RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Meet Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) Officer Alexander Perez. Officer Perez is assigned to RCPD's Patrol Operations Bureau as a patrol officer.

Officer Perez was initially in a doctorate program in psychology on the path to become a clinical psychologist. After he completed training hours at a California State Prison in his second year of the program, he realized his true passion was law enforcement.

Officer Perez contacted recruiters and participated in ride-alongs with several law enforcement agencies to develop an understanding of what it meant to be in law enforcement. He decided to join the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office

to proactively support the community and promote positive interactions with citizens.

Officer Perez worked at the Rio Cosumnes Correctional Center and Patrol before he joined RCPD as a patrol officer in fall 2019. He is also an Arrest Control/Defense Tactics and Report Writing Instructor at the Sheriff's Office Academy.

The Patrol Operations Bureau includes six patrol teams that operate on a rotating 10-hour schedule with continuous 24-hour coverage, seven days a week in the City of Rancho Cordova. Officer Perez proactively patrols and responds to calls for service during the graveyard shift throughout the night.

"What I enjoy most working at RCPD is the family environment and getting to hear feedback from our

community," said Officer Perez. "Our citizens provide invaluable insight and information about our work, and we need to continue to serve them to the fullest."

Got a Room or House for Short-Term Rental?

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA - Got a room or a home you want to list, or are listing, on Airbnb or a related service? Sacramento County would like to remind homeowners that prior to accepting guests, short-term/vacation rentals require a permit and a business license, and they must register to pay transient occupancy taxes for visitors.

Short-term/vacation rentals are defined by stays of less than 30 days. Sacramento County updated its regulations in 2018 to clarify that houses and apartments cannot be used exclusively for short-term/vacation rentals. Rentals must be an "accessory use" to the property, meaning the owner must live in the house for at least six months of the year.

The Board of Supervisors adopted this requirement to make sure short-term rentals do not disrupt neighborhoods and to limit traditional rental units from being converted to short-term use.

Stays of 30 days or longer do not require a permit.

If you are using your primary residence as a short-term rental, or are thinking of taking the plunge, please follow these steps:

Review the guidelines and application materials for a Short Term Rental Permit; Apply for a General Business License. You will need to set up an account with the Department of Finance to complete the application. Please do not submit until after you have received your Short Term Rental Permit; Register with the Tax Collector's Office for Transient Occupancy Tax returns once you have your business license.

Medical Reserve Corps Help Vaccinate

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Laura Hess, a recently retired Primary Care Nurse Practitioner has had a busy year. When the pandemic hit hard in March, Laura wanted to find a way to contribute. Inspired by the mission of the Sacramento Medical Reserve Corps (SMRC) she started to volunteer by staffing the Sacramento County Public

Health COVID-19 Medical Hotline.

SMRC recruits, trains, deploys and retains volunteer health professionals, and supports volunteers who contribute their skills and expertise during an emergency.

Members of SMRC can be called upon in the event of a large-scale disaster, public health emergency, hospital surge, or to provide medical-related support to shelters. Throughout

the year, the SMRC supports public health with flu clinics, participates in community disaster preparedness drills, staffs first aid stations at community events, provides health screenings at health fairs, and distributes health and emergency preparedness information at local events.

Since last June, Laura has worked weekly supporting the COVID-19 hotline answering questions from the Sacramento

County community. Laura educates callers about the medical aspects of COVID-19 and helps callers access community resources and walk them through their fears and anxieties. In recent months, she also started helping with medical chart review for contact tracing. When the vaccination clinics opened, Laura started helping with administering vaccinations and monitoring patients.

Second Installment of Property Taxes Due April 12

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The deadline for paying the second installment of your 2020-2021 Sacramento County property taxes is coming up very soon. Payments are due no later than April 12, 2021. Late payments will incur a 10 percent penalty plus a \$20.00 cost for each tax bill. Partial payments are not accepted.

Payment must be received in the Tax Collector's Office by 5 p.m. on April 12, 2021, or either postmarked or paid through our website by April 12, 2021. The Tax Collector also wants to remind property owners to include the appropriate installment payment stub from the tax bill or website, or write the parcel number of the property on the check being submitted to make sure that you receive proper credit for the payment.

