5th Grader Becomes Surgeon for a Day



Contest winner, in scrubs, operating the robotic system "Seymor"

Mercy San Juan Medical Center is giving one local elementary student the chance to step into a surgeon's shoes and experience what it is like to operate a \$1.6 million robotic surgical system. The hospital is awarding the honor to the winner of its "Name the Robot Contest" – Charles Peck Elementary fifthgrader Sarah Valadez.

More than 20,000 students at 45 San Juan Unified elementary schools were invited to come up with a name for Mercy San Juan's new da Vinci robotic surgical system – the first such system in the Sacramento area to offer surgeons 3D and high definition images and a greater range of motion through four robotic arms. Although there were many bright ideas, none of the suggested names captured the essence of the system better than Sarah's: Seymor. The robot gives surgeons a far better view of where they are working

than they could ever see with the naked eye; as Sarah states in her entry, "He can see more than a human."

In recognition of her winning entry, Mercy San Juan will donate \$1,000 to Sarah's school to use toward their greatest need. Additionally, Sarah will receive a \$100 gift card to Barnes & Noble Books. However the real honor will be for Sarah to meet "Seymor," put on surgical scrubs and sit down at the controls of the robot she named. With assistance from Mercy San Juan staff and physicians, Sarah will be able to manipulate the robot's arms, monitor the system's 3D high definition images and try her hand at a simulated surgical procedure. It's an opportunity not many fifth-graders will ever have the chance to experience. And for Sarah, her special visit to the hospital will be a bit like a homecoming – she was born at Mercy San Juan eleven years ago!

American Lung Association Combines Activities Under One Roof

The American Lung Association of California will commemorate the blending of its state government relations office, The Center for Tobacco Policy & Organizing, and the Sacramento Metro Office into one location at its Open House on June 11, 2008 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at 1029 J Street, Suite 450, Sacramento, Calif. The transition signals the organization's long-term commitment to establish, build and sustain lasting relationships within the Sacramento community that prevent lung disease and promote lung health.

State and local government officials, volunteers, staff and American Lung Association of California President and CEO Jim Wilgus will attend the event

"To maximize donor investments and association resources, while evolving for patient needs and program emphases, the American Lung Association has undergone a series of changes throughout its 104 year history," said Wilgus. "With this in mind, we centralized all of our Sacramento based activities into one new office to strengthen the American Lung Association of California's presence within the community and to improve overall efficiency and collaboration among our divisions."

Prior to the transition, the state government relations team, which works on statewide lung health, tobacco and air quality policy initiatives, and The Center for Tobacco Policy & Organizing, a grant funded program that works with local coalitions to protect communities from tobacco, resided in a different office than the association's local programs, services and activities.

"The American Lung Association of California is a valuable asset to the Sacramento community, as it leads the way in educating the public and advocating for policy changes that protect everyone's lungs," said Sacramento Mayor Heather Fargo, who issued a resolution for the association's Open House. "The lung association offers important resources, and hope to the thousands of people in the Sacramento region with asthma, lung cancer, emphysema or other lung diseases."

The Open House will follow the association's annual Lobby Day, which brings together American Lung Association of California staff and volunteers from around to state to meet with legislators and advocate on key state legislation.

The American Lung Association of California's Sacramento Metro Office provides local services to Alpine, Amador, Colusa, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, Sierra, and Yolo counties.

Various lung health programs, resources and activities available to the community through the local office include:

- · Better Breathers Clubs: Offering education and support to those struggling with chronic lung diseases
- · Freedom from Smoking classes and facilitator training: Considered the "gold standard" of groupsetting, peer-support smoking cessation programs.
- Open Airways for Schools asthma management program and facilitator training: Elementary-school education program that teaches children with asthma to understand and manage their condition so they can lead more normal lives.
 - · Action Network: Free online tool that provides

e-mail alerts and updates about key lung health policy initiatives.

- · Inspire Women & Lung Health Luncheon (November 13, 2008): Educating community, business and government leaders about the vital role they play in preventing lung cancer by funding early detection research, smoke-free living and healthy air initiatives.
- Respiratory Rally (November 14, 2008):
 Connecting lung disease patients with cuttingedge research and information to increase quality of life.
- · Healthy Air Walk (Spring 2009): Bringing together people who want to fight lung disease by cleaning up the air we breathe.
- · American Lung Association State of the Air Report: Annually ranking cities and counties most affected by short-term particle pollution, yearround particle pollution and ozone pollution.

