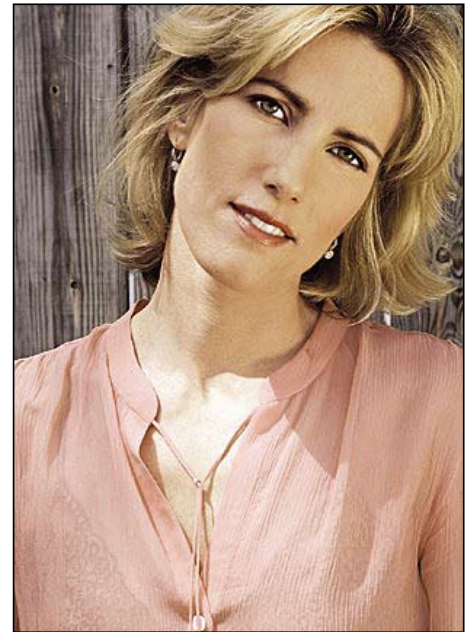

Governor Schwarzenegger presents the untraditional State of the State address

Governor Schwarzenegger delivered a very nontraditional, yet very appropriate State of the State Address. Instead of the usual evening fan fair and receptions that followed previous Addresses, this years was unceremoniously moved to 10 am and lasted approximately 12 minutes. However, Schwarzenegger did not waste any time getting to the point.

The Budget, or lack of one, dominated the stage. After thanking the First Lady and all staffers the Governor dug right in. "We are in our third special session and we have declared a fiscal emergency... The \$42 billion deficit is a rock upon our chest and we cannot breathe until we get it off." He continues, "In recent years, California's legislature has been engaged sometimes in civil war. Meanwhile, the needs of the people became secondary. At the end of the day most people do not require a great deal from their government. They expect just simply the

fundamentals. One of the reasonable expectations that the public has of government is that it will produce a sound and balanced budget...There is no course left for us but this; to work together, to sacrifice together and to think of the common good and not our individual good."

Schwarzenegger then offered an incentive to the audience, "As you know, for the last 20 years of budgeting only four budgets have been on time. So if you don't mind, let me just make a little suggestion. We should make a commitment that the legislators and the Governor too, lose per diem expenses and our paychecks for every day that the budget goes past the constitutional deadline which is June 15th. I mean, you have to admit this is a brilliant idea and look at the happy faces I see now. I love that. I mean, if you call a taxi and the taxi doesn't show up, you don't have to pay the driver. So if the people's work doesn't get done, I think the people's representatives shouldn't get paid either. That is common sense in the real world...I thought that this line would

get a great applause in this hall, but I understand why not."

Schwarzenegger concluded his speech with his recollection of this year's record number of wildfires. "2000 plus fires. What a huge challenge. But every one of those fires was put out. And you know why? Because we have the best trained and the most selfless and the toughest firefighters in the nation. Let's give them a big hand. Thirteen of whom lost their lives. They gave their lives for this state...Ladies and gentlemen, the courageous example of those firefighters should not be lost in us. In our own way we too must show courage in serving the public."

Reaction to this years Address were supportive from both sides of the aisle. Democratic Assemblyman Tony Mendoza was quoted, "It is obvious that the governor recognizes the immediate problems California is faced with." While Republican Senator Mark Wyland remarked, "I'm pleased that Governor Schwarzenegger is focused 100 percent on reforming and balancing California's budget."

Now that everyone knows what needs to be done, let's see if their actions speak louder than words.

to concentrate on protecting vital services demanded by our residents like public safety and I will work to ensure we remain focused on that task.”

Administering the oath of office to Peters was Assemblyman Roger Niello (R-Fair Oaks), who had served on the Board of Supervisors prior to his election to the legislature in 2004, the same year Peters was elected to her first term as supervisor. Most of Peters’ supervisory district is within the boundaries of the Fifth Assembly District represented by Niello. The two officials also share a mutual bond as having been both past chairs of the Sacramento Metro Chamber prior to their entries into effective office.

