

Sacramento - New data on the staggering number of California seniors who are unable to cover the cost of their most basic needs was recently released at the State Capitol. The UCLA Center for Health Policy Research and the Insight Center for Community Economic Development have used the Elder Economic Security Index (Elder Index) to quantify for the first time, how many seniors are struggling in each California county, as well as who is struggling most by age, race, gender, and housing type.

The Elder Index is a county-specific benchmark that shows how much it costs retired older adults to cover their

most basic needs (e.g. food, housing, health care and transportation), living independently. The data being released today was calculated using the most upto-date US Census Bureau ACS data available. In counties across California, the data demonstrates that elders living alone are having a tough time making ends meet. But some seniors living alone are struggling more than others. Noted in the report are: 1) Almost 3/4 of elder renters are trying to survive on incomes below the Elder Index. 2) Elders who own their own home outright are doing better, more than 1/3 of them are still unable to meet their basic needs. 3) In



the face of increasing costs and fixed incomes, more than half can't make ends meet in California.

The Elder Index for California reveals that the Federal Poverty Line (FPL) covers only a fraction of the basic cost of living experienced by adults age 65 and older - yet the FPL is used to determine income eligibility for most public programs, and state and federal resource allocations to local communities. In 2007, the FPL identified only 8% of older Californians as "poor," overlooking the other 39% with incomes under the Elder Index. That's nearly 1.5 million California seniors who can't afford to live on their own, but are not qualifying to receive help. Most of these elders have worked their entire lives, paid their taxes, and are now living on incomes comprised of Social Security, retirement accounts and pensions, but they are still not making ends meet.

"This new data finally provides us a window into the reality our seniors face on a daily basis," said Susan Smith, Director of the California Elder Economic Security Initiative at the Insight Center. "In most California counties, we're seeing that nearly half the retired population is struggling to make impossible decisions like whether they should buy enough groceries to eat three meals a day or purchase medications prescribed by their doctors. That's simply unacceptable in the world's richest country."

The California Elder Economic Security Initiative (Cal-EESI) is a statewide, research-driven initiative at the forefront of a national effort to raise awareness and promote policy change to ensure that older adults can live with dignity and economic well-being in their own homes. 

Luke has opened shows for country superstars Kenny Chesney, Brooks & Dunn, Sugarland and label-mate Dierks Bentley to name a few. "I don't consider one thing I've done since I've been in Nashville work," says Bryan.

"I still get shocked all the time when I meet random people and they say 'You're Luke Bryan.' That's still pretty neat," the singer says of his home state fan base.






Sacramento - United Way California Capital Region's board of directors has elected three new members and re-elected three others to new three-year terms. Newly elected to the board were Elk

File Your 2009 Business Property Statement On-line with E-SDR!

Over 25,000 2009 Business property Statements (Form 571-L) are being mailed by the Sacramento County Assessor's Office to business taxpayers during the first week of February. They are due back to the Assessor's Office by April 1, 2009. Business personal property includes all supplies, equipment, and any fixtures used in the operation of a business and is appraised annually at its current market value as of the January 1 property tax lien date.

The Business Property Statement Form 571-L can now be filed electronically! A program known as "E-SDR" (for "electronic Standard data record") was developed by a consortium of California Assessors to allow those who have a small number of business locations in California to file their annual Business Property Statement Form 571-L electronically over the Internet. Using E-SDR to e-file the 571-L rather than mailing back a hard copy increases efficiency for both taxpayers and the Assessor.

In the first year, E-SDR filers will save mailing costs, though it will take about the same amount of time to fill out the form. In subsequent years, E-SDR filers will only need to input changes to their list of business personal property, thereby saving both time and mailing costs. It has been estimated that using E-SDR takes only about half the preparation and filing time after the first year. In addition to the savings for business taxpayers, E-SDR helps the Assessor's Office process the e-filed BPS statements more efficiently than hardcopy statements, savings both time and money.

