes are scheduled for adoption by the RT Board on Monday, March 22, 2010, and if approved, would be implemented on Sunday, June 20, 2010.

Motorcyclist Crashes and Dies after Fleeing from Deputy

Carmichael - On February 24, 2010, at approximately 11:00 p.m., a 28 year old male from North Highlands was riding a blue 1993 Honda CBR 900 motorcycle on southbound Walnut Avenue at Marconi Avenue. A Sacramento County Sheriff Deputy in a marked patrol unit was pulling out of a parking lot at Marconi Avenue and Walnut Avenue and heard the motorcycle approaching. The motorcyclist looked at the Deputy and began to accelerate rapidly onto eastbound Marconi Avenue. The Deputy turned eastbound onto Marconi Avenue and activated his front red emergency lights for an enforcement stop. The motorcyclist failed to yield and a

pursuit entailed. The motorcycle speeds varied from 50-100 mph. As the motorcyclist approached the intersection of Fair Oaks Boulevard, he failed to slow or stop for the red traffic signal. Meselech Adamu, a 40 year old from Carmichael, was driving a grey 2007 Chrysler 300 at approximately 40 mph on northbound Fair Oaks Boulevard approaching the intersection of Marconi Avenue on a green traffic signal. As the Chrysler entered into the intersection, the motorcyclist observed the vehicle approaching and he laid his motorcycle down onto its side. The motorcycle slid into the left rear passenger door of the Chrysler. The impact caused the motorcycle to erupt

into flames and the pursuing Deputy pulled the motorcyclist from the burning wreckage. The motorcyclist was transported to Mercy San Juan Medical Hospital where he succumbed to his injuries at 0119 hours. Adamu was transported to Mercy San Juan Medical Hospital with complaint of pain to her neck and back.

It was later determined that the motorcycle was a reported stolen vehicle out of the North Sacramento CHP Area and the motorcyclist was driving on a suspended driver license. The motorcyclists name is not releasable pending notification of next of kin. This collision is still under investigation.

A Day at the DMV The Man Who Wanted to Say Something

Thursday, February 11, was chill and amber-gray. Leaning against a wiry tree in the Carmichael DMV parking lot flipping through paperwork. I looked up at a stocky, muscular, middle-aged man in a plaid shirt, Wranglers and work boots. In high school he was the guy on the offensive line you didn't want squinting at you.

He curved to a beaten bronze pickup, the bed piled with power tools and covered with a dingy canvas tarp. It was this cavalryman's horse, his HummVee, his BFV; not beautiful but proven and dependable. Reading a sheaf of papers, he stopped, stared, and slapped them with the back of his hand, annoyed. Pulling the door open he slipped in and sat half-turned, one leg on the pavement, reading. Lifting his head, he blinked at the rain spotted window, and slowly slipped out, still reading, heading to the concrete box that DMV buildings come in. He stopped on the roadway, facing the mob leaning towards the entrance. His mouth moved, but nothing came out. He stiffened, standing straight. "Listen to me a minute! You got nothing else to do anyway," he croaked. "I need to tell you something!" People strained to not see him. Pausing,

he cleared his throat. "Folks, I need to say something to you!" The mob waiting, drinking coffee from the 7-11, smoking, talking, eating donuts, working crossword puzzles, and reading, shifted, preoccupied. "This ain't America anymore!" He waited for it to sink in. "And this ain't California anymore!" He aimed a thick palm at a bundled, bell-shaped lady and spoke directly. "Ma'am, you know what I mean. I know you do. These kids need to learn it!" Perplexed, she nodded. The mob turned, curious. A couple of tattooed teens, smoking, fixed on him.

"You two young guys don't know what they're doing to you, what they've done to all of us. You're young!" Pointing at the concrete building, "You'll go in there and get a number, hoping you won't wait more than an hour, or an hour-anda-half, to talk to someone. You'll pay thirty bucks or a thousand bucks for something that used to cost a few bucks and ought to still cost a few bucks. How many of us are here? Fifty? Seventy? Maybe another hundred inside? It'll average out to \$200 or \$300 each - and this is just the first hour!"

He had my attention. Watching his back, I checked the rear of his truck for the typical antitax, anti-government bumper

stickers. There were none. He took in a deep breath and exhaled words. It was the low, heavy song of a bull. Opening his arms he lowed evenly, "Life wasn't always like this! Sure things were tough, they're always tough! That's life. But the people that ran things then weren't making it harder for us, not like now. The government was on our side, once!" The manbull waved an arm at his pickup. "They want \$350 for my truck! My truck! Look, it ain't new!" Taking a step forward, tapping his chest, "I work on it myself. I need it to make a living, and I don't have the money to pay 'em!" Everybody was facing him. "I'm California born and raised. I went to the schools when they were good. I joined the army. I got married, and got a job when there were jobs to get.

