RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - This year the Lady Lancers faced off against some of the strongest competition in the greater Sacramento area, playing the likes of Granite Bay, Rocklin, and St. Francis. They finished the season with 15 wins-7 losses- and 1 draw. In league play the Lancer's ended up in a tie for 1st place with West Campus. Both teams were 11-1 in league play, with each team beating the other by a score of 1-0. With this record, Cordova High School Girls soccer program secured their repeat as champions of the Greater Sacramento

Exhibition Examines WWII Japanese American Incarceration Camps

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Mills Station Arts & Culture Center (the MACC) announces the opening of the Smithsonian traveling exhibition "Righting a Wrong: Japanese Americans and World War II" February 2, 2023. The exhibition examines the complicated history and impact of Executive Order 9066 that led to the incarceration of Japanese Americans following the attack on Pearl Harbor. "Righting a Wrong" will remain on view through March 25, 2023. The exhibition will continue touring museums and other cultural organizations through the US.

Embracing themes that are as relevant today as they were 75 years ago, "Righting a Wrong" looks at immigration, prejudice, civil rights, heroism, and what it means to be

an American. The exhibition explores the complex history through historical images, personal stories and objects from those incarcerated at the camps. A duffle bag used by the Imada family when they were relocated to the Gila River camp in Arizona reflects the restrictions to bring only what they could carry. Takeo Shirasawa's 1943 high school diploma from the Poston camp in Arizona exemplifies the experience of thousands of other teens who had to complete their high school education in camps.

Following the attack on Pearl Harbor by Japan on Dec. 7, 1941, President Franklin Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066 which sent 75,000 Americans of Japanese ancestry and 45,000 Japanese nationals to incarceration camps. Ten large, barbed wire-enclosed incarceration camps and dozens of other

installations were scattered west of the Mississippi, far from their homes from March 1942 to March 1946. Young and old lived crowded together in the hastily built camps, endured poor living conditions, and were under the constant watch of military guards for two and a half years. Meanwhile, brave Japanese American men risked their lives fighting for the United States.

In addition to the RAW exhibit we have the 48-star flag signed by Japanese Internment survivors started by Johnny Gogo. Local internment survivor Kiyoo Sato has lent the flag for view to the MACC for the duration of the Exhibit.

"Righting a Wrong: Japanese Americans and World War II" was developed by the National Museum of American History and adapted for travel by the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service. The

national tour received Federal support from the Asian Pacific American Initiatives Pool, administered by the Smithsonian Asian Pacific American Center, the Terasaki Family Foundation, and C. L. Ehn & Ginger Lew.

The exhibition is based on the exhibit of the same name on presented on Feb. 17, 2017, through March 6, 2019 at the National Museum of American History in Washington, DC.

SITES has been sharing the wealth of Smithsonian collections and research programs with millions of people outside Washington, D.C., for more than 70 years. SITES connects Americans to their shared cultural heritage through a wide range of exhibitions about art, science, and history, which are shown wherever people live, work and play. Solidigm Names Rancho Cordova Global Headquarters

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Solidigm, a U.S.-based leading global provider of innovative NAND flash memory solutions, has named the City of Rancho Cordova in Greater Sacramento the company's new global headquarters.

The decision was made due to Greater Sacramento's access to skilled talent, quality of life, and support for technology businesses. The state capital region is ranked 7th in the country among large metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) for higher education talent with more than 700,000 students enrolled in higher learning institutions within 100 miles.

"The Sacramento region has a competitive talent pool, support for innovation, and offers a lifestyle highly valued by our team members, making Rancho Cordova the optimal headquarters for Solidigm," said Chief Operating Officer Ellen Doller. Solidigm is a leading global provider of innovative NAND flash memory solutions. The company launched as a U.S.-based subsidiary of SK hynix, Inc., the world's second-largest memory chip maker, on December 29, 2021, following an October 2020 agreement by SK hynix to acquire Intel's NAND and SSD

business for \$9 billion.

In September 2022, after an exhaustive site search in the Greater Sacramento region, Solidigm announced its choice of Rancho Cordova for its global research and development (R&D) hub, with more than \$100 million investment in the facility. That project is the largest semiconductor industry R&D project Greater Sacramento has seen over the last decade and is now followed by the company's decision to make the same location its global headquarters.

The site was chosen for its ability to combine world-class lab and office space into a single campus, proximity to where Solidigm's workforce lives, availability of public transportation, and nearby amenities.