Business taxpayers who are interested in filing their Business Property Statement Form 571-L electronically using E-SDR should go to the web site www.calbpsfile.org and look for the red E-SDR button. In order to file using E-SDR, the filer must have the 18-digit personal property account number and the E-SDR "BIN" (Business Identification Number) number from the 2009 Business Property Statement Form 571-L they received from the Assessor's Office.

Business taxpayers who did not receive a 2009 Business Property Statement Form 571-L for a new location in Sacramento County should contact the Sacramento County Assessor's Office, Business Property Division at (916) 875-0730. **SDR**

There is a companion program known as "SDR" that was developed specifically for large-scale taxpayers who annually file business property statements for numerous locations throughout the state. Proposition 1A: Keeping Taxpayers in the Dark

All those who favor putting the breaks on Sacramento's ability to overspend, please raise your hands. I see that is most of you. Those against? I see a couple of public employee union bosses over corner in the are opposed. Well those Sacramento politicians who made a "deal" last month to resolve the budget process with a tax increase that will cost the typical California family over \$1,100, are offering another deal acal appeal of will they hope to the majority of you. What they are offering is Proposition 1A on the May 19 Special Election ballot. 1A is being promoted as a spending limit that will compel those under the Capitol dome to behave responsibly. If taxpayers are wary of any offer of reform coming from those who have behaved so irresponsibly that they have run up a \$42 billion deficit, their suspicions are justified. Masked behind a weak spending limit - the limit goes up with each and every tax increase - is a two year extension of the massive tax increase that was supposed to expire in two years, doubling the damage to California taxpayers. So anxious is Senate leader, and number one tax cheerleader, Darrell Steinberg to see that this measure passes, he selected a pro-tax colleague, Sen. Loni Hancock to draft the official ballot argument against a measure that extends taxes. What's wrong with this

picture? To select Hancock, Steinberg rejected an argument submitted by lawmakers, anti-tax Dutton Bob Senator and Assemblyman Chuck DeVore along with the president of the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association, Coupal (that's Jon me). Here is what makes this process

As a result of Steinberg's selection of Hancock as the author of the argument against, the word "taxes" will not appear anywhere in the official arguments for or against Proposition 1A.

So in the interest of full disclosure, and to confound those who would like to keep adult citizens in the dark, like mushrooms, and feed them fertilizer, here is the accurate ballot argument against Proposition 1A that was submitted by Senator Dutton, Assemblyman DeVore and me: WARNING TO VOTERS: THIS IS A TAX INCREASE! A two-thirds vote of the Legislature and the signature of the governor have made California the highest taxed state in the nation





Ground was broken this past week, Friday, February 27th at noon, for a new second gym on the Del Campo High School campus. The 8,500 square foot gymnasium will provide practice space for athletic teams and instructional space for physical education classes. The groundbreaking ceremony was attended by SJUSD Board Members Richard Launey, Lucinda Luttgen, Larry Masuoka, Greg Paulo, and Larry Miles, Del Campo High School students and staff, the Del Campo Booster Club Members and San Juan Unified School District Superintendent Dr. Pat Jaurequi. The entire cost of the \$4.3 million structure

will be paid for using voter approved Measure J Bond dollars. Passed in 2003, Measure J is a \$350 million bond measure dedicated to repairing and expanding San Juan Unified schools. Del Campo High School is located at 4925 Dewey Drive in Fair Oaks.

While many construction projects in the state have been put on hold due to the state budget crisis, San Juan has been able to move ahead with projects at school sites using local funding. Building funds are held separately from district general funds and can only be spent on construction

Build or buy kites made of wood or plastic. Only use cloth for the tail.
Only use cotton, linen or nylon string. Never use metallic thread, wire or wire reinforced string as they can cause a fire, serious injury or death if they come in contact with energized electrical equipment.

• Only fly kites in dry weather. When kite string gets wet it becomes a stronger conductor of electricity.

• Fly kites in wide, open areas, away from power lines.

• If a kite gets caught in electrical lines or falls into a substation, leave it there. Do not touch any part of the kite or string and keep everyone away.