Pointing at the building, "It ain't the people workin' in there's fault, it's everything that put them there and tells 'em what to do and how much to charge and makes us stand in line to get it. It's the banks that took our money and wasted it, and drained the money out of our homes. And it's the government that gave the banks the money. It's spent now, but they want to keep spending it, so they're printing more." His confidence was up. "Listen



DMV Unveils New iPhone Application

iPhone users will now have DMV information and services at their fingertips with a new DMV iPhone application called "DMV Now." The California Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) created an application that will allow iPhone owners the ability to find a local office with the actual wait time and provide turn by turn directions based on the GPS location of the iPhone, take sample written driving tests, access a large library of DMV driver education videos and access other important DMV alerts.

The entire process of building the DMVNow iPhone application took only ninety days from inception to approval from the Apple Corporation and the DMV is the first state agency to build an application in-house keeping costs to a minimum. DMVNow iPhone application is free to iPhone customers and is available at the Apple applications store. As of July 2009, there were roughly 6.4 million iPhone users in the United States.

DMV Director, George Valverde said "Since millions of people own iphones and other Apple wireless devices we thought this would be a great way to make DMV that much more convenient and accessible to customers. More people are depending on their hand held mobile devices for information and we hope to build more DMV mobile applications in the future for other wireless device companies."

Don't Stand In Line, Go Online! Doing business with the DMV has never been easier. The DMV offers an array of services to customers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week through its Web site (www. dmv.ca.gov), including online appointments for written and drive tests; vehicle registration and driver license renewals, selection of personalized license plates, changes of address and payment of fees via secure debit transactions.

Sacramento Gas Prices Increase Again

Sacramento - Average retail gasoline prices in Sacramento have risen 13.4 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.05/g today. This compares with the national average that has increased 4.8 cents per gallon in the last week to \$2.74/g, according to gasoline price website SactoGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Sacramento during the past week, prices today are 86.3 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 20.1 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 9.8 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 80.9 cents per gallon higher than this day a year ago.

Assemblymember Huber: "No More Cuts to Education"

Sacramento -- On March 4th, the Day of Action for education, Assemblymember Alyson Huber stood in solidarity with the parents, teachers and students rallying across the state to call for no additional cuts to education.

"Enough is enough. We must hold the line on any more cuts to education. Our students have sacrificed enough," said Assemblymember Huber. "The fight against cuts will not be easy in these difficult times but if we stand

Lungren Fights for Bipartisan Protection for Health Care Consumers

Rep. Dan Lungren (R-CA) offered a bipartisan amendment to HR 4626 - Health Insurance Industry Antitrust Enforcement Act - that sparked heated debate on the House Floor. Using bipartisan language from former Judiciary Chairman Jack Brooks (D-TX), Lungren's amendment was passed out of the Judiciary Committee with unanimous support. However, Rep. Lungren's amendment was stripped from the legislation by the House Leadership and the Rules Committee refused to allow the Lungren amendment to be debated on the House Floor. Lungren released the following statement: "I do not believe that the insurance industry should be exempt from our nation's antitrust laws. I worked with my colleagues on our Judiciary


Sacramento -- Washington DC- Committee to produce a bi-partisan bill which included my amendment to allow small businesses to share historical loss data. The amendment was adopted unanimously by the Judiciary Committee and was included in section 262 of the health care legislation which passed the House of Representatives. My amendment reflected the language from legislation introduced by former Chairman of the House Judiciary Committee Jack Brooks in the 101st, 102nd, and 103rd Congresses. "Most businesses look to data on past transactions in order to enable them to price their products. And here is the rub—it is the small companies which depend on the availability of this information the most. Smaller businesses simply do not have a sufficiently large volume

of information to price their products efficiently. It is for this reason that it is of the utmost importance that these business owners have the ability to share historical data. In this regard, a Congressional Research Service Report by Janice Rubin and Baird Webel raises the possibility that were such data not available to small insurance companies we might see the ironic outcome of further consolidation in the insurance industry. The American Bar Association has supported the collection of historical data as embodied in the Lungren Amendment. Lungren supported H.R. 4626 on final passage.

Supervisor Susan Peters Urges Census Count Participation

Sacramento Region - County Supervisor Susan Peters will be filling out her census form this month when it arrives in the mail at her home and she is urging all residents to do the same. "The good news is the 2010 Census questionnaire is one of the shortest in history -- just 10 questions in all," says Peters. "The total effort should only take about 10 minutes to complete but the results could have a big impact on Sacramento County".

An accurate count of the local population helps to ensure California and Sacramento County receive a fair share of federal funding. This funding includes resources for services like education and roads. Every 10 years since 1790,

the U.S. Census has conducted a nationwide count of every resident in the United States which is required by the U.S. Constitution.

The 2010 Census questionnaires are expected to be delivered during March 15 through 17. Residents should complete and mail back their forms before April 15.

"When you receive yours, just answer the 10 short questions and mail the form back," Peters explains. "A postage-paid envelope will be provided so you don't have to bear the expense of having to add a stamp."

Federal officials report that 72 percent of occupied households mailed back their forms during the 2000 Census and every effort is being made to increase participation for the new decade's count April 1 will be Census Day and the U.S. Census Bureau will send reminder a postcard and a replacement questionnaire to all households that have not yet replied.