Broome said. "This validates the state capital market as being one of the top locations in the country for semiconductor talent. We also want to commend the City of Rancho Cordova for its leadership and for making the process business-friendly with ample real estate available. Solidigm made the best choice because the City delivers a great experience and treats industry like their customers."

"We are pleased to see continued investment in Rancho Cordova from Solidigm and are honored they selected the city as their global headquarters," said Congressman Ami Bera. "The overall investment means a significant amount to our community as Solidigm plans to invest in more high-wage jobs to grow their presence

in the region. I am proud that Sacramento will continue to be the home of several great semiconductor companies. 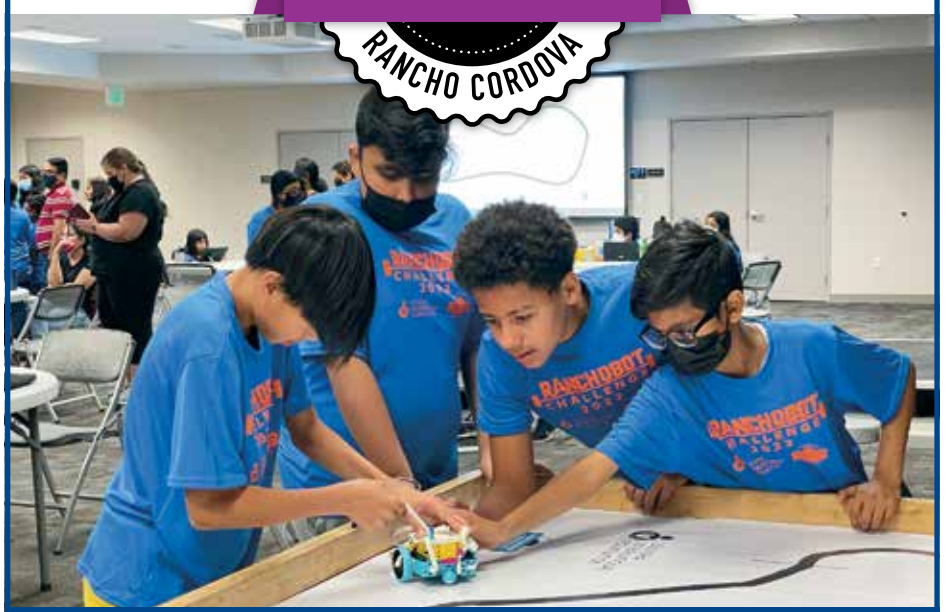

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The McGeorge School of Law is hosting a series of events to make seniors aware of the dangers of financial abuse. The school's Elder & Health Law Clinic partnered with Capital Stage for the interactive theater event. The group put together several skits explaining the warning signs of financial abuse to seniors. The "No." Is A Complete Sentence Elder Abuse Awareness Roadshow gives the public a chance to learn how someone might try to scam them and how they can avoid financial harm. The McGeorge School of Law's Elder & Health Law Clinic often works with Sacramento County's Senior and Adult Services to provide legal guidance to seniors.

"Our event is an interactive know your rights presentation where actors from the Capital Stage perform several skits taken from real-life elder financial abuse cases that our legal clinic has litigated," said staff attorney Lacey Mickleburgh.

During the presentations, actors play out different scenarios. In one skit, a son asks his dad to sign over power of attorney. Later, the dad realizes the son took out his entire savings. The skit is meant to teach older adults that sometimes even those close to them might not have the best intentions.

Once the first act of the performance is finished, the performers ask the audience for feedback. The advice from the audience is then applied to the skit and the financial abuse is avoided.

"There are so many cases that come through our door where our older adults have been influenced to make a decision that ended in financial abuse," said Mickleburgh.

The Elder & Health Law Clinic wanted to stop that financial abuse before it occurs. The skits illustrate the questions older adults must ask before signing documents or making agreements. When they know what to ask and what to look out for, they can better protect themselves.

With Public Input, SAFE Grants \$5,000 to Help Curb Homelessness

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On Jan. 30, 2023, SAFE Credit Union awarded Sacramento Cottage Housing Inc. a \$5,000 grant to fund new educational courses for its formerly homeless clients to learn important life and financial skills.

The grant was awarded through the credit union's Community Sustainability Grant Program, which provides funds to Sacramento region non-profits with programs that support education, healthcare, and veterans. To engage the community and our members in our corporate giving initiatives, SAFE invited the community in December to determine the two grant recipients offering education programs that address inequities. Voters chose Sacramento Cottage Housing Inc. and the Construction Industry Education Foundation to each receive \$5,000 grants.

