

Efforts to Help Seniors Afford Prescription Medications Applauded



Sacramento, (Business Wire) --Congressional leaders and leading pharmaceutical companies have come up with a plan to reduce medication costs for millions of senior citizens enrolled in the Medicare Part D Prescription Drug program. In combination with other discount programs and rebates, the savings to the U.S. government could represent \$80 billion. and Manufacturers of America (PhRMA) is leading the charge to specifically close the coverage gap for patients whose medications costs fall into the "doughnut hole."

Seniors prescription medication costs fall into the "doughnut

their prescriptions. Affordability and adherence to medication become serious issues that can compromise their care when this occurs. "This announcement could not have come at a better time," states Lynn Rolston, Chief Executive Officer of the California Pharmacists Association. "In order to maintain patients' health and keep health care costs down, it The Pharmaceutical Research is critical for patients to adhere to their medication therapies."

"Under the proposed plan, pharmaceutical companies will provide a 50 percent discount to most beneficiaries on brand-name medicines covered by a patient's Part D plan when purchased hole" (above \$2,700 but lower in the coverage gap," states than \$6,153.75 per year) and then PhRMA President and CEO Billy they must pay out of pocket for Tauzin. "In addition, the entire

negotiated price of the Part D covered medicine purchased in the coverage gap would count toward the beneficiary's out-of-pocket costs, thus lowering their total outof-pocket spending. Importantly, the proposal would not require any additional paperwork on the part of the beneficiary nor would an asset test be used for eligibility."

As this program rolls out, CPhA will be monitoring the implementationplansandproviding assistance where appropriate to ensure that patients get the full intended value. It will be critical that pharmacists are treated fairly and given enough information to administer this program smoothly. For now, the news seems very positive and pharmacists stand ready to support this effort.

Field of Dreams

Carmichael - Jack and his beanstalk have nothing on Jack Pefley's Carmichael garden. At 85, he figured he'd seen about everything that historic Palm

Drive could offer. But as spring warmed the vineyard his pioneer grandfatherplantedthereintheearly 1900s, the unexpected happened.

Sunflower seedlings sprouted between vines that green-fingered Pefleys have cultivated for five generations. Bemused, Jack and son John Pefley went about the annual task of turning their vineyard soil. But Jack's wife, Jeri, held the tractor at bay and transplanted a few volunteers

homestead garden. her She need not have bothered. In days, tens of thousands more emerged from tilled vineyard soil. Within two months, the family beheld a golden forest, high as an elephant's eye. "It happened for the first time a few years ago," marvelled Jack. No one ever intentionally grew sunflowers here. I guess birds dropped seeds over the years; these must have lain dormant in the soil until; 2005. Then the heavy rain that fell that spring suddenly activated them. Up they came by the thousand. I've never seen so many volunteers." While neighbors' gardens wilted in

three-digit temperatures last month, Jack's stalks just got taller and taller.

"Everyone who comes down the street sure enjoys looking at them," grinned Jack. "We haven't watered them, not a drop. They just keep growing. When it comes time for the grape harvest, I wonder if we'll be able to find any of my vines..."

Navy veteran Jack approves of volunteerism and was not tempted weed out the encroaching saffron hordes. "My wife picked a bouquet," he said. "They looked nice in a vase but I prefer flowers with a better fragrance. Next spring, perhaps two acres roses might volunteer..."





Closing a Local Sidewalk Gap

This summer construction is planned to fill a sidewalk gap in Carmichael along Fair Oaks Boulevard east of Miles Lane. Such gaps are common in many of our older suburban neighborhoods

in the unincorporated area that were developed when standards did not require that type of infrastructure.

The Department Transportation has a sidewalk continuity program to address these pedestrian challenges that identifies and prioritizes these gap locations with the goal to construct sidewalk facilities when funding is available to reduce the number over time. For this project, developer fees and Measure A sales tax funds are being used.



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

Dave Says

Another Perspective

Dear Dave,

I'm a big fan of your work, but I have to ask one question. Why do you advocate belief in God and study of the Bible in religion for dealing with financial hardship, even for those who don't believe in religion? - Daniel

Dear Daniel,

First, I don't believe that religion is the answer. I do, however, advocate God. Ibelieve with all my heart that there is a God. I also believe that He's in control, and that He's crazy about us and wants good things for us. That's my value system. It's how I approach every equation, whether it's financial or not.

