Board Revises Approved FY 2022-23 **Budget**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted on September 7, 2022, to revise the Approved Budget for the 2022-23 fiscal year.

The Approved Budget in June totaled \$7.3 billion. With the completion of the County's FY 2022-23 year-end financial closing activities and updated information, an increase of \$540 million was proposed, bringing the Budget Recommended for Adoption to \$7.9 billion in appropriations. The increase includes a \$228 million increase in General Fund appropriations, and a \$313 million increase in appropriations in other funds.

The increase in General Fund appropriations included \$19 million of additional investments in new or enhanced programs, including addressing critical needs related to homelessness and behavioral health.

Among other additional allocations, the Board set aside \$5 million for a pilot project aimed at utilizing property tax rebates for participating multi-family landlords to provide housing at below-market rates.

According to First District Supervisor Phil Serna, who proposed the idea, "It would work much the same as Williamson Act Contracts except that instead of providing a property tax break to farmers who conserve agricultural acreage, the purpose here would be to provide a valuable tax incentive to property owners who agree to offer rental units at affordable rates."

Serna continued by stating, "As far as we know, this idea has not been tried before, but given the dearth of affordable housing, it is incumbent on us to try new, creative ways to keep our constituents from spiraling into the depths of homeless."

The proposal means county executive staff will work in the coming months to design the mechanics of the proposal and deploy it with the intent of assessing its efficacy so that it might be considered for expansion at a later date.

The Board Supervisors approved the following additional costs, totaling \$10 million:

\$5 million to establish a reserve for an Affordable Housing Incentive Pilot Program; \$3 million to the Neighborhood

"I think what made us so special is that we actually cared about one another, we were good friends, and we worked hard," Johnson said. "We were committed to basketball . . . It's an honor to be recognized, for us women to be out there, and I encourage women to just commit to it, follow through with it. If you have the passion, do it."

Abrams, a coach of youth sports for over 40 years, travels the United States speaking on behalf of colon cancer survivors; he is one himself. "One night my sons and I sat down and watched a video called 'Baseball, the Latin Game' and it showed how the young players in Latin America were wrapping rocks with tape and throwing rocks as baseballs, and using cardboard as chest protectors," Abrams said. "I decided that I was going to do something about that, and that's where Handing out Hope was born." As a result, Abrams has donated more than 10,000 pieces of baseball equipment to children all over the world.

Cross country and track star Rick Anderson gives this advice to kids wanting to make it in sports. "Give it your all and if after a competition, no matter what the sport, if you didn't do your best, then reflect back on it and see was it your fault that you didn't do your best? Was it a bad plan, was it just bad execution of a plan? And learn from your mistakes."

Blanchard said in closing, "Here's a challenge to you all. Consider sharing your great sports stories with the new generation. You just don't know who you will inspire . . . The truth is, our kids need you and one day, who knows, they may be standing with you right there in the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame."

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento nonprofit Women's Empowerment invites community members to attend its 21st annual gala at 6pm on Sept. 29 at the California Railroad Museum. Guests will gather in person at the Brighter Futures Gala for the first time since 2019 to raise funds for Sacramento women and children experiencing homelessness and celebrate the accomplishments of program graduates. The event will include dinner, presentations by program graduates, a live auction, award ceremony and more.

The annual gala is the organization's largest fundraiser of the year, raising a fifth of the group's budget to empower women experiencing homelessness to secure employment and safe homes for their families. "As we step back in time at the historic Railroad Museum, we will honor the resilient women who have graduated from our programs, and celebrate the beautiful, bright futures ahead for the women and children we look forward to serving who have yet to overcome homelessness," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "We are excited to come together once again with our steadfast community here in Sacramento to ensure that more women can rise from

homelessness in the face of a prolonged pandemic and housing crisis. We will need everyone working together in the months and years ahead so women have the resources to secure good jobs and safe homes for their families."

To ensure safety of guests and graduates, proof will be required of either Covid vaccination or a negative Covid test within 48 hours. The venue is well ventilated with high ceilings and outdoor spaces.

