Enoch Accepts Position With New District

Superintendent Steven Enoch has accepted an offer to become the superintendent in San Ramon Valley Unified School District effective July 1. Enoch joined San Juan Unified in 2005 and is credited with helping to put the district on improved financial footing, driving the infusion of technology into classrooms, expanding communication with the public, and bringing greater focus to closing the achievement gap among groups of students.

"The decision to leave San Juan has been a very difficult one," Enoch said. "We are a district that is moving forward on many fronts. I am confident however, that with the incredible San Juan teachers and other staff members, including the leadership team and the Board of Education that is now in place, the district will continue the progress we have made in recent years."

Recruitment will begin immediately for a new superintendent to lead the district. The San Juan Unified Board of Education has already taken action to secure the services of the California School Boards Association to assist with the search. A public forum will be held on May 29 at 7 p.m. in the Board Room at the District Office, 3738 Walnut Ave., to offer the community a chance to weigh in on qualities they would like to see in the next superintendent.

"We are fortunate to have had Steve with our district for the past three years. He is recognized throughout the state and the nation as an innovator with a passion for technology and as an advocate for all children," said Board President Richard Launey. "I am pleased that we have a strong leadership team in place that will make this transition period a smooth one. The Board is committed to conducting an expansive search process to be sure that the best candidates are considered as we select a new superintendent."

Before arriving to San Juan, Enoch was Superintendent of the Mead School District in Spokane, Washington. Prior to his work in Spokane, he served as Superintendent of Schools in the San Juan Island School District, located north of Seattle for seven years, and before that, in the Bonsall School District in San Diego County.

Churchill Students Win Awards

Science Olympians Place 2nd in Northern California!

Churchill placed 2nd at the Norcal State Science Olympiad Finals on Saturday, Apr 26th. The competition was held at the new UC Merced campus. The competition included the top 3 schools from each region in the Northern part of the state (15 total teams). Churchill earned the right to attend the state competition by placing 2nd at the Regionals 3 weeks ago. Churchill missed 1st place by just 13 points. All team members earned at least 1 medal. Churchill took 1st in 6 events which tied the number of firsts earned by eventual champion Arden. Our team has been working hard since November putting in time after school and on weekends to prepare for this event.

The top 3 middle spots at state were all earned by San Juan USD schools: Arden, Churchill and Barrett. Mira Loma took 1st in the high school division and will again head to Nationals in Washington DC.

HP Grant – We Won!!!

I wanted you know that we were one of 110 schools in the nation selected to receive the 2008 HP Technology for Teaching (K12) Grant. In short, this was a competitive \$40,000.00 grant that myself, Sherriff, Hollenbeck, Manchester, Butler and Williams wrote this fall. The grant goal was for school teams to develop a collaborative, team-based approach to implementing technology integration projects. Our equipment, stipends, and software should begin arriving in mid-May. Our grant was titled A River Runs Through It: An outdoor laboratory application of ecological science. Next fall our science students and staff will be using the technology to conduct a thorough study of the stream running behind Churchill. Our math students will then crunch the numbers our "scientists" collect. Our "scientists" and "mathematicians" will then meet with our CORE English/Social Science students and present their findings. Our CORE English/Social Science students will sort through the data and create professional brochures, letters and proclamations to send to local and state leaders and organizations regarding the health of the ecosystem in the stream behind our school.

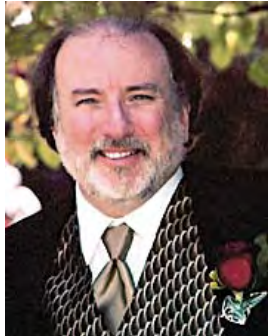

Gas Tank Placement

Q: Greg, do you remember when you could pull up to a gas station when your gas tank was located in the middle of your car under the license plate? It seems today that the gas station always has a line on my side, and I am wondering if they will ever put the gas tank in the middle again. -- "Tired of Waiting in Line" in Coal Township, Pa.