Peters was re-elected to a second term last June with 55 percent of the vote. Under state law, her new four-term commenced in January.

After being sworn in, Peters called upon her board colleagues and the county workforce to “embrace challenge and work toward a common goal that makes improving the quality of life for the residents of Sacramento County our first priority over entrenched bureaucratic procedures, protocols and red tape.”

Supervisor Susan Peters officially started her second term on the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors on January 13 and subsequently was elected by her colleagues to be chair for the 2009 year.

“Chairing the Board of Supervisors is both an honor and a responsibility,” said Peters. “This year will be a challenge due to the current economic situation and the impact on the budget. The Board will need

“While the rest of the country is focused on turning the page on eight years of failed Bush economics, it’s clear that Gov. Schwarzenegger is stuck in a time warp. California should take a page out of President-elect Obama’s playbook and stimulate the economy by creating, not eliminating, jobs. We also must take immediate steps to shore up our unemployment system and stem the tide of rising home foreclosures.

“These are the real policies of change – plans that will put Californians back to work and get our economy going again.”

Warrensburg, MO- Andrea Dixon of Carmichael earned a place on the fall 2008 semester Dean’s List at the University of Central Missouri.

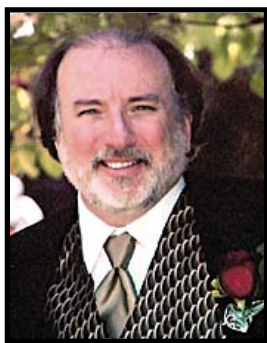
Dixon’s academic work earned a place on the 4.0 list.

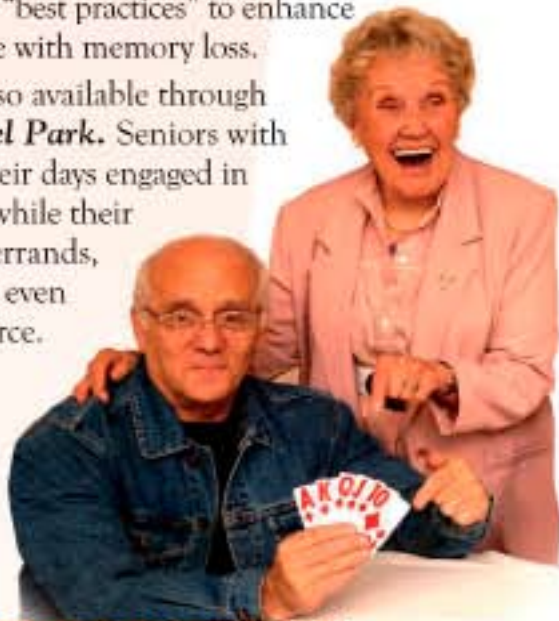

Carmichael Resident Selected for IRS Taxpayer Advocacy Panel

A Carmichael woman was recently selected by the Treasury Department to serve on the nationwide Taxpayer Advocacy Panel (TAP). Panel members listen to taxpayers, identify issues and make suggestions for improving IRS service and customer satisfaction.

A. Lee Battershell, a resident of Carmichael, California, is one of 100 volunteers serving on the panel. She will represent local taxpayers as well as work on national issues. Upon her selection, Battershell, a certified public accountant in Carmichael, said, "I applied to be a TAP member because I want to join with others in making a difference."

TAP members devote 300 to 500 hours yearly to the panel. Members work with IRS executives on priority topics and also serve as a conduit for grassroots issues between the

Female Dies In Suspected DUI Crash

On January 15, 2009 at approximately 8:55 p.m., a 28 year old woman was driving a salvaged black 1993 Acura Vigor on eastbound Whitney Boulevard just east of Becerra Way in the #2 lane. For unknown reasons, the driver steered to the left causing her vehicle to spin counter clockwise and cross the westbound traffic lanes. The passenger side of the Acura struck a power pole on the north side of the roadway. The impact caused the Acura to split in half, then continue forward where it struck

a cinder wall. The driver was not wearing her seatbelt and was partially ejected from the vehicle. The driver was pronounced dead at the scene (Sacramento County Coroner's Case # 09-00285).

