Sacramento Airport Sees Changes

Big Build Traffic Control Begins at Terminal B



Sacramento – Passengers departing from Sacramento International Airport’s Terminal B and drivers picking up passengers from Terminal B and the International Building may encounter delays as construction traffic controls go into affect. Site preparation for pile driving to support the overhead people mover columns begins this week.

Passengers are advised to allow extra time to reach the Terminal B ticket counters through April. All traffic will be affected so all Terminal B passengers should plan accordingly, including those who plan to park at the airport and take shuttles to the terminal.

“As The Big Build construction progresses, passengers may experience some slight interruption to the normally smooth customer experience at Sacramento International Airport,” says Hardy Acree, Director of Airports for the Sacramento County Airport System. “However, the resulting Central Terminal B will be well worth the wait.”

Northwest and Delta Airlines Complete Merger, Join Forces in Terminal A

Northwest Airlines relocated from its counterposition in Sacramento International Airport’s Terminal B to physically co-locate with Delta Airlines in Terminal A on Monday, March 16. All signage will reflect this change by Tuesday morning, March 17.

Northwest Airlines and Delta Airlines completed merger negotiations in October 2008 but have eased into fully integrated flight schedules that will carry ultimately only the Delta Airlines name.

Sacramento County Airport System is responsible for planning, developing, operating and maintaining the county’s four airports: Sacramento International Airport, Executive Airport, Mather Airport and Franklin Field. For more information on the system, visit www.sacairports.org.

Veteran GOP Senator proposes fix with a one-year extension

As the President and Congress deals the nation’s financial crisis, California gas stations are struggling to comply with the state’s mandate to update their pumps. State Senator Dave Cox (R-Fair Oaks) introduced Senate Bill 507 to provide relief to these small businesses and their customers. Cox’s proposal would extend the compliance deadline by one year – from April 1, 2009 to April 1, 2010.

“Small businesses like gas stations do not have the ability to finance up to \$80,000 to install new gas-dispensing nozzles in this recession,” said Sen. Cox. “By allowing gas stations a one-year extension, these small business owners will have time to find the necessary resources to comply and not close down.”

Senate Bill 507, if passed, would extend a California Air Resources Board (CARB) requirement that gas stations install new gas-dispensing nozzles to capture 98% of the vapor emissions instead of the current 95% by one year.

Specifically, SB 507 would allow gas stations to continue to operate with existing nozzles and avoid immediate closure.

Local gas stations have had a very difficult time in complying with CARB’s costly mandate that every gas station in the state be retrofitted with an Enhanced Vapor Recover Phase II system.

Without the passage of this measure, more than 6,000 gas stations could be shut down on April 1. This will result in higher prices and

unemployment. Should these gas stations close, the additional miles many residents must drive to find another station cancels out any benefit of the new vapor recovery regulation.

Urban and inner city communities will be especially hard hit as many of them will not be able to meet this arduous deadline.

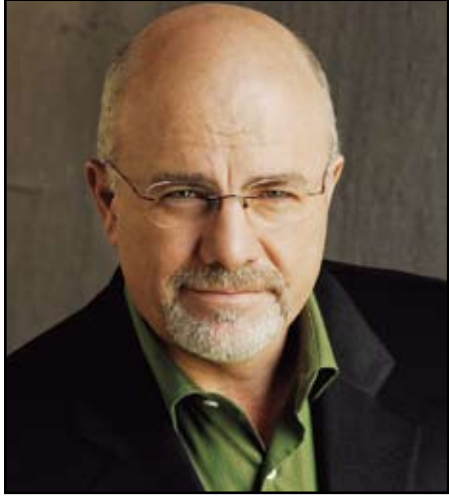
Tarek Wazne, owner of A & H Gas, Inc. in San Bernardino, who has over 100 employees, is feeling the pressure of the mandate and the economy.

When Do We Stop?

Dear Dave,

I'm 63-years old, and work part-time. My wife, at 59, works full-time, and earns \$140,000 a year. We're both self-employed. At what point do we stop buying term life insurance? I have a \$250,000 policy, and we have \$500,000 in savings. We're completely out of debt, except for a couple of car loans that total \$30,000.