Women's Empowerment is a Sacramento nonprofit providing an eight-week employment-readiness and empowerment program, paid job training, childcare and support services so women and their children can break the cycle of homelessness. Women's Empowerment offers the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women experiencing homelessness and their children. On average, 70% of women in the program find housing during the ongoing housing crisis. Last year, 142 job placements were achieved by Women's Empowerment graduates. Since its founding in 2001, the award-winning organization has graduated 1,752 women and their 3,879 children. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and grants. When I looked out of the window on Friday morning, I wasn't expecting to see the same type of orange sun which we had seen in a smokey sky in November 2018. There is a museum in Rancho Cordova now which is a museum only in the sense that military items are displayed there. It was created by Mr Smith, and it needs to be saved and kept for the future. Our community, and now our City of Rancho we'll see you next time.

Cordova, has a military background which is truly an important part of our history.

I wonder how many would be interested in a tour of Rancho Cordova. I think residents and people who work here may not really know much about the city where they live or work. A tour would, or could, also give students from schools here some history which they could see and touch instead of just be something from a book in a classroom. > century, black clothing had become so associated with mourning that any woman who dared wear black when not in mourning was looked down upon as "dangerously eccentric." The

tradition of wearing black at funerals in the west dates back to the Roman Empire, when the family of the deceased would wear a dark colored toga, called a toga pulla. The tradition persisted in England throughout medieval times, when women were expected to wear black caps and veils when their husbands passed away! Yet, in much of Europe, widows in the deepest mourning period wore WHITE, a tradition held on in Spain through most of the 1500s. French queens prior to the Revolution also wore white while in mourning. Kings and queens from 1393 in France to 1993 in Belgium wore white. Personally, I don't like wearing black. I love to celebrate the life of the deceased with perhaps their favorite colors when they lived.

How about this. Yellow has long been a color of mourning in Egypt. Red is a common funeral color in Ghana. The Catholic Church introduced the use of purple in many countries influenced by the religion. Let's just remember the loved one. Color doesn't tell THEIR story, and that's what we want to remember! Monterey Trails HS Student Arrested for Attempted Homicide

Sacramento County Sheriff's Department

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Wednesday, August 17, 2022, at approximately 1:59 p.m., school officials at Monterey Trails High School, which is a part of Elk Grove Unified School District in the County of Sacramento, requested medical assistance for a 15-year-old male student having trouble breathing. Fire arrived on school grounds at the same time as the student's parent. The

parent transported the juvenile male student to the hospital for evaluation. Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Deputies, who hold the position as the School Resource Officers, spoke to witnesses. Their preliminary investigation indicated that the victim student had suffered multiple blunt force trauma to the upper body by another 15-year-old male student.

Deputies were able to view video footage showing the assault by a fellow student. Deputies identified the

> suspect student and arrested him for attempt homicide and transported him to Sacramento County Juvenile Hall for booking. The suspect is being held on two felony

counts without bail. This is an active investigation. There is no further

information on the juvenile suspect nor any more details of the incident at this time.



Mommy Can You Hear Me?

A state program that provides children's hearing aids may be expanded to include more families

A proposal to expand a year-old California program that provides hearing aids to children was approved by the state Legislature in the final days of the session that ended Wednesday.

If Gov. Gavin Newsom signs the bills, the expansion will add about 2,000 additional deaf or hard of hearing children who have partial insurance coverage and up to age 21who are not currently eligible for the income-based Hearing Aid Coverage for Children Program. If approved, it will go into effect Jan. 1,

"For the families that weren't eligible before this is relief they have been waiting for a long time. Young adults who are aging out of the program will be able to stay on," said Mike Odeh, senior director at Children Now, an advocacy organization focused on children. "We know hearing aids are not just a nice-to-have medical device. It's truly important for all sorts of communication, socialization, and development that are important for kids and youth thriving."

Ensuring more children are eligible is good news for parents and advocates but it raises the question about whether the program, which has been plagued with problems, can actually serve them. In its first year, the program provided hearing aids to a tiny fraction of the 2,300 kids it intended to reach annually. Overall, about 7,000 kids currently qualify but they typically only need devices every three years.

In addition, the application process is complex and takes a long time, families with some insurance coverage are not eligible and few qualified providers who serve children are accepting the program. For physicians and audiologists, the state reimbursement rates are low and they could wait years to get paid, advocates said.

