## The Carmichael Story excerpted from the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce website

"LOTS FOR SALE IN CARMICHAEL, CALIFORNIA - 10 ACRE TRACTS FOR \$1,500 WITH 10 PERCENT DOWN ON TERMS OF \$10 A MONTH AT 6 PERCENT INTEREST."

That advertisement appeared in the early 1900's. It continued: "In the shelter of rolling foothills secure from frosts, the Woods hereabouts are stocked with game birds, quail etc., and the streams are stocked with trout for rod and ducks for gun."

The man selling the lots was Dan Carmichael, the community's founder and its first developer. "Big Real Estate Deal" was the headline in the Oct. 1, 1909. The story was about Daniel Carmichael who purchased 2,000 acres of "land composed of hills and dales dotted with noble oaks." It was thought he paid between \$150,000 and \$200,000 for the land.

Carmichael later bought another 1,000 acres that he called Carmichael Colony No. 2. It bordered the first colony to the east and Walnut Avenue to the west; the southern boundary was Arden Way with Sutter Avenue to the north. Carmichael laid out the two colonies into 10 acre tracts and sold them for \$1500 each.


Daniel W. Carmichael born in 1867 in Atlanta, Georgia came to California in 1885. He was mayor of Sacramento from 1917-19. He also served as a director for the Sacramento Chamber of Commerce for 18 years and was president from 1910-13.

In 1892 Carmichael was married in Sacramento to Myrtle Robb, the daughter of Charles S. Robb, a well-known Railroad man. The Carmichael's never lived in the colonies he developed; their home was on 23rd Street in Sacramento. Apparently, Carmichael left the Sacramento area around 1923 and reportedly traveled to England but returned to live In San Francisco The exact place and date of his death is unknown.

The first known settlers in the area were the Maidu Indians dating back to 1,000 B.C. The first new settlers of Carmichael were Charles W. and Mary A. Deterding. In 1907 they purchased a 425 acre site along the north bank of the American River. The Deterding Ranch is now Ancil Hoffman Park.

By 1927, there were about 300 families living in Carmichael and the 1930 population was listed at 700. Nearly 2,000 people lived in the area by 1940. Prior to 1940, the community had no central business district. As Carmichael grew, businesses clustered around Palm Avenue and Marconi Avenue. Carmichael's first bank - The Suburban Bank - opened In the 1940's. Crocker Bank took over the service in the 1950's.

Carmichael residents had telephone service beginning in 1915 with a IO party line through Fair Oaks. There was a toll charged to call Sacramento. A direct line was installed in 1933 Today, Carmichael, has grown to a population of 72,000.



## McCain's Missing Middle

Barack Obama has been flailing in response to the McCain campaign's new aggressiveness, consumed by crying foul. He's gone from hopemonger to whinemonger.

Hypersensitive and defensive, Obama seems obsessed with campaign tactics. This not only plays into the notion that he isn't tough enough, it keeps him from engaging forcefully on substance, especially on domestic issues where he has an advantage.

For the way ahead for Obama, don't look to his tetchy stump performances, but to his paid advertising. Obama's TV ads have taken clear aim at one of John McCain's vulnerabilities -- the Republican offers less direct tax relief to the middle class.

Obama's spots say he'll put "the middle-class first," that he'll "cut taxes for working families," that he has "a plan that cuts taxes for middle-class families three times as much as John McCain would," and under McCain, "100 million Americans get no tax relief at all."

Even though their image is a shambles, Republicans are sending onto the field a presidential candidate who perhaps has the least to offer middle-class voters on taxes since the first George Bush in 1992. Of course, Bush lost that year to a Democrat promising only to raise taxes on "the rich" and to cut them for the middle class -- exactly Obama's position now.

In his primary campaign, McCain had to endorse the extension of the Bush tax cuts he voted against in the Senate. But they have turned into a trap. Because Obama also wants to extend the middle-class aspects of the Bush cuts, McCain is left alone plugging for extending the cuts on higher earners. The same McCain who "in good conscience" opposed the original Bush package because it was too skewed to upperincome groups now is supporting a package that, relative to Obama's plan, is even *more* skewed to the top.

Not to mention the Bush tax cuts have the obvious branding problem of the moniker

"the Bush" tax cuts. McCain might be worse off if they were called "the Hoover" tax cuts, but not by much.

Obama's middle-class tax cuts are a dog's breakfast of credits and giveaways. McCain's camp is right that the proposals are pandering, and that the Obama approach taken in its totality -- higher taxes on investment, health-care mandates, massive new spending, etc. -- will dampen growth.