Payment may be mailed to P.O. Box 508, Sacramento, CA 95812-0508. Be sure to mail your payment early enough to ensure a timely postmark and avoid penalties.

Making Payments - Property taxes may be paid by e-check or credit card through Sacramento County's Property Tax Bill Information System or over the telephone at 1-844-430-2823, using the 14 digit parcel number. For a convenience fee, a contractor will process your credit card payment if you elect to pay the annual property tax

bill using this method. This convenience fee is not revenue to the County. **There is no fee to make a payment via e-check.** To avoid penalties, transactions made either on the internet or over the telephone must be completed before midnight on the payment pay by date. Debit and credit cards will be processed as a credit transaction, and therefore the convenience fee will apply.

Please plan ahead and do not wait until the last minute to make your payment. If you are unable to get through on the internet or telephone, causing you to miss the payment deadline, penalties will NOT be waived. Please verify your data entry very carefully when making online payments. If your payment is rejected by your financial institution **FOR ANY REASON**, you will be charged a \$53.00 return payment fee as well as penalties if your payment is rejected after the due date.

If you use your bank's Online Bill Pay service, a paper check will be printed and mailed to the Tax Collector. Because the check is sent without a payment stub, please enter the parcel number, current year's bill number and installment being paid in the online account number field for payment identification. The date on the check issued by your bank is considered the postmark, make sure you are aware of the bank's timeline on issuing the check. Some banks take 5 to 7 business days before the

check is issued, and penalties will apply if the check is dated after April 12, 2021.

How to Obtain Information About Your Tax Bill - If you have not received a tax bill, you can obtain your tax bill information and payment stubs (coupons) at the Tax Collector's website, over the automated telephone system, or by contacting the Tax Collector's Office at (916) 874-6622.

Sacramento County offers an online email subscription service for property tax information to receive e-mail notifications when the annual secured property tax bills are available each year and reminders before the first and second installments delinquent dates. This service is provided at no cost to subscribers. Visit the Sacramento County Homepage and enter your email address or mobile number under the "Connect with us" header, located at the bottom right-hand of the page.

For additional information about property taxes, the Sacramento County Tax Collector's website provides answers to the most common questions from taxpayers regarding property taxes and links to tax bill information and online payments.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the property owner of their liability to pay taxes in a timely manner or give the Tax Collector reason to cancel penalties imposed for late payment. ★

Water Users Urged to Reduce and Conserve During Dry Conditions

- As dry conditions persist throughout California, the State Water Resources Control Board mailed early warning notices to approximately 40,000 water right holders, urging them to plan for potential shortages by reducing water use and adopting practical conservation measures.

Reservoir and groundwater levels are significantly below average, and despite recent storms, snowpack is only 58% of average as of March 10. After two years of below average precipitation, officials don't expect the April 1 snow survey to reveal significant improvement in the water supply outlook this year. April 1 is typically the peak of California's snowpack, which in an average year provides 30% of the state's water supply.

"Planting crops and other decisions that are dictated by water supply are made early in the year, so early warnings are vital," said Erik Ekdahl, deputy director for the Water Board's Division of Water Rights. "These letters give water users time to prepare and help minimize the impacts of reduced supplies on businesses, farms and homes."

Agricultural water users can implement practical actions now to improve their drought resilience, including reducing irrigated acreage, managing

herd size, using innovative irrigation and diversifying water supply portfolios. Urban water users can conserve by putting in drought-resistant landscape, reducing outdoor irrigation and replacing older house fixtures and appliances with more efficient ones.

Additionally, all diverters are legally required to report their annual water use to the State Water Board. Accurate and timely reporting of information is crucial to managing the state's water resources.

In preparing for potential droughts, the State Water Board partners with multiple state, local and federal agencies, including California Department of Water Resources, Fish and Wildlife, the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, Bureau of Land Management, U.S. Forest Service, Tribal governments and water management organizations. Staff will continue to coordinate as it monitors the situation and engage more frequently with water users if conditions continue or worsen.