I'm not mad at people who don't feel this way. When someone who's in debt or behind on their mortgage asks advice, I don't tell them the answer is to go read their Bible. I give them financial advice. If they speak in Christian terminology, I answer in Christian terminology because I'm a believer. I know how to speak the language and can connect with them. But you'll never hear me beat someone up just because they're not a person of faith. At the same time, I'll never back away from the idea that God is real just because someone else isn't a believer!

Personal finance is 80 percent behavior, and 20 percent head knowledge. I've said that for years. If people can grasp that one statement, I can teach them lots of great stuff. Yet it would be naïve to try and have a discussion about behavior modification without including relationships, emotions, psychology, and spirituality. That's not just my opinion. It's a logical, wellrounded view of the facts.

But when it comes right down to it, I advocate a belief as the answer to almost every question, because they will take you places you need to go!

Teaching Them How to Spend Dear Dave,

We follow your plan and give ourkidscommissionsforworking around the house. We also try to teach them about spending, saving and giving. Still, it bugs us when they blow their money on junk, or on things we don't approve of, and immediately start worrying about the next thing they can buy. Should this bother us, and what can we do? - Mike

Dear Mike,

Of course it should bother you. It bothers me just to hear about it!

It sounds like you're on the right track when it comes to handling money, but your kids are badly in need of adult leadership. There are some things that are just a bad idea because they're getting ripped off with low-quality stuff. But give them enough rope to hang themselves once in a while, too. That way, when they buy something cheap that breaks in a few days, you can say, "I told you so." Only don't use those exact words, although you'll be tempted. Just remind them of the principle involved.

Don't be afraid to draw the line and let them know that there are things you don't want in your house. If there are video games or music that you feel are inappropriate, then they don't get to buy that stuff – period! If they put trash, filth, and nastiness into their minds and spirits, they're going to become trashy, filthy and nasty. It's not anarchy; it's responsible parenting! You guys are the leaders of a benevolent dictatorship, and the kids should learn to appreciate that fact and be grateful when you're benevolent.

In choosing between alternative methods of play, it is obviously better for declarer to select the one that offers two chances to make the contract rather than just one.

Consider this deal where South is in four hearts and West leads the club queen, taken by dummy's ace. How should declarer continue?

One possibility is to play the ace and another spade, hoping to find East with the king. If he has it, declarer becomes an overwhelming favorite to

make the contract.

But if West has the king, he would take South's queen at trick three and shift to a trump. The defense would then presumably remove both of dummy's trumps, and declarer would ultimately go down one, losing two spades, a diamond and a trump.

Instead of subjecting himself to this possibility, declarer is better advised to lead the nine of spades from dummy at trick two rather than the ace. If East has the king, the contract is virtually assured, while if West has the king, an entirely different way of making the contract presents itself.

In the latter case, East-West must play two rounds of trumps to stop South from ruffing a spade in dummy. But the trouble with this defense is that it gives declarer an opportunity to establish an extra diamond trick in

Thus, in the actual case, after drawing a third round of trumps, South next plays the ace and another diamond. When West produces the nine, declarer plays dummy's ten and later makes the contract when the diamonds divide 3-3.

It is surely best for declarer to retain the spade ace in dummy at trick two rather than relinquish spade control by playing the ace first. This gives South two ways to make four hearts instead of just one, and that's the edge declarer should always try to give

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

Niello's Statement Regarding the Passage of the Budget



Assemblyman Roger Niello

Sacramento - Assemblyman Roger Niello (R-Fair Oaks) voted this afternoon (July 24th) during a marathon 20-hour session to support some elements of a 2009 Budget reduction package that will reduce our current level of spending, stop the issuance of IOU's, and alleviate our current \$26 billion budget crisis, while adopting additional government reforms that change the way we operate state government. "There were many positives to be found in this budget reduction package. We significantly reduced the size of government, eliminated some waste and abuse in our welfare system, and protected local law enforcement funding, all while avoiding a suspension of Proposition 98 funding to education," said Assemblyman Niello.

"In addition, the budget package contains no new taxes, makes \$15 billion in budget cuts, eliminates several outdated boards and commissions, preserves park funding, and sells off some state assets to generate needed revenues."

"While there were some elements of the package that I could not support, a budget agreement is always a work of compromise and I commend Assembly Republican Leader Sam Blakeslee for his difficult work in negotiating this package."

