Ponzi scheme victims can find some relief through the Franchise Tax Board

Sacramento County - (Business Wire) The Franchise Tax Board today (March 27th) offered guidance on theft-loss deductions for California taxpayers who had losses from investment schemes. "Tax remedies are available for victims of Ponzi schemes," said State Controller and FTB Chair John Chiang.

State and Federal law allow taxpayers to deduct some uncompensated losses on their tax returns. A recent IRS ruling, Revenue Ruling 2009-9, clarifies the treatment of losses from investment

schemes, including the nature of such losses (theft losses), the amount of such losses to be allowed, and the year of deductibility. The IRS also plans to follow a new procedure, Revenue Procedure 2009-20, which provides an optional "safe-harbor" for determining the year in which the losses occurred and a simplified method of computing the amount of the loss. A "safe-harbor" allows taxpayers to avoid later IRS challenges.

California will follow this guidance, and FTB will accept the form provided

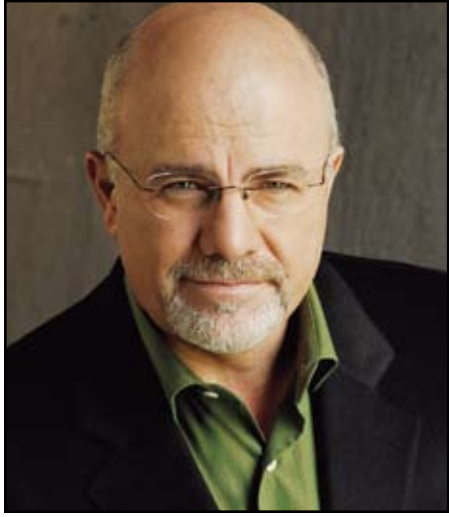
in Appendix A to Revenue Procedure 2009-20 for those taxpayers who choose to participate in the safe harbor provision for California purposes. However, a taxpayer that takes advantage of the safe harbor for federal purposes is not required to do so for California purposes.

State law differs from the Federal law in two key areas. In these areas, State law controls: 1) Statute of limitations for filing a claim for refund. 2) Deductibility of net operating loss (NOL) carryforwards or carrybacks. (NOL carryforwards are suspended for most taxpayers for 2008 and 2009. Carrybacks are allowable but only for NOLs attributable to 2011 or later.)

FTB will soon offer more detail on the differences in a FTB Taxpayer Notice. Interested taxpayers should check FTB's website at ftb.ca.gov for updates.

Dear Dave,

Could you please give us a list of the things people need to think about and deal with if they've been laid off?

Dear Anonymous,

What a great question! It's good to know you're thinking ahead. Hopefully, you won't have to face this problem, but if you do, here

area few ideas to help hold things together.

The first thing you do is take any severance pay, plus all the other money you have, and put it all in an emergency fund. You never know just how long money will be tight in a situation like this. Even if you go out immediately and find a part-time job to tide you over, you're still going to be facing a significant loss of income in the short term.

You know I love beating down debt, but at this point you need to stop paying extra on any debt you have. Yank the plug on retirement planning, too. You don't need to worry about these things when you're in the middle of a crisis! A bare-bones, detailed household budget is also a necessity. It's beans and rice time, so you've got no business seeing the inside of a restaurant or buying new stuff for a while. If you had vacation plans, put them on hold. Many times people don't want to experience the pain of a scaled-back lifestyle while they're feeling the pain of a job loss. Often they'll turn to credit cards in this situation, and that's a really dumb idea!

Be on the hunt for life insurance, if you previously had it only through your employer. Everyone needs a good, level-term life insurance policy outside of what's offered at the workplace. When it comes to medical insurance, consider using a health savings account (HSA). Look for one with a high deductible and low premium. If you have a 401(k), roll it directly into an IRA with a direct transfer rollover. Do not have them send you a check! Don't ever cash out an IRA in a situation like this, unless it's absolutely necessary

to avoid bankruptcy or foreclosure.