A: I sure do remember those days, and even more novel ways of incorporating the rear gas tank lines. Quickly coming to mind are the 1956 Chevy models that featured a left side taillight that came down in its entirety to expose the fuel inlet pipe. In 1957, Chevy utilized the top section of the left rear taillight that flipped to the side to open, and in 1958, Chevy had a placement above the bumper back panel that flipped forward to allow access. The 1958 Olds had a rear fin that lifted, so this was indeed a popular way to fill up your car in the good old days.

As for replacing the gas lines toward the rear of the vehicle, I'm guessing it is safer to have them located on left or right side due to rear-end collision situations (remember the Pinto?). With the gas door on the left or right side, the fuel line intake pipe now leads directly down to the gas tank, reducing the possibility of fire in a rear-end impact.

However, as many cars used fuel pipes behind license plates, one of my car expert friends feels it was styling cues more so than safety brainstorming that played the major role in the re-positioning of the tanks and fuel lines.

Thanks for the letter, and I still pull into the "wrong side" regularly, or, like you, have to wait for a "right side" pump.

New Home Prices Are Down – Incentives Are Up

MYTH #2: The higher the incentives, the better the deal.

Not necessarily! When builders first introduced incentives it was based on using their preferred lender, and would range around \$2,000. When the market began to show the first signs of slowing, the next step builders took to lure the homebuyers was an additional incentive, over and above the “lender incentive.” The buying public quickly caught on, and the incentive wars began! Today we’re seeing “incentives” ranging from \$10,000 to \$150,000!

I recently visited a sales office of a prominent builder. I waited while the sales rep greeted other customers. One gentleman approached the rep and asked her the million-dollar question; “What are your incentives?” The sales rep smiled graciously, and replied, “Sir, we’re not selling incentives, we’re selling beautiful homes.” If you have ever asked that question yourself, you may have experienced a bizarre response from the sales rep, including, but not limited to, crossed eyes, gibberish and sudden memory loss!

Why has such a simple question become so complicated? It used to invoke a simple, straightforward answer. But that was before the entire incentive issue became a commodity in itself, with guidelines, conditions and formulas. As a sales rep, I wanted to give the customer a simple answer. But after I explained to them the litany of incentive applications, including option and design selections, closing costs, buying down the interest rate, or lowering the price; and then explained how the incentive often differs according to floorplan, and stage of construction, and how it can NOT be used toward the down-payment, or how the

lender-base incentive can NOT exceed 3% of the purchase price; (whew!) I watched many buyers’ eyes glaze over. All they wanted to know was if my incentives were as good as the guys’ down the street. But Builder A’s \$25,000 incentive might be equal in value to Builder B’s \$40,000 incentive, depending upon what is already included in the home. So how are you supposed to make a bona fide offer given all these variables?

Simply put, the incentive is a number that indicates how much a builder is willing to negotiate. In this market, you can use it as a starting point for negotiating. Begin by comparing the base prices of the homes, then determine the options you want to add to your home. Don’t be afraid to ask for granite countertops, stainless steel appliances, upgraded cabinets, tile flooring and bath surrounds, etc. Will the builder give them to you as your incentive? Then ask for a reasonable price reduction. Here’s the clincher: if the home you want is complete, or nearly complete, most builders right now will negotiate the price over and above the offered incentives! Don’t be afraid to ask!

Bottom line is – the effectiveness of incentives is quickly running its course. When this market finally corrects, and all the completed homes have been sold, look for incentives as we know them to become a method of the past. They may still be offered for the preferred lender, but the complicated variables will no longer apply. So for today – use them to your advantage!

So go out there and get that dream home! What are you waiting for??

Iron Man Rocks

The movie-going world needs another superhero flick like it needs another unmuted cell phone or crying baby. But as sure as a tub of movie popcorn and a gallon of gas have no business costing four bucks, we'll never be rid of annoying ringtones and babysitter-challenged parents. And if this summer's slate of films is any indication, theaters will remain a haven for characters with superhuman powers.

About to save the world one baddie at a time are a reincarnated Incredible Hulk, a debuting Hancock and a Joker-dealt Batman. Among the less-immortal set waiting in the wings are a virile Indiana Jones, a revved up Speed Racer and a valiant Prince Caspian of Narnia.