Alcohol and/or drugs is suspected as a contributing factor to this collision. The driver was driving on a suspended drivers' license. The identity of the driver is not releasable at this time, pending notification of next of kin.

This collision is still under investigation.

Third Attempted Kidnapping Victim Comes Forward

After becoming aware of the attempted kidnappings of two 11-year-old boys on January 12, 2009, a 12-year-old boy told his parents he too had been the victim of an attempted kidnapping on January 13, 2009, by a man matching the general description of the suspect detectives believe is responsible for the kidnapping attempts the day before. Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Child Abuse detectives interviewed the 12-year-old victim who told them on January 13, 2009, at 4:25 p.m., he was walking near the area of Dawes Street and Folsom Boulevard when he was approached by a man in a car. The suspect told the boy he needed help finding his lost dog. The boy ran from the scene and was able to escape without harm.

The suspect in the third incident was described as a Hispanic male in his late 20's. He had short dark hair with a duck-tail in the back. He had a goatee and a mole or cold sore on his the right side of his lower lip. He had a small earring

in his right ear lobe and was wearing a short sleeve polo shirt with red and white stripes. The suspect was driving a shiny black four-door sedan.

On January 12, 2009, at 2:24 p.m., Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) officers responded the report of an attempted kidnapping of an 11-year-old male juvenile as he was walking on Mapola Way near Williamson Elementary School. At 2:42 p.m. RCPD officers responded a short distance away to the report of a second attempted kidnapping of a second 11-year-old male juvenile as he was walking near Cordova Lane Elementary School on Cordova Lane. Both victims described the suspect as a Hispanic male in his 30's. He had black hair, a mole on the left side of his face and he was unshaven with a goatee. He was wearing a black baseball hat and a black hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans. Both victims described the suspect's vehicle as a mid-sized 4-door sedan either black or dark-green in color.

In both January 12th cases, the suspect drove up to the victims and asked them to help him find his lost dog. In both

cases, the victims refused to engage the suspect in conversation and fled. The suspect attempted to grab the second victim through the window of the car before he fled. The first victim ran to Williamson Elementary School and notified the school staff. The second victim ran home and told his mother. The first victim reported the suspect did not threaten him with it, but he saw a small, black semi-automatic pistol in the suspect's vehicle.

The Sheriff's Certified Composite Sketch artist has met with each victim. The resulting composite sketches of the suspect are available on the Sacramento County Sheriff's website. Although there are noticeable differences between each sketch, detectives believe all three incidents were committed by the same suspect. Anyone with information regarding the identity of the suspect is urged to call the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department at (916) 874-5115, or Crime Alert at (916) 443-HELP. Callers can remain anonymous and may be eligible for a reward up to \$1,000.00.

Keep Your Pets Healthy and Happy During Cold and Rainy Weather

Sacramento County Reminds Pet Owners to Protect Their Pets This Winter

As temperatures continue to drop around the region, it is important for pet owners to take a few, simple precautions to ensure that their pets are prepared for the coming season.

"Pets can be seriously affected by extreme winter conditions. It is important to know what cold weather issues can affect your pets and what can be done to protect them," said Pat Claerbout, Sacramento County Animal Shelter Director.

Below are tips to help your pet weather the winter:

★ Bring your pet indoors when the weather dips below 30 degrees; 40 degrees for short-haired dogs, cats and puppies.

★ If your pet stays in the garage, make sure that there are no traces of anti-freeze in the garage. Most brands of anti-freeze are poisonous to animals.

★ If your dog spends most its time outdoors, make sure it has a house that is large enough to lay down in, a few inches off the ground to prevent water from

pooling, the floor is covered with wood or cedar shavings, and has a covered doorway that faces away from the wind.

★ Make sure that your animal's water bowl is fresh and has not frozen over or been knocked over by the weather.

★ Keep your pet well groomed. Matted fur does not protect your animal from the cold.

★ Slap the hood of your car when you start it in the morning. Cats may take refuge from the weather under your hood.