But when it comes to the economy, it's a cost-of-living election, with health-care costs and energy prices eroding workers' wages. This is why McCain's new support for offshore drilling has had such resonance. On the tax front, he offers families a doubling of the dependent exemption from \$3,500 to \$7,000. That sounds like a lot, but people down the income scale don't pay enough in income taxes for the exemption to make much of a difference, and for everyone else, McCain fully phases it in only in 2016.

Unless McCain finds a way to get more relief to middle-class families, he has an enormous weakness. Policy doesn't win or lose elections alone, but it can interact powerfully with a candidate's narrative.

McCain can still adjust, and he'd better. Obama can't be counted on to complain all the way to November.







There will also be a FREE electronic waste truck to pickup your discarded electronics that you need to get rid of.







### New Grocery Store Freezer Cases Save a Lot of Power & Cold Cash

## Raley's uses new motion-sensing technology that reaps energy savings

One may not think that the lighting in grocery store freezer cases would use a lot of electricity, but SMUD, Raley's and others developed and tested a new idea that saves a whopping 68 percent in energy costs. Conventional fluorescent lighting in freezer cases is replaced with new, energy-efficient light-emitting diode (LED) technology, and motion sensors are installed to allow the lights to come on only when a shopper is near. The project also reduced the low-temperature refrigeration system energy consumption. Larger stores like Raley's could see savings of \$10,000 to \$12,000 per year per store.

SMUD now has a rebate program available to all commercial customers within its service territory to help convert to this new energy- and money-saving technology. SMUD provides a \$100 rebate per freezer case door for LED lights and a rebate of \$120 per freezer case door for LED lights with motion sensors.

SMUD and Raley's, worked with the California Lighting Technology Center, freezer manufacturer Hussmann Corporation and ADM Associates to develop and test the LED freezer case lighting system. LED lighting performs much better in colder conditions than traditional fluorescent lighting, which must draw more energy in colder situations to produce the same amount of light. The addition of motion sensors and dimming power supplies is designed to save energy by automatically dimming the lights when there's no activity near the freezer cases.

While LEDs produce considerably less light than fluorescents, LED lighting is more even and is used much more effectively and efficiently. Fluorescent light tends to be wasted. LED lighting contains no mercury and should last at least three to four times longer than fluorescents.

The environmental benefits are equivalent to more than 1,800 trees planted or nine cars removed from the road or more than 4,300 gallons of gasoline saved. The energy saved also benefits the local SMUD customer community, especially on hot summer afternoons when power is most expensive for a utility to buy.

baseman Donnie Murphy and first baseman Casey Rogowski. Elk Grove

Brett Prinz threw a perfect ninth inning to earn the save.

Sacramento will wrap up their '08 season with a one game, winner-take-all Triple-A Championship at Oklahoma City's AT&T Bricktown Ballpark on Tuesday, September 16 at 5 p.m. PST. The Cats will face the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Yankees, winners of the International League Championship Series. The Bricktown Showdown will be internationally televised on ESPN2 and broadcast live on K-Hits 92.1 FM with the voice of the River Cats, Johnny Doskow.





#### 1942 Ford Truck

I have sent you a picture of my 1942 pre-war Ford pickup truck. It had two windshields, no rear bumper, white trim and a raised emblem on the side. It was a deluxe model. So can you tell me the engine specs of my truck? -- Edward Anderson, Macedon, N.Y.

Edward, you truck's engine is probably a 221-inch V-8 Flathead. Original cylinder heads for 1938 to 1942 were generally marked with "81A" for Ford or Mercury car engines thru 1941 or, in your case, "81T" for truck engines from 1938 to 1942. Ford did not produce any vehicles following the 1942 model until 1946 to assist in the war effort.

As for original engine paint colors, the Ford and Mercury engines through 1940 were a dark green. Ford cars continued the color until 1942, while Mercury engines were dark blue in color from 1941 thru 1948. Postwar Ford engines were dark blue through 1948. Ford truck engines were generally the same as Ford cars during the years of this group. You have a great truck in your possession.

Greg, what about the Kaiser Manhattan? My mom had one, and it was beautiful. I'm retired and living in Florida and enjoy your old car columns. -- Carl L., New Port Richey

A: I loved the Kaiser automobiles, and once said that had it not been for the economic power of the Big Three (Ford, GM and Chrysler), Kaiser was probably the best of the rest that went out of business in car manufacturing.

about treading lightly, not disturbing wildlife, and staying on designated roads and trails.