Dear Herschel,

First, let's clean up those car loans. With your income, and the money you guys have in savings, there absolutely no reason to

have car payments hanging around your necks. Otherwise, you're in great shape!

When it comes to life insurance, ask yourself why you're buying it. Who are you trying to help, and how much will they need? It's really about taking care of the people you leave behind.

From where I'm sitting, you've already done a great job of taking care of your wife. If you passed away she'd have the insurance money plus an income of \$140,000 a year, a half-million already in the bank, and a paid-for house. She wouldn't exactly have to struggle. If she passed away first, you'd still have \$500,000 in savings, plus a house that's paid for, and your part-time income. Way to go! You two have done a good job. At this point you're very close to being self-insured!

On the other hand, if you want spend a little money on a term policy for her over the next few years, and you can do so and still continue to build your nest egg, that's okay. The savings you guys have accumulated would allow you to live on about \$40,000 a year. The proceeds from a term policy could supplement that, assuming you can easily afford it.

Dear Bob,

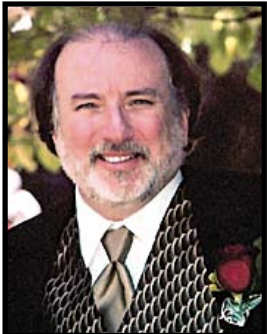
I wouldn't do that in a million years. Don't get me wrong, that's a very nice thing to do for someone. I'm sure it seems like a winning proposition for you both. But a spiritual issue has been left out of the equation. The borrower is always slave to the lender, and nowhere is that more true than in a family. You'd bring instant discomfort into your relationship. The money issue will hover over you like a shroud. Trust me, Thanksgiving dinner will taste kind of funny when you're sitting there with your lender instead of good old dad.

I understand that you have a solid track record with this kind of thing, but you're playing with fire. I simply would not do this! The downside is just too risky. If you come from a dysfunctional, screwed-up, control-freak kind of family, it's going to be right there in front of you constantly! Either way, it's not worth the risk.

to protect the civil rights of individuals while encouraging businesses to open their doors without the fear of expensive lawsuits.”

“The reforms that were approved in SB 1608 will go a long way toward helping these businesses become ADA compliant. But to help them understand what is specifically contained in SB 1608 and just how the new legislation will help, this website was essential. I appreciate the leadership that Assemblyman Smyth has provided on this issue and I was pleased to work together with him to provide this information online,” said Assemblyman Niello.

Assemblyman Smyth joint-authored SB 1608, which addressed conflicting access standards in state and federal codes, a lack of continuing education for architects and building inspectors, and inconsistent interpretations of California’s damages provisions, all of which made it nearly impossible to comply with access standards in California. Many of these provisions went into effect on January 1, 2009.

Assemblyman Smyth represents the 38th Assembly District in the California Legislature, which includes the communities of Santa Clarita, Los Angeles, Simi Valley and Glendale.

Assemblyman Niello represents the 5th Assembly District in the California Legislature, which includes the communities of Arden Arcade, Carmichael, Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks, Folsom, Granite Bay, Natomas, North Highlands, Orangevale, and Sacramento.

In an effort to get in front of the dry summer months and the inevitable potential for fire along the American River Parkway, the Sacramento County Regional Parks Department, local stakeholders and fire experts are hosting an American River Fire Prevention Summit.

The event, scheduled on March 28, from 8:30 to 12:30 at the Coloma Community Center, 4623 "T" Street, Sacramento, is free and open to the public.

"With the predicted drought year, it's more important than ever to look at long and short term plans to reduce the fire danger inherent in our Parkway," said Janet Baker, Director of County Regional Parks.

Last year, several fires were reported at locations along the Parkway, and although these were generally quickly contained,

extreme summer heat combined with drought conditions could make for a serious fire situation. At risk is not only precious habitat but surrounding homes as well.

Keynote speaker Carol Rice, President of the Wildland Management Inc., will discuss fire management projects throughout the state, and representatives from the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District and the Sacramento City Fire Department will be on hand to discuss fire prevention techniques and ongoing projects.