Why Does Everyone Need to Spare The Air?

Common misconceptions about the Sacramento region's Spare The Air season

The 2008 Spare The Air season is well underway and the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District would like residents to understand the importance of improving air quality in the Sacramento region. Many residents comply with the AQMD's requests to "Spare The Air," but don't necessarily understand the reasoning behind the program. The AQMD would like to clarify some common misconceptions about the Spare The Air program so residents can better understand why it's important for everyone to do their part to help improve air quality.

Misconception #1: "Why does the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District ask us to Spare The Air in our homes and personal lives instead of regulating large vehicles, diesel trucks, etc.?"

The Sacramento Metropolitan AQMD works to reduce pollution through its heavy-duty vehicle incentive programs to reduce NOx (oxides of nitrogen) emissions from mobile sources. NOx is a primary ingredient in the formation of ground-level ozone when it is cooked in the hot summer sun. High ozone is the

reason our region has Spare The Air days, so it's critical to reduce NOx in order to reduce ozone. In 2007, the District funded almost \$21 million in incentive projects and reduced an estimated 360 tons of NOx from heavy-duty diesel trucks.

Unfortunately, local air districts cannot regulate mobile sources like diesel trucks, locomotives, construction or agricultural equipment. That authority rests with state and federal government. Incentive programs are key to improving air quality in our region, but so are you.

The District asks residents to do their part to improve local air quality because our region has a long way to go to meet federal standards. While regulating mobile sources will help improve air quality, the AQMD knows everyone can make a difference by making small behavior changes around the home, workplace and school, so our region's air quality continues to improve.

Misconception #2: "I don't care about sparing the air because a little bit of pollution won't hurt me. Why should I inconvenience myself?"

There is no such thing as "good pollution." Exposure to bad air at lower levels for extended periods of time can cause negative health impacts such as an aggravated respiratory system, increased asthma symptoms, coughing, watery eyes and sneezing. It's important to reduce your exposure on a Spare The Air day. You can

easily do your part by reducing your car trips and being selective about what kinds of products you use around your home. It's simple to Spare The Air and it will likely help protect your health, in both the short and long term.

Misconception #3: "Air pollution only matters to people who have respiratory issues, so they should be the ones concerned with air quality, not me."

Poor air quality affects everyone, and each person's behavior affects another person's ability to breathe clean air. Respiratory issues and other health effects can surface in an individual at any time, so it's wise to do your part to ensure you maintain your health. Be a good neighbor and show courtesy to other residents by implementing clean air habits. If you had asthma or a respiratory illness, you'd want your neighbors to do the same for you. The only way to improve air quality and Spare The Air is to work together!

Misconception #4: "Our air quality is getting worse."

Actually, the amount of ground-level ozone pollution in the Sacramento region has been on a steady decline for the past several years, but with more media attention given to the condition of our air quality, it can seem like things are getting worse. Plus, the Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) recently lowered the health standard for ozone

pollution because studies confirmed that lower levels of ozone pollution are more harmful to our health than previously thought.

Even though we've made improvements to the air we breathe, it's still critical that we continue to lower ozone pollution to protect public health.

The air doesn't clean itself. Achieving clean air and maintaining it requires everyone to make an effort. We are on track to eventually meet state and federal clean air standards, but we have to maintain those standards, too—which means we must keep up those clean air habits each and every day for the benefit of future generations.

Misconception #5: "People only have to change their behavior on Spare The Air days."

Not true! Any pollution going into the air has the potential to cause a Spare The Air day during the summer. While it's important to change your behavior on a Spare The Air day (for example, drive as little as possible on that day), the only way to prevent Spare The Air days is to be conscious of your behavior all season long.

Tomatoes Return to Stores and Menus as California Begins Harvest

Just in time for the start of tomato harvest in major California production areas, restaurants and grocery stores are announcing the return of tomatoes to store shelves and menus. The move comes in light of announcements from the U.S. Food and Drug Administration clearing most U.S. tomato producing areas because tomatoes from these areas are not associated with the recent salmonella outbreak (http://www.fda.gov/oc/ opacom/hottopics/tomatoes.html).

"We understand the caution exercised by some restaurants and stores who may have stopped carrying tomatoes in light of the outbreak," said Ed Beckman, president of California Tomato Farmers, a cooperative representing approximately 80 percent of the fresh tomatoes produced in California. "However, now that government agencies have clearly removed all concern about tomatoes produced in California and several other states, we see no reason for restaurants and stores not to resume carrying tomatoes. We are encouraged by those who are doing so."

