Civic Leader Leaves Legacy of Service

Bonnie Louise Berns passed away at home in Carmichael on Saturday, May 17, 2008 at the age of 75.

A resident of Carmichael for 51 years, Bonnie was described in her nomination as Honorary Mayor of Carmichael as personifying the very best in business and local community leadership. She made a long-lasting and continuing contribution to the local community.

She served as a Carmichael businessperson with Wells Fargo Bank for 35 years, retiring in 1992. She was

well known as an expert in all phases of finance including business, commercial and real estate lending and insurance. She received special honors while with Wells Fargo, such as Sales and Achievement of Excellence Awards. She also received the Outstanding Service Award in Helping Seniors, from AARP, and the Community Service Award, from Sons in Retirement Inc. (SIRS)

It was once written of Bonnie, "The care and concern she has shown to her clients as individuals is shown by the high esteem they hold for her and the

confidence each places in her advice and direction."

She worked for the betterment of the community through her participation in the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce as a Director, Honorary Mayor, Membership Committee Chair, Ambassador and President. She was elected four-time President of Carmichael Chamber of Commerce (1986, and 2004-2006). Bonnie is the only one of the 50 presidents who has held this honor. She was the first female Honorary Mayor of Carmichael (1985).

Bonnie was more interested in giving assistance, hope and compassion to others than in bringing attention and special recognition to herself. She had distinguished herself by her involvement in PTA, Little League, Girl's softball, Boy Scouts, as Brownie leader, Sunday School teacher, and member of various church organizations, including Faith Lutheran Church, where she served as Treasurer. She offered her time as a Sheriff's Volunteer (VIPS-Volunteer in Partnership with Sheriff) as well for 7 years.

In addition, she served as financial Chair of the American River Hospital Foundation and was a member of California Widow's Association. Bonnie also served on the Carmichael Recreation and Park District Advisory Board and as member and secretary of the Sacramento Parks Foundation. She was voted as Woman of the Year in 2006 by the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce and as Citizen of the Year in 2005 by the Carmichael Elks Lodge. Per resolution to appoint her Businessperson of the Year, "Bonnie ... personifies the very best in business and community leadership and has made a lasting and continuing contribution to the local community."

Bonnie attended Iowa State Teacher College and received her Master's degree from Wells Fargo Brokerage Financial Management. She married Ivan Hebbel Berns June 1, 1952 at Peace Lutheran Church, Glidden, Iowa and moved to Ralston, Iowa after marriage. Herhobbies included painting, sewing, crafts, loved to cook special recipes, entertaining and traveling in the RV. She will be remembered as an exceptional wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother.

She was preceded in death by husband Ivan Hebbel Berns in 1983, as well as her granddaughter, Carrissa Walls and her grandson, Justin Berns. "I came to CIJT with the idea of starting a new career. My mom started a second career in the jewelry business when she was about my age and I take my inspiration from her."



Jeep Cherokee Limited

Q. Ijust bought a 1998 Jeep Grand Cherokee Limited with a 5.9-liter, 360 cubic-inch engine with 142,000 miles on it. I have some questions: Can you tell me how many were made and what it's worth today? Do you know the estimated fuel mileage, which I don't expect is too much because it has full-time 4WD? The fuel filler gauge has a label that says to use only premium fuel. -- Paul J. Davidson, Penn.

A Chrysler head Bob Lutz first introduced the Grand Cherokee concept vehicle at the 1989 Detroit auto show. Over its lifetime through 1998, 1,662,552 of the original "ZJ" code Grand Cherokees were built, the last being your model in 1998. That's when Chrysler shut its plants down to retool for the all-new 1999 Grand Cherokee, code "WJ."

Chrysler indeed announced that the powerful 5.9-liter would be the power plant for the 1998 Jeep Grand Cherokee Limited. It combined the performance of a 245 horsepower V-8 engine with more luxury and authentic Jeep capability. It also sold in overseas markets as the Grand Cherokee LX. By September 1997, the 1998 models went on sale, and the Limited got that new 5.9-liter optional engine. A Special Edition 1998 model Grand Cherokee Laredo was also announced

In its final year, 14,286 of your Cherokee models were built, and it was the fastest SUV around, accelerating to 60 mph in less than seven seconds. As for price, I found one selling today for \$8,000, as 1998 model vehicles are not yet listed in any classic-car price guides. Regarding fuel mileage, the official EPA numbers were 14 city and 18 highway -- but I doubt you get that.

RT to Operate Additional Service During Fix I-5 Construction Project

Sacramento Transit District (RT) encourages commuters to ride transit during the Caltrans Fix I-5 construction project, which will close the onemile "boat section" of Interstate 5 (I-5) in downtown Sacramento at various times from May 30 through July 15, 2008. Funding from Caltrans will allow RT to operate additional light rail and bus service during the construction period to add capacity and improve service reliability. RT will add six light rail trips during peak commute hours (6 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.) -- three trips on the Blue Line from Meadowview to K Street and three trips on the Gold Line from Sunrise to the Sacramento Valley Station/Amtrak.