★ Make sure you adjust the amount of food your animal eats due to their activity levels. If a pet is indoors more often, they do not need as much food. If your pet is often outdoors, they may need more calories to generate necessary body heat.

If you spot animal abuse, including not protecting animals in extreme weather, please report it. The community program "Critter Tip" wants you to "blow the whistle" on animal abuse. The program is anonymous and you may be eligible for an award. Call the Animal Shelter to report abuse and/or neglect at 916-368-7387.

On January 15, 2009, 2009, members of the Sacramento County Violent Crimes Task Force (which is comprised of robbery detectives from the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and Special Agents of the FBI), with the assistance of the Sacramento Police Department and the Elk Grove Police Department, arrested two additional suspects they believe are tied to a series of armed robberies. The first suspect, 18-year old Reginald Hola, was arrested at a house in the 4000 block of Deerbrook Drive. The second suspect, a 17-year-old male juvenile, was arrested at the Sacramento Job Corps Center in the 3100 block of Meadowview Drive.

Investigators believe these suspects, together with the three suspects arrested for the robbery of a video game store on January 12, 2009, are responsible for at least six recent game store robberies since December 20, 2008; including four in Sacramento County, and one each in the cities of Sacramento, and Elk Grove. Detectives also believe the suspects are tied to at least two other area robberies as well.

The investigation is ongoing and detectives believe additional arrests are imminent. Anyone with information regarding any of these robberies is urged to call detectives at (916) 874-5051 or Crime Alert at (916) 443-HELP. Callers can remain anonymous and may be eligible for a reward of up to \$1,000.00.

This collision is still under investigation.

Rising Tide of Gas Prices Could Stall

California at \$2.01 a Gallon,
Up 21 Cents from Last Month

From AAA

After five consecutive months of California's average gas price dropping, the streak has come to an end. According to AAA Northern California, which tracks fuel costs as a service to consumers, California's average gas price has increased for the first time since last July. California's statewide average price for a gallon of regular unleaded gasoline is \$2.01, up 21 cents since last month's report on December 9. Only Alaska, Hawaii and California currently have state averages more than \$2. Northern California gas prices are averaging \$2.04, up 25 cents from last month. In the San Francisco Bay Area, motorists can expect to pay an average price of \$2.06, an increase of 15 cents. Some analysts fear that tensions in the Middle East, OPEC further restricting world oil supply, and a gas dispute between Russia and Ukraine could continue to drive up the price. However, AAA analysts believe prices may start to decline again in the near future. "Demand for gasoline

is at its lowest point of the year," said Matt Skryja, AAA Northern California spokesperson. "Right now, even with uncertainty in the supply chain internationally, it seems the tough economy and decreased demand may soon help reverse the recent upward trend in prices." The least expensive average price in Northern California can be found in Concord, where unleaded is \$1.97. Santa Rosa, Tracy, and Vallejo are close behind, each with an average price of \$1.98. Of all the metro areas in Northern California where gas prices are tracked by AAA, Stockton saw the biggest increase over the last month, as its average price jumped by 39 cents to \$2.04. Alaska has the highest average price for unleaded gas in the entire country at \$2.51; California has the highest average among the lower 48 states at \$2.01. Among the lower 48 states, the least expensive gasoline in the country is found in Casper, Wyoming, where the average price of gas is \$1.29. The highest average price in the nation is in Juneau, Alaska, where the price is \$2.72. Among the lower 48 states, the highest price is in Tahoe City,

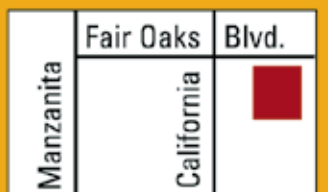

This planning document will be used to guide future improvements to Sacramento County's bicycle network. The Bikeway Master Plan update effort includes:

- An inventory of existing Class I bike trails, Class II bike lanes, and Class III bike routes.

- Identification of gaps in connectivity and alternatives to develop continuous bikeway routes.

- Evaluation of bikeway connections that provide better links into the regional bikeway system.