"The grant that SAFE is giving is such a gift and blessing for Cottage Housing," says Sacramento Cottage Housing Program Director Cynthia Hunt. "It is another tool that we can use to engage our residents on an every-day basis to address the causal factors that led to their homelessness so we can watch them bloom like the flowers in our garden."

Based in Sacramento, Cottage Housing works to lift unhoused people

into independence and self-sufficiency. They provide shelter, security and programs to families and individuals to help them focus on personal and professional development to gain confidence. At the heart of their program are two communities: Serna Village in North Highlands and Quinn Cottages near downtown Sacramento.

Part of their program includes Life Skill Development classes that provide applicable lessons on parenting, healthy eating, budgeting, and employment skills. SAFE's grant will go to create a new course on independent living skills and a second course of the residents' choosing.

The courses are designed in part to provide knowledge and skills needed for the residents to move forward on a more solid financial footing.

"I think financial freedom for our participants is giving them all the tools they need so they can live a life where they won't have debt, can make purchases and know how they're spending

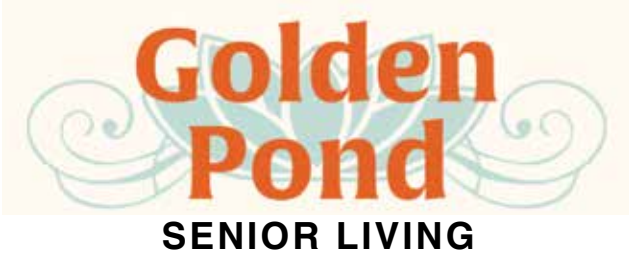
their money," Hunt says. "And to be able to do the things they want and to teach those tools to their children."

The grant to Cottage Housing was one of eight totaling \$95,000 awarded to nonprofits from SAFE in 2022.

"Our Community Sustainability Grant Program provides funding to programs that seek to make our communities economically stronger by giving people the tools and resources they need to live fulfilling, healthy lives," says SAFE Community Impact Manager Amanda Merz.

"Cottage Housing is providing essential work to address the causal roots of homelessness in our community through programs that truly work. SAFE is honored to help fund new courses that will directly help residents gain the confidence and knowledge they need to lead lives full of promise and hope."

- Increased alcohol and/or substance misuse.

-Self-destructive and risky behavior like driving while impaired." One of the best helpful numbers to assist Veterans who need help is the Veterans Crisis Suicide Prevention Declaration Signing in 1-800-273-8255. Pass on that telephone number if you know a Veteran who needs help."

I hope our elected officials from Local, County, State, or Federal government will be able to move forward with the difficulties which are facing the people of our country. We don't need problems which are making so many lives almost impossible today, floods, fires, dangerous roads, drugs, and people who seem to be increasing in numbers on the roads with 'road rage'. Caltrans, OTS Unveil New Student Named Work Zone Safety Mascot

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) unveiled on February 6, 2023, Safety Sam as their new safety cone mascot. The name was selected in a statewide student contest and is part of the campaign to expand public safety awareness to protect highway workers throughout the state.

Huntington Christian School (Huntington Beach) student Miller Ruiz's winning name was selected from nearly 2,000 entries submitted by K-12 students across the state. In recognition of his winning suggestion, Miller will receive a laptop, a \$500 gift card, a \$500 gift card for their teacher's classroom, T-shirts, and a visit from Safety Sam. The mascot will educate Californians on the importance of moving over a lane or slowing down when they see his orange friends and highway workers.

"Caltrans makes safety priority number one, and safety cones are critical to let drivers know when and where highway workers are on the road," said Caltrans Director Tony Tavares. "Including young people in our safety awareness campaigns helps us raise the awareness of both the next generation and current drivers, and we're excited to make Safety Sam the face of the important work being done to keep our highway workers and the traveling public safe."

"Educating the public on safe driving behaviors is key to helping save lives on our roadways," said OTS Director Barbara Rooney. "Safety Sam engages the public in a fun and interactive way while serving as an important reminder to be attentive when approaching work zones." In 2020, nearly 7,000 work-zone

crashes occurred on California roadways, resulting in more than 3,000 injuries and nearly 100 fatalities. Nationally, drivers and passengers account for 85% of people killed in work zones.