Finally, you've got to be willing to take any work that comes your way. This means even part-time jobs like delivering pizza or flipping burgers. There's no shame in honest work, and losing a job isn't the end of the world. It just might be the opportunity for a great new career change!

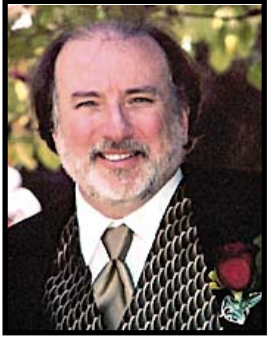
There's nothing wrong with having some cash stashed away at home. I'm all about being financially prepared. Just remember that the money you hide isn't growing or earning anything!

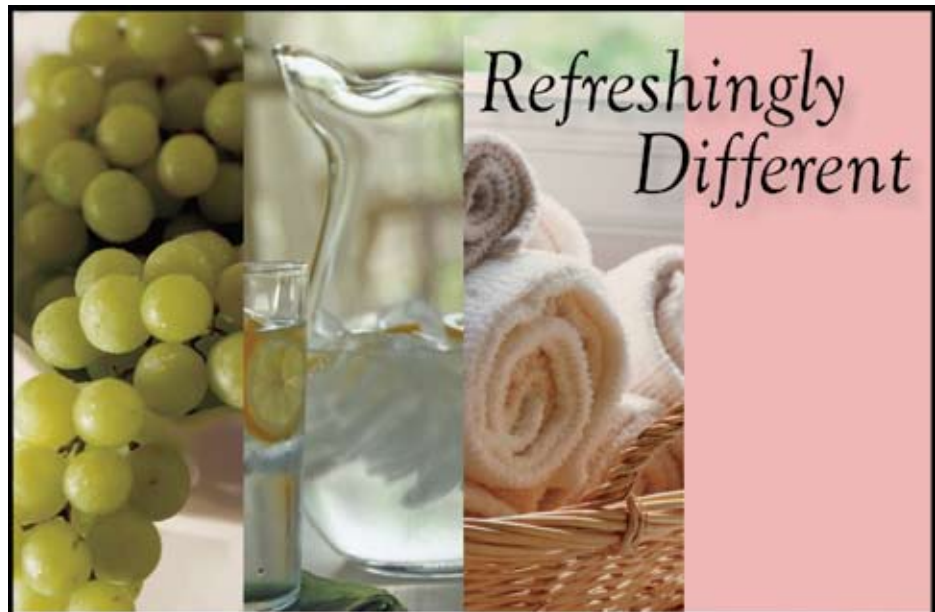

Job Demand & Hiring Trends for Local Companies Announced for the 2nd Quarter of 2009

Hiring Trends Flat

Fifty-nine percent (59%) of Sacramento's top employers are not planning to hire anyone for at least the next three months. In the telephone poll of 100 top regional companies in March, hiring demand remains stagnant in April, May and June. Pacific Staffing discovered sixteen percent (16%) of employers also report additional layoffs may be near if the economy doesn't gain strength soon. All but one of those companies anticipating cuts in the second quarter attribute the continuing weak economy as the primary reason.

Seasonal needs and attrition among the existing workforce will motivate hiring at thirty-three percent (33%) of Sacramento-regional companies in the next Quarter, and another fourteen percent (14%) indicate they are seeking to grow their workforce. Companies expecting to add to their workforce report they are seeking small numbers of specialized engineering, computer/technical and sales backgrounds for specific needs.

Workforce Challenge?

When asked what workplace or human resource challenge companies face in the next three months, eleven percent (11%) report new Federal law and changes

in COBRA healthcare rules of most concern. Another seven percent (7%) noted workplace morale, or employee motivation as second quarter challenges.

Downturn Defensive Strategies

When asked what measures their company had taken to cope with the economic recession so far, forty-eight percent (48%) of Sacramento companies surveyed say they have utilized layoffs, forty-three percent (43%) reductions in employee hours, nineteen percent (19%) have reduced wages and/ or eliminated management bonuses and seven percent (7%) report closing a company location to save money and reduce the workforce.