GRAPHIC WORLD OF "WATCHMEN" BLAZES WITH VIOLENCE

WATCHMEN (Rated R)

A "graphic novel" would appear to the uninitiated to be an extended comic book, albeit one that is exceedingly complicated and involves multi-layered storytelling. That's the impression a neophyte such as myself takes from the most cursory review of Alan Moore's legendary graphic novel "Watchmen," which won the prestigious Hugo Award and once appeared on Time magazine's list of the 100 best English-language novels.

As source material for a movie, "Watchmen" has been deemed by many to be "unfilmable." But that didn't stop powerful studios from legal battles over the right to make the film. Director Zack Snyder, who gained fame for his stylized work in the "300," attempts to do the same for "Watchmen," creating a complex world for costumed superheroes that have been outlawed and driven underground by a society that once revered them but then grew to fear and despise them.

Respecting the source material is undoubtedly a massive challenge, but apparently Snyder wanted to bring "Watchmen" to life by emphasizing

the time period of 1985 America. Others more familiar with the novel may have to judge his success on that score, but I surmise the director sincerely endeavored to capture the palpable anxiety and unease of the alternative universe in which President Nixon is serving his fifth term in office and the Doomsday Clock charting tension with the Soviet Union at the height of the Cold War is edging closer to midnight.

Ostensibly, "Watchmen" is a murder mystery, although a complex, elaborate adventure that reeks of conspiracy. In this alternate 1985 America, the once legendary crime fighters known as the Watchmen are now retired superheroes. Brutal violence rears its ugly head right at the start when one of the former colleagues is murdered. Eddie Blake (Jeffrey Dean Morgan), otherwise known as The Comedian, is tossed out of the window of his high-rise Manhattan apartment after an intense fight. The Comedian was once a masked superhero, but he didn't have any super powers.

Rorschach (Jackie Earle Haley), who defies a recently enacted law that forbids the wearing of masks, is an enigmatic character. His disguise is a mask with shifting inkblots. Oddly, he's a

sociopath with a sense of honor, which makes him not only one of the film's most fascinating characters, but a crusader for an uncompromising pursuit of justice. In flashbacks, we learn that The Comedian was also seriously disturbed, particularly when he brutally raped a member of the squad and shot to death a pregnant woman during the Vietnam War.

By the way, it bears repeating that the "Watchmen" is so full of violence that it is, despite its comic book origins, totally unsuitable for younger viewers. When Rorschach is briefly detained in prison, there's a chainsaw dismemberment of an inmate that recalls the most fearsome scene in "Scarface." But then, without the masked crusaders performing their heroic deeds, the alternate world is falling into chaos, evident when Dan (Patrick Wilson) and Laurie (Malin Akerman) are ambushed in an alley by a gang of thugs.

That Dan and Laurie are able to fend off their attackers is due to their secret identity as Nite Owl and Silk Spectre, respectively. Laurie's mother, Sally (Carla Gugino), was one of the original crew members. When in costume, Silk Spectre wears a latex outfit much sexier than Catwoman. Dan is kind of a nebbish who sheds his inhibitions only when in costume and piloting the Owl Ship.

There's another story going on about Laurie's former relationship with another superhero, Jon Osterman (Billy Crudup), a brilliant physicist who was exposed to radiation in a horrible lab accident. This mishap transformed Jon, who's seen throughout the movie as blue-skinned and naked, into a remarkable being with real super powers. Now he goes by the name of Dr. Manhattan, working for the government to devise a nuclear shield to prevent the impending Armageddon.

Another enterprising member of the group is Adrian Veidt (Matthew Goode), a megalomaniac who thinks of himself as the smartest man in the world. Previously known as Ozymandias, Veidt has a strange affinity for the pharaohs and gave up his masked crusader career in order to cash in on his exploits with a line of merchandise that included action figures. Now he dreams and acts upon world domination, setting up inevitable confrontation with former colleagues.

"Watchmen" is certainly an ambitious, visionary film that is often fascinating in parts, but the sum total doesn't add up too well. Though Zack Snyder deserves credit for his stylistic approach, the film may prove less than satisfying for those unfamiliar with the graphic novel.