The last-minute addition to the budget bills this week followed a CalMatters story about the program's challenges, a strident letter from the Republican Caucus to the state about the failure of the program to reach more children, and continued work by advocates and Central Valley Assemblymember Joaquin Arambula.

"I'm so grateful," said Michelle Marciniak, founder of Let California Kids Hear, an advocacy organization that works to increase access for deaf and hard of hearing children. "It was a huge weight seeing a certain population excluded from this program."

Earlier this year, as part of the budget process, the Legislature had requested additional funds to improve

the program and proposed expanding it to include children with partial insurance coverage. But that proposal did not make it into the governor's revised budget released in May.

Then last week, Arambula carried the language that was inserted into broader budget bills.

"This budget item means so much to so many children and families. I applaud the advocates whose tenacity helped achieve this, and I'm profoundly grateful to the State Administration for working with us to ensure the Hearing Aid Coverage for Children Program can be expanded this year to underinsured children in need," he said in an email. "We know these hearing aids and services are vital in helping these children develop and learn and, most importantly, bolster their well-being and connect with

the world around them." Odeh pointed out that while the expansion is great news, advocates will continue to lobby the state to improve the clunky and long application process, to increase reimbursement for providers and to get more audiologists and doctors to accept the program.

Hearing aids for children typically cost from \$3,000 to 10,000 and need to be replaced every three years.

The program, which debuted in July 2021, currently provides hearing aids for children who do not qualify for Medi-Cal, the state's insurance program for low-income residents, or do not have any other insurance. Families must meet certain income requirements. It was created after a 2019 legislative proposal to classify hearing aids as medically necessary so health insurers would have to cover them. That bill was opposed by health insurers and was pulled by the author after the Newsom administration said it would fund a program instead.

In its first year, the program dispensed only 39 hearing aids, according to data from the California Department of Health Care Services, which oversees the program. The agency did not say why the program reached so few children in its first year.

On Aug. 12, the Senate Republican Caucus expressed concern about the program in a letter to the Department of Health Care Services and demanded answers. In the letter, they asked why the program has served so few children and what is going to be done to correct the problems.

"It strains belief that, after a year of operation, this program has only assisted a fraction of those estimated to be eligible, and without explanation," they wrote.

According to the office of Lancaster Republican Sen. Scott Wilk, the caucus has not yet received a response from the Department of Health Care

Agency spokesperson Anthony Cava said it is still preparing a response for the caucus. If the expansion becomes official, Cava said it would update all communication, including websites, applications, and correspondence with the new eligibility information by January 2023.

Getting hearing aids early in life is critical for infants and children. They stand to lose speech, language and social-emotional development if they are not able to hear soon enough, according to a study in the journal Pediatrics.

The goal among physicians is to fit children with hearing aids by the time they are 6 months of age, said Dr. Dan Duran, audiologist and manager of audiology at Valley Children's Hospital in Madera.

Any delays in getting hearing aids make it nearly impossible for kids to catch up to their hearing peers.

"These delays can impact kids in terms of their speech and language development," Duran said. "It can also set them back in other important milestones as they are developing and growing."

Duran said the expansion of eligibility will benefit families who struggle to pay their share of costs after insurance or who wait to gather up the funds or put off getting devices for their children because of cost. He expects the center will be even busier because families come from as far as Santa Barbara and Stockton for care.

Marciniak said the lack of providers accepting the program is a huge problem for families who have to drive long distances to reach them. Expanding the provider list is next on advocates' list of things to

For single mom Kimberly Nguyen, in Sacramento, the expansion comes a little too late for her family to use now but it will be a great benefit in

the future, she said. She had been waiting to see if any changes to the program would cover her family because they have partial insurance. After waiting more than a year and seeing no hope for change this year she used money she saved from working extra hours to finally purchase a pair of hearing aids for her youngest daughter last month.

Nguyen has two daughters, 10 and 7, who typically need hearing aids every three years. Next time she hopes the state program will save her thousands of dollars. That is if she can find a provider in Sacramento. Currently the closest doctors on the state's provider list are in San Francisco.