Each has his own style, but their do-gooding purpose in life is always the same. Breaking the mold of crime-fighters with comic book origins is "Iron Man," the earliest of all the bravery-busting entries this season at the cinema. Iron Man isn't some young dweeb whose extraordinary abilities stem from some freak accident. Instead, he's a middle-aged genius who gets his might from a weapons suit he invented. The motion picture debut of this Marvel Comics character is tremendously entertaining, and all of us Shadow Boomers should adore the fact that Iron Man and the guy playing him -- brilliantly cast Robert Downey Jr. -- were born in our era, no disrespect to batty Christian Bale, super Brandon Routh, webmaster Tobey Maguire and soon-to-be

hulky Ed Norton.

"Iron Man" spends the entire 2 hours showing how Tony Stark, wealthy industrialist and playboy, becomes the metal-clad macho man created by comic book god Stan Lee. Our fun begins when Tony's stops. On a business trip in Afghanistan, the snarky, motor-mouth inventor of the U.S. army's most sophisticated weapons is kidnapped by insurgents who, among other nasty things, throw him in a cave where he is ordered to create the mother of all weapons, or else. Tony's smarts and his captors' lack of them enable the American to develop a high-tech suit of armor and make one helluva escape.

Tony returns to his Malibu home a changed man. He wants out of the weapons business, which hurts Stark Industries' stock and his relationship with Obadiah Stane (Jeff Bridges), his business partner since before Tony inherited the company from his late father. Tony's new attitude also includes setting sights on just one woman, his loyal assistant Pepper Potts (Gwyneth Paltrow fits the bill nicely). Tony's plans include inventing garb befitting a guy named Iron Man.

Although the story plays out predictably and the ultimate battle between good weapons suit wearers vs. bad weapons suit wearers is a letdown, director Jon Favreau ("Zathura," "Elf") turns in a smart, cool, action-packed winner that sets the bar high for this summer's surge of cinematic superheroes.

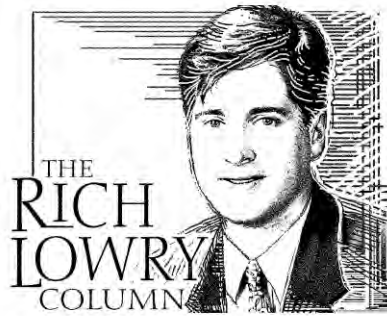

The Olympics: Bush Shouldn't Go

"The journey of harmony" isn't living up to its name.

That's what organizers of the Olympic Games dubbed the tour of the Olympic torch before realizing that the flame would have to be secreted away during its ceremonial meanderings. It was extinguished at least once in Paris as pro-Tibet protesters besieged it, and in San Francisco it popped up unannounced in unexpected places lest demonstrators create an unseemly ruckus.

If they have a sense of humor, the gods of public relations must be smiling. China celebrated landing the 2008 Summer Olympics as a global PR coup that would seal its status as an internationally respectable power of the first rank. Instead, China is reaping the embarrassment that comes with cracking skulls in Tibet and abetting genocide in Sudan as the world's eyes turn to it as the host of an event devoted "to promoting a peaceful society concerned with the preservation of human dignity."

If the games weren't a de facto seal of approval, thugs wouldn't pant over hosting them. Hitler worked to keep the 1936 Olympic Games -- awarded to Berlin in 1931 prior to his rise to power -- in Germany. For good reason: historian William Shirer says that turned them into "a dazzling propaganda success for his barbarian regime." In its eagerness to keep the Summer Games in Seoul in 1988, the then-authoritarian state of South Korea didn't crush protesters, thus arguably paving the way for its eventual political opening.

China won't be so gingerly, but to the extent the games become the occasion for embarrassment for Beijing rather than glorious self-congratulation, the better. The torch

should be harried, and Western leaders should stay away from the opening ceremonies.

All of this is mere symbolism, of course. For China, though, it's the ceremony and the pretty picture that matter most.

President Bush hasn't declared himself about the opening ceremony, understandably. If he says he won't go now, he'll lose any leverage over the Chinese. But ultimately he can't go, unless he wants to repeat his father's experience of rubbing shoulders with Chinese officialdom fresh from a crackdown. Bush has talked about religious freedom more than any other American president. In the past, he hasn't hesitated to irk China, meeting with the Dalai Lama in the White House.