The State Water Board's mission is to preserve, enhance and restore the quality of California's water resources and ensure proper allocation and efficient use for the benefit of present and future generations. ★

CRPD Receives Multiple Awards for Pool Outreach Campaign

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -The Cordova Recreation & Park District (District) is honored to be the recipient of multiple awards for the Cordova Community Pool Replacement Project (project) Virtual Public Outreach Campaign.

When the Coronavirus pandemic hit in spring of 2020, the District initially thought the opportunity to celebrate the project groundbreaking or share construction updates with the public was lost. After brainstorming and researching available technologies, the District embarked on a virtual public outreach campaign. One important piece of the campaign was a virtual groundbreaking video which allowed the District to celebrate an important milestone with the community while never compromising the community's safety during a public-health crisis. The District was also able to film stunning drone shots of the project site through various stages of construction while working with Creatiform Media. This footage was used to prepare several project update videos for the public which allowed the community to be safely informed of the progress on a regular basis until opening day finally arrives.

For outstanding work, the District was awarded the California Park & Recreation Society's (CPRS) Marketing & Communications Award of Excellence. The Marketing

& Communications Award of Excellence recognizes outstanding achievement in marketing and communications through demonstration of the CREAM principals of challenge, resourcefulness, execution, accomplishment and alignment with the parks and recreation mission. The award was created through Piece by Piece, an organization that provides low-income and formerly homeless people free mosaic art workshops using recycled materials to develop marketable skills, self-confidence, earned income and an improved quality of life.

In addition, the District was presented with the CPRS District 2 Agency Showcase Marketing Award. The Agency Showcase Marketing Award recognizes excellence in digital media that encourages participation in recreational activities, contributes to the public's increased awareness of parks and recreation services, encourages community involvement and raises the status of parks

and recreation as an essential community service.

The District's dedication to community involvement is exemplified through this Virtual Public Outreach Campaign. This campaign allowed and continues to allow the District to safely broadcast the project details to the public, provide updates on construction progress, reassure the public the project is a product of community-based planning and celebrate the project opening despite the current limitations.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The second Mills Station Arts and Culture Center Student Art Show contains over 200 pieces of art by more than 195 students. "The call went out to kids that live in Rancho Cordova or go to school in Rancho Cordova, both public and private, as well as homeschooled," said Cheryl Gleason, MACC Curator. Fourteen schools and learning centers are represented, both public and private, as well as homeschooled children and Girl Scout troops. Contributors are kindergarten through high school.

Joan Lim, whose son Bodhi, 6, entered the show, said that she became aware of the MACC art show through the newsletter from her son's school, Robert J. McGarvey Elementary. The family also had visited the MACC in February. Lim makes sure Bodhi has plenty of materials with which to make art in his spare time, especially since with distance learning a lot of school art projects have been eliminated. "He does enjoy making collages and also drawing and coloring," Lim said. "So it's something he takes the initiative and he does it by himself."

Lin has an older son as well. "There is a lot of competition from digital media," Lin said. "Sometimes when they use up their digital time, then it's back to basics. Anything you want, you can create. I think that giving them space to just create and also have a quiet time, it helps calm their minds."

Students from the Rancho Cordova CCHAT Center (Children's Choice for Hearing and Talking), entered art in the show. Out of around 55 current students, preschool through third grade, 18 submitted artwork for the show. Meredith Wright, teacher of the deaf and hard of hearing

said, "I did a project in my class, and my co-worker Melissa did art in her class. Then we submitted those student art works to the MACC." The Center does not have a regular art program, but the school works art into the day similarly to how a regular preschool or kindergarten does. "My students are in kindergarten and they're here from 9am to 2:45 pm every day, so it's a full day kindergarten," Wright said. The process for their art project used a glass baking dish. They each used a special process to draw their picture in paint on the glass. "When they got to see it peeled off, they were so excited. This was a way of printmaking, making something in a different way that we hadn't done before."

There will be a "Violin on Fire" concert at the MACC, 6:30-8:30 p.m., Friday, April 16, featuring Patrick Contreras. The Zintzuni Food Truck will be there during that time.

The Student Art Show will be on view at the MACC Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from April 1 through April 17. Hours are 3-8 p.m. on Thursdays and Fridays, and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays. Admission is free. The MACC is located at 10191 Mills Station Rd., Rancho Cordova. “My volunteer work with the SMRC and COVID-19 has been one of the most rewarding experiences of my career. The compassion, teamwork and commitment of our local Public Health Department has inspired me to give back to our community,” said Laura.