- Alternatives to improve safety for bicyclists.

- Development of a strategic implementation plan for unincorporated area bikeways including short-term, high-priority improvements and long-term bicycling needs and projects.

Riley Reviews

COMIC KEVIN JAMES MAKES "PAUL BLART" UNLIKELY ACTION HERO

PAUL BLART: MALL COP (Rated PG)

What happens when a comedian, Kevin James, best known for his nine-year run in "The King of Queens" TV series, plays a bumbling mall cop trying to emulate Bruce Willis in "Die Hard?" The result may not be the funniest movie of the year, but it doesn't need to be when you have a likeable central character with a great talent for physical humor. As the lumbering, unlikely action hero, Kevin James has an undeniable charismatic quality even at his most inept, shambling and awkward moments. "Paul Blart: Mall Cop," for reasons almost immediately clear, is the right vehicle for James' prodigious comic abilities.

In the titular role of Paul Blart, James

employs his considerable heft as a comic vehicle. A single, suburban dad trying to make ends meet as a security officer at a massive New Jersey mall, Blart aspires to become a state trooper. Ever so close to passing the exam, he continues to fail due his hypoglycemia kicking in at the most inopportune time. Still, he takes his job as mall cop very seriously, even when no one else does, including his lazy, apathetic new partner Veck Sims (Keir O'Donnell) and all his colleagues for that matter.

Blart is on the front lines of mall safety, going so far as to flag down an elderly disabled gentleman for exceeding the speed limit on his motorized scooter. He can apprehend such scofflaws with the advantage of patrolling the expansive mall on his Segway. Blart puts

to good use, at least for comedic effect, this personal transport vehicle that never caught on with the general public. The Segway is used so frequently that it should qualify for a supporting role in the credits.

Once married to an illegal immigrant who only wanted her green card, Blart lives at home with his young daughter Maya (Raini Rodriguez) and his mom (Shirley Knight), whose solution to most problems is the offering of another slice of pie. Blart observes that pie "just fills the cracks in the heart," as he merrily slathers a big piece with peanut butter. Though lonely and socially awkward, Blart nonetheless has his eyes on pretty Amy (Jayma Mays), who sells hair extensions at a mall kiosk. She seems amused by his attentions, even when he runs the Segway into the back of a minivan on display.

In an effort to mingle with his co-workers, Blart has too much to drink at an after-work party, turning unusually obnoxious and somewhat aggressive. Apparently, he has no capacity for alcohol, and as a result ends up with tattoos all over his back. Even more trouble ensues when he must confront a belligerent, loud-mouthed female shopper who just happens to be as fat as he is. One unfortunate remark leads to a full-on fight, where Blart gets beat up because he won't hit a girl.

Now that we know Blart has his foibles and weaknesses, we can only imagine what may go wrong on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving when shoppers invade the mall

en masse. The film shifts abruptly into an action picture when an extreme team of villains take over the mall in order to steal customers' credit card information. The criminals include skateboarders, BMX riders and free runners. I am not familiar with free runners, but these people display unusually agile, athletic abilities.

As part of their operation to seize control of the mall, these X-Games thugs take a few hostages, including Amy, the object of Blart's huge crush. For his part, Blart is at first oblivious to the takeover, since he's playing video games in a store. To foil the dastardly scheme and to save the girl, Blart goes completely Rambo inside the mall, adapting to his natural environment in clever ways to thwart and defeat the criminals. Not surprisingly, Blart becomes a reluctant hero, even impressing the obnoxious SWAT team leader (Bobby Cannavale) who has less than fond memories of Blart from high school.

Emanating from the Adam Sandler production factory, "Paul Blart: Mall Cop" is the kind of slapstick comedy one would expect, and it doesn't disappoint. But more than just laughs at the expense of Kevin James' girth, the movie veers off into full-blown action turf topped off with a heavy dose of sentimentality. What makes "Paul Blart" endearing for the audience is the undeniable likeability of its plus-sized hero. Kevin James just might succeed as the comic successor to the late, lovable John Candy.