"Unfortunately, the other major concern with this package is that if the state's economy continues to decline as predicted, it is likely that this will be a temporary fix and we will be right back here this fall with another budget shortfall to deal with," said Assemblyman Niello.



THE UGLY TRUTH (Rated R)

Not every romantic comedy involving the battles of the sexes must necessarily fall into the obligatory category of "chick flick." In any event, some have attached that label to "The Ugly Truth," perhaps for no other reason than this frequently raunchy film has been curiously authored by three women. My guess is that these women were probably crafting a vehicle for Gerard Butler, best known for running around half-clothed in the role of Leonidas, the Spartan King, in "300." However, Butler doesn't so much as drop a towel here, leaving that sort of disrobing to his rival.

Comedy is not always pretty, particularly when outrageous chauvinism bumps up against the sensitivity of a work environment where minimum standards of decency must be upheld. "The Ugly Truth" takes gleeful joy in pushing some of the buttons of political correctness, and that approach alone is almost certain to generate visceral distaste from certain quarters that are practically obsessed with avoiding anything crass and crude. It's important to realize from the start that this comedy will take delight in outrageously racy situations while dropping the F-bomb like a bunch of Italian mobsters trading insults.

There's little that's new or exceptionally revealing about

the comedic aspects of a heated battle between the sexes, but "The Ugly Truth" aims, though perhaps in the gutter, to deliver laughs at any cost. Katherine Heigl's Abby Richter is an ambitious, yet uptight, morning talk show producer on a Sacramento TV station. She's a control freak who mistakenly believes in her ability to solve any problem. Her show is suffering a ratings slump, a situation that is not improved by the fact that the morning anchors are a bickering married couple (Cheryl Hines and John Michael Higgins). For the sake of greater laughs, it would have been more fun if the squabbling newscasters had more screen time.

Abby's boss decides to spice up the morning show by hiring Mike Chadway (Gerard Butler), a "shock jock" cable personality whose primal approach to relationship advice is guaranteed to cause friction. Indeed, most of the tension is between Mike and his show producer, Abby, who is greatly offended by her on-air talent's Neanderthal style. As part of a segment on the morning show entitled "The Ugly Truth," Mike spills the beans on what makes men tick in the gleefully chauvinistic manner that rubs Abby in all the wrong ways. To make matters worse, Mike's rants become an instant ratings bonanza, sealing his network status.

Just when Abby despairs of finding Mr. Right, she meets her new neighbor Colin (Eric

Winter), a hunky surgeon who's suave, polite and ultimately boring. The good doctor is the opposite of Mike Chadway, an aficionado of female jello wrestling, and yet for some inexplicable reason, Abby decides she needs the loathsome TV personality's insight into the male psyche in order to impress Colin on a date. Like a modern day Cyrano, Mike coaches Abby through an earpiece at a baseball game, leading to predictable comic mishaps. The obliging Mike even helps her to dress seductively with a push-up bra in a low-cut cocktail dress. He also thoughtfully gives her remote-controlled vibrating panties that unexpectedly functional all-too-well during an important business dinner.

Now, it is time for a movie quiz, because if you have been even remotely conscious while sitting through a string of romantic comedies, you already know the ugly truth of these screen relationships. Does Abby end up with the handsome doctor, the man with impeccable manners and taste who could easily be Mr. Right, though he is as bland as white bread? Or does she get swept off her feet by the most unlikely suitor on the face of the planet, Mike the self-declared misogynist and defender of the primitive male? You might get a clue from the popular notion that opposites attract.

The truth about "The Ugly Truth" is that it offers plenty of laughs that have often been missing in the slew of femaleoriented romantic comedies released in recent months. Another truth that should not be overlooked is that there are many absurdly comic situations that bear absolutely no relationship to reality. For instance, the crass-talking Mike Chadway would most likely never last a week on network TV. Only Andy Rooney can get away with constant rambling rants.

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Recently Les Schwab teamed with the Rubber Manufacturers Association to check the tire air pressure on vehicles that came into some of our stores. Approximately 1,100 vehicles were inspected, and this is what we found:

- Only 5% of vehicles had four properly inflated tires.
- 58% of vehicles had at least one under inflated tire.
- 26% of vehicles had at least one tire under inflated by 8 psi.
- 34% of vehicles had at least one tire under inflated by 6 psi.
- 47% of vehicles had at least one tire under inflated by 4 psi.
- Tires may lose up to 1 psi per month.

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