Since the pandemic began, hundreds of MRC units have deployed volunteers to help with the COVID-19 response and logged hundreds of thousands of volunteer hours.

SMRC volunteers like Laura are now supporting vaccination clinics for COVID-19. Volunteers work tirelessly to administer doses of vaccine as quickly as they can. At this time, vaccines are prioritized for essential worker groups working in Sacramento County that fall into Phase 1a Tier 1 – 3, and the County has begun vaccinating certain groups working in Sacramento County in Phase 1b Tier 1, such as Emergency Services and Education/Child Care workers. Additionally SMRC volunteers are supporting vaccine clinics planned throughout Sacramento County for those who are at least 65 years old living in Sacramento County.

In February, Sacramento County began coordinating vaccinations at various sites for those who are living in Sacramento County and are 75 years old and older, and at other sites for those 65 years old and older. Sacramento County is also using the limited vaccine allocation to continue vaccinating Phase 1a Tier 1 – 3 priority list of workers – healthcare, first responders and congregate care setting staff as well as groups in Phase 1b Tiers 1 – 2.

“SMRC volunteers have been such an important part of the Sacramento County Public Health COVID-19 response, they have dedicated thousands of hours to answering phones, working at our testing sites, contact tracing, vaccination clinics and more,” said Megan Sheffield, Sacramento County Public Health Volunteer Coordinator for the COVID-19 response. “With the help of SMRC volunteers, Sacramento County Public Health has been able to serve our community during these unprecedented times.”

“I am so thankful for our remarkable SMRC members who generously give their time and expertise to help our community and assist Sacramento County Public Health with the COVID-19 pandemic response effort. Our membership numbers have close to tripled since the start of COVID-19,” said Lynn Pesely, Coordinator, Sacramento Medical Reserve Corps.

The SMRC currently has more than 600 volunteer medical professionals and non-medical members who have served an estimated 14,000 hours for the COVID-19 response effort to date.

The SMRC has supported Sacramento County Public Health with staffing in the following roles: Vaccination and testing clinics; COVID-19 Hotline; After-hours COVID-19 phone guidance for medical facilities; Flu clinics;

Public Health Laboratory Courier; Laboratory Coordinator; Contact tracing; Case investigations.

Aerojet Rocketdyne Pays Previously - Declared Special Dividend

EL SEGUNDO, CA (MPG) - March 24, 2021 – Aerojet Rocketdyne Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: AJRD) announced payment of the previously-declared \$5.00 per share special cash dividend to holders of its common shares and convertible senior notes, on an as-converted basis. The special dividend was paid to holders of record as of March 10, 2021.

Payment of the special cash dividend was made in connection with the anticipated acquisition of Aerojet Rocketdyne by Lockheed Martin Corporation (NYSE: LMT) in an all-cash transaction previously announced on December 20, 2020. Under the terms of the acquisition agreement, Aerojet Rocketdyne’s payment of the special dividend adjusts the consideration to be paid by Lockheed Martin at closing from \$56.00 per share to \$51.00 per share.

The transaction is expected to close in the second half of 2021, pending receipt of regulatory approval under the Hart-Scott-Rodino Antitrust Improvements Act of 1976, as amended, and satisfaction of other closing conditions specified in the acquisition agreement.

California and The Political Food Chain

While the relationships among the various levels of American government are often cooperative, always lurking in the background is what one might characterize as a political food chain.

Officials plot constantly to impose their will on counterparts occupying lower links of the chain while avoiding similar efforts by those above them – all in the name of better governance, of course.

We’re seeing one example of the syndrome now in the efforts of California’s legislators and Gov. Gavin Newsom to confront California’s housing crisis. They want to compel local governments, particularly cities, to make more land available for high-density housing to serve low- and moderate-income families, and override local zoning laws that favor single-family homes on large lots.

Local officials tend to view the state’s efforts as heavy-handed, one-size-fits-all violations of their traditional rights to control land use and thus shape the atmosphere of their communities. But advocates of state intervention say it’s needed to overcome not-in-my-backyard resistance that discriminates against the poor and

the non-white.