It is the misfortune of Beijing that it has lost the cachet it once had on the left. The country is associated less with Mao's Little Red Book than with capitalist development and rampant pollution, making it an acceptable target for moral censure. It helps that Tibet's most famous representative is a Buddhist monk and that the autonomy of a landlocked Central Asian region at 16,000 feet is a cause safely sequestered from any hint of the American national interest.

Tibet will surely get more restive rather than less as the August games approach. They are simply too good a platform for international attention (the 1989 Tiananmen Square protests began upon a high-profile visit by Mikhail Gorbachev). China will respond brutishly and hope its Olympic stage-management still comes off without a hitch.

The End of Cheap Oil is Now Sacramento Man Dares To Think Pink

Never underestimate a politician's ability to pander. With gasoline prices nearing \$4 a gallon and the summer driving season approaching, presidential candidates John McCain and Hillary Clinton have responded by calling for a consumer holiday from the federal gasoline tax. But both McCain and Clinton must know that blaming taxes for soaring gasoline prices is absurd. The tax hasn't changed. What has changed is the price of crude oil, which hit a record \$119 a barrel in April.

Get used to it. Contrary to McCain and Clinton's feel-good simplifications, there's no easy answer to this problem. Gasoline prices are rising-and will continue to rise-because global demand is outstripping supply. Combine America's gas-guzzling ways with millions of new middle class consumers in China and India, and global demand is bound to increase for years to come (absent a global economic depression). Meanwhile, global oil supplies are essentially flat. This mismatch pushes up prices.

The real issue that McCain, Clinton and anyone truly serious about gas prices must confront is peak oil. Peak oil theorists do not suggest that the Earth will surrender its last drop of oil anytime soon. Rather, they contend that the world's oil supply has, or soon will, hit its upper limit, and then shrink. This, the end of abundant oil, spells the end of cheap oil. As limited supply confronts growing demand, the result will be volatile higher prices and shortages that could bring back the gas lines of the 1970s. And that's just for starters. The modern world needs cheap oil like the human body needs oxygen; remove it, and we could be headed for economic decline, resource wars and social chaos.

Conventional wisdom says the market will solve the problem: higher prices will call forth more supply. But a growing number of oil industry insiders are disputing that and instead backing the peak oil thesis. Though largely unnoticed by the media, a decisive moment in the debate came last September, when James Schlesinger declared that the "peakists" were right. You don't get closer to the American establishment than Schlesinger, who served as head of the CIA, Secretary of Energy, and adviser to oil companies. In a speech to a conference sponsored by the Association for the Study of Peak Oil, Schlesinger said, "It's no longer the case that we have a few voices

crying in the wilderness. The battle is over. The peakists have won." Schlesinger added that many oil company CEOs privately agree that peak oil is imminent, but don't say so publicly.

One who does is Royal Dutch Shell CEO Jeroen van der Veer. Without using the term peak oil, he warned this year that, "After 2015, easily accessible supplies of oil and gas probably will no longer keep up with demand."

The United States, with its two hour commutes, three car families, atrophied mass transit and petroleum-based food system, is most vulnerable to an oil shock. But similar vulnerabilities exist in most industrial societies, not to mention China and other emerging economies that are only now getting a taste of oil-fueled modernity.

Ironically, peak oil could actually harm the environment, making climate change worse. One might think that less oil would mean less consumption and lower carbon dioxide emissions. But the modern world is addicted to oil. If peak oil arrives before the addiction is broken, societies will likely do whatever is necessary to keep their addictions fed. That is already happening in Canada, where Exxon-Mobil and others are mining so-called tar sands-a very dirty fuel that carries a much greater carbon footprint than conventional oil.

Luckily, there are smarter ways to fight both peak oil and climate change. The first step is a massive investment in energy efficiency-by far the quickest, cheapest way to reduce consumption. This will buy us time to deploy alternative fuels, reduce demand via better mass transit and less sprawl, and green our economies. Plug-in hybrid cars, for example, get over 100 miles per gallon-double what today's generation of hybrids achieves. And if plug-in hybrids rely on electricity generated by solar, wind or other green energy sources, they will fight both climate change and peak oil.