"If you don't mail the form back, you may receive a visit from a census taker" says Peters noting the U.S. Census Bureau plans to send out census takers to go doorto-door and fill-in questionnaires for households that did not respond.

"To avoid being contacted by a census taker, I'm filling out the short form when it arrives and within 10 minutes the effort should be over," says Peters adding "and I'll know by doing that I have done my part to be counted."

the aid of the crazy burglar to recover the missing card. This puts them up against the merciless, memorabilia-obsessed baseball Mexican gangster Poh Boy (Guillermo Diaz) and his bunch of stereotypical trigger-happy henchmen. But before they can reclaim the treasured Pafko card, the partners strike a deal to boost a vintage Mercedes, and along the way they rescue a Mexican beauty (Ana De La Reguera) who doesn't speak a word of English. There is a multitude of things that don't seem to matter all that much in the grand scheme of "Cop Out," chiefly a sensible plot and dialogue elevated to a higher level than locker room banter. To be sure, Bruce Willis and Tracy Morgan have some good moments of snappy wisecracks, primarily when they are bickering on incidents large and small. But too much of the manic Morgan becomes somewhat grating. His obsession with his wife's (Rashida Jones) alleged infidelity is also overworked. Meanwhile, Sean William Scott fares better as he plays off both Willis and Morgan, often needling the officers for their anxieties. Fans of Kevin Smith may be expecting an edgier buddy cop movie than "Cop Out" delivers. What we have is something more like "Rush Hour," as if Tracy Morgan had somehow tapped into the frenzied, excitable state of Chris Tucker, Jackie Chan's wacky partner. Aside from Morgan overplaying his part, "Cop Out" is agreeable enough for a good share of laughs, even if much of the humor tends to the most common denominator variety.

COP OUT (Rated R)

Film director Kevin Smith recently garnered some presumably unwanted publicity when he was bounced from a Southwest Airlines flight for being too fat for one seat. I have just two questions for a Hollywood mogul. First, why aren't you flying an airline that offers the larger, more comfortable first class seating? Second, why are you flying from Oakland, of all places? There's a school of thought that any publicity is good publicity. Maybe that will be put to the test with Smith's new film "Cop Out," which apparently is the first film that he is directing that he did not also write.

From a script written by brothers Robb and Mark Cullen, "Cop Out" is imagined by director Smith to be as much Abbott and Costello as the '80s buddy cop movie it most obviously emulates. Think "Lethal Weapon" when you see the saltand-pepper team of Bruce Willis and Tracy Morgan, the odd couple NYPD officers Jimmy Monroe and Paul Hodges respectively. Willis' Jimmy is nothing like Mel Gibson, for the wacky member of this duo is the motor-mouthed Paul, whose random thoughts and verbal grilling of suspects prove to be goofy. Willis plays his character with

the sort of taciturn reserve that he perfected in the "Die Hard" films.

Barely a few minutes into the story, Jimmy and Paul misplay a drug stakeout, resulting in a shootout that leaves an informant dead along with a trail of collateral damage. The two cops are promptly suspended for a month without pay, an untenable situation for Jimmy as his daughter (Michelle Trachtenberg) has planned an expensive wedding he must finance. But just because the partners are suspended doesn't mean they won't fall into a heap of trouble. As a matter of fact, they go about police work as if nothing would hold them back.

Not wanting to be embarrassed by his daughter's obnoxiously wealthy stepfather (Jason Lee), Jimmy is consumed by pride as well as disdain for the interloper in his family's life. Desperately needing cash, Jimmy decides he must sell his prized 1952 Andy Pafko baseball card, but unfortunately stoner thief Dave (Seann William Scott) pilfers the card at a memorabilia shop heist. Efforts to retrieve this valuable relic result in Jimmy and Paul being drawn back into the very investigation that got them benched in the first place.

Already in trouble, and brushing up against the uptight officers that replaced them (Adam Brody and Kevin Pollak), the partners break all the rules by enlisting



Dear Sam,

I love the idea of paying cash for a house, but I'm even more impressed that you've got \$50,000 you could put toward a house and a job making \$30,000 a year at age 18. Man, you're really kicking it! It's a great time to buy a house. Interest rates are low, and prices are great. But the thing that keeps sticking in my mind is that you're still just 18 years old. Now, there's nothing wrong with being 18, but there's also nothing wrong with waiting a few years and getting a little more life experience under your belt before you saddle up with a mortgage.

At times like this, I think about what I'd tell my own 18-yearold son. And honestly, I think I'd advise him to wait and let life happen for a while. I'm not putting you down because you're 18. You've done some amazing things. But I think the best thing would be to keep piling up cash, then take a look and see how you feel and what your life is like in two or three years.

You've got lots of time and a huge head start already. Plus, there will still be plenty of properties out there. Then, when the time is right, either pay cash or do a 15-year, fixed-rate mortgage. And if you take out a mortgage, make sure the monthly payments are no more than 25 percent of your take-home pay! Great job, Sam!