As state officials strive to impose their will on local governments, they often resist the federal government’s efforts to do the same on states. California’s former attorney general, Xavier Becerra, filed more than 100 lawsuits against the federal government during Donald Trump’s presidency, many of which asserted the principle of states’ rights to resist decrees from Washington.

Becerra now heads the federal health and welfare agency and can be expected to crack the whip on any states that resist federal policies in the programs he manages. That’s how the food chain works; it’s not personal animosity, just institutional jousting for control.

The recently enacted \$1.9 trillion “stimulus” that Becerra’s new boss, President Joe Biden, pushed through Congress provides another example. It gives state and local governments \$350 billion in aid, supposedly to make up for revenue losses during the COVID-19 pandemic. But one provision prohibits recipients from using the windfall to reduce taxes, and that has generated criticism from state officials of all ideological stripes that it interferes with their ability to manage their finances.

In California, politicians and interest groups on the left say it could prevent them from reducing tax burdens on the poor, such as expansion of the earned income tax credit, and small businesses.

State Finance Director Keely Bosler told Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen

in a letter that strictly applying the tax cut prohibition would “limit a state’s ability to adopt policies that support federal goals and could thus constrain the economic benefits that were intended by the authorization of these funds.”

“We’re trying to provide additional relief to businesses that took it in the teeth during the recession,” H.D. Palmer, a spokesperson for Bosler’s Department of Finance, said. “We don’t want to go down that road until we’ve got further clarification from Washington.”

California business groups, meanwhile, say that the tax cut ban would undermine efforts to restore two business tax breaks that the state suspended last year when it appeared that COVID-19 would devastate state finances. With state revenues now running more than \$14 billion over-estimates, business leaders say that the tax breaks, which amount to more than \$4 billion a year, should be reinstated.

The business-backed California Taxpayers Association and 16 other state taxpayer organizations also sent a letter to Yellen seeking clarity on what states can and cannot do under the tax cut language. The stimulus law gives her the authority to make those decisions in a classic example of how the intergovernmental food chain works.

2021. There is a form that needs to be filled out, so call “Volunteer Services” at Mather at 916-366-5372 for information and help.

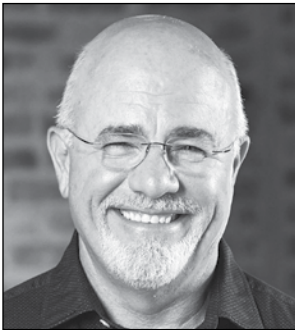

and working toward making decisions together, but you’ll never get control of your finances until you rid yourself of the mindset that debt is okay. Once you lose that idea, you’ll begin to understand missing a year of funding your Roth IRAs isn’t going to kill you. It’s also not going to prevent you from becoming wealthy and living like no one else when it’s time to start thinking about retirement.

If you stay in the mindset that having debt is okay, or that you’re going to let it hang around, eventually it will really mess you up financially. Winning with money is more about behavior than math. Don’t get me wrong, you need to crunch the numbers and be mindful of them, but all the mathematical components are nothing but theory if the behavior doesn’t kick in.

So yeah, I’m siding with your wife on this one. Just follow the Baby Steps plan. Have all your debt paid off, except for your home, and an emergency fund of three to six months of expenses saved and set aside before you start any long-term investing. A lot of folks will tell you my way isn’t mathematically correct, but it will work better in the long run – for your money, your marriage, and in other areas of your life!

Section 4 Notice of Adoption. Notice of adoption of this Resolution shall be given by posting a true copy of this Resolution in three (3) public places in the District not less than ten (10) days before the date of the public hearing described above. Notice of said public hearing shall be given by publishing the notice in a newspaper of general circulation published in the District or in a newspaper published in Sacramento County that has general circulation within the District not less than five (5) days before the date of the public hearing described above.