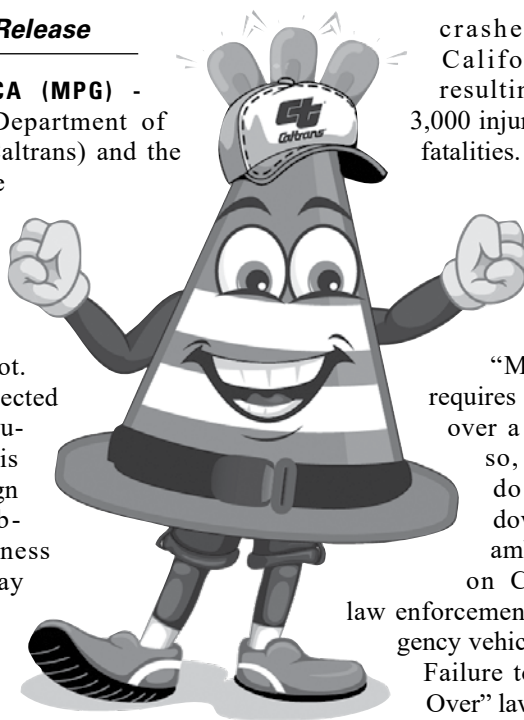
California's "Move Over" law requires all drivers to move over a lane if safe to do so, or if unable to do so safely, slow down when they see amber flashing lights on Caltrans vehicles, law enforcement, and other emergency vehicles and tow trucks. Failure to obey the "Move Over" law can result in fines up to \$1,000, plus points on your driving record.

The statewide contest ran from Nov. 21, 2022, through Jan. 20, 2023. Safety Sam will be used by Caltrans Districts for community outreach and engagement efforts. The mascot's image will also be used in materials aiming to inform the public about the importance of the "Move Over" law and work zone safety.

With safety as its top priority, Caltrans is using the Safe System approach to achieve its goal of reducing to zero the number of fatalities and serious injuries on state highways by 2050. This approach builds on its ongoing work to improve safety throughout its network and on all transportation projects the department funds or oversees, which includes "complete street" features that provide safe and accessible options for people walking, biking and taking transit.

Housing Duel Between State and Local Governments Intensifies

The long-simmering duel between California's state and local governments over housing is entering a new and more confrontational phase.

Local governments in the San Francisco Bay Area had until Jan. 31 to submit plans for meeting their state-imposed quotas for facilitating housing construction, and many of them missed it. They were supposed to identify enough land for the required number of housing units and the steps they were taking to make development feasible.

While declaring state, regional and local housing needs has been underway for decades, until recently there was virtually no backlash for failure. However, the most recent version, aimed at adding 2.5 million housing units by 2030, a million of them affordable to low-income families, is different.

The state Department of Housing and Community Development has embraced more critical oversight of the plans submitted by city and county officials, rejected those it deemed insufficient and threatened penalties for noncompliance, such as a loss of state housing funds.

The official pressure is clearly aimed at blunting the ability of local not-in-my-backyard (NIMBY) activists

to persuade local officials to resist the state quotas and/or impose conditions on housing projects that would make them unfeasible.

That syndrome is most evident in the Bay Area's many small enclaves of wealthy families living in multi-million-dollar homes. Simply put, their residents don't want to have their neighborhoods' bucolic ambience altered by apartment houses for what Victorian novelist and playwright Edward Bulwer-Lytton described as "the great unwashed" – ordinary folk lacking upper-class education and wealth.

On Jan. 31, the last day possible, the city council of the tiny, very wealthy San Francisco Peninsula community of Atherton adopted – with obvious reluctance – a plan for 348 new housing units. It acted over the objections of many high-income NIMBYs, including Golden State Warriors star Steph Curry and venture capitalist Marc Andreessen. Whether the plan will pass state muster is still uncertain.

Across the bay in Orinda, another upscale community in Contra Costa County, city officials were on the verge of adopting their 1,359-unit plan when it was revealed that one of the parcels it designated for housing was just one foot wide.

The schemes to evade state quotas have largely been uncovered by pro-housing groups, which tip off local news media, and the publicity then forces officials to backtrack. However, the "yes-in-my-backyard" (YIMBY) groups don't just blow whistles. Last week, a few days after

the Jan. 31 deadline passed, a coalition filed lawsuits against 12 local governments that had failed to meet it.

"There's no excuse for these cities to be in violation of state law," Sonja Trauss, executive director of one group, YIMBY Law, said. "Cities have had years to plan for this. They've also received resources and feedback from us, our volunteer watchdogs, and HCD. These cities are trying to push the responsibility onto other communities and avoid having to welcome new neighbors. It's time for them to be held accountable."