More encouraging news: some top government officials understand what needs to be done. For example, David Paterson, the new governor of New York state, has spoken in detail about peak oil and the necessity of investing in energy efficiency and alternative energy sources.

As it happens, Governor Paterson is a strong backer of Senator Clinton. Maybe they should talk. And they should invite McCain and Senator Obama to join them. Peak oil seems poised to become the next big idea commanding the attention of governments, businesses and citizens the world over. We need our presidential candidates to talk sense about it, not use it to make cheap political points.

A serial bank robber is on the loose again in Sacramento. Authorities are searching for a man believed to be responsible for three bank robberies and one attempted bank robbery in the Sacramento area during the period March 17, 2008, to May 6, 2008. The unidentified man has been dubbed the 'Grocery List' bandit by law enforcement officials as all of the victim banks have been located inside local grocery store chains. The Sacramento Violent Crimes Task Force (SVCTF), comprised of Federal Bureau of Investigation Agents and Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Robbery Detectives, is seeking information on this unidentified male bank robber.

The suspect, described as a black male with a light complexion, is in his early 20's and is approximately 6' tall with a slim build. Following is a summary of the bank robberies believed to be the work of the 'Grocery List' bandit: March 17, 2008, the Bank of America located inside the Save-Mart grocery store, 2501 Fair Oaks Boulevard, Sacramento, California; April 18, 2008, the Wells Fargo Bank located inside the Raley's Supermarket, 3518

Marconi Avenue, Sacramento, California. Bank surveillance photos show the same individual in the bank the day before the robbery; May 6, 2008, an attempted robbery at the U.S. Bank located inside the Save-Mart grocery store, 2735 Marconi Avenue, Sacramento, California; and May 6, 2008, the Wells Fargo Bank located inside the Raley's Supermarket, 7847 Lichen Drive, Sacramento, California.

A note was used in each of the robberies and no weapons were used or displayed. Wells Fargo Bank has offered a reward of \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the bank robbery suspect.

He has ramped up his service even more over the past year, as the hotline has been heavily hit with predatory lending and foreclosure cases. Ralph has devoted many hours to seeking resolutions for seniors who have fallen victim to predatory lending practices and are facing foreclosure. He donated more than

700 hours of pro bono work in 2007 and nearly 300 so far this year.

Senior Legal Hotline, a special program of Legal Services of Northern California, provides free legal information, advice and brief services to Californians over 60. Receiving effective, timely help can be crucial for vulnerable seniors who are facing foreclosure or eviction, need answers about health care, insurance, wills, trusts or grandparent rights, are concerned about credit card debt, victims of financial or physical elder abuse -- and much more. People seeking help can call 916 551-2140 or toll-free 800 222-1753, M-F 9 to 12 and 1 to 4, or until 7 p.m. Thursdays. Questions can also be submitted by e-mail from the hotline's web site, www.seniorlegalhotline.org. In response, a phone appointment with an advocate is set.

The hotline also houses Sacramento Senior Legal Services; which provides additional help to Sacramento seniors. It has an in-house phone mediation program as well for resolving disputes; and a new project helps clients of any age discover and secure pension rights.

Due to the state budget crisis, the number of seniors the hotline can help is at risk of a drastic reduction. This makes the program's volunteers more important than ever.

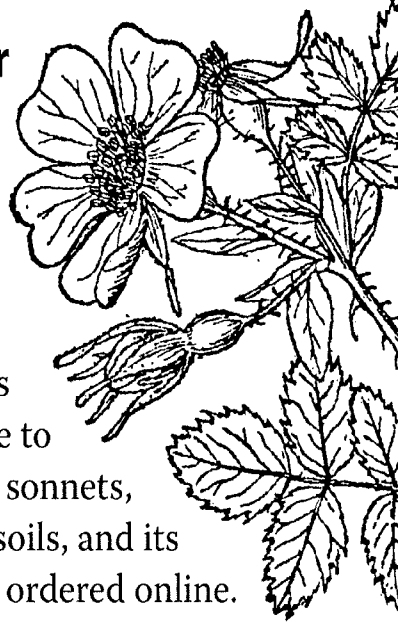