"This is great for all the families who can now access the program and who don't have to worry about how to pay the difference," said Nguyen, who has testified before the Legislature and advocated for the change. Her insurance covers \$1,000 of the \$6,000 hearing aids she purchased.

At the same time this week, the California Public Employees' Retirement System, which administers health benefits for state and local government employees and retirees, announced that its basic plans would cover hearing aids for children starting in January 2023. That means instead of covering just a fraction of the cost, the insurers will fully pay for the devices.

FEMA Fire Management Assistance Granted for the Mosquito Fire

OAKLAND, CA (MPG) -The Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) regional administrator authorized the use of federal funds to assist the state of California in combatting the Mosquito Fire burning in Placer and El Dorado counties.

On Sept. 9, the state of California submitted a request for a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG). At the time of the request, the fire threatened approximately

3,600 homes in and around Foresthill, CA. The fire also threatened a high school, middle school, elementary school, Placer County Community Center, a Placer County Sheriff substation, Cal Fire Station 11, two hydro power plants, Foresthill Water Treatment Plant, Foresthill Fire Protection District, Sugar Pine Dam and Reservoir, and two public radio towers for fire and law enforcement communications.

FMAGs provide federal funding for up to 75 percent of eligible firefighting costs. The Disaster Relief Fund provides allowances for FMAGs through FEMA to assist in fighting fires that threaten to become a greater incident.

Eligible costs covered by FMAGs can include expenses for field camps, equipment use, materials, supplies and mobilization, and demobilization activities attributed to fighting the fire.

FBI Field Office Warns of Scammers Posing as FBI Agents

Sacramento FBI Field Office

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation Sacramento Field Office (FBI Sacramento) is cautioning the public to be wary of any unsolicited call, especially if the caller claims to be from the FBI.

"Nothing sends a person into a panic like a call from law enforcement, especially when the call informs them that they have been a victim of a crime or may be wanted for a crime," explained Acting Special Agent in Charge Dennis Guertin. "Sadly, that response is something scammers are leveraging with increased frequency, so it is important to educate the public about what to look out for."

Scammers are sophisticated and any unsolicited call, text or email can be a path for a scammer to attempt to gain your trust and separate you from your hard-earned money. To ensure your security and safety:

Never click on links contained in unsolicited emails or texts. The links may route you to fake websites or deploy malicious software on your phone or computer; Never trust the caller ID number; the displayed telephone number can be manipulated with software; Never be afraid to hang up on an unsolicited caller; Always consider sending unsolicited phone calls to voicemail. Most scam call centers will not leave a message; Always check the email address of seemingly official communications and feel free to reach out to your bank or credit card company directly by calling the telephone number on the back of your card to verify if the email is

Some scammers impersonate FBI agents over the phone. "The public should not be afraid to hang up on an alleged agent. An authentic FBI agent will find other ways to contact you, if necessary," said Guertin.

An official FBI special agent will never provide you with a badge number or telephone number to attempt to verify their identity without additional verification. Instead, they will direct you to the official FBI website www.FBI.gov to locate the local field office's telephone number and encourage you to make a call.

FBI will never call or email you to do any of the following:

Make demands for money, wire transfers, gift cards, or bitcoin; Coordinate financial transactions of any kind; Threaten

Defendant Convicted for Shooting Murder

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Patrick Noied was convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Tayler Wellman-Holochwost.

The jury also found true the allegation that Noied personally discharged a firearm causing the death of the victim.

On May 5, 2021, the victim drove to an apartment complex to sell marijuana to an acquaintance. The victim, the acquaintance and several other individuals smoked marijuana and hung out together in and around the victim's car. Patrick Noied joined the group for some time and then left.

He returned to the victim's car, brandished a firearm and attempted to rob the victim of his marijuana. Noied fired at least two shots into the car striking the victim in the neck and arm. He then reached into the car to grab the victim's bag of marijuana before fleeing. The victim was able to drive his vehicle to a store and ask for help before succumbing to his injuries minutes later. The gun used in the murder was never recovered.