The suits mirror those filed by housing advocates in Southern California when cities in that region missed their deadline last fall. One goal of the Bay Area actions is to establish that the targeted communities are subject to one of the many new pro-housing laws, dubbed "builder's remedy." It exempts low- and moderate-income housing projects from local design control if the local governing body doesn't have an approved housing plan.

Whether the pressure on local communities actually results in 2.5 million units is very questionable. That would require more than a doubling of current housing construction and other factors, such as interest rates, material costs and the supply of construction labor, tend to discourage construction.

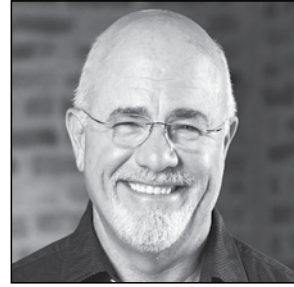
Defendant Sentenced for Sex Trafficking

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable Maryanne Gilliard sentenced Justin Starks to 12 years in state prison. On November 3, 2022, a jury convicted Starks of persuading a minor to engage in a commercial sex act, pimping a minor under age 16, and pandering by encouraging a minor under 16 years old. The jury also found true aggravating factors that the victim was particularly vulnerable; that the crime indicated planning, sophistication, and professionalism; and that

the trafficker took advantage of a position of trust and confidence.

In September 2021, detectives at the Sacramento Police Department received information that a 15-year-old teenager may be a victim of human trafficking. After talking to the victim's family members and reviewing a significant amount of evidence, detectives identified Justin Starks as her trafficker. Over the course of several weeks, the victim's trafficker took her to areas known for prostitution. She made money from selling sex and turned that money over to her trafficker. ★



How Big is the Burden?

Dear Dave,

My parents are both in their seventies. They have been healthy and active all their lives, but in spite of them both having good jobs they neglected to plan and save for retirement. Is it my responsibility now to provide them with financial help in their old age?

It sounds like you might be a little irritated that your parents haven't been responsible with their money. The way you described the circumstances, it's understandable—to a point. But in my mind, there's a bigger question when it comes to helping your folks. How big is the burden?

Let me ask you a few things. Do you have the money to help? Now,

can you provide this help without your own family suffering or going without? If both answers are yes, I think your question may be a little more about your own aggravation with your folks than any ethical or moral obligation.

A few years ago I spoke with a guy who was in really good shape financially. He made over \$1 million a year, and he had plenty set aside in savings and retirement accounts. His father was in poor health and had never handled his money wisely. The son asked me if he should help out his dad by giving him some money every month.

In my mind, there's no question the right answer was yes. And that's what I told him. If you're making millions, but don't want to help out your sick dad, there's something wrong with you. There's something missing inside you that money just won't fix. However, if you and your family are barely getting by—let's say you bring home \$3,000 a month—you're not morally required to

help a parent who was irresponsible with money their entire life.

I'm not sure what your situation is, Reagan, but I hope you'll look at things with a little grace and reason. It's a tough situation to be in, because it sounds like your heart is being pulled in different directions. My advice, above all else, is to pray about it. And, if you have a spouse, talk to them about everything, and make sure the two of you are in agreement on what should be done before moving forward.

Defendant Convicted of Child Molestation, Possession of Child Pornography

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sayed Ali Reza Fatemy was convicted by a jury of six counts of child molestation and one count of aggravated possession of child pornography.

On September 9, 2021, members of the Internet Crimes Against Children Unit within the Sacramento Valley Hi-Tech Crimes Task Force executed a search warrant on Sayed Fatemy's home in Rio Linda. The search warrant was the result of a cyber tip from the National Center for Missing

and Exploited Children that someone from inside the home was uploading videos of child pornography to the internet. Officers seized Fatemy's electronic devices and online accounts, which revealed a total of 11,207 images of child pornography in his possession. Some of the videos found were of Fatemy sexually abusing an infant.

Fatemy faces a maximum sentence of 18 years and 8 months in prison. Sentencing is set for February 17, 2023, at 2:30 p.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Laurel White. ★

Defendant Sentenced to 46-Life for Sexual Assault w/Use of Firearm

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Honorable James McFetridge sentenced Jorge Enrique Martinez Molina to 46 years to life in state prison. On December 1, 2022, a jury convicted Molina of assault to commit rape with a use of a firearm allegation; forcible sexual penetration with a foreign object; oral copulation by force, violence, duress, menace, and fear; and assault with a firearm.