Examples of chains who are returning tomatoes to their menus include: Jack in the Box, who was the first major chain to return tomatoes to the menu following the FDA clearance; and Subway, who is the largest user of fresh tomatoes in the United States. Beckman was also quick to point out major Canadian operations, like A&W and Tim Horton's, have also resumed serving tomatoes.

"We have fully returned to purchasing tomatoes for our customers in the U.S. and Canada and also have resumed offering our own Markon First Crop label tomatoes because of our confidence in the producers who supply these tomatoes," said Tim York, president of Markon, one of the nation's largest foodservice distributors.

The move by chains to return or continue featuring tomatoes comes just in time for the beginning of fresh tomato harvest in the major production regions of California's San Joaquin Valley. Members of California Tomato Farmers produce tomatoes from San Diego County in the south to Sacramento County in the north. Beckman stated that California is the second leading producer of fresh tomatoes behind Florida and that the value of the California tomato crop is approximately 400 million dollars.

The value of the tomato crop does not take into

account the contribution of the California tomato industry to the state's economy," he continued. disruption in harvest of tomatoes would significantly impact the California economy.'

To further encourage consumption and address the issue of consumer confusion, California Tomato Farmers is offering to its customers reproducible templates for in-store point of sale materials and signage so that retailers and restaurants can let consumers know the tomatoes they see on shelves and menus are from California.

The signs are very consumer friendly," said Beckman. "They simply state product origin so that consumers who have heard California tomatoes are now cleared can be assured of the safety of the tomatoes they eat."

"Members of California Tomato Farmers have a long-time commitment to ensuring the field-grown tomatoes we produce are always safe to eat and we have made food safety a top priority," explained Beckman, adding that California Tomato Farmers is owned by the family farms who produce tomatoes for the following companies: Ace Tomato Company, DiMare Company, Gargiulo, Harry Singh & Sons/Oceanside Produce, Live Oak Farms, Pacific/Triple E Produce, HS Packing and San Joaquin Tomato Growers.

Beckman pointed to a stringent food safety program which has been adopted by California Tomato Farmers requiring adherence to mandatory standards verified by government inspection. He explained that California Tomato Farmers food safety protocols, known as "The Fresh Standard," are based on guidelines developed in conjunction with FDA, food safety scientists, representatives of the produce buying trade and other U.S. tomato growing regions.

"As a condition of membership, California Tomato Farmers members are required to adhere to The Fresh Standard for food safety," he explained. "All operations are audited by California Department of Food and Agriculture inspectors under the authority of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to verify farming and packing practices are in compliance. Under the program, member companies are subject to multiple USDA audits of fields and packing sheds to verify the standards are being met. The audits are conducted on a random basis and include unannounced visits.

"To our knowledge, members of California Tomato Farmers are the only California tomato producers who are subjecting themselves to mandatory government audit," said Beckman.







EXPLOSIVE "HULK" MEANS BUSINESS FOR THE SUPERHERO GENRE

THE INCREDIBLE HULK (Rated PG-13)

Five years ago, director Ang Lee realized his vision of Marvel Comics superhero The Hulk, capturing Bruce Banner and his alter ego in an origin story, one that examined a portrait of a man at war with himself and the world in "Hulk." The green giant superhero is now imagined in French director Louis Leterrier's version in "The Incredible Hulk." Having directed the high-octane action of "The Transporter" films, Leterrier is understandably committed to the kind of action where his vision is tuned into a meaner and greener Hulk, the reluctant hero often forced to embrace the darker side of his personality.

Stepping into the shoes of scientist Bruce Banner and his green alter ego is Edward Norton, an interesting choice for a well-established actor who brings the right note of brooding to a conflicted character. "The Incredible Hulk" does not dwell inordinately on unresolved issues, but neither does it skirt Banner's moody outbursts in a desperate hunt for a cure to the gamma radiation that poisoned his cells and unleashes the unbridled force of rage within him. While Banner dwells in a Brazilian slum in an effort to control his anger, his fugitive status ensures that violence is sure to follow.

Working by day at a bottling factory, Banner takes anger management lessons to avoid the triggering of another Hulk episode. Meanwhile, the scientist communicates by computer with Professor Sterns (Tim Blake Nelson), a cellular biologist who quite possibly holds the key to Banner's quest for a cure. Banner's nemesis, General Ross (William Hurt), remains on high alert to capture The Hulk, and a factory mishap makes it possible for the rogue General to narrow the search to Brazil.