Noied faces a maximum sentence of 50 years to life in in prison. Sentencing is set for October 14, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. Department 30 before the Honorable Donald Currier. ★

Detectives Arrest Sex Registrant

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On August 30, 2022, Aleksandr Anatolyevi Rudenko (26), of Sacramento County, was arrested in relation to a sexual assault investigation conducted by the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, Sexual and Elder Abuse Bureau (SEAB). Rudenko is a registered sex offender. He is known to frequent public recreation areas, parks and movie theaters throughout Sacramento County. Rudenko has been habitually meeting minors online through various social media platforms using fictitious names/profiles. The victims in this case are female minors aged 13 and 17. There are no further details at this time.

Aleksandr Anatolyevi Rudenko was booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on five counts that include Lewd/Lascivious Acts w/ Child Under 14, Sodomy and Oral Copulation. He was released on \$135,000 bail the following day. Rudenko will appear in court on September 1, 2022 at 3pm to answer for the charges.





Scammers Use Every Trick to Steal Your Identity, Financial Information

WASHINGTON, CA (MPG) - Suspicious communications in all its forms designed to either trick, surprise or scare someone into responding before thinking is No. 7 on the 2022 "Dirty Dozen" scams warning list, the Internal Revenue Service announced today, warning everyone to be on the lookout for bogus calls, texts, emails and posts online to gain trust or steal.

Criminals have used these methods for years and they persist because these tricks work enough times to keep the scammers at it. Victims are tricked into providing sensitive personal financial information, money or other information. This can be used to file false tax returns and tap into financial accounts, among other schemes.

As part of the Security Summit effort with the states and the nation's tax industry, the IRS has made great strides in preventing and reducing tax-related identity theft. But it remains a serious threat to taxpayers and tax professionals who don't adequately protect Social Security numbers (SSN) and other personal information.

For example, criminals can quickly file a fake tax return using a stolen SSN in the hope that it has not already appeared on another filed return. People frequently don't know they are a victim of identity theft until they are notified by the IRS of a possible issue with their tax return or their return is rejected because the SSN appears on a return already filed.

Here are some common scams the IRS continues to see. Taxpayers should take extra caution with these schemes, which continue to evolve and change:

Text message scams: These scams are sent to taxpayers' smartphones and can reference things like COVID-19 and/or "stimulus payments." These messages often contain bogus links claiming to be IRS websites or other online tools. Other than IRS Secure Access, the IRS does not use text messages to discuss personal tax issues, such as those involving bills or refunds. The IRS also will not send taxpayers messages via social media platforms.

If a taxpayer receives an unsolicited SMS/ text that appears to be from either the IRS or a program closely linked to the IRS, the taxpayer should take a screenshot of the text message and include the screenshot in an email to phishing@irs.gov with the following information: Date, time and time zone they received the text message; Phone number that received the text message; The IRS reminds everyone NOT to click links or open attachments in unsolicited, suspicious or unexpected text messages whether from the IRS, state tax agencies or others in the tax community.

Email phishing scams: The IRS does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email to request personal or financial information. The IRS initiates most contacts through regular mail. If a taxpayer receives an unsolicited fraudulent email that appears to be from either the IRS or a program closely linked to the IRS, report it by sending the email as an attachment to phishing@irs.gov. The Report Phishing and Online Scams page at IRS.gov provides complete details.

Phone scams: The IRS does not leave pre-recorded, urgent or threatening messages. In many variations of the phone scam, victims are told if they do not call back, a warrant will be issued for their arrest. Other verbal threats include law-enforcement agency intervention, deportation or revocation of licenses.

Criminals can fake or "spoof" caller ID numbers to appear to be anywhere in the country, including from an IRS office. This prevents taxpayers from being able to verify the caller's true number. Fraudsters also have spoofed local sheriff's offices, state departments of motor vehicles, federal agencies and others, to convince taxpayers the call is legitimate.

The IRS (and its authorized private collection agencies) will never:

Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. The IRS does not use these methods for tax payments; Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have the taxpayer arrested for not paying; Demand that taxes be paid without giving the taxpayer the opportunity to question or appeal the amount owed; Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

Generally, the IRS will first mail a bill to any taxpayer who owes taxes. All tax payments should only be made payable to the U.S. Treasury and checks should never be made payable to third parties. For anyone who doesn't owe taxes and has no reason to think they do: Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately. For more information, see IR-2022-25.