Molina and the victim had ended their relationship. On September 25, 2021, the

victim went out with her friends. Molina was texting her demanding to know her location and had used a tracking device to locate her. He then went to the victim's house and waited for her to return home. When the victim returned home, she went to bed. Soon after, she awoke to Molina standing over her in the bedroom pointing a gun at her. At gunpoint, Molina demanded the victim have sex with him. He then sexually assaulted her while their children slept in the next bedroom. The victim fought Molina the entire time and was able to grab a phone to call 911. ★

"This is exactly why we're here, to help the dogs who would otherwise be considered unadoptable or unable to receive treatment, and it's only possible with foster homes and donations," Bird added.

"Bubbles didn't know how to be a dog when I first met her. She didn't know creature comforts like blankets, toys or love, but now she is almost fully recovered and loves jumping up on the couch and snuggling," said Marylin Hermit NorCal Bully Breed Rescue volunteer and Bubble's foster mom.

What Are 'Red Flag' Laws and How Can They Prevent Gun Violence?

California's red flag law, which allows people to obtain gun violence restraining orders (GVROs), went into effect seven years ago. Since then, GVROs have been credited with deterring at least 58 potential mass shootings and other types of gun violence in California, including suicides. Currently, 19 states and the District of Columbia have red flag laws, also known as extreme risk protection order laws.

But what are they, and how do they work?

"Red flag laws are a tool law enforcement and others can use when somebody is clearly at high risk of doing something with a firearm, but they can't be arrested because no crime has been committed and they don't appear to need a mental health hold or qualify for one," Amy Barnhorst said.

Barnhorst is a psychiatrist at UC Davis Health and an expert on violence prevention. She is vice chair of Community Mental Health and the director of the BulletPoints Project, which teaches clinicians how to prevent firearm violence. She remembers the days before California's red flag law. "When somebody was making threats about hurting people at their school or even threats of suicide, there wasn't much that could be done," Barnhorst said. "Red flag laws have changed that. With the law, there is something that can be done about people who are making threats or have concerning behaviors."

Obtaining a gun violence restraining order

Gun-related deaths remain high in the U.S. The Gun Violence Archive, which tracks firearm violence in the U.S., reports 648 mass shootings, 20,176 homicides, and 24,090 suicides in 2022.

Research has found that in

about 80% of cases, people who commit mass shootings or suicide make their intentions known in advance to family members or friends or via social media. "It's really important that if you are concerned about a student in your school, or you're a concerned parent, teacher, employer, or somebody who's worried about someone, know there is a way to intervene and reduce the risk. But you need to tell someone, such as law enforcement, who can act," Barnhorst said.

"If you're in California, and there is someone you're concerned about who may be at risk of firearm injury, and they have access to guns, you can go

to the Speak for Safety website. It can help walk you through how to pursue a gun violence restraining order," Barnhorst said. The website has different tabs you can select for your relationship to the person at risk, such as employer or co-worker, family or household member, law enforcement or teacher or school employee.

The California Courts website also has information in English and Spanish about how to obtain a GVRO.

"In many cases, law enforcement can get an emergency GVRO on the scene, and they can remove any firearms from the person at risk at that time," Barnhorst said. "If the judge

determines that the person is at risk, the judge can continue the prohibition. The guns will continue to be kept away for the duration of the order, which can be renewed after a year or longer in some cases."

Barnhorst explains there is due process during all stages of the legal procedures. "People who have had their firearms removed can appear in court to give their side. If the judge determines they are not a danger, the prohibition can be lifted, and the firearms returned," Barnhorst said. She notes GVROs are civil court actions. They don't involve the criminal courts, and they don't become part of a person's criminal record.

Most people don't know about GVROs

Despite the potential to reduce mass shootings and suicides, the use of GVROs in California has been limited. One of the biggest barriers appears to be the lack of awareness about them. A recent survey found that nearly two-thirds of the respondents did not know about GVROs, although 70% said they would consider using one in a high-risk situation.

"The GVRO law empowers people to play a role in preventing firearm violence among friends, family members, co-workers and classmates by providing a tool to remove firearms from crisis situations," said Veronica Pear, an assistant professor at the Violence Prevention Research Program at UC Davis. Pear studies violence prevention and has published numerous studies about the efficacy of red flag laws. "However, the law can only save lives if it is used, and for that reason, education is key," Pear said.