The unprecedented move places the responsibility of seeking an asylum hearing on the migrants through Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE) or legal assistance. Multiple Border Patrol agents confirmed the new process to Fox News, revealing that they have been directed to use prosecutorial discretion (PD) to forgo the hours-long process of paperwork required to issue an NTA amid the surge of migrants at the border. ★

Local Soroptimist Club Completes Its First Dream Program

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Soroptimist International of Rancho Cordova and Gold River club completed its very first Dream It, Be It program! This Soroptimist "Dream" program is primarily geared towards secondary school girls who face obstacles to their future success. Through small group workshops or in a conference setting, students are mentored on setting and achieving their goals, moving forward after setbacks or failures, and discovering career opportunities.

The club originally planned to host its Dream It Be It (DIBI) workshops face-to-face. In light of rising COVID-19 cases and the Governor's Stay at Home orders in December 2020, they quickly adjusted their DIBI program to a virtual setting. Their first virtual workshop was held on December 5 with 10 girls. The beauty of the virtual platform was that participation was no longer limited to local area students. They had students that joined from Seattle, Michigan, Southern California, Vacaville and even Switzerland!

Their 12/5 workshop focused on identifying personal values and learning how personal values translate to work values. Their 12/19 workshop focused on an "adulting" exercise in money management, budgeting and the potential dangers of credit as well as exercises on identifying personal obstacles and how to develop a plan to overcome them. The 12/21 workshop focused on resume-building when you have little to no work experience as well as different interview types and how to prepare. During the last session, on 12/28, the girls practiced interviewing through mock interviews.

Their DIBI program turned some dreams into reality! As a result of this inaugural program, a mentorship was arranged for one of the girls, and an internship offered to another. In addition, the Rancho Cordova/Gold River club established a new relationship with a club in another state and a partnership with another local nonprofit! They had quite the learning curve for

this virtual program. Not only was this the first time they offered this program, they had to learn how to offer it virtually. Yet, everything went off without a hitch. The success of their DIBI program is partly due to their community partner, National Teen Leadership Program (NTLP). Ashleigh Cook, their Program Manager, had the tech savvy, and the proper applications that allowed them to make our program interactive and fun. They received good feedback from the girls about that. They also spent a great deal of time planning out the sessions, which served them very well.

The club’s next effort includes a “Success Stories” session, where professional women will present in a panel format on April 10th. Girls will hear what it is like to be a dentist, or HR representative, or a woman in the fields of medicine and technology. This program idea came from the feedback received from the girls in their DIBI program. The club will work with NTLP again for this, and continue working with them for the next DIBI workshop series in October. They are crossing their fingers to do an in-person session for that, but are also prepared to hold sessions virtually again, if need be, and will be open to not only our first DIBI workshop participants, but to all students. Your COVID-19 Vaccine Questions Answered: Why is the COVID-19 Vaccine Safe?

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Public Health, healthcare networks and pharmacies throughout the region are continuing to vaccinate people with the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccine supplies are limited, so the most vulnerable are being vaccinated first. The City of Rancho Cordova wants to answer your questions, point you in the right direction, and help you sort through the confusing chatter about how to get a COVID-19 vaccine.

When will I be protected from COVID-19 after I get the vaccine?

The COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective at preventing COVID-19. However, like many vaccinations, it takes time for your body to build protection after being vaccinated. While you may have some protection after getting your first dose of the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, it’s questionable until you get both doses. In addition, your second dose may not protect you until a week or two after you get it. Johnson & Johnson’s vaccine only requires one dose, but just like the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines, it will take some time for your body to develop protection.

Once I get the COVID-19 vaccine, do I still need to wear a mask, social distance, and so forth?

On Monday, March 8, the CDC announced the first set of public health guidelines for those who have received the COVID-19 vaccine.

People are considered fully vaccinated two weeks after they receive a second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine, or two weeks after receiving the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

Fully vaccinated people can:

Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing; Visit with unvaccinated people from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing; Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if they have no symptoms.

Those who are not fully vaccinated should continue to wear a mask, maintain social distancing, and avoid gathering with non-household members. Learn more at CDC.gov.

Can a COVID-19 vaccine make me sick with COVID-19?

No. The Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson vaccines do not contain the live virus that causes COVID-19, so the vaccines cannot make you sick with COVID-19.

What are the side effects of the COVID-19 vaccine?