Soon enough, General Ross launches a military commando raid on Banner's slum neighborhood, having enlisted the mercenary Emil Blonsky (Tim Roth) as a ruthless fighting machine. Banner morphs into The Hulk, taking on not only the military but a bunch of malcontents at the factory. Needless to say, the bottling factory is pulverized by The Hulk's destructive rage, before he runs off into the jungle to escape his

Waking up nearly naked and alone in the backwoods of Guatemala, Banner makes his way back to the United States, with the eventual goal of hooking up with Professor Sterns. But first he seeks out his former

Ross (Liv Tyler), a brilliant biologist teaching at a university. Dropping in on the college town, Banner has a touching reunion with Betty, which leads to the conclusion that emotions other than rage can also trigger a

Inevitably, it doesn't take long for General Ross to descend on the campus as if a D-Day invasion is underway. This time, Blonsky has subjected himself to medical experimentation which gives him added strength, and after a confrontation with The Hulk, he imagines the next step to be a full-blown transformation into an indestructible creature capable of matching brute force with the green giant. While Ross' commandos fail to destroy The Hulk, the ravaged campus is nearly destroyed, but at least some students capture the action on cell phone cameras that provide footage for the nightly news.

Next stop for The Hulk is Professor Sterns' laboratory in Manhattan, where Banner may well find the cure for his agitated condition. Meanwhile, Blonsky has other ideas about the professor's research and wastes little time in getting some dosage of The Hulk's blood plasma. Appropriately enough, this infusion turns Blonsky into a giant creature called the Abomination, setting up the climactic confrontation on the streets of upper Manhattan. The resulting clash of the titans is a brutal smackdown in which taxis and police cars are hurled back and forth, while screaming citizens run through the streets to flee the battle scene. The big showdown between The Hulk and the Abomination has the feel of a "Godzilla" movie where giant monsters are on the loose. More than anything, this lends a cartoon-like quality to "The Incredible Hulk," which seems entirely fitting since this whole business is a product of Marvel Comics. A cameo appearance at the end of the film (which won't be revealed here) is certain to delight comic book fans with the promise of a future superhero reunion. One doesn't need to be a hardcore comic book fan to enjoy the incredible action scenes that drive "The Incredible Hulk."

Talking Cure

In their litany of American presidents who met with hostile dictators, supporters of Barack Obama cite John F. Kennedy and his meeting with Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev in Vienna in 1961. They leave out how it went.

The earnest, young American president wanted to forestall any possibility of misunderstanding and to win Khrushchev's commitment to the international status quo. The blustery, risk-taking Soviet premier wanted to bludgeon Kennedy into making concessions that would further the Soviet goal of global revolution. When Kennedy thought he was being accommodating, Khrushchev thought he was being weak. Vienna was the backdrop for Soviet assertion in the Cold War flash points to come.

Not all talking is created equal. Which is why it's folly for a presidential candidate to make a blanket promise to negotiate personally with adversaries.

Consider President Reagan, another president invoked by Obama supporters. Reagan believed in personal diplomacy, but concluded upon taking office that it was pointless to talk to Soviet hard-liner Leonid Brezhnev. In stiffening U.S. defenses and pursuing the Strategic Defense Initiative, his administration sought to convince Moscow, in the words of Secretary of State George Shultz, that restraint "was its most attractive, or only, option," while pressuring the tottering Soviet economic system.

When Mikhail Gorbachev came to power, the administration thought it had the strategic upper hand, and a man it could work with. Reagan met with his counterpart in Geneva and Reykjavik. Keenly aware of his inability to keep pace in a hightech arms race, Gorbachev wanted any deal contingent on prohibiting SDI. Reagan said "no." Out of his weakness, Gorbachev eventually gave the Reagan administration the kinds of arms cuts it wanted and openings in the Soviet system. The Cold War was about to end.

IfaPresidentObamahandlesrelations with Iran as deftly, maneuvering the clerical regime to its doom, he's worthy of his hype. Nothing suggests that he even conceives of his desire to talk in these terms. To do so, he'd have to develop some appreciation for the concept of leverage.

Has the Bush administration been too diplomatically inflexible? Maybe, but it has allowed the EU-3 (Great Britain, France and Germany) to take the lead with Iran, and the Europeans have offered incentives for the suspension of its nuclear program. It has engaged in prolonged negotiations with North Korea, winning the (dubious) promise of the suspension of its nuclear program. It has relentlessly promoted Israel-Palestinian negotiations.