Sacramento regional companies polled report they are using hiring freezes, reduction by attrition, 3-day workweeks and voluntary days off without pay as strategic tools to cope with recession and protect their core workforce.

10 Reasons to Buy Local

By David Lillard

There are two hardware stores near my house. One is a big name-brand store that has everything I need at lower prices, open seven days a week. The other has inconvenient hours -- they close at noon on Saturdays -- and prices are a little higher. They don't have nearly the same selection either. So you'd think I'd shop at the super-convenient big box store on the new highway. Nope. I've decided it's in my economic self-interest to shop at the local mom and pop store.

Like many Americans, I face similar decisions several times each week, weighing the advantages of local vs. national chain stores. With the global economy in freefall, it's tempting to vote for the quick savings promised by a national chain, which can make you think you're doing the right thing for your family. But a closer look shows that the savings gained at Walmart or Sam's Club might cost more dearly, especially in these hard economic times.

Here are ten reasons to think local, buy local, and be local, as listed by the American Independent Business Alliance, a nonprofit group that promotes sustainable communities through strong local economies.

1. Buying local supports you and your family. When you buy from an independent locally owned business, significantly more of your buying dollar stays in the community and is used to make purchases from other local businesses, like local service providers and local advertisers (such as this newspaper!), which helps strengthen the economic base of your hometown. (Visit www.AMIBA.net to see case studies supporting this claim).

2. When you buy from local businesses, you're supporting local nonprofits. Studies show that small business owners give an average of 250 percent more dollars

in donations to local nonprofits than do large businesses. This should be especially important to any soccer mom with a son or daughter on a team or in Scouts, or someone who enjoys local theater and the arts.

3. Buying local keeps your community unique. Where we shop, where we eat and have fun -- all of it makes our community home. Our one-of-a-kind local businesses give a distinctive character to a place, and add to quality of life; they also bring in more tourist dollars. "When people go on vacation they generally seek out destinations that offer them the sense of being someplace, not just anyplace," says National Trust for Historic Preservation President Richard Moe.

4. Reduce your environmental impact. Locally owned businesses make more local purchases, which means less wasted fossil fuel for deliveries from afar. Also, when you shop in town or city centers, your purchases contribute less to sprawl, congestion, habitat loss, and pollution. You save money too, whenever you can walk instead of driving to buy.

5. Local business creates more good jobs. Small local businesses are the largest employer nationally, and the jobs they offer create stronger links to our communities. After all, where would you rather see a son or daughter work: at a local store where they might get valuable personal employer referrals, or at an impersonal national chain store checkout counter?

6. When you buy local, you invest in community. Local businesses are owned by your neighbors, people who live in your town, who are less likely to leave, and who -- like you -- are more invested in the community's future. Local businesses provide very important community allies in tough economic times.

7. You get better service locally. Local businesses often hire people with a better understanding of the products they sell, and take more time to get to know customers. If a product causes problems, the local business is more likely to respond to your concerns in a personal way.

8. Buying local puts your taxes to good use. Local businesses, particularly those in town centers, require little public infrastructure investment, as compared to nationally owned chains built at the edge of town with taxpayer money for improved roads, water and sewer service.

9. You can buy what you want, not what someone wants you to buy. A multitude of small businesses, each selecting products based not on a national sales plan but on the needs and requests of local customers, assures a buyer-friendly range of product choices.

10. Buying local encourages local prosperity. A growing body of economic research shows that in an increasingly homogenized world, entrepreneurs and skilled workers are more likely to invest and settle in communities that preserve their one-of-a-kind businesses and distinctive hometown character.

So, whenever possible, I buy local. Yeah, I may pay a little more for that new bathroom fixture at the local hardware, and deal with the occasional frustration of inconvenient hours. But I enjoy running into neighbors there. And nothing beats knowing the owner by name, and getting her tips on how to get a good seal on my pipe fittings. To me, it's worth it.