Visit the CDC’s vaccine webpage CDC.gov/Vaccines/COVID-19 for information on what to expect after getting the COVID-19 vaccine, including common side effects and helpful tips. However, if you’ve ever had an immediate allergic reaction to a vaccine or injectable therapy for another disease – even if it was not severe – ask your doctor about getting vaccinated.

How do I report if I have a problem or a bad reaction to the COVID-19 vaccine?

Serious problems from any vaccination can happen, but they are rare. The CDC has learned of reports that some people have experienced severe allergic reactions – also known as anaphylaxis – after getting a COVID-19 vaccine.

If you get a COVID-19 vaccine and you think you might be having a severe allergic reaction after leaving the vaccination site, seek immediate medical care by calling 911.

The CDC has launched v-safe, a smartphone-based tool that uses text messaging and web surveys to provide personalized health check-ins after you receive a COVID-19 vaccination. Register for v-safe on the CDC’s website at VSafe.CDC.gov.

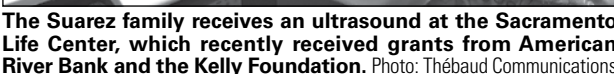

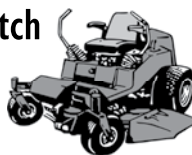

Need A Medicare Supplement Guaranteed Issue Plan?

and B when he turned 65 and remained on my company benefits due to having health issues.

He has recently began taking heart meds for blood clots and his cardiologist's office manager expressed concern over my husband's insurance changes from group insurance to Medicare since he may have to have serious medical needs.

Please explain how we enroll in our Medicare plan. Thanks, Sheila from Tulsa, OK

Hello Sheila:

When you enroll in Part B the wrong way or may be too soon, it can cause you to not qualify medically for the Medicare Supplement you desire.

Medicare provides special rules for employees or spouses who are "still working" and are covered by an employer group health insurance.

Sheila, I know how worried you are about Seth's health issues but there is a Medicare answer to his Medicare Supplement enrollment. He enrolled in Medicare Part B when he turned 65 over 5 years ago and he must answer underwriting questions to qualify for a Medicare Supplement.

Therefore, enrolling in Part B, the correct way, when "still working" full-time with true company benefits is so important. Not only to keep from receiving a Medicare Part B penalty, but also to be able to enroll and be accepted in any Medicare Supplement/Medigap plan due to medical underwriting.

Seth may not be able to pass Medicare Supplement underwriting due to heart issues. There is a Medicare Supplement rule which can keep him from answering underwriting questions.

Since he is leaving your company benefits, he qualifies for the 63-day guaranteed issue period to apply for a Medicare

Dear Toni:

I have decided to retire when I turn 65 in June and will need to enroll in Medicare Parts A and B. My husband, Seth is 70 and he enrolled in Medicare Parts A

Supplement/Medigap plan without medical underwriting. He will need your company benefit termination letter to prove to the Medicare Supplement plan that he is in a guaranteed issue period.


With guaranteed issue, an insurance company must:

- Sell you a Medigap/Medicare Supplement policy. "You have the right to buy Medigap/Medicare Supplement plan A, B, C, F, K or L that's sold in your state by any insurance company. Seth is not eligible for Plan G with guaranteed issue plans since his Medicare Part A began prior to January 1, 2020. Those that Medicare Part A begins after January 1, 2020 are eligible for Plan G not Plan F or C for a guaranteed issue plan.
- Cover all your pre-existing health conditions.
- Cannot charge you more for a Medigap/Medicare Supplement policy, regardless of past or present health problems.

Sheila, I have great news for you! You are "turning 65" and have a less stressful Medicare enrollment than Seth because you are in your Medicare Supplement/Medigap Open Enrollment Period and in the Medicare & You handbook it states, "The best time to purchase a Medicare Supplement/Medigap policy is during your Medigap Open Enrollment Period. This 6-month period begins on the first day of the month in which you are 65 or older and enrolled in Medicare Part B. After this enrollment period, you may not be able to buy a Medicare Supplement/Medigap policy. If you are able to buy one it may cost more."

America does not realize that enrolling in Medicare Part B is as valuable as GOLD and should be treated with kid gloves. Take your time and explore your Medicare plan options.