She could be one of the people her fiancé's nephews are pointing at and calling a prostitute. Why did you ignore this huge elephant in the room? Is being pregnant and unmarried that common and acceptable? — Mary, Yuba City CA

Mariah, 17, Collinsville OK: Lori is engaged and in a committed relationship so I don't see an elephant in the room. It's a new generation and the world is changing. She is worried for her future child, how can we bash that?

Peter, 21, Monterey CA: It's easy to judge someone based on a snapshot (unmarried, 20, pregnant), but being born out-of-wedlock isn't a crime. What people should look at is that she cares about her child. If you want to judge someone, how about starting with the positive instead of the negative?

Laura, 22, Fair Oaks CA: I see nothing to criticize. The stigma against being pregnant and married is almost entirely religious. You equate pregnant 20-year-olds with prostitutes, however, vast numbers of people in this country disagree. Lori is more articulate than most parents who write us, and she has the maturity to worry about how to raise a well-adjusted child. What would bother me is if she got married simply because she got pregnant.

Lennon, 22, Fair Oaks CA: My mom was pregnant with me before she and my dad married. It doesn't mean my parents loved each other, or me, any less. I'm not scarred by it, I've never thought it

weird, and I've never thought my parents married because of me. People have sex outside marriage all the time. It's not "raunchy". Please move into the 21st century with the rest of us.

Rose, 21, Auburn CA: If Lori didn't want her baby, or was abusing drugs, that would bother me. But Lori is engaged to be married and is obviously very concerned for her child. This is America. Many people have decided they don't need government approval to love or live with somebody. My own parents were never married. I was never looked down upon for that. What really matters for a child is having two good, loving parents. Until middle school, these parents are the primary socializing agent for their child.

Dear Mary: I honestly appreciate your point, which was echoed in numerous letters. And yes, when the Republican Party touts Sarah Palin's daughter's out-of-wedlock pregnancy as "good family values", things are indeed changing. But this change wasn't born overnight. Two of five responding panelists were themselves born out-of-wedlock without stigma. With shameful exceptions, you have to reach back to grandparents to find women who were hidden, beaten, sent to unwed mothers' homes, or back-alley abortion clinics. I am thrilled a young mother wrote wanting to protect her child from what really is raunchy and what really has oozed overnight into every crevice of mainstream culture — and that is the pornography industry. Since the World Wide Web's invention 20 years ago, we now have Jenna Jameson, highest paid porn star ever, interviewed in Abercrombie & Fitch catalogues, Girls gone Wild videos, Paris Hilton's sex tapes and resultant 'fame', celebrity girl-girl romps, suburban strip clubs, mother-daughter pole dancing classes, breast implants, labia rejuvenation surgery, thong underwear, freak dancing, and 'sex' messaging. That's raunch culture, not Lori. That's where to take your attack.

If you do not file your Response on time, you may lose the case by default, and your wages, money and property may be taken without further warning from the court. There are other legal requirements. You may want to call an attorney right away. If you do not know an attorney, you may want to call an attorney referral service. If you cannot afford an attorney, you may be eligible for free legal services from a nonprofit legal services program. You can locate these nonprofit groups at the California Legal Services Web site (www.lawhelpcalifornia.org), the California Courts Online Self-Help Center (www.courtinfo.ca.gov/selfhelp), or by contacting your local court or county bar association.

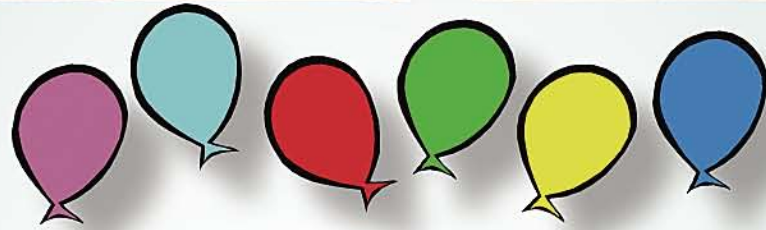