Free parking is available at 18 RT park-and-ride lots (7,379 spaces) throughout the light rail system. For I-5 commuters traveling from Elk Grove and south Sacramento, RT recommends parking at the Florin light rail station (1,076 spaces) located on Florin Road between 24th Street and Franklin Boulevard. Passengers should be advised that the Meadowview light rail station fills up quickly during the morning commute. Free parking is also available at the 47th Avenue light rail station.



Plan your alternate routes wisely (Internet Joke photo)

For Highway 50 commuters traveling from Folsom and Rancho Cordova, RT recommends parking at the Hazel light rail station (432 spaces) located on Folsom Boulevard between Aerojet Road and Hazel Avenue. Passengers should be advised that the Historic Folsom, Glenn and Iron Point light rail stations fill up quickly during the morning commute. Free parking is also available at the Sunrise, Watt/Manlove and Butterfield light rail stations.

For Interstate 80 (I-80) commuters traveling from Roseville, Antelope and Citrus Heights, RT recommends parking

at the Watt/I-80 light rail station (243 spaces) accessible from "Light Rail Exit 94" via I-80 westbound (left-hand lane). All park-and-ride lots along the I-80 corridor have available spaces, with the exception of the Arden/Del Paso light rail station. RT currently operates 97 bus routes throughout the Sacramento region. Ten buses will be on standby and dispatched to various routes as needed during peak commute hours. With the increase in vehicle traffic on city streets, RT buses may be detoured as necessary. Due to possible delays, passengers should take an earlier trip, if possible.

Route 15 (Rio Linda Boulevard O) – O Street) will be detoured to 7th Street. Routes 3, 7, 11, 86, 88 and 89 may also be affected. Detour information will be posted each day as a "Rider Alert" at www.sacrt.com.

"With gas prices continuing to skyrocket and six weeks of major freeway construction ahead of us, transit is a welcome relief for commuters who want to save money and avoid heavy traffic congestion," Mike Wiley, General Manager/CEO, stated. 





FORMULAIC SCREWBALL COMEDY IS "WHAT HAPPENS IN VEGAS"

WHAT HAPPENS IN VEGAS (Rated PG-13)

The new "Indiana Jones" movie can't arrive soon enough. Lately, I have seen more than my share of romantic comedies, which has not necessarily been a bad thing. For instance, new films coming out now include "What Happens in Vegas" and "Speed Racer." The latter film, a glossy mix of animation and live-action, is geared to a younger audience. On the other hand, "What Happens in Vegas" takes full comedic advantage of Sin City's marketing campaign, turning the famous slogan on its ear. Gleeful debauchery and insane indulgence aside, some things just don't stay behind in Vegas, particularly when a marriage ceremony at a tawdry wedding chapel carries the full weight of a binding legal entanglement.

Unfortunate circumstances bring two very unlikely people together in miserable matrimony. But first, "What Happens in Vegas" introduces the two central characters who decide for vastly different reasons to vacation in Vegas. Jack Fuller (Ashton Kutcher) is the ultimate slacker and party dude who is fired by his own father (Treat Williams) from the family's furniture manufacturing. His polar opposite is Joy McNally (Cameron Diaz), a buttoned-up commodities trader on Wall Street, who gets dumped by her fiance at her own surprise birthday party.

In a coincidence that only happens in the movies, Jack takes his best buddy Steve "Hater" Hader (Rob Corddry) on the trip, where they check into a Vegas hotel only to find that the room is already occupied by Joy and her best friend Tipper (Lake Bell). After resolving this unhappy arrangement, Jack and Steve convince the two girls to go out for a night on the town, which is facilitated by the concierge's eagerness to comp their festivities.

This quartet of partygoers is a mismatched group for many reasons. A second-rate lawyer, Steve fancies himself a ladies man, even if his charisma barely surpasses that of a serial killer. His obnoxious behavior finds its equal in Tipper's unrelenting hostility. The rowdy weekend becomes a random blur of frantic activity lubricated by massive amounts of alcohol. When the dust settles in the early morning, Joy and Jack painfully discover they tied the knot in a ceremony witnessed by drunken revelers.

Before the two vacationing New Yorkers can figure out how to quickly dissolve their union, Jack uses Joy's last quarter to play a slot machine which incredibly pays out a cool \$3 million. Now an impending marital split will be complicated by sizable community assets. Back in Manhattan, a cranky judge (Dennis Miller) decides to sentence the bickering pair to "six months of hard marriage." By freezing the prize booty, the judge forces the irresponsible couple to prove that they done everything possible to make the impromptu marriage work. The first one to fail in this mission will lose all the loot to the other.

Since Joy has to move into Jack's messy bachelor pad, it's going to be a very trying battle of the sexes. Not surprisingly, Jack and Joy will do their best to sabotage the other, and of course, their friends Steve and Tipper will become willing and supportive combatants on each side. They even have to attend marriage counseling with Queen Latifah. But many tricks are employed to undermine the marriage. Joy rounds up a bevy of beautiful women in order to lead Jack astray at a party. Jack tries to get her snooty ex-fiance Mason (Jason Sudeikis) to woo her again.