We have a recent example of even more active Middle East diplomacy. President Clinton had Yasser Arafat to the White House more than any other foreign leader, and his secretary of state, Warren Christopher, spent long, bootless hours with then-Syrian President Hafez al-Assad. When Clinton tried to pressure Arafat and Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Barak into a deal that wasn't there near the end of his second term, the second intifada erupted. It wasn't appeasement; it was iust foolish.

Obama beware.

Statistics show that most successful children grow up in authoritative (note: not authoritarian) households. So, be authoritative and set boundaries. At the same time, give your son positive reinforcement. Don't ask why he doesn't have friends, or why he doesn't to so-and-so anymore. These questions make a socially shy person feel even more inadequate and rejected.

From Geoff, 22: The online worlds of MMOs are foundational for many young people, and parents need to understand the appeal. As a player, you are living the most explicit way possible: trekking across haunted deserts with your guild, exploring ancient tombs of forgotten races, brewing beers for fellow players, playing an active part in a dynamic economy. In high school I gamed similar hours as your son — yes, I also did 'extracurriculars' and made honor role — but I don't agree that gaming is addictive. I mean, why not play these games in high school when you still can play games? Now I have no time for gaming instead I enjoy the freedom not possible in high school: real life

Dear Carmichael: Don't get me going. Gaming is highly addicting, just like drugs, alcohol, or gambling. In fact, many gamers consider WoW the "meth" of video games. Some boys like Geoff, Peter, and Beau, can game heavily, maintain balance, and stop on their own. However, countless your son included — cannot. They are flunking school, flunking life. 

SMUD Provides Relief to Needy Customers from High Summer Electric Bills

The hot summer is now in full swing. Air conditioners run longer and many customers may usemore energy and receive higher electric bills. Higher bills can be very difficult for some people. The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) has special rates and programs to help.

Eligible low-income customers can take advantage of the SMUD Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR) that can save customers more than 30 percent on their entire monthly electric bill as well as \$1.50 off the \$5 service charge. Customers are eligible for the discounted rate if their total household income does not exceed 200 percent of the federal poverty level. For example, a family of four can earn up to \$43,200 a year to qualify for EAPR.

EAPR customers may also participate in the SMUD Residential Weatherization program.

Qualified customers can, at no cost to them, have their homes weatherized to improve energy efficiency and keep down energy costs especially during these hot summer months.

Customers in households where a fulltime resident requires an electrically powered device for medical reasons may be eligible for the Medical Equipment Discount (MED) rate. SMUD also offers the Senior Citizen Identification and Third Party Notification programs, both of which are designed to prevent service interruptions because of late payments.

There are other ways customers can reduce their energy use during the hot summer months. One way, for example, is to plant free shade trees from SMUD. SMUD provides up to 10 free trees, fertilizer, stakes and advice about planting and caring for the trees. Properly placed trees can yield as much as 40 percent savings on air conditioning bills once the trees are mature, and initial savings are seen in three years.

All SMUD customers benefit from their utility being customer-owned. SMUD electric rates are among the most competitive in the state and are about 20 percent lower than PG&E's. IRS Adds Functions to Online Payment Agreement App

The Internal Revenue Service today introduced several new features to the interactive Online Payment Agreement application , which will make it easier for taxpayers and their authorized representatives to make changes to existing installment agreements. The system will now permit:

- · Individuals to revise their payment due dates and/or amounts on existing agreements.
- · Individuals to revise existing extensions to regular installment agreements and direct debit installment agreements.
- · Individuals to revise existing regular installment agreements to a payroll deduction installment agreement or a direct debit installment agreement.
- · Practitioners with valid authorizations to use the signature date found on their approved Form 2848, Power of Attorney and Declaration of Representative, or the caller ID as

an alternate way to authenticate when requesting agreements for clients. More than 75 percent of those eligible for an installment agreement can establish one using the online application, according to the IRS. Since launching in October 2006, more than 30,000 taxpayers have successfully used it to set up a payment agreement.Eligible taxpayers owe \$25,000 or less in combined tax, penalties and interest can self-qualify, apply and receive immediate notification of approval for installment agreements - including pre-assessed agreements on tax year 2007 Form 1040 liabilities and paperless direct debit agreements. Paying taxes on time and in full avoids unnecessary penalties and interest. However, taxpayers who cannot pay in full may request a payment agreement. To be eligible, a taxpayer must first file all required tax returns and be current with estimated tax payments, if applicable.