"What Happens in Vegas" thrives on the formulaic approach to romantic comedy. Very little happens that is unexpected or terribly surprising, but nevertheless there are plenty of laughs. While Joy is trying hard to move up the corporate ladder, it is the laidback Jack who manages to impress her demanding boss (Dennis Farina) on a company retreat. Is it any wonder where these mismatched lovebirds will end up? Ashton Kutcher and Cameron Diaz have the right chemistry for their respective roles of wayward slacker and uptight professional.

The Royal Schwarzenegger's

Remember Arnold Schwarzenegger? The guy who ran Gray Davis out of town by convincing us he was a tough-talking reformer ready to shake up California's stagnant political culture? What happened to that guy? Did he ever really exist? Or did his wife's Uncle Teddy eat him?

That political outsider is nowhere to be found today. He's not a fiscal conservative, not a government reformer, and the gunslinger who came to town looking for a fight is more interested in getting along than getting things done. Arnold Schwarzenegger has become just another member of America's royal class, a politically connected multi-millionaire who has virtually nothing in common with the rest of us.

Who else would lecture us about the need to invest our resources in the fight against "global warming" while he commutes back and forth between Santa Monica and Sacramento on his private jet almost every day? Way to set a

good example, Mr. Green Jeans. The rest of us don't have any choice but to reduce our carbon footprint when gas is \$4 a gallon. Your eco-buds refuse to let anybody drill or refine, but it doesn't affect you, so what's the big deal, right?

Keeping it real has to be difficult after you've become mega-wealthy and mega-famous, but it has to be doubly tough for Arnold, having married into America's most royal of royal families. I can't really fault Maria Shriver for being a Kennedy. By all accounts, she's a lovely and decent woman, does not appear to have a penchant for public drunkenness, and, unlike some in her clan, seems a competent driver and swimmer. But her latest book, Just Who Will You Be?, exemplifies how Maria just isn't like the rest of us. After Arnold was elected, Maria lost her position as a correspondent for NBC News, who felt her objectivity might appear compromised while her husband was California's governor. She found herself at loose ends as a result, and the book is her little life's lesson that "it's never too late to be who you want to be." 

How Hilary Became a Social **Conservative** (Sort Of)

When Hillary Rodham the gave commencement address at Wellesley College in 1969, extolling the virtues of "human liberation" on behalf of a restless generation of left-wing youth, did she have any idea she'd one day be the champion of old, white, beer-drinking Democrats everywhere?

Oh, what tangled webs we weave. And what strange transformations are wrought by presidential primaries. Candidates are often driven by their constituencies and the logic of their campaigns into unexpected places.

It's only as compared with Barack Obama, of course, that Clinton looks like a curmudgeonly traditionalist. Only he could have given her such wide openings to defend small-town mores and (gingerly) chastise a black nationalist preacher. It's not policy differences on cultural issues that divide Obama and Clinton, but differing sensibilities.

A push-pull dynamic has redefined Hillary. As the mainstream media, the leftwing blogs and latte liberals have turned on her, she has held all the more tightly to her down-scale constituency and reacted against her critics. She has lashed out against MoveOn.org, and husband Bill has dissed "upscale cultural liberals." She has defied the precious rules of liberal politics. referring to Osama bin Laden in a TV ad, threatening to "obliterate" Iran and -- even worse -- sitting down with Bill O'Reilly for a cordial interview. The same people who spent a decade defending her and her husband howl betrayal.

Every politician becomes a function of his constituency, a particular peril this year. Both Republican and Democratic primary races have been exercises in electoral tribalism: The evangelicals have voted for the evangelical, the Mormons for the Mormon, the Southerners for the Southerners, the blacks for the black, the youth for the young guy, the old white people for the old white people. The easiest way for Hillary to grow her support has been to get even more of her -- older, poorer, less-educated -white voters.

Why should she get them? Both she and Obama went to Ivy League law schools. The difference is that Obama left Harvard Law School for community organizing in Chicago and then a political career on the South Side. It's as if Bill and Hillary Clinton had departed Yale Law School and headed straight to San Francisco to clamber up the slippery pole of progressive politics. That way lies Nancy Pelosi.

Instead, they went to Arkansas and had to win over Bubba voters to survive. Democrats successful at the national level come from the South because it forces them into sympathy with parts of America not represented in the liberal, coastal bubble. Hillary obviously doesn't have the natural popular touch that Bill does, but she's sending him to every small town in America on her behalf.

Then, there's the matter of experience. Hillary's years in politics benefit her not because she's used to answering that proverbial red phone, but because they have roughed her up, making her -- like the Velveteen Rabbit -- more real for her voters.

All of this has made her a stronger candidate. Operating on the Bill Clinton model, a Democratic candidate needs a "Sister Souljah moment," distancing him from the fringes of the party. Hillary Clinton's Sister Souljah moment has been running against Obama, pushing herself to the center in relation to him and forging a bond with voters Democrats need in a general election. Oddly, she may be a more electable candidate now when the odds are against her winning the nomination than when she seemed a lock. Tangled webs, indeed.
